Charlie has spent the past three years at the University of Exeter studying Geography and he's made some excellent stops in his two games so far.

Going out the door, 18-year-old goalkeeper James Earl who played a

handful of games in September has left the club in search of more regular senior football and we wish him well for the future.

### They've only lost three times so far in the Premier Division this season and yet Newhaven currently sit in 12th place in the table. It's been a strange season at the Trafalgar Ground so far for the dangerous

Those two defeats have come against Crawley Down Gatwick and AFC Uckfield Town, but it's the number of draws that Newhaven have served up that have proven to be more damaging to their title hopes.

Five times in 13 league games the Dockers have shared the spoils with their opponents.

If they could turn those stalemates into victories, then they'd be right on the tails of Eastbourne Town, a position that is familiar to those with Newhaven given that they've been in championship challengers for the past few campaigns.

Their mixed bag of a season isn't just restricted to the league either; their form in knockout competitions has been puzzling to outsiders too.

Newhaven are still in the FA Vase and will travel to Glebe in the third round next week having picked up a hugely impressive 6-1 win away at Kennington.

But on the flip side, they suffered a shock exit from the Sussex Prinicpal RUR Charity Cup at the hands of lowly Pagham, a competition that they won in 2016 and 2017.

The Dockers will no doubt arrive at the Beacon in expectant mood given that it is a venue at which they've enjoyed plenty of success over the course of the 16 game history of the fixture.

Hassocks have only ever managed four victories over Newhaven, marking them out as one of the opponents who the Robins seem to struggle against.

Playing a huge part in Hassocks' terrible record is the firepower that Newhaven can call upon and if that is on full show this afternoon, then another difficult 90 minutes could lie ahead.

Lee Robinson needs no introduction to Hassocks supporters. The Premier Division's most dangerous marksman has been a frequent scorer against the Robins down the years and he has nine goals in 10 games to his name so far.

We'll also need to find a way to stop Ebou Jallow who's plundered 11 in what is one of the most dangerous front pairings in the league.

### **Played for both**

Two former Hassocks Youth Team products spent time with Newhaven with Terry Gacias and Naim Rouane both playing parts in the Dockers side that won promotion to the top flight in 2013.

Gacias racked up 35 appearances for Hassocks across two spells at the Beacon with the majority of those games coming during the 2009-10 season after he'd returned to the Robins from St Francis Rangers.

He had earlier been both Under 18s and Reserve captain and was a popular player with the Beacon faithful during his time at the club.

Rouane meanwhile failed to make a first team appearance for the Robins, featuring for the reserves and third team in the middle part of the last decade.

He went onto have much greater success after leaving the Beacon, most notably with Lancing and Haywards Heath whom he captained to the Southern Combination League / Peter Bentley League Cup double in 2017-18. Rouane is now Lancing manager.

There are a couple of other players who have represented both.

Rob Boddy played eight times for Hassocks at the back end of the 2011 -12 season after joining from Shoreham and he went onto play for Newhaven a few seasons later.

Jake Forward meanwhile had a brief five game spell with the Robins at the start of the 2012-13 campaign, scoring once before moving onto St Francis Rangers and then Newhvaen.

### **SLAUGHTER SENDS HASSOCKS TO FIRST EVER WIN AT NEWHAVEN**

#### After a couple of weeks of Dr Jekyll performances, Hassocks gave a Mr Hyde showing as they picked up a 1-0 win away at title chasing Newhaven.

The Robins have long been compared to the titular character from Robert Louis Stevenson's novel for their ability to go from being absolutely shocking one game to outrageously good the next.

This victory against the Dockers was the latest case in point. Hassocks arrived at the Trafalgar Ground having drawn 3-3 with second-bottom Loxwood and lost 2-0 to third-bottom Arundel in the past three weeks.

They were facing a Newhaven side who had won 13 of their previous 16 Premier Division games and history was also firmly against the Robins, with no Hassocks side having ever won a game of senior football at Fort Road.

Spencer Slaughter's goal right on the stroke of half time changed all that though, delivering a 1-0 victory that the defensive efforts of the Robins more than deserved.

