Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon for this afternoon's Southern Combination League Premier Division fixture against free-scoring Peacehaven...

We would like to welcome the players, management, officials and supporters of the Tye and hope that they enjoy their stay with us in Mid Sussex this afternoon.

Before we get to on-the-pitch matters, thank you to everyone who turned out for the very-belated AGM held in the Clubhouse on Monday night.

It was good for us to be able to update members on everything that has been going on over the past year, especially in light of the pandemic and where exactly that leaves us a club.

We were also delighted to welcome several new faces onto the committee - including a couple of former players in Nick Newman and Stuart Faith - with the hope of kick starting several projects which had to be shelved when the first lockdown came along in spring 2020.

Chief of those will be the development of the south field, a goal stead for the relegation fight ahead. which we have had for over a decade now but one which has never quite managed to come to fruition for one reason or another. We will keep you updated as plans develop so watch

this space.

To footballing matters and we picked up an excellent point from a 0-0 draw at Broadbridge Heath last Saturday.

Unless you have been living under the rock, you will have heard about how Phil ended up in goal for the final 30 minutes, keeping his first clean sheet since decimalisation.

Wickers aside, it was a superb performance in which the players had to really battle against opponents who were in good form and scoring goals for fun.

Four days previously we suffered a close-fought 2-1 defeat against Pagham which, were it not for some fine goalkeeping from the Lions' goalkeeper, might have ended in additional points on the board.

To be competing with sides like Broadbridge Heath and Pagham who are pushing for the top six is a sign of how far we have come in recent weeks and should stand us in good

Similar performance levels will be needed today against a Peacehaven outfit who have scored 29 goals in their past five matches if we are to take anything.

Away from first team matters, the Under 23s were 3-1 winners over Stevning Town in the League Cup nine days ago thanks to a trio of headers from Lewis Beebee, Luke Marshall and Charlie Tuck.

The Under 18s were edged out in a seven goal thriller last Sunday, going down 4-3 at Worthing United whilst a week earlier, the Ladies picked up their biggest victory for three seasons when beating Woodingdean Wanderers 7-0.

All of December's fixtures across all of our sides are confirmed in today's programme and with only one home game next month - the visit of Saltdean United on Saturday 18th - it would be great to see some support for the club's other teams.

That may be able to start tomorrow night, when the Veterans are due to face Ansty. We say may, because we are still unsure of whether the opposition will be able to raise a team. If you are considering coming along, please check with Owen behind the bar if the game is still going ahead.

Peacehaven have played six games so far in November, scoring 30 goals at an average of five a game. To say this would be a bad time to be facing the Tye would be a slight understatement...

Such has been our luck against Peacehaven this season. Our previous meeting came back in August when Mark Shutt's side were also flying, their 3-2 win over us at the Sports Park taking them joint top of the table alongside local rivals Saltdean United.

Things fell apart for Peacehaven after that and they went winless in 10, toppling from title contention into lower mid table as well as exiting the FA Cup, the FA Vase and Peter Bentley League Cup in the space of a September week.

The ship though has since been steadied, as those November results so far are testament to; a 10-0 win over Loxwood, a 6-0 success at East Preston and a 9-0 victory against Oakwood in midweek contributing hugely to that ridiculous goal total.

What these sequences of results tell us is that the Tye can be a quality side on their day - meaning our chances of getting something today could hinge on which Peacehaven turn up.

Any home fans looking for some positive signs from past meetings will find themselves barking up the wrong tree as our record against Peacehaven is spectacularly bad.

The Tye have won 21 of the 35 meetings with eight wins for us and seven draws.

We can at least take solace from the fact that today's game is here at the Beacon – trips to the Sports Park have been even more harrowing.

Hassocks have just one league win to their name down on the south coast in 12 attempts, coming under Mickey Jewell in the 2011-12 season when we went onto claim our highest ever Premier Division finish of fourth.

Peacehaven could have several faces familiar to Robins fans on show with three former Hassocks players currently amongst their ranks.

Liam Benson will be sure of a warm welcome for his efforts as part of our 2013-14 title winning youth team and subsequent record of 31 goals from 134 senior appearances.

The Tye can also count Alex Spinks and Alex Bygraves amongst their number - with it being particularly good to see Bygraves playing again after an injury hit few years.

