We meet again, as a well-known Dame from around these parts used to sing. Peacehaven are back at the Beacon for the second time in two weeks, looking to repeat the experience of their last visit...

It is in the cup competitions which Peacehaven are experiencing the most joy so far this season.

There was that 3-0 victory here a fortnight ago and prior to that, the Tye picked up a hugely impressive FA Cup victory away at Bearsted in the extra preliminary round.

Unfortunately, Peacehaven also been i fielded an ineligible player in that 5-3 win and so the tie was awarded to their opponents, but those two results just serve as a reminder of just what dangerous opponents Mark Shutt's team can be on their day not that we need much reminding! also been i If Peac gaggle of o the table, i Tyler Scraft huge part.

The Tye's Premier Division form so far might give a little cause for optimism, however.

Two wins from six is perhaps not how Peacehaven imagined their 2020-21 Southern Combination League season beginning.

One of those victories came on Tuesday night when Langney Wanderers were vanquished 2-0 at the Sports Park.

The other was a 4-0 home win three weeks ago against Horsham YMCA.

Peacehaven have not been

helped admittedly by a tough opening set of fixtures; they have faced last season's top two precurtailment in Lancing and Eastbourne Town; a Crawley Down Gatwick side who could be dark horses for the title this time around and Eastbourne United who have also been in good nick.

If Peacehaven are to join that gaggle of clubs towards the top of the table, then you suspect that Tyler Scrafton's goals will play a huge part.

He leads the Tye's scoring charts with seven - two of which came here in the FA Vase - and if the Robins can keep him quiet today, then our chances of winning will increase dramatically.

Should we emerge victorious this afernoon, it would be a rare occurrence. In 34 previous meetings, we have won only seven times with just four of those coming in the Premier Division.

You have to go back to 2016 to find the last Hassocks win, a success you can read all about in a page or two...

It has been quite the summer for players swapping Hassocks for Peacehaven and there could be a number of individuals facing off against their former club as a result.

Let us start on our side. **Bradley Bant** was lured to the Beacon from the Sports Park this summer, joining Hassocks for a second spell at the club from the Tye and assuming the club captaincy in the process.

Going the other way from the Robins to Peacehaven was a man who wore the armband on several occasions for us last season, midfielder **Alex Spinks**.

Spinks managed 29 appearances

between 2018 and 2020 in what was an injury hit second spell at the Beacon.

Defender **Harry Mills** called time on his Hassocks career after 122 appearances made in four seasons to make the move to the Sports Park, where he has since been turned into a goalkeeper, keeping a clean sheet in the FA Vase meeting between the two clubs a fortnight ago.

Liam Benson has also swapped Robins red for Peacehaven black and white in the summer.

Benson was a part of the Hassocks Under 18s side who won the Central Division title in 2013-14 and went score 31 times in 134 matches over three spells with us at the Beacon.

Before those four switched between the two clubs, you would be hard pressed to find many players who turned out for both.

The most notable was striker **Dan Smith,** a bit of a nomadic figure at who played for Hassocks and Peacehaven across several spells.

Smith finished his Hassocks career with a decent return of 26 goals from 63 games over three periods with the club.

Defender **Sol Bowra** also turned out for the Tye after leaving Hassocks 10 years ago.

TOOTHLESS HASSOCKS FALL TO HAVEN AT THE FIRST HURDLE

Goals win games and that is why Hassocks exited the FA Vase at the hands of Peacehaven & Telscombe.

Both sides had chances, the difference being that the Tye clinically despatched three of theirs; Hassocks in contrast drew a blank as Harry Mills in the Peacehaven goal left with a clean sheet on his return to the Beacon.

Yes, you have read that right. And yes, it was the same Mills who made 122 appearances for the Robins as a defender over the past four seasons before moving to Peacehaven in the summer.

