### Today's visitors

We'd like to start by welcoming our visitors from Peacehaven & Telscombe to the Beacon this afternoon and hope they enjoy their brief stay with us here in Mid Sussex.

A quick look at the league table tells you how tough today will be with the Tye well in title contention currently - although fingers crossed we can put a little dent in their championship bid.

### Downed by the Dockers

It was a much-improved performance against Newhaven last Saturday but sadly it counted for nothing in terms of points as the Dockers left with all a 3-2 victory.

Still, there were positives to be taken. The one-goal deficit means it is the closest we've come to not losing since the start of October and that was against quality opposition who have only lost three times all season.

It was also great to see Phil Johnson back on the score sheet for the first time since he broke his leg in August and there was the intriguing prospect of a debut for new signing Blagomir Mastagarkov who was

introduced from the subs bench.

Blagomir is a six foot plus forward from Bulgaria who came through the youth system at Lokomotiv Plovdiv, playing one game in the Bulgarian top flight in the 2010-11 season.

He also played for Brestnik 1948, Vidima-Rakovski and Marista Plovdiv, all of whom competed in the top three tiers during his time with them.

We'd like to welcome Blagomir to the Beacon and wish him all the best for his time with us.

### Under 23s hammer Oakwood

48 hours before he was scoring against Newhaven on Saturday, Jonno hit a hat-trick as he started his first game since August in the Under 23s 5-1 victory over Oakwood.

It was a good night all round as not only was it our third win of the season, but Will Broomfield also made his own comeback from a lengthy period on the side lines and James Westlake got more minutes under his belt after a year out.

There is another Beacon double header scheduled for tomorrow with entrance to both games free.

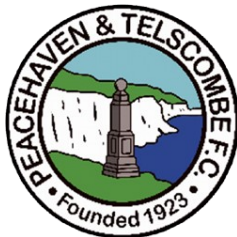

**They're one of the most successful clubs in Southern Combination League history and are well in the hunt for a ninth league title. A tough afternoon awaits with Peacehaven & Telscombe in town...**

The Tye look on course to have their best season since they were last crowned champions in 2013 which was the start of a golden period at the Sports Park.

Back-to-back promotions took Peacehaven into the Isthmian League Premier Division, the highest level the club has ever played at and they also had a day out that nobody will ever forget when lifting the Sussex Senior Cup at the Amex in May 2014.

The Tye's fall was nearly as quick as their rise and successive relegations followed, leaving them back in the Southern Combination Premier Division for 2016-17.

More concerning was the financial troubles that gulped and could have easily killed off this most famous of Sussex Non League clubs.

The people of Peacehaven rallied however and the Tye were eventually saved, now thriving as a community owned football club.

Under the management of Mark Shutt, they shocked higher division Haywards Heath Town to win the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup at the end of last season.

That's proven to be a springboard to bigger and better things this time around and they arrive at the Beacon sitting third in the table, seven points behind leaders Eastbourne Town with a game in hand.

The Tye have already defeated Town once this season, eliminating them from the Peter Bentley League Cup before going onto knock out Lancing who are the only other team above them in the table.

Those two results show just what a dangerous outfit Peacehaven could be and given that they're still in that competition, the RUR Cup and the Sussex Senior Cup, chances are there will be at least one piece of silverware heading towards the trophy cabinet at the Sports Park come the end of the season.

They'll fancy their chances of keeping pace with the top two after today if their record against Hassocks is anything to go by.

32 times we've met in the past with Peacehaven winning on 17 occasions, including nine of the last 10.

Ouch.

## Played for Both

**Peacehaven could name one familiar face in their squad today with former Hassocks favourite Bradley Bant now in his second season with the Tye.**

Bant made the move to the Sports Park from the Beacon a few weeks into the 2018-19 campaign and hasn't looked back, becoming a regular starter for Mark Shutt's side.

The midfielder played 131 times for Hassocks after joining from Lancing in November 2014, scoring 12 times for the Robins.

