We've rarely crossed paths with the Clarets in competitive football before with only two previous meetings and this is the first time they've visited the Beacon.

We received excellent hospitality on our trip to the New Defence on the opening day of the campaign and we hope that the players, supporters and officials of Horley enjoy a similar day with us here - although hopefully with a different result!

Home games coming up

So, what of those home games coming up? We've had a hastily arranged Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup game with Pagham crammed in for this Tuesday night with a 7.45pm kick off.

After that, it's back-to-back Premier Division meetings with Lingfield and then Loxwood, offering the chance to hopefully put some much-needed points on the board to start climbing the Premier Division table.

There is also a home Peter Bentley League Cup tie with Langney Wanderers to be arranged at some point, but the league have assured us that won't be until October given the packed nature of the fixture list.

Battling the top three

Our lowly league position can in part be attributed to a tricky run of fixtures which have seen away games against the sides sitting second and third in the table in the past two matches.

Broadbridge Heath ran out 2-1 winners at High Wood Hill on Tuesday night and Eastbourne Town 4-1 victors at the Saffrons on Saturday.

Despite those results, both performances were actually extremely encouraging, as was the previous Premier Division game we had when going down 2-1 to second placed Lancing.

Replicate those levels against the sides who are closer to us in the table and hopefully it won't be long before we're pulling away from the mire.

Benson back at the Beacon

Mark has been busy on the transfer front again with Liam Benson returning to the Beacon to boost our attacking options.

Liam left for Steyning Town in the summer but has decided to come back for a third spell in Hassocks colours, following the path trodden by Ben Bacon already this season.

Ben has three goals to his name, so hopefully Liam will have a similar effect now he's back in Robins red.

You wait years to play Horley Town, and then two meetings come along in the space of five weeks. The newest members of the Southern Combination League are today's visitors in the FA Vase...

Nobody really knew how Horley would take to life in the SCFL following their sideways move in the summer.

The Combined Counties League is generally considered to be stronger than its Sussex based counterpart based on national cup results between the two leagues, and so a 10th placed finish there last season pointed to the fact that Anthony Jupp's men could make an impression in their new surroundings.

They're certainly doing that so far, having lost just once in six Premier Division fixtures, which leaves them sitting seventh in the early season table.

They also reached the first qualifying round of the FA Cup, one of only five Southern Combination sides to do so which gives them a game in hand on most of the teams above them. Win that and they could climb up to third and the cusp of the title race.

All of which points to a tough afternoon ahead for Hassocks.

Those who travelled to the New Defence for the opening game of the

season will already know that though, some poor defensive errors from the Robins coupled with clinical finishing from a well-organised Town ensuring it was a 2-0 win for the hosts.

That maintained their 100% record against the Robins - although in fairness, there have only been two meetings so far!

The other came in this competition back in September 2016, Horley running out 4-2 winners at home in a game in which they sauntered into a 3-0 lead inside of 30 minutes.

Hassocks will be hoping for better today on what is Horley's first visit to the Beacon for a competitive fixture.

If the Robins are to progress, then they'll need to stop Town's dangerous front pairing of Kerran Boylan and Tony Halsey.

Boylan already has six goals to his name and anyone who managed to catch the highlights of their 2-2 draw with Loxwood on Tuesday night would have been impressed with the finish he delivered at Plaistow Road.

Played for both

There are just a couple of players who have played for both Hassocks and Horley Town through the years.

The first of those was defender Lee Bryant who moved to the Robins from the New Defence in the summer of 2012.

A former Brighton youth player, Bryant played reserve team football for the Albion at the tender age of 16 before deciding to concentrate instead on a music career.

He became a regular at left back in his first season with the Robins, helping Mickey Jewell's side to their highest ever league finish of fourth in the Premier Division as well as reaching the semi finals of the Sussex RUR Charity Cup.

Bryant found first team opportunities a little harder to come by in the 2013-14 season and he departed a few months into the campaign to play for Ditchling in the Mid Sussex League with a number of his former Hassocks teammates.

He ended his Robins career having played 44 times for the club without scoring.