Turns out he is also a relatively handy goalkeeper. What makes this revelation all the more incredible is that goalkeeper is a position which Hassocks have struggled with over the past four years, often having to turn to 45-year-old Phil Wickwar to fill the void. And all that time they could have handed Mills the gloves.

Mills' task minding the net for his new club was undoubtedly made easier by the absence through injury of Charlie Pitcher and Phil Gault.

Nobody could fault the work rate of Chris Neatherway and Joe Bull, but you could not help but wonder how different this might have turned out had Dave John had his first choice front line on the pitch rather than on the sidelines enjoying the Beacon's popular new range of locally brewed craft beer.

Hassocks' best route to goal especially in the second half appeared to be down the flanks. Jack Troak gave another positive display on the left whilst 17-year-old Alfie Loversidge was an intriguing choice to take over from James Littlejohn on the right.

Loversidge showed plenty of promise and was only a lick of paint away from marking his full debut with a goal when placing a second half header which defied his miniature stature against the post

from a looping Troak cross.

He was not the only Under 18s player in John's youthful starting line up. Jack Gardner came in at centre back, although his time at the heart of defence was short lived.

In an early blow to Hassocks, Louis Pittock was forced off injured after just two minutes.

Gardner switched to right back with Will Broomfield coming off the bench for his first competitive action of the campaign after an injury hit pre-season.

disruption impact them, helped in part by a slow start to proceedings.

There were just two chances of note in the first half hour, one falling to each side and neither on target.

Bull collected a neat Gardner pass and turned Matthew Gunn but his effort dragged wide of Mills' post on 12 minutes.

Three minutes later and Andy Whittingham had to make a vital block from Max Holloborne who went all Gazza at Euro 96, beautifully flicking the ball over the head of Dan Turner before hitting a volley which Whittingham threw his body in the way off.

Holloborne drew the first save of the game on 32, stinging the palms of Dave Carruthers with a distance drive after picking the pocket of George Brown in midfield.

Turner was not far away with a alancing header on a Brown cross from a well worked short corner routine but from the resulting goal kick, Hassocks fell alarmingly asleep and a simple move up the pitch found Tyler Scrafton who turned Turner and beat Carruthers via a deflection.

That was with five minutes of the first half remaining. Hassocks to their credit responded well, Loversidge's aforementioned header coming with the second half just three minutes old and two minutes later Neatherway couldn't quite apply the

finishing touch to a low Troak cross.

Troak was the next man to squander a chance, backheeling wide from a goalmouth scramble.

Another Under 18s player entered the fray with 64 minutes played, striker Lewis Beebee making his senior debut in place of Neatherway.

Beebee had little chance to make much headway before Peacehaven added a second and there were plenty of questions about Hassocks' markina.

Visiting right back Jake Legrange The Robins did well not to let that came forward to whip in a cross which Scrafton was able to bring down, turn on and pick out the corner of Carruthers' goal with no sign of a red shirt anywhere near him.

> Peacehaven's third in contrast was a goal which you simply had to applaud, Jake Brocklebank bending a free kick into the stanchion from 30 yards for a strike of the very highest quality with four minutes remaining.

> Bull's cross-shot had been turned behind by Mills minutes earlier and the former-Hassocks defender then showed his worth as a goalkeeper when denying Troak's one-on-one effort with an excellent double save.

> The Robins had one final chance in stoppage time but in a moment which summed their afternoon up, Loversidge's low cross went through the legs of Troak and under the foot of Beebee.

Hassocks 2-1 Peacehaven & Telscombe

GAULT AND MILES MAKE IT TWO FROM TWO FOR IN-FORM ROBINS

You had to go back 20 years to find the last and one of only two times that Hassocks have begun a Southern Combination Premier Division season with back-to-back league victories.

But that unenviable statistic was finally broken at the Beacon as Phil Gault and Nathan Miles struck in a 2-1 win over Peacehaven and Telscombe to make it six points out of a possible six to kick off their 2016 -17 campaign.

