Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon as the visit of AFC Varndeanians kicks off another busy run of three consecutive home fixtures over the next week...

Although Varndeanians have been regular pre-season opponents over the past few seasons and used to compete against our old third team during their days in the Mid Sussex League, this will be the first meeting at senior level between the clubs.

We hope that their players, management, officials and supporters who have made the short hop over Clayton Hill from Withdean Stadium enjoy their stay with us today.

Things have picked up markedly over our past two matches, starting with the FA Vase visit of Beckenham Town a fortnight ago.

Becks were no slouches - you do not top the Combined Counties League if you are - and yet we gave them a real fright, succumbing to only a 2-1 defeat.

To push the leaders from a stronger division than our own so close felt a little like a potential turning point - although what we really needed was points on the board in the bread and butter of Premier Division football.

One of those duly arrived last weekend away at Bexhill United. The

commitment of players and supporters to undertake the longest trip of the season in the middle of a petrol crisis (which was very real, even if our esteemed Prime Minister tried to claim otherwise) was rewarded with an excellent 1-1 draw.

In grim conditions, we had to show the battling skills that Hassocks sides of yesteryear used to be famous for to hang on, particularly in the second half. Nobody watching though could have denied we were worthy of a point.

The challenge now is to build on that. Today's game against Varndeanians starts a run of three consecutive home fixtures, with Eastbourne United to come on Tuesday night and Horsham YMCA a week today.

Securing further points against sides around us in the table will hopefully push up the table after what has been a difficult start.

Helping that quest are a couple of old faces returning to the Beacon as Brad seeks to add experience to the squad.

Bradley Bant made his comeback in the Beckenham Town game after re-signing from today's opponents and Spencer Slaughter appearing on the bench at the Polegrove caused quite a stir.

It is great to have two players so popular for their previous endeavours with us back at the Beacon.

Aside from first team matters, the Ladies started their season with a 1-1 draw against Montpelier Villa two weeks ago.

The Under 18s meanwhile have picked up four points from their past two matches, beating AFC Varndeanians 3-2 two weeks ago and drawing 1-1 with St Francis Rangers last Sunday.

A certain Glenn Murray was in attendance for the Rangers game and it did not take long for Johnsy to try and tempt him out of retirement.

No word has yet reached us of Glenn's answer, although it is hard to see how he can say no to paying £2 a week for training and getting the chance to enter a raffle every home game, which is impossible to win as Dave will make him leave his prize behind for the next draw.

#### For the first time since 1962, AFC Varndeanians are a Southern Combination League Premier Division club and after a difficult start to the campaign, they will be hoping a change of manager means a change of fortune

It has been quite a whirlwind ride for Varndeanians, who have climbed three divisions in seven seasons having been a Mid Sussex Premier club as recently as 2015.

Ryan Gayler was the man who started the rise, leading the club to the Division Two title at the first time the Anvils have been in recently. of asking in 2015-16.

Not only that, but Gayler was also instrumental in helping them move from Brighton University to Withdean Stadium, providing the necessary ground grading for Vs to return to senior football having left for the Brighton League in 1972.

Varndeanians were elevated to the top flight for 2021-22 by the FA based on their performances in Division One over the past two curtailed seasons but it has not been an easy start to life.

Former Loxwood and Langney Wanderers manager Alex Walsh was unable to oversee a league win, resulting in the return of Gayler to Withdean last month.

Charged with maintaining the top flight status that he laid the foundations for achieving, Gayler has instigated improvement already.

His first match back at the helm resulted in a 2-2 draw against Crawley Down Gatwick. That was the first point of the season that Varndeanians had put on the board and a seriously impressive one at that given the free scoring form that

Varndeanians followed that up with a close-fought 3-2 defeat against Newhaven.

Those two results suggest they will be much more competitive over the remainder of the season, making it difficult to know what to expect this afternoon on what will be the first ever meeting at senior level before the clubs.

Varndeanians were regular opponents for our third XI back in the Mid Sussex League during the 2000s and they usually had the upper hand as perennial title challengers.

One notable exception came when we pulled off a shock by winning the Montgomery Cup on penalties against them in 2004 18year-old Ashley Marsh, a 16-year-old Sam Fisk and a 49-year-old Robbie Kitchen.

Since AFC Varndeanians joined the Southern Combination League in 2015, a number of players have turned out for both us and them - hardly a surprise given the close proximity of Withdean to the Beacon.

