A difficult 2020-21 season meant that, like us the previous season, Horsham YMCA were probably a side grateful for the campaign being declared null and void. This time around, they have eyes set up the table...

Following the departure of longserving manager Peter Buckland in the summer of 2020, Horsham YMCA challenging Pagham at Gorings Mead struggled in the part of last season that got completed and were sat in the bottom three when the campaign the Premier Division season so far. was curtailed.

Dean Carden - a YM legend with over 500 appearances for the club to his name - took over in November from Buckland's successor Julian Miller and although Carden could not instigate an immediate turnaround, there has been a noticeable improvement in 2021-22 so far.

YM have won three and drawn three of their 14 games to sit 15th coming into today's game, two places and three points better off than ourselves.

That gives this afternoon the feel of a six pointer - one that looks utterly unpredictable given that both sides have out in some wildly contradicting results.

Lots of goals have been shipped, YM conceding nine against a rampant Phil Johnson and Crawley Down Gatwick and 10 when they made the trip to Jersey Bulls in the FA Cup.

There has also been one very eye catching victory, a 2-1 win over title back in August which remains arguably the biggest shock result of

If YM can repeat their feat against the Lions over the rest of the season, then they should have little to worry about when it comes to the relegation battle.

In the not-too-distant past, today would have been a game which YM would relish given their excellent record against us.

Of the 52 previous meetings across five different competitions, YM have 25, helped hugely by their home form against the Robins.

Before a 3-1 win at Gorings Mead last October, we had not won away at YM for 17 long years.

We have had the upper hand in recent seasons however, being unbeaten in the past three meetings between the clubs.

What will happen this afternoon is anyone's guess, but if history is anything to go by then it will at the very least be entertaining.

Since John Suter's brief spell in charge of Hassocks at the start of the 2008-09 season, there have been a huge number of players to represent both clubs.

Suter brought a whole host of names from Gorings Mead to the Beacon with him including Glen Woodburn, Matt Percival, Matt Russell, Ali Russell and James Bird.

Matt Russell was the stand out performer, scoring four times in eight East Preston after over 400 games games before following Suter to Worthing United like most of the YM contingent.

In more recent times, Phil Gault enjoyed a brief stay with YM in

between moving form Hassocks to Haywards Heath Town while Phil Johnson went the opposite way, playing one brief game for Heath before joining YM following a spell with Burgess Hill Town.

Another Hassocks youth product who went onto star for YM was Anthony Hibbert who joined YM midway through the 2014-15 season.

Hibbert had originally moved to and 100 goals for the Robins but Dom Di Paolo's resignation saw him transfer to YM, where he spent the next one-and-a-half seasons before retiring.

Hibbert wasn't the only player to move to YMCA that year, young defender Alex Gathern also signing for Peter Buckland's side from the Beacon.

Two more players have represented both clubs in the past four seasons; Hassocks having signed defender Dan Webster from YM in the summer of 2018 whilst Jake Lindsev moved to Gorings Mead at the start of the 2019-20 campaign for a brief spell.

Webster only played a handful of games before moving to Oakwood while Lindsey's spell at YM was equally short lived.

After 17 years, it's finally fun for Hassocks to stay at the YMCA

Nothing surprises when it comes to Hassocks. Three days after suffering the heaviest home defeat in their history when losing 8-0 to Horley Town, the Robins went and won a league game away at Horsham YMCA for the first time in 17 years.

Saturday 22nd November 2003 was the last time Hassocks left Gorings Mead with three points.

Tony Blair was Prime Minister, Busted were top of the charts with 'Crashed the Wedding' and Pat Harding scored twice in the space of 120 seconds to secure a 2-0 win for Dave John's Robins.

Little could Johnsy have known that day that Hassocks would have to wait until 2020 to win at YM again, nor did he probably expect to still be in the dugout, albeit in his fourth spell at the helm.