The other is **Steve Spies**, who played for Horley long before he turned up at the Beacon.

Spiesy has become something of a Hassocks legend for his prowess in both boxes as a striker and then a defender.

He is also responsible for one of the greatest individual performances in the club's history when turning out for the third team away at Wisdom Sports in their Mid Sussex Premier Division clash in March 2007.

Things didn't get off to the best of starts for Spiesy as he scored an own goal and then gave away a penalty in the first half.

Worse was to come though as in the second, he saw red after producing a brilliant full length diving save to push the ball around the post with his hands.

Wisdom's scored the resulting penalty on their way to a 3-1 victory. Spiesy then joined them at their club Race Night and subsequent pub crawl to complete a quite amazing day.

He would later go onto manage Hassocks IIIs, once getting sent off for calling the linesman a "cheating ****" within 10 minutes of giving a team talk in which he had urged the older heads in the changing room to lead by example in a team packed full of Under 18s.

Spiesy also had great success as veterans manager, winning several Fred Pretty Cups for the Robins as well as taking the Mid Sussex League's Veterans' section top scorer award multiple times.

He celebrates his 50th birthday soon, but can still be found turning out for Lindfield IIIs on a Saturday and Hassocks Fatboys on a Sunday.

DEFENSIVE ERRORS COST HASSOCKS DEAR AT THE DEFENCE

As far as season openers go, there wasn't too much excitement to shout about as Hassocks met Southern Combination League new boys Horley Town at the New Defence.

It was the hosts who ran out 2-0 winners, but that owed much to two defensive lapses from the Robins.

This was a game devoid of any real quality as two pretty robust back lines ensured that chances were at a premium, save for the goals that Hassocks contrived to give away.

The manner in which they conceded left Mark Dalgleish more than a little perplexed with the Hassocks boss knowing that with a little more concentration, his side could have been heading back from the north of the county come 5pm with a hard earned point.

How good a point that would have been remains to be seen.

Horley are something of an unknown quality having been moved across to the Southern Combination League in the summer by the FA.

They finished 10th in the Combined Counties Premier last season, a league that is often considered stronger than its Sussex counterpart based on results in the national cup competitions.

Where that puts them in a Premier Division that doesn't have a clear cut favourite this year nobody yet knows.

But based on this showing, they'll be resolute, well organised and stubborn opponents – traits that could make them a threat to those towards the top of the table.

Hassocks had been scoring goals for fun in pre-season, registering 14 in four games.

Yet they couldn't land a real blow on a Horley back line that was marshalled superbly by the outstanding Ryan Brackpool.

True, Hassocks were well below

their best and created very little of the attacking verve that saw them give their Isthmian League neighbours Burgess Hill Town and Haywards Heath Town a real fright over the last month.

But credit should still go to Horley who defended doggedly when they needed to.

The closest that the Robins came to troubling George Hyde in the home goal was when Phil Johnson had a strong penalty claim waved away by referee Ciaran Kane.

That brought back memories of Hassocks' only previous visit to the New Defence for a competitive fixture, a 4-2 FA Vase defeat three years ago in which they had three cast-iron penalties turned down.

They'd fallen three goals behind inside a horror opening half hour on that occasion.

It wasn't the best of starts this time around either as Horley took the lead with just five minutes on the clock.

A long throw into the Hassocks box caused chaos and in the ensuing confusion, it appeared to be the unfortunate Andy Whittingham who sliced into his own goal when attempting to clear.

Hassocks regrouped after that early setback and they did some decent things through midfield as the first half wore on.

Alex Spinks was a controlling presence after an injury-hit campaign last time out and Jack Troak, a new signing from Lewes, showed plenty of promising touches.

The Robins back four looked relatively solid as well. Will Broomfield was partnered at the heart of the defence by Arni Kublickas, back at the Beacon after several seasons in the Mid Sussex League with Burgess Hill Albion.

With Harvey Blake and Whittingham in the full back positions, Josh Green a safe pair of hands in goal and the likes of Harry Mills and enigmatic fan favourite Dan Jacques sitting on the bench, Dalgleish certainly appears to have plenty of options for his rear guard.

