Good morning and welcome to the Beacon for our final Southern Combination League Premier Division home game of the 2021-22 season

We welcome our friends from Crawley Down Gatwick and hope that their players, management officials and supporters enjoy their time with us on this Easter Bank Holiday Monday.

The Anvils are of course familiar opponents to us, with this being the fourth meeting of the season between the sides.

Hassocks lead the head-to-head with two wins out of three, following Down's victory in the Sussex Senior Cup tie played here in October.

Both sides will be aiming for three points in an attempt to finish as high up the table as possible, and that should hopefully lead to an entertaining clash in keeping with a fixture which has provided plenty of goals and drama through the years.

After an outstanding March in which we picked up some very impressive results, April so far has been a little harder going.

Away from first team matters and the Veterans are into the semi finals of the Fred Pretty Plate after beating Sidley United 4-1 on Monday night.

Paul Armstrong, Robert Sayers, David Juniper and Elliott Butler got the goals as a strong side were victorious.

For the fourth time this season, it is Hassocks against Crawley Down Gatwick. Familiar foes we might be for several reasons, but that has not managed to stop every game so far being packed with entertainment...

This is a fixture that historically has a Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup, well-earned reputation for being one of the most exciting fixtures in the Southern Combination League.

Since the first ever meeting between the sides in this competition back in 2005, there have been 23 matches containing 89 goals at an average of nearly four per match.

Amongst the more ridiculous score lines of the past six years are 5 -3 and 6-4 wins for Hassocks. Two matches in the Premier Division Supplementary Shield matches last April vielded 10 goals.

In terms of the overall head-tohead, Hassocks lead it with 12 victories to eight for Down.

That comes as something of a surprise as since the Anvils first joined us in the top flight of the Southern Combination in 2009, they finished above us in all but one season.

The score so far this season is Hassocks 2-1 Crawlev Down. The Anvils won the first meeting 2-0 here at the Beacon in the Sussex Senior Cup back in October.

We gained revenge in January with a 2-1 extra time win in the

before winning 3-1 at the Haven in the league three weeks later.

The familiarity between the clubs does not just end with the fact we have been such frequent opponents over the course of the current campaign.

Down have five former Robins in their first team squad, including two prolific strikers.

Charlie Pitcher top the scoring charts for us in the 2020-21 season having been signed to replace Phil Johnson after Jonno made the move to the Haven.

Both have been in excellent form for Down in the current campaign. Pitcher has 32 goals. Johnson has missed virtually the whole second half of the season but still has 23 to his name.

Harvey Blake, Will Broomfield and Harvey Enticknap are the other ex-Hassocks players now at Down who could feature on an important morning for both sides.

Down need three points in their chase for the top 10 whilst we would like to finish on a high in front of our own fans.

Robins make light of injuries for a happy evening at the Haven

Crawley Down Gatwick must be sick of the sight of Hassocks. For the second time in 21 days, Brad Sweetman's side defied the nine Premier Division placings and 20 points separating the two clubs to run out victorious over the Anvils.

Three weeks earlier and two extra time goals from Jack Troak were enough to send the Robins into the quarter finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup via a 2-1 win over Down at the Beacon.

This 3-1 success at the Haven was even more impressive. Hassocks were away from home, the margin of victory was bigger, the game was won in 80 minutes and the Robins had several walking wounded after a bruising 4-1 weekend defeat at home to Bexhill United.

Three players who had started against the Pirates were ruled out completely. Alex Harris, Charlie Tuck and captain Troak were replaced by Harvey Parker, Arthur Rawlingson and Bradley Bant.

"Just when you start to get a settled team out, you pick up a load more injuries," said Hassocks technical director Dave John before kick off, although Down too had absentees issues of their own.

Chief amongst those was the fact that former Robins favourite and Anvils top scorer Phil Johnson was watching from the stands, a ligament injury having ruled him out since November.

It was two more of Down's ex-Hassocks contingent who combined to give the hosts the lead with the only meaningful attack either side managed in the opening 30 minutes.

A quarter of an hour had elapsed when Harvey Enticknap did well to get to the byline and deliver a low cross into the box towards Charlie Pitcher.

Bradley Tighe appeared to make a decent tackle on Pitcher, only for

the ball to ricochet back to last season's Hassocks top scorer to clinically finish into the bottom corner with a snapshot on the turn.

