Shoreham arrive at the Beacon fighting for their lives as they look to avoid back-to-back relegations with the trapdoor into Division One of the Southern Combination League looming...

Put simply, this has been a disastrous season for Shoreham. Having been relegated from the Bostik League at the end of 2017-18, that downward spiral has continued, and they will arrive to the Beacon deep in relegation trouble having recently sunk to the bottom of the table, five points shy of safety.

Experienced manager Sammy Donnelly left the club just before Christmas and although his replacement Curtis Foster bought an initial uplift in results, he has also departed.

Dale Hurley, who had an extremely brief spell in charge of Hassocks' Reserves before the start of the 2014-15 season, has now been charged with trying to save the Musselmen from back-to-back relegations.

He's got quite the task on his hands. They haven't won for 10 games stretching back to January 5<sup>th</sup>, a shock 1-0 win away at promotion chasing Horsham YMCA.

There were signs of some

improvement in their last outing however, a single goal defeat away at a strong AFC Uckfield Town outfit.

Hurley and his side will no doubt be viewing this game as the most winnable of their final three, given that they face Saltdean United in 48 hours time and then go to Newhaven on the final day.

They can take solace from the fact that they have a relatively decent record against the Robins.

Shoreham have been one of Hassocks' most frequent opponents in with 50 meetings to date. The Robins have won 22, Shoreham 17 while there have been 11 draws with the only senior competition they've never met in being the FA Vase.

The Musselmen will also be out for revenge after the meeting between the two back in Decembe.

That was Foster's first game in charge at Middle Road in December.

There wasn't much in it, Liam Benson scoring the only goal early in the first half with Robins goalkeeper Josh Green winning man of the match for a string of excellent saves late on.

### A whole host of players have swapped between Hassocks and Shoreham through the years with some potentially on show todav.

The Robins have signed two players from Middle Road over the course of this season with Scott Kirkwood firstly making the move to the Beacon at the turn of the year and then Jack Rowe-Hurst following suit two months ago.

Shoreham's number one this

season has been James Broadbent who moved to the Musselmen in order to play Isthmian League football in the summer of 2017 after an outstanding season for Hassocks in which he claimed a clean sweep of Player's Player, Supporter's Player and Manager's Player of the Season at the end of year awards.

He was joined in the summer at Middle Road by Josh Tuck who played 19 times for the Robins last season, scoring once.

Mussels' boss Dale Hurley had a brief spell in charge of the Robins second string before the start of the 2014-15 season and striker Michael McCormick was a member of the Under 21s squad a few years ago.

Going further back, forwards Neil Kane, Jonno Melia and Rob Boddy all played for Shoreham before joining Hassocks with defender Sol Bowra another player to have represented both clubs in the last decade.

# **CLEVER BENSON HELPS HASSOCKS END 2018 ON A HIGH**

Liam Benson's clever first half strike was enough to ensure that Hassocks signed off for 2018 with a 1-0 victory away at Shoreham.

It's been a year that the Robins won't remember too fondly.

They won just three times in the first five months on their way to the club's lowest finish for 24 years in April.

Relegation to Division One was only avoided due to the restructuring of the Bostik League which saw both Haywards Heath Town and Three Bridges promoted whilst only Saturday's opponents were relegated.

It's been a much better second half of the year however, Mark Dalgleish's work on the transfer front over the course of the summer greatly improving the squad and leaving Hassocks just six points behind their 2017-18 points total with 18 games still left to play.

Benson was one of the Hassocks manager's new signings, returning to the Robins after six months with Lancing and his ninth goal of the season won all three points at Middle Road.

It arrived with 30 minutes played. Shoreham couldn't clear a Jake Lindsey corner and when Spencer Slaughter drove in a low shot from the edge of the box, Benson showed quick reactions to stick out a foot and divert the ball over the head of Ben Kirk-Patrick guarding the post and into the top corner.

There were plenty of chances for both sides to score further across the 90 minutes.

