Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon as we bring to a close a run of five consecutive home games with the visit of Little Common

This is our first meeting with Little Common in two-and-a-half vears as we managed to avoid each other in both the curtailed 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons.

After such a long time, we would like to extend a special welcome to Russell Eldridge and his players, Little supporters, and hope they enjoy their brief stay with us in Mid Sussex this afternoon.

On Tuesday night, we bowed out of the Peter Bentley League Cup in a 5-1 defeat to Division One side Roffey, who seemed to score with virtually every foray forward.

We meanwhile hit the bar and put two or three other opportunities off target. With a little more composure, it could have been a very different game - even if Roffey's players seemed to take umbrage with that view on social media afterwards!

Following two heavy losses at the Beacon - the less said about Saturday's 5-0 reversal to Newhaven, the better - today represents an opportunity to get back on track.

That will not be easy though against a Common side who have surprised a lot of people so far by sitting third in the current Premier Division table.

There really is no respite either: after today, we play only our third away game of the campaign at Littlehampton Town in a week's time. The Golds sit second in the table.

We do not know who our next Common's officials and of course their opponents will be after that. What we do know though is it will be here at the Beacon on Saturday 25th September in the FA Vase against the winner of this afternoon's K Sports v Beckenham Town clash.

A fortnight break from home first team action is something that feels very alien following the jam-packed schedule the Beacon has been placed under since the season started six weeks ago.

This coming Thursday, the Under 23s host Roffey in a 7:45pm kick off. Admission is £3 adults with everyone else going free.

When the Premier Division fixtures came out, Little Common looked like one of the easier games in a horrendously difficult start for Hassocks. We say looked, because how wrong can you be?

Instead, it now appears one of the toughest to date—despite the face that we have already faced the likes of Saltdean United, Eastbourne Town, Newhaven and AFC Uckfield Town.

Common have been the Premier Division's surprise package so far, sitting in third place with 16 points from a possible 24 after eight matches.

Their most eye catching result has to be a 4-0 win over early leaders Pagham on the opening day, whilst they have also taken a point from much-fancied Eastbourne Town.

This is Common's fourth season as a Premier Division club and they already feel like part of the furniture in the top flight, even if only one of those campaigns has been completed.

They finished in 16th place in that 2018-19 season. In the two seasons which have suffered curtailment, Common have been a long way clear of relegation which points to progress being made yearon-year by Russell Eldridge at his players. What is most impressive is that this progress is being achieved with largely the same players who won the Division One title for Common back in 2018.

Amongst their biggest dangers are Sam Cruttwell and Lewis Hole, two forwards who know where the goal is.

Hassocks fans with memories long enough to remember our last meeting with Common back in February 2019 will recall that Hole was on target that afternoon at the Beacon in a game which finished as a 1-1 draw.

That ensured that we did not manage to beat Common in the 2018-19 season, the year in which our only Premier Division meetings to date have taken place.

In total, there have been 15 matches between the sides over the past 35 years with the vast majority of those taking place in Division One during the late 1980s and early 1990s.

There is nothing to separate us historically, both clubs having won five games apiece with five draws.

Hassocks 1-1 Little Common

Benson levels late against Little Common for much-changed Robins

On the face of it, a 1-1 home draw with lowly Little Common looks like a disappointing result for Hassocks.

But given the lengthy absentee list faced by Mark Dalgleish, the Robins will probably be happy with the point that Liam Benson's late leveller salvaged for the them at the Beacon.

Four of the stars from last week's stunning 1-0 success away at title chasing Newhaven were missing for the visit of relegation-threatened Common.

Phil Johnson and Harry Mills were unavailable while Spencer Slaughter and George Brown both had to sit this one out through suspension.

Last season, so many highprofile absentees would have been an almost unrecoverable blow for Hassocks, but it says much for the work that Dalgleish has done on the transfer front over the past year that he was still able to name a squad packed with quality - which included two new signings.

They were both familiar faces to the Beacon faithful, Lewis Westlake appearing as a substitute following his return to the club from Loxwood while Jack Rowe-Hurst's start made Hassocks the fourth different Premier Division side that the young attacker has played for this season.

