

For the first time since their promotion to the Premier Division in 2014, Loxwood are embroiled in a relegation battle – but they're making a real fight out of it...

Like many of the sides currently towards the bottom of the table, Loxwood endured a difficult start to the season before their form picked up markedly once they'd made a managerial change.

Alex Walsh was the new man in the hotseat, leaving his role as assistant manager with Hassocks' local rivals Haywards Heath Town to take over at Plaistow Road at the start of November.

Since Walsh's appointment, the Magpies have acquired 13 of the 17 17 they've accumulated so far this season to haul themselves right back into the battle for Premier Division survival.

At the time of writing, they sit second bottom of the table but just two points behind Arundel, the team immediately above the dreaded relegation line.

A peek at their record against the Robins will give the visitors cause for optimism as well.

Hassocks have only won once in the short nine-game history of the fixture, that coming at Plaistow Road back in September when Mark Dalgleish's side ran out 4-0 victors through goals from Liam Benson, Spencer Slaughter and a Phil Johnson brace.

Other than that, the Magpies have won six times and there have been two draws while they've also enjoyed their trips to the Beacon, having never lost in Mid Sussex before.

That won't come as a surprise to anybody who has witnessed Loxwood here before, their slick, young attacking teams often proving to be too good with a set of impressive showings in their back catalogue.

A fair few of those young players who had made the Magpies such a formidable force in their time in the top flight to date have moved on which is why they've struggled slightly to date, but with Walsh at the helm things are definitely looking up.

That will make them dangerous opponents and Hassocks will need to be especially wary if they are to avoid a repeat of their 2-0 loss to Arundel here a fortnight ago.

## **Played for both**

Loxwood could have two former Hassocks players among their number today and there are a whole host of others who have represented both sides in the last five years alone.

Current Magpies captain **Eddie French** was one of the first major success stories to come through the Hassocks Youth System back in the late 1990's.

He led Dave John's successful Under 18 side as well as captaining the Sussex Representative side, something that no other youth player from the Robins has ever achieved.

With his natural talent, French became a regular in the first time at a young age and racked up 99 appearances, scoring 10 goals.

Needless to say, it wasn't long

before bigger sides came calling and French moved to Isthmian League side Horsham.

He went onto become a Hornets legend and was part of the side that famously took League One's Swansea City to an FA Cup First Round replay in the 2007-08 season.

Also currently plying his trade at Plaistow Road is midfielder **Lewis Westlake** who left Hassocks this summer, moving to Loxwood via a brief spell with Lancing.

Westlake racked up 62 appearances for the Robins across the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons, scoring four times for the club.

Another player to have made the move to the Magpies this summer was **Michael Death** who left the Beacon after 38 goals in 112

appearances for Hassocks.

He won't be here today though – Death recently moved to Lancing having managed five goals from 24 games for Loxwood.

Striker **Charlie Pitcher** has enjoyed a couple of spells with both clubs, but he was unable to bring his prolific form from his time at Loxwood to the Beacon, managing just three goals in 22 games in a Hassocks shirt.

French isn't the only successful Hassocks Under 18s captain to play for the Magpies either – **Adam Williams** captained the young Robins to their League Cup title success in 2009 and played 24 times for the first team before moving to Haywards Heath Town and then later, Loxwood.

# NINTH TIME LUCKY AS HASSOCKS HAMMER LOXWOOD

Since their promotion to the Southern Combination League Premier Division in 2014, Loxwood have proven to be the most difficult of opponents for Hassocks.

In eight previous meetings between the two, the Robins had never won and only had two points to show for their efforts against the Magpies thanks to a couple of 1-1 draws back when Loxwood were in their first season in the top flight.

That barren run of form ended at Plaistow Road and in quite spectacular fashion too as Hassocks ran out convincing 4-0 winners.

The Robins had put on an outstanding second half of football in their midweek Peter Bentley League Cup comeback win over Bexhill United and it was a similar story here as three second half goals added to Liam Benson's first half opener to secure their biggest win in nearly two years.

Mark Dalgleish made two changes to the side that had beaten the Pirates.

Will Broomfield took the place of unavailable captain Jordan Badger which necessitated a move to left back for Dan Jacques and Alex Spinks returned at the expense of Ryan Collins who dropped to the bench.

In Badger's absence, Phil Johnson captained Hassocks for the first time and although he marked the occasion with two goals and another man-of-the-match showing, Johnson was keen to point out that this was a real team effort.

