Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon for a very tough looking Buildbase FA Vase clash against Combined Counties Premier South side Beckenham Town

This is our first ever meeting with Becks and we hope that their players, management, officials and supporters enjoy their stay with us today in Mid Sussex.

Those of you who have studied the Combined Counties table will know what a task faces us today, with Beckenham currently sitting pretty in first spot of a league routinely considered to be stronger than the Southern Combination.

We will at least come into the game having taken a little confidence from a 4-2 defeat against our own Premier Division leaders, Littlehampton Town last weekend.

Most of the Golds' victories so far this season have been achieved at a canter, so to have pushed them so close was a decent achievement for Brad and the players - especially as going 2-0 down inside of 13 minutes could have caused the floodgates to open.

Some dogged defending and a willingness to battle got us back into the tie at 2-2. Those qualities will no doubt be needed today if we are to have any hope of progressing to the first round of the competition.

A week prior to that trip to the Sportsfield and we were beaten 3-0 here by Little Common, who themselves arrived at the Beacon top of the Premier League.

Whilst there are no easy games in the division this season, we have endured a particularly hard time of it fixture-wise in recent weeks.

On paper, October looks like it is going to be a bit more friendly so fingers crossed we can start picking up some points and climbing the table.

The Under 23s are having no such troubles and they remain unbeaten with four wins from five matches so far, most recently a 1-0 win over Roffey last Thursday.

Sean McSwiney scored the only goal of the game, his first for the club. Defensively, the side have now kept clean sheets in their past three consecutive matches - and that is despite Brad having to don the gloves himself in the first of those!

The Under 18s meanwhile have picked up four points from their past two games. The two remaining 100 percent records in the Central Division were on the line at the Shooting Field two weeks ago, where

a 2-1 win over Steyning Town sent our Young Robins top of the table.

Last Sunday, they were involved in an astonishing 5-5 draw with Burgess Hill Town. Too much happened to list here, so you will just have to wait for the match report in Tuesday night's programme.

They return to action tomorrow morning away at AFC Varndeanians. Kick off is at 11am at Withdean Stadium for anyone who fancies the short hop down the A23 to support.

Last but by no means least, we fielded a Veterans side for the first time since the 2017-18 season away at South Godstone on Sunday afternoon.

It went rather well, a 7-1 victory with two goals apiece from Steve Spies, Pat Harding and Dave Juniper and one from Elliott Butler.

Again, you can read all about it on Tuesday night when we host Eastbourne United - kick off at 7:45pm. See you back here for that.

Beckenham Town are one of the oldest non-league clubs still in existence and their 125th anniversary celebrations next year could be made doubly exciting by what is happening on the pitch so far this season...

Becks were victims of a sideways move by the FA in the summer, shifting from their long-term home of the South East Counties League into the Combined Counties Premier Division South.

Things are working out pretty well so far in their new home. Jason Huntley's side are top of the table with seven wins and one draw from their eight games to date.

For an idea of how that stacks up compared to the Southern Combination League, Horley Town are currently fourth, some six points behind Beckenham following their own sideways move from this parish to the Combined Counites.

Horley were Saltdean United's closest pursuers before last season was curtailed, so for them to be that far behind Beckenham already is a sign of the quality that Huntley has assembled in his squad.

If promotion to step four does end up arriving in seven months time, then it will be more than deserved for Becks' efforts over the past two null and void seasons.

In 2019-20, they were top of the South East Counties Premier. A

fascinating four-way battle for the two promotion spots was taking place and the likelihood is that Beckenham would have filled one of those places.

They took a while to get going last season, perhaps as a result of the disappointment of being denied a place at the higher level by the controversial decision to simply write the previous campaign off.

Becks were however beginning to find some form when the December lockdown arrived, bringing another campaign to an early conclusion. They had been fifth when 2020-21 was abandoned.

Clearly, the aim for Beckenham is to become a step four club. To that end, Huntley retained the bulk of the players who have performed so admirably over the past two seasons, as well as adding some quality to the ranks over the summer.

Returning goalkeeper Nick Blue, new skipper and former Billericay favourite Danny Waldren and ex Ashford United midfielder Tom O'Connor all arrived at Eden Park Avenue, tasked with bringing Isthmian League football.

#### **Beckenham Town - Links with Sussex**



Although there are no ties between Hassocks and Becks, Beckenham do have a strong link with Sussex football through a promotion winning Brighton & Hove Albion manager.