What will help Hassocks' cause is if this becomes the season when they can finally cut out conceding from set pieces.

Letting in cheap goals from corners and free kicks has been an ongoing problem dating back to 2015, and it was from yet another dead ball scenario that Horley added their second midway through the second half.

Brackpool was the scorer as he escaped the attentions of Rowe-Hurst to be left with a free header which he gleefully powered past Green.

Hassocks turned to James Littlejohn and Joe Bull to try and wrestle a way back into the game but in truth it never looked likely as proceedings petered out, giving Horley an historic first win on their Southern Combination debut.

For Hassocks, there were some promising moments on a tough assignment, although Dalgleish and his players will know that they can perform much better than this.

HORROR HALF HOUR ENDS ROBINS' VASE HOPES

Hassocks' return to the FA Vase after a seasons absence was all but over within half an hour of their first ever competitive visit to Horley Town.

By that point their Combined Counties Premier Division hosts were 3-0 up and well on their way to a 4-2 victory which sets them up for a home tie in the second qualifying round with either Selsey or Langney Wanderers, both Southern Combination Division One sides.

Hassocks would have fancied their chances against lower division opposition had they have got through here but a combination of some typically woeful defending from balls into the box and a number of baffling refereeing decisions meant it is Horley who now have that opportunity.

In the absence of Ashley Marsh and Tom Barnes, Hassocks were again forced into using Josh Hawkes as an emergency centre back and the defence were soon creaking under a bombardment of crosses from both flanks.

With just seven minutes gone Horley stuck one on the scoreboard as a Mark Bevan cross from the left was headed in by Kyle Hough.

Seven minutes after that it was two in virtually identical circumstances, the only difference being this time the ball came in from the right hand side via Hough with Ryan Brackpool the gleeful recipient.

Goal three had a helping hand from the referee as he incensed Hassocks by missing a clear foul on Jordan Badger as the defender attempted to clear with the result being the loose ball being fired home by Richard Whetton.

That that wasn't even the worse decision of the afternoon spoke volumes for the day the man in the middle had.

30 minutes gone, 3-0 down and Hassocks belatedly began to play.

They dominated proceedings from that point and should have had a penalty, a rash tackle in the box leading to howls of protests and Horley players berating their own team mate for his stupidity in lunging in. The result? A goal kick.

Horley hardly had a kick in the opening exchanges of the second half as the excellent James Westlake began to run the show and they were even more under the cosh once the pace of Jamie Hillwood and Ben Bacon had been introduced from the bench in a double change just prior to the hour mark.

Hassocks are understandably fragile in the confidence department since their flying start to the season has come to a stuttering halt in the last few weeks.

But they had nothing to lose in terms of giving it a right go with the best two of a plethora of chances falling to Bacon and Nathan Miles in a two minute period around midway

through.

Investing so much in trying to get back into the game left them prone to the counter and that is exactly what happened with 15 minutes left to pay as any hopes of an unlikely comeback were all but dashed by Whetton as he – surprise, surprise – headed home a Liam Cox cross.

Hassocks added some respectability to the scoreline with two goals in the final 10 minutes, Jamie Hillwood firing home from the edge of the box and then Hawkes converting from the spot after the Robins were finally deemed worthy of a penalty.

Despite that disastrous opening spell which cost Hassocks any chance of winning the tie, it was the officials who were on the end of most of Phil Wickwar's ire at the final whistle.

"We were on the wrong end of two of the worst decisions I've seen in years which really did kill us."

"We got it wrong tactically in the first half but we can take a decent second half performance away with us. At least it is something to build on."

Hassocks in the FA Vase

The FA Vase has never been the most fruitful of competitions for Hassocks as we are yet to progress past the second round stage since first entering in the 1995-96 season. We take a look at the Robins' record over the past 24 years....

Five games from Wembley

The closest Hassocks have ever got to reaching Wembley in the FA Vase is the second round of the competition, a stage that the Robins have reached on four previous occasions.

