Neither Hassocks nor Pagham have enjoyed the best start to the Premier Division campaign, so tonight's meeting in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup represents a chance to get back on track...

Pagham's slow start can be attributed to the fact that it was a ridiculously busy summer at Nyetimber Lane as the Lions brought in a new manager and an entire new squad.

Bob Paine is now the man at the helm having moved west from East Preston, an appointment that the Lions hoped would arrest a decline that saw them pick up just 14 points from 23 games from November onwards last season.

Prior to that, they had accumulated 31 from 15, which had them well in the title race alongside Horsham YMCA and eventual champions, Chichester City.

Obviously, when a club makes such wholesale changes as Pagham have then it can take time to gel, something the Lions are experiencing as their currently second bottom with one win from seven games.

Hassocks fans won't need any reminding about where that one win came from either.

It was of course on the Robins' long trip west on Tuesday 20th August, Lewis Jenkins scoring the only goal of the game with just nine minutes remaining to deny the Robins what would have been a hard -earned point.

Perhaps we shouldn't have been surprised by that though. After all, Hassocks do have a terrible record against the Lions in recent years, having lost nine of the previous 11 meetings stretching back to 2014

The Robins' only win since then against Pagham came here in the Premier Division last year, a 4-0 success thanks to goals from Liam Benson, Will Broomfield and a Phil Johnson double.

That hasn't made much difference to the overall head-tohead, which the Lions still lead by some way, having won 26 games to the Robins' 17 with nine draws.

Things don't get much better in this competition either. Pagham have won all three of the previous meetings in the RUR Cup.

The most recent of those came in the 2003-04 season while older fans will remember the heartbreak of a 2-0 extra time defeat in the semi final of the competition in the 1993-94 season.

ROBINS FALL LATE ON THE LONG TRIP WEST

Three days after Hassocks had bucked some recent history by picking up a point from a normally fruitless hunting ground, they were unable to repeat the trick from their longest away journey of the season.

On Saturday at Horsham YMCA, Ben Bacon's late leveller secured a share of the spoils at a Gorings Mead ground at which they've only won twice this century.

While their record at Nyetimber Lane may not be quite as bad, you still have to go back eight years to find the last time that the Robins left Pagham with all three points.

On paper, this looked like their best opportunity to do so since that October day in 2011 when Phil Gault and Phil Johnson delivered a 2-1 success for Mickey Jewell's side.

Pagham came into the tie yet to taste victory in four games under new boss Bob Paine and sat bottom of the early Premier Division table having failed to score a goal in the league so far.

While former East Preston manager Paine may have completely rebuilt the squad over the summer, that was a continuation of the Lions' form from the second half of last season, which had seen them tumble from title contention in November to finishing 11th come the end of the campaign.

They picked up just 14 points from 23 games in that run, including a chastening 4-0 hammering at the hands of Hassocks at the Beacon in March.

But there was no repeat of that here. Hassocks certainly weren't helped by the scheduling, the Southern Combination League sending the Robins on their longest trip on a Tuesday night in the middle of holiday season for a 7.30pm kick off. That deprived Mark Dalgleish of some of his big name players, necessitating four changes from the side that drew at YM.

Out went Arni Kublickas, Alex Spinks, Jamie Hillwood and Jack Rowe-Hurst and in came Dan Jacques, Will Broomfield, Lewis Westlake and James Littlejohn.

The only goal of the game arrived midway through the second half and once again it was as a result of a set piece that Hassocks failed to defend properly.

Lewis Jenkins was the man in black and white who took advantage of the slackness in the Hassocks backline, heading a Jack Barnes corner past Josh Green with nine minutes remaining.

Pagham had begun the game the brighter side, peppering the Hassocks goal with a number of off target efforts.

Jenkins, Scott Rafferty and George Cody all failed to make Josh Green work when well placed while Tom Chalaye saw an effort hacked off the line by the enigmatic Jacques, making his first start of the campaign.

It took until the 42nd minute for the Robins to register a shot on target, Lewis Broughton saving comfortably from a Jack Troak effort.

A second Hassocks chance followed a minute later, this time Broughton produced a stunning stop to keep out a one-on-one from Ben Bacon after a home backpass went horribly wrong. Green produced an equally good save to tip a Barnes screamer over the bar in-between those two opportunities in what was a breathless end to the first half.

