Postponements and young guns stepping up the plate

We've lost our last two scheduled games at the Beacon to the weather with AFC Uckfield Town's visit 17 days ago and Saturday's fixture with Little Common both falling to waterlogged pitches.

Our last home game here saw Langney Wanderers visit in the Peter Bentley League Cup, a game that came just one week after losing 4-0 at Priory Lane in the league against the same opponents.

And it was a much improved performance as we came within three minutes of taking the visitors into extra time.

Ben Bacon and Jamie Hillwood were in the goals but it was the back four who deserve special praise, despite conceding four times.

With the current injury and unavailability crisis showing no sign of abating, Mark named three teenagers in the back four; 19-year-old Dan Turner and 17-year-olds Luke Marshall and Jack Gardner.

They all coped admirably with the step up, displaying the sort of roll-the -sleeves up attitude that is going to be needed over the coming weeks.

Under 23s through in County Cup

It's not the just the first team who are relying on the club's young guns, but the Under 23s too.

Youth team striker Alfie Loversidge scored twice for Dave John's side in their 3-3 Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup draw at higher division Three Bridges on October 10th.

That game went to penalties with Hassocks converting eight of their 10 spot kicks to eliminate Bridges 8-7 on spot kicks.

They'll now face Horsham YMCA away from home on Friday night. In the league, they've since lost 4-2 at Lancing and last week went down 2-1 at home to YM.

the Lancers down as title challengers in the summer when Rouane became both sides have several players who the third man inside of a year to sit in the Culver Road hotseat.

The Robins then won a last minute penalty but Ben Bacon saw his spot kick kept out as Lancing maintained their 1000% record by making it five wins from five.

That was just the latest in a long line of entertaining fixtures between the two which have featured goals, controversies and familiar faces.

The 30 previous meetings have Not many people would have had yielded over 100 goals at an average of well over three per game, while used to play for the other outfit among their ranks.

Since the turn of the decade, a whole host of players have turned out for both Lancing and Hassocks—which probably makes them the club with which the Robins have the most links outside of Mid Sussex.

One of the first to represent both was goalkeeper **Joel Harding** who racked up 340 games for Hassocks before leaving for Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2010.

After a couple of successful seasons at Leylands Park, he moved to Culver Road midway through the 2012-13 campaign before joining East Preston with whom he won the Premier Division in 2014.

Young right back **Jake Mills** was part of the Hassocks Reserves side that lifted the Reserve Section Cup in 2012 before departing for Lancing at the end of that season in search of first team football.

That's a journey that was undertaken a few years later by **Alex Bygraves -** who will sadly miss tonight having broken his leg a few weeks ago - as well as manager **Naim Rouane** who played his youth team football at the Beacon but never managed to break into the senior side.

Coming the other way, **Bradley Bant** moved from Lancing via East
Grinstead Town to the Robins in late

2014 and went onto play 131 times for Hassocks.

He was joined nine months later by **Jonno Melia** who hit 10 goals in 27 appearances during his sole season with the Robins.

In the summer of 2016, **Lewis Westlake** made the move to the Beacon from the Lancers and a year later goalkeeper **Josh Green** returned to Hassocks having helped Lancing lift the Peter Bentley League Cup in 2016.

Bradley Tighe and **Jack Rowe-Hurst** also played for both Hassocks and Lancing with the duo moving onto Seaford Town since the start of the season.



Hassocks in the Senior Cup

Hassocks first entered the Sussex Senior Cup in the 1981/82 season. Since then, it's a been a competition that has delivered some big wins, some great memories and plenty of "what might have been" moments...

The furthest that the Robins have gone in the competition is the quarter finals, a stage that they reached in three seasons out of four in the middle of the last decade.

Two of those adventures were ended by club's from higher divisions in memorable encounters at the Beacon; the other was arguably a great opportunity missed although nobody felt like that at the time.

