Horsham YMCA are undergoing something of a transitional season in 2019-20, but with their dominance of this fixture they'll arrive at the Beacon confident of leaving with all three points...

Having been regular title challengers for a number of seasons now including when finishing as runners up last time out, YM saw a number of key players leave in the summer.

As a result, manager Peter Buckland had to rebuild his squad. That's a process that has taken time with YM initially giving plenty of young players an opportunity, followed by some smart recruitment which has seen some quality additions flock to Gorings Mead over recent months.

Unsurprisingly, all of that has taken some time to gel but after spending the first month or two of the season floating around the bottom half of the table, YM appear to have clicked and arrive here today in 11th position for another instalment of a fixture with a rich history.

YM have been one of the Robins' most frequent opponents over our 35 years as a Southern Combination League club.

In that time, there have been 50 meetings across five different competitions.

Hassocks' record isn't exactly one at the Beacon.

to shout home about either with just 13 wins to YM's 26 and 11 draws.

We can at least be grateful that this game takes place at the Beacon - the Robins' record at Gorings Mead is particularly ghastly with only two league victories there since 2000.

Our last meeting took place at YM back in August with Hassocks picking up a rare point as Ben Bacon marked his first goal back in Hassocks colours with an 86th minute equaliser.

Harvey Blake had put the visitors 1-0 ahead going into half time before second half goals from YM's Dean Lovegrove and Martin Smith looked set to give the hosts all three points until Bacon's late heroics in his first 90 minutes for three months.

Bacon has since left the Beacon and with Phil Johnson injured, Hassocks look rather light in the strikers department at the minute.

Johnson will be particularly disappointed should he miss out today. He enjoyed a successful spell with YM between 2015 and 2018 and is nearly as popular a figure with the Gorings Mead faithful as he is here at the Beacon.

Since John Suter's brief spell in charge of Hassocks at the start of the 2008-09 season, there have been a huge number of players to represent both clubs.

Suter brought a whole host of names from Gorings Mead to the Beacon with him including Glen Woodburn, Matt Percival, Matt Russell, Ali Russell and James Bird.

Matt Russell was the stand out performer, scoring four times in eight games before following Suter to Worthing United like most of the YM contingent.

In more recent times, Phil Gault enjoyed a brief stay with YM in between moving form Hassocks to Haywards Heath Town while Phil Johnson went the opposite way, playing one brief game for Heath before joining YM following a spell with Burgess Hill Town.

Johnson endured a highly productive two-and-a-half seasons at Gorings Mead before his return to the Beacon last summer.

Another Hassocks youth product who went onto star for YM was Anthony Hibbert who joined YM midway through the 2014-15 season.

Hibbert had originally moved to East Preston after over 400 games and 100 goals for the Robins but Dom Di Paolo's resignation saw him transfer to YM, where he spent the next one-and-a-half seasons before retiring.

Hibbert wasn't the only player to move to YMCA that year, young defender Alex Gathern also signing for Peter Buckland's side from the Beacon.

Two more players have represented both clubs in the past two seasons; Hassocks having signed defender Dan Webster from YM last summer while Jake Lindsey moved to Gorings Mead at the start of this season for a brief spell.

Webster only played a handful of games before moving to Oakwood while Lindsey's spell at YM was equally short lived.

BEN SAVES HASSOCKS' BACON WITH LATE LEVELLER

Ben Bacon is back at the Beacon and he marked his return to Hassocks with an 86th minute equaliser for the Robins away at Horsham YMCA.

The striker returned to the club from Steyning Town in midweek and his late leveller combined with an absolute rocket from Harvey Blake helped earn Hassocks a rare point from Gorings Mead.

This is a venue which has often proved fruitless for the Robins.

They've won in Horsham just twice this century so to claim a share of the spoils against the side who finished as Premier Division runners up last season represents a good afternoon's work for Mark Dalgleish and his side.

That it was delivered by Dalgleish's new striker will have made it doubly pleasing.

Hassocks look a little light in the forwards department following the departures of Liam Benson and Jake Lindsey – a situation not helped by Phil Johnson being side lined with a broken leg and the fact that they lost Jack Rowe-Hurst to injury here just after Blake had struck.

So Bacon's return is a timely one – and there is certainly a feeling that he has unfinished business from his first spell with the Robins.

After all, it was Hassocks who had given Bacon his chance in senior football, plucking him from Haywards Heath Town's reserve squad in the summer of 2016.

