

It's the meeting of the two longest serving teams in the Premier Division this afternoon, meaning there is a rich history of games between Hassocks and Arundel...

The Robins have been in the top flight since 1994 with Arundel's unbroken run of Premier Division football stretching from 2000.

In that time, there have been 43 leagye meetings with nothing much to separate the two sides.

Hassocks have won on 15 occasions, Arundel and 13 while there have been 15 draws.

What those statistics don't tell you though is that it has traditionally been the home side who have triumphed although that trend has been under threat in recent seasons, Arundel winning 4-0 on their last visit to the Beacon in December 2017 and Hassocks returning from Mill Road with a 3-1 success back in September.

It was a well-deserved victory for Mark Dalgleish's side but it also pointed to a long, hard season ahead for the Mullets and so it has proven as they arrive here embroiled in the relegation battle.

That's nothing new to Arundel; they pulled off a fantastic great escape from relegation from a pretty perilous position last season and if they can rediscover some of that form then with any luck, they'll get themselves out of the mire before the end of the campaign.

One quality that Arundel do possess that the other sides around them at the bottom of the table is goals thanks to the presence in their ranks of Benjamin Gray.

Gray is one of the top scorers in the division despite the Mullet's lowly position and as long as he keeps fit and firing for Simon Hull's side, they'll have a chance of escaping the drop.

Their recent run of fixtures hasn't helped their league position, the Mullets having lost to both leaders Chichester City 6-1 and second placed Newhaven 6-0 since the turn of the year.

Sandwiched in between those results was a hugely encouraging 3-1 win over Lancing while earlier in the season they claimed an impressive point away at high-flying Broadbridge Heath and also beat Peacehaven & Telscombe at home.

That points to the fact that the Mullets can be dangerous opponents on their day and Hassocks will know they'll have to be at their best to stand a chance of picking up all three points and pushing themselves closer to safety.

JONNO BACK WITH A DOUBLE AS HASSOCKS FINALLY GET A WIN

Hassocks are finally up and running as the Robins got their first win of the season at the fifth time of asking thanks to a 3-1 success away at Arundel.

Phil Johnson netted his first goals since his summer return to the Beacon with a brace and Dan Stokes was the other man on target as a superb Robins display blew away the Mullets.

Hassocks have been threatening a performance like this for time.

They've looked good in glimpses in their previous four outings without ever managing to sustain it over the course of 90 minutes, normally due to wastefulness in front of goal or sloppy errors at the back.

They had to negotiate a difficult start against dangerous opponents at Mill Road – Arundel came into the game unbeaten in the league and with a hugely impressive 4-1 FA Cup win against Chertsey Town to their name – before going onto control proceedings and run out deserved winners.

Last time these two sides met in December, the Mullets left the Beacon 4-0 winners with Hassocks unable to cope with the movement of the Arundel's lively forward players.

It looked like it might be a similar story here in the opening exchanges as the hosts dominated for the first 20 minutes.

Hassocks looked nervy and it was only once the excellent Harry Mills and Will Broomfield down the right side of the Robins defence got to grips with their opponents that the Robins began to come into proceedings.

Hassocks could've taken the lead at that stage but for a bizarre set of circumstances.

Referee Jonathan Wilks had played an excellent advantage, allowing Hassocks to break and when it looked like that advantage had come to nothing as the ball was played back to Daniel Stevens in the Arundel goal, Mr Wilks pulled back play to award the visitors the initial free kick.

That was lucky for Stevens as seconds after Mr Wilks had stopped play, Stevens made a total hash of his clearance, smashing the ball into the back of defender Nathan Foster which resulted in it looping into the back of the net.

Unfortunately for Hassocks, they then squandered the opportunity from the resulting free kick.

A few minutes later and the Robins misery at not being 1-0 ahead was compounded as Arundel took the lead.

Hassocks failed to deal with a long ball over the top which was flicked on allowing Gray a free run at goal.

Alex Harris did manage to save the initial effort but Gray wasn't to be denied and he tucked away the rebound.

A piece of individual brilliance from Harvey Blake nearly dragged Hassocks back into it.

Blake embarked on a mazy run from left back which took him past virtually the whole Arundel team to 12 yards out from the Mullets goal where his left footed strike was only kept out by a combination of Stevens' fingertips and the crossbar.