Two players from either side could come up against their former clubs today after a couple last month. of seasons in which the red of Hassocks and the black and white of Peacehaven have been swapped with startling frequently.

Let us start on our side with Bradley Bant, currently in his third spell as a Hassocks player after rejoining the club in October from AFC Varndeanians.

Sandwiched between Bants' first and second spells with us was his time at Peacehaven, where he spent the 2018-19 and 2019-20 campaigns.

The other current Robin with Tye

connections is Lucas Tyrrell, who we swooped to sign from the Sports Park close his third spell at Hassocks.

Played for Both

Tyrrell will be hoping to feature against his former club should he recover from the injury which forced him off after 25 minutes of the Alfold victory a fortnight ago.

A glut of players left the Beacon for Peacehaven last summer and two still remain with the Tye, including Hassocks' 2019-20 season captain Alex Spinks.

Midfielder Spinks managed 29 appearances between 2018 and 2020 in what was an injury hit second spell at the Beacon.

Liam Benson also moved to the

Sports Park in 2020, bringing to a

Benson had come through the ranks at the Beacon as part of the Under 18s side who won the Central Division title in 2013-14, going onto score 31 times in 134 matches for the first time.

Playing alongside Spinks and Benson at the Tye last season were Harry Mills and James Broadbent.

Other notable names to have represented both include defender Sol Bowra who switched from Hassocks to Peacehaven a decade ago and striker Dan Smith who scored 26 goals from 63 games during his time as a Robin.

Still no wins but Hassocks give leaders Peacehaven a fright

That first win of the season Christian Kiddell, continuing in the continues to elude Hassocks but if they can deliver frights like the one they gave Peacehaven & **Telscombe at the Sports** Park then it surely cannot be too far away.

A 3-2 victory for the hosts represented a fifth successive success and moved them level on points with early leaders and local rivals Saltdean United, who they faced in a tantalising derby clash on Bank Holiday Monday.

Hassocks were clearly facing no slouches and although Peacehaven dominated much of the evening in terms of possession, the Tye were extremely grateful to hear the full time whistle as Hassocks had them on the ropes whilst chasing a most unlikely of draws.

The performance of the Robins could not have been further away from their weekend showing, when they scored two own goals on their way to a 5-1 home defeat to Broadbridge Heath.

Head coach Brad Sweetman made four changes from the side beaten by the Bears, two of them in his defence.

Dan Turner returned from an injury picked up on the opening day of the season and Luke Marshall was recalled from the bench to replace absent duo Arthur Rawlingson and Bradley Tighe.

17-year-old Sam Geard made his full debut in place of Ben Hicks and there was a first senior appearance for Jay Hudson, taking over from George Mitchell-Phillips in attack.

Former Burgess Hill Town man Hudson came into the clash in flying form having scored all four goals as the Under 23s beat Crowborough Athletic in their season opener the previous Thursday.

Peacehaven dominated the first 10 minutes without ever really testing Robins goal with Charlie Pugh still unavailable.

In fact, it was Hassocks who had the first chance of the match. Hudson was the man to fashion it, nearly marking his debut in perfect style when working his way into the area to fire in a shot was well repelled by Jake Hutson in the Tye goal.

Hassocks remained steadfast defensively right up until the half hour mark when Max Hollobone broke the deadlock in a spectacular manner.

There did not seem much on when the ball fell to the Peacehaven schemer on the edge of the box.

That was until he fizzed in a powerful strike from 25 yards, giving Kiddell no chance.

Other than that Hudson opportunity, Hassocks had been a non-entity as an attacking force throughout the first half, instead content to focus on maintaining their shape and keeping Peacehaven at bay.

That changed though with the introduction of George Mitchell-Phillips for Hudson during the break as the teenage forward suddenly started asking questions of the Tye defence.

Initially at least, Peacehaven were unable to cope with the threat posed by Mitchell-Phillips.

That eventually led to a Hassocks equaliser, Connor Bradley volleying home his first senior goal with 54 minutes on the clock.

Parity appeared to shake Peacehaven back into life and within 60 seconds of Bradley's leveller, the hosts retook the lead.

