They asked if we would pass on our thanks to everyone for the warm welcome they received and for getting into the spirit of the occasion - hopefully, we have gained ourselves a Wiltshire-based supporters club. Aside from first team matters, the Under 18s raised some smiles on Sunday morning by taking local bragging rights via a 5-0 win over Haywards Heath Town.

Today represents something of an historic occasion as Hassocks v Roffey takes place at senior level for the first time ever. It surely will not be the last either given how upwardly mobile Roffey have been since 2008...

Back then, they were playing in Division Three of the Mid Sussex League.

A remarkable rise saw them climb four divisions in four seasons, culminating in promotion to the Southern Combination League at the end of the 2011-12 campaign.

After establishing themselves in Division Two, 2018-19 saw Roffey win promotion into Division One to play senior football for the first time in their 100-year history.

Covid has meant that they are yet to complete a season at that level. Should 2021-22 not suffer any interruptions, then it appears as though their stay in Division One maybe brief based on the start they have made to the current campaign.

Andy Lampard's side have delivered seven wins out of seven so far to sit level on points with Midhurst & Easebourne but second on goal difference.

They have plundered 22 goals at an average better than three a game and if they carry on in this vein, then a first ever promotion to the Premier Division looks more than achievable.

The summer appointment of

former Broadbridge Heath manager Steve Painter as general manager at Bartholomew Way has no doubt helped.

Painter knows exactly what it takes to lead sides to promotion through the Southern Combination having turned Heath from a struggling Division Two outfit into one capable of finishing in the top six of the Premier Division during a long association with the Bears.

Working alongside Lampard, the two have put together a squad full of names which will be familiar to Hassocks supporters for their exploits against us in the top division in recent seasons.

Kelvin Lucas and Joao Tiago Andrade have played (and scored) for a host of Premier Division clubs in the past.

In a sign of how deep Roffey's squad is, those two do not even lead Roffey's scoring charts - that honour goes to Josh Neathey, previously a goal machine at Oakwood.

We may be the Premier Division club coming into this tie, but this will be a stern examination for Brad and the players tonight.



The Peter Bentley League Cup has never been the happiest of hunting grounds for Hassocks, right back to when we first entered the tournament in 1985.

It actually took 10 years from that debut in the competition against Peacehaven & Telscombe for us to taste victory for the first time.

Sure, there was a spell in Division Two in that decade in which we were notable to enter, but even so that was a remarkable long time to wait for a first win.

It belatedly arrived in the 1995-96 season, a 3-1 win away at Bosham which set the Robins up for elimination in the next round against Langney Sports.

We were quick learners however and just one year after their first win in the competition, we went all the way to the semi-finals.

Sidley were seen off in the second round, Mile Oak in round three and an almighty upset followed against the great Saltdean United side of the late 90s in the quarter finals.

That set up a semi-final showdown with Wick, another of the period's big names, but unfortunately we were not able to repeat our heroics of the previous round and fell to a heavy 5-0 defeat in the last four.

We have made the quarter finals on a number of occasions since then, the most recent of which came in the 2015-16 season.

There was no shortage of controversy about Lancing hosting a 7.15pm kick off which meant a mad dash down to Culver Road for the Robins squad, even without taking into account the traffic nightmare that unfolded due to Brighton playing at the Amex on the same evening.

That lack of preparation certainly didn't help, but we were outclassed 4 -0 by a Lancing side who would go onto lift the trophy.

Lingfield and Crawley Down Gatwick were seen off on route to that quarter final, with both sides playing in Division One at the time.

We wasted a glorious chance to make the semi-finals in the 2012-13 season when one of the finest sides in the club's history fell in the last eight.

That defeat came 1-0 away at the no Division One side Littlehampton Town and it owed a lot to a spectacular show of goalkeeping from Jonathan Hendrick.

Before that 2012-13 season, we had been on another barren run of form in the competition, failing to win in five seasons since the 2007-08 campaign.

We suffered some chastening defeats in that time, going down 2-1 away at Division One strugglers Southwick in 2011.

The only notable fact about that game was that just 15 paying customers bothered to turn up at Old Barn Way, making it comfortably the lowest attendance Hassocks have ever played in front of in senior football.

Another defeat to lower league

opposition came in 2008, when John Suter's side faced Rustington for the first and so far only time, losing 2-1 away from home.

We ended up making the quarter finals in the 2007-08 season before falling to Ringmer. The previous season may have been the Robins' second-best ever on record after Dave John's side achieved a sixth-place finish in the league, but we still couldn't get beyond round two of the League Cup after losing 1-0 at home to Sidley United.

