To say that Pagham endured a dramatic start to the season would be a slight understatement - and yet they arrive here at the Beacon in sixth spot having come unscathed through a testing opening week...

You would have got long odds on the Lions flying so high when they were hammered 4-0 by Little Common on the opening weekend and then saw boss Kerry Hardwell resign a few days later, setting what must be some sort of record for the earliest managerial department in Southern Combination League history.

Pagham though rallied. Ryan Pharo was appointed in Hardwell's place and they have won 11 and lost six of their 17 games to date.

Such formidable form leaves the Lions 11 points behind only Littlehampton Town in the table but with two games in hand on the leaders as we approach the halfway point of the campaign.

The Lions of course have been here before many times. They have a reputation as being strong starters, often in title contention only to then fade away later in the season.

Pharo's challenge is to ensure that does not happen this time around. If he can, then there is no reason why Pagham cannot be involved in what is already looking like a fascinating race for the championship which the Lions last won in 1989.

Pagham's current spell in the top flight began in 2007, making them the second-longest serving club in the Premier Division after ourselves.

That means that there have been plenty of meetings between us throughout the years, 56 in total. They are one of our most frequent opponents.

Pagham lead the way in the head -to-head with 27 wins to our 20. Draws are few and far between, only nine having been recorded to date.

The bad news is that our record against the Lions in recent years is particularly dire. Since 2014, we've picked up a grand total of 10 points from a possible 39, making them very much a bogey club for us.

If that record is to be improved today, then we will need to find a way to stop two of the most in-form strikers in the league.

The well-travelled Jack Langford has 15 goals to his name with Joe Clarke just behind on 10.

It is another tough test to start a difficult looking run of games for the Robins.

Pitcher at the double to end Pagham's unbeaten start

What a difference 72 hours can make. Just three days after being hammered 6-2 away at Eastbourne Town, Hassocks ended Pagham's unbeaten start to the season with a gritty 2-1 win at the Beacon.

Most of the drama was saved for the final 10 minutes, when two of the goals arrived and both sides squandered chances as the tie threatened to go either way.

The previous 80 minutes won't be remembered as a classic. Opportunities were few and far between, not that anyone with home connections was complaining as dour fare meant that the Robins had given their best defensive performance of the campaign so far.

With a striker like Charlie Pitcher in their ranks, Hassocks know that if they can keep it tight at one end, then Pitcher has the quality to win them games at the other.

He scored both of the Robins goals, the first with a perfectly taken penalty and the second a poacher's finish after a goalmouth scramble which sparked that madcap finale.

Hassocks were rarely troubled at the back until then. Last season's number one Charlie Pugh answered the call to return between the sticks with Dave Carruthers and Conor Evento both struck down by injury.

Pugh could not have expected to have such a comfortable evening against a side who arrived in Mid Sussex as the division's secondhighest scorers, the goalkeeper pulling off only one save of note in the second half.

Dave John made one change from the side who suffered that weekend trouncing at the Saffrons.

Young Alfie Loversidge was rested to the bench with his place taken by former Burgess Hill Town youngster Josh Short.

Whilst Pitcher's brace took the

headlines, Short was outstanding. He covered every blade of grass, constantly won possession back for Hassocks and hardly wasted a pass. It was some full debut.

A rare defensive lapse from the Robins gave Pagham the opening chance of the game with 13 minutes played.

Grant Radmore found himself completely free at the far post and no more than three yards out from goal when Joe Bennett's cross reached him but somehow, the burly Radmore contrived to put his glancing header the wrong side of the upright.

Nine minutes later and Jack Gardner hit a slicing through ball from right back which put Pitcher in.

The Hassocks striker took a touch to cleverly work some room away from the attentions of Joe Clarke, allowing him to pull an excellent save from Connor Kelly as the Pagham goalkeeper got down well to his left at full stretch.

It was another ball out of defence to Pitcher which earned Hassocks their spot kick two minutes later.

Dan Turner this time found Pitcher 30 yards out from goal. The striker still had plenty to do, meandering his way into the box where Dylan Jelley had a wobble to bring him to ground with a clumsy trip.

Pitcher dusted himself down and struck an excellent penalty low and hard into the bottom corner to give Hassocks the lead.

Jack Troak headed a Dave Crouch effort off the line as the first half entered its final five minutes.