The most recent of those came in the 2014-15 season and it was an evening to forget for Dave John's young side as they were hammered 7 -0 by Ashford United – Hassocks' heaviest defeat in the competition.

Before the 2-0 win over Meridian Valley Park two weeks ago, that was the season in which the Robins most recently won a game in the Vase when triumphing 3-1 at home against Cortinthian thanks to two goals in the final five minutes from Phil Johnson and Nathan Miles.

Hassocks' other games in the second round stage were less

chastening than that Ashford experience; 1-0 defeats away at Lymington Spa and Kingsbury Town in 2007-08 and 2005-06 respectively and a 2-1 loss at Banstead Athletic in 1998-99.

That Banstead defeat was preceded by probably Hassocks' best ever set of results in the competition.

The Robins weren't drawn at home in a single round but picked up quite brilliant wins on the road in tough away games at Knitbury Rangers (3-2) and then a stunning 3-0 win away at Ware.

Stung by the Hornets

The Vase seemed to love throwing up games with Horsham in the early 90s and Hassocks and the Hornets faced off three times in the FA Vase between 1995 and 2000.

season that the Robins entered the competition, Horsham winning a topsy-turvy game 6-3 at Queen Street in the first round in 1995-96.

Ramsgate became the first side Hassocks ever beaten in a national cup competition in the previous round following a 2-1 away win.

John's side then were eliminated by he Hornets again in 2000/01 thanks to a 2-1 repay defeat at Queen Street after they'd done fantastically well to hold their higher division visitors 2-2 here at the Beacon.

The fact that game went to a replay was a rarity in itself, as only one other time in over 20 years of entering the competition have Hassocks needed an additional 90 minutes to decide a game.

That came in the first qualifying The first of those came in the first round game against Farnham Town

in 2011-12.

Both of those matches ended in 1 -1 draws with Town eventually triumphing 8-7 on penalties on a horrible Tuesday night in Surrey.

Phil Gault scored the Hassocks goals in both games and it was the unfortunate James Westlake who missed the decisive spot kick.

No Deal at Deal

There have been five other exits at the first round stage, the most disappointing of which came at Deal Town in 2012-13.

Hassocks had finished the previous season in fourth place in the Sussex County League - their highest ever finish - and had arguably the best squad in the clubs history but they simply didn't turn up on the day, going down 2-0 to a set of gloating hosts.

The only positive from the experience came with meeting the 'Deal Duck', Town's mascot that was effectively a bloke dressed in a Donald Duck outfit.

Spencer Slaughter in particular was delighted to meet him, demanding a picture after the game in what was otherwise a pretty poor afternoon on the road.

The Robins other first round exits have come at the hands of Chessington & Hook United 3-0 in 2013-14, Witney United in 2004-05 just before a certain David Cameron became the local MP, fellow Sussex side Sidley United 3-1 in 2001-02 and away at Herne Bay in the 1996-97 season.

Sussex sides send the Robins crashing

Of the Robins six other second qualifying round exits, three of them have come at the hands of clubs from the Southern Combination League.

Littlehampton Town accounted for the Robins exit from the competition in 1997, Arundel in 2003 and Eastbourne Town in 2006.

That Eastbourne Town defeat was particularly harsh on the Robins as they took the eventual Premier Division champions all the way to extra time before succumbing 3-1.

Two of the other three exits were all by a single goal – 3-2 away at BAT Sports in the 1999-00 season and at home to Chertsey Town 3-2 AET in 2008-09.

There was also a disappointing 2-

0 defeat away at Molesey in the 2009 -10 campaign and a 3-0 home loss to Spelthorne Sports two seasons ago.

Out at the earliest

Given that Hassocks have rarely finished in the bottom six during their 24 years in the top flight of the Southern Combination, it has not been often that they've entered the FA Vase at the first qualifying round.

They did so last season, losing 2-0 at home to K Sports.

Today's opponents meanwhile provided the opposition in the 2016-17 campaign as the Robins were on the end of a 4-2 defeat at the New Defence in the club's first game in the competition for two years, having failed to enter for the 2015-16 season. Hassocks' only other exits at the first qualifying round stage came in 2010-11, 3-2 away at Blackfield & Langley in a game that is probably best remembered for a young Andy Whittingham receiving a quite sensational red card for attempting to kung fu kick an opposition player in the face.

