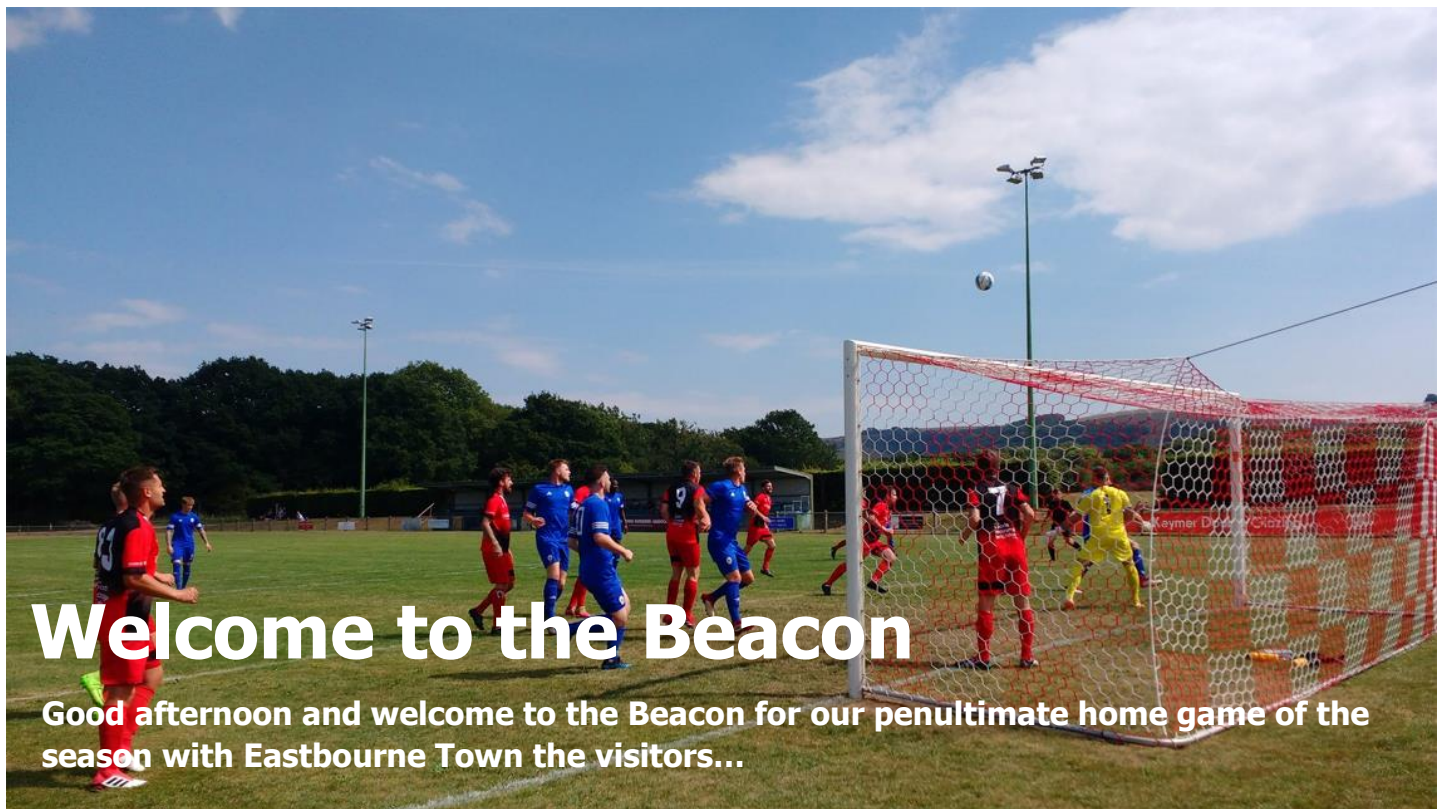

# Today's visitors...

**Eastbourne Town arrive at the Beacon today still just about in the hunt for promotion back to the Bostik League after a five-year absence thanks to a hugely impressive second half of the campaign...**

**This has been a typical Eastbourne Town season really. Since their return to the Southern Combination League in 2014, Town have been slow to start campaigns which is ultimately what has cost them in the title race.**

This time around, they picked up just one win from their first six games across all competitions before beginning to build up some momentum which has put them back into the battle for the runners up spot.