Troak then proved his worth at the other end, playing a lovely through ball which left Jake Chadwick in a foot race with Kelly.

Both players arrived on the scene at the same time, Chadwick sliding in with a firm but fair tackle which resulted in the ball smashing against the post and away.

Into the second half and James Littlejohn headed an in-swinging corner over the bar at the near post before Pugh's one save arrived midway through, a big one-on-one stop on the charge to deny Radmore.

Hassocks' desperation to see out the win was highlighted when Pitcher started holding the ball in the corner on 82 minutes, a bold tactic if his intention was to try and keep it there for the next eight plus injury time.

Pagham certainly weren't impressed. Their mood sunk even lower when the Robins earned a corner from this so-called negativity, Pitcher won the header to spark a melee in the box which he eventually ended by reacting quickest to fire past for Kelly for 2-0.

The Lions halved the deficit within two minutes through a brilliant 25 yard volley from substitute Jamie Carroll to set up a tense finish.

What you then don't expect to see when defending a slender lead in stoppage time is your defender charging 60 yards up the pitch with the ball.

Will Broomfield was nearly rewarded for his bravery though as he exchanged passed with Jack Troak, resulting in Troak finding himself one-on-one with Kelly who made a superb double save.

That was in the 93rd minute. In the 95th, Crouch beat Pugh but not the upright as the ball cannoned to safety and in the 97th, Ash Hawkes found himself one-on-one but could only drag wide.

Bristow the Lion tamer gives Hassocks first win in four

Simon Bristow opened his Hassocks account as the **Robins tamed the Lions of** Pagham to deliver a first win in four.

Dave John rarely signs players midway through the season, a notable exception being Phil Gault's arrival from St Francis Rangers in January of last year.

But having seen his side fail to score in six of their last seven outings, the Hassocks boss made his move to bring Bristow to the Beacon from Haywards Heath Town and already it looks like a shrewd acquisition.

The 21-year-old striker was a real menace all afternoon against Pagham with his non-stop running and pace never giving the visiting defence a moments peace.

He scored Hassocks' equaliser just before the half hour mark to cancel out Ashley Hunter's stunning opener for the Lions and then won the second half penalty which Spencer Slaughter converted for what proved to be the winner.

And John said afterwards that he believes there will be more to come from Bristow once he gets up to speed with senior football, this being only his third game at this level since arriving from Hanbury Park.

If that's the case, then Hassocks could have quite a player on their

John sprung something of a surprise, not with his team selection but in the way they lined up with Slaughter, Richard Thompson and Matt Robbins all being played out of their natural positions.

Slaughter dropped into sweeper from his favoured midfield berth, Thompson moved across from wing back to play as one of the three centre halves and Robbins took over from Thompson at left wing back for the first time in his career.

There was also a rare run out for Graham Beveridge, the veteran midfielder answering John's call to make his first start of the season and add some much-needed experience to a starting line up in which Mickey Turner was the only other player over the age of 25.

Hassocks started brightly but thoughts of that barren run in front of goal were never far from the home with a desperate treble substitution faithful's minds as both Bristow and his strike partner Laurence Robinson missed easy chances inside of the opening 15 minutes.

That wastefulness was punished by Hunter who hit a sublime effort from way out on the left that gave Joel Harding no chance after good work by Michael Frangou.

Turner went close to levelling the scores twice in quick succession before Bristow equalised.

Robinson was the architect, playing a perfect through pass but Bristow still had plenty to do as he showed commendable strength and pace to evade the challenge of Sean Dobbs and coolly slot past the advancing figure of Wes Hallett in the Pagham goal.

Beveridge then proved his worth when hooking Rob Wimble's goal bound effort off the line with half time approaching.

Both sides set their stalls out to attack early in the second half, Pagham hitting a post and Hassocks' teenage midfielder Jamie Ingham embarking on a mazy run which came incredibly close – which was more than could be said about a Beveridge free kick which wouldn't have looked out of place in the evening's Six Nations game between France and England at Stade de

Hobbs had been given a torrid time of it by Bristow which reached its nadir when the Pagham defender hauled down Bristow down in the box, giving Slaughter the opportunity to blast home his fourth of the season from the spot.

Lions' boss Gary Block responded to try and get back in the game, but it was actually Hassocks who ended the strongest.