"It was a great team performance and everyone is working really hard for each other all over the pitch," Johnson said afterwards.

"The back four and Josh in goal in particular were excellent and they thoroughly deserved their clean sheet.

"There's a good vibe in the dressing room at the moment and we're all looking forward to the next game as we're enjoying our football."

The Robins faithful are enjoying it too.

They saw their side take the lead after some good build up play put Matt Berridge into a shooting position and although the post denied him what would have been his first senior goal, Benson did what all good strikers do and followed up to sniff out the rebound and scramble it over the line.

Loxwood began the second half the brighter of the two sides, bombarding the Hassocks goal with crosses and corners but as Johnson highlighted, Josh Green put on a real show of confident goalkeeping in claiming everything that came into his box.

It wasn't just with his dominance that Green impressed.

He also made a couple of crucial saves late on to prevent what might otherwise have become a nervy last 10 minutes and Dalgleish now has a real selection dilemma on his hands with Alex Harris set to be available after completing his three game ban against East Preston on Tuesday night.

Thanks to Green's excellence and

the efforts of Jacques, Broomfield, Harry Mills and Harvey Blake, Hassocks withstood that 10 minutes of relentless pressure before hitting Loxwood with a sweeping counter attack move.

One minute the ball was in the Hassocks box and the next Johnson was skipping past Josh Courtney and cutting the ball back to the far post where Spencer Slaughter was arriving for a tap in.

That seemed to break the Magpies' spirit somewhat and 11 minutes later Johnson notched his first of the afternoon, cutting inside from way out on the touch line and hitting one from distance which picked up a slight deflection on the way through to beat home goalkeeper Liam Matthews.

Johnson's second was a goal of the highest quality as he powered past former Hassocks favourite Eddie French and then breezed past French's defensive partner Ollie Joels to slot past the advancing Matthews with 15 minutes remaining.

# WINLESS RUN STRETCHED TO 10 FOR HAPLESS HASSOCKS

It rained goals at Plaistow Road when Hassocks when to Loxwood in December 2015 as the Magpies and the Robins scored eight times between them, the highest scoring match in the history of the fixture so far...

It's now ten games without a victory for Hassocks as a 5-3 defeat away at high flying Loxwood condemned the Robins to their worst winless run in over a decade.

And it was an all too familiar story at Plaistow Road as two goals in the final five minutes of the first 45 turned the game around as the Robins saw a deserved 2-1 lead flipped on its head to leave them going into the break trailing 3-2.

Of the 38 goals Hassocks have conceded in the league this season, 12 have come in the last five minutes of either half.

It is this alarming habit of capitulating after 40 minutes work that is really harming their cause in a season that is again beginning to look like a desperate struggle against the drop into Division One.

Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar have been busy on the transfer front in the last week in an attempt to shake their side out of this slump.

Midfielder James Westlake has returned from Haywards Heath Town after leaving the Beacon in 2013 to move to St Francis Rangers.

Another familiar face back in Hassocks colours is goalkeeper Alex Harris who last played for the Robins in the 2013-14 season on-loan from Woking.

Since then, Harris has played for a number of clubs, the most recent being Metropolitan Police in the Ryman League.

Both Westlake and Harris started at Plaistow Road but not even their presence could prevent Hassocks' losing run hitting double figures.

The Robins could have been forgiven for looking rusty given that this was their first game in 17 days if you excuse the encounter with

Worthing United that was abandoned at half time at the weekend after an electrical problem in the village knocked out the Beacon's power supply and with it, the floodlights.

Yet they went ahead with just three minutes played when Bradley Bant's corner sailed straight in despite the call of "safe" from Loxwood goalkeeper Sam Smith.

The lead was short lived as it lasted just nine minutes, Michael Death being desperately unlucky to deflect a Josh Courtney cross past Harris, hardly the welcoming present that the young goalkeeper would have liked to receive.

At the other end, Smith obviously wasn't content with playing his part in giving Hassocks their opener as he did his level best to hand Spencer Slaughter a golden opportunity to make it 2-1.

Quite what the Loxwood man was doing as he came charging out of goal is anybody's guess but it nearly ended in tears, Slaughter beating him to the ball but the midfielder's subsequent effort on goal rolled agonisingly wide.

Smith was again involved when Hassocks retook the lead on 35

minutes as he failed to collect after a strong challenge from Phil Gault allowed Dan Jacques' cross to drop in at the far post.

Then came those two quick fire goals from the hosts with the impressive Ollie Gill the architect of both.