One of their most famous former players is Pat Saward, who began his career at Beckenham before going onto play for Millwall, Aston Villa and represent the Republic of Ireland

An iconic Becks legend, Saward moved to the Den before going onto join Aston Villa.

Cool, confident and a good ball player he was an attacking left half who helped to restore some of the former glory of Villa – with whom he won an FA Cup winners medal when they beat the legendary 'Busby Babes' of Manchester United in the 1957 Final at Wembley.

Capped 18 times by the Republic of Ireland he also captained them and represented them in the qualifying stages of the 1954 World Cup finals.

Once his playing days were over, Saward was appointed as Brighton manager in July 1970 and led the Seagulls to a surprise promotion to the second tier at the end of the 1971-72 season.

The Seagulls stay in the old

Division Two was a brief one and they were relegated after one season.

Saward was not given much on an opportunity to lead the club back to the second tier - he was controversially sacked in October 1973, although the anger of Brighton supporters soon dissipated when his replacement was announced.

Chairman Mike Bamber pulled off one of the biggest coups in English football by convincing Brian Clough to take over a struggling Division Three side after leaving Derby County, who he had led to the Division One title.



### Hassocks in the FA Vase

The FA Vase has never been the most fruitful of competitions for Hassocks as we are yet to progress past the second round stage since first entering in the 1995-96 season. We take a look at the Robins' record over the past 25 years....

#### **Five games from Wembley**

The closest we have ever got to reaching Wembley in the FA Vase is the second round proper of the competition, a stage that the Robins have reached on four previous occasions.

The most recent of those came in the 2014-15 season and it was an evening to forget for Dave John's young side as we were hammered 7-0 by Ashford United – our heaviest defeat in the competition so far.

Before the 2-0 win over Meridian Valley Park in 2019-20, that was the season in which the Robins most recently won a game in the Vase when triumphing 3-1 at home against Cortinthian thanks to two goals in the final five minutes from Phil Johnson and Nathan Miles.

Hassocks' other games in the second round stage were less

chastening than that Ashford experience; 1-0 defeats away at Lymington Spa and Kingsbury Town in 2007-08 and 2005-06 respectively and a 2-1 loss at Banstead Athletic in 1998-99.

That Banstead defeat was preceded by probably our best ever set of results in the competition.

We weren't drawn at home in a single round but picked up brilliant wins on the road in tough away games at Knitbury Rangers (3-2) and then a stunning 3-0 win away at Ware.

#### Stung by the Hornets

The Vase seemed to love throwing up games with Horsham in the early 90s and Hassocks and the Hornets faced off three times in the competition between 1995 and 2000.

The first of those came in the first 2011-12 season.

season that the Robins entered, Horsham winning a topsy-turvy game 6-3 at Queen Street in the first round in 1995-96.

Ramsgate had become the first side we had defeated in a national cup competition in the previous round following a 2-1 away win.

We were then eliminated by the Hornets again in 2000-01 thanks to a 2-1 replay defeat at Queens Street after we had done fantastically well to hold our higher division visitors to a 2-2 draw here at the Beacon.

The fact that game went to a replay was a rarity in itself, as only one other time in over 20 years of entering the competition have Hassocks needed an additional 90 minutes to decide a game.

That came in the first qualifying round game Farnham Town in the 2011-12 season.

Both of those matches ended in 1-1 draws with Town eventually triumphing 8-7 on penalties on a horrible Tuesday night in Surrey.

Phil Gault scored the Hassocks goals in both games and it was the unfortunate James Westlake who missed the decisive spot kick in a crazy shootout.

#### No Deal at Deal

There have been five other exits at the first round stage, the most disappointing of which came at Deal Town in 2012-13.

We had finished the previous season in fourth place in the Sussex County League - our highest ever finish - and had arguably the best squad in the clubs history.

turn up on the day, going down 2-0 to a set of gloating hosts.

The only positive from the experience came with meeting the 'Deal Duck', Town's mascot that was basically a bloke dressed in a Donald Duck outfit.

Spencer Slaughter in particular was delighted to meet him, demanding a picture after the game in what was otherwise a pretty poor afternoon on the road.

Our other first round exits have come at the hands of Chessington & Hook United 3-0 in 2013-14, Witney United in 2004-05 - just before a certain David Cameron became the local MP - fellow Sussex side Sidley United 3-1 in 2001-02 and away at Herne Bay in the 1996-97 season.

