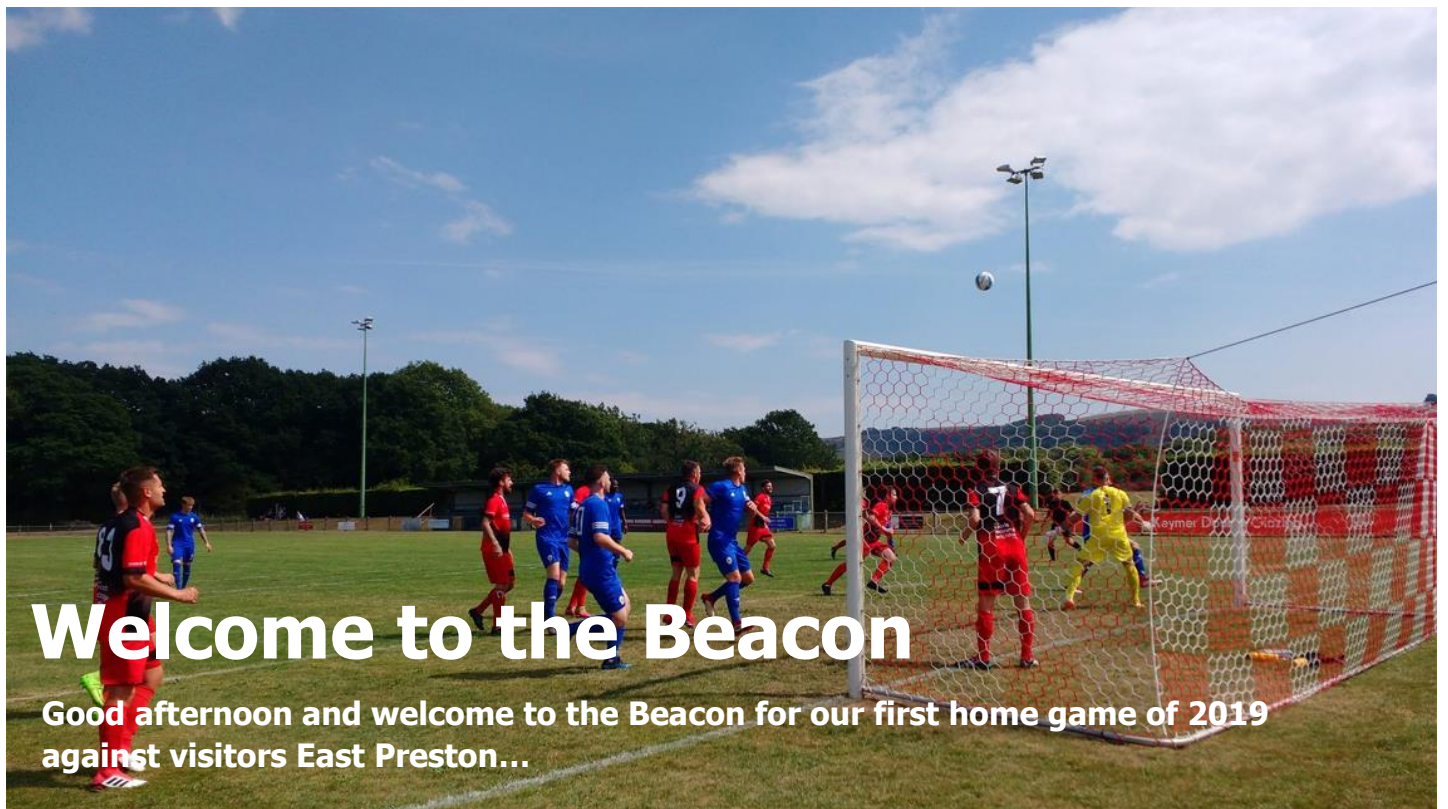

Welcome to the Beacon

Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon for our first home game of 2019 against visitors East Preston...

A warm welcome to EP

We'd like to start by welcoming our visitors East Preston to the Beacon and hope their players, supporters and officials enjoy their brief stay in Mid Sussex with us today.

Meetings between Hassocks and East Preston and Hassocks have thrown up some entertaining fixtures down the years so fingers crossed that there will be plenty of excitement on show today as the Robins look to continue their good run of form.

Seven points out of nine in a brilliant festive period

Hassocks have enjoyed a brilliant festive period, picking up seven points out of a possible nine either side of Christmas.