Arundel were just two minutes away from reaching half time with the lead when the Robins equalised.

Spencer Slaughter sent a perfect free kick delivery onto the head of Broomfield and his header across goal was met by Johnson who turned the ball in for his 47th Hassocks goal.

Slaughter was again the architect of the Robins second which arrived on the hour mark.

This time, the midfielder drove out to the left, riding a couple of challenges along the way before playing the ball into Johnson's feet.

Johnson managed to find the onrushing Stokes who, having been told at half time by coach Mark Price that he could be the Robins match winner, duly sent a splendid strike into the top corner.

Jack Wilkins work rate and movement earned him a few half chances as Hassocks went looking for a third to kill the game off with the midfield three of Slaughter, Stokes and Alex Spinks offering great control throughout the second half.

It was a classic Johnson goal that wrapped things up with just a minute of normal time remaining. Blake hit a long ball over the top which Johnson's explosive pace took him onto and a brilliant first touch saw him round Stevens to slot home.

LAWMAN JOHNSON MAKES HIS CASE WITH LATE DOUBLE

Two goals in two minutes from Phil Johnson transformed Hassocks' afternoon at Mill Road as they came from behind right at the death to win 3-2 away at Arundel.

With 88 minutes gone, this looked like being another disappointing day on the road for the Robins, a fortnight after they had been on the end of a chastening 4-1 hammering at Sidley United.

On this occasion, they trailed 2-1 against a Mullets side who had been completely dominant up until that point and who must have thought they had the three points in the bag.

But by the time the clock ticked around to 90 minutes, Johnson had intervened with two sweet finishes to boost Mickey Jewell's sides hopes of a top seven finish.

Johnson has missed large chunks of this season due to his ongoing law training, but his lack of game time clearly hasn't affected his eye for goal.

In his sporadic appearances so far, he's managed four goals in five appearances for the reserves and this double took him onto four in nine for the first team.

And he clearly has a liking for playing Arundel too.

It was against the Mullets when he really announced himself in the Hassocks set up with a sensational hat-trick as the youth team defeated their Arundel counterparts 3-2 to lift the Sussex County Under 18 League Cup back in 2008.

Two of Johnson's team mates from that success over the Mullets were also in the starting line up here, Nathan Miles having firmly established himself in the first team while Nathan Cooper is enjoying a run of games as injuries and unavailability bite Jewell's squad as the campaign comes to a close.

The Hassocks boss was without five key players at Arundel with Stuart Faith, Ashley Marsh, Anthony Hibbert, Phil Gault and Elliott Butler all missing.

That meant rare starts for Johnson and Stuart Brown who came in at right back with Rob South, captaining the club for the first time in the absence of Faith, Mash and Gault, switching to the left.

Jewell also called up the Robins' record goal scorer James Laing, now a regular in the reserves, for his first start since January 2011.

The bench meanwhile was made up of youth teamers Ryan John and Aaron Czech and goalkeeper Reece Wickwar, who was used as an emergency striker in the closing stages for the second game running in a sign of just how stretched Hassocks' resources are at the minute.

Despite the patchy look of their side, it was the Robins who took the lead with 20 minutes played.

Hassocks have been trying to make something of South's relatively long throws all season and they finally did so when a huge toss into the box wasn't convincingly dealt with by the Arundel defence, giving Jamie Weston the opportunity to produce a fine finish from outside the box.

Hassocks led for just 10 minutes before a quick-fire double from Grant Thetford took Arundel from 1-0 down to 2-1 ahead.

His first arrived 10 minutes when he took full advantage of a weak Hassocks clearance to beat Simon Lehkyj and his second was a rebound from a penalty after Lehkyj had brilliant kept out the initial spot kick.

Lehkyj was by far the busier keeper in the second half with a string of crucial saves that ensured Hassocks weren't out the tie by the time Johnson conjured up his two minutes of magic.

The first of those arrived with 88 played, substitute John doing well to head a ball in down towards Johnson who was waiting to bring it under control before scrambling home.

Then just one minute later he latched onto a clever through-ball from Weston, outstripping home defender Ashley Hunter for pace before slotting past James Fernandes in the Arundel goal to complete a stunning comeback.