They are four points behind current second placed side Horsham YMCA having played the same number of games as YM and with both sides having five fixtures left to play, they could yet find themselves finishing behind Chichester City who must surely have the title won.

Town should arrive at the Beacon confident of picking up three points today if their record in the fixture is anything to go by.

There have been 33 games between the two sides with Town winning over half of them – 18 – to the Robins nine with six draws along the way.

In 23 meetings in the Southern Combination Premier, Town again edge the head-to-head.

Hassocks meanwhile have won just once against Town in the past 14 years – a shock 2-1 success here at the Beacon towards the end of the 2016-17 season with Phil Gault scoring twice and James Broadbent saving a penalty against his former club.

A small crumb of comfort for the hosts is that this game takes place in Mid Sussex.

You have to go back to 2006 to find the last time Hassocks won away at the Saffrons, although they did at least make something of a match of it on their visit to the sunshine coast in December before going down to a 2-1 defeat.

Sonny Dullaway and Marcus Goldsmith scored within five minutes of each other to put Town in a strong position before James Westlake pulled one back to set up a nervy last 20 minutes or so.

Town saw it out though to pick up three precious points in their quest for promotion – Hassocks will know they'll need to be at their best today to prevent a repeat.

**Former Eastbourne Town goalkeeper James Broadbent spent the 2016-17 season with Hassocks.**

And although his time at the Beacon was only brief, he still managed to establish himself as one of the best number ones that the Robins have ever had.

Broadbent ended up saving four penalties throughout the campaign and his performances went a long way towards ensuring that Hassocks avoided relegation to Division One.

That contribution was recognised come the end of the campaign when Broadbent won a clean sweep of

Player's Player, Manager's Player and Supporter's Player of the Season awards, earning a deserved move to try his luck at higher level football with Shoreham in the Isthmian League that summer.

Striker Dan Smith has also represented both clubs having rattled through three separate spells with the Robins.

Smith ended up making 63 appearances and scoring 26 goals for the Robins whilst Scott Kirkwood, who played once earlier in the campaign for Hassocks before returning to Horsham, is also an ex-Town player.



# HASSOCKS PUSH TOWN ALL THE WAY ON CHARITY DAY

**Eastbourne Town held their annual Christmas Charity Day as Hassocks visited the Saffrons but the Robins clearly didn't get the memo as they pushed their in-form hosts all the way before succumbing to a 2-1 defeat.**

Off the pitch, the second-biggest ninth tier crowd across the whole country of 261 was in a charitable mood, helping to raise a staggering £1060 for Memory Lane, a local charity who help provide social activities for those with dementia and their carers.

On it, Hassocks were feeling far from generous as they left Town never really certain of the three points until referee Adam Parry blew his whistle for full time, much to the obvious delight and relief of a boisterous home crowd.

Entrance was free with supporters instead asked to make a bucket donation to Memory Lane, a brilliant initiative which would have left the hosts out of pocket for the day but done wonderful things for their local community.

Those who took advantage of the offer could have been forgiven for thinking that they'd turn up and watch a routine Town win given the contrasting form both sides arrived in.

John Lambert's side had made their traditional slow start to the season, picking up just one win from their first six matches across all competitions.

That may have put a serious dent in their hopes for a tilt at the Southern Combination League title, but things have picked up markedly since the start of October and they came into the clash having beaten three of the top five in their last six fixtures.

Hassocks meanwhile had won just one of their last six and haven't tasted

victory at the Saffrons for nearly 13 years, a Stuart Faith goal giving Dave John's side a shock 1-0 win back in February 2006.

The Robins' cause on this day wasn't helped by several notable absentees including goalkeeper Josh Green, who was replaced by current Under 18s number one Toby Fisher.

Fisher was just three years old when Hassocks last left the Sunshine Coast with all three points.

Spencer Slaughter was also unavailable but on the credit side, Mark Dalglish gave a second debut to Andy Whittingham who has returned to the Beacon seven years after leaving the club for Seaford Town.

The left sided player has since gone onto play for AFC Uckfield Town and Hailsham Town and he will add some more bite to a side that can sometimes appear overly nice, as evidenced by the fact he picked up a yellow card with the second half just a couple of minutes old.