First, he slipped in Jon Nurse after Loxwood launched a devastating counter attack from a Hassocks corner and he then teed up Michael Wood who gave the Magpies the lead.

Gill himself made it 4-2 five minutes after the restart with a low drive from distance and the game was up on the hour mark when Nurse added his second of the evening and Loxwood's fifth by rounding off another counter attack despite everybody in the ground expecting the goal to be ruled out for what appeared to be a blatant offside.

Hassocks added a late third of their own when substitute Josh Hawkes ended a goal mouth scramble from a free kick by firing home with the last kick of the game.

That was of course nothing more than a consolation but to score three times against a side who came into the game with the joint third best defensive record in the division will at least give the Robins some hope.

They certainly need it with this Saturday's game away against Wick & Barnham United, the side immediately above them in the table, feeling like it could be pivotal to where Hassocks are going this season.

# Enigmatic Jacques takes Hassocks January Player of the Month

Hassocks' enigmatic defender Dan Jacques has been voted as the Robins' Player of the Month for January 2019. The veteran of over 200 games for the club impressed with his displays at the heart of the Hassocks back four as Mark Dalgleish's side won three and lost two of their five fixtures, taking 53% of the vote. THE HASSOCKS It's hard to know where to start with regards to the fan favourites best performance of the month as he set a racked up three consecutive man of the match awards. Those came in the 2-1 home defeat to AFC Uckfield Town, the 2-0 win away at Eastbourne United and the 2-0 loss against Arundel at the Beacon. Jacques also starred in the 1-0 victory which kicked off the month against East Preston and the stunning 5-3 success against title chasing Horsham YMCA a week later. This is the first time that Jacques has been voted as Player of the Month and it is a welldeserved accolade for a player who remains extremely popular with the regulars in the Maurice Boxall Stand. Phil Johnson continued his remarkable run of always being the

bridesmaid but never the bride as he finished in second place for the fifth successive month.

The striker wore the armband throughout most of January with regular captain Jordan Badger missing and he responded with five goals, his best monthly haul of the season.

Two of those came against his former club YMCA in a man of the match performance while he also netted the only goal of the game against EP as well as Hassocks' second in their success away at Eastbourne United which took him onto 20 for the season.

Johnson remains the only man to have been voted into the top three for every poll so far having also acquired a third-place finish from the August poll to go with his raft of runners up medals.

In third place was Johnson's striker partner Liam Benson who notched in the 5-3 win over Horsham YMCA.

Benson's game was about so much more than goals in January though as he played a crucial role as a target man, particularly in the 2-0 success at the Oval.

The young striker is enjoying a particularly good time of it of late, having won the December Player of the Month vote while he is also approaching the milestone of 100 appearances for the Robins.

# Under 23s head into the lion's den as February fixtures announced

# February's fixtures have been announced and they send Hassocks Under 23s to reigning Southern Combination West Division champions Pagham.

The meeting between the current leaders and the defending champions is the most mouth-watering tie of the month, with Nigel Pearce's side set to travel to Nyetimber Lane this coming Thursday.

It was Hassocks who came out on top in the last meeting between the two in September as goals from Jake Lindsey and James Littlejohn secured a 2-0 success at the Beacon.

The Robins will know that a similar result from their long trip west will give their hopes of lifting a first trophy at Under 23 level a real boost.

Hassocks have never won at the home of the Lions before, there only previous visit coming last season when they were beaten 3-2 with Matt Berridge and Connor Bradley scoring.

Before that, the Robins were due to host Selsey at the Beacon 48 hours ago on Thursday night.

The Blues are the only team to

have beaten Hassocks in the league so far this season, winning 1-0 at the Bunn Leisure Stadium through Josh Hall's 14<sup>th</sup> minute strike back in October.

The Robins will round off the month with the visit of East Preston to the Beacon which comes a week after their trip to Pagham on Thursday 21st February.

EP led at the break last time the two sides met in the final fixture before Christmas through top scorer Dan Huet but a second half brace from Matt Berridge and a Max Willcox strike earned Hassocks all three points against the side currently sitting third in the table.

Hassocks' League Cup Quarter Final against Midhurst & Easebourne is also still to be rearranged after the original fixture fell to a frozen pitch in the last week of January.

The Under 18s have endured a frustrating time with the fixture list having been given two weeks off so their last outing, a 9-0 win over Rottingdean Village on January 20<sup>th</sup> and they've only got two games in February to look forward to as well.