#### **Sussex sides send the Robins** crashing

Of the Robins seven other second qualifying round exits, four of them have come at the hands of clubs from the Southern Combination League.

Littlehampton Town accounted for the Robins exit from the competition in 1997, Arundel in 2003 and Eastbourne Town in 2006.

That Eastbourne Town defeat was particularly harsh on as we took the eventual Premier Division champions all the way to extra time before succumbing 3-1.

Two of the other three exits were all by a single goal - 3-2 away at BAT Sports in the 1999-00 season and at home to Chertsey Town 3-2 AET in 2008-09.

There was also a disappointing

2-0 defeat away at Molesey in the 2009-10 campaign and a 3-0 home loss to Spelthorne Sports in 2017-18.

#### Out at the earliest

Given that we had rarely finished in the bottom of the Southern Combination League Premier Division up until six or so years ago, it has not the face. been often that we have entered and then promptly exited - the FA Vase at the first qualifying round stage.

It happened last season when Peacehaven & Telscombe won 3-0 at the Beacon. To rub salt into the wounds, former Hassocks defender Harry Mills kept a clean sheet whilst playing in goal for the Tye.

2018-19 saw a 2-0 home defeat Mickey Jewell's side simply did not to K Sports and in 2016-17 there was a 4-2 loss at Horley Town.

Our other exits at the first qualifying round stage came in 2010-11, 3-2 away at Blackfield & Langley in a game that is probably best remembered for a young Andy Whittingham receiving a quite sensational red card for attempting to kung fu kick an opposition player in

There was also a 3-2 defeat at big spending Moneyfields in 2003-04.

Hassocks have won two games at the first qualifying round of the competition previously, including one of their most entertaining outings in the Vase, a 4-3 win over Three Bridges in 2008-09 in which Jack Simpson made his Hassocks debut.

The other victory came by three goals to one the following season at home to Sevenoaks Town.



# Frow or Villa for Robins in return of RUR Cup

The draws for the Sussex County FA Cup competitions have taken place, with the first team, the Under 23s, the Under 18s and the Veterans finding out who their opponents will be on the first step towards a Culver Road final...

Hassocks will face brand new opponents in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup with one of Division One newcomers Forest Row or Montpelier Villa visiting the Beacon in the second round of the competition.

Both clubs are embarking on their first ever seasons in senior football, Villa having been elevated from Division Two and Frow after being bumped up from the Mid Sussex Premier Division.

They are both making a good stab at life at the highest level they have ever played at too.

Villa sit seventh in the table with four wins, two draws and four defeats from 10 matches. Forest Row

meanwhile are 10th having won four and lost five of their fixtures.

No date has yet been set for the second round tie, but the Robins will know their opponents by October 20th as that is the date Villa and Frow must have completed their first found match by.

The Under 23s also have a home tie in the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup, hosting Saltdean United of the East Division at the Beacon.

Just like with the first team, it again offers a clash with opponents who Hassocks have never faced at Under 23 level before.

The Tigers are eighth out of 10 in the East Division. Their record reads one win, one draw and three defeats from five games.

They will make the trip to Mid Sussex on Thursday 8th October with a 7:45pm kick off. The normal admission prices of £3 adults, £1 concessions and free for under 16s will apply.

It is the Under 18s who have the toughest draw of the lot having been given a trip to Eastbourne Borough on Sunday 10th October in the Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup

Hassocks can at least take solace from the fact that upsets do happen; the last time a Robins youth team faced Borough was when the treble winners of 2017-18 pulled of a shock 2-1 win at Priory Lane in the first round of the competition via a Jake Lindsey brace.

The Veterans will kick off their first Sussex Veterans Challenge Cup campaign for four years with a trip to Sussex Sunday Veterans League outfit Woodingdean Wanderers on Sunday 24th October.

### McLean at the double as clinical **Common latest to hurt Hassocks**

**Southern Combination League Premier Division** Saturday 11th September 2021, The Beacon **Hassocks 0-3 Little Common** 

Hassocks were unable to surprise the surprise package of the Southern **Combination Premier** Division season so far as high flying Little Common left the Beacon with a routine 3-0 victory.

When the fixtures came out back in July, the Robins would have marked Little Common at home as one of their more realistic opportunities to get points on the board in a tough opening 10 games which included the likes of Saltdean United, Eastbourne Town, Newhaven and Peacehaven & Telscombe.