Luke Akehurst is the former Robin who has racked up the most appearances for Varndeanians, turning out for Vs for the past few seasons since leaving the Beacon midway through the 2017-18 season.

Over three spells with Hassocks, Akehurst played 96 games for the Robins across the back line, scoring once.

He was joined at Withdean last season by two ex-Robins, each with a under Mickey Jewell. century of matches for Hassocks to their names having come through our in 124 appearances before departing youth system.

Tom Barnes and Jamie Hillwood were both members of the Under 18s side who won the League Cup in 2008, defeating Arundel 3-2 in the final via a thrilling hat-trick from Phil Johnson.

Hillwood broke into the first team as an 18-year-old the following season during John Suter's short reign. Sporadic availability meant he was restricted to a handful of appearances until the 2013-14

campaign, when he became a regular

Hillwood went onto score 25 goals in the summer of 2020 for Withdean Stadium.

Barnes left the Beacon following that youth team triumph, spending several years with St Francis Rangers and Haywards Heath Town before returning to Hassocks in January 2015 and playing a crucial role in the Great Escape from relegation at the end of the 2014-15 season.

He departed in 2018 having made 103 appearances in total for the Robins.

# Happy Mondays as Robins make it three wins in a row

Monday Night Football returned to the Beacon where Hassocks IIIs ran out 2-1 winners over Old Varndeanians to make it three wins in a row as their climb into the top half of the Mid Sussex Premier Division continued.

A tough game looked in store as the visitors arrived having dished out hammerings to two of the title favourites in their last two outings, beating Wisdom Sports 6-0 and Maresfield Village 4-1.

Hassocks though were given a boost on the morning of the game when Phil Wickwar pulled out through illness.

That opened up a spot for Chris Maynard, who would be playing his first match since breaking his ankle during the first team's FA Cup exit away at Sholing back in September.

Manager Steve Spies could hardly contain his delight at this stroke of luck, describing Maynard for Wickwar as "a like for like replacement" prior to the game before bursting into laughter.

Hassocks started brightly with the power of Spies and the pace of Logan Newington alongside him in attack causing plenty of problems.

The midfield trio of Adam Williams, Ben Holden and Maynard were bossing the game with Maynard doing a good impression of Elliott Butler in terms of the ground he was covering.

Hassocks had the first real chance of the game when the enigmatic Russell Harris skipped past a defender down the right but his finish was lacking.

Spies then should have done better with a free header which appeared to slide off his bald head.

Old V's recent scoring record speaks for itself and yet the Hassocks back three of Steve Hudson, Jack Farrall and Sam Franks kept the

opposition quiet, coping admirably all evening with the threat.

The goal that Hassocks' start deserved arrived from a nice passing move. The ball flowed from defence into midfield before an Elliott Butleresque through ball from Maynard released Harris, whose cross picked out Williams to finish with aplomb.

Hassocks' lead was short-lived as Old V's were level within five minutes. Harris had a senior moment (fell over) to gift the visitors their only real chance of the first half, put away by left winger John Sewell.

Despite the setback, the Robins pressed on and should have had the game wrapped up by half time. Unfortunately, Spies and Newington contrived to miss every single opportunity which came their way.

One Beacon regular summed things up nicely when Newington was wasteful with his fourth good chance, shouting from the stand: "Don't worry Logan, Spiesy would have missed all these anyway."

Hassocks suffered a blow on 30 minutes when Maynard was replaced by Mark Darbyshire after taking a kick to the ankle.

It wasn't a bad injury to Maynard but after such a long layoff it was decided to get him off as precaution. He also looked like he could do with a rest. Not something you ever heard said about Elliott Butler.

The second half was nowhere near as good from a Hassocks point-of-view and the back three needed to do more work than they had in the opening 45 minutes, assisted by Ashley Hayes working hard at left lung back.

Newington missed another great chance when his delicate chip beat both goalkeeper and crossbar and a Williams corner flashed across the goal but nobody could add the touch it needed.

Youth teamer Will Baker was introduced for the injured Newington, slotting in on the right as Harris was

moved up front alongside Spies and told to make up for his earlier senior moment.

It was not long before he did. Some more neat approach play got the ball to Harris and he rounded the goalkeeper cool as you like to finish.

Hassocks introduced further fresh legs with another youth team player joining the action from the bench when Luke Pearce replaced the tiring Holden.

Both Pearce and Baker acquitted themselves well in what was a difficult game to come into.