In fairness to Hassocks, they had been excellent in the second half of that thrilling draw with Loxwood, wrestling back from 3-0 down at the • break to claim a point.

That comeback had been sparked by a treble half time substitution from Mark Dalgleish and he rewarded two of those replacements with promotion to the starting 11, goal scorer Slaughter replacing Dan Jacques with Harry Mills dropping in at centre half and Dan Stokes taking the place of Jake Lindsey.

Hassocks set their stall out early, lining up in two banks of four which was clearly designed to frustrate this talented Newhaven side, whilst looking to use the pace of Phil Johnson on the counter.

That game plan looked like it might have been left in tatters when Johnson was forced off with injury early on, former Woking man George Brown replacing Johnson in attack.

But Brown proved to be a more than adequate substitute for the Hassocks skipper, even if his own afternoon was also curtailed prematurely after an unnecessary red card after he'd kicked the ball away when already on a yellow.

Brown was involved in the only goal of the game which arrived just 60 seconds before the break. He linked up well with Harvey Enticknap down the right before digging out a cross to the back post.

That was met by Slaughter who beat Freddie Beale in the air to send a header past Jake Buss in the Dockers goal for his fifth of the season.

Hassocks had done plenty of honest defending before that, Broomfield and Mills in particular excelling to restrict Newhaven's deadly 55-goal top scorer Lee Robinson to mainly pot shots from outside the box.

On the rare occasions that the Dockers did break through, they found Josh Green in inspired form.

The Robins goalkeeper picked a good day to give arguably his best performance of the season.

There were three vital saves late on with a flying stop that defied gravity from Kyle Woolven being the pick of the bunch.

Newhaven had a second half penalty appeal turned down after

Beale was felled in the box by Slaughter but despite the vehement protests of the home faithful, referee Chris Britton waved play on. It was the right decision.

Before Brown's silly dismissal, Newhaven looked particularly uncomfortable dealing with the probing runs of Bradley Tighe and Harvey Blake from the full back positions, who were bombing on at most opportunities in spite of Hassocks' cautious approach.

Once the Robins went down to 10, the work rate of Liam Benson became pivotal to them holding onto their lead as he ploughed a lonely furrow up front.

Slaughter and Enticknap meanwhile continued to dominate in midfield despite the numerical disadvantage with Slaughter's vocal encouragement in particular driving his side on to this most unlikely of three points.

Slaughter said afterwards, "It was a superb display from everyone involved today."

"Our shape was fantastic, it was a proper old-school Hassocks workmanlike performance and we were brilliant breaking forward on the counter to cause one of the best teams in the league real problems."

Hassocks will hope to see Mr Hyde on a few more occasions over their remaining 10 games.

### Hassocks 2-1 Newhaven

### MICHAEL AT THE DEATH AS HASSOCKS MAKE IT A SUPER SEVEN

Hassocks left it as late as possible to defeat Newhaven 2-1 and win consecutive game number seven to equal the clubs best ever run in senior football.

It was the aptly named Michael Death who struck right at the death – the 91st minute to be precise – to match the seven game streak that the Robins' class of 1999-00 put together and with it secure a first victory since 1987 over the Dockers.

Phil Wickwar had admitted before the game that his sides winning run had been helped in part by a set of fixtures against teams around his in the bottom half of the Southern Combination Premier table.

That was far from the case here. Newhaven arrived at the Beacon with just five defeats to their name and sitting in fourth spot in the table, making them a credible dark horse for promotion.

The hosts rode their luck at times to secure the three points and you'd have got long odds on there being such a dramatic climax – which also included an 80th minute Newhaven equaliser – after a first half in which it took 25 minutes for there to be a shot on target.

And with that first shot came the first goal in a move that would have had anybody who appreciated the finer points of the Wimbledon side of the 1980s purring with delight.

Phil Gault latched onto a massive

punt forward from Alex Harris in the Hassocks goal to slot past Jake Buss at the other end with aplomb.

Ebou Jallow came closest to equalising for Newhaven but he saw his effort cannon back off the upright while there were a few customary shaky moments for the Robins rear guard from set pieces.