The Robins continued where they'd left off at the start of the second 45, drawing another fine save from Broughton and then seeing two further efforts desperately blocked by home defenders.

Pagham weathered that little storm and the game ebbed and flowed after that, the Lions wastefulness in front of goal looking like it might allow the Robins to leave with a point.

That was until Jenkins struck to spark wild scenes of jubilation among the home faithful.

Pagham could have sewn the game up with a second in time added on, substitute Harrison Mott winning possession before bearing down on the Hassocks goal but Green made another fine stop.

Paine said afterwards that he was delighted for his young squad and you suspect that they'll be climbing the table over the coming weeks, now that the monkey of getting their first win is off their backs.

Dalgleish and Hassocks meanwhile turn their attentions to the FA Cup and a first Preliminary Qualifying Round tie for six years away at Isthmian League side Chipstead.

The Robins haven't eliminated a higher league side in the competition since 2005, meaning that it is something of a free hit - as well as a chance to buck some more recent history.

ROBINS SHOCK PAGHAM TO END LEADER'S WINNING STREAK

After 13 successive wins to start their Sussex County League Division One campaign, leaders Pagham were shocked at Nyetimber Lane as Hassocks left with all three points courtesy of a 2-1 win.

The Lions have looked and been unbeatable so far this season and, although nobody was making too much noise about it in public, they had Newhaven's 50-year-old record of 16 straight victories to begin a top flight season well within their sights.

They'd netted 38 times and contained the division's leading scorer Scott Murfin, who always seems to score against Hassocks, among their ranks.

As a result, not many people gave Hassocks a prayer going into this game.

Mickey Jewell's side have been wildly inconsistent this season and came into the clash having lost their past three games, conceding 15 times along the way.

They had won just five times from their opening 16 games in all competitions, exiting the FA Cup, FA Vase and John O'Hara League Cup at the earliest possible stage in the process.

To add to Jewell's woes, there have been serious doubts about the fitness of Jack Simpson.

The Robins number one missed that League Cup defeat at Old Barn

Way a month ago with injury and although he has played in every game since, he has looked as if he is a man playing through the pain barrier for the cause.

That was until this one. Simpson was back on song here, showing the sort of form that saw him claim a clean sweep of Player's Player, Manager's Player and Supporter's Player of the Season awards last year.

Jewell knows he has a talented squad that will come good once they can get out of the rut.

To his credit, he kept the faith in making just one change from the 2-0 defeat away at Division One newcomers AFC Uckfield Town at the weekend, a game which the Robins dominated but were in the end denied anything from due to some woeful finishing.

Kieran O'Callaghan was available again and he came into shore up the centre of midfield with Jamie Weston moving out to the left and Phil Johnson dropping down to the bench.

It looked like things would go to form when Pagham took the lead after just three minutes when James Temple's superb effort from distance whistled past Simpson and into the back of the net.

Undeterred, Hassocks equalised by the time the clock had reached the sixth minute.

A clumsy challenge in the box from Pagham gave Phil Gault the

opportunity to level things up from the penalty spot and he duly did, confidently dispatching his kick for 1-1 and his ninth goal of the season.

Hassocks were indebted to Simpson after that for keeping Murfin and his fellow attackers at bay with a string of outrageous saves which would ultimately prove to be the difference between the to sides.

Pagham thought they'd finally found a way past the young Hassocks stopper with 12 minutes remaining, but that effort was chalked off by the officials.

It was a decision that seemed to galvanise Hassocks and in particular Johnson, now on the field in place of the hard working Nathan Miles.

He went close with a header in the final 10 minutes from a Chris Maynard delivery that flew just over the bar.

That was a warning sign and as Pagham went looking for a winner to make it victory number 14, they were hit with a sucker punch as Johnson scored his fifth goal of the season in the 88th minute to end the only remaining 100% record in Division One.

Robins in the RUR



Hassocks first entered the Sussex RUR Charity Cup in 1981. We take a look back at the Robins' attempts over the past 38 years to make it the first ever piece of senior silverware to enter the Beacon's trophy cabinet...

Everybody knows the fact – Hassocks have never reached a senior cup final, let alone lifted a trophy in their 114 year history.

The Sussex RUR Charity Cup is the one that has provided the Robins with the best opportunity to do so – not that that is saying much, admittedly – as we've reached the semi-finals of the competition on three occasions.

The most recent of those visits to the last four was probably the most disappointing when in 2011-12, we were beaten 3-1 by lowly Selsey at Culver Road.