Hassocks registered their first opportunity with 31 minutes played. Rawlingson clipped up the line for the tireless Alfie Loversidge to chase.

His clever switch of play out to the left found Joe Bull who despite having a tight angle to work with, drew a good stop from Alex Bellingham in the Down goal.

Bellingham was called into action again three minutes later, Rawlingson advancing from right back to collect a Josh Short pass and deliver a cross.

What came next was something of a collector's item, the diminutive Bradley Bant appearing to leap 50 times his own body length like a cricket to power a firm header which required a decent save to keep it out.

The slow start to proceedings became a distant memory in the final 10 minutes of the half as the game began to ebb and flow.

Home centre back Lewis Scally was lucky to stay on the pitch after a reckless, high, two-footed lunge through Bull was somehow only deemed a yellow card by referee Joshua Langley-Fineing.

It was a decision that left even home fans a little surprised and it caused a bit of a furore on the pitch, the normally placid Westlake brothers momentarily turning into the Kray Twins in the resulting melee.

Hassocks regained their composure quickly to equalise four minutes before the interval.

Turner used his hand to produce a textbook volleyball spike back to James Westlake, something which incredibly went unnoticed by Down bar one half-hearted appeal for handball.

Westlake made the most of the opportunity, striking low and hard past Bellingham to level the game.

The second half was nine minutes old when Marc Pelling joined his

defensive partner Scally in the referee's book for cynically pulling Short's shirt after the Hassocks forward skipped around him.

That left both of Down's centre backs trying to negotiate the final half hour without committing another foul, whilst facing the pace and skill of Short and Loversidge leading the line for Hassocks.

The Robins would go onto make the most of the situation, but they first needed Bant to produce a superb block on the line from another Pitcher snapshot to ensure they did not fall 2-1 behind with 68 minutes played.

Bant almost went from goal saver to goal scorer on 75. A failed Pelling clearance hit Bant in the chest and although he showed mighty quick reactions to get a volley away as the ball fell, it was just wide.

Hassocks were on top now and they took the lead with 78 minutes played. Loversidge's deft flick put Short in against Scally and the Down defender did not dare risk getting a tackle wrong for fear of a red card.

That allowed Short to skip away before drilling past Bellingham and into the bottom corner.

Two minutes later and Loversidge and Short again linked up in identical fashion. This time, Down managed to scramble clear but their relief was short lived as the Robins wrapped things up from the resulting corner.

Lewis Westlake delivered to the penalty spot where Rawlingson had been left with enough time and space to bring the ball down on his chest and thump home a crisp volley with aplomb for his first senior goal in Hassocks colours.

Super sub Miles provides the magic as Hassocks snatch a point

Young super sub Nathan Miles was the Hassocks hero as the teenage striker came off the substitutes bench to earn the Robins a 3-3 draw with Crawley Down in just 13 minutes on the pitch.

Miles had just entered the action in place of James Laing when Joel Harding's clearance was returned through the middle and former Burgess Hill Town striker Nick Sullivan beat the perplexed keeper to put Down 3-1 ahead and cruising to victory.

That was in the 78th minute. In the 82nd minute, Miles was pulled down in the box by Jahmal King and Anthony Hibbert converted the resulting spot kick, his second of the afternoon.

In the 84th minute, Miles then went racing through to lift the ball over Down goalkeeper Shayne Goldmsith to complete a magnificent Hassocks turnaround.

On the balance of play, it was a fortunate point for the Robins. Dave John, back in the dugout after being laid low with flu over Christmas and the New Year, said afterwards that any point from 3-1 down is a good one.

He also reserved special praise for Miles, who has been knocking on the door of the first team for some time now.

The recent wet weather meant that this was Hassocks' first action in three weeks.

Despite the heavy rain, the Beacon pitch was in excellent condition thanks to the heavy investment that the Robins committee have sunk into their facilities over the last few years.

Four of the goals arrived in the second half and yet bizarrely, it was the first half which was the better to watch in terms of quality.

Both sides tried to play football, there was a lively tempo and plenty of competitive edge.

It could have been 2-2 inside the first 10 minutes. Hassocks were first to threaten when Phil Gault drew an excellent save from Goldsmith.

From the resulting corner, both Sol Bowra and Gault had chances before Spencer Slaughter hit a shot just wide.