Newhaven came out for the second half with attack on the mind and that allowed Hassocks to use their pace on the break to fashion three decent half chances early on as the game began to ebb and flow.

The end-to-end stuff saw Harris do brilliantly to tip a header over, the crossbar come to the young Hassocks stoppers rescue and then it was straight up the other end for Jonno Melia to flash an effort just the wrong side of the post.

A Newhaven free kick smashed into the Hassocks wall and wide, Ian Robinson found Lee Robinson who saw his effort deflected out and the Dockers missed another big chance from the resulting corner.

Next up it was Hassocks' turn to spurn a gilt-edged chance, Death nutmegging Adam Kneller and advancing away being working the ball to Melia who fired just over with only Buss to beat.

The next goal would be crucial and it went Newhaven's way, but only once Harris had pulled off another excellent stop when it seemed to the world that the ball was destined for the back of the net.

After that, he was powerless to keep out a Kyle Woolven effort that deflected in off the helpless Ashley Marsh.

Not so long ago that would have been curtains for Hassocks but this winning streak has inspired a new found belief in the Robins and they went on the attack again believing the game was still there to be won.

Gault fed Melia who glided clear only to shoot wide and then Death found himself with almost too much time as he fired over after nice link up play with James Westlake.

And then came that late, late winner. It was a goal which summed this end-to-end encounter up, Newhaven missing a header from which Harris rolled Melia away and he advanced 70 yards up the pitch to deliver an excellent cross which was powered home by the head of Death to steal the win.

### December date set for Robins' Alfold adventure

### Hassocks will make their first ever trip to Alfold on Tuesday 3rd December after the rearranged date for the Robins' visit to Surrey was confirmed.

Kick off was just 10 minutes away at Alfold Recreation Ground on Saturday 9th November when the referee decided that the pitch was unplayable.

That followed a deluge of rain on the day of the game which denied Hassocks the chance to face the Southern Combination League Premier Division newcomers for the first ever time.

The historic meeting now moves to the first Tuesday in December with a 7.45pm kick off under the lights at the Recreation Ground.

Alfold are making a good impression on the top flight in their debut campaign at this level.

They've have won five, drawn

three and lost four of their 12 games so far to sit in an extremely comfortable midtable position.

Survival is the name of the game for the Fold this year following their rapid ascent through the non league pyramid.

As recently as the 2014-15 season, Alfold were plying their trade in the West Sussex League.

Three promotions in the subsequent four seasons have taken them from Division Two to the Premier Division in what has been a whirlwind last few years for the club.

Last season was their debut in senior football and they took to it like a duck to water, breezing through Division One at the first time of asking.

They ended the campaign as champions, showing remarkable consistency over the course of the year to beat Steyning Town to the title.

There were big strides forward

taken off the pitch as well. Their Alford Recreation Ground on Dunsfold Road in the village had a new stand and LED floodlights installed as well as perimeter pathways and fencing.

Work that should have taken around two years to complete was done in around six months, highlighting the extraordinary dedication of those behind the scenes at Alfold to achieving their dream of Premier Division football.

The new date means that Hassocks will face a gruelling schedule of six fixtures in the space of 21 days.

That run started with Tuesday night's home game against AFC Uckfield Town and encompasses today's clash with Newhaven, the visit of Little Common to the Beacon on Tuesday, Peacehaven & Telscombe here on Saturday and then finally this trip to Alford in 11 days time.

## Enti Entertains to win October Player of the

## Month

It was a disappointing October by-and-large for Hassocks but one man who shone was Harvey Enticknap who has been voted as the Robins' Player of the Month.

The midfielder took 41% of supporters votes to finish in the top three for the first time this season, beating Harvey Blake and Luke Marshall to the award.

Enticknap started all four of Hassocks' games, giving arguably his best performance in the 4-0 defeat away at Langney Wanderers in which he was selected as Man-of-the-Match.

He played a crucial role in October's only win, that crazy 6-4 extra time triumph against Arundel in the Sussex Senior Cup with a domineering display in the holding role.

There were also cultured displays in the Peter Bentley League Cup loss to Langney and the 4-1 Premier Division defeat away at Eastbourne United.