Rowe-Hurst in particular is a quality addition and he was well in the running for the man-of-the-match accolade with a performance that reminded home supporters of the talents they were treated to during his previous spell with the club, when he scored twice in 15 appearances in the second half of the 2016-17 season

It was Common who made the brighter start, perhaps as a result of the changes which had swept through the Hassocks line up, and

Harvey Blake had to make a crucial block inside of two minutes from Jamie Crone.

Unfortunately, Blake injured himself in doing so and had to be withdrawn, effectively making it five changes from the win at the Trafalgar Ground, with Jordan Badger taking Blake's place.

Common's opener arrived just prior to the 15 minute mark and it came from a corner with plenty of questions to be asked about Hassocks' marking.

Wes Tate swung the ball over to Lewis Parsons whose header back across goal was nodded in by Lewis Hole from close range.

One nearly became two when Tate's pass split the home defence but Crone could only hit the side netting from a tight angle after Green Starman: Liam Benson, a constant did well to force him wide.

Visiting goalkeeper Matt Cruttwell was called into action for the first time when palming away a Rowe-Hurst shot that looked destined for the top corner.

Common fashioned two more opportunities just before the break, Sam Ellis firing over and Tate seeing a header blocked on the line by Will Broomfield.

Common suffered an injury blow of their own at the interval as the

impressive Crone was forced off with Adam Smith entering the action.

Smith's first task was to watch Hassocks nearly equalise, Benson only being denied by a brilliant point blank save from Cruttwell before an equally impressive block on the line kept out the follow up.

That set the tone for the second half and it was all the hosts from that point on as a succession of dangerous corners followed.

One of those ended up in the back of the net via a flicked header but was controversially ruled to be offside.

If Hassocks were miffed by that decision then they were incensed shortly after when Liam Ward appeared to virtually catch a goal bound effort in the six yard box but no penalty award was forthcoming.

What was coming though was the equaliser and it duly arrived with 10 minutes remaining.

Common were caught out by a quickly taken corner which fell to Benson who scrambled home at the near post.

Hassocks crash out to Common in 10 goal RUR Cup thriller

Ten goals, one red card and the third round of a competition they a penalty shoot out were packed into an extraordinary couple of hours at the Beacon as **Hassocks exited the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup** to Little Common.

This was the first meeting between those two sides since the 1994-95 season and it managed to pack 18 seasons worth of entertainment into 120 breath taking minutes.

By that point, still nothing could separate the sides with the scores locked at 5-5.

Common then proved to be superior from 12 yards, scoring all four of their required penalties to become the latest in a growing list of Division Two sides to have eliminated Hassocks from knockout competitions over the last five or so seasons.

Mickey Jewell made one change to the side that had lost 2-0 away at Deal Town in the FA Vase three days previously.

Top scorer Phil Gault was available after missing the trip to Kent and he returned at the expense of Louis Pople who dropped down to the bench.

It was Gault's strike partner Dan Smith who opened the scoring as early as the seventh minute after a totally dominant start to proceedings.

At that stage, Hassocks could've been forgiven for thinking a place in reached the semi-finals of last season nature of the tie, Common equalised was a formality.

Common aren't considered dark horses for a first ever promotion to the County League's top flight for no reason however and they equalised on 22 minutes through Jared Lusted.

That seemed to shock Hassocks and their game went alarmingly to pieces as Common began to assert themselves.

Common missed a whole host of chances before eventually taking the lead on 38 minutes in controversial circumstances.

Their captain Jerome Smith became the latest victim of the Jack and Jill Sniper as he went down under minimal contact in the box but the referee bought it, pointing to the spot and allowing Chris Cummings-Bart to convert the resulting penalty.

Going behind had a galvanising effect on Hassocks and within 30 seconds of the restart, they'd levelled things up as the Common goalkeeper spilled a James Westlake corner with Kieran O'Callaghan gleefully pouncing on the lose ball to fire home his third goal of the season.

The Robins retook the lead with the second half seven minutes old. Another Westlake delivery, this time a free kick, caused more panic in the Common box and although Hassocks captain Stuart Faith was on the scene and making a nuisance of himself, it will probably have to go down as an own goal.

bookable offences after that but Common couldn't make their man advantage count in what remained of normal time, the tie finishing 3-3 to necessitate an additional 30 minutes.

Within eight minutes of those extras, Common had gone 5-3 ahead as the talented Cummings-Bart completed his hat-trick and Hassocks looked dead and buried.