Our first appearance in the last eight came in the 2005-06 season against a Horsham side who were enjoying a golden period of their own.

Horsham had pretty much the same squad that would go onto reach the second round of the FA

Cup two years later where they would take League One side Swansea competition - Brighton and Hove City to a replay.

On this occasion though it was them who were nearly victims of a giant killing as despite the two divisions difference between Robins and Hornets, the visitors required extra time to see plucky Hassocks.

Mickey Turner and Richard Thomas scored for the hosts but Horsham had just about enough quality to win 3-2 in extra time.

They would go onto make the final that year, going down 3-1 to Lewes at Priory Lane five months later.

The following season and we again made the quarter finals, this time receiving the plum draw that

everybody wants from the Albion at home.

The Seagulls bought an experienced line up to a Beacon that was packed out by over 300 intrigued spectators and none of them could deny that the men in red were harshly done by in going down 1-0.

The most controversial moment came in the first half when Brighton captain Richard Carpenter slapped Mark Sherriff in the face right in front of the referee.

Incredibly, the official described it as "a friendly slap" and therefore deemed it worthy of only a yellow card, infuriating home connections.

Hassocks might have fancied their chances against 10 men but with 11,

the Albion's professionals had the fitness edge and that was enough to see them squeak through 2-0 thanks to goals from Nathan Elder and Doug

Hassocks most recent run to the quarter finals came two seasons after that clash with the Albion with Shoreham the visitors to the Beacon in the 2008-09 campaign.

The Robins were in the midst of a desperate battle against relegation at the time, and so Dave John wasn't backwards in coming forwards by saying that the only reason he was glad to be in the last eight was because it was another fixture which meant Jack Simpson and Spencer Slaughter could get one-match bans out the way without impacting on his side's survival bid!

Looking back though, this was a real opportunity to reach the final four against a fellow Southern Combination League side which Hassocks were unable to take, going down 1-0 at the Beacon.

That bought to an end one of the more interesting runs in the competition for the club.

It should have come to an end against Conference South outfit Bognor Regis Town in the second round stage but the Rocks played an ineligible player in their 5-2 extra time win and so we were put through.

Chichester City came to the Beacon in round three and a goalkeeping crisis meant that Chi's 58 -year-old manager Adie Girdler had to play himself in goal.

Girdler was only beaten by an own goal as lucky Hassocks progressed 1-0 to set up their quarter final tie with the Musselmen.

The third round has been the exit point of the competition for the Robins on seven occasions and always to clubs from outside of the Southern Combination League.

It was at that stage where we suffered our heaviest Senior Cup defeat, being beaten 8-1 by Brighton in the 2001-02 season when then-Albion boss Peter Taylor decided to send a near-full strength side to the Beacon.

out to St Leonards Stamco with a 4-1 home defeat, Bognor Regis were 4-2 winners in Mid Sussex in 2000-01 and

Pat Harding returned to the Beacon in 2007-08 with Eastbourne Borough, scoring past brother Joel in a comfortable 5-0 win for a side who would go onto win promotion to the Conference Premier at the end of that season.

There was another meeting with Horsham in 2010-11 with the Hornets winning 4-2, Eastbourne Borough again accounted for Hassocks two year's later by winning 2-0 at Priory Lane and our most recent adventure to the third round stage came in the 2016-17 season when Southern Counties East League outfit Crowborough Athletic won 1-0 at the Beacon.

Given Hassocks' long-established reputation as a side who frequently fall to opponents from lower divisions in cup games, the Robins have a surprisingly good record when it comes to avoiding upsets in the Senior Cup.

Just once in 34 years in the competition have they fallen to a side below them in the footballing pyramid, a 3-2 home defeat to Seaford Town at the second round stage in the 2004-05 campaign.

Hassocks' biggest Sussex Senior Cup win came in the 2002-03 season when Shinewater Association were hammered 6-1 in the first round stage, while there has been a 5-0 victory over Newhaven in 1982-83 and 5-1 wins over Steyning Town in a 2010-11 first round replay - the original tie had ended a 1-1 at the Shooting Field - and away at Storrington in 2012-13.