A 5-2 victory in the league at the High Street Ground had been recorded a month previously and the Robins went into the tie the favourites despite being without the services of the talismanic Phil Gault.

But there could be little complaint about the score on the day as Mickey Jewell's side simply didn't turn up and the chance of a first ever cup final went begging.

It had been a straight forward cup run up until that point with victories against Mile Oak, East Grinstead Town and Southwick paving the way to heartache in the last four.

If that illustrated just what a favourable draw can do for a cup run, then Hassocks' previous semi-final defeat before that was an indication of how it can work the other way, when we met all-conquering Burgess Hill Town in the 1999-00 season.

Mile Oak, Arundel and Lancing had all been vanquished on route to the meeting with the Robins arch rivals of the time and although formbooks and class can go out the window when it comes to a local derby, Hassocks proved to be no match for the Hillians who ran out 4-1 winners.

The third semi of this competition the Robins have made came six seasons before that defeat at the hands of Hill in 1993-94 and it was the closest Hassocks have ever come to clearing the hurdle to actually making a final as they went down only in extra time 2-0 to tonight's visitors, Pagham.

That wasn't an easy run to reach the last four either with victories over Wick, Southwick, Lancing and Whitehawk all being gained along the way.

In the mid 00's, Hassocks were remarkably consistent in bowing out of the competition at the quarter final stage with four last eight exits in a row – 2005-06 to Shoreham, 2006-07 to Whitehawk, 2007-08 to Rye United and 2008-09 to Three Bridges.

There have been five other quarter final exits, to Burgess Hill the year before that semi heartache at the hands of the Hillians, to Selsey in 1994-95, Pagham in 1992-93 and Southwick in 1981-82 – the first season we entered the competition.

Haywards Heath Town were responsible four our most recent last eight elimination when they won 3-0 here last season on route to defeat in the final against Peacehaven & Telscombe.

It was a similar story in the quarter finals in 2016-17 when the Robins were eliminated away at Crawley Down Gatwick who ended up finishing as runners up to Newhaven.

Round three only came into existence for the 2000-01 competition when the preliminary round was removed, and it has been the Robins exiting point on three occasions, most recently in 2013-14 via a 3-2 defeat away at Horsham YMCA.

Hassocks crashed out at the stage in back-to-back campaigns in 2000-01 and 2001-02 to Selsey and Southwick respectively.

And as for the aforementioned preliminary round? Hassocks only ever had one dalliance with it.

That came in the 1993-94 season, a 3-2 win over Wick.

As for the second round, that was the stage of the competition we exited in 2017-18, somehow managing to blowing a 2-0 lead with 15 minutes remaining to lose 4-2 in extra time away at AFC Uckfield Town.

Hassocks were also eliminated from the competition at that stage in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons via heavy home defeats, 5-1 against Eastbourne Town and 5-0 against Littlehampton Town respectively. The less said about those, the better.

Given the Robins well documented ability to make hard work and more often than not lose to teams from a lower division, Hassocks have been knocked out of the RUR Cup a surprisingly low number of times by sides from lower down the pyramid.

The most recent of those did come in the second round, a penalty shootout defeat to Division One outfit Little Common in 2012-13 after an astonishing 5-5 draw.

Round two also accounted for Hassocks' exits in 2010-11 to Sidley United and 2009-10 when Dave John's side were eliminated by Selsey.

Selsey again eliminated the Robins at that stage in 2004-05, which followed hot on the heels of second round defeats to Pagham the previous year and Burgess Hill before that.

Other exits came against Shoreham in 1997-98, Midhurst & Easebourne in 1995-96 which represented another rare shock, Sidley in 1986-87 and Whitehawk in 1982-83.

Hassocks have been on a remarkable run of receiving byes in the competition to the point where they didn't actually compete in the first round for 17 years between beating Worthing United 6-3 in the 2016-17 season and defeating Mile Oak in the 1999-00 season.

The Robins have only bowed out

of the competition three times at the first round stage – to Langney Sports in 1996-97, Ringmer in 1984-85 and Peacehaven & Telscombe in 1983-84.

That exit to the Tye remains one of only two games in the competition that Hassocks have been involved in that required a replay, a 1-1 draw at Adastra Park being followed by a 1-0 defeat away from home.


The other came two seasons previously when another 1-1 draw at Adastra necessitated a second game, this time Hassocks triumphing 5-3 in a thriller away at Hastings Town.

