Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon for our first Southern Combination Premier Division home game of 2022 as we welcome Bexhill United

This is the first time that the Pirates have sailed into these parts for a league match since the 1994-95 season and we hope that their players, management, officials and supporters enjoy their stay with us today.

It has been a bit of a whirlwind couple of weeks since we last played at the Beacon, an enthralling evening of football against Crawley Down Gatwick in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

Despite the Anvils arriving higher than us in the table, we progressed to the last eight of the competition with an excellent 2-1 victory delivered by two Jack Troak goals in extra time.

The chance to secure a rare place in the final four of a knockout cup takes place on Tuesday 15th February against Division One title contenders Seaford Town.

It looks on paper an incredibly tough game, but so did the Crawley Down fixture. If you can make it along to cheer on the players, then that could help make a real difference on the night and would be very much appreciated by everyone at the club.

Two other first team fixtures have taken place since that dramatic evening. We had the honour of being the first team to visit Little Common Recreation Ground for a league fixture since Common were allowed to return, picking up a fine 2-2 draw.

Last Saturday saw us lose our first match of 2022, going down 1-0 at Eastbourne United after 90 minutes which anyone is unlikely to remember for too long.

Away from senior business, the Under 23s are unbeaten after their first two matches of the calendar year Enjoy the game, after recovering from two goals down

After a 30 year absence from the Southern Combination League Premier Division, Bexhill United have not wasted any time on making an impression in their first top flight campaign since the 1990-91 season...

The Pirates were awarded promotion the Pirates are well in the race for in the summer by the FA based on their results in Division One over the previous two curtailed seasons, a deserved reward as Ryan Light and his players had been hanging onto the coattails of Littlehampton Town in both 2019-20 and 2020-21 before Covid-19 struck.

Just how strong the top of the lower division has been over the past couple of years has been evidenced by Littlehampton being on course to win the Southern Combination League title at the first attempt and Bexhill having spent virtually all of the campaign in the top six.

The Pirates arrive in Mid Sussex having won 14 and drawn eight of their 25 games, meaning that only three of their matches have ended in defeat - the joint-lowest in the division alongside Littlehampton and Newhaven.

That record leaves Bexhill currently sitting sixth in the table but with games in hand on every side above them, bar the leaders.

Win their additional matches and they would go level with current second placed side Newhaven, so

the runners up spot at the very least. Taking the silver medal would result in Bexhill's best campaign since 1969.

Central to their outstanding season has been the presence of two prominent goal scorers in Light's squad. Evan Archibald needs no introduction having regularly tormented Hassocks during his time at Eastbourne Town.

He has 22 goals to his name, exactly the same number as his strike partner Jack Shonk. With two strikers of that sort of quality, it is little wonder Bexhill are flying.

More of a surprise is that Hassocks have already taken a point from the Pirates this season. October's trip to the Polegrove was the first league meeting between the clubs since the 1994-95 season.

It ended 1-1, a bit of a shock result given the contrasting starts to the season the sides had made with United flying and us struggling.

Repeating the feat today looks a tough ask - but if we can keep Bexhill's deadly front duo quiet, who knows...

In the end, the journey was worth it. Those Hassocks fans who used their precious petrol to make the longest away trip of the season to Bexhill United in the middle of the fuel crisis were rewarded by witnessing the Robins take an excellent point with a 1-1 draw at the Polegrove.

The Pirates have made quite a splash in their first Premier Division season for 30 years, sitting seventh in the early table with six wins from 10 matches.

Included in that impressive haul was a 3-1 victory over title favourites Saltdean United last time out, a result that pointed to a difficult afternoon for Hassocks on the East Sussex coast.

The Robins though have been showing improvement over the past few weeks, pushing both Premier Division leaders Littlehampton Town close in the league and then doing likewise to Combined Counties Premier table toppers Beckenham Town in the FA Vase.