There was another brace scorer on this occasion, too. Charlie Pitcher repeated Harding's heroics with a double which, combined with Jack Troak's penalty, proved enough to give the Robins a 3-1 success.

Hassocks made three changes from the Horley hammering; injured goalkeeper Connor Evento and midfielder Josh Short were replaced by Charlie Pugh and Jack Troak and Dan Turner returned for George Brown, who hadn't covered himself in glory at the weekend when picking up a red card for dissent.

That meant that eight of the starting line up remained and it was clear from the first whistle that they wanted to redeem themselves.

Aaron Jeal in the YM goal made the first of a series of excellent saves with 10 minutes played.

The outstanding James Littlejohn had clearly taken inspiration from the Strictly Come Dancing launch show as he foxtrotted into the box past four challenges, eventually laying the ball off to Bradley Bant whose low drive was repelled.

More fast footwork from Littlejohn chested a ball down 25 yards out

earned a free kick on the edge of the from goal until Pitcher burst onto the box five minutes later, from which the Hassocks striker clipped the bar after dusting himself down to bend an effort which Jeal could only watch onto the woodwork.

Littlejohn then rattled the right hand post after a well worked move in which he dummied Bant's sweeping cross for Pitcher before collecting the lay off and getting a shot away which again beat Jeal but not the frame of the goal.

Hassocks got the goal that their enterprising start deserved on the half hour mark.

Harvey Enticknap appeared to have the ball glued to his foot as he turned this way and that along the by -line, eventually drawing a foul which led referee Daniel D'Urso to point to the spot.

No Hassocks player seemed particularly eager to take the penalty, hardly a surprise given the Robins had missed their previous two spot kicks.

Eventually, Troak stepped up and he sent Jeal the wrong way, confidently despatching into the bottom right hand corner of the YM goal to give the visitors the lead.

Unfortunately, they weren't ahead for long. Within two minutes, Dean Carden popped up on the right wing to deliver a cross which Cameron Gyeabour met with a looping header, giving Pugh no chance.

That took the sting out of the game a little. Hassocks next mustered a chance right on the stroke of half time when Chadwick played in Troak, he skipped around Kyle Sim but saw his one-on-one effort brilliantly saved by a strong Jeal hand.

Just as in the first half, Hassocks came flying out of the traps at the start of the second and they retook the lead within three minutes of the restart.

There seemed little on when Bant

Pugh had a rare piece of work to do when he saved bravely at the feet of Charlie Gee as YM looked for another instant response.

Bant swung over a corner, Turner produced a clever head down to Broomfield who headed away from goal.

"You're going the wrong way, Will," somebody helpfully shouted but Broomfield clearly knew what he was doing as the ball found Pitcher who rifled home through a crowd for 3-1.

It was fairly comfortable for Hassocks from that point on. Troak might have added a fourth when he again went through, only for the ball to spoon off his shin pad and into the arms of Jeal and the YM keeper showed smart handling to hold a Chadwick piledriver from distance.

"Have a shot next time, Jake" was the shout from the sidelines for that one, this time given by Chadwick's father of all people.

That raised a few smiles on the Hassocks bench and there plenty more when the final whistle went. From a club-record defeat to ending a 17-year hoodoo in the space of three days. It's never dull with Hassocks.

History made for happy Hassocks who make it eight wins in a row

History was made at the **Beacon as Hassocks** defeated Horsham YMCA 1-0 to win for the eighth consecutive game in senior football for the first time in the club's 114 year existence.

Phil Gault's beautiful 19th minute header from a trademark James Westlake delivery decided the tie, played in a howling gale which meant chances were at a premium.

That suited Hassocks as they put in a dogged defensive display which saw them give not an inch to their promotion pushing opponents.

In fact, if the Oxford English Dictionary are looking to simplify their definition of "backs to the wall performance" anytime soon then they could do a lot worse than simply say "Hassocks 1-0 Horsham YMCA" as this was the epitome of the term.

