Derby day win for Under 18s but Ladies crash out of FA Cup

It was a mixed Sunday for the Robins as the under 18s got their title defence underway with victory but the ladies were eliminated from the FA Cup in the first qualifying round.

Brad Sweetman's first game in charge of the young Robins ended in a 4-1 victory away at St Francis Rangers.

With virtually all of last seasons champions now being too old to play youth football, Sweetman fielded

what was basically a completely new team and a young one at that.

That made the result all the more pleasing as a brace from Yahya Azizi and goals from Henry Le-May and Alfie Loversidge – all their firsts for the club – secured the three points.

It wasn't such a good day for the ladies who went down 4-2 at home to Islington Borough as their FA Cup adventures came to an end at the Beacon.

Out of the Vase

Our last home game three days ago saw Hassocks exit the FA Vase at the hands of the K Sports.

The Paperboys – still the best nickname in football – were a quality outfit and you could see why they took Pagham to an FA Cup replay, which makes the fact that it was only squandered chances that denied the Robins a result all the more frustrating.

Still, on the positive side it was great to see fans favourite Dan Jacques back after a two season absence and we look forward to plenty of encouraging shouts towards Jacquesy from the stands.

Also back was Ryan Collins who, at the time of writing, looked like being a deserved winner of the Man of the Match vote and there was also a debut for young Harvery Enticknap – hopefully the first of many appearances in a Robins shirt.

The Robins will be hoping that this years encounter goes slightly better than last seasons, when Corey Wheeler's extra time goal gave Bexhill a 1-0 victory.

It was particularly memorable evening for the Pirates' goalkeeper Dan Rose who pulled off in quick succession two of the finest saves the Beacon saw all season when denying Michael Death and then Nathan Miles.

United have been something of a bogey team for the Robins in cup competitions over the last few seasons, having also been responsible for Hassocks' elimination from the 2014-15 Sussex Senior Cup.

That 2-1 defeat take place at the Polgrove where two goals from Jamie Morgan turned the tables after Miles' opener.

It was the Robins last visit to the Polegrove and its magnificent old stand which doubles up as a listed building.

Unfortunately, there hasn't been much prospect of United's home becoming a Premier Division ground over the last few seasons.

The Pirates seventh place finish last time out represented their third highest placing since winning promotion back to Division One in 2010.

Those were only bettered by fourth spot in 2010-11 and sixth place in that season they knocked Dave John's side out of the Senior Cup.

It's been a mixed start to the season for United with two defeats and two victories.

Those two victories have both been by huge margins with a 7-1 success away at Storrington and a 7-1 win away at Seaford Town.

They were profitable games for Jack Shonk who hit hat-tricks in both of those encounters to lead the clubs scoring charts.

Their other two league games saw 1-0 defeats against the current top two in Division One, AFC Varndeanians and Alford.

At the weekend, they were on the end of a heavy defeat of their own, exiting the FA Vase 4-1 away at Bearsted.

PIRATES SINK ROBINS TO END CUP DREAMS

August hasn't even reached its conclusion yet and already Hassocks have been eliminated from three of the five knockout competitions they are entered in following Tuesday night's 1-0 defeat at home to Bexhill United.

The extra time defeat to their Division One opponents ended their Peter Bentley League Cup dreams just three days after another loss over 120 minutes to AFC Uckfield Town.

Both of those games were eminently winnable, certainly more so than the tie that resulted in their elimination from the FA Cup against Hollands and Blair on the opening weekend.

Seasoned Hassocks watchers approach any game with lower division opposition with a sense of trepidation.

In the last nine seasons, the Robins have gone out of various competitions nine times to teams plying their trade in Division One at the time - Rustington, East Preston, Seaford Town, Southwick, Little Common, Littlehampton Town and Steyning Town.

Bexhill are now on the list twice having knocked Hassocks out of the Sussex Senior Cup as well when these two last met.

Much like on that cold October eve three seasons ago at the Polegrove, Hassocks had the majority of the ball with the Pirates content to pillaging on the counter attack.

They were rather effective at this, earning a free kick early on which struck the chin of Josh Hawkes in the Hassocks wall.

Hawkes was making his first start of the season here and along with the

returning Spencer Slaughter and Bradley Bant, gave Hassocks a much more experienced look in midfield to the side that threw away a two goal lead on Saturday.