And Hassocks were well worth their point here in horrific conditions which resulted in numerous games across the county either being postponed or abandoned before the final whistle.

There was never any danger of that at the Polegrove. Although not the best surface, the pitch was extremely dry before kick off and it coped admirably with all mother nature could throw at it over the course of a grim afternoon.

The last time Hassocks had visited these parts for a league game had been in their 1994-95 Division One promotion season, drawing 2-2.

Phil Wickwar had been an unused substitute on that day and remarkably, he was back on the Robins bench for this one 26 years later.

That was not the only note of interest amongst Brad Sweetman's substitutes; Spencer Slaughter was also named having re-joined Hassocks for a fourth spell following his departure from the manager's seat at Loxwood.

Slaughter came on for the final 12 minutes and although it will take him some weeks to get up to full match fitness, the fan favourite will bring some much needed leadership and experience to what is the youngest squad in the Premier Division.

Hassocks made two changes from the close-fought 2-1 defeat against Beckenham last time out.

Andy Whittingham was replaced by Bradley Tighe and Alex Harris took over in goal from Harvey Parker.

Harris looked to have a particularly difficult task on his hands, dealing with relentless torrential rain and a wind swirling at speeds approaching 45 miles per hour.

None of that seemed to bother him, however. He was confident claiming when he needed to be despite the unpredictability of what the ball would do in the gale and his handling was exceptional all afternoon.

Having seen Hassocks concede two or more goals in 10 of their 12 previous matches, it was quite an achievement for only one to go in on a day when the weather could easily have claimed a couple of assists – enough to earn Harris the Robins's man-of-the-match accolade, in fact.

Just behind Harris in that particular vote was Alfie Loversidge. He opened the scoring in only the seventh minute with his fourth goal of the campaign following a swashbuckling move down the left.

Bradley Bant released Joe Bull working the channel and his cut back to the penalty spot was slammed into the top corner by Loversidge to shock the home crowd by giving Hassocks the lead.

Unfortunately, that lead lasted only 13 minutes. Hassocks should have doubled their advantage from a corner but the effort was placed straight at Bexhill goalkeeper Alexander Zamani.

From there, the Pirates pillaged down the right and a low cross from Jack Shonk was tapped in by the prolific Evan Archibald.

Hassocks had a chance to retake the lead on the stroke of half time, Zamani parrying an on-target effort away.

The loose ball fell to Arthur Rawlingson but with the goal gaping, he could not quite toe poke home.

Bexhill were much the dominant side in the second half and the Robins needed all hands on deck to prevent their point from disappearing to Davy Jones' locker.

There was one shivering moment in the final five minutes when the Pirates thought they had sunk Hassocks by putting the ball in the back of the net from a follow up after a good stop by Harris.

The away bench were convinced it was offside and after what felt like an eternity, referee Chris Stobard and his assistant came to the same conclusion and the goal was scuttled.

That seemed to knock the wind out of Bexhill's sails and Hassocks held on, ending a run of five consecutive defeats ahead of three huge home games against AFC Varndeanians, Eastbourne United and Horsham YMCA.

Five star Robins leave Pirates all at sea to set up plum Bognor tie

Bognor Regis Town will be visiting the Beacon in the third round of the Sussex Senior Cup after Hassocks set up a plum tie with Conference South opposition thanks to a 5-0 win away at Bexhill United.

On paper, this looked a potential banana skin of a fixture, especially given that Hassocks had already exited the John O'Hara Cup to Division One opponents Rustington this season.

In the end though, the Robins made it look simple at the Polegrove as they gave a professional performance that was easily the best so far since John Suter and Mickey Jewell took the reins in the summer.

There were five different scorers, a first clean sheet for 17-year-old Jack Simpson and for the first time this season, Hassocks never looked in danger at any point.

The first 40 minutes were pretty even with both sides giving the ball away with alarming regularity.

Simon Bristow was handed the opportunity to partner James Laing in attack and it was his angled shot that flew just wide after five minutes that provided the first opportunity of the tie.