That neither could was largely down to the brilliance of the two goalkeepers on show.

Hassocks supporters needed no introduction to the man with the gloves for Shoreham.

James Broadbent was a hugely popular figure during his one-season

at the Beacon, picking up a clean sweep of Player's Player, Manager's Player and Supporter's Player of the Year at the end of the 2016-17 campaign before moving to Shoreham for Bostik League football.

Broadbent stayed loyal to the Musselmen this summer and reminded his former club of all his qualities with a string of excellent first half saves which prevented Hassocks from running away with the game.

He saved from Harvey Blake from point-blank range after a brilliant run and cross from Joe Bull and then five minutes later produced a stunning stop at full stretch after Bull stepped around Daley McLennan and fired in a shot from the edge of the box.

Before those two opportunities, Slaughter sent a looping effort just over the bar and Lindsey bent a free kick wide of the post in what was a frenetic start from the Robins.

Bull went close again before the break, a driving run from midfield ending with a shot that wasn't too far away.

The second half began in much the same fashion with the visitors on top once Shoreham captain Ross Myers had fired over after from the edge of the box after cutting through the Robins' midfield.

Hassocks then hit the crossbar, a cleverly worked short freekick routine involving Harry Mills and Slaughter seeing the latter's shot crash against the woodwork with Broadbent beaten and Johnson's pace took him in on goal and around Broadbent but the angle and the covering of defender Lee Denyer did for him.

Benson went on a driving run down the right flank before cutting inside and shooting but Broadbent made another excellent stop low down to his left, although Benson perhaps should have squared with Johnson, Slaughter and Lindsey all in support.

That woke Shoreham up and they were much the better side in the final

20 minutes, which is where Green earned the Robins' man-of-the-match award for an unbelievable spell in which he pulled off five excellent saves in the space of a couple of minutes.

Firstly, he turned away a low shot from Ryan Carse and when Bradley Tighe's clearance was returned into the box by Alfie Proto-Gates, Green was forced into an acrobatic stop to keep out Myers' header.

From the resulting corner, McLennan rose like the proverbial salmon but somehow Green flew across his goal to get a fingertip onto the ball and turn it around the post.

The next corner was an equally good delivery.

This time, it fell to McLennan at the far post and his low volley was blocked by the feet of Green who then recovered brilliantly to block George Olulode's attempt from the rebound.

Shoreham had a couple of other chances, Myers firing over and Kirk-Patrick seeing a dangerous cross headed away by captain Jordan Badger, making his 100th appearance for the club.

There was one free kick each in the final five minutes, Broadbent punching away Slaughter's delivery with Dan Stokes' controlled volley dropping onto the roof of the net and then Green confidently dealt with a Thomas Johnston delivery with the last play of the game.

# ROBINS RUN RIOT TO SHOCK LEADERS SHOREHAM

# One of the most beautiful things about the beautiful game is its unpredictability.

And if you'd predicted on Tuesday afternoon that come 10pm Hassocks would have defeated league leaders Shoreham 4-1, you'd have been laughed out of the Beacon.

Yet that is exactly what happened as the Robins ran riot, producing easily their best performance in at least four seasons – harking back to a time when they were regular challengers for a top four spot themselves – and inflicting a third and heaviest league defeat of the season on the Mussels in the process.

"Brilliant from start to finish" is how Phil Wickwar described the finest result of his and Mark Dalgleish's twoand-a-bit year tenure.

"As soon as we went 2-1 up you could see only us winning it.

"We got lucky for the second goal – it was a bit of a gift.

"But it is reward for the players who we have kept the faith in after a bit of a difficult run."

One such player was Liam Benson. Benson has spearheaded the Robins Under 21s challenge for honours this season with 15 goals in 16 games and he started here despite the availability of top scorer Phil Gault, who had to settle for a spot on the bench.

Benson rewarded that decision handsomely as he carried his Under 21 form into the first team by netting a brace, the fourth and fifth goals of a senior career that looks as though it could be about to take off in a big way.

