### After enduring a slow start to the season for a number of reasons, Broadbridge Heath looked to have turned the corner before the November lockdown and will provide tricky opponents today for the Robins...

Heath were one of the first sides in the Southern Combination League to be impacted by Covid-19 back in September, having to forfeit an FA Cup tie with Haywards Heath Town and sit out matches for two weeks after a positive test among their squad.

That had an impact as they were winless in the first month of the campaign, scoring just twice and conceding 14 goals in their opening three matches.

In mid-October though, something clicked for Chris Simmons and his players and since then they have racked up a series of impressive results to move away from the bottom three.

We were one of the first sides to fall victim to the in-form Bears when losing 1-0 at High Wood Hill Sports Ground, Heath's second Premier Division win of the season.

Since then, they have also defeated Langney Wanderers and gone down to close defeats against league leaders Saltdean United (2-1), Lancing (3-4) and Alfold (4-5).

Scoring goals is clearly not a problem for Simmons' side and in

Lewis Croal, they have one of the Premier Division's top scorers.

What happens tonight could therefore hinge on which defence can deal with their opponent's attacking threat best - Charlie Pitcher is three goals behind Croal's total of 14.

Charlie needs no introduction to Heath having previously enjoyed a brief spell with the Bears earlier in his career, one of a number of links between the two sides coming into this evening.

We signed Conor Evento from Heath earlier in the season whilst their defender Dan Webster played a handful of games for us at the start of the 2018-19 campaign.

As clubs, we are quite familiar with each other too—Heath are one of the only clubs in the Southern Combination League that we have faced in all three divisions over the past 35 years.

There has been little to separate the team in that time with the headto-head reading 10 Heath wins, nine Hassocks wins and five draws, although it is Heath who have dominated the fixture recently.

#### Prior to 2014, you'd have been hard pressed to find many players who have represented both Hassocks and Broadbridge Heath.

In recent years however there has been a growing trend for the Bears to sign ex-Robins - something which all started with defender **Matt Carruthers.** 

Carruthers had a brief eight months spell with us in 2011, playing 27 games and scoring twice after joining from St Francis Rangers in February of that year.

He returned to Colwell Road in October 2012 and later went onto

have spells with Ringmer and coaching Burgess Hill Town's under 18 side.

He spent part of the 2014-15 season with Broadbridge Heath before moving to Australia.

Another defender to have represented both clubs is **Glen Woodburn**, who spent the 2018-19 season with the Bears.

**Josh Tuck** joined us from Burgess Hill Town a few weeks into the 2017-18 campaign, playing 19 times and scoring once in a 3-1 win over struggling Littlehampton Town in October 2017.

He went onto join the Bears at

the start of last season, playing 15 times for before moving to Saltdean United.

Finally, there could be three players involved today turning out against their former club.

For the Robins, goalkeeper **Conor Evento** was signed from Broadbridge Heath in September and **Charlie Pitcher** also had a brief spell with the Bears earlier in his career.

Heath meanwhile have the services of **Dan Webster** who made a couple of appearances in Hassocks colours at the beginning of the 2018-19 season.

### **TAYLOR'S 92ND MINUTE STUNNER SINKS HASSOCKS**

Entertainment may have been in short supply at High Wood Hill Sports Ground but it did at least look like Hassocks were going to pick up a valuable point against improving Broadbridge Heath.

A game of few chances was petering out towards a 0-0 draw. Given that Heath had won both their previous games 4-1 against East Preston and early Premier Division leaders AFC Uckfield Town, that would have made a stalemate a good result for the Robins.

It was not to be though. With the match 92 minutes old, an unfortunate scuff from Hassocks goalkeeper Charlie Pugh presented Jamie Taylor with a chance to win the game, providing he had the quality to finish into an open goal from 40 yards.

Unfortunately for the Robins, Taylor did just that and they were left to make the journey back to Mid Sussex with nothing to show for their efforts.

Taylor's strike was the one moment of quality in a game which featured plenty of hard work but few stand out moments.

Hassocks welcomed Pugh, Jack Gardner, Will Broomfield, James Littlejohn, Jack Troak, James Littlejohn and Charlie Pitcher back after all seven were rested for the midweek trip to Midhurst & Easebourne in the Sussex Senior Cup.