At the other end, Jack Aston lashed a shot inches wide before Ashley Marsh found himself in unfamiliar territory in front of the opposing goal after Laing played him in.

How Marsh ended up there remains a complete mystery and the realisation that he was through one-on-one certainly seemed to panic him.

As a result, Marsh attempted to square the ball when a shot on target would surely have beaten United goalkeeper Akyut Kusha, although the Hassocks defender could be forgiven his lack of striking instinct after a record of one goal in 170 appearances.

Bristow, who had been one of the main culprits when it came to handing possession to hosts, was the man who opened the scoring with 38 minutes on the clock.

There was a huge helping hand from Kusha as Bristow's effort from 25 yards looked to be an extremely tame one, yet somehow it eluded the grasp of Kusha and just about trickled over the line to give Hassocks the lead.

The Robins made one enforced change at the break as Matt Russell replaced the injured Laing and it was the former Burgess Hill Town striker's arrival into proceedings that saw Hassocks grab the tie by the scruff of the neck.

Within 14 minutes of his introduction, Russell doubled the Robins advantage although the goal owed much to the industry of Dan Jacques at right wing back.

This was another promising performance from Jacques and he found himself in an advanced position after a lung busting run forward.

It looked like he'd blown the opportunity though when producing an almighty scuff yet somehow the ball went through the home defence and straight into the path of the onrushing Russell who slotted home at the second attempt.

Hassocks were in control now. Matt Percival was just over with a dipping volley and Bristow failed to clear Kusha with an attempted lob when one on one with the keeper. Suter turned to Matt Amos and Anthony Hibbert to replace Bristow and Percival in a double substitution on 67 minutes and the introduction of two of the Robins' most dangerous attacking threats helped them wrap the tie up comfortably.

Russell should have made it three within a couple of minutes of the changes and then Bexhill sub Ricky Mote missed their clearest chance when firing over Simpson's bar from 12 yards.

Jamie Hillwood added the Robins third with 10 minutes remaining with a stunning individual effort for his first goal for the first team since stepping up from last season's League Cup winning youth team.

Hillwood started with the ball inside his own half before riding three or four Bexhill challenges and tucking under the body of Kusha.

In an action packed last 10 minutes, Russell somehow hit the post from a yard out before Spencer Slaughter netted the fourth by rounding off a fine move that involved Hibbert, Russell and Amos with a neat finish.

The scoring was completed in injury time by Hibbert who placed the ball out of the reach of Kusha having collected an excellent lay off from Amos.

Westlake one-two goes Lewis' way for December Player of the Month

December may have been a bit of a washout with only two games played, but that was all Lewis Westlake needed to win back-to-back Hassocks Player of the Month awards.

The midfielder hammered in three goals from four appearances in November, enough to see him claim the gong ahead of Arthur Rawlingson in second and brother James Westlake in third.

This time, it was a Westlake onetwo with only 3.9 percent of the vote keeping Lewis ahead of James, leaving Rawlingson to settle for third spot this time around.

Lewis continued his excellent goal scoring form in December's first game when Hassocks were beaten 5-2 away at Eastbourne Town.

The Robins were two goals behind midway through the first half when referee Nick Blogg deemed that Alfie Loversidge had been fouled outside the Town penalty area when most spectators felt it was a clear penalty.

If the hosts thought that Mr Blogg's decision making had given them a lucky reprieve then they mistaken, Westlake sending the resulting free kick past Chris Winterton and into the back of the net.

That made it four goals in five appearances for Westlake since rejoining Hassocks from Steyning Town. In contrast, he had scored four in 77 appearances over the course of his two previous spells with the Robins.

Westlake could not add to his total when Premier Division leaders Saltdean Untied visited the Beacon but he was at the heart of an industrious Hassocks performance which saw the Robins claim a point from a star-studded Tigers outfit.