All in all, it was a welcome return to form for a player who had so struggled to nail down a regular starting spot before this month.

Harvey Blake may have missed the victory at Arundel, but that couldn't stop him securing second spot behind Enticknap with a 32% share of the vote.

Blake became the senior member of an inexperienced defence throughout most of the month as an unprecedented injury and unavailability crisis hit Mark Dalgleish's squad particularly hard in the defensive positions. As a result, Blake captained the Robins for the first time in the League Cup fixture with Langney, leading a back line that was otherwise made up of teenagers through a difficult assignment.

It was one of those teenage defenders that stepped into the breach who finished third with 17-year-old Luke Marshall taking 15% to just pip Jamie Hillwood to a spot in the top three.

Marshall only made his senior debut away at Arundel but he underlined his promise with a display that belied his tender years in what was a crazy evening of football at Mill Road. He maintained

his place for the two games with Langney Wanderers before making a fourth and final appearance from the bench in the away match with Eastbourne United.

In an excellent month for the young defender, he was also a part of the Under 23s side who shocked Isthmian League Three Bridges in the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup and played in all of the Under 18s Fixtures as they plundered 24 goals in just three games, conceding only two along the way.

### DOWN TIP HASSOCKS TO TURN IT AROUND AFTER 5-GOAL THRILLER

### Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 16th November 2019, The Haven Crawley Down Gatwick 3-2 Hassocks

Games between Crawley Down Gatwick and Hassocks are rarely dull and this latest instalment certainly had an entertainment factor to it as the two sides shared five goals.

Unfortunately for the Robins, they were on the end of a fifth consecutive defeat as they went down 3-2 but there were at least positives to take for Mark Dalgleish's side.

It had looked like another long afternoon would be in store at a saturated Haven which passed a 10.30am pitch inspection thanks to the hard work of a loyal band of Anvils volunteers.

Their efforts in ensuring the surface was playable was paying off handsomely as the hosts swept into a two goal lead with just over half an hour played

Billy Wraight had made it 1-0 with nine minutes on the clock, a tidy finish rounding off a neat team move.

The second arrived on 32, Ollie Moore doubling Down's advantage at which point they were in complete control.

Credit to Hassocks though who tried hard to battle back after that. With a third of the campaign now completed and only two wins and seven points on the board, the Robins once again find themselves in a fight for Premier Division survival and they'll need to show more of this sort of spirit and resistance if 26 seasons of consecutive top fight football isn't to come to an end come April.

They made it 2-1 before half time with a goal from the most unlikely of sources as left back Andy Whittingham opened his account for the club at the 80th time of asking.

Whittingham had made his first appearance for the Robins as long

ago as August 2010, which quite possibly gives him a club record of longest period of time between debut and first goal in Hassocks history with a nine-year stretch.

It was the perfect moment to score too, coming as it did in the final five minutes of the half when a goal for a side who had been trailing by two can often turn a game around.

That was certainly the case here and there was a real momentum change which continued into the second half.

As a result, the half time tea had hardly finished being when poured when Hassocks were on level terms.

Jamie Hillwood was the scorer this time, his third of the season arriving just five minutes after the restart to make it 2-2.

That was a wake up call for Down and almost instantly, they upped their game in an attempt to get back on the front foot.

You sensed that the next goal would be crucial and unfortunately for the Robins, it went the way of the hosts - and not long after Hillwood's leveller.

Parity had been restored for only seven minutes when Joe Holvey struck what proved to be the winner, netting a brilliant individual goal worthy of deciding any game.

Down certainly knew they'd been in a battle come the final whistle, when they offered words of encouragement to Dalgleish and his squad for the season ahead.

"It's always a pleasure to play against Hassocks home or away."

"They will be disappointed with the result but playing with the level of commitment shown today, they will turn it around."

If the Robins are to turn it around, they know that they need to take advantage of a run of four consecutive home games over the coming 11 days, although a quick glance at the fixture list makes you realise just how tough the Premier



Division is this season.

Newhaven have lost only twice in the league all season, Peacehaven & Telscombe are in third and one of the only sides to have beaten runaway leaders Eastbourne Town so far and Little Common have won four of their last six.