It was a third youth teamer who made sure of the three points for Hassocks, goalkeeper Reece Wickwar making two excellent saves in the final 10 minutes.

Hudson and Franks could not decide whether they should be picking up ball or man and in the end did neither, allowing Old V's a clear run at goal.

Thankfully, Wickwar stayed big and somehow managed to keep the effort out.

The game became incredibly stretched going into the last five and with V's going all-out for a point, the visiting striker looked odds-on to score again until Wickwar pulled off another fantastic stop.

A great result and team performance from Hassocks, who make the short trip to Leylands Park this Saturday to face Lindfield.

# Down drawn in Senior Cup & date of rearranged United game confirmed

The draw for the first round of the Sussex Senior Cup took place last Saturday live on BBC Radio Sussex and it has resulted in the possibility of a number of familiar faces returning to the Beacon with their new club...

Hassocks have been drawn at home against Southern Combination League Premier Division rivals Crawley Down Gatwick in the first round of the Sussex Senior Cup.

That is good news for the neutral as games between Robins and Anvils tend to be ridiculously entertaining with goals never in short supply.

84 have been plundered in 21 previous meetings in senior football at an average of four a game, including 25 in the past five meetings.

Amongst the more ridiculous score lines of the past six years are 5-3 and 6-4 wins for Hassocks.

The last fixture between the two was dull in comparison, yielding only six goals as the Robins won 4-2 in Southern Combination Premier Division Supplementary Shield at the Haven back in April.

That gave Hassocks their 10th

victory over Down, who have seven wins to their name. There have been four draws.

This will be the first time that the clubs have met in the Senior Cup and the first time Crawley Down have visited the Beacon since October 2018 when they ran out 2-1 winners.

The pandemic put paid to their trips to Hassocks in the 2019-20 and 2020-21 campaigns, with both last season's Supplementary Shield clashes taking place at the Haven due to drainage work on the Beacon pitch.

Down will arrive with several familiar names amongst their squad. Harvey Blake and Phil Johnson moved to the Haven in the summer of 2021 and they were joined this year by Charlie Pitcher and Will Broomfield.

Nobody at Hassocks needs telling of the difficulties facing Johnson and Pitcher poses; both are in double figures for the season already, explaining why Down have scored the second-highest number of goals in the Premier Division after leaders Littlehampton Town.

The Robins exited last season's competition in a 3-0 defeat away at Midhurst & Easebourne.

Dave John left many of his first choice players at home for the fixture with the Division One Stags and paid the price.

No date has been set yet for Downs visit, although we expect it to be either Tuesday 19th October or Tuesday 26th. Please keep an eye on our website and social media for details.

One game that does have a confirmed date is the rearranged Premier Division clash with Eastbourne United.

The original tie was postponed by the league in response to the fuel crisis and will now take place this coming Tuesday 12th October.

Kick off is at 7:45pm and admission prices will be the usual £6 adults, £3 concessions and free for under 18s.



# **Bradley bags August Player of the Month**

Better late than never, the results are finally in for our August Player of the Month where one of the tightest votes in the seven seasons we have been running these awards was decided by just 2.2 percent...

It was one of the tightest Hassocks Player of the Month Awards in history, but in the end Connor Bradley did just about enough to win the vote for the Robins' best August performer ahead of Alfie Loversidge.

Just 2.2 percent separated the top two, enabling Bradley to win his first gong after establishing himself as a first team regular over the opening four weeks of the 2021-22 season.

The highlight for Bradley was undoubtedly his first senior goal for the club, a sweet volley in the 3-2 defeat against Peacehaven & Telscombe.

Bradley was voted Man of the Match for his efforts at the Sports

Park, one of five appearances that the midfielder made over the course of August. Four of those were starts and one came from the bench.

Teenage midfielder Loversidge enjoyed an excellent start to the campaign as an ever present in the Robins' engine room.

He scored three times, looking like the sort of genuine goal scoring midfielder that Hassocks have not possessed since the halcyon days of Spencer Slaughter and Anthony Hibbert.

The first of those goals came in the 2-1 FA Cup defeat to Spelthorne Sports. The other two helped secure two of Hassocks' five points won in August.

Loversidge netted the opener in the 2-2 draw with AFC Uckfield Town and the opener in August Bank Holiday Monday's 1-1 stalemate with Lingfield.

He also has a number of assists to his name, mainly from pinpoint crosses and set piece deliveries into the box.