Jewell's answer was to breathe live back into his team with a double change as Elliott Butler and Louis Pople replaced wingers Westlake and Jamie Weston and it was Pople who scored a guick fire brace with two virtually identical goals to bring the scores level at 5-5.

That sent the game to penalties, where Smith missed Hassocks' first spot kick and Pople their last as Common triumphed 4-3 in the shootout.

Robins swoop to bring back Badger and Harris

Hassocks head coach Brad Sweetman has added some experience to his young squad by bringing two familiar faces back to the Beacon.

Former club captain Jordan Badger has returned after a couple of years away from football due to work commitments and he is joined by goalkeeper Alex Harris who starts his fifth spell with the club.

Badger originally arrived at the Robins from Lewes in the opening weeks of the 2016-17 season.

He soon established himself as a commanding presence at centre back with the ability to get Hassocks quickly on the front foot via raking passes both cross field and down the pitch.

Badger took over as captain when Ashley Marsh retired in 2017 and held the role until he himself took a step back from the game at the end of the 2018-19 season after 110

appearances and an impressive haul for a centre back of seven goals.

He wasted no time in reminding the Hassocks faithful of the aerial threat he can pose for opposition defences, causing carnage in the AFC Uckfield Town box to snatch a late equaliser on his second Robins debut.

Harris has been brought in to strengthen the goalkeeper department due to Charlie Pugh's availability remaining sporadic for the foreseeable future.

It was the 2013-14 season when Harris first arrived at the Beacon as a 16-year-old dual signed from Woking to gain experience of senior football.

He succeeded Jack Simpson as Hassocks number one when Simpson went travelling midway through the campaign, going onto make 16 appearances.

Harris subsequently returned to the Beacon from Metropolitan Police with the Robins in a relegation battle in the autumn of 2015.

His form over the second half of

the season was a major reason why Hassocks managed to pull clear of the drop zone, including when keeping four clean sheets in a club-record run of eight consecutive wins in senior football.

Harris moved to Burgess Hill Town midway through 2016-17, returning for subsequent spells with the Robins at the start of the 2017-18 and 2018-19 campaigns.

Over the course of those, he has racked up 60 Hassocks appearances and also turned out for AFC Uckfield Town, Broadbridge Heath and Alfold amongst others.

Bradley Bant meanwhile has departed the Beacon for Premier Division newcomers AFC Varndeanians, where he will team up with former Robins Jamie Hillwood and Luke Akehurst.

Bant captained Hassocks last season after re-joining the club from Peacehaven & Telscombe. He departs having made 150 appearances over two spells, scoring 12 times.



Swindon Town stag wows Robins in Sussex

Last weekend's game against Newhaven may not have gone to plan on the pitch, but there was at least plenty of entertainment provided off it thanks to a Swindon Town supporters' stag party...

Hassocks welcomed a very different crowd to their Southern Combination League Premier Division home game against Newhaven as a stag party from the West Country decided to spend their afternoon at the Beacon.

As a long-suffering Swindon Town supporter, groom-to-be Steve Underwood had long dreamed of walking out at the County Ground alongside all his heroes who have played for the Robins.

Beggars cannot be choosers though and so rather than it being the League Two Robins, his friends instead arranged for Steve to be a mascot with the Sussex-based Robins some 117 miles away from Swindon and five divisions lower down the pyramid.

Steve donned a replica Hassocks

kit for the day and wore a Robin mask as he led the teams out, finally fulfilling that lifelong ambition of being a mascot.

The best was saved for half time however, when Steve appeared on the pitch to dance to Swindon anthem Rockin' Robin, much to the delight of his friends and the rest of the Beacon faithful. One Hassocks fan went so far as to describe it as "breath taking."

There was very little else to cheer for Robins supporters on the day as their side were well beaten 5-0 by Newhaven, four of the goals coming in a 14 minute blitz at the start of the second half.

As a former goalkeeper himself, Steve could no doubt sympathise with Hassocks number one Alex Harris with the frequency with which Harris had to pick the ball out of the back of

the net.

Steve was then able to compare notes with Newhaven netminder Jake Buss at full time as the visitors' goalkeeper posed for photos with the stag party to celebrate his clean sheet.