Five games have gone to extra time and Hassocks have won three of them, the only blemishes being that 1994 semi-final defeat to Pagham and the exit two seasons ago against AFC Uckfield Town.

The extra time wins have seen the Robins defeat Ringmer 4-3 in 1982-83, Worthing United 4-2 in 1995-96 and Ringmer again in 2005-06, that time 2-1.

Aside from the Little Common penalty defeat, Hassocks have only had one other shoot out in the competition which was in 2007-08 when Arundel were beaten 4-1 from 12 yards after a 2-2 draw in normal time.

Hassocks' biggest victory in the competition also represents one of their biggest ever victories in senior football, a 9-0 hammering dished out to the now defunct Shinewater Association in 2000-01. The Robins heaviest RUR defeat is that 5-0 loss to Littlehampton Town from 2014.

Owen goes to Iceland

Owen's latest running challenge will see him running 200 miles across Iceland in 10 days. Here's how you can support him, both in terms of raising money for good causes and by helping out around the Beacon in his absence...

On my fitness and running journey, I've been lucky enough to meet and rub shoulders with some pretty impressive people - world champions, Guinness World Record Holders, and some pretty bad ass individuals who provide plenty of inspiration on a daily basis.

Danny Bent is one such individual. He was voted one of the 100 happiest people in the UK, and one of the 50 most inspirational people in London.

He is an award winning author and journalist, Guinness World Record holder, and celebrated adventurer and community leader.

Motivating people to be the best version of themselves is Danny's passion and trade.

Encouraging them to do more, give more and live more.

Living dreams, facing fears, and loving themselves, others and life with abandon are his tool kit.

He set up and founded One Run For Boston, a 3328.2 mile relay run across the US, that raised \$550,000 for those affected by the Boston Marathon bombings.

He is also the founder of Project Awesome in the UK providing free fitness in Central London, and The London Relay (which I've run a leg of) where a 10k leg made up part of a relay which ran for 24 hours a day for a month.

It all started with an idea on Facebook, where Danny was looking for people to help him celebrate his birthday by joining him on a run across Iceland, and before I knew it I and a band of intrepid runners and adventurers had agreed and The Great Norse Run was born.

Not just a run, this has been described as a nomadic journey covering 200 miles in just 10 days, camping in the wilds of Iceland and fully experiencing all the beauty it has to offer.

In typical Danny fashion he also wants to leave a legacy, so we have joined with The Committed Project to raise funds to support the work they do.

Their aim is to help young people get the skills and experience they need for a meaningful and positive life.

They do this through adventures, mentoring and interventions lead by some really inspirational people.

HIGH FLYING BEARS BEAT HASSOCKS - BUT ONLY JUST

Southern Combination League Premier Division Tuesday 10th September 2019, High Wood Hill Broadbridge Heath 2-1 Hassocks

Last time Hassocks travelled to Broadbridge Heath, it was a chastening experience.

The Bears' Leisure Centre home was on its last legs as the club were caught in limbo, playing at a facility they were supposed to have vacated months earlier but were still stuck at as the contractors working on their new High Wood Hill home repeatedly pushed back the moving in date.

As a result, the pitch on that grim November afternoon resembled a cabbage patch.

Not that it provided any excuses for the Robins' performance as they were deservedly beaten 6-0 by Steve Painter's side. In truth, it could have been double figures.

This time around, the fixture was played in Heath's impressive new facility, the fourth league game to be played since the keys were finally handed over in the summer.

Not only were the surroundings vastly improved, but so was Hassocks' showing as they went down 2-1 to a Bears side who could well be dark horses in this season's Premier Division title race.

The Bears are riding the crest of a wave currently, in part due to the significant boost that High Wood Hill is providing.

They're unbeaten there so far and playing in front of vastly increased crowds which have so far pushed them into second in the Premier Division's average attendance table.

As for the actual league table, Heath are flying in that too. This victory took them into third spot, three points behind joint leaders Eastbourne Town and Lancing.

Those two clubs provided the opposition in Hassocks' two previous league outings, which goes some way towards explaining why the Robins are currently floundering towards the wrong end of the table.

Mark Dalgleish and his men are in

the midst of not only a desperately hard run of games, but a congested fixture list too.

They've played six times in the past three weeks, taking on the Premier Division's top three and having two FA Cup clashes with Isthmian League side Chipstead.