All of this was enough to see Loversidge voted Man of the Match in three of Hassocks' eight August fixtures; the opening day loss at Saltdean United, the FA Cup exit against Spelthorne and the 2-0 win over Steyning Town.

Back in third was another midfielder in Josh Short. The former Burgess Hill Town man was impressive when signed early on in the curtailed 2020-21 season.

He has continued where he left off, featuring in all eight games like Loversidge and being one of the Robins' stand out performers, most notably when Man of the Match in the 2-1 defeat to Eastbourne Town.

# Robins in valiant Vase showing that nearly causes blushes for Becks

One week after giving

Town a fright, the FA Vase
presented Hassocks with
an even sterner
assignment against
Combined Counties
Premier Division leaders
Beckenham Town.

So, if that 4-2 defeat at the Flora Sportsfield seven days ago was seen as a creditable result, what then of this narrow 2-1 reversal against table toppers from a league undoubtedly stronger than Hassocks' own?

Based on their season so far, this was a good result for Hassocks. It was certainly one of their better performances and by the end, Beckenham were hanging on for their place in the first round proper of the competition.

That in itself would have come as a surprise to most at the Beacon. Becks arrived with seven wins and one draw from eight league matches so far as they look to mark their 125th anniversary next year with promotion to step four.

Even more daunting for Hassocks than the Combined Counties table was that their visitors booked their trip to Mid Sussex via a 5-0 victory away at Southern Counties East outfit K Sports in the first qualifying round - another league considered of a higher standard to the Southern Combination.

Hassocks could take heart from their efforts in a single goal defeat and having Becks seriously worried at various points.

This of course is not anything new. Hassocks have for weeks now been picking up praise for their performances against better sides.

What has got to happen soon is that these performances start

translating into results - otherwise a long, hard winter could be in store.

To help try and instigate a climb away from the bottom three, head coach Brad Sweetman has been busy on the transfer front and one returning face and one new face were both on show.

Last season's club captain Bradley Bant has been lured back to the Robins after a shot stay with AFC Varndenians.

Another player with V's connections made his Hassocks debut, goalkeeper Harvey Parker becoming the fifth different player to don the gloves for the Robins so far this season.

It was Parker's opposite number Mason Whitnell who was first called into action, setting the tone for an afternoon in which he pulled off several outrageous saves.

The first of those arrived on 15 minutes. A swift break down the left involving Josh Short, Andy Whittingham and Joe Bull led to Bull crossing into the box.

Alfie Loversidge had timed his run to perfection and his slamming volley from eight yards out looked perfect until Whitnell somehow reacted, stretching out a left hand and doing just enough to turn it over the bar.

Becks were suddenly aware that this might not be the cakewalk that it looked on paper. They duly responded by taking the lead on 30 minutes through stand in skipper Junior Kaffo.

Hassocks were caught out by a long ball over the top, leaving Kaffo in a footrace with Luke Marshall.

To be fair to Marshall, he did well to keep up with Kaffo initially, forcing the Becks midfielder wider than he would have liked.

Kaffo though eventually proved to have enough pace to accelerate into space before beating Parker with a difficult finish, lifting the ball over the new man between the Hassocks posts from a very tight angle.





Beckenham doubled their advantage on the hour mark. Substitute Dennis Doci played the ball into the feet of Tunde Aderonma, who turned sharply to hit a clinical snapshot past Parker.

Hassocks were not perturbed and whereas several weeks ago they might have folded like napkins, they instead hit back almost immediately.

Loversidge swung over the sort of pinpoint corner which is fast becoming his trademark and Bull ghosted in unmarked to power a downwards header in for his first goal of the season.

It was the least that Bull deserved after a hardworking set of performances.

Hassocks will be hoping it will spark a run of scoring form from the man charged with leading the line by Sweetman following joint top scorer George Mitchell-Phillips moving to Saltdean United.

Hassocks now had 23 minutes to try and find an equaliser. Becks decided that they were going to try and see the game out, inviting the Robins to come forward in a way that they have scarcely done so far in the current campaign.

The best chance of a Hassocks leveller came from a marauding run forward from captain Whittingham. He beat a couple of Beckenham players on a charge from left back and with the home crowd urging him to shoot, let fly an effort from the edge of the area.

Unfortunately, Whitnell produced an acrobatic stop every bit as spectacular as his first half save from Loversidge to again turn the effort over the bar.