A 3-0 defeat at the Rotherfield to their Division One opponents was the Robins' punishment for treating the competition with disdain and it took their full strength line up a little while to get going against Heath.

Pugh had to pull off a series of early saves as home captain Lewis Croal tested the Hassocks goalkeeper after a driving run and Charlie Parminter drew a fine stop from a

free kick.

Conor Smith put a header from a Croal cross off target in between those two saves with the same fate befalling efforts from Croal, Taylor and Jamie Robinson, none of whom could make Pugh work.

Hassocks' only chance of a non descript first half came when Pitcher put a free kick on target but it was easy for Liam Matthews to gather.

Whatever was said to Hassocks at half time appeared to have the desired effect as they began the second half the brighter side with Smith in particular being given a torrid time.

Smith was yellow carded within four minutes of the restart and another five minutes later, he was booked again to leave Heath facing the final 35 minutes with 10 men.

Remarkably, Smith's red card was the fifth time in nine games this season that Heath had ended shorthanded due to a dismissal.

The Bears showed their considerable experience at playing with 10 men by reasserting themselves on the game following Smith's dismissal.

Pugh was forced into an excellent save, tipping a Taylor shot around the post at full stretch before the same player was wastefully off target.

Hassocks were handed a golden opportunity to take the lead when referee Jamie Wells pointed to the penalty spot midway through the second half. Pitcher saw his spot kick brilliantly kept out by Matthews, who threw himself low down to his left to deny Hassocks' talisman a goal against one of his former clubs.

The miss seemed to deflate Hassocks and despite the Robins throwing on three players with the quality of Phil Gault, George Brown and Alfie Loversidge from the bench, it was Heath who had more of the ball in the final 20 minutes.

They were not able to do much with it, however. The lively Croal looked the most likely to make something happen but he found his efforts frustrated by the Hassocks back four of Gardner, Broomfield, Dan Turner and Andy Whittingham.

Heath thought they had found a winner as the game ticked into injury time when Pugh spilled a cross under pressure from Taylor, only for Mr Wells to rule the goal out on the basis that Pugh had been impeded by Taylor when trying to regather the ball.

That looked to be a let off Hassocks but any relief was short lived as within 60 seconds, Taylor notched his spectacular winner.

Heath hit a long ball down the Hassocks left which tempted Pugh to stray into no mans land over on the touchline.

His attempted clearance back down the centre of the pitch went awry and the ball fell to Taylor just inside the Hassocks half who took a touch and coolly lobbed the ball back towards the unattended goal with it going in via the far post.

### **ROBINS RETURN HOME BY BEATING THE BEARS**

Home hasn't been where the heart is for Hassocks after playing just one game at the Beacon in their previous six fixtures but they returned to Mid Sussex on Saturday to secure a 3-2 win against a spirited Broadbridge Heath side.

The Beacon became somewhat of a fortress in the second half of last season and that went a long way to securing the Robins' place in the Premier Division for this campaign.

And in a division that is shaping up to be every bit as competitive from top to bottom this time around, home form could be the key to the Robins avoiding another season of struggle and desperate shoulder overlooking.

That was why the result pleased Phil Wickwar so much. "An important three points that we definitely deserved," the Hassocks joint manager said afterwards.

"We did exceptionally well after the break, particularly given the number of players missing and it was great to see another one of our youth team come on and not look out of place."

That was 17-year-old Jake Lindsey and he had a lively cameo, one driving run and cross in particular was impressive for its boldness as he teed up Michael Death for a chance to make the game safe which Death sadly squandered.

Lindsey can probably expect to be involved more in the coming weeks, especially after Phil Gault limped off after only 25 minutes looking visibly distraught at the prospect of missing out on a trip to Hastings United on Tuesday night.

Gault had made a lively start to the game before that, being just inches away from turning Charlie Pitcher's cross-cum-shot in and then testing former Hassocks youth goalkeeper Conor Evento in the Heath goal.

Evento's opposite number Nathan Stroomberg had to be sharp off his line to deny Devon Fender before Hassocks took the lead just before Gault's withdrawal.

It was a classic route one goal from the Robins, Stroomberg sending a pinpoint early ball to release Pitcher.

Pitcher in turn squared to Gault who slid James Westlake in with the diminutive midfielder producing a great touch and finish.

Pitcher was enjoying his best game of the season and he was the architect of Hassocks' second just before the half hour mark.