Brother James' second place in the December Player of the Month poll stemmed from his man-of-thematch performance against Eastbourne Town.

Senior Westlake was a real driving force and played a part in the Robins' second goal at the Saffrons, a fine cross from out on the right being headed home by Sam Smith scoring a debut goal following his move from Loxwood.

With Hassocks' draw against

Saltdean stemming largely from their unbelievable work rate, the presence of an international marathon runner in midfield obviously went a long way towards helping secure that most unlikely of draws.

Holding off the challenge of Jack Baden for third was Rawlingson in a battle between two players have been absolute revelations since taking over the full back positions from the injured duo of Jack Gardner and Andy Whittingham.

Rawlingson has combined solid defensive abilities down the right with a penchant for getting forward when the time is right, enabling him to make a difference at both ends.

That was most evident in the Saltdean match when his powerful charge forward and cross into the box looked set to be chinned in by Josh Hawkes until the veteran midfielder was blatantly tripped by a defender.

Had Hassocks got the penalty they deserved for that, they might have even beaten the table topping Tigers - and a good December could have become a great one.

Five February fixtures lie in wait for Hassocks with the obvious highlight being the Sussex **Principal RUR Charity Cup** quarter final with Seaford Town.

The Badgers will visit the Beacon on Tuesday 15th February with a 7:45pm kick off to decide who will progress to the final four of the competition.

Town are enjoying an excellent season in Division One, where they are currently locked in a fascinating four-way title battle with Roffey, Epsom & Ewell and Midhurst & Easebourne.

Their cup form has been equally impressive. To reach this stage of the competition, Seaford have already eliminated one Premier Division outfit in Broadbridge Heath and accounted for Isthmian League side Lancing.

Seaford visit three days later before the Robins go to Gorings Mead to face Horsham YMCA on Saturday 19th February, followed by a home Premier Division fixture with Loxwood on Saturday 26th.

This though was anything but boring and nobody was complaining about an extra half hour, especially the fan on the sideline heard to say: "Excellent, a bonus 30 minutes away from my missus."

As recently as six weeks ago, not many would have given Hassocks much hope of keeping man from wife by taking Down to extra time.

The Robins' struggles in the opening three months of the season are fast becoming a distant memory however; they have now won four, drawn three and lost only two of their last nine matches.

That lengthy autumn injury list has begun shrinking as key players return - and they do not come much more key than Jack Troak.

The Hassocks captain scored both goals against Down in a typically energetic performance down the left flank in which he did not give his former teammate Harvey Blake a moments peace.

Having Troak fit is as good as a new signing for Brad Sweetman. Troak brings goals - something the Robins have missed since Charlie Pitcher's summer departure - and boundless enthusiasm that rubs off on everyone around him.

Pitcher is of course another ex-Robin now of Crawley Down's parish. the scoring in the first 15 minutes.

Hassocks passed up two opportunities to clear their lines in a matter of seconds. Oli Leslie crossed and Pitcher with his back to goal produced a chest and bicycle kick which dropped just over the bar and onto the roof of the net.

The Robins created their first chance three minutes later with a lightning quick counter. A crunching Dan Turner tackle on Josh Brown in the home box led to Troak scampering up the left.

Troak switched to Lewis Westlake who touched inside to Jude Wallis. From 30 yards, Wallis hit a strike which beat Down goalkeeper Alex Bellingham but not the cross bar.

After clattering the top of the goal once, the ball looped up 15 yards into the air. Remarkably, it then dropped straight back onto the bar before bouncing out for a goal kick.

Turner thought he had scored with the last play of the first half, a looping header from a Lewis Westlake free kick fumbled in by Bellingham. Alfie Loversidge though had strayed offside when challenging the goalkeeper and so the goal was chalked off amongst minimal appeals.

Hassocks were more vehement in their belief that they should have had a penalty eight minutes into the second half.