There was also a 3-2 defeat at big spending Moneyfields in 2003-04.

Hassocks have won two games at the first qualifying round of the competition previously including one of their most entertaining outings in the Vase, a 4-3 win over Three Bridges in 2008-09 in which Jack Simpson made his Hassocks debut.

The other victory came by three goals to one the following season at home to Sevenoaks Town.

Robins to host Lions in RUR

Hassocks will face Southern Combination League Premier Division rivals Pagham in the second round of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup on Tuesday 17th September.

The tie will take place at the

Beacon with a 7.45pm kick off, giving the Robins a run of four consecutive home games.

The Robins host Horley Town in the FA Vase on Saturday 14th, the Lions now visit three days later with back-to-back league fixtures following against Lingfield and Loxwood on Saturday 21st and Saturday 28th. This will be Hassocks' first game in the RUR Cup of the season having been given a bye in the first round.

Pagham meanwhile had been due to face Isthmian League side Chichester City, but their local rivals decided to pull out of the competition to hand the Lions their place in round two.

It will be the first meeting in the RUR Cup between the two sides since the 2003-04 season when Dave John's side went 4-2 away at Nyetimber Lane.

That's one of three previous clashes in the competition and ominously for Hassocks, it's Pagham who have won every one so far.

The Lions denied Hassocks a first ever appearance in a senior final when winning 2-0 in extra time at the semi-final stage in 1994 and a year previous to that it had been a similar story in the last eight where Pagham were 2-1 victors.

Bob Paine's side are currently below Hassocks in the Premier Division table, but they'll be buoyed by the early season league fixture between the two.

That took place on Tuesday August 20th at Nyetimber Lane and saw the Lions run out 1-0 winners. Lewis Jenkins scored the only goal of the game nine minutes from time to end the Robins' resistance with the three points being Pagham's only maximum haul so far this season.

Likewise, Hassocks only have one league win to their name and that came against East Preston in the second game of the campaign.

They have however been excellent in the cup competitions so far, defeating Langney Wanderers and Meridian Valley Park and taking Isthmian League side Chipstead to an FA Cup replay, where only a couple of controversial refereeing decisions denied them giant killing headlines.

The winners will go onto face either high flying Division One outfit Mile Oak or another Premier Division side in Newhaven in the third round.

Owen goes to Iceland

Owen's latest running challenge will see him running 200 miles across Iceland in 10 days. Here's how you can support him, both in terms of raising money for good causes and by helping out around the Beacon in his absence...

On my fitness and running journey, I've been lucky enough to meet and rub shoulders with some pretty impressive people - world champions, Guinness World Record Holders, and some pretty bad ass individuals who provide plenty of inspiration on a daily basis.

Danny Bent is one such individual. He was voted one of the 100 happiest people in the UK, and one of the 50 most inspirational people in London.

He is an award winning author and journalist, Guinness World Record holder, and celebrated adventurer and community leader.

Motivating people to be the best version of themselves is Danny's passion and trade.

Encouraging them to do more, give more and live more.

Living dreams, facing fears, and loving themselves, others and life with abandon are his tool kit.

He set up and founded One Run For Boston, a 3328.2 mile relay run across the US, that raised \$550,000 for those affected by the Boston Marathon bombings.

He is also the founder of Project Awesome in the UK providing free fitness in Central London, and The London Relay (which I've run a leg of) where a 10k leg made up part of a relay which ran for 24 hours a day for a month.

It all started with an idea on Facebook, where Danny was looking for people to help him celebrate his birthday by joining him on a run across Iceland, and before I knew it I and a band of intrepid runners and adventurers had agreed and The Great Norse Run was born.

Not just a run, this has been described as a nomadic journey covering 200 miles in just 10 days, camping in the wilds of Iceland and fully experiencing all the beauty it has to offer.

In typical Danny fashion he also wants to leave a legacy, so we have joined with The Committed Project to raise funds to support the work they do.