It was on out way to another quarter final defeat in 2005-06 that we racked up our biggest win in the competition, hammering Crawley Down 6-0 at the Beacon.

That came in the second round and in the third round, we chalked up the notable scalp of Eastbourne

This was the last season that replays were used in the competition and after a 1-1 draw at the Beacon, Johnsy's boys went down to the Saffrons and triumphed 3-1 through two goals from Pat Harding and one from Matt Robbins.

That set up a quarter final meeting with Crowborough Athletic who proved to be a real bogey team to us around this time and so it was again, the Crows running out 2-1 winners at the Beacon.

The last time the competition was held in 2019-20, we bowed out in the second round via a 4-2 home defeat to Langney Wanders. Ben Bacon and Jamie Hillwood were in the goals that day.



2020-21 Season Review: Supplementary Shield

The final part of our 2020-21 Season Review focusses on the post-curtailment competitions entered by the Under 23s, the Under 18s and the Ladies in which the youth team impressed most by going all the way to a big semi...

Whilst Hassocks' senior squad were busy pulling off upsets in their post-lockdown Supplementary Shield, they were not the only Robins in action throughout April and May as the Under 23s, the Under 18s and the Ladies all had end-of-season competitions of their own to take part in.

The final part of our 2020-21

Season Review kicks off with the Under 23s, who enjoyed their best run of the campaign once football was allowed to resume.

They were drawn in Group B of the Southern Combination League Under 23 Supplementary Shield, facing a tough set of fixtures against Broadbridhe Heath, Horley Town, Horsham YMCA, Mile Oak and St Francis Rangers.

First up was the short hop over the South Downs to face an Oak side who had sat second in the West Division prior to curtailment, behind only Chichester City.

A tense affair was decided late on, Marshall Smith choosing a timely moment to score his first goal for the Robins by coming off the bench to hit an 80th minute winner to give Hassocks all three points.

Six days later and it was derby day against St Francis Rangers at Colwell Road.

Nothing could separate the sides as an entertaining encounter finished 1-1, Joe Bull scoring one of the goals

of the season when hitting an unstoppable long range effort from 30 yards which gave Rangers goalkeeper Jacob Campbell no chance.

The hosts had taken the lead three minutes before Bull's stunning intervention with two ex-Robins players involved.

Former Robins Under 23 captain Ellis Common started the move, hitting a perfect diagonal ball to Sam Wright. Wright crossed and Will Glenn, also once of Hassocks' parish, powered a header past Charlie Pugh.

A young Hassocks side then went to Horsham YMCA, the North Division's outstanding team for much of the past three seasons.

The last time the Under 23 League was played to a finish in 2018 -19, they pipped Hassocks to the title thanks to an excellent end-of-year run of form which saw them overhaul Nigel Pearce's side at the head of the table.

In 2019-20 they had been top of the table before the campaign was curtailed.

It was the same story again in 2020-21 with their ascent to the summit including a 2-0 December victory at the Beacon in what turned out to be Hassocks' last game of the regular season.

You would have got long odds then on Hassocks leaving Gorings Mead with a 5-2 success.

All the goals came from members of the Under 18s squad too, Lewis Beebee and Sam Geard notching braces alongside one for Luke Marshall. YM's goals came from Aden Radojevic and substitute Leon Eales.

The shock win over YM put Hassocks in a strong position with two games of the competition left to play.

Their penultimate match came away at Broadbridge Heath and although Beebee had the Robins in a half time lead, Heath's stronger bench allowed them to come from behind to win 2-1.

Ben Whiteley equalised on 61 minutes, just four minutes after the Bears had made a double substitution to introduce fresh legs.

Nine minutes later and Cameron Watts hit the winner, three minutes after the Bears had made another change as the new faces provided fresh impetus for the hosts to wrap

up the victory.

That left a final game decided between Horley and Hassocks; whoever won at the New Defence would progress to the semi finals.

The Robins though were never really in the tie as they were defeated 5-1 by an excellent Clarets side.

Horley, the hosts having the good grace to put through their own net five minutes before half time.

Sam Cranfield had put Horley 1-0 ahead 15 minutes earlier and they retook the lead before the break via Josh Rapson.

Rapson made it 3-1 four minutes after the interval with George Branton and Mario Quiassaca rounding off the scoring.

The result meant that Horley progressed to the final four whilst Hassocks finished third in Group B, dropping below St Francis right at the death.

Having gone through the first half of the season undefeated and dropping only two points, the Under 18s were confident of making an impression on their Supplementary Shield.

They certainly did that, going all the way to the semi finals where they were outdone by a Steyning Town outfit who were one of the best youth sides in Sussex in 2020-21.