Keeping players fresh during such an intense schedule is a tough ask at the best of times, let alone when you're taking on such quality opposition.

Dalgleish shuffled his pack here, resting several players ahead of Saturday's FA Vase clash with Horley Town.

The most eye-catching selection decision saw 18-year-old goalkeeper James Earl come in for his Hassocks debut in place of Josh Green.

Earl arrived in the summer from Eastbourne Borough, for whom he made a couple of first teams appearances from the bench last season.

He's already impressed in the Robins' Under 23s opening two fixtures and gave a good account of himself on his first start at senior level.

There were two saves of particular note, both from the lively Jamie Taylor.

The first saw Earl do well to get behind Taylor's scissor kick volley, the improvisation of which could easily have caught the goalkeeper out while the second was smart rather spectacular.

Hassocks' other changes saw Dan Stokes start at right back in place of Harvey Blake, Arni Kublickas come in for Harry Mills and Jack Rowe-Hurst replace James Littlejohn.

Liam Benson was also named among the Hassocks substitutes having re-joined the club just three months after his summer move to Steyning Town.

Aside from that Taylor volley, chances were few and far between in the first half.



Rowe-Hurst had the only other opportunity worth mentioning but his effort was blocked by Heath's Connor Evento, himself a former Hassocks

Under 23 goalkeeper. The second half was a different story with Heath flying out of the traps to set the tempo for what was to come.

That positivity saw them take the lead within five minutes of the restart.

The Robins failed to convincingly clear a George Cousins effort with Max Howell cracking the lose ball into the bottom corner of Earl's goal from 15 yards.

Hassocks' response was impressive and they were level within six minutes.

An excellent corner delivery was met by Ben Bacon who just got his head to the ball in front of Evento for his third goal of the campaign.

The Robins were on top for the next five minutes with Heath's centre backs of Lee Carney and Josh Tuck another ex-Robin - resorting to increasingly desperate measures to repel the visitors' attacks.

That was until Heath notched what turned out to be the winner, completely against the run of play.

No prizes for guessing who scored it, Taylor finally managing to find a way past Earl with a stunning volley from a Jamie Robinson cross.

Hassocks threw on Benson and Littlejohn in response and despite spending the final five minutes camped in Heath's half, they couldn't find a way through.

HASSOCKS FALTER IN THE CLOSING STAGES AGAIN

The closing minutes of games have not been kind to Hassocks of late and that didn't change as their first competitive meeting with Newhaven since 1987 ended in a 1-1 draw at the Beacon.

A last minute penalty miss on Saturday denied the Robins a deserved FA Cup replay with Isthmian League side Chipstead.

And here they were three days later surrendering two points to the Dockers who equalised just six minutes from time.

In all fairness, the hosts could hardly grumble about the result in what was their first league outing for three weeks.

Hassocks might have created the clearer chances, but it was Newhaven who had the greater desire in the closing half hour and that's ultimately what led the spoils to be shared.

It was the Dockers' liveliest attacker, right winger Lee Robinson, who fired a low shot through a crowded area after Hassocks failed to effectively clear their lines.

On this evidence, Robinson is going to be a real handful for Division One defences to handle this season as he gave Chris Maynard and Ashley Marsh a real test on the left side of Hassocks' defence.

The hosts had led for 70 minutes prior to Robinson's equaliser but in truth it was a poor performance.

Mickey Jewell's hand wasn't helped by a bench consisting of defenders Lee Bryant and Tom Davess, 17-year-old midfielder George Brown and goalkeeper Alex Harris.

For Brown, it was a first call up to the first team bench. He's been in excellent early season form for Nigel Pearce's Under 18s as they look to go one better than last season's runners up finish in the Youth League Central Division.

Hassocks' options were further limited by the fact that the reserves had games the following night and on Friday, which meant he could hardly call upon the likes of Dan Jacques and Stuart Brown who might otherwise have been involved.

There was therefore little that Jewell could do to inject some muchneeded life into a team that were dangerously sitting back on their lead.

The withdrawal during the day of Phil Gault coupled with Phil Johnson's unavailability left Nathan Miles to plough a lone furrow up front and he was guilty of missing some of his side's best chances.

Jamie Ingham scored the goal after Newhaven keeper Jake Buss did well to save the initial effort and then Anthony Hibbert had his follow-up effort blocked before Ingham made it Subs: Bryant (Ingham 81), Davess, third time lucky.