Our ridiculous 6-4 victory over Arundel in the last round set a record for the Robins' highest scoring game in the competition and nobody who was at Mill Road that night is ever likely to forget that extraordinary evening.

Likewise, those who saw the only previous meeting in the Senior Cup between Hassocks and tonight's opponents Lancing.

That came in the first round in the 2011-12 season with the Lancers inflicting a 6-1 defeat on Mickey Jewell's Robins, which remains our heaviest defeat in the competition to In the 1996-97 campaign we went a Southern Combination League Club.

Hassocks' 5-1 win at Storrington in November 2012 was memorable not just for the ease with which Mickey Jewell's team swatted aside the Swans, but also for the identity of one of the

While James Westlake, Anthony Hibbert and Dan Smith were all regulars when it came to finding the back of the net, the name of Ashley Marsh wasn't exactly one that you associated with goal-scoring feats.

In fact, since his debut eight years and over 300 games previously, Marsh had only managed to find the back of the net on one over occasion and that had come in his debut season in 2004.



The Hassocks captain owed his first goal for nearly a decade to a friendly linesman who ruled that the ball had crossed the line despite the best efforts of a Swans' defender to hack it clear.

That sparked wild scenes of iubilation mixed with disbelief with half an hour played at Storrington Rec.

Marsh's goal was the second of the evening and proved to be pivotal, coming as it did at the end of a period of Storrington pressure and providing a platform for Hassocks to go onto win the game from.

There wasn't quite such a long wait for his next strike as Marsh goals proved to be like London Buses- you wait eight years for one to come along, and then two do at once.

Fast forward three months and he was at it again, scoring against Chichester in a 3-2 league victory.

Still, they proved to be very much collectors items - by the time Marsh retired four years later, he'd managed just one more goal to take his career tally to four in 525 games for the club.



NEW DATE SET FOR UCKERS CLASH

Hassocks' Southern Combination League Premier Division clash with AFC Uckfield Town has been rearranged for Tuesday 19th November 2019.

Kick off will be at 7.45pm at the Beacon, giving the Robins three consecutive home games.

Four days after the Oakmen's visit and Newhaven are set to visit Mid Sussex Saturday 23rd followed by Peacehaven & Telscombe a week later.

The original meeting with Uckfield had been due to take place on Saturday 19th October but fell to a waterlogged pitch after a morning inspection of the Beacon by the match referee.

Last season, it took four attempts to get the Oakmen's visit to Hassocks played.

The original fixture scheduled for November was moved due to Uckfield's continued involvement in the FA Vase. Anthony Storey's side embarked on an historic run which was only ended in January at the fourth round stage by Windsor.

The second and third attempts both fell to wet weather with the game eventually being played at the fourth time of asking, Uckfield winning 2-1 thanks to goals from Dee Okojie and Taylor Maddock. Phil Johnson got the Robins' consolation.

We're still waiting a full release of the Under 23's fixtures for November with only two games pencilled in so far.

Dave John takes his side to Horsham YMCA in two days time in the second round of the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup with a 7.30pm kick off at Gorings Mead.

That will be followed a week later by East Preston visiting the Beacon as the Robins look to put a disappointing run of form behind them.

Littlejohn voted September Player of the Month

It was a good September for James Littleiohn as the forward hit his maiden senior hat-trick as well as claiming his first Player of the Month award.

Littlejohn's treble came in the space of an astonishing seven second half minutes and helped pave the way for the Robins' 6-2 Premier Division win over Loxwood at the Beacon.

He was also on target three days later in the extraordinary 6-4 extra time over away at Arundel in the Sussex Senior Cup.

Littlejohn netted Hassocks' third equaliser at Mill Road that night just a few minutes before half time, a vital moment to score given that the game could have taken on a very different complexion had the Robins gone into the break behind.