Down soon proved they could pose a threat when skipper Tony Reid had his header from Nick Sullivan's cross turned aside by Harding, who then did superbly three minutes later to deny Aaron Watson.

Hassocks skipper Ashley Marsh misjudged a long ball and although Dan Jacques did well to hold up Watson, the visiting midfielder looked as if he had rounded Harding before the keeper miraculously grabbed the ball from Watson's toe as the visiting forward was about to pull the trigger.

The Robins went a little flat after that and it was no surprise when Down took the lead on 25 minutes.

Harding came for Dan Sullivan's cross, but he was beaten to it by Reid who crashed a header into the unguarded net.

Hassocks responded well to going behind and Stuart Faith nearly marked his return from seven weeks out with a goal, putting a near post header just over the bar from a corner needlessly conceded by Goldsmith.

Faith's miss hardly mattered four minutes later though when referee Paul Burton spotted the hand of the hapless King blocking a Hassocks shot in the box.

Mr Burton pointed to the spot and the hosts had their first penalty which Hibbert powerfully despatched, although Goldsmith did well to get a hand on it.

From then until half time, Hassocks were much the better side. Slaughter did brilliantly to set up Laing whose shot cannoned off the underside of the bar.

Slaughter then put a good chance wide after Matt Beeston made a mess of a clearance.

Down dominated the second half as Hassocks failed to get going until Miles' introduction.

The home defence was carved open on 65 minutes as Reid notched a well taken and deserved second goal.

Harding denied him a hat-trick with another fine stop before Down did get their third through Sullivan.

It looked like curtains for the home side but Miles had other ideas, his late turn delivering his first senior goal and a valuable point for the Robins to leave Down wondering how they had let the game get away.

Hassocks stalwart Spencer Slaughter & his fiancée Megan completed the Brighton Marathon on Sunday 10th April, raising over £1000 for St Peter & St James Hospice along the way.

Spencer was tackling his third marathon and finished it in a personal best of 4:04:36 running alongside fellow Robin Josh Hawkes.

Whisper it quietly, but Spencer is now talking about running a fourth having come close to breaking the sub four hour barrier.

Megan meanwhile completed her first marathon in 5 hours 38 minutes, a fantastic effort following 120 training runs over the course of the previous 20 weeks.

In total, the couple have raised \pounds 1,142 for St Peter & St James, far exceeding their initial target of \pounds 500. If you have not yet donated and

£340 of that was contributed at the Beacon in our previous home fixture against Littlehampton Town through bucket collections, a raffle and a generous whip round organised by the players before the game.

Goals galore in March win Captain Jack Troak Player of the Month

Hassocks enjoyed their best month of the 2021-22 season so far in March and central to that was Captain Jack Troak, a deserved winner of the Robins Player of the Month award.

Troak endured an injury hit 2021 in which he made only a handful of appearances from November onwards. That partly explains why Hassocks struggled so much in the early part of the campaign.

Since the turn of the year however, there has been no looking back. In March, he contributed five goals as the Robins won three, drew one and lost one of their five fixtures.

The month began with a disappointing team performance in a 1-0 defeat at Horsham YMCA. That was put right a week later when a professional showing against bottom of the table East Preston delivered a 5-2 win at a sunny Beacon.

Troak cancelled out the shock lead taken by EP when visiting goalkeeper Gentjan Poda was caught out by the Robins captain's pace.

Poda hesitated on a backpass for

a little too long, allowing Troak to dispossess him and roll into the empty net.

Parity did not last long as EP went 2012 via a 1-0 victory. back into the lead within a minute. Troak was the man who again hauled Hassocks level, beat Poda to glance in a Lewis Westlake corner. 2012 via a 1-0 victory. His run and cross d eventually fell for Shor via a Sam Smith effort save from Lions goalke

Those two goals set the stage for the Robins to go on and win the game in the second half as Alfie Loversidge, Lewis Westlake and Joe Bull all joined Troak on the scoresheet.

Troak hit another brace three days later when Hassocks won 2-0 at Seaford Town, securing a spot in the semi finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup semi final for the first time in a decade.

His first came from the penalty spot after a jinking Josh Short run past three or four Seaford players was ended illegally inside the area.

The second arrived with perfect timing on the stroke of half time. Lewis Westlake popped up in a wide position to deliver a cross which Troak ran across a couple of home defenders to poke home from close range. Troak was involved in the only goal of the game at Pagham, where Hassocks won for the first time since 2012 via a 1-0 victory.