The scores were still level at that point, Fisher impressing once again with the back four of Bradley Tighe, Jordan Badger, Harry Mills and Will Broomfield doing a far better job of

protecting him than they'd managed on the young custodian's debut when he'd picked up the man-of-the-match award despite conceding six times away at Broadbridge Heath a month previously.

It had been a scrappy first half with Mr Parry's notebook getting through as much work as any of the 22 players on the pitch as bookings were flashed to Ollie Black and Sonny Dullaway for the hosts and Alex Spinks for the visitors.

Dullaway added a goal to his caution, opening the scoring with 49 minutes on the clock and five minutes later it was 2-0 thanks to Marcus Goldsmith.

At that point, Hassocks supporters could've been fearing the worse as their side have alarmingly collapsed when conceding goals in quick succession to Town in the past, most notably in the last meeting between the two at the Beacon when Even Archibald scored a 40-minute hat-trick.

The Robins regained their composure here though and gave themselves a lifeline back into the tie with 25 minutes left to play when James Westlake scored his first goal in just his second appearance of the season after returning from his running commitments.

Dalglish threw on strikers Jake Lindsey and Liam Benson after that but Hassocks couldn't quite find a way through, leaving Town as winners on the pitch and Memory Lane as winners off it.

# YOUNG ROBINS SHOCK TOWN WITH STUNNING COMEBACK

**A depleted Hassocks squad with an average age of 23 defied the odds with a sensational second half comeback to earn a superb 2-2 draw at high flying Eastbourne Town.**

And in the process, they took a huge step towards securing their place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division for another season.

Hassocks looked dead and buried at the interval as they came in trailing 2-0 to goals from George Robinson and Dom Clarke.

But whatever Mark Dagleish and Phil Wickwar said to their young charges at half time worked as strikes from Phil Johnson and Bradley Bant earned the visitors a share of the spoils.

You could even make an argument that they should have left the Saffrons with all three points after a dreadful piece of officiating denied Johnson a clear penalty.

That key talking point came with eight minutes remaining.

Johnson had latched onto a huge punt that both Town defender Sean Kelly and goalkeeper James Broadbent misjudged, leaving the Robins' top scorer to round Broadbent whose only answer was to upend him.

Johnson was at least a yard inside the box and with the goal at his mercy, meaning that a penalty and a red card for denying a clear goal scoring opportunity could be the only

possible outcome.

Yet after referee Elliott Hollobone consulted his assistant, they contrived to make a complete and utter mess out of the situation, first by awarding just a free kick on the edge of the box and then by only booking Broadbent.

Even the Town bench and supporters looked bewildered by the decision and needless to say the Robins contingent were enraged about the episode.

A point was the least that Hassocks deserved having endured a tough first half.

Robinson scored from close range after poor defending from a corner on 22 minutes and then Clarke nodded in after an excellent Robinson cross just past the half hour mark.

Ryan Collins' dipping volley almost pulled one back for the visitors and Jake Booth squandered a great chance, slicing his effort wide when well placed although to be fair to him the ball took a wicked bobble off the very poor surface.

Tom Barnes and Dan Jacques - at 27 the oldest player on the park for Hassocks - handled the giant partnership of Clarke and Kenny Pogue pretty well and when Pogue limped off early in the second half, Hassocks grew in confidence.

George Willett made two excellent saves to deny Clarke and Robinson whilst at the other end Collins will probably still be wondering how he failed to convert Dan Stokes's free kick from four yards with the goal at his mercy.

Stokes was the most influential player in the second period, finding lots of space and it was his pinpoint cross from Bradley Tighe's ball down the line that was turned in by Johnson to half the deficit on 68 minutes.

On 77 minutes the Hassocks youngsters were level, Bant's free kick from 20 yards nestling into the bottom corner via a slight deflection off the end of the wall.

The Robins were now in the ascendency and if it had not been for that poor refereeing decision, they could have left with three famous points.

Phil Wickwar was full of unmitigated praise for his side afterwards, saying, "To come her with a skeleton squad and get a result was outstanding."

"I cannot praise this group of players enough. They are all in it together, no big egos and the team ethos is fantastic. We outplayed Town in the second half today and we were disappointed in the end with a point."