The back four were excellent. Bradley Tighe, Ashley Marsh and Nick Pitcher each cleared an effort off the line over the course of the 90 minutes while man-of-the-match Luke Akehurst was the star performer, given the best showing of his Hassocks career at left back.

YM had the wind to their advantage attacking the railway end in the first half but while their neat approach play was pleasing on the eve, they seemed more content to stroke the ball around than let fly any efforts to seriously test Alex Harris in what were horrific conditions for a goalkeeper.

Captain Ash Dugdale headed a good opportunity wide from a Dan Evans cross inside the opening five minutes with what was the only chance of note before Gault's opener just before the 20 minute mark.

Gault had been feeling very under the weather in the run up to the game.

Hassocks took a risk in playing their talismanic striker against one of

his former clubs but it was one which to crash into the young Robins was richly vindicated when Gault leapt like the proverbial salmon to flick home a pinpoint corner from Westlake, earned after a scampering left wing run from Jonno Melia.

The visitors had two chances on the stroke of half time to get back into the game.

Nick Sullivan danced his way around four defenders before seeing his shot beat Harris but repelled by the covering Tighe.

Then former Hassocks favourite Anthony Hibbert beat the advancing Harris to a punt over the top from Dugdale but his lobbed effort fell just the wrong side of the post.

Michael Death had a great chance to double the advantage five minutes after the restart but he curled over from the edge of the box and that was really it in terms of Hassocks as an attacking force.

YM did get the ball in the back of the net when Marsh's questionable header caused a world of problems as it looped over Harris, but Dean Wright couldn't jam the ball home without first bundling the young goalkeeper over.

The result was a foul against Wright, much to Marsh's relief. The lack of any appeal against the decision from the YM contingent suggested that referee John Walker had got it right.

Substitute Martin Smith was next

stopper and he lacked the sensibility of Wright in failing to realise he had committed the foul, appearing to be extremely miffed at not being awarded a penalty.

Smith's ranting and raving eventually saw him push Marsh to the ground while swinging his handbag around in frustration for which a yellow card was the punishment. In truth, he was lucky to escape a red.

It was bodies on the line and hearts in mouth stuff in the last 10 minutes.

Jamie Hillwood and Josh Hawkes both threw themselves in the way of goal bound efforts, Harris went full stretch to palm away a Sam Schaff volley and then gathered bravely as Smith ploughed towards him like a train with a brakes failure.

It got even more nervy in stoppage time as those other two aforementioned last gasp hacks off the line from Marsh and Pitcher followed, the latter of whom was totally nonplussed by the tension in the air as he managed to throw in a series of keepy ups alongside his clearance.

"That's two promotion teams (YMCA and Newhaven) we have beaten in our last two games which just goes to show that when 14 lads play for the shirt you can achieve amazing things," Phil Wickwar said afterwards.

"They deserve all the credit they get for what they have done over the last eight games." The history books will agree.

Robins swoop to bring in Westlake and Hawkes

The signings keep coming. Hassocks continue to roll back the clock to 2016 with the **Robins completing the transfers** of two more former favourites from Loxwood.

Following Spencer Slaughter back to the Beacon from Plaistow Road are midfielders James Westlake and Josh Hawkes.

That is not all as Brad Sweetman has also brought in the highly rated Lucas Tyrrell from Peacehaven & Telscombe as his Robins squad continues to gather experienced individuals.

This will be Westlake's third spell at the club, having originally signed from St Francis Rangers in 2010 under Mickey Jewell.

A hugely popular player with the Hassocks faithful, he departed in the summer of 2013 to re-sign for Rangers before a brief spell at Haywards Heath Town.

Hassocks were deep in relegation trouble when Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar managed to tempt him back to play a massive role in the Reserve from Hanbury Park in the autumn of 2015.

His capture coincided with a clubrecord run of eight successive victories which went a long way towards helping Hassocks pull off a great escape from falling into Division One.