The striker hit nine goals in 24 games before going onto have spells with Steyning Town, Three Bridges, Saltdean United and Lingfield.

Last time the Hassocks faithful saw him on a pitch, he was smashing four goals past the Robins in Saltdean United's 4-1 win at the Beacon just under a year ago.

Now, they'll be hoping he continues banging them in while

wearing Hassocks colours.

Based on this, there is every chance of that happening, especially as this was Bacon's first 90 minutes in three months so you suspect there is a lot more to come once he gets up to speed.

YM came into the game having lost their two league fixtures so far with manager Peter Buckland being very keen to stress that this is a newlook, younger side who are very much a work in progress compared to last year's title challengers.

Some of that can go down as bluster. They had an eye catching FA Cup win away against Croydon seven days previously and still have more than enough quality to be there or thereabouts come the end of the season. That makes this a good point for Hassocks.

Dalgleish made three changes from the Robins side who'd knocked off Langney Wanderers in their own FA Cup tie last week.

Bacon came in for James Littlejohn, Harry Mills replaced Will Broomfield at the heart of the defence and Alex Spinks was rewarded for his game-changing substitutes appearance against Langney with a starting berth in place of Lewis Westlake. Spinks also had the captaincy in the absence of Johnson for good measure.

The game was 30 minutes old when Harvey Blake opened the scoring with what will surely win Goal

of the Season, even if we are only four games into the campaign.

Blake loves nothing more than scampering forward from right back and he's been threatening to score from such situations for some time, most notably when skipping past three men and hitting the bar from 25 yards against East Preston.

There was no dancing around opponents on this occasion, instead Blake went for the more direct route of hitting an absolute rocket which left Aaron Jeal with absolutely no chance.

That was the only goal of the first half.

The second 45 saw YM come into proceedings and they equalised just eight minutes after the restart.

There was some ambiguity about the identity of the scorer.

The goal came as a result of a mass scramble in the Hassocks box with YM crediting the final touch to Dean Lovegrove although a dubious goals panel might rule it was in fact a Josh Green own goal.

There was no such doubt about the identity of YM's second scorer, Martin Smith making it 2-1 just 11 minutes after the equaliser had arrived.

Dalgleish threw on Joe Bull for Spinks with 15 minutes remaining, sacrificing one of his holding midfielders for a more attacking outlet.

That had the desired effect when Bacon struck with just four minutes remaining. Hassocks will be hoping it's the first of many.

CURATES EGG IN THE CUP AS HASSOCKS MARCH THROUGH

It was a bit like the curate's egg at Gorings Mead. Horsham YMCA were undeniably the better side, Hassocks were well below par and yet it was the Robins who march onto the preliminary qualifying round of the FA Cup, pocketing a cool £1,500 along the way.

Hassocks will fancy their chances of making further progress and money with Dorking Wanderers to come next.

Mickey Jewell's side took four points from Wanderers in Division One last season and although the Surrey based team have strengthened, the Robins on their day should still have enough to swat them aside.

YM meanwhile will probably be wondering how they didn't win this one for some weeks to come.

This was a game that ebbed and flowed with most of the flowing going towards the visitors' goal but such is football and this magical competition in particular that you can never really tell what will happen next.

That was certainly the case here. The opening exchanges were all YM as the hosts played some delightful passing football, looking particularly dangerous whenever they entered Hassocks' defensive third.

In Brad Curtis, Martin Smith and Dave Brown they had a potent mix of speed, finesse and talent.

Not that they needed any of that to take the lead, Hassocks defending an in-swinging Dan Sullivan corner woefully to allow YM skipper Ashley Dugdale to put them ahead.

That fourth minute set piece was the result of an excellent save from young Alex Harris who was deputising for the holidaying Jack Simpson for the second game in succession. Harris is on-loan from Woking with the intention of gaining experience in the senior game and it certainly looks like an arrangement that is going to benefit both parties, especially with Simpson set to depart for a year of travelling in November.

Home centre half Kevin Burgess almost scored from another Sullivan corner delivery on eight minutes and one sensed the hosts needed to capitalise while they were in the ascendancy.

When they failed to do so, the inevitable happened as Hassocks scored twice in the space of five minutes to turn the tie on its head.

Nick Pitcher levelled things up on 15 minutes after a Chris Maynard free kick broke to him in the box.