Perhaps the most impressive thing about this win was that Hassocks had to come from behind to do it.

Rob O'Toole gave Shoreham the lead with an absolute bullet of a strike just before the midway point in the first half.

Going behind against a team as packed with talent as this Shoreham side are has in the past proven to be the point at which the floodgates would open, but not on this night as within 10 minutes Benson had drawn the Robins level.

It was an excellent goal from the Robins striker as he latched onto a brilliant through ball to net with aplomb past Josh Heyburn in the Shoreham goal.

Things got even better five minutes later, Jack Rowe-Hurst giving Hassocks the lead via a deflection for his second goal in three starts since arriving from Three Bridges.

The Robins took that 2-1 lead into the break and had to weather a lot of

Shoreham pressure early in the second half as the visitors desperately tried to find a way back into the encounter.

Despite plenty of huffing and puffing they weren't able to blow down the Hassocks door thanks to some excellent defending from Luke Akehurst, Jordan Badger, Tom Barnes and Ashley Marsh.

And they paid for that inability to find a way through when the Robins added their third of the evening against the run of play.

Set pieces have proven to be an Achilles heel for Hassocks for sometime now but the boot was well and truly on the other foot as Michael Death took advantage of some extremely slack Shoreham marking to produce a delightful flicked header at the near post from a Lewis Westlake corner.

Shoreham looked like they needed to pour forward after that but they never got the chance as within two minutes of Death beating Heyburn, Hassocks made it 4-1 with Benson completing his brace to secure one of the biggest shocks of the Southern Combination League season so far.

He was in superlative form in the month's final game against Eastbourne Town, pulling off a string of inspired saves to keep the score at 2-0.

Green also recorded a clean sheet in the win against Pagham and kept out Crawley Down Gatwick's dangerous front man Oliver Leslie in the win at the Haven.

# Century for the Sheriff as Mills joins the 100 Club

Versatile and popular, Harry Mills became the latest player to pass 100 appearances for Hassocks in the recent 2-1 defeat away at Horsham YMCA.

The man known as "the Sheriff" because of his ridiculous collection of belts that often make appearances on the player's nights out has become a popular player since his arrival at the Beacon in the summer of 2016.

Mills moved to the Robins from Hailsham Town having previously been with Seaford Town.

He made an instant impression with a number of swashbuckling performances from right back, scoring his first goal for the club away at Worthing United in a 5-0 win in October 2016.

That afternoon at the Robert Albon Memorial Ground was the first glimpse that the Hassocks faithful got of Mills' trademark celebration, a cross between a cartwheel and a forward roll that looks like it is being performed by an unsteady giraffe.

Whilst that suggested that Mills is

unlikely to be troubling the GB Olympic Gymnastics selectors anytime soon, it made him something of a cult hero to the Robins support.

He ended that first season having played 37 times and added a second goal, in a 1-1 draw away at Arundel.

In 2017-18 he made 29 appearances and so far in this campaign he has played a further 34 times, scoring three goals - with "the Sheriff Celebration" receiving particular short shrift away at Saltdean United two months ago.

Mills' main value to the squad comes from his ability to play as either a full back, a centre back, a central midfielder or a winger at a push. He has become one of Mark Dalgleish's trusted lieutenants as a result.

Mills is the third man this season to become a Hassocks centurion, following in the footsteps of Jordan Badger and Liam Benson.

It's been a good season for landmarks all round; Dan Jacques made his 200<sup>th</sup> appearance and Phil Johnson racked up his 50<sup>th</sup> goal earlier in the campaign as well.

Hassocks' best route to goal looked like it would be from set pieces as they earned a flurry of corners but couldn't quite make anything of them.

YM did have one chance to make the game safe but Jack Ryder's low and hard shot was repelled by an excellent stop from Green.

One final corner with the last play of the game led to a desparate struggle in the box but YM managed to hold on for a victory which keeps them in second place behind Chichester City who beat Langney Wanderers 2-0 to be crowned champions for the first time since 2004.