Another run down the right ended with a cross to the far post where Bradley Bant had timed his run to perfection to arrive and defy his Hobbit-like stature with a bullet header.

Heath boss Steve Painter was understandably disappointed with that first half display and after expressing his displeasure, the visitors flew out of the traps in the second half, forcing Stroomberg into two early saves.

They then pulled one back when a cross wasn't cleared and Darren Helsdown reacted quickest to score.

The Bears were beginning to roar

now but Hassocks dug in with Josh Tuck, Jordan Badger, Tom Barnes and the returning Ashley Marsh in particular manning the defensive trenches gamefully.

Badger has benefited from a move to left back in recent weeks, allowing Hassocks to take advantage of his ability to play raking long passes across the pitch which is where their third of the afternoon came from.

Pitcher still had plenty to do when he latched onto the perfect aerial ball down the pitch but he was cool, calm and collected to beat the advancing Evento with a deft lob.

That was a real blow to Heath's advance in search of a point and Hassocks really should have put themselves out of sight.

There was the aforementioned Death chance fashioned by young Lindsey and then Death again squandered another opportunity after an Evento save fell to him and he went for goal rather than picking the better option of the pass.

Heath did manage to set up a nervy final five minutes when a cross deflected off James Westlake with the loose ball falling between Stroomberg and Barnes to Zac Massey who guided home.

The visitors could not find a way to fashion an equaliser however, leaving Hassocks to claim a big three points ahead of three tough matches at Hastings, Pagham and Horsham YMCA – all away from home again.

### WHERE TO CATCH THE ROBINS POST-LOCKDOWN

After a month of lockdown, grassroots football is back. Clubhouses may be closed for now, but at least we can all look forward to seeing 22 players kicking a ball around on the pitch. Here is the full rundown of what we have going on over December...

### **Festive feast of football** for Robins' first team

Following this evening's game with Broadbridge Heath, we face four more matches before the end of December including two in 48 hours over the Christmas period.

On Saturday, it is a trip to the sunshine coast to face Eastbourne United. The Oval has been a happy hunting ground for Hassocks in recent years.

Prior to last season's 4-1 defeat there, we had won our previous six visits stretching back to 2010 - an extraordinary run made more remarkable when you consider the fact that despite that hoodoo over United, we only went onto finish above them in the Premier Division table on two occasions.

United have endured a difficult start to the 2020-21 season with only three wins on the board to sit 16th in the table. They have also undergone an early managerial change following Matt Crabb's resignation with his assistant Ray Collier take over the reigns just prior to November's lockdown.

A week later and we host Alfold in a fixture rearranged from Halloween

weekend. Heavy rain on the morning of the game rendered the Beacon pitch unplayable, a postponement which came at a bad time given the form we were in before the season was suspended for a month.

It will be our second meeting of the campaign against Alfold. The opening day fixture at the Recreation Ground saw the hosts run out 3-1 winners on an afternoon when nothing went right for the Robins.

A goalkeeping crisis forced Phil Wickwar to start in goal but he lasted only an hour before injury struck with defender Dan Turner taking over.

So much upheaval proved too much to overcome although Hassocks from Harvey Enticknap and Pitcher did look lively at times and perhaps should have done more with the chances which came their way.

Charlie Pitcher was the only man to make an opportunity stick with an excellent headed goal.

The Southern Combination League fixture gods were obviously smiling on Hassocks when the Boxing Day matches were decided as we have been given the glamour of a festive trip to Saltdean United's Hill Park.

The Tigers are enjoying an outstanding 2020-21 and currently sit at the top of the Premier Division with eight wins, two draws and one defeat from their 11 fixtures so far.

Kick off is at 11am in what looks like being one of the toughest assignments of the season.

Two days later and we have our final outing of 2020 when East Preston visit the Beacon on Monday 28th December with another 11am start for some Bank Holiday football.

We last faced EP in October in a ridiculously entertaining clash at the Lashmar.

A George Brown brace and goals gave us a 4-0 lead going into half time.

Never has the phrase "a game of two halves" been so apt as EP launched a remarkable comeback as an own goal and a Conor Bull double made it 4-3 at the final whistle with the Robins just about clinging on for the three points.

If the return match is anywhere near as enthralling, then it is one that is not to be missed.