How wrong could you be? Common arrived in Mid Sussex above all those clubs in the table, sitting pretty in third place and as one of only two sides to have beaten early leaders Pagham. Not just beaten, but hammered 4-0 on the Lions' own Nyetimber Lane ground.

Whereas Common are flying, Hassocks are struggling. The Robins' previous two games had seen five goals fly into their net in the space of 72 hours with only one in reply - and that was a gift of a penalty from Division One outfit Roffey in the final minutes of a chastening 5-1 Peter Bentley League Cup second round exit.

Hassocks created chances on Tuesday night, they just struggled to take them. It was a similar story against Common, Joe Bull missing an early opportunity which, had it hit the back of Matt Cruttwell's net, might have led to a different game than the one that the Beacon faithful were treated to.

Bull has been a lively presence leading the line in the past three games. He works hard, is an intelligent footballer and makes things happen.

All that is missing form his game is a goal; Hassocks will be hoping

that it is one of those where once he gets the monkey of a first of the season off his back, he will hit a run of scoring form.

Hassocks' cause against Common was not helped by the absence of Josh Short, arguably their star performer of the campaign so far.

Short's spot in midfield was taken by Jack Baden, one of five changes from the Roffey defeat.

Alex Harris returned in goal in place of Jacob Campbell, George Mitchell-Phillips was promoted to the starting XI after scoring the penalty on Tuesday night to partner Bull in attack and Bradley Tighe and Wes Tighe took over in defence from Jordan Badger and Jack Gardner.

This was the first time that the Tighes had lined up together in senior football.

The touching message posted by older brother Brad on social media afterwards saying their grandad would have been proud served as a reminder that whilst results may not be going Hassocks' way currently, they remain a family club.

Common rattled the post prior to Bull's early chance after Jack McLean teed up Lewis Hole, his first time effort cannoning back into the grateful arms of Harris.

The deadlock was broken with 33 minutes played. Common sliced their way through Hassocks with a pleasing passing move.

Harris managed to keep out McLean's right footed effort, but the loose ball went straight to Matt MacLean who headed home.

Hassocks had been completely undone when Newhaven came to the Beacon seven days earlier by conceding four goals in quick succession.

The Robins must have known that Dimelow; Mitchell-Phillips, Bull. if they were to have any chance of finding a way back into this one, they could not afford for one to quickly turn into two.

Sadly, that is exactly what





happened as within five minutes, Common doubled their advantage.

McLean was again the man on target with a goal vastly different to his first.

Whereas that one involved being in the right place at the right time, McLean showed his quality for his second of the afternoon by leading Wes Tighe on a merry dance before riffling an effort across Harris and in.

Common started the second half where they had left off the first and within three minutes of the restart, they had their killer third.

Another neat move led to Sammy Bunn producing a deft flick into the path of Hole who slotted past Harris.

With 42 minutes still to play, the home support could have been forgiven for fearing that another big defeat was on the cards.

Hassocks did at least dig in and prevent any more damage being done to the scoreboard. McLean and MacLean both went close and Common player-manager Russell Eldridge saw an effort from a corner heroically deflected behind by Bradley Tighe.

The closest that the Robins came was when a free kick was swung over and substitute Badger put a trademark towering header against the Common cross bar.

Things do not get any easier got Hassocks. They hit the road in a week's time to Littlehampton Town, one of only two teams above Common in the table and who have plundered 26 goals in seven matches. It could be a long afternoon at the Sports Field.

### Not what was expected as Hassocks give Golds a fright

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 18th September 2021, St Flora Sportsfield **Littlehampton Town 4-2 Hassocks** 

St Flora Sportsfield plays host to football and cricket and when the Premier Division's top scorers met one of its leakiest defences, those in an attendance might have been expecting a scoreline more in keeping with the summer game.

Instead, Hassocks put up a brave fight against a Littlehampton Town side who will surely be in title contention come the end of their first top flight campaign for four seasons after a spell in Division One.

It finished 4-2 to the hosts with the Robins gaining a fair amount of praise from the Golds' crowd, many of whom felt that Hassocks will be climbing the table before long if they can produce more performances like this.

As Robins fans can attest to, that is quite a big if. Relying on so many young players carries a risk of serious inconsistency as Hassocks have been living proof of so far.