The 3-3 draw at leaders Chichester City looks even more impressive since Chi have gone onto beat Pagham and demolish Arundel, while the Boxing Day game against Lancing more than lived up to expectations.

There was a big crowd of over 200 at the Beacon and a fiery encounter was eventually won 3-1 by the Robins thanks to goals from Liam Benson, Phil Johnson and Jake Lindsey.

That was followed by an excellent 1-0 win at Shoreham last weekend. The Musselmen are under new management though and with some of the players they're bringing in,

they should soon start climbing the table, so this was an important three points.

Really, the game could have gone either way as both goalkeepers were in outstanding form, the Robins' former custodian James Broadbent pulling off all manner of saves in the first half for Shoreham while in the second, Josh Green made a flurry of stops in a matter of minutes to earn his clean sheet.

There are reports from both games contained within the programme and special congratulations go to Jordan Badger who made his 100th appearance for the club in the win at Middle Road.

Other sides return to action this week

Away from the first team, Hassocks' other sides all return to action this week after their Christmas breaks.

The Under 18s kick things off here at the Beacon tomorrow morning when Broadbridge Heath are the visitors with an 11am start.

Brad Sweetman's side endured a disappointing end to 2018 with back-to-back defeats for the first time in over 18 months.

They'll return refreshed and recharged though as they attempt the difficult task of overhauling Central Division leaders Haywards Heath Town in an attempt to retain their

title.

The Ladies meanwhile go to Wandgas tomorrow afternoon looking to maintain their 100% record at the top of the South East Counties Women's League Division One.

Nigel Pearce's Under 23 side have a little longer to wait before returning to action as they make the trip to Broadbridge Heath on Thursday evening.

The West Division title looks something of a wide open race at the minute and three points against the Bears would be a big result for the Robins.

Today's visitors...

The Robins' first home game of 2019 sees Bob Paine bring his talented young East Preston squad to the Beacon for Premier Division action...

It's been a whirlwind couple of years for everybody involved at the Lashmar since EP's all-conquering side from the start of the decade broke up.

Dom Di Paolo had led them through a trophy-laden period which saw EP lift the Sussex RUR Charity Cup, the Peter Bentley League Cup and their first ever Southern Combination League title in the space of two glorious seasons.

Di Paolo's departure a few months into the 2014-15 season saw most of his title winning squad leave with him and EP had to endure a couple of years of struggle which culminated in relegation to Division One at the end of the 2015-16 campaign.

Their committee made an extremely clever move at that point in time, turning to former Worthing Development Squad manager Bob Paine to take the reigns and he built a squad of talented young players who won promotion back to the top flight at the first attempt.

They more than held their own in the Premier Division last time out, ending up in 13th spot, some 17 points clear of Hassocks in the final relegation place.

It looks like being a similar story

this time around.

At the time of writing, EP were in 11th position but with games in hand on virtually every side around them in the table.

On their day, EP can be a match for any team in the division as evidenced by the fact that they have victories over title challengers Chichester City, Newhaven and Saltdean United to their name – suggesting that with a little more consistency, they could aim even higher up the table.

There have been 41 meetings between the two sides with Hassocks winning 13, 10 draws and EP tasting success on 18 occasions.

EP are normally good for a goal or two in the fixture as well, having scored 80 times against the Robins, the majority of those coming during their domination of the league between 2013 and 2014.

If they are to add to that total, then Daniel Huet will probably be the man to do it.

He's netted seven times this season and will be a familiar face to the members of Mark Dalglish's squad who also play Under 23 football having scored twice for EP when the two sides met three weeks ago.

Boddy had played a dozen games for Hassocks having joined the club towards the end of the 2011-12 campaign from Shoreham.

Anthony Hibbert also enjoyed a brief spell with EP between his departure from Hassocks and his arrival at Horsham YMCA.



SUPER SUB STOKES STRIKES LATE DOUBLE TO EARN ROBINS POINT

Perhaps Hassocks should request their evening games kick off at 9pm from now on?

For the second Tuesday in succession, the Robins launched a dazzling second half comeback to take something from a game in which they came in at half time trailing 2-0 after a disjointed first half showing.

They simply weren't at the races in the opening 45 minutes at the Lashmar against a talented East Preston side who scored twice through Lucas Pattenden and Thomas Lyne.