That showed as unlike in recent weeks the Robins had more shape, kept the ball better and largely avoided making the silly little mistakes that have undermined their progress so far.

Were it not for visiting goalkeeper Dan Rose they could easily have progressed.

Rose was in inspired form and he produced two excellent first half saves to keep out efforts from the Robins front pairing of Nathan Miles and Michael Death.

Rose also denied Spencer Slaughter and Dan Stokes but in all spite of all that the best bit of goalkeeping of the half came at the other end, where Nathan Stroomberg marked his home debut for Hassocks with a brilliant penalty stop, diving full length to his right to push away Craig Ottley's spot kick right on the stroke of half time.

The chances continued to flow in the second half.

Kyle Holden denied Miles a sight of Rose's goal with a last ditch tackle, Stroomberg produced another excellent stop from a Wayne Giles header and then Slaughter saw a header of his own cleared off the line by Craig McFarlane.

That represented the last chance of the 90 and so for the second time in a week, Hassocks were forced into playing an additional 30 minutes.

They had plenty of options from the bench with Lewis Westlake, Harry Mills and Liam Benson all being introduced.

Those fresh legs didn't matter though as the Robins were caught alarmingly cold at the start of extra time with Corey Wheeler finding it far too easy to finish off a fine individual effort which gave Bexhill the lead.

The Pirates were all too happy to sit back after that and although Hassocks had plenty of the ball they couldn't find anyway of parting the white sea that stood between them and an equaliser.

The closest they got was when Benson met an excellent cross with a thumping ahead that rattled the bar rather than the back of the net as the Pirates closed the game out to sail into round three.

FIVE STAR ROBINS SET UP PLUM BOGNOR TIE

Bognor Regis Town will be visiting the Beacon in the third round of the Sussex Senior Cup after Hassocks set up a plum tie with Conference South opposition thanks to a 5-0 win away at Bexhill United.

On paper, this looked a potential banana skin of a tie, especially given that Hassocks had already exited the John O'Hara Cup to Division One opponents Rustington.

In the end though the Robins made it look easy at the Polegrove as they gave a professional performance that was easily the best so far since John Suter and Mickey Jewell took the reins in the summer.

There were five different scorers, a first clean sheet for 17-year-old Jack Simpson and for the first time this season, Hassocks never looked in danger at any point.

The first 40 minutes were pretty even with both sides giving the ball away with alarming regularity.

Simon Bristow was handed the opportunity to partner James Laing in attack and it was his angled shot that flew just wide after five minutes that provided the first opportunity of the tie.

At the other end, Jack Aston lashed a shot just wide before Ashley Marsh found himself in unfamiliar territory in front of the opposing goal after Laing played him in.

How Marsh ended up there remains a complete mystery and the realisation that he was through one-on-one certainly seemed to panic him.

As a result, Marsh attempted to square the ball when a shot on target would surely have beaten United goalkeeper Akyut Kusha, although the Hassocks defender could be forgiven his lack of striking instinct after a record of one goal in 170 appearances.

Bristow, who had been one of the main culprits when it came to handing possession to hosts, was the man

who opened the scoring with 38 minutes on the clock.

There was a huge helping hand from Kusha as Bristow's effort from 25 yards looked to be an extremely tame one, yet somehow it eluded the grasp of Kusha and just about trickled over the line to give Hassocks the lead.

The Robins made one enforced change at the break as Matt Russell replaced the injured Laing and it was the former Burgess Hill Town striker's arrival into proceedings that saw Hassocks grab the tie by the scruff of the neck.

Within 14 minutes of his introduction, Russell doubled the Robins advantage although the goal owed much to the industry of Dan Jacques at right wing back.

This was another promising

performance from Jacques and he found himself in an advanced position after a lung busting run forward.

It looked like he'd blown the opportunity though when producing an almighty scuff yet somehow the ball went through the home defence and straight onto the path of the onrushing Russell who slotted home at the second attempt.

Hassocks were in control now and Matt Percival was just over with a dipping volley and Bristow failed to clear Kusha with an attempted lob when one on one with the keeper.