Turner again was involved, his header from another pinpoint Lewis Westlake delivery appearing to be blocked by the hand of Mike Spence. Neither referee Simon Faires nor his assistant James Slaney agreed.

Josh Short came to the fore next, fashioning good opportunities with three driving runs which provided routine saves for Bellingham.

Turner was also denied by the Down goalkeeper after staying up from a corner, picking up the pieces of a fine slide tackle from substitute Marshall Smith, sidestepping a man





and cracking a low shot towards goal.

Down appeared to be getting tired towards the end of the 90, perhaps as a result of their past three matches being postponed.

It did not come as too much of a surprise therefore when Hassocks took the lead six minutes into the additional 30. Lewis Westlake was scythed down in the box as he jinked towards goal and Troak confidently despatched the resulting penalty.

That seemed to shake Down into life. Within five minutes of Troak's opener, another ex-Robin Harvey Enticknap headed on a free kick for fellow substitute Ben Chowney to bundle home an equaliser.

Hassocks were lucky not to concede a penalty right on the stroke of half time in extra time. Leslie was caught in the box but his theatrical scream led Mr Faires to believe the Down forward was making a mountain out of a mole hill and so play was waved on.

There were a couple of further hairy moments for the Robins to navigate. They were especially grateful for Alex Harris making a superb flying stop to his right to keep out a bending Nick Sullivan shot before Troak won it for Hassocks on the counter with five minutes left.

James Westlake turned over possession in midfield, releasing Troak with a defence splitting pass. Captain Jack was calmness personified as he raced clear and beat Bellingham with a low, hard effort drilled into the corner.

Hassocks twice recover to deny Common a winning homecoming

For the first time in over four years, Little Common played a league game at their Recreation Ground. Hassocks were not the most obliging of party guests, twice coming from behind to secure a 2-2 draw and deny the Green Lane Boys a win on their long -awaited homecoming.

The last time Common had taken to their own patch for Southern Combination action was April 2017, spending nearly half-a-decade ground sharing 12 miles away at Eastbourne United's Oval due to the Recreation Ground not having the required grading to host Premier Division football.

An intrigued crowd of 184 turned out to check out the improved facilities - including two new stands - delivered thanks to the hard work of everyone behind the scenes at Common.

Those in attendance were suitably impressed by both the upgrades and the football, an entertaining 90 minutes that ebbed and flowed.

Common were determined to give their fans something to celebrate on their return but Hassocks have developed a mean streak in recent months.

This was undoubtedly a game the Robins would have lost in the autumn; not now though, a run of four wins, four draws and two defeats from their last 10 matches instilling new belief and confidence in Brad Sweetman's team that they can compete with most teams in the league.

Despite having gone through a grueling 120 minutes on a heavy pitch when eliminating Crawley Down Gatwick from the RUR Cup in extra time on Tuesday night, Sweetman limited his changes with only two from the side who saw off the Anvils.

Of those, Charlie Tuck had played all but the opening half hour against

Down after replacing Arthur Rawlingson, who had only suitably recovered from his midweek knock to sit on the bench here.

The other change saw the evergreen Phil Gault available for his first start since November at the expense of young Jude Wallis.

Hassocks had expected a strong start from Common and they were duly swamped from the off by the hosts, eventually leading to a 13th minute opener.

Sam Ellis swung over a corner and the Robins' marking was poor, leaving Common top scorer Lewis Hole to head unmarked past Alex Harris.

Hassocks had to weather more of the storm before they could make an impression on the game, Johnny Walker with a long distance effort nearly as strong as his namesake's whiskey being followed by a similar drive from Liam Ward which had Harris a little concerned.

The Robins' first venture into the Common half came when Josh Short worked himself into a decent position, only to drill a low one across the area that was well held by home goalkeeper Matt Cruttwell.

Captain Jack Troak was next to threaten. Alfie Loversidge and James Westlake built an opportunity for Troak to scamper down the left but his shot was just wide of the post.