# Final fixtures announced as Robins eye up silverware

**The fixtures have been announced for the final month of the 2018-19 season as Hassocks Under 23s and Ladies both go looking for further silverware for the Beacon trophy cabinet.**

The Under 23s are still fighting on two fronts with a shot at lifting both the Southern Combination League Under 23 West Division title and the League Cup.

They kick off a pivotal five weeks on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> April against East Preston in the semi-finals of the League Cup.

That game takes place at Shoreham's Middle Road ground with kick off at 7.30pm. The winners will face either AFC Uckfield Town or Newhaven from the East Division who face off this Thursday at the Saffrons.

Two away games follow for Nigel Pearce's side as they travel to Arundel on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> before a potentially season defining trip to Gorings Mead to take on current West Division

leaders Horsham YMCA.

Nothing could separate the two teams when they met at the Beacon back in December, Connor Bradley scoring for Hassocks in a 1-1 draw.

YM are currently two points clear at the top although Hassocks do have a game in hand, meaning that it the result in Horsham on April 18<sup>th</sup> will go a long way towards deciding where the title goes.

The Robins will then have two more fixtures as they round the season off with games at the Beacon against East Preston again on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April and Arundel on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, which will be the final Hassocks game at the ground this season.

Hassocks Ladies are looking to secure a league title of their own to go with the Sussex Women's Challenge Trophy that they lifted at the start of March by beating Burgess Hill Town 2-1 at Culver Road.

The Hillians could yet gain revenge with the battle for the South East Counties Women's League Division One title set to be between the two Mid Sussex rivals.

The Robins currently lead the way having dropped just two points all season but Hill have two games in hand; victories in both of those would take the Hillians to within five points of Hassocks.

They are also yet to face each other in the league so far with games to come at the Green Elephants Stadium on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> April and the Beacon two weeks later on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup>.

If the cup final between the two is anything to go by then those are two clashes not to be missed – both games start at 2pm and entrance is free.

Before that, Hassocks will take on Bexhill United in the league on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> April at the Beacon.

The Under 18s meanwhile have three games left as they look to try and finish in second spot behind Haywards Heath Town.

The champions visit the Beacon on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> March. That's followed by Lancing visiting Mid Sussex two weeks later and the Young Robins final game is away at Southwick on April 21<sup>st</sup>.

# Beacon chosen to host Peter Bentley Cup Final

**For the fourth season running, the Southern Combination League have chosen to use the Beacon as the venue for the Peter Bentley League Cup Final.**

This year's showpiece final sees Saltdean United take on AFC Uckfield Town on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> May with an 11am kick off.

Both sides caused something of a shock in the last four to book their respective places in the final; Saltdean defeated Premier Division champions-elect Chichester City 2-1 at Steyning Town's Shooting Field whilst Uckfield ran out 3-2 winners over promotion chasing Horsham YMCA at Middle Road.

Whatever happens in the final, there will be a new or relatively new name on the trophy.

United have only won the competition once back in 2000 when they were in the midst of their golden period while the Uckers are chasing their first ever senior trophy.

They did make the Peter Bentley Cup final in 2012 but went down to a Three Bridges side who completed a league and cup double as a result. That game was also held at the Beacon.

Last season's final saw Hassocks' Mid Sussex rivals Haywards Heath Town beat a Horsham YMCA side including current Robins' striker Phil Johnson 4-0 thanks to a Karly Akeurst brace and goal from Callum Saunders and Max Miller.

That banished the demons of the previous year for Heath who had suffered a shock 1-0 defeat to Pagham to end the season trophy less.

In 2016, Lancing ended their 23 year wait for silverware by defeating Newhaven 2-1. Josh Green was in goal for the Lancers that day as an own goal and Lewis Finney did the damage.

The cup final action doesn't stop there either with the Southern Combination also deciding to bring their Under 18 League Cup back to

the Beacon for the second season running.

Last year, it was Dave John's Young Robins who ran out 1-0 winners over AFC Uckfield Town to complete the second part of an historic treble on home soil. Jake Lindsey scored the only goal that day.

This year, AFC Varndeanians while face Newhaven with the game set to take place on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> April 2019 with an 11am kick off.

V's secured their spot in the final with a 2-0 victory over Montpelier Villa with Newhaven winning by the same scoreline against Central Division champions Haywards Heath.