Bant can be sure of a good reception today from the home support for his efforts during three-and-a-half years at the Beacon -

although hopefully it won't be too happy a return.

Striker **Dan Smith** was a bit of a nomadic figure at the start of the decade, playing for Hassocks and Peacehaven across several spells.

Mickey Jewell first bought him to the Beacon from the Tye for the 2010-11 season when he scored 10 goals in 37 appearances.

He left for Saltdean United at the start of the 2011-12 campaign, but returned to the Beacon two further times in-between a couple of returns to Peacehaven too.

Smith finished his Hassocks career with a decent return of 26 goals from 63 games.



# **PAIN IN THE RAIN AS HASSOCKS ARE HAMMERED BY HAVEN**

**As the rain poured and games across Sussex fell like dominoes, Hassocks could have been forgiven for rueing the investment they've sunk into the Beacon pitch over the years.**

Whilst many non-league clubs spend money on players, Hassocks have always ploughed their finances into their facilities, turning their home ground into one of the finest on the Southern Combination League circuit.

The benefit of that investment was evidenced come 5pm on Saturday evening after the visit of Peacehaven & Telscombe.

Despite the Beacon car park being under water and the roads around the ground flooded, the pitch more than survived the worst weather conditions that anyone can remember seeing at a Hassocks home game for the past 25 years.

Torrential rain fell for the entire 90 minutes and a driving wind meant that temperatures plummeted. It was terrible to watch in and difficult to play in.

Spencer Slaughter, with nearly 500 career games for a glut of Sussex sides under his belt, said afterwards that he'd never experienced anything like it – and he only played the first 45 minutes before succumbing to illness.

"It was absolutely vile," said Slaughter. "I was shocked it went ahead to be honest. I spoke to several Southern Combination and Bostik League players on Saturday night and we all agreed it was by far the worst conditions we've ever played in."

"Pat Harding (Slaughter's former Hassocks and Burgess Hill Town teammate) said to me he showered after Burgess Hill's game in his full kit and boots as he couldn't undo them due to being so cold and wet. And they were abandoned after 30

minutes."

Hassocks will wish that their clash with the Tye had have gone the same way as the Hillians trip to Whitehawk as this was a bruising afternoon for the Robins.

A first half brace from Callum Hart was followed by a second half brace from Curtis Ford, giving Peacehaven a 4-0 win which extends their impressive record over Hassocks to nine victories in the last 10 meetings between the two.

Mark Dalgleish made two enforced changes from the side who had pushed Haywards Heath Town all the way in their Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup Quarter Final on Tuesday night before going down 3-0.

Andy Whittingham was unavailable with his place taken by Bradley Tighe who had been cup tied for the Heath game while Will Broomfield, who picked up a knock in the latter stages of that one, was replaced by Dan Jacques.

Peacehaven started brightly and went close through Matt Cheeseman, John Elliott and former Hassocks favourite Bradley Bant, who received a warm welcome on his first return to the Beacon since his September move to the Tye.

Visiting goalkeeper Aliue Secka saved at the second attempt to deny Phil Johnson on a Robins breakaway as both sides did their best to defy the biblical weather in an opening 20 minutes which ebbed and flowed.

Hassocks had the wind taken out of their sails somewhat when they went behind midway through the first half, Hart opening his account for the afternoon when he met Cheeseman's cross to the near post with a neat finish past Josh Green.

Seven minutes later and Hart had both his and Peacehaven's second of the afternoon.

It was another cross that caused the damage, this time Cam Wiltshire delivering into a crowded penalty

area where Hart did well to make the space to turn before firing home low and hard.

Tyler Scrafton thought he'd found himself with a clear run at goal only to be halted by a brilliant last man challenge from Jacques and three minutes before the break Hassocks came close to pulling one back but Slaughter's free-kick clipped the top of the bar.