His run and cross down the left eventually fell for Short to fire home via a Sam Smith effort and a great save from Lions goalkeeper Lewis Broughton.

Troak's final goal of March came in the 1-1 draw at Newhaven, another confidently despatched penalty which put a serious dent in the title hopes of the Dockers.

It was close for second place in the Player of the Month vote with James Westlake claiming only 1.5 percent more than Dan Turner.

Westlake senior has been in excellent form all season alongside his brother in midfield, consistently turning over possession and getting Hassocks on the front foot.

Turner meanwhile played a huge part in ensuring that the Robins conceded just once on the road from those visits to Pagham and Newhaven, two clubs who have been free scoring for most of the campaign as they chased top five finishes.



Hassocks to host Littlehampton in RUR Charity Cup big semi

Hassocks will face Southern Combination League Premier Division leaders and FA Vase finalists Littlehampton Town in the semi finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

The tie will take place on Tuesday 26th April with a 7:45pm kick off under the lights at the Beacon.

It will be the Robins' first big semi since reaching the final four of the same competition in the 2011-12 campaign.

They lost 3-1 on that occasion to Selsey, extending their record of never having reached a cup final in senior football.

The defeat to the Blues is one of four semi finals that Hassocks have qualified for in their 40 years as a Southern Combination League club.

Three of those have come in the RUR Cup - 2000 and 1994 alongside 2012 - and one in the Peter Bentley League Cup in 1997.

To reach this stage, Hassocks have seen off Montpelier Villa,

Crawley Down Gatwick and Seaford Town. For the Robins to continue their run and make history, they will have to pull off the mother of all upsets against opponents who have swept all before them this season.

Littlehampton are chasing an historic quadruple. They lead the Premier Division by two points with three games remaining and could become the first Southern Combination outfit to win the FA Vase Beacon in the second round of the should they overcome Newport Pagnell Town at Wembley on Sunday 22nd May.

And six days after visiting the Beacon in the RUR Cup, the Marigolds return to Hassocks to face Newhaven in the final of the Peter Bentley Cup.

Results between the two this season also point to the difficult task facing Brad Sweetman and his Robins players.

Littlehampton recently won 6-2 in Mid Sussex, a victory achieved without either of their leading goal scorers Joe Benn or George Gaskin.

The September meeting at the Flora Sportsfield was a little closer,

Hassocks rallving from 2-0 down at half time to level the game at 2-2 by the hour mark.

Unfortunately for the visitors, the Marigolds' quality told and they struck twice late on to run out 4-2 victors.

Of the 33 previous games between Hassocks and Littlehampton, only one has taken place in the RUR Cup, the Marigolds visiting the 2015-16 competition.

Littlehampton were the reigning Southern Combination champions at the time and they made light work of Hassocks, running out 5-0 winners.

Current Marigolds boss Mitchell Hand was on the scoresheet, along with Dean Janman and a hat-trick for George Landais.

Littlehampton have eliminated Loxwood, AFC Uckfield Town and Chichester City on their way to the semi final, racking up a scarcely believable 23 goals in three games.

The winners of the tie will go onto face Saltdean United at Culver Road in the final.

Below par Robins are no match for Wembley bound Littlehampton

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 9th April 2022, The Beacon Hassocks 1-6 Littlehampton Town

FA Vase finalists Littlehampton Town showed why they have become the first ever Southern Combination League side to reach the Wembley showpiece by hammering Hassocks in front of the biggest Beacon crowd of the season.

The Marigolds ran out 6-2 winners to remain two points ahead of Saltdean United at the head of the Premier Division with three matches to play in a title race which looks set to go down to the wire.

Littlehampton are undoubtedly the best side the Robins have faced this season.

What might stop them claiming the championship is that they still have their eyes on four different pieces of silverware.

As well as the league title and the Vase, they will return to the Beacon on May Bank Holiday Monday to take on Newhaven in the Peter Bentley League Cup final.

That may not be their only repeat visit to Mid Sussex over the next few weeks either.

On Tuesday night, the Marigolds face Chichester City in the quarter finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup. The winners will have a trip to Hassocks in the final four.

The Robins know that whoever they face out of Littlehampton or Chi, they will have their work cut out in reaching a first ever final in senior football.