In order to ensure both of these cup finals run smoothly and to enhance the Beacon's reputation as one of the best grounds in Sussex, the club will obviously require some help from supporters.

# SCORE DRAW AGAIN BETWEEN ROBINS AND WANDERERS

**It might be worth keeping an eye on fixtures between Hassocks and Langney Wanderers in the future if the first two meetings are anything to go by.**

Back in September, these two played out a 2-2 draw that had just about everything in their first ever clash at senior level at Priory Lane.

And while the reverse fixture at the Beacon couldn't quite match the drama that came with Jordan Badger's last minute equaliser six months ago, both the scoreline and the entertainment levels were exactly the same.

Both the Robins and Wanderers are finishing the campaign strongly.

Hassocks passed the 40 point mark with their third victory in four games away at Crawley Down Gatwick last weekend whilst the visitors had won their past three games in a row before arriving in Mid Sussex.

Mark Dalgleish made just one change from the previous weekend's success at the Haven, former Woking forward George Brown being handed his first start for the Robins in place of the absent Jake Lindsey.

Any latecomers in the Beacon's second highest attendance of the season so far would've regretted their tardiness as within five minutes, both sides were already on the scoresheet.

It was Langney who got the party started with just three minutes on the clock, Tyreece Daley opening the scoring for the visitors after some slack Hassocks defending.

Wanderers' lead was shortlived

however thanks to Dan Stokes.

Stokes has been in excellent form of late in the midfield engine room with the only thing really missing from his game being goals.

He chose an opportune time to set the record straight in that regard, scoring for the fourth time this season and the first time since September with a neat finish to level things up.

Both sides went hammer and tongs at each other after that with Stokes and Harvey Enticknap creating countless opportunities for Hassocks but it was telling that Langney goalkeeper Dan Hutchins ended the game as the visitors man-of-the-match.

The Wanderers' custodian constantly thwarted Hassocks' front three of Brown, Liam Benson and Phil Johnson as an entertaining encounter ebbed and flowed.

At the other end, Will Broomfield

and Jordan Badger in particular stood strong against a Langley front line containing the considerable talents of former Eastbourne Town pair Evan Archibald and Tyler Capon.

Hassocks finally found a way past Hutchins just past the hour mark and it will come as no surprise that it was Johnson who put the hosts ahead.

The Robins' talismanic forward has hit a real purple patch at the moment and his 63<sup>rd</sup> minute strike was his seventh in his past three games since returning from injury and his 27<sup>th</sup> of the season.

Johnson has now eclipsed his previous best season's total for Hassocks of 26 and with five games still remaining, he could yet become only the third player to break the 30 goals in a campaign mark for the club this century after Phil Gault and Pat Harding.

Landmarks aside, it looked like Johnson's strike would also prove to be the winner right up until the 83<sup>rd</sup> minute when Capon netted the goal of the game with a superb finish that left Josh Green with no chance.

In keeping with the rest of a thrilling clash, both sides had chances to win it late on but come the full time whistle, the draw was probably a fair result and one which certainly drew the approval of the bumper crowd.

# BATTLING HASSOCKS EVENTUALLY SEE OFF SOUTHWICK

## Battling Hassocks Under 23s kept their Southern Combination League West Division title hopes alive with a 3-2 win over a plucky Southwick side.

For 75 minutes, it looked like this would be another frustrating evening for the Robins.

Joe Russell replaced Steve Bright whilst perhaps most important of all, Pearce could call upon the services of Littlejohn and Max Willcox – a strike force who have plundered 31 goals together – in place of Will Glenn and Jake Lindsey.

Ross had proven to be a real thorn in Hassocks' side in that previous meeting at Old Barn Way and it didn't take him long to begin tormenting the Robins again, giving Southwick the lead inside of 15 minutes.

Hassocks huffed and puffed after that and they eventually equalised eight minutes before the break, Willcox marking his return to the starting line up with his 13<sup>th</sup> goal of the campaign.

Connor Bradley put Hassocks into the lead for the first time just past the hour mark but it was short lived, that man Ross levelling things up less than five minutes later.

That set the stage for Littlejohn's late winner, the striker bringing up 20 goals for the campaign and ensuring that Hassocks remain well in the title race with Pearce also handing a debut to Harvey Ransome, an impressive performer throughout his first season with the Under 18s so far.