They could have added a third through both Robinson and Ingham who were only denied by some excellent goalkeeping from Hallett, although the Robins did survive a scare right at the death when Wimble went down in the area but play was waved on.

In the end, this was a good victory for Hassocks on an afternoon that was preceded with an impeccably observed minutes silence for Ringmer's Herve King, who tragically collapsed and died while playing against Three Bridges last

Lewis the latest lured back to the Beacon

Hassocks continue to bring popular players back to the Beacon with midfielder Lewis Westlake the latest to return for another spell with the club...

Hassocks have completed the re-signing of another former favourite with Lewis Westlake he made about 15 appearances arriving back at the Beacon following a brief spell with Steyning Town.

This will be Westlake's third spell with the Robins having originally joined the club in the summer of 2016 from Lancing.

Westlake made 62 appearances over the next two seasons, establishing himself as an important player in the Robins' midfield engine room before returning to Lancing for a brief spell at the beginning of the 2018-19 campaign.

His next destination was Loxwood, whom he played for 22 times before Mark Dalgleish brought him back for a second spell with

Hassocks in February 2019.

Over the course of the next year, before the spring 2020 lockdown brought a premature end to the 2019 -20 campaign.

Westlake returned to Loxwood for the start of the 2020-21 season to link up with former Hassocks teammate Spencer Slaughter, who was embarking on his second season as manager at Plaistow Road.

Slaughter soon named Westlake as his captain and he skippered Loxwood to the final of the Supplementary Shield last May, where the Magpies were beaten by Isthmian League-bound Lancing.

When Slaughter left the club in September, it was not long before Westlake sought pastures new too, moving to Premier Division rivals

Stevning for two starts and one substitute appearance at the Shooting Field.

Hassocks have since lured him back to Mid Sussex and he joins Slaughter, Josh Hawkes and brother James who have all departed Loxwood in the past two months for new spells at the Beacon.

Since signing, Westlake has made quite the impression in his three appearances in a Hassocks shirt, scoring twice.

Both have been spectacular goals too, the first coming from 36 yards against Montpelier Villa in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

The second arrived four days later, a delicate chip after some intelligent pressing to open the scoring after only two minutes of the 2-1 win over Alfold.

Late drama at the Beacon as Gault wins it at the second attempt

Where do you even begin with what happened between Hassocks and Alfold at the Beacon?

Two red cards for the visitors, Hassocks losing three players to injury and then a penalty in the final seconds from Phil Gault saved, retaken and scored at the second attempt ended up earning the Robins a much-needed 2-1 victory on a day of ridiculous drama.

The first of those injuries arrived before the game had even kicked off, Hassocks losing top scorer Alfie Loversidge in the warm up.

His place was taken by youth team winger Louis Thwaites, thrust in domination, during which the visitors for a full debut. Surprisingly, Hassocks were not at all impacted by the disruption as they flew out of the traps, taking the lead with only two minutes on the clock.

For the second game running following the 5-0 midweek win over Montpelier Villa, Lewis Westlake scored a superb effort from distance after pressing a roll out from Alfold goalkeeper Andrew Osei and chipping in from 24 yards.

Unfortunately for Westlake, that was the end of his afternoon as he left proceedings minutes later as the Robins' second injury.

Lucas Tyrrell then joined him after a nasty collision with Osei. Both players were entitled to go for the ball, it was just unfortunate that Tyrrell came off worse and had to be helped from the field.

Jordan Badger and Josh Hawkes are both feeling their way back to match fitness, so they probably could have done without playing for well over an hour once Westlake and Tyrrell departed.

Hassocks did well to cope with the chaos in their ranks and although they struggled to create too many first half opportunities, they crucially kept Alfold at bay for the most part.

On the one occasion where the visitors had a sight of goal, Alex

Harris pulled off one of the best saves the Beacon has seen for a very long time.

It looked to all the world like Sam Lemon was going to score from point blank range but somehow, Harris managed to stick out a strong hand and turn the effort over the bar.

The second half took a while to heat up, sparking into life when Alfold equalised with 63 minutes on the clock.

It was an excellent goal from Lemon, cutting inside from the left channel and bending a sweet effort into the top corner.

That led to a brief period of Alfold looked the most likely winners.

Hassocks were again indebted to Harris when he pushed another effort from close range over the bar, this time from Kelvin Lucas.