Suter turned to Matt Amos and Anthony Hibbert to replace Bristow and Percival in a double substitution on 67 minutes and the introduction of two of the Robins' most dangerous attacking threats helped them wrap the tie up comfortable.

Russell should have made it three within a couple of minutes of the changes and then Bexhill sub Ricky Mote missed their clearest chance when firing over Simpson's bar from 12 yards.

Jamie Hillwood added the Robins third with 10 minutes remaining with a stunning individual effort for his first goal for the first team since stepping up from last seasons .

Hillwood started with the ball inside his own half before riding three or four Bexhill challenges and tucking under the body of Kusha.

In an action packed last 10 minutes, Russell somehow hit the post from a yard out before Spencer Slaughter netted the fourth by rounding off a fine move that involved Hibbert, Russell and Amos with a neat finish.

The scoring was rounded off in injury time by Hibbert who placed the ball out of the reach of Kusha having collected an excellent lay off from Amos.

Wilkins voted Robins August Player of the Month

Jack Wilkins has been named as the first Robins Player of the Month for the 2018-19 season, winning August's award with 48% of the vote.

The 20-year-old forward started six games out of seven, only missing the 2-1 victory over Crawley Down Gatwick in the Sussex RUR Principal Charity Cup.

He won the man-of-the-match awards in the 6-0 defeat at home to Chichester City United and most impressively, during the Robins finest win of the season to date when they left Mill Road with all three points after a 3-1 victory over Arundel.

It is the first time Wilkins has been in the top three of a Player of the Month award and a rich reward for his excellent start to the campaign.

Harvey Blake's flying start to life at the Beacon has seen the young full back voted into second spot with 26% of the vote.

Blake arrived from Mid Sussex League side Sporting Lindfield in the summer and after coming off the bench for lively cameos in his first two appearances for the Robins, he has been a regular starter in the next four games, winning the man-of-the-match award in the 4-1 defeat to Saltdean United.

In third was Phil Johnson, rounding off a hugely successful first month back at the Beacon following his return from Horsham YMCA.

Johnson netted four times in five August games, scoring twice in the win over Arundel as well as the games with Crawley Down and Saltdean. That goal against the Tigers was his 50th for the club.







HASSOCKS IN THE PETER BENTLEY CUP

With just one semi final appearance in over 30 years, Hassocks' Peter Bentley League Cup record leaves a lot to be desired. Here's a look back at some of the highlights from the Robins previous cracks at the competition...

The Peter Bentley League Cup has never been the happiest of hunting grounds for Hassocks, right back to when they first entered the tournament in 1985.

It actually took 10 years from that debut in the competition against Peacehaven & Telscombe for the Robins to taste victory.

Sure, there was a spell in Division Two in that decade in which Hassocks weren't able to enter, but even so that was a remarkable long time to wait for a first win.

It belatedly arrived in the 1995-96 season, a 3-1 win away at Bosham which set the Robins up for elimination in the next round against Langney Sports.

Hassocks were quick learners however and just one year after winning in the competition for the first time, they went all the way to the semi-finals.

Sidley were seen off in the second round, Mile Oak in round three and an almighty upset followed against the great Saltdean United side of the late 90s in the quarter finals.

That set up a semi-final showdown with another of the periods big names Wick, but unfortunately the Robins weren't able to repeat their heroics of the previous round and fell to a heavy 5-0 defeat in the last four.

Hassocks have made the quarter finals on xxx occasions, the most recent of which came in the 2015-16 season.

There was no shortage of controversy about Lancing hosting a 7.15pm kick off meaning a mad dash down to Culver Road for the Robins

squad, even without taking into account the traffic nightmare that unfolded due to Brighton playing at the Amex on the same evening.

That lack of preparation certainly didn't help the visitors, but they were outclassed 4-0 by a Lancing side who would go onto lift the trophy.

Both Lingfield and Crawley Down Gatwick were seen off en route to that semi, with both sides playing in Division One at the time.

The Robins wasted a glorious chance to make the semi finals in the 2012-13 season when one of the finest sides in the clubs history fell in the last eight.

That defeat came 1-0 away at Division One side Littlehampton Town and a owed a lot of a spectacular show of goalkeeping from Jonathan

Before that 2012-13 season, Hassocks had been on another barren run of form in the competition, failing to win in five seasons since the 2007-08 campaign.