Over the following seasons, Westlake concentrated more on his running career. His feats in that field need no introduction and culminated with representing England.

He joined Loxwood last season and served as part of Slaughter's coaching team as the Magpies made it to the Southern Combination Premier Division Supplementary Shield final.

Westlake returns to the Beacon on 196 appearances so, all being well, the Robins can look forward to him passing the 200 games mark in the coming weeks.

Hawkes started out at Ringmer, arriving at Hassocks from St Francis teams historic 2012-13 season treble of Reserve Section Premier title winners, Reserve Section Cup winners and Mid Sussex Senior Cup winners.

Despite those feats, he found his first team opportunities limited and so moved back to Rangers alongside Westlake in the summer of 2013.

His own return to the Beacon came in 2015 and he was appointed Hassocks club captain ahead of the 2016-17 season.

Injuries saw him scale back his senior football commitments and he eventually left the Beacon at the end of the 2017-18 season, resurfacing at Loxwood last summer when Slaughter convinced him to step up from Mid Sussex League football and assume the captaincy at the Magpies. Hawkes has played 72 times for Hassocks, scoring 11 goals.

Tyrell meanwhile joins having spent the past three seasons as a first team regular at Peacehaven.

Flying United only denied a rout of the Robins by outstanding Pugh

With Eastbourne United in such flying form since Anthony Storey was appointed manager at the Oval last month, their visit to the Beacon was always likely to be a difficult assignment for Hassocks.

And so it proved as United made it four wins from five matches under their new manager with a 3-0 success that was as comfortable as the scoreline suggests.

United might even feel that the margin of victory should have been greater. They came up against an inspired Charlie Pugh however, the Hassocks goalkeeper making a string of first class saves to keep the score at three.

The effort of Pugh's outfield teammates could not be faulted. They just lacked the quality that they had shown when hammering AFC Varndeanians 4-1 at the weekend, perhaps because those exertions caught up with them.

Hassocks' recent run of strong performances has been built on a settled starting XI. They made one change from Saturday, James Westlake coming in for his first start since re-joining the Robins from Loxwood in place of Charlie Tuck.

United took the lead with 14 minutes played with a goal that left a fair few questions about Hassocks' defending.

A long kick was not dealt with and that allowed Bailo Camara to cross for United top scorer Festos Kamara to send a looping header over the top of Pugh.

Hassocks enjoyed their best period in the immediate aftermath of the opening goal.

Rampaging Joe Bull was hauled down in the box but remarkably, referee Daniel Cooper waved away the penalty appeals much to the home crowd's bemusement. Mr Cooper soon had the chance to make amends for that decision and he duly did so, pointing to the spot with 20 minutes played.

Alfie Loversidge had completed his hat-trick against Varndeanians with a successful penalty but taking duties this time fell to Josh Short, who saw his low effort successfully kept out by Phil Hawkins in the United goal.

Hawkins seems to thrive against the Robins. He gave a match winning performance as United squeaked a 1-0 victory the last time these sides met in December. Hassocks were unable to trouble him here on too many more occasions once he had repelled Short's spot kick.

Instead, it was Pugh who became the far busier goalkeeper on show. On 21 minutes, he denied Max Thompson with an outrageous piece of shot stopping and then watched an Alfie Peacock effort from distance drift wide.

A rare foray forward from Hassocks saw Westlake got a shot away but it was easy for Hawkins to deal with. Dee Okajie then crossed for Kamara whose header this time was over as United finished the half strongly.

The final five minutes resulted in a flurry of activity in the Hassocks box. Pugh made his next outstanding intervention with a close range save from Camara after he was released by Kamara, who then tested Pugh himself before Thompson was denied by the Robins number one.

Hassocks needed half time to regroup and they duly did that, almost catching United cold within 60 seconds of the restart.

A rare bit of good football down the right involving Jack Gardner and Westlake ended with Short seeing his goal bound effort blocked.