Louis Veneti and Tyler Scrafton combined to feed Jordan Pryor, whose strike clipped Kiddell's post on its way to nestling in the back of the net.

Sweetman made a double change on 73 minutes in an attempt to try and wrestle something from the

contest, Max Blencowe and Jude Wallis taking over from Bradley and Lewis Beebee respectively.

The first task of the new faces was unfortunately to watch Peacehaven add their third.

It came from Scrafton, capping off a fine individual performance with a richly deserved goal which most home observers felt meant the game was done and dusted.

Some Hassocks observers were probably wondering not only the same thing, but also if another mauling might be on the cards for their young team with 15 minutes still to play.

Instead, the Robins showed commendable fight to force their second goal of the evening and set up a nervy finish for the Tye.

Captain Andy Whittingham was the scorer, choosing a timely moment to net only his second Hassocks goal in over 100 appearances when smashing home during a goalmouth scramble with 83 minutes showing on the clock.

Hassocks threw everything they could at the Peacehaven goal in the final seven minutes plus stoppage time but were unable to find a way through, much to the relief of Tye boss Mark Shutt and his players.

Peacehaven got the result they needed to move joint top. Hassocks too could be pleased with their evening's work ahead of two home games in the space of 48 hours over the Bank Holiday weekend against Steyning Town and Lingfield as they chase that first win.

Robins still unbeaten but should have had more from talented Tye

Talented Peacehaven & Telscombe posed the sternest test vet of the **Mickey Jewell era at the** Beacon on Tuesday night.

A third successive 1-1 draw preserved Hassocks' unbeaten start under their new manager but the Robins will surely have been disappointed not to earn all three points.

Hassocks were superb in the first half and with a little more composure, they could have been out of sight rather than having a mere one goal lead provided by Sam Jeremiah.

Peacehaven came roaring back in the second half, as you would expect from a squad packed with some of the best talents in the County League and who will surely give title favourites Whitehawk a run for their money this season.

And despite their quality, the visitors still needed a hugely contentious penalty which left Jewell fuming to claim their share of the points.

One of the most notable aspects of the campaign so far has been the way in which Jewell rotates his players and there were several changes again from the side who drew with Arundel at the weekend.

The most intriguing came at right back, where 18-year-old Stuart Brown made his full debut in place of Luke Akehurst.

Brown won the Robins' Young Player of the Season award last year and is highly thought of by Jewell, who has been keen to involve him in the first team despite the influx of new arrivals to the Beacon.

There was also a change in goal, where the injured Mike Abbott was replaced by Jack Simpson.

Simpson was making his first appearance of the season but with his weekend cricketing commitments now all-but complete, he will be

available for the foreseeable future.

That will only strengthen Hassocks further, even if Abbott has hardly put a foot wrong since signing from Steyning Town.

Simpson had a relatively quiet evening despite the Tye dominating the possession count, the young Robins goalkeeper just fielding a couple of long range efforts and confidently collecting some crosses into his box.

Hassocks set their stall out early when Neil Kane forced a good save low down from Josh Heyburn and Brown embarked on a driving run and cross which was headed over by Jeremiah.

At the other end, a rare forav forward from Peacehaven saw Simpson save well from the influential Clive Snell.

The lead Hassocks deserved arrived on 32 minutes and it came via some brilliant football. Spencer Slaughter won possession in midfield and his pass found the industrious Lee Waterhouse out on the right.

Waterhouse is already becoming a fan favourite amongst the Hassocks faithful with his tricky wing play. He put that to good effect, dancing past his marker and whipping in an excellent cross for Jeremiah to glance chance in the final few minutes and it past Heyburn at the far post.

Jeremiah nearly doubled the lead five minutes later, beating Heyburn but not Jamie Cullinane who performed heroics to clear off the line.

The Tye used half time to their advantage, regrouping and taking the when Combined Counties League game to Hassocks through lots of possession football.

They were helped slightly in that regard by the Robins, who were quilty of giving the ball away cheaply and perhaps sitting a little too deep.

Ashley Marsh and Phil Gault were both correctly booked. Slaughter looked like he would go the same way, escaping with just a talking to from referee Nigel Baker for a robust foul.

Jewell decided to save Slaughter from having Baker take his name when replacing the midfielder with Anthony Hibbert in a bid to turn the tide.