Hassocks' first equaliser of the afternoon arrived on 26 minutes. James Westlake did well to get possession to Gault just inside the Common area.

Gault had his back to goal but he turned on a sixpence, curling an effort out of the reach of Cruttwell to nestle in the bottom corner via the upright.

Things tapered off a little after that, hardly a surprise given the breakneck speed that the opening 30 minutes had been played at.

Normal service was however resumed at the start of the second





half when both sides had opportunities to take the lead inside the first seven minutes.

Hassocks were first to go close, Short heading a Loversidge delivery wide. Common were not so wasteful, new signing Freddie Warren capitalising on a mistake in the Robins defence to square across goal for Hole to sidefoot home his second and restore the hosts' lead.

Common should have added a third almost straight from the restart. They regained possession and headed up field through Sam Ellis. Amazingly, nobody in claret and blue could get on the end of Ellis' fizzed cross which only needed a touch to send it past Harris.

Hassocks punished that by equalising again with 13 minutes left to play. Short picked up possession in midfield and drove at the Common defence.

As they backed off, the space opened up for him to hit a low drive from 25 yards which found the bottom corner.

Common finished the stronger - hardly a surprise given the tiredness Hassocks must have been feeling following their Tuesday night exertions - but the visitors stayed strong in the face of a number of hopeful balls tossed into the box, Dan Turner heading clear anything that came his way.

There was one late scare when Common might have been awarded a penalty. Half-hearted appeals from home connections told their own story about that, with the draw being the correct outcome in the end.

Blast from Ball sends Hassocks to their first defeat of 2022

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 22nd January 2021, The Oval **Eastbourne United 0-0 Hassocks**

Eastbourne United has not been the happiest of hunting grounds for Hassocks in recent times and their 2022 visit went to form as they suffered a 1-0 reversal at the Oval.

There was a time when trips to this part of the world used to mean a guaranteed three points for the Robins.

Between 2010 and 2019, they won on six consecutive visits to United, a run of form made all the more extraordinary by the fact that Hassocks finished below United in all but two of those seasons.

The Robins though have now lost on their three most recent games against United at the Oval, this latest defeat ending their impressive unbeaten start to the new year.

Home captain Charlie Ball scored the only goal of the game midway through the first half with what was one of the few moments of quality in a pretty turgid affair.

Good football was in short supply as both sides seemed determined to go long, making it an attritional 90 minutes in stark contrast to the entertainment Hassocks have been involved with serving up since the start of December.

Injuries and unavailability have meant that Brad Sweetman has rarely been able to name an unchanged starting XI so far this season.

He was treated to that luxury at the Oval, selecting the same line up who had spoiled Little Common's homecoming party a week earlier when holding the Green Lane Boys to a draw in their first league game at the Recreation Ground for four years.

Changes now seem likely for next week's visit of Bexhill United. Bradley Tighe had an excellent personal performance brought to a premature ending when he departed with an ankle injury to be replaced by Arthur

Rawlingson whilst there were also decent cameos from the bench from Joe Bull and debutant Charlie Broad.

Young Broad in particular looks an intriguing signing. Yet another acquisition with Loxwood links, his senior bow for the Robins came less than 48 hours after he had scored twice for the Under 23s in a 3-2 win over Horsham YMCA which took the Robins development squad top of the North Division.

The closest either side came to opening the scoring before Ball struck for a quite unnecessary foul. was when Tigana Quebe fancied a crack from distance but his effort from outside the area did not bother Alex Harris in the slightest.

More troubling to Harris was Ball's excellent strike from 25 yards which whistled into the back of the net to give United the lead with 27 minutes on the clock.

There was little the Robins number one could do as Ball conjured something out of nothing.

The 122 in attendance - including a decent number of travelling Hassocks supporters - were no doubt hoping that Ball's moment of magic might spark the game into life.

Unfortunately, that was not the case and neither side were able to string more than four or five passes together.