The previous weeks comeback win against Bexhill United in the Peter Bentley League Cup came about when Mark Dalgleish told his players to abandon their haphazard attempts at passing football in favour of going direct in order to utilise the pace of Phil Johnson, Liam Benson and James Littlejohn.

And it was another tactical adjustment that turned the game here and allowed Hassocks to leave with a share of the spoils.

Dalgleish abandoned 4-3-3 at half time in favour of 4-4-2 which put the Robins firmly in control, although the introduction of their goal scoring saviour owed more to luck than design.

Dan Stokes was bought on early in the second half when the unfortunate Will Broomfield pulled a hamstring.

Stokes took full advantage of the opportunity, netting a brilliant brace in the final 10 minutes to earn his side a 2-2 draw.

Pattenden's opener for EP had arrived after just three minutes, the wing back dancing past three

Hassocks defenders before whipping a left footed effort past Josh Green and into the top corner.

The hosts had a plethora of chances to extend their lead after that.

Ryan Quirke fired wastefully over, Dan Huet saw an effort well blocked by Broomfield and Jack Barnes shot wide.

EP's second goal eventually arrived with 10 minutes of the half remaining.

Quirke delivered a free kick to the far post where Lyne had far too much time and space to bring the ball down and fire a left footed volley in via the upright.

Hassocks made their shape change at the break and there were a couple of personnel changes early on in the second half as well as Jordan Badger replaced Dan Jacques and young Joe Bull came on for Alex Spinks before Stokes' pivotal entrance to the game.

As a result of Broomfield's injury, Spencer Slaughter dropped back into defence and he began pushing his side higher up the pitch than they'd previously dared to go.

That, coupled with the tireless work rate of the Robins front three, began causing EP a world of problems and Hassocks spent most of the second half camped in the opposition half.

Despite their territorial and possession dominance, it took until the 80th minute for Hassocks to pull one back.

A succession of big tackles from the Robins saw the ball fall to Stokes some 25 yards out and he hit a

dipping distance effort which left EP goalkeeper James Fernandes grasping at thin air.

That sparked a manic last 10 minutes.

Slaughter plucked a ball out of the air with the grace of a gazelle before hitting a 40 yard diagonal ball over the top for Littlejohn to chase.

Littlejohn latched onto it and knocked it past Fernandes who then pole axed the Hassocks striker to concede a penalty and earn a straight red card.

EP sacrificed Quirke for substitute goalkeeper Leesun Donaldson and his first touch of the game saw him save Benson's spot kick, much to the delight of the home crowd who must've thought it was going to be their day at that point.

Stokes had other ideas though and he equalised with just one minute of the 90 remaining, producing a deft touch to escape the attentions of Nathan Da Costa and then hitting a peach of a shot back across goal that went in off the post.

Player coach Slaughter said afterwards, "It's four wins and a draw from our last seven games now and it could easily have been more."

"If we take the halves we are having here and there and turn it into a full game then we're going to be very difficult to play against."

GAULT HAT-TRICK ENDS SEASON ON A HIGH

There is something about the final game of the season that seems to bring out the best in Phil Gault.

A year on from his stunning five-goal haul away at Chichester City, he hit a hat-trick to see off third placed East Preston at the Beacon as the Robins wrapped up their 2012-13 campaign.

It gave Hassocks the three points they needed to secure seventh place in Division One with a 3-2 victory over an out-of-sorts EP in conditions more akin to November than May.

The visitors could be forgiven for being a touch jaded given that this fixture brought the curtain down on a mammoth run of 15 games in 26 days that all but cost them any hope of being crowned league champions.

It was also a case of after the Lord Mayors show for Dom Di Paolo's side who might well have been suffering from a severe hangover having lifted their first senior trophy 48 hours previously with victory in the Sussex RUR Charity Cup final over Broadbridge Heath.

Still, take nothing away from Hassocks who ruthlessly took advantage of the conditions being in their favour in the second half.

Those fans who braved the driving winds and rain were treated to a first appearance in a Robins shirt for over seven years for Pat Harding.

Harding was given permission to turn out for the Robins by Burgess Hill Town boss Ian Chapman as the Hillians' Ryman League season was completed a fortnight previously.

He saw little of the ball in the first half as EP attacked the railway end of the ground with the assistance of the wind.

Luckily for Hassocks they failed to take full advantage of the gale, scoring just the once through a Liam O'Brien header.