Unfortunately, Hibbert's first task was to watch Mr Baker award the spot kick which levelled the game and looked soft in the extreme.

Andy Whittingham was adjudged to have nudged Snell, who sent Simpson the wrong way with the subsequent penalty.

Conceding an equaliser seemed to break Hassocks out of the defensive mood they had settled into and the final 25 minutes became much more of an even contest.

Peacehaven continued to do plenty of pressing but Simpson was untroubled and it was the Robins who had the better chances to win it.

Hibbert was inches wide with a trademark free kick curled towards the top corner which had Heyburn looking worried.

Cullinane then came to Peacehaven's rescue again, this time denying Jeremiah with a superb last ditch block following a fine run from the Hassocks forward.

Peacehaven mustered one final was no surprise to see Snell involved, his effort being well blocked by Simpson.

In the end, the spoils were shared. Hassocks remain unbeaten under Jewell with another examination of their abilities to come outfit Farnham Town visit the Beacon in the FA Cup on Saturday.

It will be lonely this Christmas with festive fixtures confirmed

It will be lonely at the Beacon this Christmas as Hassocks play only one Southern Combination League Premier Division home game in December.

The month gets underway with a trip to AFC Uckfield Town on Saturday 4th December. Uckfield were the first opponents who the Robins picked up a point against this season when the sides drew 2-2 at the Beacon back in August.

Hassocks head east again a week later, visiting the Sunshine Coast for a date with Eastbourne Town on Saturday 11th December.

You have to go back to February 2006 to find the last time the Robins left the Saffrons with three points, a 1-0 victory delivered by a Stuart Faith header.

Current Premier Division leaders Saltdean United provide the opposition at the Beacon on Saturday 18th December for that one home

fixture, which also happens to be our final game before Christmas.

The Tigers gave an indication of their intentions to be involved in the title race when hammering Hassocks 6-0 back in the opening week of the season.

December is rounded off with a trip to Crawley Down Gatwick on Monday 27th as the traditional post-Christmas fixture is pushed back 24 hours owning to Boxing Day falling on a Sunday this year.

It will be the first Premier Division meeting of the season between the clubs, although they have already met in the Sussex Senior Cup when the Anvils won 2-0 at the Beacon.

The Under 23s have just two fixtures in December. They travel to Alfold on Thursday 2nd for a 7:30pm kick off before hosting Steyning Town on Thursday 9th at 7:45pm.

December for the Under 18s starts away at Montpelier Villa on Sunday 5th with a slightly later start time than normal of 11:45am at Culver Road.

Back-to-back home games then round off 2021 for the Young Robins against Worthing United on Sunday 12th and AFC Varndeanians on Sunday 19th.

The Ladies also have a date at Villa to look forward to on Sunday 12th, followed by Roffey at the Beacon on Sunday 19th.

Finally, the Veterans are due to host Brockham on Sunday 5th. Kick off time and venue for that one are yet to be decided and as is always the case with vets football, could be subject to change right up until the last minute.

Loversidge needs a bigger mantlepiece for consecutive Player of the Month awards

He did it in September. Now he has done it in October. Four goals including a first senior hat-trick helps Alfie Loversidge to another Player of the Month award

Has Alfie Loversidge got a big enough mantlepiece? The young forward added the Hassocks October Player of the Month award to his September gong as his superb 2021-22 season continued.

It was a two-horse race for the title between Loversidge and Josh Short, who can consider himself unlucky to have not won a Player of the Month award of his own having finished in the top three in every vote so far.

On this occasion, Loversidge picked up 45.5 percent, beating Short who secured 36.4 percent. Charlie Pugh and Arthur Rawlingson shared third after both took 9.1 percent.

Loversidge started October by scoring the Hassocks goal in an impressive 1-1 draw at Bexhill United.

Better was to come the following week when he hit his first senior hattrick, firing the Robins to a vital 4-1 win over AFC Varndeanians.

The teenager was unplayable against V's, earning and converting the penalty which completed his treble and playing a minor role in Joe Bull's opener.

Having started the season playing in midfield, Loversidge drew comparisons for his October performances with another youth team product who found himself thrown up front once in the senior setup to great effect - Matt Amos.