If both teams hoped to emerge at half time to find conditions improving then they were to be sorely disappointed as, if anything, they were now even worse than to start with.

With the quality on show now dropping off as a result, the game ended up being decided by two key moments a couple of minutes apart just past the hour mark.

Hassocks were in the ascendancy at that point with Jordan Badger coming agonisingly close to pulling one back as his header hit the bar.

Had that have gone in, it would have been very much game on.

Instead, Peacehaven went up the other end and a brilliant passing move between Hart and Ford saw the latter make it 3-0 and very much game over.

Ford had only been on the pitch for eight minutes following his introduction in place of Bant and he needed just another 10 to score a second, firing home another cross from Cheeseman to round off the scoring.

# SIX GOAL THRILLER LEAVES HONOURS EVEN AT THE BEACON

**It's been six long seasons since Hassocks and Peacehaven & Telscombe last met in a league game but this richly entertaining 3-3 thriller proved to be well worth the wait.**

The Tye last played Division One football in the 2002-03 campaign but they look well equipped to make a real impression on their top flight return having been crowned Division Two champions last season.

Dave John would have been pleased then that his side played a full part in an excellent footballing contest, conjuring up some passages of play that more than matched those delivered by the visitors who could be dark horses for this year's County League title.

By the time the full time whistle blew, both sides could have claimed that they deserved the three points afterwards - which is what made the draw the right result at the end of the evening.

Peacehaven certainly enjoyed zipping the ball around on a slick Beacon surface in the opening exchanges and they took the lead as early as the 13th minute when Tom Levitt fired home after Hassocks couldn't convincingly clear a cross.

That goal seemed to shock the Robins into life and within six minutes they were level.

There was some debate but who got the final touch onto a ball delivered into the box with Stuart Faith requiring length treatment to a nasty head wound that he'd incurred

in the confusion.

Faith in the end claimed the goal, which was probably the least he deserved for his endeavours in putting his head in where it hurts.

Joel Harding had to save well from Carl Dunk and Levitt again before Hassocks went ahead 10 minutes before the interval.

The Peacehaven defence were completely caught out by a huge clearance from Harding and as the visitors' back four froze, Anthony Hibbert latched onto the ball over the top and beat Jake Buss in the Tye goal with ease.

That goal sparked an action-packed finish to the first half from a Hassocks point of view.

Hibbert was inches away from making it 3-1 when his volley flashed just wide of Buss' post while Spencer Slaughter and Terry Gacias both found their way into the referee's book.

Whatever was said to the Peacehaven players at half time clearly had the desired impact as they began the second half with real urgency, knocking the ball around well as Hassocks struggled to get a grip on proceedings.

It was no surprise when that bright start was rewarded with an equaliser just prior to the hour mark.

Arni Kublickas' clearing header wasn't a good one with the ball falling to Craig Bunch who delivered the perfect cross straight onto the boot of Levitt for his second of the game.

Things went from bad to worse for Hassocks' young Lithuanian full

back after that as he picked up a deserved booking for a heavy challenge and then allowed himself to be turned far too easily by Dunk who fired past Harding to put Peacehaven into the lead.

That was on 66 minutes. John responded by throwing on strikers Neil Kane and James Laing in place of Matt Amos and Gacias.

The new faces nearly had an instant impact, fashioning a chance for Slaughter who tested Buss with a real piledriver from a full 30 yards which the Peacehaven keeper did well to keep out.

There was nothing that Buss could do about the Hassocks leveller though which arrived with just six minutes of normal time remaining.

Hibbert swung over a free kick to the far post where Laing had timed his run to perfection to meet the delivery with a trademark header.

Both sides then had chances to win it in injury time. Ian Simpson's rocket header flew narrowly over the bar with Buss well beaten and Harding somehow managed to keep out a double effort from Bunch, firstly with his hands and then even more impressively with his feet.