That came when Simon Lehkyj's attempt to gather a cross from former

Hassocks forward Rob Boddy saw him end up stranded in no man's land with O'Brien nipping in to head into the unguarded net.

With the wind in their favour, Hassocks came out fighting in the second half and posed a far greater attacking threat.

They were helped in that regard by a shrewd piece of management from Mickey Jewell.

Knowing that his side would have the wind behind their backs in the second half, the Robins boss gambled that it would mean less defending to concentrate on and so at the break he replaced right back Rob South with striker Nathan Miles.

The gamble nearly paid off straight away as Harding played a superb cross field pass that Miles just failed to get to ahead of EP keeper Ben Rose.

James Westlake then swung over a wind-assisted corner which had to be scrambled off the line at the expense of another corner from the other side and this time the gale nearly whipped it in at the near post.

After those two near-misses, it was no surprise to see the Hassocks equaliser arriving from another set piece.

Westlake again sent in a superb delivery that EP failed to clear and they were punished by a thumping volley from Lee Bryant that went in via a deflection from Gault to deny the centre back what would have been his first Hassocks goal.

Five minutes later and the Robins had the lead.

Nathan Cooper won possession in trademark fashion and his perfectly weighted pass released Harding who was taken clean out by Rose.

Gault slammed home the resulting penalty with aplomb.

Hassocks were now well and truly on top and Harding nearly had the goal his impressive display deserved when Gault played him in but his

effort was well saved on the stretch by Rose.

Having given away the penalty five minutes previously, an evening the EP keeper would rather forget was rounded off when Cooper's seemingly harmless cross from the left somehow eluded him via the faintest of touches from Gault to wrap up his hat-trick.

EP pulled one back with 12 minutes remaining when Matt Axell picked up possession in the centre of the park 35 yards out and with nothing else on, unleashed an unstoppable drive that flew into the very top left-hand corner of Lehkyj's goal despite being hit against the wind.

That could have led to a nervy final 10 but the Robins comfortably saw out the remainder of the match to complete a reasonably pleasing campaign in which they scored 97 league goals and secured their second highest Division One points tally.

Gault's treble also ensured that he finished as Division One's top scorer with 32 – the first Hassocks player to achieve the feat since his strike partner for the evening Harding did so in 2006.

Gault's excellent evenings work was rounded off with the presentation of Supporters Player of the Season after the game – although whether he was quite so popular with Messrs Bryant and Cooper after claiming goals that could quite easily have gone to them is another matter!

Robins and Oaks hope for fourth time lucky

Hassocks and AFC Uckfield Town will hope that it's a case of fourth time lucky as they attempt to get their Southern Combination League Premier Division game played at the Beacon on Tuesday 15th January.

Kick off will be at 7.45pm for a fixture that has already been moved once due to the Oakmen's FA Vase run and twice because of wet weather.

The match had originally been due to take place at the Oaks on Saturday 3rd November but had to be postponed due to the Oaks clash with AFC Croydon Athletic in the second round of the FA Vase.

They won that 2-1 to progress to the third round for the first time in their history where they defeated Sutton Common Rovers 5-2 to set up a home tie with Windsor which is scheduled to take place today.

As a result of their run in the

national cup competition, the meeting with the Robins was moved to Tuesday 27th November and changed from Uckfield to the Beacon in a bid to protect the Oaks pitch for that meeting with Sutton which was due to take place four days later.

As it was, Storm Diana rendered the Beacon pitch unplayable and also saw Uckfield have to delay their FA Vase tie for a week.

The third and most recent attempt to get the game played was due to take place on Tuesday 18th December at the end of another extremely wet period of weather.

As games were postponed or abandoned midway through on December 15th, the Beacon not only withstood a horrible day of rain for the 4-0 defeat to Peacehaven & Telscombe but was also playable 24 hours later as the Ladies booked a semi-final spot in the Sussex Women's Challenge Trophy by beating AFC Littlehampton 3-1.

The subsequent rainfall in the 48 hours before Martin Lee's sides victory and the visit of Uckfield proved to be too much however and match referee Daniel D'Urso made an early decision to postpone after a pitch inspection.

This will be the 14th meeting between the two sides. Hassocks have won eight with Uckfield triumphing in six.

There has never been a draw, which means it won't be one that you'll want to include on your coupon. When Hassocks do win against Town, they tend to win big having plundered 34 goals in the fixture.