The centre back still had plenty to do but he produced a finish as good as anything you'll see from a seasoned striker to notch his first ever senior goal.

Hassocks' second was the result of beautifully crafted move which swept from one end to the other.

Pitcher started it, playing a great pass down the line to Anthony Hibbert and when Hibbert eventually pulled back, Nathan Miles had timed his run to perfection to convert after arriving at full speed at the back post.

The Robins lost their influential skipper Nathan Cooper to a recurrence of his recent shoulder problems on 34 minutes but the significant blow that could have been was lessened by Jewell being able to call upon the quality of Jamie Ingham from the bench.

Hassocks could and probably should have wrapped the tie up with the second half just two minutes old.

Phil Gault's header fell to Ingham who displayed some fancy footwork to get the ball to Jamie Hillwood.

The goal was gaping for the winger but instead of going for the placement that was required, he opted for power with the result being

a shot that cannoned off the underside of the bar before being cleared away by a relieved YM.

That chance aside, Hassocks were very much playing second fiddle.

Their cause wasn't helped when ex-Ringmer midfielder Mark Price was forced off just past the hour mark on what had been an encouraging debut up until that point.

It was no surprise at all when the excellent Brown created and then finished an opportunity for himself to equaliser on 68 minutes and only some increasingly frantic defending from Pitcher, Maynard, Ashley Marsh and Rob South prevented YM from taking the lead.

The efforts of the back four were rewarded with 15 minutes remaining.

Ingham released Hillwood and he more than made amends for that earlier miss by finishing expertly to make it 3-2.

It was perhaps more than Hassocks deserved on the day after they gave the ball away far too cheaply but they could do with a little luck in the cups, especially as they have never won a senior trophy in their entire history.

Needless to say, it will not be in this competition that they belatedly break their duck.

Still, there are some rich pickings to be had if they can get a mini run going, starting with that trip to Dorking in a fortnight's time.

March date set for Alfold trip

Hassocks will be hoping that it's a case of fourth time lucky as they attempt to play Southern Combination League Premier Division newcomers Alfold for the first time in senior football.

Kick off had been just 10 minutes away at Alfold Recreation Ground back in November when a late deluge of rain hit the Surrey village back in November, leaving the pitch suddenly unplayable with both teams ready and waiting to start.

The tie was then rearranged for a Tuesday evening in December but that too fell by the wayside, as did the third attempt last month.

The Robins will now travel to Alfold Rec on Tuesday 3rd March with a 7.45pm kick off.

There won't be long to wait for the second meeting between the clubs either - so many times has the game been postponed that it now falls just 11 days before Alfold come to the Beacon on Saturday 14th March.

The Fold are making a good impression on the top flight in their debut campaign at this level.

They have won nine, drawn three and lost 11 of their 23 games so far to sit in an extremely comfortable mid table position of 12th.

Underpinning that solid form has been an excellent home record. Alfold Rec is already developing a reputation as one of the toughest places to go in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, with the Fold having lost just three times there in all competitions this season.

Survival is the name of the game for the Fold this year following their rapid ascent through the non league pyramid.

As recently as the 2014-15 season, Alfold were plying their trade in the West Sussex League.

Three promotions in the

subsequent four seasons have taken them from Division Two to the Premier Division in what has been a whirlwind last few years for the club.

Last season was their debut in senior football and they took to it like a duck to water, breezing through Division One at the first time of asking.

They ended the campaign as champions, showing remarkable consistency over the course of the year to beat Steyning Town to the title.

There were big strides forward taken off the pitch as well as their home on Dunsfold Road in the village had a new stand and LED floodlights installed as well as perimeter pathways and fencing.

Work that should have taken around two years to complete was done in around six months, highlighting the extraordinary dedication of those behind the scenes at Alfold to achieving their dream of Premier Division football.

ENTI AND STOKES SCORE TO SEE OFF NINE-MAN STEYNING

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 25th January 2020, The Beacon Hassocks 2-1 Steyning Town

Two red cards, three goals and plenty of controversy made for an entertaining afternoon at the Beacon where Hassocks and Steyning Town met in a league fixture for the first time in 25 years.

The Robins ended up winning 2-1, 19th in the table beating eighth in something of an upset - although whether Hassocks would have won had Steyning managed to keep their discipline is up for debate.

The visitors were reduced to 10 men with eight minutes of the first half remaining when Mayckol Sabino decided to rake his studs down the back of Will Broomfield after a firm but fair challenge.