Still, there were other positives for Dalgleish to take from the Haven going into those games alongside the way his side battled back and the words of praise from their hosts.

Goalkeeper Charlie Pugh pushed Dan Turner close for the man-of-thematch award on his debut having recently moved back to Sussex following a spell at the University of Exeter.

Pugh was recommended to the Robins by club legend Robbie Kitchen who, with 123 goals in 323 senior appearances for the club, knows a thing or two about what it takes to be a decent keeper at this level.

More importantly, there was also the welcome return to action of Phil Johnson who made his first appearance since breaking his leg against East Preston in early August.

Johnson's 27 goals last season were a major reason as to why Hassocks finished as high as 12th in the table and they'll be hoping that their captain can hit the goal trail soon.

If he can, then Crawley Down's prediction of a turnaround being not too far away might be correct.

It took Uckfield less than 120 seconds to take the lead. For reasons nobody could explain, the Beacon clubhouse was showing EastEnders on its televisions.

As a result, anybody who dallied their departure outside in order to catch the fallout of the explosive revelations about the paternity of Sharon Mitchell's unborn child would have missed the opening goal.

Hassocks certainly looked like they had their minds on goings on in Albert Square, Coronation Street, Emmerdale Farm... anywhere but the Beacon really as they allowed Matt Barbosa to skip away and deliver a low cross to Liam Baitup, who was free in the box for a tap in.

The Robins managed just two opportunities in the first half.

Four minutes after Baitup's opener and James Littlejohn's free kick drew a fingertip save.

Then on the stroke of half time, Littlejohn collected Alex Spinks' flick but his curler was held by Hawkins.

Other than that, it was pretty much one way traffic towards the Hassocks goal.

Charlie Pugh held a Baitup header Marshall on the line.

at full stretch after another driving run from Barbosa and Pugh then did superbly to tip a curling effort from Bailo Camara around the post.

There was nothing that he could do about Uckfield's second which arrived on 23 minutes.

Barbosa again was the architect as he latched onto a long ball over the top, getting the wrong side of Dan Turner who was unfortunate to clip the livewire winger.

There could be few complaints about Anthony Andrews' decision to award the penalty however which was perfectly dispatched by Camara.

Hassocks switched their Harveys at half time with Blake replacing Enticknap but there was little time for the change to make an impact before Uckfield sewed things up with their third eight minutes after the restart.

Visiting captain Richie Welch's free kick from out on the left was allowed to bounce in the Hassocks box and in the ensuing chaos, Turner swung a leg at the ball to slice it over the top of Pugh for an own goal.

Three minutes later and there was a moment of controversy as Bacon and Hawkins collided as both attempted to latch onto Jack Troak's ball over the top.

Bacon got there first and knocked the ball just wide of the post before he was wiped out, leaving the referee with a straightforward decision penalty or goal kick? Remarkably, he gave neither and instead settled on a corner.

Perhaps if Hassocks were still in the game there would have been more vehement appeals. They were even further out of it on the hour mark when a long ball over the top left Pugh and Baitup in a footrace to get there first.

Just like Hawkins and Bacon, they too ran into each other but Baitup had the awareness to get up first, collect the loose ball and fire home despite the best efforts of Luke Marshall on the line.



At that stage, you began wonder how many Uckfield were going to rack up. Hassocks could at least take solace them from the fact that no further goals arrived for the visitors; in fact, it should have been the Robins adding to the score line.

That they didn't was because of Hawkins and some beguiling officiating.

Hawkins pulled off a fine double stop, parrying Joe Bull's low cross and then catching Jamie Hillwood's effort from the rebound after excellent work from Andy Whittingham.

He then pushed a bouncing distance effort from Bull away and somehow kept out Troak's powerful chest and volley which came through a crowd of players, not to mention that penalty stop from Benson.

Turner also drilled a trademark free kick from 30 yards inches over the bar.

As for the officials, they didn't seem to mind that Taylor Maddock had taken it upon himself to play as a second goalkeeper in the closing stages.

It was perhaps understandable that they missed Maddock handling Benson's volley given how quickly the incident unfolded.