The visit of Uckfield will complete a run of three home games in 10 days which starts with today's visit of East Preston.

Horsham YMCA then visit the Beacon in a week's time for another rearranged fixture before the Oakmen make the short trip to Mid Sussex three days later.

Captain Badger caps a Hassocks Century

Hassocks captain Jordan Badger made his 100th appearance for the Robins in last Saturday's 1-0 win at Shoreham, becoming the 47th player to pass a century of games for the club in senior football...

Jordan Badger joined Hassocks from Lewes two weeks into the 2016-17 season having found first team opportunities limited at the Dripping Pan.

The defender came through the ranks with the Rooks, winning Player of the Season at Under 18 level before going onto make a handful of senior appearances.

Badger's most memorable moment for Lewes came when he was deployed from the bench as an emergency striker in the closing stages of a game away at Kingstonian.

He was sent on up front for the final five minutes with the instruction "Be a nuisance".

Badger said of the incident, "The whole of our bench were laughing at me, but I ended up scoring two and would've had a hat-trick but for a brilliant top onto the bar from the goalkeeper. Badger had the last laugh that day!"

His debut for Hassocks came against AFC Uckfield Town in the Peter Bentley League Cup in August 2016 and he showed that attacking prowess, nearly scoring twice on his first appearance.

The first opportunity saw a header from a James Westlake corner brilliantly saved by the Oakmen's Matt Dann and then a harsh offside flag after Badger had come barreling forward to meet a Bradley Bant cross.

Badger did eventually net his first goal three months later, notching a brace in a ridiculous 6-4 win away at Crawley Down Gatwick.

He only missed six games in that 2016-17 campaign and was absent on only five occasions in 2017-18, the season in which he was handed the captains armband by Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar after Ashley Marsh's retirement.

At 22 years old, that made him the youngest club captain in Hassocks history and its proven to be an inspired decision with Badger playing as well as ever so far in the 2018-19 campaign.

He's made 24 appearances scoring three goals so far this season, leaving him with a grand total of seven goals from 100 appearances.

Congratulations to Jordan for reaching the century milestone.

CHRISTMAS CRACKER AS ROBINS PICK UP FESTIVE THREE POINTS

There might be no Boxing Day Mid Sussex Derby for Hassocks in the foreseeable future, but the Robins won't mind too much after they collected a festive three points from visitors Lancing.

With Haywards Heath Town thriving in the Bostik League and St Francis Rangers sadly no more, Hassocks are left as the district's sole representatives in the Southern Combination League.

That meant that for the first time since 2007, there was no game against their local rivals to look forward to in the holiday season.

Not without controversy, the league decided to pair them with Lancing for this season's holiday fixtures despite the fact that there are a glut of clubs who are closer in terms of location to both.

It proved to be an inspired decision, a Beacon best crowd of the season of 206 being treated to a feisty encounter which saw Hassocks run out 3-1 winners and both sides reduced to 10 men amongst nine cards flashed by referee Thomas Price.

Geography-wise, Hassocks versus Lancing doesn't make sense as a derby but playing wise, there is plenty of history between the two as, aside from Haywards Heath and St Francis, the Lancers are probably the side with which Hassocks have swapped players on the most frequent basis over the last decade.

While Lancing were without their talismanic ex-Robin Alex Bygraves, Mark Dalglish named three former Lancers in his starting line up; Josh Green, Bradley Tighe and Liam Benson and it was the former who was part of the melee that resulted in Spencer Slaughter and Dean Stewart-Hunter seeing red.

Quite what Stewart-Hunter was thinking when he took a vicious kick at Benson is anyone's guess but it

didn't sit well with Slaughter who charged 60 yards up the pitch to grab the visitors number six.

Both Slaughter and Stewart-Hunter were already on yellows by that point, leaving Mr Price with little choice but to send them for an early bath with their disagreement continuing down the players tunnel.

Hassocks were 2-1 ahead by that point and were good value for it.

They'd started the game the brighter side with Benson heading just wide with nine minutes played and then visiting goalkeeper Matt Evans made an excellent stop from Phil Johnson with 27 on the clock.

That parry from Evans become all the more important as just four minutes later, Lancing took the lead.

The goal was of Hassocks' own making.

Firstly, they took an ill-advised throw across their own box which led to a string of mistakes before Harry Mills hauled down Matt Daniel.