Broomfield certainly made the most of the situation, but you can't kick out at an opponent like Sabino did.

The away support were incensed by the red but most tellingly, Steyning captain and former Hassocks defender Alex Gathern could be heard berating Sabino for his stupidity as the striker trudged off.

It was another ex-Hasssocks player who picked up the Barrowmen's other red card, although what Jamie Weston did to deserve the first sending off of his career remained a mystery.

His first yellow was for an innocuous trip out on the right in the first half.

The second came in front of the home dugout late in the second half. Weston said afterwards that he wasn't even sure what it was for and given that he's one of the nicest men in football, it's hard to believe that he could have said anything untoward, nor were either of his tackles worthy of bookings.

To compound Steyning's misery, Jamie Brotherton then lost his head

and talked himself into a spell in the sin bin, leaving the visitors to try and find an equaliser with only eight players on the pitch in the final 10 minutes.

That Steyning had more of the ball and were still creating chances despite a three man disadvantage suggests that, had they not had players kicking out and mouthing off, this could have been a very different afternoon.

The biggest question at half time was where were the goals going to come from for Hassocks to take advantage of their numerical superiority?

Phil Johnson's nightmare season has lurched back into the treatment room again as he's out for an indefinite period with an ankle ligament problem.

Ben Bacon has departed for Three Bridges and Blagomir Mastagarkov's brief Hassocks career already looks to be over.

Liam Benson ploughed a lonely furrow up top but chances were few and far between.

In the end, it was two midfielders who struck to give the Robins the perfect response to the previous week's 7-0 hammering at the hands of Eastbourne Town.

Harvey Enticknap scored the first on the hour mark after James Littlejohn danced away down the left and delivered a low cross.

Steyning had chances to clear, but two defenders both passed up the opportunity which left Enticknap to rifle home at the back post.

The Barrowmen almost levelled straight from kick off when Rob Clark smashed the crossbar with Charlie Pugh well beaten.

Dan Stokes added the hosts' second nine minutes later when Steyning tried to play their way out of their own box, only to gift possession to Hassocks.

A few swift passes later and the ball was switched to the other side of





the area where Stokes was lurking to make it 2-0 via a heavy deflection.

Steyning pulled one back on 75 with the goal of the game, a sweeping passing move which Conor Bull finished with aplomb.

That looked like it would set up a nervy last 15 minutes. Weston's dismissal and Brotherton's 10 minutes off the pitch reduced the threat slightly, but the relief at the final whistle was still palpable.

Before Sabino's early bath, Pugh had been forced into two good saves low down from Bull while Littlejohn and Stokes had both flashed in crosses which Benson couldn't quite get on the end of.

The outstanding Dan Turner broke up a couple more dangerous looking Steyning attacks and he also tested Conor Kelly with a towering header from a Littlejohn set piece.

Broomfield had a similar second half chance superbly repelled by Kelly and Pugh had to be alert to turn away Josh Maher's effort three minutes prior to Enticknap's opener.

The strangest moment of a strange afternoon though was reserved for Harry Mills, who picked up a ridiculous booking for jumping on Kelly for a piggyback as the Steyning goalkeeper was about to launch a kick down pitch.

Mills quite rightly picked up a deserved booking, much to the amusement of a home bench which featured Phil Wickwar as substitute goalkeeper; Wickwar also having provided the keeping backup in the previous league meeting between the sides back in 1995.

25 years between league meetings and still the same sub goalkeeper

The more things change, the more they stay the same. 25 years may have passed between Hassocks' 2-1 victory over Steyning Town on Saturday and the previous league meeting between the sides in 1995, but there was a familiar name on the bench as the Robins' sub goalkeeper on both occasions.

Nick Greenwood and Peter Liddle had named a 20-year-old Phil Wickwar on their bench for Hassocks' 3-0 victory over the Barrowmen in the second tier of what was then known as the Sussex County League.

With only a couple of subs allowed back in those days, Wickwar's versatility was important—as well as donning the gloves, he was also adept playing out pitch should the need arise.

Fast forward a quarter of a century to 2020 and Wickwar was again among the substitutes, this time combining his role as physio with that of backup goalkeeper

should any misfortune strike down the Robins' young number one Charlie Pugh.

25 years and still the same sub goalkeeper—it's the sort of ridiculous, quirky statistic you only find in non league football.