They suffered some chastening

defeats in that time, going down 2-1 away at Southwick in 2011 in a game that was notable only for the fact that just 15 paying customers bothered to turn up at Old Barn Way, making it comfortably the lowest attendance Hassocks have ever played in front of in senior football.

Another defeat to lower league opposition came in 2008, when John Suter's side faced Rustington for the first and so far only time, losing 2-1 away from home.

Hassocks ended up making the quarter finals in that 2007-08 season before falling to Ringmer while the previous season may have been the Robins second best ever on record after Dave John's side achieved a sixth place finish, but they still couldn't get beyond round two of the League Cup after losing 1-0 at home to Sidley United.

It was on their way to another quarter final defeat in 2005-06 that Hassocks racked up their biggest win in the competition, hammering Crawley Down 6-0 at the Beacon.

That came in the second round and in the third round, the Robins chalked up the scalp of Eastbourne Town.

This was the final season that replays were used in the competition and after a 1-1 draw at the Beacon, Dave John's side went down to the Saffrons and triumphed 3-1 through two goals from Harding and one from Matt Robbins.

That set up a quarter final meeting with Crowborough Atheltic who proved to be a real bogey team to Hassocks around this time and so it proved, the Crows running out 2-1 winners at the Beacon.

ROBINS BARREN NATIONAL CUP RUN GOES ON

Buildbase FA Vase First Qualifying Round Saturday 1st September 2018, The Beacon Hassocks 0-2 K Sports

It will be at least another season before Hassocks end their barren run in national cup competitions after they were eliminated from the FA Vase at the hands of K Sports.

The Southern Counties East side triumphed 2-0 at the Beacon on Saturday to complete a clean sweep for that particular league when it comes to the Robins' hopes of Wembley or even just some decent prize money after the Paperboys' Kent compatriots Erith Town had knocked Hassocks out of the FA Cup at the Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round stage in the second week of the season.

All that means that the Robins are now without a win in national knockouts since triumphing 3-1 against Corinthian in the first round of the Vase in 2014.

Only three players from that day were in the Hassocks starting line up here and remarkably two of those were making their second debuts for the Robins.

Enigmatic fan favourite Dan Jacques was handed his first Hassocks start since February 2016 at centre back after two seasons with Lindfield in which he helped the Swans lift virtually every trophy going in the Mid Sussex.

Ryan Collins meanwhile left the Beacon in late 2015, enjoying spells at AFC Varndeanians and Ringmer since. He started in central midfield and clearly made a big impression on the home faithful if his showing in the supporters Man of the Match poll was anything to go by.

There weren't just two new-old faces either.

Mark Dalgleish handed a full debut to Harvey Enticknap following an encouraging start to life in the Robins under 23 squad. Enticknap in the process became the 300th player to represent the club since the move to the Beacon in 1992.

Despite the three enforced changes, Hassocks could and probably should have taken the game into extra time at least.

The Robins were the better side for the most part, dominating large periods of the game without ever managing to convert one of their numerous chances.

That will at least provide encouragement to Dalgleish given that their opponents were no slouches.

They'd already taken Pagham, one of the favourites for the Southern Combination League title, to a replay in the FA Cup and had made a solid start to their first ever season in the Southern Counties Premier Division after finishing Division One runners up last time out.

What will concern the Hassocks coaching staff on this showing however is the way in which the Robins couldn't quite see out each half defensively.

Both of Sports' goals came in the last five minutes of either half, the first arriving just one minute before the break and the second with two minutes of normal time remaining.

Liam Benson had one good chance saved low down by Paperboys' keeper Henry Lovering and a Matt Berridge





free kick set off a game of ping pong in the box with Jack Wilkins' deflected effort falling gratefully into the hands of Lovering in Hassocks' two best chances of the first half.

Then came that sucker punch as James Alderman gave the visitors the lead right on the stroke of half time.

Supporters of the Robins have seen their team concede just before the break and then follow that up with a nightmare start to the second half but they avoided that fate here as

Hassocks again showed plenty of intent through the hardworking Phil Johnson.

Sports' most likely route to a second looked to be from set pieces and Alex Harris had to be alert to save down to his left after a low corner was volleyed goalward and he then made a solid stop with his feet after another corner wasn't convincingly cleared.