# Fixtures confirmed for Christmas run-in

## **The Southern Combination League have confirmed the Under 23 West Division and Under 18 Central Division fixtures between now and the Christmas break.**

Dave John's Under 23s will play three more times between now and the end of the year while the Under 18s also have three fixtures lined up.

The Under 23s kicked off their run 48 hours ago when Lancing came to the Beacon for a 7.45pm kick off.

Hassocks would have been looking for revenge in that one having gone down 4-2 away at Culver Road in October.

Alex Fair scored three times for Lancing with George Mitchell-Phillips also on target. The Robins' goals came from Louis Pople and Tom Jupp.

They're next in action this coming Wednesday 4th December in the last eight of the Sussex Under 23

Challenge Cup with a tough looking trip to Combined Counties League outfit Loxwood which kicks off at 7.45pm.

This will be the first meeting between Robins and Magpies at this level of football since the 2015-16 campaign.

Loxwood were crowned West Division champions that year and in some style too as they lost just once all season.

Hassocks' visit to Plaistow Road ended in a 3-1 defeat in which Liam Benson scored.

The return fixture at the Beacon finished 3-2 with the Robins' goals coming from Andrew Roberts and Stuart Faith.

The Under 23's final game of 2019 is a tough one as title chasing Pagham visit the Beacon on Thursday 12th December at 7.45pm.

Hassocks did the double over the Lions last year, winning 2-0 at home thanks to goals from Jake Lindsey

and James Littlejohn and triumphing 2-1 at Nyetimber Lane with Littlejohn again on target, that time alongside Matt Berridge.

There is also an Under 23 League Cup tie to fit in somewhere with Hassocks having been given a trip to Old Barn Way to face Southwick, although this is most likely to take place in the new year.

The Under 18s meanwhile will kick off December with a home game against the Bears of Broadbridge Heath tomorrow at 11am.

Brad Sweetman's side won both meetings between the two 5-1 last season.

That's followed next Sunday by a League Cup clash away at fellow Central Division title challengers Mile Oak.

The Young Robins' final game of 2019 takes place on Sunday 15th December, a mouth watering Mid Sussex Derby to round off the decade with away at Burgess Hill Town.

# HASSOCKS DOWNED BY DOCKERS BUT POSITIVES TO BE HAD

**Southern Combination League Premier Division**  
**Saturday 23rd November 2019, The Beacon**  
**Hassocks 2-3 Newhaven**

**There was good news and bad news at the Beacon as Newhaven ran out 3-2 winners to become the seventh team in succession to defeat Hassocks.**

That's the start of the bad news as the Robins are now approaching unwanted club-record territory.

The most games they've ever lost in a row in senior football is nine, coming in the 2017-18 season. That was the year in which they only survived relegation due to ground grading.

The bad news doesn't end with record losing streaks, either. The result also sunk Hassocks to second-bottom in the Premier Division table thanks to Pagham's 3-1 win over Broadbridge Heath.

Throw in a 5-2 success for East Preston away at Horsham YMCA and the Robins are six points adrift of safety.

Thankfully, there is plenty of time to turn the situation around. And Hassocks' cause in that regard will be helped immeasurably by a familiar name returning to the score sheet after four months on the side lines - which is where the good news begins.

Phil Johnson's 95th minute goal may not have meant much for this game, but in the long run it's a pointed reminder of the quality that Hassocks will now be able to call upon as they attempt to haul themselves out of the mire.

Johnson scored 27 times last season, firing the Robins to 12th place.

He assumed the captaincy and swept up the Players' Player, Manager's Player and Supporters' Player of the Year awards.

Hassocks aren't quite a one-man team, but they are a very different proposition when Johnson is fit and firing - Mark Dalgleish will now be

hoping that Johnson stays that way until the end of the season.

Dalgleish was also able to give a debut to an intriguing new signing from the bench.

Blagomir Mastagarkov is a six-foot-plus forward who has previously played in the top three divisions in his native Bulgaria.