Hassocks did lots of huffing and puffing and nobody could fault their work rate. Phil Hawkins in the United goal was rarely troubled despite James and Lewis Westlake and Josh Short's attempts to make something happen.

The hosts meanwhile really should have gone into the interval with a two goal advantage, squandering a gilt-edged opportunity in first half stoppage time.

Harris got in a bit of a mess when attempting to gather Jack Murphy's corner, the loose ball falling to Harvey Mapstone who seemed to be caught by surprise at the chance unfolding to him as he somehow fired





over.

United registered the first chance of the second half 10 minutes after the restart, Harris doing better to hold a shot after Brett Patton broke clear.

The lively Max Thompson went through one-on-one, only to put his effort off target. That seemed to frustrate the United player and two minutes later he picked up a booking

Ball nearly had his second of the afternoon when meeting a Quebe cross with a powerful header that Harris repelled and the Hassocks goalkeeper again denied the same player with five minutes remaining.

Even when an astonishing eight minutes of injury time was played owing to several stoppages including for Tighe's departure, Hassocks were unable to force an opportunity as they finished the game with only 10 men on the pitch.

Their frustration had manifested itself just before the end of the 90 when the usually calm Lewis Westlake found his way into the sin bin.

You could excuse the Robins an off day though following a run of four wins, four draws and two defeats in their last 10 outings, pulling themselves 10 points clear of the bottom two in the process.

Two goal deficits not a problem as Hassocks comeback once again

Hassocks Under 23s are getting rather good at this coming from two goals behind thing.

A week after turning around a 2-0 half time deficit to draw 2-2 with Southern Combination League North Division leaders Broadbridge Heath, the Robins went one better by beating Horsham YMCA after again recovering from the same situation.

Not only that, but the result took Hassocks top of the table for the first time since October thanks to Heath being held 1-1 at home by Roffey.

It would still take something of a miracle for the Robins to win their first Under 23 title, mind.

Despite it not even being the end of January yet, Hassocks play their final league game of the season next Thursday night away at St Francis Rangers.

The Robins currently lead Heath by one point but the Bears have three matches left to play, giving them an extra two fixtures in hand in which to overhaul Hassocks.

Visitors YM had been one of the most dominant Under 23 sides in recent years. They won the North Division the last time a season was played to a finish in 2018-19, pipping Hassocks to the title.

That incidentally was the most recent campaign in which the Robins themselves were involved in the race.

YM also led the way in both the 2019-20 and 2020-21 campaigns at the point they were curtailed, suggesting that they would have added further silverware to the

Gorings Mead cabinet.

They have a younger side this season however made up of mainly teenagers and that has left them lower down the standings but with a bright long-term future.

Eight of YM's squad that travelled to the Beacon came from their Under 18s side and five of those were 16-year-olds.

That is not to say that they lack quality. Hassocks knew only too well what they would be up against, YM being the only side the Robins failed to beat in an opening seven fixtures to the season which yielded six wins and a 1-1 draw away in Horsham.

Hassocks gave full debuts to two players in amongst five changes from the previous week's top-of-the-table stalemate with the Bears.

Charlie Broad made his first start since arriving from Loxwood and Jamie Douglass from the Under 18s was rewarded for an excellent season in the youth team and a promising cameo from the bench against Broadbridge Heath.

Archie Russell was promoted from the bench to lead the line, Arthur Rawlingson returned from an injury picked up in the first team's Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup win over Crawley Down Gatwick nine days ago, and the final change saw Ryan West take over in goal from Harvey Parker.

Ben Hicks missed his first Under 23s game of the season with the other absentees from the Heath draw being Connor Bradlley, Phil Gault and George Mercer who somehow injured himself hopping over the perimeter





barrier to collect a ball last week.

What made this latest comeback particularly impressive was that it was done with a threadbare squad, including only three substitutes. Even head coach Brad Sweetman was able to justify giving himself some minutes from the bench.