# HASSOCKS DROP FIRST POINTS IN MOLE VALLEY STALEMATE

## After 12 victories out of 12 in Division One West of the South East Counties Women's League, Hassocks Ladies finally dropped points for the first time this season.

A spirited Mole Valley side became the first opponents to avoid defeat against the Robins, giving a determined defensive display to leave the Beacon with a well-earned 0-0 draw. It was probably a fair result.

Hassocks' exploits this season appear to be catching up with them at just the wrong time and after losing to Premier Division Saltdean United in the semi-finals of the League Cup last week, they were sluggish against opponents who currently sit second in the table.

Mole Valley enjoyed the better of the opening 10 minutes with Chloe John having to make an early interception to prevent a goal scoring opportunity.

That woke the Robins up slightly and they began to create a couple of half chances.

Billie Philpott fired just wide after a beautiful through ball from Sam Newman and then Liz King looked to get Philpott in again but the visiting goalkeeper was quick off her line to snuff out the danger.

From there, the game went straight up the other end where Claire Stevens had to make two great blocks, Sarah Chappell produced a magnificent save to claw a free kick out of the top corner and from the

resulting corner, Stevens again did well by this heading off the line.

Going forward, King was proving to be a real threat with her driving runs from a deep midfield position and she drew a fine save from the Mole Valley goalkeeper.

King headed the subsequent corner just wide whilst more last-ditch defending was required at the other end, this time via a trademark perfectly timed sliding block by Emma Young.

Hassocks' best chance of the first half probably came from a goalmouth scramble from a corner won by an enterprising run by Tallie Bright, but nobody in red could add the finish touch amid frantic scenes in the Mole Valley box.

Another set piece caused issues for the visitors, this time a well-worked short corner routine which presented Kirsten Mair with a sight of goal but her shot was saved and Philpott was off target with a header.

Mole Valley had two glorious opportunities to take the lead before the break but again they were denied by some excellent defending as first Gemma Craig headed clear and then Stevens made another last-ditch tackle to ensure it remained 0-0 at the break.

After that action packed first half, the second 45 was something of a disappointment in comparison.

The tone was set with a scrappy opening 15 minutes in which both sides frequently surrendered possession as the encounter developed a war of attrition feel.

Philpott had the first just before the hour mark but her effort was saved and there was another frustrating goalmouth scramble in which no Hassocks player could get a shot away.

Philpott was pulling wider by this point and she delivered a fantastic cross which was well cut out by the Mole Valley goalkeeper and with Hassocks beginning to sense that it wasn't going to be their day for once, the visitors grew in confidence and had the better of the final 20 minutes.

Young had to make another goal saving block and Stevens showed excellent pace and strength to thwart the Mole Valley striker as she bore down on Chappell's goal at an alarming rate.

The final chance of the game did go Hassocks' way but Philpott snatched at it, flashing her shot agonisingly wide of the post.

There was no doubt that Stevens had been the Robins' best player come the final whistle and although there was more than a hint of disappointment in the home camp after, Hassocks will know that one point is better than none and the chance to become champions is still in their hands with three games left to play.

### 2013 – No grumbles as Robins left feeling the Blues

#### **Two sides missing key personnel met at the Beacon where Ringmer coped the better to run out 2-1 winners over Hassocks.**

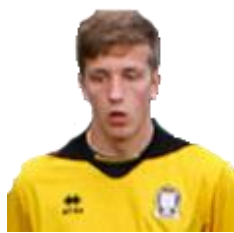

Robbie Kitchen was one of the most feared strikers in the Southern Combination League during his heyday in the 1990s.

He was the first Hassocks player to pass 100 goals in senior football for club and his record of 123 goals from 323 stood for a number of years before Pat Harding finally broke it in 2006. Phil Gault, James Laing and Anthony Hibbert have also gone onto pass him since.

Kitchen was a real club man and once his first team days were over, he played for both the reserves and third teams with some success, passing his knowledge and experience onto the young players coming through the Hassocks youth system well into his 40's.

A passionate player, he could often be found getting into trouble with referees but that was a result of his ferocious will to win and his love of all things Hassocks rather than anything malicious.

Kitchen retired from third team duty at the end of the 2007-08 when Simon Maskell stepped down from management but continued to turn out for the veterans for several years.