To complete a memorable day, Steve ended up being a landslide winner of the Hassocks supporters' man-of-the-match poll on Twitter afterwards for his smooth moves displayed during the interval.

Steve marries fiancee Claire Sheridan in Ireland on Friday, 24 September.

He will no doubt hope to convince Claire to fly back to England the next day so the two can start wedded life by watching Hassocks host either K Sports or Beckenham Town in the second qualifying round of the FA Vase.

Ruthless Roffey give Robins a lesson in clinical finishing

Goals win games and that saying has never run truer than in this chastening Peter Bentley League Cup second round exit which Hassocks suffered at the hands of Roffey.

It may seem like an obvious thing to state when the final score was 5-1 to Roffey. This was a match that could easily have finished 5-5 though if the Robins had been able to take their chances.

Unfortunately, they could not and several big opportunities went begging.

Compare that to their Division One visitors who found the back of the net with all five of their shots on target, adding their name in the process to the ever growing list of lower league outfits to have knocked Hassocks out of cup competitions over the past 15 years or so.

That nobody in attendance at the Beacon really considered this a shock tells you everything about where these two clubs are right now.

Hassocks' young side are struggling for consistency and sit third bottom of the Premier Division.

On their day, the Robins play some good football and can compete with most opponents in their league. The problem is that those days are too rare at the moment.

Roffey meanwhile arrived in Mid Sussex having won seven out of seven. It would be a real surprise if this season does not end in a first ever promotion to the Premier Division.

The appointment of former Broadbridge Heath boss Steve Painter as general manager has seen them attract a squad containing a fair amount of top flight experience and plenty of goals.

Roffey had to weather an early Hassocks storm before they could show their ruthlessness as the Robins passed up not one, not two, but three glorious opportunities to take the lead the opening 30 minutes.

Jordan Badger was the first to go close - closer than anyone else in fact - when his towering header from a perfect Alfie Loversidge corner smashed against the cross bar with Roffey goalkeeper Alfie Hadfield rooted to the spot with nine minutes on the clock.

Badger was one of the Hassocks bright spots on what was his first start for over two years since taking a break from football.

His next contribution came with 22 minutes played when he intercepted a Roffey clearance just inside the visitor's half, striding forward with purpose before unleashing a lot show from 30 yards which whistled inches wide of the post.

Hassocks felt that Hadfield had got the feintest of touches to turn it behind. If he did, then it was an outstanding piece of shot stopping missed by both linesman and referee, who instead ruled for a goal kick.

Three minutes after that and Loversidge produced a remarkable leap to win a header from a free kick against Roffey's tallest defender, Brendan Millborrow.

The second ball dropped perfectly to Joe Bull, completely free in the middle of the box who only needed to guide his own header either side of Hadfield. Whilst Bull avoided Hadfield, he unfortunately guided it the wrong side of the post as well.

Those squandered chances were punished when Roffey took the lead with their first meaningful foray forward with half an hour played.

Joao Tiago Andrade showed some trickery on the edge of the box to lay off to Josh Meyer, whose shot deflected up and over Hassocks' debutant goalkeeper Jacob Campbell off Luke Marshall as he put in a despairing tackle.

Roffey mustered their second attack on 37 minutes and this too resulted in a goal.

A passing move instigated by the



impressive Dan Pearse cut through the Robins like the proverbial knife slicing warm butter, finished off by Kelvin Lucas.

There was an interesting interpretation of the offside law for the third which arrived eight minutes into the second half.

Lucas had been in an offside position when Badger headed clear a long ball over the top, which the Roffey man then collected, advanced with and beat Campbell with a clinical effort.

In the face of Hassocks appeals, the linesman said that Lucas had not been interfering with play. Answers on a postcard as to how scoring a goal is deemed not interfering with play, please.

Super sub Stokes saves Hassocks with a late double

Perhaps Hassocks should request their evening games kick off at 9pm from now on?

For the second Tuesday in succession, the Robins launched a dazzling second half comeback to take something from a game in which they came in at half time trailing 2-0 after a disjointed first half showing.

Pattenden's opener for EP had arrived after just three minutes, the wing back dancing past three Hassocks defenders before whipping a left footed effort past Josh Green and into the top corner.