Less forgivable was the fact that Maddock then produced an excellent, full length diving punch from a Hillwood corner in full view of the linesman which wasn't given.

It was a piece of officiating nearly as awful as Hassocks' opening 75 minutes.

### HASSOCKS HAMMER CHAMPIONS IN MID SUSSEX DERBY

Southern Combination League Under 18 Central Division Sunday 27th October 2019, The Beacon Hassocks U18 4-1 Haywards Heath Town Under 18s

After plundering 21 goals in their previous two games, Hassocks Under 18s knew that reigning Haywards Heath Town would offer a much stiffer test of the Robins' own title credentials.

It was a test that Brad Sweetman's side passed with flying colours however, winning 4-1 against the reigning Southern Combination League Central Division champions to move up into third spot in the early season table.

Hassocks' free-scoring form meant that they came into this in confident mood.

Lewes Juniors had been dispatched 8-1 in the first round of the Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup three weeks ago before last weekend's 13-0 win over Southwick.

Both sides have undergone significant changes over the summer, but the importance and notoriety of the fixture wasn't lost on anyone involved and that made this a sweet win for the hosts.

Sweetman made just one change from the previous week's baker's dozen at Old Barn Way.

Harry Meredith returned from a one-match ban to take the place of Oliver Charlesworth.

That meant that striker Yahya Azizi, one of last season's standout performers, had to settle for a spot on the bench on his return to action having been unavailable for the past few weeks.

The goal scoring form of newcomers Harrison Lees and Lewis Beebee has more than made up for Azizi's absence and they were both on target again.

For Lees, it was a brace which takes his tally for the season to nine. It also means that he has scored in all five of Hassocks' fixtures so far.

Beebee also has nine for the season, a single here ensuring that Lees and himself remain level at the top of both the Hassocks and the league's goalscoring charts.

Remarkably, Beebee's entire season's haul so far has come in just



the past three games; he notched a hat-trick in the County Cup win over Lewes and helped himself to five against hapless Southwick.

It was Azizi who added Hassocks' fourth when he was introduced from the bench, belatedly opening his account for the season and underlying just what a dangerous front line Sweetman has at his disposal.

Heath's consolation was a late one, arriving in the 89th minute from substitute Connor Silvey, the last action of a game which was at times a little heated.

As a result of that, four players went into the book - Charlie Jones for Hassocks being joined by Heath's Guy Batt, Kobe Dersley and Connor Silvey in what was a busy game for referee Peter Dingle compared to normal Under 18s fare.



For the third time in seven league games, the Robins were involved in a score draw as they played out an entertaining 3-3 draw at home to Eastbourne United.

Given that United are yet to win this season and Hassocks came into the game on a high after becoming the first side to take a point off leaders Lewes last week, on paper this might look like a poor result.

But given the upheaval that Martin Lee and his side went through in the run up to the game, they'd probably have settled for a point before hand - even if blowing a twogoal lead wasn't ideal.

After all, the Robins nearly had to play without a recognised goalkeeper.

Number one Sarah Chappell was ruled out with illness and normal backup Ellie Moguet was also unavailable, which meant Emma Young answering the call to come out of retirement and step into the breach.

Young had little to do for the first 15 minutes as it was all Hassocks. Bethany Purse was looking a real livewire up front, drawing an early foul in a dangerous position and then seeing an indirect freekick inside the box blocked after the United keeper had been harshly deemed to have deliberately handled a backpass.

Purse drew a magnificent save from the visiting custodian on 10 minutes and on 12, Liz King played in Jodie Johnason but she was denied by a sliding block from the United number one.

It was completely against the run of play when United took the lead

just past the quarter of an hour mark and it wasn't even really an effort on target that put them ahead.

Shantelle Omar was out wide when she hit a hopeful ball into the box which turned into a cross-shot and despite Young getting a hand to it, she was unable to keep it out.

The lead lasted just four minutes as Hassocks responded impressively to that setback.

Sam Newman was the architect of the equaliser, playing a perfectly weighted through pass that put Purse Brocklehurst entered the game for in and she calmly beat the advancing United goalkeeper to notch her first goal in Hassocks colours.