Jack Simpson

Goalkeeper Simpson was in his first season as number one when East Preston visited and would go onto play 161 times for the club. He retired in 2014 after a number of finger and shoulder complications.

Dan Jacques

One of three members of the Hassocks side from a decade ago to still be at the club, Jacques has flitted in and out of the first team picture over the past 10 years including a two-year spell when he left the Robins to play Lindfield.

Richard Thompson

Thompson had another season as first team left back with a few sporadic appearances following in 2010-11 before he retired that summer after 324 games. Now spends his Saturdays watching Brighton.

Ashley Marsh

Already a popular figure at the Beacon by this point, Marsh would go onto become the second highest Hassocks appearance maker in senior football, playing 525 times before his retirement a year ago.

Stuart Faith

Went onto captain the club to its highest ever finish of fourth in 2011-12. Stepped down from first team duty in the summer of 2013 but continued to play for the third and reserve until the end of 2015-16. Ended his Hassocks career on 289 appearances.

Sol Bowra

Left the club a little over a year after the EP defeat to move to Southwick and has since represented Peacehaven & Telscombe and among others.

Sam Fisk

The EP game was one of four appearances Fisk made in 2008-09 after returning from a spell in Australia before being snapped up by Conference Premier side Lewes. He won the Southern Combination League title with Whitehawk in 2011 and has spent the past seven years with Burgess Hill Town.

Spencer Slaughter

The man who always comes back to the Beacon! Slaughter has moved to Worthing, Burgess Hill Town, Haywards Heath Town and spent a year travelling, but he always returns to Hassocks eventually. Now in his fourth spell at the club and closing in on the 300 games mark.

Anthony Hibbert

A mainstay for another five-and-a-half years, Hibbert ended up the club's fifth highest appearance maker with 462 and the fourth highest scorer on 124.Retired at Horsham YMCA in the summer of 2016

Laurence Robinson

Played through the pain barrier of serious knee complications to help Hassocks battle to safety that season and never really recovered, managing just 10 more first team games over the next six years before he retired in 2014 through injury.

Jamie Buckett

Scored five times in 21 games in his only season with the club. Currently at Seaford Town but has also played for Saltdean United, Crowborough Athletic and Langney Wanderers.

Ben Bowra

Younger brother of Sol, he was an unused sub against EP and never made a first team appearance for the Robins.

Ian Dawson

Popular player coach who last played in the 2010-11 season. Now lives in America.

Nick Pitcher

Eventually became a first team regular in 2013-14, racking up 130 games before leaving for Burgess Hill Albion in the summer of 2017.

Adam Williams

Lifted the League Cup as Under 18s captain at the end of that season and stayed at the Beacon until the summer of 2010. Has since played for Haywards Heath Town, Loxwood and Balcombe in the Mid Sussex League

Phil Wickwar

Has gone onto manage the reserves, the first team and assist with the thirds. A man who would do any job you ask him for the cub, Wickwar is currently employed as physio.

LACKLUSTRE ROBINS LOSE OUT TO CUP SPECIALIST OAKMEN

Hassocks 1-2 AFC Uckfield Town

After their stunning 5-3 victory over third placed Horsham YMCA three days previously, this was a case of after the Lord Mayor's show for Hassocks as they went down to a 2-1 defeat to AFC Uckfield Town.

The Oakmen have carved out a reputation as cup specialists this season, having been the Southern Combination League's last representatives in the FA Vase when embarking on a club-record best run to the fourth round.

And Anthony Storey's side still harbour hopes of lifting a first piece of senior silverware with a Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup quarter final and a Peter Bentley League Cup semi-final to come.

That knockout form suggests that on their day, they can be one of the better sides in the Premier Division and they certainly had their day at the Beacon, an impressive performance bringing to an end the Robins' four game winning run.

Mark Dalgleish made one change to the side who had blown YM away so impressively at the weekend, Spencer Slaughter returning in place of Harvey Enticknap with the young midfielder dropping down to the bench.

It was the visitors who made the faster start to the game, Ellis Cormack looking lively from the off with a couple of probing runs that told Will Broomfield and Dan Jacques that they

were going to be in for quite a busy evening at the heart of the Hassocks defence.

Hassocks by contrast were lacklustre throughout, no doubt feeling the effects of their exertions against YM as they failed to really test Louis Rogers in the Uckfield goal.