# Hassocks sail away from Pirates with a point for their efforts

In the end, the journey was remarkably, he was back on the worth it. Those Hassocks fans who used their precious petrol to make the longest away journey of the season to Bexhill United in the middle of the fuel crisis were rewarded by witnessing the Robins take an excellent point with a 1-1 draw at the Polegrove.

The Pirates have made quite a splash in their first Premier Division season for 30 years, sitting seventh in the early table with six wins from 10 matches.

Included in that impressive haul was a 3-1 victory over title favourites Saltdean United last time out, a result that pointed to a difficult afternoon for Hassocks on the East Sussex coast.

The Robins though have been showing improvement over the past few weeks, pushing both Premier Division leaders Littlehampton Town close in the league and then doing likewise to Combined Counties Premier table toppers Beckenham Town in the FA Vase.

And Hassocks were well worth their here point in horrific conditions which resulted in numerous games across the county either being postponed or abandoned before the final whistle.

There was never any danger of that at the Polegrove. Although not the best surface, the pitch was extremely dry before kick off and it coped admirably with all mother nature could throw at it over the course of a grim afternoon.

The last time Hassocks had visited these parts for a league game had been in their 1994-95 Division One promotion season, drawing 2-2.

Phil Wickwar had been an unused substitute on that day and

Robins bench for this one 26 years later.

That was not the only note of interest amongst Brad Sweetman's substitutes; Spencer Slaughter was also named having re-joined Hassocks for a fourth spell following his departure from the manager's seat at Loxwood.

Slaughter came on for the final 12 minutes and although it will take him some weeks to get up to full match fitness, the fan favourite will bring some much needed leadership and experience to what is the youngest squad in the Premier Division.

Hassocks made two changes from the close-fought 2-1 defeat against Beckenham last time out. Andy Whittingham was replaced by Bradley Tighe and Alex Harris took over in goal from Harvey Parker.

Harris looked to have a particularly difficult task on his hands, dealing with relentless torrential rain and a wind swirling at speeds approaching 45 miles per hour.

None of that seemed to bother him, however. He was confident claiming when he needed to be despite the unpredictability of what the ball would do in the gale and his handling was exceptional all afternoon.

Having seen Hassocks concede two or more goals in 10 of their 12 previous matches, it was quite an achievement for only one to go in on a day when the weather could easily have claimed a couple of assists enough to earn Harris the Robins's man-of-the-match accolade, in fact.

Just behind Harris in that particular vote was Alfie Loversidge. He opened the scoring in only the seventh minute with his fourth goal of the campaign following a swashbuckling move down the left.

Bradley Bant released Joe Bull working the channel and his cut back to the penalty spot was slammed into the top corner by Loversidge to shock





the home crowd by giving Hassocks the lead.

Unfortunately, that lead lasted only 13 minutes. Hassocks should have doubled their advantage from a corner but the effort was placed straight at Bexhill goalkeeper Alexander Zamani.

From there, the Pirates pillaged down the right and a low cross from Jack Shonk was tapped in by the prolific Evan Archibald.

Hassocks had a chance to retake the lead on the stroke of half time, Zamani parrying an on-target effort

The loose ball fell to Arthur Rawlingson but with the goal gaping, he could not quite toe poke home.

Bexhill were much the dominant side in the second half and the Robins needed all hands on deck to prevent their point from disappearing to Davy Jones' locker.

There was one shivering moment in the final five minutes when the Pirates thought they had sunk Hassocks by putting the ball in the back of the net from a follow up after a good stop by Harris.

The away bench were convinced it was offside and after what felt like an eternity, referee Chris Stobard and his assistant came to the same conclusion and the goal was scuttled.

That seemed to knock the wind out of Bexhill's sails and Hassocks held on, ending a run of five consecutive defeats ahead of three huge home games against AFC Varndeanians, Eastbourne United and Horsham YMCA.

Suddenly, the flame does not appear to be glowing so brightly at the Beacon. After a surprise midweek RUR Cup exit at the hands of Sidley whom Hassocks hammered 5-0 just 17 days earlier, the Robins struggled to preserve their unbeaten league record against lowly Lingfield.

16 minutes from time to rescue a 1-1 draw in a game that nobody is likely to forget anytime soon thanks to the antics of Lingers boss Dave 'Dixie' Dean, appointed three weeks ago after the resignation of Jim Bajeux.

The visitors arrived at the Beacon with only two substitutes and Dean as support staff on a sparsely populated bench.

Dean did not last the full 90 minutes either - and he would have been banished to the stands much sooner had he not also been acting as physio.