Their aim is to help young people get the skills and experience they need for a meaningful and positive life.

They do this through adventures, mentoring and interventions lead by some really inspirational people.

I've never run this far in such a short space of time, so this is going to be a huge test of both my physical and mental ability.

Any support you can give to both me and the charity would be amazing, especially as a group we are trying to raise in excess of £30K!!

TOWN TRIUMPH BUT THIS WAS FAR FROM A CAKEWALK

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 7th September 2019, The Saffrons Eastbourne Town 4-1 Hassocks

Sometimes in football, the scoreline doesn't tell the whole story. Hassocks' visit to Eastbourne Town was one of those occasions.

On the face of it, a 4-1 defeat at the Saffrons for Mark Dalgleish's side is a result that looks about right to the casual Premier Division observer.

Town are the favourites to lift the Southern Combination title this season and came into the fixture unbeaten. They'd only conceded once in their five previous games.

Hassocks meanwhile had just one league win to their name and that came against the division's bottom club, East Preston.

The current table suggests that it could be a long season ahead for the Robins.

But the Hassocks' league position is another falsity. While they may have been undercooking in the Premier Division, in the cups Hassocks have been delivering some outstanding displays.

They've beaten Langney Wanderers and Meridian Valley Park and took Isthmian League side Chipstead to an FA Cup replay, where only a couple of controversial refereeing decisions denied them giant killing headlines.

Believe it or not, but they brought that cup form to the Sunshine Coast; while the final score suggests an easy day at the office for Town, in reality it was anything but.

What ensured that there was a three-goal difference between the two sides was Town's ruthlessness in front of goal as the hosts finished with clinical aplomb the chances that came their way.

Aaron Capon scored Town's first two with the outstanding Dan Perry adding the third and fourth.

Perry now has eight for the season already; two more than Hassocks have managed in the Premier Division in total. It wasn't like the visitors didn't have chances. The Robins created four or five good opportunities across the course of the afternoon which unfortunately for them they failed to take.

Perhaps most costly of all, they hit the post early in the second half with the scores level at 1-1.

Had that gone in, then things may well have been very different. Town would have been forced to chase the game, which would have left the sort of spaces that Hassocks can so brutally take advantage of with their counter attacking ability.

Clearly, Hassocks are missing the services of last season's 27-goal top scorer Phil Johnson, who hasn't been seen since limping off in that win over EP back at the start of August.

No timeframe appears to have been put on Johnson's return, but install a player with his knack of knowing where the goal is into a side who, on their day can threaten even the best teams in the league and the omens look good.

Dalgleish did at least have Jack Rowe-Hurst available here to boost his attacking options after a couple of weeks on the side lines.

That's timely, as the games are coming thick and fast now. By the time September reaches it's conclusion, Hassocks will have played twice a week in six of the first eight weeks of the season.

Despite the glut of fixtures caused



by the Robins' aforementioned success in knockout competitions, Dalgleish named a rare unchanged line up from the side that felt so hard done by against Chipstead in midweek.

That showing against the Chips was full of steel and determination but it looked like those attributes had deserted Hassocks as it took Town just seven minutes to take the lead through Capon.

Going behind so early proved to be something of a wake up call to the Robins and they battled their way back into the tie, eventually levelling things up right on the stroke of half time.

Ben Bacon was the man on target, his second goal since returning to the club from Steyning Town a fortnight into the new campaign and the least he deserved for another hardworking showing leading the line.

Town goalkeeper Jason Tibble could then only watch when the Robins rattled the woodwork within five minutes of the restart.

Two minutes later and that miss proved to be doubly costly as Capon added his second of the afternoon to put the hosts 2-1 ahead.

Like all good teams, Town turned the screw after that and Perry's quick -fire double arrived between minutes 64 and 70, ending any Hassocks hopes of returning to Mid Sussex with something to show for their efforts.

ROBINS LEAVE IT LATE TO SPOIL THE BEARS BIG DAY

It was an historic occasion for Broadbridge Heath Under 23s as they played their first game at their new High Wood Hill Sports Ground.