The first real chance of the game arrived in the 15th minute, Cormack showing that he is as good in the air as he is with his feet when rising to meet a Regan Smith corner but his header was kept out by Josh Green's crossbar.

Callum Smith's pace then allowed him to spring the Hassocks offside trap but he dragged his low shot just wide and a rare Hassocks foray forward was snuffed out when James Littlejohn's cross was cleared by a Steve Hickman-Smith header with Richie Welch clearing up before Phil Johnson could pounce on the loose ball.

Littlejohn and Johnson both saw efforts well blocked while Rogers was quick off his line to thwart Johnson as





the Hassocks captain attempted to latch onto a through ball.

There were less than 60 seconds of regulation time in the first half remaining when Uckfield took the lead, Bailo Camara embarking on a winding run down the left flank to cross for Dee Okojie who arrived from the right flank to tap home at the far post.

Uckfield began the second period as brightly as they had the first, Smith firing narrowly over as the Robins struggled to respond to the blow of going behind so close to the interval.

Matters got even worse for the hosts just before the hour mark when Uckfield doubled their lead, defender Taylor Maddock producing a flicked header from a freekick for 2-0.

Welch then sent an effort fizzing over as the Oakmen looked to kill off the game but their desire to get the third left Hassocks with spaces to exploit on the break and Matt Barbosa had to be alert to put in a couple of challenges to prevent Johnson and Liam Benson from taking advantage.

Hassocks did manage to pull one back but it was a case of too little, too late as Johnson emphatically beat Rogers from the spot with a 94th minute penalty.

HASSOCKS BOUNCE BACK ON ANOTHER FRUITFUL OVAL TRIP

On the face of it, Hassocks 2-0 victory over Eastbourne United looks like exactly the sort of result that the Robins should have expected from their trip to face the Southern Combination League Premier Division's bottom club.

In reality though, this was in fact a hugely impressive three points against rejuvenated opponents who surely won't be propping up the table come the end of the season.

United may have just three wins to their name so far, but all of those have come in the last month since new boss Arron Hopkinson took over the managerial hotseat at the Oval.

Hopkinson's made his mark fast, bringing in a number of quality players and beating title challengers Saltdean United away from home, taking a point off fifth place Broadbridge Heath and being only seconds away from drawing with Newhaven before Lee Robinson's 93rd minute intervention three weeks ago won the game for the Dockers.

This is a side far removed from the one which Hassocks swatted aside 3-0 at the Beacon in September and one who on this showing have a genuine chance of pulling off a great escape from relegation, all of which makes Mark Dalgleish's sides fifth win in their past six games as impressive as any that have come before in this purple patch that they've hit.

Perhaps the most pleasing aspect of the result however was the way in which Hassocks bounced back from their midweek defeat to AFC Uckfield Town.

As player-coach Spencer Slaughter pointed out afterwards, "In recent times, we tend to go on either a winning streak or a losing one and we often then find it difficult to break the sequence."

"So to get back to winning ways straight away is another important step in our development and keeps us moving up the table."

Slaughter started on the bench here, one of three changes made by Dalgleish from that 2-1 loss to the Oakmen with the unavailable Will Broomfield missing out and Joe Bull also dropping down among the substitutes.

In their places came Andy Whittingham, Harvey Enticknap and Dan Stokes.

It was a fairly even opening first half with one moment of real quality arriving on 42 minutes which proved to be the difference as James Littlejohn sent the visitors into the break 1-0 ahead.

United poured forward in the second half as the Hassocks goal came under sustained pressure with the back four of Bradley Tighe, Whittingham, Harry Mills and Dan Jacques having to be at their very best to repel everything the hosts could throw at them.

Jacques in particular was superb, winning his second consecutive manof-the-match award in the process as he didn't put a foot wrong all afternoon.

Hassocks continued to look lively on the break thanks to the tireless work of Liam Benson who has really come into his own over the last month, becoming a vital focal point for the Robins new style as a target man.

The other crucial ingredient for their ability to be so dangerous on the break is the pace and finishing of Phil Johnson and it was he who wrapped the game up with Hassocks' second of the afternoon with around 15 minutes remaining.