Harris' heroics suddenly seemed to inspire the Robins and they ended the game back on top, led by the driving runs of Jack Troak who had taken over from the hard working Thwaites.

Osei was called into action when he managed to get his leg onto Josh Short's effort from six yards out, just doing enough to see the ball trickle wide of the post after good link up between Gault and James Westlake.

Alfold were reduced to 10 men when Mitch Clark made a lazy trip on Short in the middle of the park to pick up a second booking.

Dan Turner then met a beautiful free kick delivered into the box from out wide with a towering header which beat Osei.

The game was by now entering its final five minutes and it looked like **Subs:** Badger, Hawkes, Troak Hassocks' chance of winning it had





gone.

Alfold were content to sit back and take a point, as you might expect given their numerical disadvantage and that they are in the midst of a poor run of form.

Short though had other ideas and in the fourth minute of time added on, he embarked on a mesmerising run, jinking past three players and into the penalty area.

Osei came charging off his line and unlike that first half challenge on Tyrrell, got his timing all wrong as he completely missed the ball and wiped Short out.

A penalty was the only outcome but Osei redeemed himself with a superb full length save to his left to push Gault's spot kick onto the post.

The linesman who had spotted that offside which nobody else witnessed minutes earlier this time saw that Osei had left his line to make the stop and so Gault was given a second bite of the cherry.

A deathly hush descended from everyone except Osei, who did his best to put Gault off.

The veteran was not going to make the same mistake twice however and he scored with the last kick of the game to give Hassocks back-to-back wins for the first time under Brad Sweetman.

Whilst the Robins players celebrated with their young supporters behind the goal, Osei managed to talk himself into a red card for dissent after the full time whistle for continuing his protest against the retake far too vehemently for referee Joshua Langley-Fineing's likina.



Thomas at the double in welcome win for 10 man Robins

Games between Crawley Down Gatwick and Hassocks are rarely dull and this latest instalment certainly had an entertainment factor to it as the two sides shared five goals.

Unfortunately for the Robins, they were on the end of a fifth consecutive defeat as they went down 3-2 but there were at least positives to take for Mark Dalgleish's side.

It had looked like another long afternoon would be in store at a saturated Haven which passed a 10.30am pitch inspection thanks to the hard work of a loyal band of Anvils volunteers.

Their efforts in ensuring the surface was playable was paying off handsomely as the hosts swept into a two goal lead with just over half an hour played

nine minutes on the clock, a tidy finish rounding off a neat team move.

The second arrived on 32, Ollie Moore doubling Down's advantage at which point they were in complete

Credit to Hassocks though who tried hard to battle back after that.

With a third of the campaign now completed and only two wins and seven points on the board, the Robins once again find themselves in a fight for Premier Division survival and they'll need to show more of this sort of spirit and resistance if 26 seasons of consecutive top fight football isn't to come to an end come when they offered words of

April.

They made it 2-1 before half time with a goal from the most unlikely of sources as left back Andy

Whittingham opened his account for the club at the 80th time of asking. Whittingham had made his first appearance for the Robins as long ago as August 2010, which guite possibly gives him a club record of longest period of time between debut and first goal in Hassocks history with a nine-year stretch.

It was the perfect moment to score too, coming as it did in the final for Dalgleish to take from the Haven five minutes of the half when a goal for a side who had been trailing by two can often turn a game around.

That was certainly the case here and there was a real momentum change which continued into the second half.

As a result, the half time tea had Billy Wraight had made it 1-0 with hardly finished being when poured when Hassocks were on level terms. Jamie Hillwood was the scorer this time, his third of the season arriving iust five minutes after the restart to make it 2-2.

> That was a wake up call for Down and almost instantly, they upped their game in an attempt to get back on the front foot.

Parity had been restored for only seven minutes when Joe Holvey struck what proved to be the winner, netting a brilliant individual goal worthy of deciding any game.

Down certainly knew they'd been in a battle come the final whistle,

encouragement to Dalgleish and his squad for the season ahead.

"It's always a pleasure to play against Hassocks home or away. They will be disappointed with the result but playing with the level of commitment shown today, they will turn it around."

Johnson's 27 goals last season were a major reason as to why Hassocks finished as high as 12th in the table and they'll be hoping that their captain can hit the goal trail soon.