Those four strikes have helped put Littlejohn into joint first place on the Robins' scoring charts so far this season with six goals in 15 appearances, leaving him level with

Ben Bacon.

It already ensures that 2019-20 is the forward's most prolific campaign at senior level, and much more will no doubt be expected over the coming months, especially as he matches. continues to thrive with the added goal scoring responsibility placed on Mark Dalgleish's strikers due to the broken leg which continues to side line last season's top scorer, Phil Johnson.

Littlejohn took 57% of the vote meaning he was a clear winner ahead of Dan Jacques who came second on 28%.

Enigmatic fan favourite Jacques had endured an injury hit start to the campaign but he nailed down his spot at the heart of the Hassocks throughout September. defence with a string of superlative performances over the course of September.

He was named as the Robins Man of the Match in the defeats away at Eastbourne Town and at home to Lingfield, giving a particularly strong showing against the league leaders' talented front

line at the Saffrons.

Jacques' achievements in coming second are made all the more impressive given that he only played in six of the month's eight


That was clearly enough time though to make a strong made enough impression on the Beacon faithful.

Third place went to August's winner as Will Broomfield just saw off the challenge of Jamie Hillwood, collecting 11% of the vote to Hillwood's 4%.

Broomfield continues to be a vital component in the holding midfield role for Mark Dalgleish and he was a virtual ever-present

He also continues to do an excellent job of captaining the club in Johnson's absence.

That's reflected in the fact that he is vet to finish outside of the top three in a Player of the Month vote this season and is already a leading contender for Player of the Season just three months into the season.

LANGNEY LEAVE IT LATE TO BREAK YOUNG ROBINS RESISTANCE

For the second week running, Hassocks lost to Langney Wanderers and conceded four goals in the process.

But that was where the similarities stopped.

Whereas last week's 4-0 Premier Division defeat was something of a walk in the park for Wanderers at Priory Lane, they were made to fight all the way at the Beacon to progress to round three of the Peter Bentley League Cup.

Twice Langney led over the course of the 90 but twice Hassocks came fighting back.

The Robins got to within three minutes of taking the tie to extra time before the visitors struck twice late on, eventually doing just enough to win 4-2 and book a meeting with Division One high flyers Mile Oak in the next round of the competition.

It was harsh on Mark Dagleish's young battlers, particularly a back four which must surely have been the youngest that the club have ever fielded; the Robins' injury and unavailability crisis showing no sign of abating.

Three quarters of the Hassocks defence were born after the year 2000.

As one startled observer watching from the Clubhouse side put it when they heard that statistic, "That means they were born after the Spice Girls split".

Very true. It was a defence that wasn't so much Baby, Posh, Sporty and Scary as Baby, Baby, Baby and Harvey.

You had 17-year-old Luke
Marshall partnered at centre back by
19-year-old Dan Turner, rushing back
to help out from a nasty arm injury
picked up on Under 23 duty three
weeks ago and which had left him in
a sling.

At right back, there was another 17-year-old as Jack Gardner came

into the side for his full debut.

The elder statesman of the defence was Harvey Blake, himself only 24-years-old and wearing the captain's armband for the first time in the absence of so many other senior players.

Hassocks had looked toothless in attack last week and they were at least boosted in that department this time around with Jamie Hillwood, Liam Benson and Joe Bull all back to add a welcome boost to the Robins' firepower.

The only goal of the first half arrived after just 10 minutes, Joe Summerbell hitting an opportunistic effort from 25 yards which beat Josh Green.

You could have been forgiven at that point for thinking a repeat of last week's heavy defeat was on the cards, but while Langney dominated possession, clear cut chances were harder to come by for either side.

That's testament to the efforts of the Robins' young defence, who made it to the break without conceding any further goals.

This provided Hassocks with a platform to be a little more positive in the second half and they duly began to take the game to the visitors.