There could be no real complaints at the decision to award the Lancers a spot kick and Jonathan Lansdale certainly made the most of the Christmas gift, slotting the penalty past Green for 1-0.

When one goal goes in against Hassocks, a second can quickly follow so Dalglish would have been pleased that his side quickly reasserted their authority despite falling behind.

This time it was Benson who Evans foiled while Jake Lindsey also went close and Slaughter hit a rocket that whistled just wide of the post.

Stewart-Hunter could have doubled the visitors lead just before the break but was caught in an offside position when he thought he was in on goal.

Hassocks made a lively start to the second half with most of their good play coming from Tighe and Harvey Blake down the right while Joe Bull was proving to be a real threat on a rare start through the middle.

It came as little surprise when the Robins levelled things up and it was even less of a shock that it was Benson who scored it.

The striker seems to thrive when coming up against his former clubs – he'd scored twice at the Beacon in Lancing colours back in March on his first return since moving to Culver Road – and there was nothing Evans could do to prevent him equalising.

Hassocks still had another gear to step up to and Benson's goal inspired them to push the clutch down and go for it.

Within seven minutes they were ahead through a goal of the highest quality from Johnson.

There didn't seem much on when the Robins' top scorer got the ball with his back to goal but he produced a sublime turn in the box and then slotted the ball across Evans and into the far corner.

That rattled Lancing and they lost their discipline somewhat, the double dismissal of Slaughter and Hunter-Stewart being the culmination of a ragged period in which Liam Hendy and Will Broomfield were also booked.

Yellow card aside, Broomfield was outstanding all afternoon stepping out of defence with the ball and driving his side on.

Hassocks could have chosen to sit back on their lead with both sides now shorthanded but they didn't and they were rewarded for that positivity when Lindsey wrapped things up with the Robins' third just three minutes after the red cards.

It was an excellent finish from the 18-year-old to round off an entertaining Christmas cracker.

CLEVER BENSON HELPS HASSOCKS END 2018 ON A HIGH

Liam Benson's clever first half strike was enough to ensure that Hassocks signed off for 2018 with a 1-0 victory away at Shoreham.

It's been a year that the Robins won't remember too fondly. They won just three times in the first five months on their way to the club's lowest finish for 24 years in April.

Relegation to Division One was only avoided due to the restructuring of the Bostik League which saw both Haywards Heath Town and Three Bridges promoted whilst only Saturday's opponents were relegated.

It's been a much better second half of the year however, Mark Dalgleish's work on the transfer front over the course of the summer greatly improving the squad and leaving Hassocks just six points behind their 2017-18 points total with 18 games still left to play.

Benson was one of the Hassocks manager's new signings, returning to the Robins after six months with Lancing and his ninth goal of the season won all three points at Middle Road.

It arrived with 30 minutes played. Shoreham couldn't clear a Jake Lindsey corner and when Spencer Slaughter drove in a low shot from the edge of the box, Benson showed quick reactions to stick out a foot and divert the ball over the head of Ben Kirk-Patrick guarding the post and into the top corner.

There were plenty of chances for both sides to score further across the 90 minutes. That neither could was largely down to the brilliance of the two goalkeepers on show.

Hassocks supporters needed no introduction to the man with the gloves for Shoreham.

James Broadbent was a hugely popular figure during his one-season at the Beacon, picking up a clean sweep of Player's Player, Manager's Player and Supporter's Player of the

Year at the end of the 2016-17 campaign before moving to Shoreham for Bostik League football.

Broadbent stayed loyal to the Musselmen this summer and reminded his former club of all his qualities with a string of excellent first half saves which prevented Hassocks from running away with the game.

He saved from Harvey Blake from point-blank range after a brilliant run and cross from Joe Bull and then five minutes later produced a stunning stop at full stretch after Bull stepped around Daley McLennan and fired in a shot from the edge of the box.

Before those two opportunities, Slaughter sent a looping effort just over the bar and Lindsey bent a free kick wide of the post in what was a frenetic start from the Robins.

Bull went close again before the break, a driving run from midfield ending with a shot that wasn't too far away.

The second half began in much the same fashion with the visitors on top once Shoreham captain Ross Myers had fired over after from the edge of the box after cutting through the Robins' midfield.

Hassocks then hit the crossbar, a cleverly worked short freekick routine involving Harry Mills and Slaughter seeing the latter's shot crash against the woodwork with Broadbent beaten and Johnson's pace took him in on goal and around Broadbent but the angle and the covering of defender Lee Denyer did for him.