Johnson started the move, releasing Slaughter down the right from where he delivered a lovely cross which Johnson met with an inch-perfect finish in off the post after continuing his run into the box.

To their credit, United kept pushing for a goal of their own but it wasn't to be as Hassocks held on to pick up their sixth consecutive win at the Oval, a remarkable run stretching back eight years to 2010 when United were reigning champions.

Rye United returned to the Salts on Wednesday night but any hopes of a dream homecoming were crushed by a Hassocks side who clearly hadn't read the script.

The Robins put in arguably their finest performance of the date so far to return from this longest of journeys east with a 2-1, inflicting on United their first defeat since the start of November.

This was Rye's first game at their home ground since a diabolical arson attack had burned their clubhouse to the ground in August.

As a result, they've spent the past five months living a nomadic existence by playing at a number of different home grounds including Little Common, where the Quarterboys ended Hassocks' John O'Hara League Cup hopes at the second-round stage back in October.

Yet despite the setback of being rendered homeless for half the season, Rye have reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and with a sack full of games in hand over those above them, they are the only realistic challengers to Three Bridges and Crawley Down in the battle to win the league.

Not that any of that mattered to Hassocks, the Robins paying no attention to form, standings or occasion as they bounced back from a woeful 1-0 loss at struggling Lingfield at the weekend to pick up three vital points and end a run of three defeats in a row.

Rye have installed a temporary clubhouse at the Salts until a more permanent structure can be funded and anybody still checking out the new facilities as the game kicked off would have missed the first goal as it arrived with just 30 seconds played.

Spencer Slaughter was the early gate crasher of the party, striking his 13th of the season in a Hassocks move that came straight from kick off.

To their credit, Rye took going behind so early in their stride and only a brilliant reflex save from Jack Simpson kept out a Jack Dixon header from a Liam Upton cross.

There was nothing Simpson could do about the United equaliser which arrived with 20 minutes played, Dixon again showing his aerial abilities by rising to guide home a cross which this time came from Danny Ellis down the other flank.

The woodwork came to Hassocks' rescue twice in quick succession before half time, Dixon smashing the bar with a distance effort from outside the box and then a 25-yard free kick from Paul Tuppeney suffered the same fate.

Having weathered the storm and with rain now falling heavily, Hassocks stepped it up a gear in the second half and were rewarded for that positivity when Slaughter bundled home his second of the evening after a clever short corner routine led to Phil Gault hitting the bar.

Rye hit the post in the first minute of stoppage time but in the end, Hassocks were good value for their win in a textbook defensive performance away from home.

A lack of match practice meant it was always like to remain tight and to the home bench's obvious delight, they equalised for the second time with just eight minutes remaining after sprightly substitute Jordan Farrell stooped low to head home.

The joy was short lived, however. Just three minutes later and Hassocks retook the lead, an attack down the right ending with a shot blocked but the loose ball was turned back to Cooper who had timed his run to perfection to slam home.

Cooper celebrated wildly with massed crowd behind the goal but Hassock still had another five minutes to see out.

That they did was thanks to the efforts of Ben Palmer, Arni Kublickas, Nick Pitcher and Luke Pawson who manned the borders in the face of relentless Clymping pressure.

Staughton was delighted with his team's efforts, telling Hassocks FC TV afterwards, "It was a tough game, we didn't play particularly well but we showed great resilience to keep going forward considering the players we had missing."

"The support we had today was tremendous and I'd like to thank all nine of them for coming and creating a special atmosphere which drove us on."

Versatile Bradley Bant spent just short of four years at the Beacon between 2014 and 2018, racking up 131 appearances and scoring 12 times.

He became Dave John's last signing as Robins manager when he arrived from Lancing in November 2014 having previously played for East Grinstead Town and Shoreham among others.

Bant instantly established himself as a first team regular and his ability to play as either a number 10, a central midfielder, out wide on the left or even at left back made him an important asset as Hassocks battled against the drop in the 2014-15 season.

He was also a masterful deliverer of set pieces with in-swining corners in particular tending to cause havoc. In one memorable Peter Bentley League Cup game against Lingfield, he set two goals up from corners and even managed to score a brace in what was probably his finest performance in a Hassocks shirt.

Bant left the club a few weeks into this season and can now be found turning out for Peacehaven & Telscombe.