If Loversidge can go onto have as big an impact as Amos managed, then there will be many more Player of the Month awards to come.

The main reason that Loversidge was so prolific throughout October

was because of the work of Short in midfield.

Short has already established himself as a firm fan favourite and spent most of the month being at the heart of everyone good that Hassocks did having been given a little more freedom in a more attacking role.

Nothing could separate Pugh and Rawlingson in third. Goalkeeper Pugh was voted as Man-of-the-Match in both the Eastbourne United and Horsham YMCA defeats following a string of excellent saves to prevent Hassocks falling to heavy defeats.

A lull in proceedings was followed by a period of Hassocks dominance as the game ticked past the half hour.

Next it was the turn of the cross bar to keep the Robins in the game. A wonderful passing move involving Jack Barnes, Olly Hambleton and Carroll ended with Langford smashing a first time shot against the woodwork.

Having completed 90 minutes on Saturday, Gault was by now starting look like he needed a lot of WD40 and a nice drop of Malbec.

Brad Sweetman withdrew his evergreen striker with Lewis Beebee taking Gault's place and Beebee really should have scored after being released by Turner and rounding Broughton.

His effort into the empty goal lacked the requisite power and that allowed Nathan Da Costa to get back and clear.

The exertions of the past week looked like they were no catching up with even those players much younger than Gault as Hassocks began flagging in the final 15 minutes.

Harris had to make a strong save with his feet from Grant Radmore and Langford, Clarke and Morey all squandered one-on-ones.

The Robins deserved a consolation at the very least and they did eventually get that deep into the fourth minute of injury time.

Wickwar rolls back the years to help Hassocks claim a point

The proof of the progress made by Hassocks this season was there for all to see at Broadbridge Heath.

When these sides met at the Beacon back in August, it was a horror show for Hassocks.

They were walloped 5-1, hopelessly outplayed and capped a miserable evening by managing the impressive feat of scoring two own goals. A long season looked ahead.

Fast forward three months and 19.8 miles north to High Wood Hill Sports Ground and the contrast could not have been more stark.

The Robins battled their way to a 0-0 draw against hosts who are enjoying their best ever top flight season, starting the afternoon fifth in the Premier Division table.

What made this result all the more impressive was that Hassocks achieved it shorn of the services of goalkeeper Alex Harris for the final 30 minutes.

A nasty blow to the head led to Harris leaving the field, his place taken by 47-year-old physio Phil Wickwar.

The number of times that Wickwar has been called upon in such circumstances over the past five years or so is frankly astonishing.

Other than using his favourite adjective of "shambles", he never complains though.

Wickwar would do quite literally anything for the club and that is why he has been such a popular figure at Hassocks for 30 years, filling virtually every role going.

In terms of goalkeeping cameos, this was arguably his best since he served as regular backup to Joel Harding in the mid-00's.

Wickwar rolled back the years even further than that, making two brilliant saves as if it were 1992 again to help preserve the clean sheet and with it, the point.

As a result, Wickwar was an easy

winner of Man-of-the-Match, with Hassocks now seeking sponsorship for the award from Age Concern in honour of their sprightly stand in.

Wickwar might have taken the headlines, but the rest of the Robins who featured deserve immense credit too.

Heath are not flying so high by fluke or accident; they are a quality outfit assembled by manager Chris Simmons and in number 9 Mason Doughty, they had the best player on the pitch.

Hassocks might not have had the edge on ability but their work rate throughout was phenomenal.

This was by no means a backs to the wall 0-0 as the Robins played a full part, at least before Harris departed. On another day, they might have even won it.

Doughty was the first player from either side to get a sight of goal, latching onto a defence splitting pass from Jamie Taylor and drawing a good stop low down on the angle from Harris with 13 minutes played.

Hassocks had their best spell after that, racking up three decent opportunities in 15 minutes.

Jack Troak could not connect properly as he scuffed wide when well placed. A good passage of play set Alfie Loversidge up for a left footed effort off target.

Jack Baden then swung over a free kick which Heath goalkeeper Liam Matthews was brave in dealing with, taking a clattering from Dan Turner for his troubles.

Doughty was soon back in the thick of the action, meeting a Charlie Weller right wing cross with a first time volley.