The first of those is a huge one as

Central Division leaders Haywards Heath Town put their 100% record on the line when they make the short trip to the Beacon on Sunday February 10<sup>th</sup>.

Heath were the side who brought Hassocks' 392-day, 30-game undefeated streak to an end when winning 5-3 in the last meeting at Hanbury Park in October.

Brad Sweetman's side will have revenge on their minds then, as well as knowing that defeat against an outstanding Heath outfit would all but end their slim hopes of overhauling their local rivals in the race to defender their Central Division title.

The Under 18s other game of the month comes a week later at home to Steyning Town.

As for the ladies, they'll continue their push for the South East Counties Women's League Division One title with games against Burgess Hill Town on February 10<sup>th</sup> and Milford & Witley on the 24<sup>th</sup>, both at home.

There's also the small matter of the Sussex Women's Challenge Trophy against the Hillians to come on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March at Culver Road.

# Westlake to undertake 145-mile cycle for charity

Former Hassocks midfielder Lewis Westlake is set to undertake an epic 145 mile charity bike ride from London to Amsterdam to raise money for Prostate Cancer UK.

Lewis, who moved from the Beacon to today's opponents Loxwood in the summer, has signed up for Football to Amsterdam challenge, a 145-mile pedal pilgrimage to the Dutch capital which is backed by both the Football League and the League Managers Association.

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men, a disease which kills one man every 45 minutes – that's two men who die during one game of football.

The ride is supported by grassroots players, professional football club staff and legends of the game with the aim of raising money to try and make prostate cancer a disease that the next generation need

not fear.

It's a charity particularly close to both Lewis and his brother, Hassocks player and marathon man James Westlake's heart given that their father Phil, a familiar face around the Beacon with his camera, was diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2010 before receiving the all-clear in 2015 that he had won the battle against his awful disease.

Lewis is looking to raise £1200 in sponsorship and is well on the way to that target, helped by Loxwood dedicating their January game with Eastbourne Town to his fund with collections being held throughout the day at Plaistow Road, Magpies boss Alex Walsh and his squad donating their expenses to the cause and a generous donation of £200 from visitors Town.

# MULLETS WIN IN THE WIND AS ROBINS FAIL TO FIRE

It used to be the case that whenever the two longest serving teams in the Southern Combination League Premier Division met, whoever was at home out of Hassocks or Arundel would tend to win the game.

Well, not any more. The struggling Mullets won for the second successive season at the Beacon, going some of the way to avenging the fact that Hassocks have triumphed on their last two visits to Mill Road.

The most recent of those came in August, a 3-1 victory which was Hassocks' first of the campaign and pointed to a long season ahead for their hosts.

Those predictions have come true and Arundel arrived in Mid Sussex second bottom of the table with only three league wins to their name so far.

Win number four was achieved via second half goals from Benjamin Gray and Harry Russell, the 2-0 success lifting Simon Hull's side two places above Loxwood and Little Common and out of the relegation zone in the process.

To complete a miserable day for the hosts, they also saw left back Andy Whittingham dismissed in only his sixth appearance back in a Hassocks shirt since returning to the club after seven years away.

Mark Dalgleish made just one change to the side who had won at Eastbourne United a week previously, Jordan Badger returning at centre back with Harry Mills pushed into midfield to replace the unavailable Dan Stokes.

For all their good form since Christmas, Hassocks were a pale imitation of the side that had won five of their previous six matches and in truth, Arundel were deserved winners of an encounter low on any real quality.

Matters weren't helped by a hurricane that was blowing from one end of the Beacon down to the other, restricting Hassocks' normal potency as a counter attacking unit and ensuring that it was a stop-start game in which the Robins never really got going.

Before kick off, you'd have assumed that the side who defended the wind best would be the one who had the greater chance of winning the

Hassocks therefore would certainly have been the happier of the two sides at half time as they came in with the scores locked at 0-0 having had the gale in their face for the previous 45 minutes.

Liam Benson had the best chance in that first half when he found himself one-on-one with Daniel Stevens, but the figure of Arundel captain Jordan Dudas galloping back to try and retrieve the situation put Benson under added pressure and that was enough to seem him fail to finish.

The Mullets were well organised when it came to it being their turn to defend the wind after the break and Hassocks couldn't find a way through as Arundel gave their survival chances a real shot in the arm with a gritty





second half display.

The one thing that Arundel do have in the battle to avoid the drop that other teams in and around the relegation zone don't is an out-and-out goal scorer in the shape of Gray, and it was he who gave the Mullets the lead on 57 minutes with his 14<sup>th</sup> goal of the season.