Sterner tests no doubt lie in wait than that offered by both Peacehaven and the other side vanquished three days previously, Wick.

Nonetheless, this has been an impressive start for the Robins, even more so when you consider that in the previous two seasons it has taken until the seventh and ninth league games to get the number two into the win column.

Peacehaven have endured a difficult couple of seasons after consecutive relegations through the divisions.

Now without the war chest that helped to provide a remarkable rise from intermediate football to the heights of the Ryman Premier in just 10 seasons, they've had to rebuild their squad with talented young players, largely from the lower leagues.

It was one of those players who

drew them level.

Jack Langford is a summer acquisition from Division Two side Rottingdean Village and he slotted home from the penalty spot with just over an hour played to round off a bright start to the second half for the visitors.

They'd started the first half in equally positive fashion, Langford drawing a fine stop from Alex Harris and Marcus Allen giving the crossbar a good rattling as Hassocks began shakily.

It took Gault's opener on the half hour mark to settle the Robins down and my goodness what a goal it was, the striker opening his account for the season by hitting an absolute rocket into the top corner which not even three goalkeepers would have kept out.

Both teams went hell for leather after Langford had levelled things up

but it was Hassocks who would land the decisive blow, Miles popping up in a pocket of space at the back post to sweep home a low cross with 10 minutes remaining.

Miles has had a terrible run of injuries over the last three years but nothing as bizarre as what happened during the wild celebrations of the winner, Bradley Bant deciding a good way to commemorate the goal would be to headbutt Miles which resulted in a split head for the talented striker.

Despite those surreal scenes, Hassocks stayed strong as Peacehaven became increasingly ragged in their attempts to force a late and in truth probably deserved equaliser.

The Tye couldn't find a way through though despite all their late pressure as the Robins begin a campaign with two wins from two for the first time since 1996.

Robins handed trip to the Rotherfield in Senior Cup

Hassocks face a long trip to the west of the county after the draw for the first round of the Sussex Senior Cup paired us with Midhurst & Easebourne...

The draw for the first round of the Sussex Senior Cup has been made with Hassocks facing a trip to Division One side Midhurst & Easebourne on Tuesday 6th October.

It will be the first meeting between the two clubs since the 2016 -17, when we paired together in the third round of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup in one of the first matches to ever take place under the newly installed lights at Rotherfield.

Extra time was needed to separate the sides on that occasion after the 90 minutes finished with the score 0-0 after a dour spectacle.

Thankfully, things sparked into life in the additional 30. Substitute Liam

Benson opened the scoring in the 95th minute with Phil Gault adding a second five minutes later.

Ben Kamplen pulled one back for Midhurst a couple of minutes after the interval to leave a nervy finish but much to the travelling contingent's relief, the Robins were able to hold on which avoided the drama of penalties and an even later arrival back in Mid Sussex.

We went onto be eliminated away at Crawley Down Gatwick in the quarter finals, the Anvils denying us what would have been just a third appearance in the last four of the competition.

This will be the third time that we have met in the Sussex Senior Cup. The first came in the second round of the 1986-87 competition when the

Stags ran out comfortable 3-0 winners.

The second occasion was a much more pleasant experience as we won 3-1 at Rotherfield in September 2015.

All the goals arrived in the second half as Josh Hawkes, Spencer Slaughter and Jonno Melia were on target with the Midhurst consolation being mired in controversy.

There had been a very clear foul on goalkeeper George Willett in the build up and yet George Morris' scrambled effort was still allowed to stand, much to the anger of the away dugout and the laughter of the hosts' bench.

In total, we have met Midhurst on seven occasions, winning five and losing two. Kick off in game number eight will be at 7:45pm.

PITCHER AT THE DOUBLE TO END PAGHAM'S UNBEATEN START

Southern Combination League Premier Division Tuesday 29th September 2020, The Beacon Hassocks 2-1 Pagham

What a difference 72 hours can make. Just three days after being hammered 6-2 away at Eastbourne Town, Hassocks ended Pagham's unbeaten start to the season with a gritty 2-1 win at the Beacon.