Gardner then proved his worth at the other end, doing brilliantly to hack an Alfie Peacock effort off the line after the United forward had



rounded Pugh.

United got their second on 54 minutes and it was that man Kamara again. Another cross proved to be the Robins' undoing, this time from Emerson Guimaraes and whilst the defending was sloppy, the finish was of the highest class as Kamara took a touch and rifled home.

Pugh denied Kamara a hat-trick with a full stretch tip around the post on the hour mark. Five minutes later and United might have gone down to 10, Harvey Mapstone hauling down Loversidge last man but much to the relief of the United defender, Mr Cooper reached for a yellow rather than a red.

Would a sending off have helped Hassocks find a way back in the last 20 minutes? Probably not.

A double change of Phil Gault and Lucas Tyrrell - a new signing from Peacehaven & Telscombe - for Bull and Connor Bradley could not shake a response from the Robins and Pugh had to made further saves from Alfie Headland and Peacock twice.

Andy Whittingham's tame effort when well placed on 77 minutes summed Hassocks' evening up, after which it looked like both sides were contented to settle for a final score of 2-0 to the visitors.

United though had one final goal in them. It arrived with 60 seconds of normal time remaining, a deflected shot from substitute Chinoso Nwajagu falling kindly for Thompson who brought the ball down and fired clinically past Pugh.

Hassocks had made it into mid-October still unbeaten in the league under new manager Mickey Jewell in 2010 - but could that translate into rare success in a cup competition? The Robins headed to Rye United to find out...

Lacklustre Robins bow out of League Cup

Whilst Hassocks remain unbeaten in the league so far this season under Mickey Jewell, the Robins' performances in cup competitions have been a source of bitter disappointment for their new boss.

After exiting the RUR Charity Cup at the hands of lowly Sidley United 11 days earlier, it was another East Sussex club in Rye United who eliminated Hassocks from the John O'Hara League Cup via a 2-0 defeat at the earliest opportunity.

The pace, urgency and fluency which had seen the Robins become the first side to take a point from Three Bridges on Tuesday night was sadly missing.

Hassocks were also guilty of giving away possession far too easily and created very little in front of goal, not helped by the absence of Phil Gault.

Rye provided competent and organised opponents and it would not be a surprise to see them challenging Bridges for the title come the end of the season, providing they are not too badly impacted by their current home ground situation.

An arson attack on the clubhouse at the Salts at the end of October caused enough damage to mean that it cannot be used again, leaving Rye to face a nomadic existence for the near-future at least.

This tie was switched to the home

of Rye's near-neighbours Little Common. The pitch at the Recreation turgid fare that had come before. Ground was rather bobbly and, coupled with a very strong wind, that meant both sides struggled to make much happen in the first half.

The best two chances of the opening 45 both arrived inside of five minutes, punishing any latecomers.

Dan Smith decided to get an early feeler for what the wind could do when he let one go from distance. The lively Dan Leach then fired into the side netting for Rye from a tight but well placed angle.

Both sides were content to knock the ball around after that without ever taking the risk to go for that killer pass.

The possession stats would have been relatively high but the shot count was non-existent, leaving Jack Simpson and his opposite number Josh Pelling as mere spectators.

One worry for Hassocks was that they lost the industrious Lee Waterhouse to a thigh injury midway through the first half.

His place was taken by the fit again Dan Jacques, returning for his first appearance of the season.

Hassocks fell behind on 53 minutes when they were caught on the break following a free kick of their own deep in the Rye half.

Leach took possession from the clearance and played a neat exchange with Liam Upton, whose cross was headed in via the far post by Ryan Moreby.

It was a fine counter attacking

goal not really in keeping with the

Moreby in particular deserved a lot of credit for making up the best part of 80 yards so rapidly up the Rye right to get on the end of Upton's delivery.