Two key moments from a Hassocks point of view followed that.

The Robins' own improvement from regular strugglers to their current mid table position has been founded on acquiring a quality striker of their own in Phil Johnson, but the normally reliable marksman fluffed his lines when miscuing a James Littlejohn cross from just five yards out.

Had Johnson managed to convert, an equaliser at that point might have changed the game but that miss was compounded when Whittingham was shown red for a tackle from behind.

Those two moments lifted Arundel's spirits and they duly added a second through Harry Russell with 70 on the clock.

Despite there still being 20 minutes left and with Hassocks still having the wind advantage, there was no real optimism among the home support that the Robins were going to come back into the tie.

And so it proved, a lacklustre last quarter of an hour ensuring that Arundel left with all three points on another fruitful trip to the Beacon for the Mullets.



# TIGERS ROAR FOR AN HOUR TO SILENCE CHIRPY ROBINS

## **Saltdean United 4-1 Hassocks**



The Robins probably wish it had stayed that way as they were on the end of a bruising 4-1 defeat against a Tigers outfit who returned to form after several disappointing weeks.

Damion Freeman's side came into the clash with their title hopes hanging by a thread after a run of just three wins from their past 10 games.

But they rewarded the efforts of those who helped clear the pitch of snow with a scintillating performance once they'd weathered a Hassocks storm in the opening half hour.

Mark Dalgleish's side had their opponents pinned in their own half in that time, fashioning a succession of chances as they dominated possession with a helpful wind blowing behind their backs.

There was something of a surprise in the way that the Robins lined up, Harry Mills being relieved of his normal defence-minded duties to take up a box-to-box midfield role and he looked brilliant doing so, even managing to get on the score sheet.

That came in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute, a Joe Bull corner from the left being knocked down in the box by the chest of Phil Johnson, leaving Mills to produce a poacher's finish low and hard into the bottom corner.

Mills was clearly delighted with the goal as he celebrated with a cartwheel and forward role combo which ,although unlikely to attract the attentions of British gymnastics anytime soon, was the last that Hassocks deserved for the start they'd made.

Before Mills' opener, former Robins goalkeeper Nathan Stroomberg had to be alert to save twice from Phil Johnson, the Hassocks captain producing a troublesome low shot after collecting a Jordan Badger pass and then glancing a header goal wards from a huge Bradley Tighe free kick.

Mills had also gone close in between those two Johnson efforts, another delivery from Tighe resulting in a game of head tennis with Johnson flicking onto Mills whose header looked to be dropping in until it was well claimed by a stretching Stroomberg.

Mills' goal seemed to stir Saltdean into life and Hassocks' Under 18s goalkeeper Toby Fisher, deputising for the absent Josh Green, did well to push a free kick around the post.

Fisher then dealt with a low shot from the edge of the box and Bull went close at the other end after a dangerous run ended with an effort that drifted just wide with Stroomberg beaten.

Hassocks lost their intensity somewhat in the final 10 minutes of the half and seemed to tire, which proved to be fatal to their chances of taking their lead into the break as United scored twice in the final five minutes.

Curtis Gayler notched the first, a fine shot which the midfielder curled into the top corner from the edge of the box but really, the opportunity should never have existed in the first place as Mills' pressing wasn't being followed by his team mates who backed off and backed off, allowing Gayler the time and space he needed to beat Fisher.

It was in the final minute of the half that Saltdean took the lead, Dan Jacques' attempts to get out of the way of a shot seeing him only succeed in blocking it with his hand.

Although clearly not deliberate, Hassocks could have few arguments about referee Andrew Senior's decision to award a penalty which





was confidently dispatched by Gayler off the post.

Hassocks managed to fashion a chance for an equaliser straight from kick off, the lively Bull again tricking his way past a couple of defenders with Stroomberg punching the resulting cross straight to Johnson who caught the ball cleaning but with a little too much lift as it whistled agonisingly over the bar.

Saltdean dominated the second half and it was effectively game over when they added their third in the 61<sup>st</sup> minute.

Mills, Tighe and Will Broomfield were all in attendance but still a Bailie Rogers cross was able to bobbl across the box to Robin Keen who was somehow free to tap in.

A calamity pass from Broomfield then gifted Rogers possession but rather than head for Fisher's goal, he inexplicably tore off towards the corner flag from where he tried to claim a penalty despite the ball hitting the recovering Broomfield in the side.