### ...and the rest of the December fixtures

#### The Under 23s face two tough fixtures in December as they take on the reigning North Division champions followed by the current league leaders.

Horsham YMCA are the visitors to the Beacon on Thursday night for a 7.30pm kick. YM won the title in the completed 2018-19 season and were leading the way when the 2019-20 campaign was declared null and void.

Unsurprisingly, we lost both our meetings at Under 23 level last season, going down 2-1 at both the Beacon and Gorings Mead.

There was however something of an upset in the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup when we eliminated YM in extra time with a 4-3 away success delivered by braces from Dan to support. Turner and Kieran Dimelow.

A week after hosting YM, the Under 23s go to current leaders Alfold on Thursday 17th December. Kick off is at 7.45pm against opponents who have three wins, two draws and one defeat at the top of the table in what is their debut campaign at Under 23 level.

The Under 18s were in action on Sunday morning against Broadbridge Heath - to find out how they got on, please seek out Owen who will be able to tell you what happened in a socially distanced manner.

They have their final game of 2020 this coming Sunday away at Crawley Down Gatwick. That gets underway at 11am for anybody who wants to make the trip to the Haven

### LITTLEJOHN AND PITCHER HAT-TRICKS HAMMER LANGNEY

### Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 24th October 2020, The Beacon Hassocks 7-2 Langney Wanderers

### Whilst Premier League fans are charged £15 to watch their club on PPV, Hassocks home regulars are forking out 97p per goal so far this season.

There have been 35 scored in six matches so far at the Beacon in 2020-21 with the latest goal fest between the Robins and Langney Wanderers adding nine to that total.

Seven of them were scored by the hosts, the first time Hassocks had hit a baker's half dozen at home since August 2010 and a remarkable turnaround from the 8-0 hammering at the hands of Horley Town seven days previously.

That heavy defeat to the Clarets represents a minor blip in a 2020-21 campaign which so far is going swimmingly for the Robins.

They sit seventh in the table with 18 points from 11 games, just two points shy of their entire 2019-20 total prior to the season being curtailed.

Central to the very obvious improvement has been the form of Charlie Pitcher and James Littlejohn, who are providing enough firepower to help Hassocks overcome even the most farcical of starts to matches, as was the case against Langney.

Both forwards helped themselves to hat-tricks as the Robins recovered from going 1-0 down inside of 60 seconds.

Referee Adam Jones was an eager beaver and he kicked off proceedings at 2.57pm, just as a monsoon opened up over the ground.

Perhaps the early start is what caught Hassocks cold as Dan Turner conceded a penalty straight from kick off which was despatched by Tim Bennett past Charlie Pugh.

Pitcher scored his first of the afternoon with 10 minutes on the clock to level things up, rounding off a well worked team move. Phil Gault started it, marking his first start since the opening day by releasing Littlejohn who sensibly squared to Pitcher to beat Alieu Secka in the Langney goal.

Littlejohn added the second himself on 20 with a brilliant individual effort, beating two Wanderers defenders after cutting in from the right and hitting a left footed curler into the top corner.

The monsoon which had doused the Beacon gave way after that to a driving wind which was very much in Langney's favour as it blew towards Pugh's goal at the Railway End.

Defending suddenly became very tough for Hassocks and they did well to restrict the visitors to just a couple of chances - especially as Will Broomfield was an early departure through injury with 17-year-old Luke Marshall taking his place alongside Turner at centre back.

Turner found himself involved again for Langney's equaliser when he unfortunately deflected Joe Sumerbell's effort past Pugh just past the half hour mark.

At that point, it felt like if Hassocks made it to the interval on level terms then they would be in an excellent position to go on and win the game with the wind in their favour.

The Robins weren't willing to wait until the second half however and in first half stoppage time, Jack Troak laid off to Littlejohn who scored via a deflection and a post to make it 3-2.

Gault came close to adding a fourth within five minutes of the restart when Pitcher teed him up on the edge of the box, only for Secka to do well to tip the Robins' record scorer's effort over the bar.

Hassocks were largely dominant in the second 45 but that didn't translate to the scoreboard until the final 12 minutes when the Robins notched four goals in a blistering finale which blew Langney away.

Central to it was substitute Jamie



Wilkes, a summer signing from St Francis Rangers who was making his home debut after earning rave reviews for the Under 23s.