It was some hit from Doughty but luckily for Hassocks, it proved more dangerous to the property prices of the neighbouring flats than Harris' goal.

Heath started the second half strongest, Taylor seeing an effort blocked by Turner before Bradley



Tighe produced a first class covering tackle on Weller, who had beaten three Hassocks players on a mazy run up the right.

The collision involving Harris came on the hour mark. The Hassocks goalkeeper was crashed into by a Bears opponent when a corner was delivered into the box and although it was clearly accidental, the seriousness of the incident was obvious from the start.

There was a lengthy delay whilst Wickwar tended to the injury and Harris was helped from the field. Heath did a first class job in looking after Harris and he reported after the game that he was in good spirits, if a little sore.

With Wickwar now in goal, the hosts understandably fancied their chances of going onto win the game. Heath became even more determined to get on the front foot, beginning to pin Hassocks into their own half.

The Robins though dug in, manned the trenches and defended stubbornly. That restricted Heath to only three clear opportunities in the final 30 minutes.

Taylor headed wide from one of a barrage of Kyle Sim long throws before Wickwar came to the fore, tipping a Charlie Parmiter free kick over at full stretch and getting down to his left wonderfully to keep out a Doughty effort.

Jack Gardner was given a rare Under 23s appearance in place of Tighe, Luke Marshall took over from Badger and Tyrrell's place was taken by the Robins' five-goal top scorer Jay Hudson, promoted back into the starting XI having sat on the bench for Alfold match.

Dan Turner was a notable used substitute for Hassocks, getting his first minutes since an August injury. He appeared to come through relatively unscathed, which is good news for the first team ahead of a very important run of matches over the next few weeks against fellow Premier Division strugglers.

For over an hour, this was an even contest. It was clear why both



these sides were yet to lose a game as they played some excellent football with little to separate them.

It remained locked at 0-0 right up until the 70th minute, when Tyler Symonds managed to break the deadlock for Heath.

Hassocks had to pour forward in response and that left space for the Bears to exploit on the counter.

And that was where there killer second came from, scored with 10 minutes remaining by Harry Williams to move Heath three points clear at the top.

Next up for Hassocks is a tough looking trip to Crowborough Athletic in a week's time.

It was a Sussex Senior Cup second round trip to Storrington on this day in **2012** and the people of Hassocks reported spotting rocking horse droppings in the village as Ashley Marsh scored a goal...

5-1, even Marshy scored

There was no upset in the Sussex Senior Cup second round battle of the birds as the Swans of Storrington were soundly beaten 5-1 by the Robins of Hassocks.

On paper, this looked like a potential banana skin for Hassocks. They were up against determined opponents from the division below on a Recreation Ground pitch that looked difficult to play on and with a strong wind blowing from one end to the other.

If Storrington thought the conditions might be a leveller, then they were in for a rude awakening.

The Robins gave a thoroughly professional performance, bossing the first half despite playing against that wind and had the tie virtually won as they turned around 3-1 up.

James Westlake opened the scoring with a shot on the turn after 17 minutes. Then on the half hour mark, there was an surprise as Ashley Marsh made it 2-0.

In over 300 games for Hassocks, Marsh had only managed to get on the scoresheet once before.

That had come some eight years earlier, a first time volley from 30 yards to open the scoring in a 4-1 win over Southwick.

Then-Robins boss Dave John described it afterwards as one of the best goals he had ever seen, and Johnsy has seen quite a lot.

Marsh's second in Hassocks colours was not quite as spectacular and it needed a helping hand from a linesman to count, the official flagging to indicate that the third shot of a game of ping-pong from a corner had crossed the line.

Storrington had barely threatened but 10 minutes after Marsh struck, a Will Conway shot from distance took a slight deflection off Lee Bryant to beat goalkeeper Simon Lehkyj on his Robins debut.

That sparked a madcap finish to the first half. Two minutes later and referee Jacob Miles harshly adjudged Marsh to have fouled some 25 yards out from goal.

Conway struck a superb free kick which rattled the underside of Lehkyj's cross bar, from which Hassocks swept up the other end within 60 seconds to make it 3-1.

Jamie Weston was the architect, leading the counter attack before playing in Dan Smith who made no mistake.