Stroomberg made two good saves in the space of a minute, turning a Harvey Blake effort behind and then flying across goal to push away a Broomfield volley from the resulting corner.

Saltdean's fourth came with 10 minutes remaining, a long corner flying to the back post where substitute Will Berry was waiting for a free header.

There was one final opportunity to pull one back for Hassocks in the closing stages, a quick free kick from Spencer Slaughter being cleverly missed by Jack Baden which allowed Harvey Enticknap to get a shot away but again Stroomberg was equal to it.



# TWO MORE WINS AS THE LADIES KEEP ON ROLLING

Hassocks Ladies' winning run has kept on rolling over the last fortnight as they made it 11 wins from 11 league games with victory over Oakwood and then defeated higher division side Worthing to book a League Cup Semi Final spot...

Hassocks Ladies brushed aside the challenge of Oakwood to make it 11 wins from 11 games at the top of South East Counties Women's League Division West.

These two sides last met in the second game of the season, the Robins squeaking away from Tinsley Lane with a 1-0 success courtesy of a Billie Philpott strike.

Fast forward four months and that remains the closest that Hassocks have come to dropping a point in the league so far this season and the devastating way in which they dispatched of a team who pushed them so close last time they met shows just how far Martin Lee's side have come over the course of the campaign.

Following the pattern of recent games, this one started fairly evenly as Sam Newman had to intercept what could have been a dangerous Oakwood break, Katherine Chappell turned a Tallie Bright cross just wide and Claire Stevens has to head away an Oaks freekick.

Hassocks saw a goal disallowed for offside in the 19<sup>th</sup> minute but they weren't to be denied an opener for long as seven minutes later, Katherine Chappell hit an unstoppable effort from outside the box after a clever pass from Bright.

That sparked a goal rush as the Robins added a second and third in the space of five minutes as Philpott and then Kirsten Mair got in on the act to put the hosts in an extremely commanding position.

Credit to Oakwood though who despite having the wind taken out of their sails kept plugging away, sending a shot just over and then delivering a dangerous cross which Sarah Chappell confidently collected.

That was as good as it got for the visitors however as Hassocks' midfield three began to reassert themselves on proceedings with Gemma Craig making her first start after injury being particularly impressive alongside Chappell and Mair.

Three more chances came
Hassocks' way in quick succession
before the end of the half and they all
fell to Rushworth who saw an effort
blocked on the line, fired over when
well placed and was then just inches
away from meeting a through ball
from Emma Young.

The second half was just five minutes old when Hassocks added their fourth of the afternoon.

Rushworth found Mair out wide and her cross was met by Billie Philpott for her second.

Philpott then intercepted a weak backpass to play in Mair but her shot was just over the bar and Stevens saw a header cleared off the line.

Oakwood came into the game a little more after the hour mark and only some excellent defending from Chloe John and Young prevented them pulling one back.

The introduction of Ria Banitas broke that spell of Oakwood dominance and it was the substitute who created Hassocks' fifth, playing a perfect through ball for Philpott to latch onto and complete her hat-trick.

There were two more late opportunities to bring up the dozen but Mair fired over from a Chappell cross and Jodie Johanson and Philpott combined well to set up Banna Haines but her effort struck the post.

Hassocks Ladies delivered their best display of the season to progress to the semi finals of the League Cup by knocking out Premier Division side Worthing at Woodside Road.

This was a rerun of last season's final when the Robins defeated the same opponents 3-1 to lift the cup, a result that added some gloss to a campaign that ended in relegation for Hassocks.

They'll surely be back in the top fight next season having won 11 games out of 11 in Division One West and now with a stunning 7-2 victory against the Premier Division Rebels in the bank.

Boss Martin Lee highlighted the importance of a strong start and Hassocks certainly came out the traps with all guns blazing as Katherine Chappell had two attempts on goal and Kelly Rushworth fired over all in the first five minutes.

Top scorer Billie Philpott gave the Robins the lead with 10 minutes of the clock when she collected a Kirsten Mair pass and slotted past the goalkeeper before Worthing came back into the tie with Hassocks relying on some brave defending from Sam Newman, Chloe John and Emma Young to maintain their lead.

The Robins weathered the storm and were rewarded for their diligent defending by an amazing spell in which they scored three times in five minutes around the half hour mark.

Philpott scored the first of those when reacting in predatory fashion to convert a rebound after a good block from the Worthing goalkeeper, Rushworth added the next after a clever header from Claire Stevens and Chappell the one after following a clever pass from Philpott.