Just past the hour mark and the Robins' desire to get on the front foot was rewarded when Hillwood hit a distance effort of his own, flummoxing Langney goalkeeper Dan Hutchings from well outside the box for 1-1.

Wanderers boss Simon Colbran responded by turning to his bench and on came Ali Mekawir in place of Matt Fear. It proved to be an inspired decision.

Within five minutes of his introduction, Mekawir had put Langney back into the lead with a well worked goal, the finish being applied from inside the six yard box.

Mekawir had the chance to wrap things up on 83 but he fired wide with only Green to beat and that miss





was duly punished as Hassocks went straight up the other end to equalise for the second time.

Langney defender Shaun Lee suffered an unfortunate slip in the build up to the goal and that allowed Ben Bacon to get in one-on-one.

Bacon still had plenty to do but he produced a cool, calm and collected finish to life the ball over the advancing Hutchings for his seventh goal in 15 games since re-joining from Steyning Town.

There were just six minutes of normal time remaining at that point and extra time was looming large, a deserved reward for the doggedness of Hassocks' young side.

But Langney have carved out a reputation so far this season as a side who never die.

They've already come back from 3-0 down with 25 minutes remaining to draw 3-3 away at Newhaven and, sadly from a Hassocks point of view, those qualities were on display as with three minutes left, the visitors took the lead for the third time.

The Robins couldn't quite clear their lines from a goalmouth scramble and the melee ended with Dan Blackmore heading home.

Hassocks poured forward after that and forced a couple of half chances but they were also vulnerable to being picked off on the break.

And that's where Langney's fourth game from deep into five minutes of time added on, a blistering counter attacking move led by Mekawir and finished off by Max Holloborne.

After a couple of disappointing results, Hassocks Under 23s bounced back to form by shocking Bluefin Development League opponents in the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Trophy.

This was a performance full of character from the Robins away at Three Bridges, a side who ply their trade in the Isthmian League's Under 23 section.

Hassocks trailed 2-0 in normal time before finding a way to fight back through Under 18s striker Alfie Loversidge's first goals for the Under 23s.

Their showings at Jubilee Field could push them both back into first team contention, although Westlake has recently dual-signed with reigning Mid Sussex League champions Cuckfield Rangers.

Those making way were James Earl, Steve Bright, Joe Russell, Louis Pople and Liam Benson with Bright joining Joe Tatford and youth team duo Jack Gardner and Luke Marshall among the substitutes.

As you may have gathered, this was a hugely impressive result, especially given that some of Bridges' squad have tasted first team football in the Isthmian League South East Division already this season.

They probably were a little undercooked though coming into the tie, having played just two league games so far.

Not that it showed. Bridges surged into a 2-0 lead and it looked like it would be a routine win for the hosts at that stage of proceedings.

That was until Loversidge struck





the first of his brace on 57 minutes.

The second arrived eight minutes later, shocking Bridges somewhat as an additional 30 minutes was required to try and separate the two sides.

It couldn't. Bridges went back into the lead early in extra time but Galbraith-Gibbons' second of the season with just six minutes remaining sent the tie to spot kicks.

Hassocks missed two out of 10 with Bridges squandering three, sending the Robins through to the second round of the competition.

They'll face another tough ask there against Southern Combination League West Division leaders Horsham YMCA, opponents who have already defeated Hassocks 2-1 this season and who beat the Robins to the title last season.

This performance should give John's young charges confidence going forward though with a Friday night clash away at Lancing next on the agenda.

HASSOCKS BLOWN APART BY IMPRESSIVE PAGHAM

Pagham haven't lost in the league since the opening day of the season and there was little chance of that record ending as they sauntered to a 3-0 victory over Hassocks at the Beacon.

The Robins have now faced all of the realistic title contenders bar Haywards Heath Town.

Pagham have easily been the best of the lot, a view shared by Hassocks boss Phil Wickwar.