He came through the youth system at top flight club Lokomotiv Plovdiv and he looked a decent prospect on the run out he got here after finally receiving international clearance earlier in the week.

Quite how his talents are going to translate into the ninth tier of English football remains to be seen, but it will certainly be interesting to watch - presuming of course that Hassocks can hold onto a player of Mastagarkov's calibre should he be a success at this level.

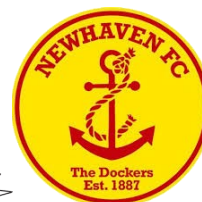
One thing that the new addition does add though is height and a physical presence, a commodity sorely lacking in a side that is Hobbit-like in stature.

Only one player on show against the Dockers other than Mastagarkov measured in at over six feet and that was 17-year-old defender Luke Marshall, arguably Hassocks' Man-of-the-Match against a dangerous Newhaven front line which included the talents of Lee Robinson.

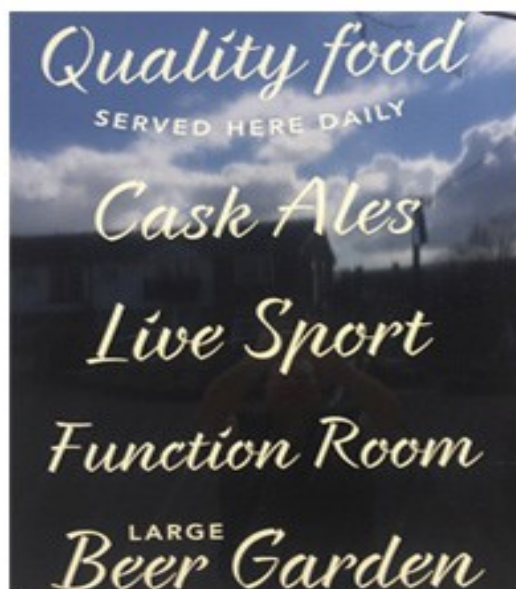

The postponement had worked out quite well for Sweetman in other ways, too.

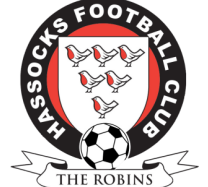

Alfold are the Premier Division's newest side having won promotion to the top flight of the Southern Combination League for the first time in their 96 year history as Division One champions last season. They've taken to the higher standard impressively and currently sit in 13th position in the table, 11 points clear of Hassocks and the relegation zone, avoiding which is ultimately their aim for the season. Much of that good start has been down to their form - Alfold Rec is proving to be a difficult place to go and the time of writing, the Fold are yet to lose a home game this season in any competition.

#### **Hassocks' record against Alfold?**

This will be the first ever meeting between the two sides and what we believe is any level, be it first team, reserves, thirds or youth. That will hardly come as a surprise - they only won promotion from the West Sussex League to Southern Combination in 2015.

#### **How to get to Alfold Rec?**

Don't use Google! Google Maps doesn't seem to think that Alfold Rec exists for some reason, which could make navigation tricky given that we've never been there before. It's a similar journey to Loxwood away which means you'll need to take the A272 to through Billingshurst, joining the B2133 towards Newpound. Continue on the B2133 through Loxwood and Alfold will be the next village. Once you reach Alfold, you'll come to Alfold Crossways where you need to bear left onto Dunsfold Road with the ground being immediately on your left.

#### **Players to watch out for?**

Kelvin Lucas is Alfold's top scorer having plundered 12 goals in 12 games and given the trouble that we're having keeping them out at the wrong end, he may be expecting a profitable afternoon. They also have their own Jacquesy in Clyde Jacques, but it's doubtful as he is as enigmatic as our very own Dan.

### East Preston this season?

A quick glance at the Premier Division table will tell you how important this game is for Hassocks. 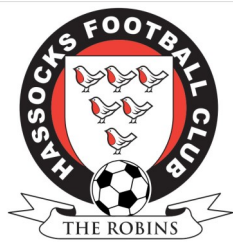