Rye took control after that, Scott Ramsay flashing a shot wide and Jack Dixon firing over the bar when he should have at least worked Simpson.

Jewell twisted with 20 minutes left to go, making a double change as Sam Jeremiah and Neil Kane replaced Spencer Slaughter and Smith to give Hassocks two out-and-out forwards on the pitch.

It nearly had the desired impact. Simpson made an excellent full stretch save to deny Dixon and then Jeremiah had the Robins' best chance of the afternoon, outpacing the Rye defence but not getting enough purchase on his shot which was saved comfortably by Pelling.

The game should have been sewn up by Rye on 81 minutes but substitute Matt MacLean somehow contrived to miss from six yards.

His fellow replacement Sam Cole was not so wasteful five minutes later, heading home unmarked after Hassocks were caught surprised when an acrobatic hook back from the by-line by Dixon kept the ball in play.

Kane nearly claimed a consolation but he shot straight at Pelling in injury time, leaving Hassocks with only the Sussex Senior Cup to focus on alongside their league campaign.

Crawley Down this season

The Sussex Senior Cup draw has not been kind to us as it sends one of the potential dark horses for the Southern Combination League title to the Beacon. Crawley Down have amassed some serious firepower this season with two names who will be very familiar to Hassocks fans. Phil Johnson has 17 goals to his name and Charlie Pitcher 12, meaning that Down are the second highest scorers in the division after leaders Littlehampton. Six wins and two draws from 12 matches currently has them in ninth spot, but with goals guaranteed you would not rule them out of finding their way into the promotion picture over the coming months.

Our record against Crawley Down Gatwick

Hassocks v Crawley Down has become one of the most entertaining fixtures on the Southern Combination League. 84 goals have been plundered in 21 previous meetings in senior football at an average of four a game, including 25 in the past five meetings. Amongst the more ridiculous score lines of the past six years are 5-3 and 6-4 wins for Hassocks. The head-to-head reads 10 victories for the Robins, seven for Down with four draws.

Last time we met?

The last fixture between the two may have only yielded six goals, but there was still plenty of drama as we won 4 -2 in Southern Combination Premier Division Supplementary Shield at the Haven back in April. Alfie Loversidge, Jack Troak, Charlie Pitcher and Pat Harding got the goals with Pitcher and Harding striking in the final two minutes in a dramatic finish.

A quick glance at the Premier Division table will tell you what an important game this is. The Magpies are one of only four sides below us, having won two, drawn two and lost eight of their games so far. It might be too early in the season for six pointers, but the trip to the Sussex/Surrey border looks massive in terms of what it could do for morale and belief, if not actual league position.

Our record against Loxwood?

The sides first clashed in the 2014-15 season, since when there have been 12 meetings. Hassocks have only ever beaten the Magpies twice, a 4-0 win at Plaistow Road in September 2018 and a 6-2 success at the Beacon a year later. The last four games have been hugely entertaining with 22 goals flying in.

Last time we met?

Pass through Newpound and Roundstreet Common, approaching a fork in the road with Skiff Lane. Plaistow Road is just on the left after that with the ground on your left a very short distance down it.

Any familiar faces?

Only the small matter of Spencer Slaughter - now back home where he belongs - coming up against the club he managed for the past 18 months. James Westlake and Josh Hawkes have also followed Slaughter back to the Beacon in recent weeks, adding even more intrigue to the game.

Pitcher opened the scoring in the first half and added a second with six minutes remaining. Jamie Carroll pulled one back two minutes later for the visitors, but we just about held on for a gritty three points only three days after being hammered 6-2 at Eastbourne Town.

Pagham' danger men?

The Lions have both Jack Langford an Joe Clarke in the Premier Division's top scorer charts. Langford is back at Nyetimber Lane for a second spell this season, having played for what feels like every club in the Southern Combination League bar us. He has scored against the Robins for the Lions, Peacehaven, Eastbourne Town, Saltdean United and Newhaven.