That job, in truth, did not last long. Dean's first venture onto the pitch to administer treatment came after only eight minutes and ended with him slamming down the medical bag, giving it a kicking and then storming off without so much as touching the magic sponge.

He was seemingly incensed that referee Matthew Goldsmith had not awarded his side a penalty against home goalkeeper Jack Simpson, leaving his own injured player to tend being a strange affair. Hassocks still to himself.

Dean need not have worried. That bizarre incident sparked a mad few

minutes which eventually ended with Mr Goldsmith giving Lingfield an outrageous spot kick for a perceived foul by Pete Lear on Daryl Coleman.

That set the tone for an awful afternoon for Mr Goldsmith, who landed himself with a mountain of paperwork.

He dished out seven bookings, They needed a Sam Jeremiah goal four to home players although Ashley Marsh and Spencer Slaughter could have no complaints.

> Lear on the other hand certainly could as a yellow card for the penalty -that-never-was rubbed salt into the wounds of the Hassocks defender.

As for Dean, Mr Goldsmith said afterwards that he would be reporting the Lingfield boss twice for misconduct.

He also confirmed that Dean had only survived so long in the dugout because he could not be sent off whilst acting as physio. Once Dean had delegated that task to a Lingers fan, Mr Goldsmith sent him to the stands for foul and abusive language.

Back to the actual football and Coleman - the best player on the pitch by some distance - duly slammed home that controversial penalty to give Lingfield the lead with 12 minutes played.

Leaking an average of three goals a game, the visitors were content to get bodies behind the ball after that.

The next 80 minutes ended up created plenty of opportunities, but there could be no doubt that they were a shadow of their best and

lacking in the sort of invention which has characterised the first two months of Mickey Jewell's management.

It was poor fare all round really and only the antics of Dean could be labelled entertainment. Even that had run thin long before the end as home supporters becoming increasingly upset with his antics.

Mr Goldsmith also came under the spotlight, which is always a shame and not what the game is really about.

The Hassocks equaliser summed up their performance perfectly scrappy and unconvincing. Jewell had made three substitutions in the space of eight minutes as he desperately sort a spark of creativity from somewhere.

Anthony Hibbert was the last of the players introduced and when his attempted cross from a free kick instead rattled the bar, an almighty scramble occurred with the ball eventually bundled in and Jeremiah claiming the final touch.

On chances, it was deserved enough but had Dean not blotted the Lingfield copybook, there may have been a twinge of sympathy from Hassocks supporters towards the visitors, given the effort they put into defending their early lead.

Jewell admitted afterwards it was another poor performance but that unbeaten start remains intact and means something will have to give up against the 100% record of Three Bridges on Tuesday night.

#### **Eastbourne United this season?**

When this game was originally meant to take place 10 days ago, United were only one point ahead of us in the table. The gap now reads six as back-to-back victories have lifted them up the table and away from the relegation zone. And when we say victories, we mean hammerings - Lingfield were beaten 7-0 in the first of those matches and Loxwood 4-0 in the second.

#### Our record against Eastbourne United?

The Robins dominate the head-to-head with 18 wins to United's 12 and 12 draws in our 41 meetings. That record is helped hugely by the fact that we seem to love visiting the Oval for some reason. We won six times in a row there between 2010 and 2019, although that run has been dampened somewhat by defeats on our last two visits to the Sunshine Coast.

#### Last time we met?

Included amongst those was our previous visit to the Oval, the last game completed before the 2020-21 season was curtailed by the winter lockdown. United were floundering towards the bottom of the table at the time whereas we were enjoying one of our best campaigns for some time. #### Horsham YMCA this season?

Following the departure of longserving manager Peter Buckland in the summer of 2020, Horsham YMCA struggled in the part of last season that got completed and were sat in the bottom three when the campaign was curtailed. Dean Carden - a YM legend with over 500 appearances for the club to his name - took over in November from Buckland's successor Julian Miller and although he could not instigate an immediate turnaround, there has been a noticeable improvement in 2021-22 so far. #### Our record against Horsham YMCA?

Three days after suffering a club record 8-0 home defeat, we went and won 3-1 at Horsham YMCA for a first league victory at Gorings Mead in 17 years (we did tell you that our form their was terrible!). Jack Troak opened the scoring from the penalty spot and although Cameron Gyeabour equalised only two minutes later, YM had no answer to two outstanding Charlie Pitcher goals in the second half.