Benson went on a driving run down the right flank before cutting inside and shooting but Broadbent made another excellent stop low down to his left, although Benson perhaps should have squared with Johnson, Slaughter and Lindsey all in support.

That woke Shoreham up and they were much the better side in final 20 minutes, which is where Green earned the Robins' man-of-the-match award for an unbelievable spell in which he pulled off five excellent saves in the space of a couple of minutes.

Firstly, he turned away a low shot from Ryan Carse and when Bradley Tighe's clearance was returned into the box by Alfie Proto-Gates, Green was forced into an acrobatic stop to keep out Myers' header.

From the resulting corner, McLennan rose like the proverbial salmon but somehow Green flew across his goal to get a fingertip onto the ball and turn it around the post.

The next corner was an equally good delivery. This time, it fell to McLennan at the far post and his low volley was blocked by the feet of Green who then recovered brilliantly to block George Olulode's attempt from the rebound.

Shoreham had a couple of other chances, Myers firing over and Kirk-Patrick seeing a dangerous cross headed away by Jordan Badger.

There was one freekick each in the final five minutes, Broadbent punching away Slaughter's delivery with Dan Stokes' controlled volley dropping onto the roof of the net and then Green confidently dealt with a Thomas Johnston delivery with the last play of the game.

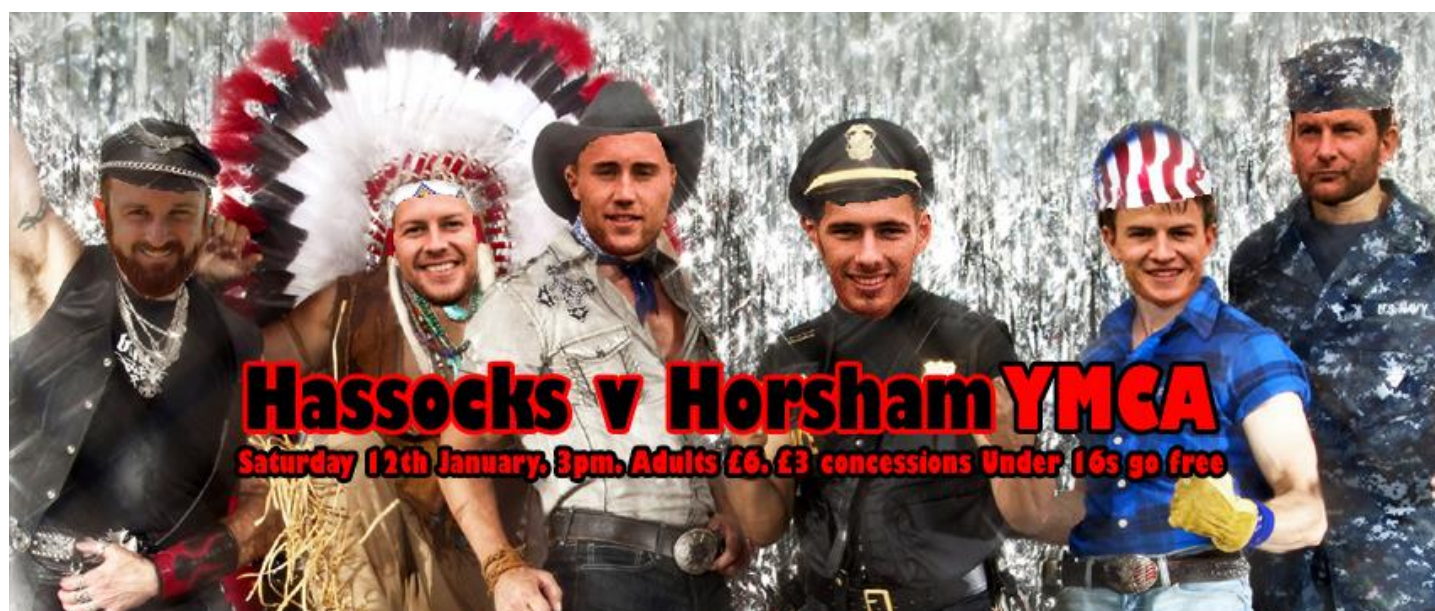

2013 – ROBINS HAVE THEIR WINGS CLIPPED BY LOBSTERS

It was an afternoon in which nothing seemed to go right for Hassocks as they went down to a 3-1 defeat away at promotion hopefuls Redhill.