A two-goal defeat and a right scare for an outstanding Littlehampton side came off the back of 13 goals conceded in three matches, including a 5-1 hammering at the hands of Division One Roffey in the Peter Bentley League Cup.

Prior to that, Hassocks had taken four points from two matches in 48 hours against Steyning Town and Lingfield, despite having to play for over an hour of both those encounters with only 10 men following first half red cards.

The showing at the Sportsfield was much more in keeping with those exploits over the August Bank Holiday Weekend.

Most pleasing for head coach Brad Sweetman would have been the fact that when Littlehampton led 2-0 inside of 13 minutes, there was every chance that the feared cricket score

might have materialised.

Hassocks though showed the sort of resilience rarely seen so far this season.

Whereas in recent weeks they have crumbled in similar situations to ship an alarming number of goals in those heavy defeats, here they rallied to level the tie before running out of steam as Littlehampton's additional quality shone.

Sweetman sprung a surprise with his starting line up, handing Jordan Badger the number nine shirt in a piece of out-of-the-box thinking that paid dividends.

Badger has always been a threat from crosses into the box and he is a good player technically too, so using him as a presence in a more attacking role for a side who have struggled in front of goal made sense on paper.

It ended up working on the pitch too, Badger scoring the Robins' second of the afternoon to make it 2-2 after 62 minutes.

Neither Badger netting nor Hassocks being on level terms at that point in proceedings were in the pregame script.

What was expected was an early Littlehampton goal. It arrived within two minutes and came from George Gaskin, so frequently a thorn in Hassocks' side during the Golds' previous spell in the Premier Division.

One became two 11 minutes later, Dave Herbert doing the damage this time as the league leaders made things looked remarkably easy.

Most would have assumed that the game was up at the point. Littlehampton were probably thinking about how many they could add to the 28 goals plundered in only eight matches already this season.

Hassocks though were able to make it to half time without conceding again.

That provided a platform for the Robins to come out and stun





Littlehampton at the start of the second half and 17 minutes after the restart, they were back on level terms.

Like Badger, Jack Gardner was benefiting from a more advanced role than his usual right back berth and he took full advantage to notch his first senior goal for the club on 54 minutes.

The Sportsfield was then shocked into near silence eight minutes later when Badger scored Hassocks' second of the afternoon. Suddenly, we had a game on our hands.

If the Robins were to secure an unlikely point or three, then parity needed to remain for as long as possible.

Unfortunately, the scores were level for only six minutes. It was a stunning goal too, Premier Division top scorer Joe Benn firing a rocket which left Alex Harris no chance for a scarcely believable 18th goal of the season by the middle of September.

Hassocks kept plugging away but their goose was finally cooked when Mitchell Hand made it 4-2 with three minutes of normal time remaining, curling a beautiful free kick into the top corner.

Nonetheless, a fine effort from the Robins, who will have also been cheered by a first appearance of the season for Louis Pittock from the substitutes bench following a torrid year of injury problems.



#### Hibbert thunderbolt earns a share of the spoils

"The best one I have ever hit," is dealt with admirably by the Robins how Anthony Hibbert described his blockbuster 88th minute effort which secured a 1-1 draw for Hassocks against Three **Bridges - and few would argue** with that assessment.

Nathan Davis in particular is unlikely to win an Oscar for his acting ability anytime soon with Hasan Nyang and substitute Warren Whitley the other guilty parties when it came to trying to be the new Leonardo Di Caprio.

Faith, Marsh and Hibbert were all shown yellow cards for dissent as they pointed out to Mr Cox a little too vehemently that he was being led

down the garden path by unconvincing acting. Amos deservedly joined them in the book for a foul.

Hassocks' best chance of the second half came when Hibbert hit a low effort towards goal which seemed certain to nestle in the corner until Robinson extended a long leg to somehow keep it up.

The Bridges goalkeeper next fumbled a Faith shot but nobody in red was following up to take advantage.

Then came that late Bridges penalty. Davis took another somewhat questionabel tumble in the box under a Faith challenge and much to Hassocks' dismay, Mr Cox pointed to the spot.

Liam Ahearne sent Harding the wrong way and suddenly, Hassocks looked to be heading home with nothing to show for their efforts from a game they should have won.

Luckily for the Robins, Hibbert chose to score the best goal of his life three minutes later to give them what was ultimately another valuable point on the road.