### **Hassocks Ladies 6-0 Bexhill United Ladies**





Hassocks Ladies were crowned South East Counties Women's League Division One West champions - and in some style - as they hammered Bexhill United 6-0 at the Beacon.

Following Burgess Hill Town's defeat to Mole Valley last week, the Robins knew that if they could pillage three points from the Pirates then they'd be able to claim the title before their final two games of the campaign – both against the Hillians.

And they duly delivered to cap a double as the league title will now join the Sussex Women's Challenge Trophy in the silverware cabinet.

Hassocks started brightly with Billie Philpott clearly eager to add to her 36-goal haul.

She went close as early as the fifth minute when shooting narrowly over after good work from Kirsten Mair and was then denied by a fine smothering save from the Bexhill goalkeeper.

The visiting custodian denied Katherine Chappell before Philpott fired in two more efforts that weren't far away, the first drawing another good save and the second hitting the side netting.

Jodie Johnason was looking lively down the right wing and Chappell again went close as Hassocks continued to enjoy plenty of possession but without a cutting edge.

It took them until the 37<sup>th</sup> minute to open the scoring but the goal was well worth the wait.

Philpott and Mair showed excellent interplay to fashion an opportunity for Kelly Rushworth and she duly took it, hitting an unstoppable left footed shot which rocketed into the top corner of the Bexhill goal.

The Robins were rocking now and

virtually straight from kick off they regained possession and Philpott had another shot saved.

Hassocks weren't to be denied for long however and just three minutes after Rushworth had opened the scoring, Katherine Chappell doubled the advantage although she did have a bit of a helping hand from Rushworth who got he slightest of deflections onto the initial shot to flummox the Bexhill goalkeeper.

The visitors didn't give up despite conceding twice in quick succession and they could even have pulled one back before half time were it not for an excellent intervention from Hassocks defender Sam Newman.

The Robins could feel the championship within their grasp and they flew out the traps at the start of the second half in an attempt to put the game well and truly to bed.

Rushworth shot wide five minutes after the restart after good work by Johanson and then got a shot on target three minutes later.

The resulting save fell kindly for Hassocks and Mair was on hand to calmly slot the loose ball home to make it 3-0.

Two minutes later and Hassocks put the result beyond doubt when a Rushworth through ball found Chappell who showed a cool head to place past the Bexhill goalkeeper.

The Robins were on the rampage now and they scored for the third

time in four minutes with arguably the goal of the afternoon, Liz King finding the top corner with a half-volley from a full 35 yards out.

Stevens had to do some more good covering to thwart a rare Bexhill attack before Martin Lee turned to his bench and introduced Banna Hannes and Tallie Bright.

Bright was straight into the action, slotting into an unfamiliar position as part of the back three and then needing three attempts to get a throw in into play as the wet and slippery ball kept falling out of her hands, which she claimed was tactical timewasting.

The score sheet had a slightly unusual look to it at this point as five had been scored by Hassocks and yet Philpott's name wasn't on it.

She soon righted that anomaly with a calmly taken goal in the 77<sup>th</sup> minute which proved to be the Robins' last of the day.

In fact, it was Bexhill who had the better chances after that with Sarah Chappell making one fine save from a late corner as the visitors finished with something of a flourish.

Still, Hassocks held on for three points and another clean sheet, although credit must go to the Pirates who were a vastly improved side from the one that the Robins faced earlier in the campaign.

Whilst the league and cup double may now be completed, Hassocks will no doubt want to preserve their proud unbeaten record in their final two games against local rivals Burgess Hill, who themselves will be out for revenge after the Robins defeated them in that County Trophy final back in March.

Ben Caiden whipped in a vicious free kick which Toby Fisher could only watch onto the bar and nobody in red could react quick enough to the loose ball with Aaron Raymond tapping home for 1-0.

They were ahead for only nine minutes before Tristan Hayes scored a spectacular equaliser for the hosts.