In between those two Harris saves, Blake came close to opening his account for the club when he went bombing forward from right back and rounded the goalkeeper but the angle was against him and his effort was hacked off the line when all it required was the touch of a Hassocks player to poke it in.

There was one moment of outrageous skill from Sport's James West when he produced a perfect bicycle kick after yet another corner wasn't dealt with but his powerful effort cannoned off the crossbar.

It was Matt Gething who made the game safe for the visitors with two minutes remaining but that wasn't the end of the drama as there was still time for Sports' Tom Carr to be dismissed late on.

Galbraith-Gibbons notched the fifth with 25 played before two goals in less than 90 seconds just before half time from Littlejohn completed a 23 minute hat-trick for the Robins striker.





The second half was just five minutes old when Galbraith-Gibbons completed a treble of his own.

Hassocks' ninth and final goal of the game arrived in the 70th minute through Littlejohn with his fourth of the night to round off a memorable evenings work for the Robins.

They are next in action away at Southwick next Thursday with kick off at the slightly earlier time of 7.30pm at Old Barn Way.

The 1999 Champions League final. Ole Gunnar Solksjaer winner in the 92nd minute v Bayern Munich. What a dream.



Mickey Jewell tasted defeat for the first time as Hassocks manager as he saw his side bow out of the FA Vase at the first hurdle in disappointing fashion at Wessex League side Blackfield and Langley.

Despite some curious decisions from the officials, the Robins only had themselves to blame for not extending their unbeaten start to the season to eight games as left-back Andy Whittingham saw red and assistant manager Mark Dalgleish removed himself from the dugout to avoid the same fate on a blustery day in Hampshire.

Hassocks were given the perfect start as they took the lead with only two minutes on the clock when Sam Jeremiah gained possession on the right and his clever through pass played in Neil Kane who beat the advancing Tom Hawkins with a deft finish.

The lead lasted for just two minutes though, as Jack Simpson failed to hold a wind-assisted delivery into his box and when the ball eventually dropped, Blackfield skipper Shaun Hughes was on hand to lash home with a powerful volley.

Jeremiah could have restored the visitors advantage on eight minutes when he met a dangerous whipped cross from Whittingham after good work by Chris Maynard but he saw his header fly inches over the bar.

The home side took the lead from the penalty spot on 22 minutes when a long ball over the top caught the Hassocks defence flat footed.

The impressive Fuhad Hamadou was wrestled to the ground by Ashley Marsh as the pair chased it down, leaving Hughes to step up and net his second of the game.

Spencer Slaughter pulled the Robins back into the game three minutes before half-time.

With Blackfield backing off, Marsh atoned for his conceding of the penalty with a mazy 60-yard run forward before laying the ball off to the midfielder who calmly stroked home.

Unlike their opponents, Hassocks failed to take advantage of the wind in the second half.

Phil Gault saw an effort come back off the post after Kane pulled back across goal from a long ball from substitute Stuart Brown, but the game changed with 15 minutes left on the clock as Whittingham received his marching orders following a mistimed kung fu kick that connected with Bell.

Down to ten men, the Robins found themselves trailing 3-2 four minutes later as nobody put a suitable challenge in on the advancing Bell and he played in Neil Williams who was left to beat Simpson one-on-one.

Hassocks had their chances to force a replay in the last five minutes, firstly when Gault played in Kane who put his effort wide with only the keeper to beat, and then in the 94th minute when a long ball released Slaughter but he saw his low cross evade the charging cavalry.

Hassocks Youth Team started their campaign with a hard-fought point in a 1-1 draw at home to Mile Oak.



Loxwood last season?

Jamie Hillwood was part of the Hassocks Under 18s side that won the Southern Combination League Youth Cup Final in 2008, although he probably doesn't remember it too fondly given he was sent off in that game!

It was after that that he became a semi-first team regular under Mickey Jewell and then Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar, racking up 1-2 appearances when work allowed and scoring 22 goals along the way.

He had a brief spell with Haywards Heath Town at the start of last season before returning to the Beacon for an ill-fated spell.

Hillwood can now be found playing for Burgess Hill Albion in the Mid Sussex Premier League.