That was the midfielder's first senior goal in his second spell at the club and was a richly deserved reward for some fine appearances of late.

After that 15th minute strike, Miles pulled his shot wide of the far post after just two passes stretching the length of the pitch had put him clean through.

Then on 54 minutes, Buss denied him well when home skipper Nathan Cooper, in his 50th game for the club, released his striker one-on-one.

Hibbert thundered a 30-yarder against the bar midway through the second half but the Dockers, to their credit, kept beavering away before finally earning their reward.

At least on the credit side, the combative and tremendously hard working Mark Price stayed on the pitch for 90 minutes after two red cards in a week and there was a belated first appearance of the season for Bryant from the bench.

And the Robins also had the consolation of maintaining their unbeaten league record this season to five games before the focus again switches to knockout competition, this time the FA Vase and the visit of Ringmer.

Lingfield this season?

Lingfield started the season with two big results, hammering East Preston 3-0 at the Lashmar in their opening game before dispatching of Eastbourne United 6-0 in a result that really made the rest of the Premier Division sit up and take notice. It's been a little bit more of a struggle since then however and at the time of writing, they'd lost their past eight games in a row in all competitions since drawing 1-1 with Spelthorne Sports in the extra preliminary qualifying round of the FA Cup.

Hassocks' record against Lingfield?

There have been 24 meetings between Hassocks and Lingfield in the past with the Robins leading the head-to-head with 12 wins to the Lingers' seven. Lingfield did complete a Premier Division double last season with Hassocks winning 3-2 in the Peter Bentley League Cup at the Beacon.

Last time we met?

It was at the Sports Pavilion back in March where Lingfield picked up all three points via a 1-0 win. Sam Clements scored the only goal of the game with 20 minutes remaining in what was a pretty entertaining game. Both sides created plenty of opportunities and while Hassocks were wasteful in front of goal, at the other end the Lingers could be found cursing Josh Green for a string of excellent stops.

Played for both?

Current Hassocks top scorer Ben Bacon had a brief spell with the Lingers last season in between his time with Saltdean United and Steyning Town. Daley Clark is the only other man to have represented both clubs, the striker moving to the Beacon from the Lingers in the summer of 2009. He would go onto play 40 times for the Robins, scoring twice before moving onto St Francis Rangers.

Loxwood this season?

Having pulled off a late escape from relegation under the leadership of former Haywards Heath Town assistant boss Alex Walsh last season, hopes were high that Loxwood would continue to be upwardly mobile in 2019-20. Things haven't guite worked out like that although they are proving difficult to beat, having drawn four of their seven games so far. Problematically, the win column is still showing zero but their cup form suggests that won't be the case for much longer as they've made good progress in the FA Vase, the RUR Charity Cup and most impressively the Peter Bentley League Cup where they became the first opponents to win at Broadbridge Heath's new High Wood Hill ground.

Hassocks' record against Loxwood?

ever beaten the Magpies once, a 4-0 win at Plaistow Road last year. That means that Loxwood are yet to taste defeat at the Beacon having won six times overall. There have been three draws, the most extraordinary of which took place back in February.

Last time we met

You'll be hard pushed to find a more crazy game than this one to have been played at the Beacon in the 27 years the ground has been open for. Loxwood had gone into half time 3-0 ahead thanks to goals from Mark Goldson, Sam Karl and former Hassocks favourite Eddie French. And yet within 11 minutes of the second half, the Robins had scored three of their own to level things up. Mark Dalgleish introduced Spencer Slaughter and George Brown at the break and they were both on target alongside Harvey Enticknap. Sadly, that was the end of the scoring.

Langney Wanderers this season?

Chris Brown was a rare summer signing in the days when Hassocks' forays into the transfer market happened once in a blue moon.

He arrived at the Beacon in 2005 from Ringmer, where he'd enjoyed several seasons in a side who were consistently challenging towards the top of the table.

Brown had been part of his fair share of successful teams prior to that, having also played for Burgess Hill Town and Whitehawk.

A tough tackling midfielder, he added some real bite to the Robins central midfield three for three seasons between 2005 and 2008, racking up 102 appearances as a virtual ever present before retiring at the end of the 2007-08 campaign..

Before Brown's arrival, Hassocks were regular finishers in the top three Fair Play Awards. That went out the window with him in the side, much to manager Dave John's chagrin! Keep abreast of the Robins in 2019-20