Hayes has enjoyed quite a first season at the Beacon, very quickly earning a berth in the Under 23s squad and he notched his 17<sup>th</sup> of the season in some style.

Heath weren't particularly alert to a quick Dimelow throw which found Hayes who showed great strength to hold off the challenge of Bejamin Rakabopa to get to the by-line from where he hit a stunning effort which bent over the head of Heath goalkeeper Leigh Batchelor and into the back of the net from the most impossible of angles.

Heath retook the lead on the half hour mark through the Central Division's leading marksman, Ollie Broad showing why he has plundered over 30 goals by latching onto a header and lifting an excellent cushioned volley over the head of the advancing Fisher.

Hassocks levelled things up once again before half time and once again it was Hayes who was on target.

### 2013 - Lawman Johnson makes his case with a double

Two goals in two minutes from Phil Johnson transformed Hassocks' afternoon at Mill Road as they came from behind right at the death to win 3-2 away at Arundel.

With 88 minutes gone, this looked like being another disappointing day on the road for the Robins, a fortnight after they had been on the end of a chastening 4-1 hammering at Sidley United.

On this occasion, they trailed 2-1 against a Mullets side who had been completely dominant up until that point and who must have thought they had the three points in the bag.

But by the time the clock ticked around to 90 minutes, Johnson had intervened with two sweet finishes to boost Mickey Jewell's sides hopes of a top seven finish.

Johnson has missed large chunks of this season due to his ongoing law training, but his lack of game time clearly hasn't affected his eye for goal.

In his sporadic appearances so far, he's managed four goals in five appearances for the reserves and this double took him onto four in nine for the first team.

And he clearly has a liking for playing Arundel too.

It was against the Mullets when he really announced himself in the Hassocks set up with a sensational hat-trick as the youth team defeated their Arundel counterparts 3-2 to lift the Sussex County Under 18 League Cup back in 2008.

Two of Johnson's team mates from that success over the Mullets were also in the starting line up here, Nathan Miles having firmly established himself in the first team while Nathan Cooper is enjoying a run of games as injuries and unavailability bite Jewell's squad as the campaign comes to a close.

The Hassocks boss was without five key players at Arundel with Stuart Faith, Ashley Marsh, Anthony Hibbert, Phil Gault and Elliott Butler all missing.

That meant rare starts for Johnson and Stuart Brown who came in at right back with Rob South, captaining the club for the first time in the absence of Faith, Mash and Gault, switching to the left.

Jewell also called up the Robins' record goal scorer James Laing, now a regular in the reserves, for his first start since January 2011.

The bench meanwhile was made up of youth teamers Ryan John and Aaron Czech and goalkeeper Reece Wickwar, who was used as an emergency striker in the closing stages for the second game running in a sign of just how stretched Hassocks' resources are at the minute.

Despite the patchy look of their side, it was the Robins who took the

lead with 20 minutes played.

Hassocks have been trying to make something of South's relatively long throws all season and they finally did so when a huge toss into the box wasn't convincingly dealt with by the Arundel defence, giving Jamie Weston the opportunity to produce a fine finish from outside the box.

Hassocks led for just 10 minutes before a quick-fire double from Grant Thetford took Arundel from 1-0 down to 2-1 ahead.

His first arrived 10 minutes when he took full advantage of a weak Hassocks clearance to beat Simon Lehkyj and his second was a rebound from a penalty after Lehkyj had brilliant kept out the initial spot kick.

Lehkyj was by far the busier keeper in the second half with a string of crucial saves that ensured Hassocks weren't out the tie by the time Johnson conjured up his two minutes of magic.

The first of those arrived with 88 played, substitute John doing well to head a ball in down towards Johnson who was waiting to bring it under control before scrambling home.

Then just one minute later he latched onto a clever through-ball from Weston, outstripping home defender Ashley Hunter for pace before slotting past James Fernandes in the Arundel goal to complete a stunning comeback.