And, this being non league football, it of course comes with an equally ludicrous story - as Wickwar explains.

"I've sat on the bench so many times that a lot of the games tend to blur into one," said Wickwar.

"Steyning at home though always sticks in my mind because in the warm up, Roger Meier got smacked in the face with a ball which knocked one of his contact lenses out."

"Rather than warming Roger up, I spent 20 minutes crawling around on the floor looking for this contact lens."

"We never did manage to find it, Roger just played the game without it. It must have been alright though, he kept a clean sheet."

Meier, Wickwar and co ended up winning promotion to the top flight at the end of that 1994-95 season as runners up to Mile Oak. Today's visitors Horsham YMCA finished third to join the promotion party.

Hassocks have stayed there ever since and after 25 years, Steyning have now joined them in the Southern Combination League Premier Division.

In that time, Wickwar has managed the Robins' reserve team, third team and had a spell as joint first-team boss alongside Mark Dalgleish.

He's played for every one of the club's teams from Under 18s through to veterans, run the club's social events, been a long-serving member of the committee, worked behind the bar and can now be found treating injured players - as long as their problems don't include lost contact lenses, presumably.

SPINKS STRIKE EARNS POINT BUT IT COULD HAVE BEEN MORE

On a big night in the Southern Combination League Premier Division relegation battle, nothing could separate Saltdean United and Hassocks as they played out a 1-1 draw at a freezing Hill Park.

This was a game that neither side could afford to lose. Both sides got their wish in that regard, but by full time they could also both have laid justifiable claims to being worthy of three points.

The hosts had more of the ball but were only able to force Charlie Pugh into one meaningful save.

Hassocks by contrast had to defend for their lives at times and yet managed to miss three glorious chances to add to Alex Spinks' first half volley. It was a strange evening.

An important one, too. Saltdean and Hassocks weren't the only sides in the bottom six meeting as some 27 miles to west, 16th placed East Preston were hosting 18th placed Pagham at the Lashmar.

That went the way of the visitors as Pagham made it three wins in a row to climb out of the relegation zone for the first time this season.

The Lions are now four points clear of Hassocks having played a game more.

The gap between the Robins and EP is down to five with Hassocks having three game in hand.

Saltdean stay eight ahead having played twice more while Lingfield's 3-0 defeat at Lancing dropped them to 18th, two points better off than the Robins.

There will no doubt be plenty more twists and turns to come in what is shaping up to be an intriguing fight to avoid the drop into Division One.

Should Hassocks be successful in doing so, then they will look back on this as a valuable point.

Little of note happened in the opening 15 minutes, save for the crowd admiring Hassocks' cheery new yellow away kit and taking in the surprise return of James Westlake to first team duty.

Westlake has spent the past couple of months combining appearances for the Under 23s with his running commitments and this was his first game of senior football since December 2018.

It took just 26 minutes for Westlake to make his mark as he played a part in the Hassocks goal.

Some neat play down the right between Westlake, Dan Stokes and Liam Benson earned a throw which Dan Turner came forward to launch into the box.

Turner's trebuchet caused chaos and with Saltdean unable to effectively clear their lines, Spinks was on hand to crash a crisp volley past home goalkeeper Billy Collings.

A timely moment for the Hassocks captain to score his first for the club.

Saltdean had gone ahead eight minutes earlier through Dan Perry, scoring his 27th of the season after taking advantage of some slack marking to glance home a Jack Walters cross.

22 of Perry's total were scored for Eastbourne Town earlier in the season.

Convincing one of the Premier Division's leading strikers to swap a title chase at the Saffrons for a relegation battle at Hill Park was an extraordinary piece of transfer business from the Saltdean hierarchy and one which could go a long way towards ensuring their survival.

Hassocks know only too well what a difference a talismanic marksman can make, given that they've had to do without the services of Phil Johnson for most of this season thanks to a succession of injuries.

You'd certainly have backed the Robins to get all three points had Johnson been playing here with the





opportunities that they created.

Three of those chances should have led to goals. There were two minutes of the first half remaining when Benson sprung the offside trap with a perfectly timed run to latch onto Jack Troak's through ball, but his effort was too close to Collings.

Midway through the second half and Westlake drew an excellent stop from Collings.

The loose ball fell to Benson who looked certain to roll into an empty net, only for some desperate defending from the hosts to scramble it behind for a corner.