Young had to be alert to produce a diving save to maintain parity before Hassocks took the lead on the 29 minute mark, a game of head tennis breaking out in the United box as Jess Craig headed to King who nodded home.

Lee introduced Katherine Chappell at the interval having decided not to risk her from the start as she wasn't 100% fit.

It was a decision that turned out be a prudent one as Chappell was straight into the thick of the action, earning a throw from which Kirsten Mari's dangerous cross was nearly turned in.

Gemma Craig's excellent run and cross then created an opportunity for Purse but she shot wide and Mair



saw another shot blocked.

It wasn't all one-way traffic though and United nearly pulled one back in an almighty goalmouth scramble.

When Hassocks eventually managed to clear the ball, they broke quickly up the other end to win two corners in succession as Gemma Craig and King both went close.

Tallie Bright and Emily the final 20 minutes and Purse again went close with a shot that flashed across goal.

Then, with 13 minutes left to play the entire complexion of the game changed as two wonder goals in less than 120 seconds hauled United back into it.

The first came out of nowhere, a spectacular 35 yard strike leaving Young with no chance as the ball flew into the top corner from Ellis Rabey.

Clearly buoyed by this, Omar then went and repeated the trick with an equally brilliant distance strike for her second of the game, levelling things up in the process.

Suddenly, Hassocks were hanging on.

That led to some desperate defending in the final 10 minutes as substitute Hollie Lamar had to make a good block, Emma Flin threw herself into two goal-saving tackles and Stevens managed to do just enough to turn away a couple of dangerous crosses before one final chance for the United in the final seconds flew harmlessly wide.

### CZECH MATE AS AARON STRIKES LATE TO WIN IT FOR HASSOCKS

Aaron Czech chose a timely moment to net his first senior goal for Hassocks as the 17-year -old substitute delivered a most welcome three points courtesy of a 2-1 win over struggling Arundel.

There were just seven minutes of normal time remaining when Czech replaced Jamie Ingham but within two minutes of his introduction, he'd latched onto Phil Gault's through ball to coolly finish past the Mullets' outstanding goalkeeper James Fernandes and win the game for the Robins.

Hassocks came into the encounter in a bit of a rut, two defeats in the space of a week at the hands of Horsham YMCA in the league and Sussex RUR Charity Cup giving boss Mickey Jewell some cause for concern.

Jewell said afterwards that he was far from happy with thus performance against struggling opponents but given the number of high-profiles players that the Robins were coping without, that was perhaps a little harsh on those who did eventually manage to get over the line at the Beacon.

And although Arundel felt hard done by come the final whistle, the fact that it was Fernandes who was the best player on the pitch over the course of the 90 minutes tells you that on the balance of things, Hassocks just about deserved it.

Fernandes pulled off some excellent saves while also being

grateful to his defenders for several goal line clearances as Chris Maynard gave them an extremely testing time with his in-swinging corners from the right.

Maynard for Stuart Brown was one of two changes from the side who'd gone down 3-2 at Gorings Mead in midweek, the other being Jamie Ingham coming in for Craig Knowles who was unavailable.

Knowles' absence left Gault as Hassocks' only recognised forward, forcing Jewell to use the versatile Kieran O'Callaghan as a striker and perhaps unsurprisingly, it took the Robins the first quarter of the match to muster any attacking potency.

They were already 1-0 down by that point, the classy Russell Hardwell sending over a dangerous cross which finally fell for skipper Scott Tipper to score with a gentle shot on the turn.

That seemed to shock Hassocks into life and when they did eventually manage to start creating chances, they found Fernandes in inspired form, although weak finishing also helped the Arundel number one's cause.

First he denied Gault comfortably after the Robins top scorer was set up by Anthony Hibbert and that was followed by a sequence of three good Hassocks: Harris; South, Marsh, chances in no more than five minutes.

From a swift break, Jamie Ingham put Hibbert clean through and when he was presented with a second chance after Fernandes foiled his

initial effort, it was right back Nathan Da Costa who performed heroics to deflect the follow-up effort just wide. Gault then struck a post with a header from Rob South's long cross before an error by Ryan Peake left O'Callaghan through with only Fernandes to beat, but yet again the finish was poor and the Mullets survived.