Hassocks seemed to be caught cold at the start of an absolutely freezing evening at the Beacon as YM sauntered into their two goal lead.

Both came from one of those 16year-olds, Stan Berry notching in the fourth and 15th minute to leave the Robins with a mountain to climb.

Thankfully, they have become rather adept at doing that in the new year. Rawlingson pulled one back from the penalty spot within a couple of minutes of Berry doubling YM's advantage.

It was then over to Broad to become the hero. He opened his Hassocks account with the equaliser on 25 minutes before going onto hit the winner which keeps the Robins' slim title hopes alive - just.



Familiar foe Rye leave Robins season in meltdown

In the space of one short month, a season that held plenty of promise for Hassocks has collapsed - and the disintegration started and finished with Rye United.

The East Sussex club ended the Robins' very real hopes of winning the Sussex RUR Charity Cup four days after Christmas, beating Dave John's side 2-1 at the Salts in the quarter finals of a wide open competition.

Then on Tuesday night, they came to the Beacon and pocketed three valuable points in their battle to avoid relegation, winning 2-0 to leave Hassocks' title challenge hanging by a thread.

Those two victories have well and truly buried the memory of Hassocks eliminating Rye from the FA Cup back in August.

This was only Rye's fifth league victory of the campaign but was thoroughly deserved and with their massive number of games in hand, they should preserve their Division One status come the end of the season.

As for Hassocks, there were mitigating circumstances, mostly surrounding a squad being stretched to its absolute limit.

But even so, this was not good enough and the normally phlegmatic John admitted afterwards that he was not happy.

He felt his side were bullied out of it by a physical and robust Rye side. It is not the first time Hassocks have

not got on with opponents adopting such an approach; another coastal club in Selsey ruffled the Robins' earlier in the campaign, although Hassocks' quality shone through enough to defeat the Blues in each of their three meetings.

John was also left confused about how referee Boris Erguvan flashed only three yellow cards and all of those to home players - Chris Brown, Spencer Slaughter and Phil Gault.

Hassocks could have been better protected by the officials, particularly at a time when John needs to keep as many of his players fit as possible given the extended list of absentees.

It was confirmed before kick off that consistent defender Ashley Marsh broke a collarbone in the weekend defeat against East Preston and will be missing for at least two months.

Free-scoring Anthony Hibbert is still several weeks away from fitness, Matt Robbins is sidelined with an ankle problem, Matt Amos has returned to Cambridge University following the holidays and Sam Fisk is now trying his luck in Australia.

Jamie Ingham is struggling with a knee injury but such was his desperation not to add to John's woes that the 16-year-old amazingly declared himself fit. Sensibly though, he was not risked and remained on the bench.

Such a heavily depleted squad meant a full debut for Michael Bates in midfield. John said he was more than happy with Bates' performance and he can expect to be further involved over the coming weeks.

The patch up job John was forced into was best summed up by the sight of regular striker Gault in midfield and regular midfielder Slaughter filling in for Marsh at sweeper.

It was little wonder that Hassocks gave away the ball far too cheaply, the service for their front two of James Laing and the willing Laurence Robinson being non-existent all evening.

In the 40 minutes it took the Robins to register their first shot - an astute chip from Gault well saved by Gavin Bourne - Rye had managed four or five acceptable chances on Joel Harding's goal.

Hassocks did at least start the second half a little brighter but it came to nothing and two goals in little more than two minutes just past the hour mark left them well beaten.

Scott McDonald scored from Shaun Loft's headed pass on 64 minutes. That was followed by the talented Duncan McArthur waltzing past at least five Hassocks players followed by Harding before rolling into an empty net for a breath taking solo goal.

Crawley Down this season?

It has been a bit of a strange campaign for Crawley Down. They amassed some serious firepower in the summer, pairing two of our former strikers together in Phil Johnson and Charlie Pitcher.