But Hassocks seemingly hadn't read the script as they spoilt the party, coming from behind to win 2-1 and get their season up and running.

Pitcher wasn't the only injury concern following Monday either.

Dan Turner had also started against Lancing before a knee problem brought a premature end to his first team debut as he hobbled

Hassocks were largely untroubled after Bull's strike and they saw the game out comfortably for a first three points of the season.

With next week's scheduled game against early leaders Pagham postponed, Hassocks will now wait two weeks until their next fixture - an equally difficult assignment away at a YMCA side who beat the Robins to the title last season.

HIBBERT STRIKE SEES HASSOCKS PROGRESS

After Saturday's magnificent display in winning 3-0 away at **Chessington & Hook United** in the FA Cup, this was very much a case of after the Lord Mayor's show for Hassocks as they got their Sussex RUR Charity Cup campaign underway.

They struggled to break down a resolute Crawley Down outfit from a division below in the first ever meeting between the two sides.

Perhaps that shouldn't have come as a surprise given their exertions four days previously.

this performance and result highlighted the Robins' other qualities such as determination as they were forced to keep plugging away against determined opposition.

Hassocks had lots of possession but squandered plenty of good opportunities before Anthony Hibbert volleyed home his fourth goal of the season with just nine minutes remaining.

That ensured that the Robins won't have to try and cram a replay into an already packed fixture list they're still in all four knockout competitions - and sets up a home time with either holders Ringmer or Eastbourne Town in round three.

As well as being wasteful in front of goal, Hassocks also came up against an inspired goalkeeping

display from the visitors' Matt Heasman.

The Down goalkeeper produced several excellent saves which kept Hassocks at bay for much of the match. He deserved a replay.

Dave John made two changes from the side that had been so impressive at the weekend.

James Laing was rested with Matt Robbins coming in to partner Pat Harding in attack and Chris Brown was handed a start in midfield.

Brown coming in necessitated a position change for Stuart Faith who dropped into the back five in place of Brendan Leahy.

Faith may have to get used to a defensive role over the coming weeks In fact, you could even argue that as the early prognosis is that Leahy could be out for some time after being forced off just before the break at Chessington.

> Hibbert had the first two chances of the game with a couple of distance efforts, firing over from 25 yards and 20 yards respectively.

The second of those was the closest, whistling just past the upright with Heasman stranded in no mans land.

Pat Harding had one of his quieter evenings in front of goal but his work rate across the backline troubled a Down defence who didn't appear to know what to do with him.

Graham Beveridge headed over, Harding shot straight at Heasman and Robbins fire over in a goalless first half that left Hassocks frustrated but in charge of the game.

Down tried to attack a little more after the break and they had a good chance to take the lead on 56 minutes, the lively Dan Sullivan firing over when well placed.

At the other end, Hibbert again found himself with a shooting opportunity but was denied by a smart stop from the legs of Heasman.

Sullivan continued to look like Down's most likely route to causing an upset and it took an excellent diving save from Joel Harding to deny him after the striker had managed to find a pocket of space in the box.

Substitute Mark Saunders then went close after his driving run from the halfway line ended with a shot from the edge of the area that was inches wide.

Laing was introduced for the injured Robbins on 66 minutes and on 73 minutes, John made a minor adjustment by replacing Beveridge with Kieron Leahy who slotted into the back line, freeing Faith up to move into midfield.

When Matt Robbins was fit and on form, there weren't many better central midfielders on the Southern Combination League circuit in the mid-2000's.

Robbins arrived at the Beacon in 2004 having moved to Brighton for University. Originally from Suffolk, he'd helped Beccles United win the Anglian Combination League in 2002 at the age of 18 and after a few reserve outings for the Robins, it became apparent very quickly that Hassocks had a serious talent.

As a result, Dave John fast tracked him into the first team squad and he made his debut early in the 2004-05 season, going onto become a mainstay of the side over the next four seasons.

Robbins was mainly used as a central midfielder but he could also do a job up front and even played the odd game at left wing back, his versatility nearly matching his technical ability in his 157 appearances which yielded 20 goals.