A tough start lay in wait in Group C with the trip to face Alfold who possessed an even better prelockdown record than Hassocks having not dropped a single point.

To win 3-1 at the Elliott Scott Group Stadium was therefore an excellent result for the young Robins.

Two of the goals came from debutant George Mitchell-Phillips who signed on at the Beacon for the Supplementary Shield from Lewes.

The other was a stunner from defender Marshall from a free kick taken from inside his own half. Alfold's consolation came from Ayo-Oluwa Oke.

Two weeks later and Hassocks played their second game of the Shield away at Horsham YMCA.

Beebee was enjoying his April trips to Gorings Mead and he grabbed another brace to go with his double there for the Under 23s.

On this occasion though it was not enough to help the Robins to victory as they were held 2-2, Callum

Chesworth scoring two of his own to ensure the spoils were shared.

With only the group winner progressing to the semi finals, Brad Sweetman and his players knew they could ill afford any more dropped points.

A brutal 6-1 win at St Francis All six goals were in fact scored by Rangers ensured they got back on track and did their goal difference a world of good.

> That was important as YM were busy turning over Alfold 5-0 at the same time.

Mitchell-Phillips helped himself to another brace at Colwell Road with Beebee, Geard and Archie Messent also on target.

Hassocks' final group game took them to Hill Park to face Saltdean United.

Victory would secure top spot and a place in the final four and it was relatively comfortable in the end, Archie Russell and Mitchell-Phillips grabbing two apiece and Beebee one in a 5-0 success.

Steyning were the Robins' opponents at the Shooting Field in the semi final and it was here that Hassocks' journey came to an end in a 7-1 defeat.

Mitchell-Phillips got the consolation but the Robins had no answer to

Steyning. A hat-trick from Thomas Charlwood, two from Toby Bloomfield and singles from Ben Neale and Ben Spano took the Barrowmen into the final, where they beat Bexhill United to lift the trophy.

The Ladies ended their 2020-21 campaign in the London & South East Regional League Spring Round Robin competition, suffering three defeats and picking up a draw from their four matches.

Newhaven provided the first opponents and the trip to Fort Road ended in a 5-0 defeat. Mia Pordage was on target in a game number two, a 3-1 defeat at Crawley Wasps before an excellent point was earned at Parkwood Rangers.

Katherine Chappell, Jess Craig and Claire Stevens all scored in a 3-3 draw, a result made all the more impressive by the fact that Hassocks went with only one sub whilst Rangers had six sets of fresh legs to use from the bench. The Robins rounded off their season with a 7-0 defeat away at Lewes.

14 minute capitulation enables the Dockers to sink Hassocks

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 4th September 2021, The Beacon **Hassocks 0-5 Newhaven**

When Sven-Goran Eriksson was England manager, he used to have a favourite saying that seemed to get trotted out in every other post-match interview.

"First half good, second half not so good." Nothing could sum up Hassocks' performance in their 5-0 defeat to Newhaven better than the Swede's most frequent phrase.

At half time, the Robins turned around trailing only 1-0 to their visitors. What followed in the second half was a complete capitulation as the Dockers ran riot, scoring four times in 14 minutes on their way to a 5-0 victory.

Newhaven appeared to take their foot off the pedal once the fifth of the afternoon had reigned in with a little over an hour played.

Had they kept going in the relentless manner in which they blitzed Hassocks, then they could have had even more. They probably should have done.

It was another harsh lesson for these young Robins, the majority of whom had barely started primary school when Eriksson stood down as England boss 15 years ago. Talk about a way to make you feel old.

Hassocks came into the game buoyed by taking four points out of six over the Bank Holiday Weekend, their efforts made all the more remarkable by the circumstances they were achieved in.

The Robins had to play against both Steyning Town and Lingfield for over an hour with 10 men following the dismissals of Luke Marshall against the Barrowmen and Connor Bradley against the Lingers.

Marshall and Bradley were both suspended for this one as a result. Marshall missing out proved to be particularly problematic for Hassocks as Dan Turner was also absent.

That left Brad Sweetman without

two of his three first choice central defenders; not ideal against a Newhaven side who contain the talents of the man who has been the Premier Division's most deadly scorer for the best part of seven seasons, Lee Robinson.

Into the Hassocks starting line up came Arthur Rawlingson, Jude Wallis and Jack Baden to replace Turner, Marshall and Bradley in three changes from Monday morning's 1-1 draw with Lingfield.

There was little sign of what was to come in the opening 30 minutes. Hassocks held their ground well in what was a scrapy first half of football.