Most of the drama was saved for the final 10 minutes, when two of the goals arrived and both sides squandered chances as the tie threatened to go either way.

The previous 80 minutes won't be remembered as a classic. Opportunities were few and far between, not that anyone with home connections was complaining as dour fare meant that the Robins had given their best defensive performance of the campaign so far.

With a striker like Charlie Pitcher in their ranks, Hassocks know that if they can keep it tight at one end, then Pitcher has the quality to win them games at the other.

He scored both of the Robins goals, the first with a perfectly taken penalty and the second a poacher's finish after a goalmouth scramble which sparked that madcap finale.

Hassocks were rarely troubled at the back until then. Last season's number one Charlie Pugh answered the call to return between the sticks with Dave Carruthers and Conor Evento both struck down by injury.

Pugh could not have expected to have such a comfortable evening against a side who arrived in Mid Sussex as the division's secondhighest scorers, the goalkeeper pulling off only one save of note in the second half.

Dave John made one change from the side who suffered that weekend trouncing at the Saffrons.

Young Alfie Loversidge was rested to the bench with his place taken by former Burgess Hill Town youngster Josh Short.

Whilst Pitcher's brace took the

headlines, Short was outstanding. He covered every blade of grass, constantly won possession back for Hassocks and hardly wasted a pass. It was some full debut.

A rare defensive lapse from the Robins gave Pagham the opening chance of the game with 13 minutes played.

Grant Radmore found himself completely free at the far post and no more than three yards out from goal when Joe Bennett's cross reached him but somehow, the burly Radmore contrived to put his glancing header the wrong side of the upright.

Nine minutes later and Jack Gardner hit a slicing through ball from right back which put Pitcher in.

The Hassocks striker took a touch to cleverly work some room away from the attentions of Joe Clarke, allowing him to pull an excellent save from Connor Kelly as the Pagham goalkeeper got down well to his left at full stretch.

It was another ball out of defence to Pitcher which earned Hassocks their spot kick two minutes later.

Dan Turner this time found Pitcher 30 yards out from goal. The striker still had plenty to do, meandering his way into the box where Dylan Jelley had a wobble to bring him to ground with a clumsy trip.

Pitcher dusted himself down and struck an excellent penalty low and hard into the bottom corner to give Hassocks the lead.

Jack Troak headed a Dave Crouch effort off the line as the first half entered its final five minutes.

Troak then proved his worth at the other end, playing a lovely through ball which left Jake Chadwick in a foot race with Kelly.

Both players arrived on the scene at the same time, Chadwick sliding in with a firm but fair tackle which resulted in the ball smashing against the post and away.



Into the second half and James Littlejohn headed an in-swinging corner over the bar at the near post before Pugh's one save arrived midway through, a big one-on-one stop on the charge to deny Radmore.

Hassocks' desperation to see out the win was highlighted when Pitcher started holding the ball in the corner on 82 minutes, a bold tactic if his intention was to try and keep it there for the next eight plus injury time.

Pagham certainly weren't impressed. Their mood sunk even lower when the Robins earned a corner from this so-called negativity, Pitcher won the header to spark a melee in the box which he eventually ended by reacting quickest to fire past for Kelly for 2-0.

The Lions halved the deficit within two minutes through a brilliant 25 yard volley from substitute Jamie Carroll to set up a tense finish.

What you then don't expect to see when defending a slender lead in stoppage time is your defender charging 60 yards up the pitch with the ball.

Will Broomfield was nearly rewarded for his bravery though as he exchanged passed with Jack Troak, resulting in Troak finding himself one-on-one with Kelly who made a superb double save.

That was in the 93rd minute. In the 95th, Crouch beat Pugh but not the upright as the ball cannoned to safety and in the 97th, Ash Hawkes found himself one-on-one but could only drag wide.

Last time we met?