"We stuck at it but no complaints – we were second best today."

"There is no shame in that against a team that good, the best we've faced this season."

Ever the optimist though, Wickwar added, "We could've done better with the soft second goal and for their third, we didn't think it was a foul and then the free kick took a deflection."

The fact that Hassocks goalkeeper James Broadbent was voted as the supporter's man of the match tells it's own story.

Broadbent made three outstanding saves in particular which helped keep the scoreline somewhat respectable.

Joe Shelley has lifted the Southern Combination League title in each of the past three seasons – with Horsham, Littlehampton Town and East Preston – and the talented journeyman midfielder opened the scoring with 12 minutes on the clock.

Hassocks' trials and tribulations in dealing with set pieces have been well documented but for once there was little blame that could be attached, Shelley rising to produce an absolute bullet header from a superb corner delivery.

With the Lions having conceded only nine goals in 13 league games coming into the tie, Hassocks faced an uphill struggle to get back into the game from that point, especially given that they were missing two of their inform forwards in Nathan Miles and Ben Bacon.

And that struggle became an all but impossible task on 26 minutes when Kieron Pamment doubled Pagham's lead.

Bonfire Night is traditionally a time to give to charities and the Hassocks defence got in the spirit of generosity, deciding that rather than clear their lines they would give Pagham a couple of opportunities to get crosses in which they then wouldn't effectively clear, eventually giving Pamment the chance to net.

Things looked to be getting even worse when Mark Price's body gave up on him on the half hour mark but the subsequent personnel and tactical reshuffle that followed belatedly got Hassocks going with James Westlake having a decent chance from which he couldn't find a finish.

Hassocks huffed and puffed at the start of the second half before the game was finally killed off. A quick break saw a Pagham forward appear to trip over the ball rather than being fouled but a free kick was awarded which Scott Murfin fired home via a deflection from the wall for 3-0.

The Robins kept going despite what was clearly an insurmountable task and had a couple of opportunities to pull a goal back, Ashley Marsh rampaging forward from left back to produce an exquisite cross which Liam Benson should have finished and Jamie Hillwood blazing high, wide and handsome when well placed.

While the result leaves Pagham as a clutch of teams challenging leaders Shoreham with seven points between the top four, it is even tighter at the bottom – Hassocks are one of eight clubs separated by just three points from the relegation zone.

With a run of games against teams around them coming up, the Robins face a season defining period before Christmas in which they know they must escape the clutches of the bottom three.

Hassocks' record against Alford?

How to get to Alford Rec?

It's a similar journey to Loxwood away which means you'll need to take the A272 to through Billingshurst, joining the B2133 towards Newpound. Continue on the B2133 through Loxwood and Alford will be the next village. Once you reach Alford, you'll come to Alford Crossways where you need to bear left onto Dunsfold Road with the ground being immediately on your left.

Players to watch out for?

Kelvin Lucas is Alford's top scorer having plundered 12 goals in 12 games and given the trouble that we're having keeping them out at the wrong end, he may be expecting a profitable afternoon. They also have their own Jacquesy in Clyde Jacques, but it's doubtful as he is as enigmatic as our very own Dan.

Jack Simpson was one of the best goalkeepers ever to play for Hassocks, making 161 appearances from his first team debut in 2008 until he was forced to retire through injury in 2014 after continuous shoulder and finger problems.

Simpson had been part of the Under 18 side who won the Central Division title in the 2005-06 season and became the reserves number one the following year at the age of just 15, winning the Reserve Section Cup with Mickey Jewell & Phil Wickwar's side.

It was John Suter who gave him a first team debut at 17-years-old in an FA Vase clash with Three Bridges in September 2008

When Joel Harding departed for Burgess Hill Town in the summer of 2010, one of Jewell's first decisions as the newly crowned first team boss was to make Simpson his number one and he ended the 2010-11 season with a clean sweep of Player's Player, Supporter's Player and Manager's Player awards that year.