That blitz left Worthing shell shocked but they did recover, hitting the bar five minutes before half time with Robins goalkeeper Sarah Chappell then having to save bravely at an attackers feet.

Philpott completed a first half hattrick with Hassocks' fifth on the stroke of half time but there was still enough time for Worthing to pull one back to make it 5-1 going into the break.

Buoyed by that injury time goal, the Rebels started the second half the better and added a second within three minutes of the restart.

Sarah Chappell then had to make two fine saves and Tallie Bright produced a last ditch block before the introduction of Liz King saw Hassocks re-establish their authority on the tie with Rushworth scoring both the sixth and seventh goals as the Robins booked a last four meeting with Saltdean United

# Father & son

Harvey and Mark Enticknap are just one of a number of fatherand-son duos to have represented Hassocks in senior football.

While Harvey has made quite the impression so far this season in his 17 appearances to date, dad Mark made five starts and seven substitute appearances under Dave John in the early 2000's.

Probably the most famous fatherson pairing were Andy and Sam Fisk who even managed to take to the pitch together on a number of occasions for reserves and third teams as Sam began his career and Andy ended his.

Andy ended up playing 456 times for the Robins with Sam making 104 appearances before moving onto Lewes, Whitehawk and Burgess Hill Town.

Full back Joe Maskell played 20 times last season, following in the foot steps of his dad Dan who appeared four times for the Robins two decades previously.

Paul John made 329 appearances in goal during the late 1990's and his son Ben has played three times and was number one for last season's title winning youth team.

Hassocks chose a bad afternoon to give their worst performance of the season as they were completely outclassed by title chasing Arundel.

The Mullets were a slick, well-drilled side who passed the ball brilliantly and in truth they probably deserved to win by more than the four goals they did triumph by.

Ben O'Connor in the Arundel goal was a virtual spectator in the Beacon sunshine for most of the afternoon, with the Robins managing just one shot on target.

That came in the 49<sup>th</sup> minute and was from the unlikely source of wing back Ian Dawson, starting his first game of the season in place of Pete Lear.

The absence of the influential Lear decimated Dave John's already stretched defensive options to the point where the Hassocks boss had to play Richard Thompson as one of his three centre backs alongside retired former club captain Chris Hewitt, who stepped up from the reserves to help out.

On the plus side, Matt Robbins returned to the midfield engine room but Arundel were just too good for a side still missing Ashley Marsh and Anthony Hibbert.

The first goal didn't arrive until the 27<sup>th</sup> minute but once it did the floodgates opened as the Mullets moved through the gears with ease.

That opener was an individual goal of the highest quality, Mike Huckett eluding two of three tackles to weave into the box and coolly slot past Joel Harding.

The same player then fired over before his brother Matt came to the fore, drawing an excellent save from Harding and then forcing Faith into a goal line clearance after Hassocks failed to effectively clear a corner.

Arundel made it 2-0 seven minutes before half time, a Josh Sutcliffe free kick being headed home by Jason Wimbleton although he did have a helping hand from a deflection off James Laing which wrongfooted Harding.

The Mullets dominated possession in the second half as Hassocks struggled to get any meaningful service to Laing or Phil Gault.

Spencer Slaughter shot well wide in rare foray forward before Laing was replaced by teenage striker Laurence Robinson in a belated attempt to inject some pace into the hosts.

But even the streaky striker's introduction couldn't add any urgency to Hassocks' play with Josh Sutcliffe making it 3-0 on 69 minutes with a neat finish past Harding after he found himself in acres of space.

Frustrations began to boil over and Slaughter had to be subbed off before he was sent off after a flurry of fouls earned him a deserved booking.

Youth team midfielder Jamie Ingham replaced him and he did at least look to try and get Hassocks playing in an encouraging 15 minute cameo.

Number four for Arundel arrived in the 87<sup>th</sup> minute via a tap in for substitute George Gaskin and a miserable day for Hassocks was rounded off when Chris Brown aimed a wild kick at Mike Huckett to earn a red card and spark a mass fracas involving most of the players on the pitch and a fair few individuals from both dugouts as well.

At the sixth time of asking, Hassocks finally secured their first victory of 2013 as they won 5-0 away at Division One's bottom side, Worthing United.

Braces from James Westlake and Phil Gault and a first senior goal for Nathan Cooper ended the Robins' barren run of form in style.

The score line happened to be the same result as the Robins last victory which came on Boxing Day against St Francis Rangers.