That should not of come as a surprise really. Not only did a surprisingly hot September sun mean that a frenetic pace was never likely, but Newhaven had rust to shake off which had built up from an enforced two week rest from action because of a Covid-19 outbreak amongst the personnel at Fort Road.

It took the Dockers 34 minutes to break the deadlock. No prizes for guessing who did so; that man Robinson ensuring that Newhaven went into the break with the advantage.

At half time, the Beacon faithful were treated to what must be one of the more surreal sights that the ground has seen in its near-30 year existence.





A stag party from the west country had decided that Hassocks v Newhaven was where they wanted to spend their afternoon before going for a night out in Brighton, on account of the groom being a Swindon Town supporter and Hassocks sharing their Robins nickname with the League Two outfit.

Swindon fan Steve Underwood therefore found himself spending the day in full Hassocks kit, wearing a Robin mask and dancing to Rockin' Robin on the pitch having earlier led the teams out as the day's official mascot.

That Underwood ended up being voted as supporter's man of the match for his performance tells you much about just how poor the second half was from a Hassocks point of view.

Eight minutes had elapsed when Henry Watson doubled the advantage, causing the floodgates to well and truly open.

Five minutes later and Robinson wrapped things up with his second and Newhaven's third. Robinson did not have to wait long to complete his hat-trick as less than 120 seconds later he made it 4-0.

Hassocks' misery was completed five minutes after that, Watson adding his second to round off a blistering quarter of an hour of football.

The Robins did at least manage to prevent any further damage being done to their goal difference and there was the pleasing sight of Lithuanian defender Arni Kublickas making his first appearance from the bench for a couple of seasons.



Town triumph but this was far from a cakewalk

Sometimes in football, the scoreline doesn't tell the whole story. Hassocks' visit to **Eastbourne Town was one of** those occasions.

On the face of it, a 4-1 defeat at the Saffrons for Mark Dalgleish's side is a result that looks about right to the casual Premier Division observer.

Town are the favourites to lift the Southern Combination title this season and came into the fixture unbeaten. They had only conceded once in their five previous games.

Hassocks meanwhile had just one league win to their name and that came against the division's bottom club, East Preston.

The current table suggests that it could be a long season ahead for the Robins.

But Hassocks' league position is another falsity. Whilst they may have been under-cooking in the Premier Division, in the cups Hassocks have been delivering some outstanding displays.

They have beaten Langney Wanderers and Meridian Valley Park and took Isthmian League side Chipstead to an FA Cup replay, where only a couple of controversial refereeing decisions denied them giant killing headlines.

that cup form to the Sunshine Coast; the final score suggests an easy day at the office for Town, but in reality it was anything but.

What ensured that there was a three-goal difference between the

two sides was Town's ruthlessness in front of goal as the hosts finished with clinical aplomb the chances that came their way.

Aaron Capon scored Town's first two with the outstanding Dan Perry adding the third and fourth. Perry now has eight for the season already; two more than Hassocks have managed in the Premier Division in total.

It was not like the visitors didn't have chances. The Robins created four or five good opportunities across the course of the afternoon which unfortunately for them they failed to take.

Perhaps most costly of all, they hit the post early in the second half with the scores level at 1-1. Had that gone in, then things may well have been very different.

Town would have been forced to chase the game, which would have left the sort of spaces that Hassocks can so brutally take advantage of with their counter attacking ability.

Clearly, Hassocks are missing the services of last season's 27-goal top scorer Phil Johnson, who hasn't been seen since limping off with a broken leg in that win over EP back at the start of August.

Dalgleish did at least have Jack Believe it or not, but they brought Rowe-Hurst available here to boost his attacking options after a couple of **Subs:** Rowe-Hurst, Stokes, Bull weeks on the side lines.

> That showing against the Chips last time out was full of steel and determination but it looked like those attributes had deserted Hassocks as

it took Town just seven minutes to take the lead through Capon.

Going behind so early proved to be something of a wake up call to the Robins and they battled their way back into the tie, eventually levelling things up right on the stroke of half time.

Ben Bacon was the man on target, his second goal since returning to the club from Steyning Town a fortnight into the new campaign and the least he deserved for another hardworking showing leading the line.

Town goalkeeper Jason Tibble could then only watch when the Robins rattled the woodwork within five minutes of the restart.

Two minutes later and that miss proved to be doubly costly as Capon added his second of the afternoon to put the hosts 2-1 ahead.

Like all good teams, Town turned the screw after that and Perry's quick -fire double arrived between minutes 64 and 70, ending any Hassocks hopes of returning to Mid Sussex with something to show for their efforts.