The hosts had a plethora of chances to extend their lead after that. Ryan Quirke fired wastefully over, Dan Huet saw an effort well blocked by Broomfield and Jack Barnes shot wide.

EP's second goal eventually arrived with 10 minutes of the half remaining.

Quirke delivered a free kick to the far post where Lyne had far too much time and space to bring the ball down and fire a left footed volley in via the upright.

Hassocks made their shape change at the break and there were a couple of personnel changes early on in the second half as well as Jordan Badger replaced Dan Jacques and young Joe Bull came on for Alex Spinks before Stokes' pivotal entrance to the game.

As a result of Broomfield's injury, Spencer Slaughter dropped back into defence and he began pushing his side higher up the pitch than they'd previously dared to go.

That, coupled with the tireless work rate of the Robins attacking players, began causing EP a world of problems and Hassocks spent most of the second half camped in the opposition half.

Despite their territorial and

possession dominance, it took until the 80th minute for Hassocks to pull one back.

A succession of big tackles from the Robins saw the ball fall to Stokes some 25 yards out and he hit a dipping distance effort which left EP goalkeeper James Fernandes grasping at thin air.

That sparked a manic last 10 minutes. Slaughter plucked a ball out of the air with the grace of a gazelle before hitting a 40 yard diagonal ball over the top for Littlejohn to chase.

Littlejohn latched onto it and knocked it past Fernandes who then pole axed the Hassocks striker to concede a penalty and earn a straight red card.

EP sacrificed Quirke for substitute goalkeeper Leesun Donaldson and his first touch of the game saw him save Benson's spot kick, much to the delight of the home crowd who must have thought it was going to be their day at that point.

Stokes had other ideas though and he equalised with just one minute of the 90 remaining, producing a deft touch to escape the attentions of Nathan Da Costa and then hitting a peach of a shot back across goal that went in off the post.

Player coach Slaughter said afterwards: "It's four wins and a draw from our last seven games now and it could easily have been more."

"If we take the halves we are having here and there and turn it into a full game then we're going to be very difficult to play against."

Littlehampton Town this season?

Do not rub your eyes, we really do have an away game - only our third of the season. It is a very difficult one too against a Littlehampton side who are making quite the impression after being promoted for 2021-22. The Golds had been totally dominant of Division One in the two curtailed campaigns and their elevation was richly deserved. In their first Premier Division campaign since 2017-18, they have won five and drawn one so far.

Our record against Littlehampton Town?

There have been 33 meetings with Littlehampton in the past and it is the Golds who dominate the head-tohead with 17 wins to Hassocks' 13. Littlehamptin have racked up their fair share of goals in the fixture, scoring 59 - a figure hugely helped by the 17 they notched in four matches across their 2014-15 Southern Combination title winning season and the following campaign.

Last time we met?

Littlehampton were rock bottom of the Premier Division and we were stuck in the relegation zone ourselves when we went to the Sportsfield in February 2018. It was a six pointer then and we duly got the job done, a 2-0 victory ending a club-record run of 14 matches without a win. Jack Wilkins and Jake Lindsey got the goals.

How to get to the Flora Sportsfield?

Take the A27 to Worthing before joining the A259 through Goring, East Preston and Angmering. When you reach the roundabout featuring a Burger King and Travelodge, take the second exit onto the B2187 Horsham Road into Littlehampton. When the road bears around to the right, take the left hand turn onto St Flora's Road with the ground being located towards the bottom of the road on the left hand side.

Those victories came against an AFC Uckfield Town outfit who we drew with back in August and newly promoted Bexhill United. After the tricky run of fixtures which we started the campaign with, the visit of United has the look of a six pointer about it already.

Our record against Eastbourne United?

The Robins dominate the head-tohead with 18 wins to United's 12 and 12 draws in our 41 meetings. That record is helped hugely by the fact that we seem to love visiting the Oval for some reason. Fan favourite Jack Troak previously played for United before moving to the Beacon in the summer of 2019. Others to have represented both clubs are few and far between with Zak Dove - who enjoyed a brief spell with us at the Beacon in 2014 - about it. He is now manager at Eastbourne Town Ladies.

Take the third right after that onto Birkdale and follow the road before turning right into Westcourt Drive, Pass over the railway line, then take another right onto Cooden Drive and the third right after that will take you onto Brockley Road where you will find the ground.