Then in the 89th minute, Westlake had a near-identical one-on -one to Benson's first half effort kept out by Collings after the Saltdean defence misjudged Jack Troak's ball over the top.

At the other end, Pugh's only real save came on 70 minutes when Perry brilliantly played in Harry Shooman but his effort from six yards out, front and centre was somehow repelled by Hassocks' young number one.

Perry himself put a free header over shortly afterwards when the Saltdean right back hung a cross up to the back post, but other than that Pugh had a largely quiet evening save for expertly gathering a couple of set piece deliveries.

His unemployment was largely down to the efforts of his defenders.

For all Saltdean's possession, they struggled to find a way past Hassocks' two best players on the night - Turner who headed everything and Will Broomfield who turned into a one-man blocking machine.

OLD FOE MULLETS PROVE HARD FOR HASSOCKS TO BEAT

Arundel were never likely to be the easiest opponents for Hassocks Under 23s to return to Southern Combination League West Division action against after a seven week layoff.

The Robins don't have particularly good memories of their previous meetings with the Mullets, with last season's two games proving to be particularly hair-raising experiences.

The sides didn't meet until mid-April when second place Hassocks went to Mill Road knowing that victory would set up a winner-takes-it -all clash with leaders Horsham YMCA the following week.

But the championship race never quite made it that far.

Instead, Arundel hammered the Robins 4-0 thanks to goals from Jack Kates, Patricio Gomes and Harry Russell.

That was followed by the return meeting between the Robins and Arundel, which ended 1-1 at the Beacon.

James Littlejohn got the Hassocks goal that night as hopes of a first Under 23 League title were finally extinguished.

The Robins haven't quite hit the heights of last season so far,

although they seemed to have turned a corner in their previous two West Division fixtures, hammering Oakwood 5-1 at Tinsley Lane and then beating Lancing 6-1 at the Beacon.

That Lancing fixture took place at the end of November, since when Dave John's side have taken to the field just once when bowing out of the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup at the quarter final stage to Loxwood a week previously.

There were an astonishing five changes to the Hassocks line up from that 1-0 defeat at Plaistow Road.

Charlie Pugh, Thomas Jupp, Kieran Dimelow and Harvey Enticknap were missing altogether while Sam Cash dropped down to the bench.

Their places were taken by Josh Green, Luke Marshall, Jack Troak, Joe Bull and top scorer George Galbraith-Gibbons.

The returns of goalkeeper Green and forward Bull after several weeks absence were particularly welcome, especially with such a packed fixture list to come in February.

Galbraith-Gibbons meanwhile was on the scoresheet with his sixth of the season, a timely reminder to the first team management of his talents with something of a striker crisis gripping the senior squad.

Phil Johnson is out injured again and could be set for a lengthy spell on the side lines, leaving Liam Benson as the only fit and available striker at this moment in time.





Hassocks' other goal came from James Westlake, the marathon man scoring for the first time since December 2018 when he notched for the first team in a 2-1 defeat at Eastbourne Town.

Arundel scored two of their own through Luke Jearum and Harry Callaghan; not the first time this season that Callaghan has proven to be a real handful for Hassocks.

The young winger had also starred for the Mullets when the first team travelled to Mill Road in the first round of the Sussex Senior Cup back in October.

A ridiculous game eventually ended 6-4 in the favour of the visitors and although the entertainment value on this occasion couldn't quite meet that high standard, those who did brave the cold to watch still left having received their moneys worth from an enthralling 2-2 draw.

ROBINS FLEX MUSSELS TO GET BACK TO WINNING WAYS

The Robins go to reigning champions Heath next week in what is shaping up to be a crucial game -kick off at Hanbury Park is at 11am and any support would be greatly appreciated.

Jamie Weston spent two-and-a-half-seasons with Hassocks in which time his wand of a left foot earned him the nickname "The Wizard".

Weston was part of Burgess Hill Town's treble winning Under 18 side of 2005 but couldn't make the breakthrough to at Leylands Park and so moved to Upper Beeding.

St Francis Rangers soon recognised his talents and he made the move to Colwell Road, spending a few happy seasons with Rangers before Mickey Jewell brought him to the Beacon in November 2010.

Weston instantly established himself in the first team and was a virtual ever present over the next 30 months, racking up 107 appearances and scoring 14 times.

Comfortable anywhere down the left, in central midfield or as a striker, he became a popular player with the Beacon faithful before his return to St Francis in the summer of 2013.