Manager Mickey Jewell was absent from the dugout with illness for the third game running, leaving assistant boss Mark Dalgleish to take charge of the side.

His cause wasn't helped by the Robins being without two of their most influential players, midfielder Kieran O'Callaghan and top scorer Phil Gault both being absent for the trip to Kiln Brow.

These two sides had already met in this part of Surrey once this season, Hassocks picking up a fine 2-0 win two months previously in the John O'Hara League Cup, but the Lobsters have improved remarkably since then and look like they could be one of the few teams to give Peacehaven & Telscombe a run in the title race.

They showed their promotion credentials almost from the first whistle and by full time, Hassocks were indebted to goalkeeper Simon Lehykj for a string of fine saves which not only kept the score down, but even gave the Robins the chance of nicking what would have been an undeserved draw until the tie was decided late on.

Lehykj was quick off his line to deny Josh Bennett twice in the opening stages before Redhill were awarded a controversial penalty just after the half hour mark.

A long ball over the top looked like

it had been overhit for Gavin Gordon and when it became apparent that Gordon was not going to get there before Lehykj, the home striker threw himself to the ground under minimal contact outside the box.

Remarkably, referee Chris Bull not only deemed it to be a foul, but he also decreed it had taken place inside the area, giving Gordon the opportunity to dust himself down and send Lehykj the wrong way from the spot.

In fairness to Redhill, their dominance did deserve the lead no matter the manner in which they'd been handed it and it was somewhat out of the blue when Hassocks equalised on the stroke of half time.

In the absence of Gault, Nathan Miles was asked to plough a lone furrow up front and despite the lack of support from his team mates, he summoned up a moment of sheer magic to hit a 30-yard effort that flew over home goalkeeper Chris Duffy after some neat interplay between Anthony Hibbert and Nathan Cooper in midfield.

Hassocks were below par again for the first 15 minutes of the second half, not helped by a nasty challenge on Lee Bryant which brought a premature end to the defenders afternoon, and they were made to pay when Chris Gregson made it 2-1 on the hour.

It was a poor goal to concede from a defensive point of view, Gregson being allowed far too much space at the far post to control and finish after a corner had only been

partially cleared.

Dalgleish reacted to that by pushing Cooper further forward to support Miles and Hassocks came into the game more as a result.

They nearly had a second equaliser when Duffy fumbled and Spencer Slaughter capitalised by chipping him but home defender John Trotter did brilliantly to get back and clear off the line.

There were other opportunities to snatch a point before Redhill belatedly made the game safe with two minutes remaining.

Hassocks had committed plenty of bodies forward at that point in the search for a leveler and the Lobsters took full advantage of the extra space available to them at the other end, Gregson leading a sweeping counter attack down the left which found Gordon only for Lehykj to bring the striker down in the box.

There could be no complaints about the award of this one, and again Gordon finished neatly from the spot for his second and Redhill's third of the afternoon.

Eastbourne United this season?

It's been a difficult campaign for Eastbourne United so far. Manager Tobi Hutchinson resigned on the eve of the season with player Ryan Cooper stepping into the breach. Sam Fisk

One of the most talented players to come through the Hassocks youth system, Sam Fisk was just 16-years-old when he made his debut for the Robins first team towards the end of the 2003-04 season.

By that point in time, he was already a regular in the thirds and helped Simon Maskell's side lift the Montgomery Cup in 2004 before playing a significant role in the title winning Under 18s side of 2006.

Dave John made Fisk a regular in his first team from the 2006-07 season, using him as both a left wing back and a central midfielder over the course of the next two seasons before he moved to Australia spell.

Fisk returned for a handful of games in 2008-09 before being snapped up by Lewes, where he tasted Conference Premier football.

A subsequent move to Whitehawk followed and he lifted the Southern Combination League title with the Hawks before joining Burgess Hill Town, where he remains to this day.

Fisk racked up a total of 104 appearances for Hassocks, scoring six times as well as having the distinction of playing alongside his father Andy for the first, reserves and third teams.

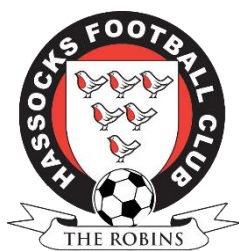