A two-goal lead was the least the Robins deserved for their first half efforts - parity would have been a travesty had Conway's effort gone in - and the visitors set about adding to their total in the second half with the wind now in their favour.

Smith scored his second and Hassocks' fourth when picking the pocket of Swans goalkeepers Matt Chester on the hour.

The fifth and final goal arrived two minutes later, Rob South overlapping down the right to provide a low cross and a close range finish for Anthony Hibbert.

It was a surprise to see Mr Miles

flash three yellow cards in the second half of a contest which was mild mannered throughout.

Two of those booking went to Storrington players. The Hassocks offender was Smith and it cost him the chance of a hat-trick, Mickey Jewell immediately withdrawing his fiery striker to prevent yellow becoming red.

Smith passed up a couple of opportunities for his treble prior to his removal, curling wide of the far post in a lively showing.

That was in contrast to his strike partner Phil Gault, who cut an unusually subdued figure and rarely looked like getting on the scoresheet. Perhaps he was suffering from shock at Marsh netting?

A good evenings work then for Hassocks, who also got captain Stuart Faith's one-match suspension out of the way without him having to miss a league game in the Robins' quest for a top three finish.

Bryant did well standing in at centre back whilst Lehkyj was given his chance in goal ahead of James Plumley, having originally been due to start in Saturday's postponed Division One game at home to Arundel when Plumley was away.

With two quality goalkeepers on the books vying to replace the Worthing-bound Jack Simpson, Jewell may face something of a dilemma trying to keep them both happy although it is a problem most managed would be prepared to have.

Ever since receiving a Premier Division relegation reprieve at the end of the 2016-17 season, AFC Uckfield Town have been a club on the up. Year-by-year they have improved their finishing position and in 2020-21 they looked on cause to record their highest ever spot, sitting fifth before the season was curtailed. They have not managed to hit those heights this season following Steve Ives's appointment as sole boss, a young team rather like our own sitting in 15th spot with four wins, seven draws and eight defeats from their 19 games so far.

Our record against AFC Uckfield Town?

We have met AFC Uckfield on 18 occasions, losing nine, winning eight and drawing once, so this is probably one not to have on your coupon. Goals are normally in plentiful supply too with 73 having been plundered at an average of over four per game.

Last time we met?

We picked up our first point of the season - and a first ever draw against the Oakmen - back in August here at the Beacon. Jordan Badger marked his first game in over two years with an 87th minute equaliser after being thrown on as an emergency striker. Our other goal from Alfie Loversidge whilst Uckfield scored via Luke Blewden and Sam Carrington.

How to get to the Oaks?

Take the A272 followed by the A26 towards Uckfield before joining the B2102 into the town itself. Turn right at the t-junction, past the railway station and follow the road down the high street. When the fork is reached, take the left hand option down Eastbourne Road with the ground being on the left by the Rajditt Restaurant.

Eastbourne Town this season?

Eastbourne Town are notorious for starting slowly, hitting form a couple of months into the campaign but having left themselves a little too much to do to get into the title race. It looks like being a similar story this season. A month ago, they were floating around 10th spot but some sparkling form in recent weeks has pushed them towards the top five. They have nine wins, six draws and four defeats from 19 matches marking them out as difficult to beat even before you consider our terrible record at the Saffrons.

Our record against Eastbourne Town?

We have met on 37 occasions with Town winning over half of them – 22 – to the Robins' nine with six draws along the way. In 25 meetings in the Southern Combination Premier, Town again lead the head-to-head with Hassocks having won just once in the past 14 years – a shock 2-1 success towards the end of the 2016-17 season with Phil Gault scoring twice and James Broadbent saving a penalty against his former club. You have to go back even further for our last win at the Saffrons, Stuart Faith scoring in a 1-0 victory in 2006.

Last time we met?

Town provided the opposition in our first Premier Division home game of the season back in August. It was close encounter as the visitors ran out 2-1 winners thanks to goals from Aaron Hopkinson and Leon Greig. Josh Short got our consolation goal, his first for the club.

How to get to the Saffrons?

The normal route to Eastbourne via the A27 and the A2770, following the road towards Eastbourne town centre. Turn right into The Goffs just before reaching the main station followed by an immediate left into Southfields Road. That is followed by another right into Dittons Road with the Saffrons on the left at the end of the road.