Alex Harris was less than convincing when flapping a half chance from Rory Biggs around the post but Hassocks' young stopper survived that scare and then his side equalise right on the stroke of half time. It was a neat passing move that set up the opportunity to shoot from 30 vards for Hibbert and he duly took it, hitting a superb distance strike which left Fernandes grasping at thin air high up to his left.

Conceding so close to the break left Arundel looking a little deflated and although Hassocks looked the more likely scorers throughout the second half, they kept their fans waiting until late in the day for Czech to provide the winner.

The closest the visitors came was when Rory Biggs was allowed to shoot from distance but the effort was neatly turned over by Harris.

### Peacehaven & Telscombe this season?

At this moment in time, the Premier Division title looks like it is Eastbourne Town's to lose but Peacehaven & Telscombe are one of the two teams who could vet stop it becoming a procession. They are one of the few teams to have beaten Town so far this season, eliminating them from the Peter Bentley League Cup. In terms of the league, the Tye currently sit third in the table having won seven, drawn four and only lost two of their league games to date. Those defeats came against Broadbridge Heath and on the opening day when Alford visited the Sports Park.

### Hassocks' record against Peacehaven & Telscombe?

Peacehaven have dominated the fixture, securing 19 wins to Hassocks' seven with seven draws thrown into the mix. In 24 league meetings, Hassocks have only won four times with only one of those coming at the Sports Park. The Robins will be glad to be at home for this one at least, with their last victory against Peacehaven coming here in August 2016.

#### Last time we met?

It was very wet. The Tye came to Hassocks on Saturday December 15th last year when Sussex was battered by torrential rain and most games across the county were abandoned before they'd reached a conclusion. Not at the Beacon however, which was a shame for the Robins as the visitors ran out easy 4-0 winners as Callum Hart and Curtis Ford both notched braces.

### Any familiar faces?

Bradley Bant is a Peacehaven regular having swapped Hassocks for the Tye last September. The midfielder had spent nearly four years at the Beacon, racking up 131 appearances and scoring 12 times between 2014 and 2018.

### Alfold this season?

Alfold are the Premier Division's newest side having won promotion to the top flight of the Southern Combination League for the first time in their 96 year history as Division One champions last season. They've taken to the higher standard impressively and currently sit in 13th position in the table, 11 points clear of Hassocks and the relegation zone, avoiding which is ultimately their aim for the season. Much of that good start has been down to their form -Alfold Rec is proving to be a difficult place to go and the time of writing, the Fold are yet to lose a home game this season in any competition.

### Hassocks' record against Alfold?

This will be the first ever meeting between the two sides and what we believe is any level, be it first team, reserves, thirds or youth. That will hardly come as a surprise - they only won promotion from the West Sussex League to Southern Combination in 2015.

Continue on the B2133 through Loxwood and Alfold will be the next village. Once you reach Alfold, you'll come to Alfold Crossways where you need to bear left onto Dunsfold Road with the ground being immediately on your left.

#### Players to watch out for?

Kelvin Lucas is Alfold's top scorer having plundered 12 goals in 12 games and given the trouble that we're having keeping them out at the wrong end, he may be expecting a profitable afternoon. They also have their own Jacquesy in Clyde Jacques, but it's doubtful as he is as enigmatic as our very own Dan.

### **Bradley Bant**

Versatile Bradley Bant spent just short of four years at the Beacon between 2014 and 2018, racking up 131 appearances and scoring 12 times.

He became Dave John's last signing as Robins manager when he arrived from Lancing in November 2014 having previously played for East Grinstead Town and Shoreham among others.

Bant instantly established himself as a first team regular and his ability to play as either a number 10, a central midfielder, out wide on the left or even at left back made him an important asset as Hassocks battled against the drop in the 2014-15 season.

He was also a masterful deliverer of set pieces with in-swining corners in particular tending to cause havoc. In one memorable Peter Bentley League Cup game against Lingfield, he set two goals up from corners and even managed to score a brace in what was probably his finest performance in a Hassocks shirt. 