The Mavericks meanwhile will be happy to see the back of Mid Sussex's two senior sides this season, having themselves gone down to Rangers 8-1 just four days previously.

Hassocks didn't come close to matching that rout racked up by their local rivals as they took their foot of the gas markedly in the second half, but that won't matter to Mickey Jewell who was just desperate for a result to get his side's season back on track.

Having some consistency in selection certainly helped.

For the first time since October and only the second time this season, Jewell was able to name an unchanged side from that which lined up in the Robins' last game, the 2-0 defeat at home to Pagham.

They began in flying fashion, taking the lead inside of 15 minutes when Westlake rounded United goalkeeper Tom Betts and slotted the ball home despite the best efforts of Josh Sutcliffe to clear off the line.

United came close to equalising with what was their best chance of the game just before the half hour mark, a corner from the left being met by the head of Mark Burgess but Simon Lehkyj reacted quickly to push the ball up and over the crossbar.

Stuart Faith then put a powerful header of his own from a Hassocks

corner wide and Gault was denied by Betts in a one-on-one before Cooper popped up at the back post with a neat finish to double the Robins advantage.

It was a timely moment for Cooper to bring the scoring qualities he's exhibited in the reserves over the last few seasons to the front side; Spencer Slaughter's recent move to Ryman League South outfit Worthing leaves Hassocks looking a little light when it comes to a source of goals from the middle of the park.

Betts' busy afternoon continued as he denied Nathan Miles before Gault got his name on the scoresheet five minutes before the interval with a cushioned header from a Westlake dink to send Hassocks into the break with a commanding 3-0 lead and the tie all but over as a contest.

The second half was just five minutes old when Westlake added his second and Hassocks' fourth, twisting and turning into the box before unleashing a rasping drive that flew into the bottom left hand corner of Betts' goal.

Miles was the architect of the fifth, ghosting his way past several challenges before teeing up Gault for his 23<sup>rd</sup> of the season, leaving him just 11 goals shy of his tally for last season with 16 games still left to play.

On this form, the smart money would be on the Robins' talismanic forward smashing through that milestone although Pat Harding's record of 43 goals in a single season might just be beyond him.

There was still half an hour left to play plus injury time when Gault notched that fifth but Hassocks eased up after that, preventing what otherwise might have been a cricket score.

The manner of the victory allowed Jewell to give significant game time to all three substitutes, which was welcome for three different reasons – Sam Goodridge playing his first minutes of the season, Lee Bryant returning from a month out injured and Chris Maynard making his first appearance since September after paternity leave.

#### Newhaven this season?

Newhaven haven't won the Southern Combination League title since 1974 and they might not get a better chance to do so again than this season. The Dockers have been absolutely flying in the league, winning 18, drawing four and losing just three of their games to date to sit second, five points behind Chichester City but with a game in hand. Most of their success is fuelled by the goalscoring exploits of Lee Robinson, who has already passed 50 goals this season in all competitions and has a scarcely believable total in excess of 350 for the club.

## Hassocks record against Newhaven?

Look away now if you are of a nervous disposition. Hassocks have only ever managed three victories over Newhaven in 14 previous meetings. The Robins' record at the Trafalgar Ground in particular is dreadful. They've never won there, losing six games out seven and conceding 24 goals at an average of over three a game.

#### Last time we met?

Hassocks gave one of their better performances against the Dockers in the previous league meeting back in October. Phil Johnson gave the Robins a shock lead which was only cancelled with a minute of the first half remaining by Tristan Jarvis. Tom Cooklin then netted what proved to be the winner just past the hour mark as despite Hassocks dominating the game from that point on, the Dockers escaped with a 2-1 win much to their bemusement of their travelling support who admitted they weren't sure how they'd got away with it.



## The top 50 appearance makers for the Robins in senior football



Ian Dawson came through the ranks at Hassocks, progressing from the Under 18s through to the first team and even had a season as first team coach before he moved to the United States.

Of his 136 appearances for the Robins, 66 of them came from the bench which gives Dawson the record as the most used Hassocks substitute in senior football.

In part, that was as a result of his versatility. Dawson was equally adept playing out wide or in the middle of the park, but never quite good enough in either position to hold it down for a sustained period.

He suffered with his fair share of injuries as well which saw him eventually take up a role as player coach for the 2009-10 season, the same campaign in which he made his final appearance for the Robins.

He was a popular member of Dave John's management team that season before emigrating and has continued his football coaching career across the pond while keeping tabs on goings on at the Beacon from afar.