Wilkes, Pitcher and Littlejohn combined for the fourth on 78 with Pitcher's deft flick setting up Littlejohn for a lovely finish to complete his hat-trick.

Two minutes later and Wilkes glided in to unselfishly square to Littlejohn and although Secka did well to get across goal and block Littlejohn's initial effort, Pitcher collected the rebound and slammed home.

Andy Whittingham drew gasps all round when he marauded forward from left back, beat six men and found himself in one-on-one only to be denied what would surely been Hassocks' Goal of the Season by a smart stop from Secka.

Hassocks would not be denied a sixth for long, Troak bringing up the half dozen in the 86th minute when he drilled a shot in at the near post before Pitcher completed his hat-trick in injury time

There did not seem to be much on the Robins' top scorer picked the ball up on the edge of the box with a gaggle of blue shirts blocking his way to goal.

Pitcher though has the ability to produce something of nothing and he duly did that, smashing the ball into the top corner with an astonishing amount of power and precision to round off the scoring on another enthralling afternoon at the Beacon.

### **HUDSON DOUBLE AT THE DEATH** HELPS HASSOCKS SEE OFF BROOK

### Substitute Jay Hudson was League Premier Division. the Hassocks Under 23s hero as his two goals in the final five minutes earned the Robins a 3-2 win against Jarvis Brook.

It was a manic conclusion to a match which ebbed and flowed and could have gone either way with Brook only taking their 2-1 lead as the game entered the last 10.

The result made it two wins in a row for Hassocks, a sign that they are turning the corner after a difficult start to the campaign in which they failed to win any of their opening four matches across all competitions.

Brook have come a long way since then to now be an established Southern Combination League club with this being the first season in which they have entered an Under 23 side.

### **BEREFT OF CONFIDENCE, HASSOCKS ARE HAMMERED AGAIN**

Hassocks Ladies' disappointing start to the 2020-21 London & South East Regional League Division One East season continued as they suffered another heavy defeat when going down 7-0 against Ashford.

Instead, it was Ashford who took the lead with seven minutes played. Hassocks had already been given a warning when a goal kick from Sarah Chappell was returned through the middle, only for the visiting striker to put her one-one-one effort off target.

There was no such mistake when the exact same scenario unfolded the second time around, this time two Ashford players bursting through to combine and beat Chappell with a well worked goal.

Four minutes later and it was 2-0 as nobody in red could react quickest to Chappell's excellent tip onto the crossbar with an Ashford forward sweeping home the rebound.

### FIVE STAR SECOND HALF SENDS HASSOCKS TO VICTORY

For the fifth time this season, Hassocks hit five or more goals as they hammered Sidley United 5-0, a scoreline you would have got long odds on when the teams went in at half time goalless.

The Robins missed a succession of chances in the opening 45 minutes before Phil Gault and Nathan Miles belatedly discovered their shooting boots to fire Mickey Jewell's side to a convincing win.

Gault hit a hat-trick and Miles added the other two as Hassocks' strike force underscored their position as the County League's most in-form partnership.

Jewell had cut an increasingly frustrated figure throughout the first half as opportunity after opportunity went begging.

He was a much more contented man after the final whistle however, saying, "I am very happy. We had a poor first half but after a few words, it was much better in the second half."

Hassocks made one change from Tuesday night's 2-2 draw against Arundel. After playing out-of-position at centre half when the Mullets came to town, Spencer Slaughter was absent here with Kieran O'Callaghan dropping into defence and Anthony Hibbert returning in midfield.

The most gilt edged of those aforementioned first half chances fell to Dan Smith, Miles and Hibbert, at which point the home faithful could have been forgiven for thinking it was going to turn into one of those evenings for the Robins.

Gault though had other ideas and he gave Hassocks the lead just three minutes after the restart with an important goal.

The Robins' talisman had passed 100 goals for the club in last week's excellent win over East Preston and it is unlikely that his century includes a scrappier one than that which broke the deadlock against Sidley.

Gault's initial shot was blocked on the line, leading to a bit of a scramble in which he eventually managed to poke him the rebound.

Lee Bryant nearly became an unlikely scorer of a second for Hassocks. A poor corner from the Robins was retrieved by the full back who produced a fierce shot from 30 yards that was tipped around the post spectacularly by Greg Nessling in the Sidley goal.