This season though has been a relative success for Brad Sweetman and his squad.

Premier Division survival was the aim and although Hassocks lost on the day, defeat for Loxwood against Saltdean means the Robins cannot now finish in the bottom two.

After a slow and troublesome start in which relegation looked a real possibility, the young Hassocks head

coach and his players have grown into their roles to the point where they can now compete with most teams in the top flight.

Most being the operative word, because when Littlehampton are in this sort of form they are difficult to live with.

Sweetman stuck with the same starting XI who had all-but ended Newhaven's faint title hopes when drawing 1-1 at Fort Road in their last fixture a fortnight ago.

Hassocks knew that they would need to give a similar faultless display to that effort down on the banks of the Ouse if they were to impose themselves again on the championship race.

Unfortunately for the Robins, they ended up having a bit of an off-day, giving away two cheap goals in the space of three minutes midway through the first half which set the tone for the afternoon.

Aaron Capon was the first grateful recipient on 20 minutes before Dion Jarvis doubled the advantage on 23.

In the corresponding September fixture between these sides at the Sportsfield, Hassocks had rallied from 2-0 down to level the tie before succumbing to a battling 4-2 defeat.

Any hopes of a similar story were dashed two minutes after the interval.

Alfie Loversidge conceded possession with a loose pass and half time substitute Zack Harris punished the mistake with a cracking finish to give Alex Harris no chance.

Sam Smith pulled one back for the Robins on 58 when Littlehampton failed to clear a corner and the bustling forward bundled home.

It was poor defending from the Marigolds. Hassocks were equally guilty of that just three minutes later when Lewis Jenkins was left unmarked from six yards out to scuff a weak effort past Harris.

That made it 4-1 for anyone struggling to keep up. Littlehampton



goal number five arrived despite the best efforts of Dan Turner, who won a succession of headers and blocks whilst left almost alone by a defence which had gone worryingly AWOL.

The visitors eventually took advantage of the opportunity via captain Jordan Clark.

Harris made it 6-1 with eight minutes to go, after which there was still time for Hassocks to find a second consolation.

Referee Neil Wallace pointed to the spot, awarding the Robins a penalty.

Nobody seemed entirely sure what offence had been committed, but that was of no concern to Jack Troak who buried his kick to make in nine goals in 20 appearances since returning from injury midway through the campaign.

The final score from Loxwood did at least raise spirits amongst the home contingent, as did the news that £340 had been raised on the day for St Peter & St James Hospice.

Those generous donations from both Robins and Littlehampton fans were in support of Hassocks stalwart Spencer Slaughter and his fiancée Megan, who were running the Brighton Marathon the following day in support of the charity.

Awesome Akras denies Hassocks three points in sunny Steyning

With both Steyning Town and decision seemed to take the wind out Hassocks safe from relegation, there was little to play for when the sides who sit 16th and 17th in the Southern Combination League Premier Division met at the Shooting Field.

It was to both teams credit then that they still put on a decent show, especially in the first half when most of the chances arrived and both goals were scored in a 1-1 draw.

The spoils being shared was probably the right result, even though home goalkeeper Stefanos Akras was the best player on the pitch.

Hassocks were incensed and even though Mr Blogg was right to want halt proceedings for a potential head injury you could understand why; they almost certainly would have gone onto win had they gone 2-0 ahead.

It was a lead they deserved too after dominating the opening 25 minutes. To make matters worse, the of the Robins' sails and Stevning equalised shortly afterwards with their first shot on target.

Hassocks had taken the lead with only seven minutes on the clock. Dan Turner charged over to the touchline to use one of his famous long throws, launching the ball 50 yards down the pitch deep into Steyning territory.

The Barrowmen worked the ball back to a surprised Akras, who dallied in possession for a second too long. Troak closed him down, won the ball and then rolled into an empty goal to make it 1-0.

Akras atoned for his part in the opener with his first outrageous stop of the afternoon five minutes later.

Lewis Westlake played a long ball over the top to set Short away and his powerful drive looked destined for the bottom corner until Akram somehow repelled it with a strong arm.

The Steyning goalkeeper made an even more impressive save just before the phantom head injury incident. Lewis Westlake swung over a corner which young Luke Marshall met with a towering header.

Akras though threw himself into the air and got the most important of touches on the ball, pushing it onto the cross bar as Steyning again survived.

Steyning though made light work of losing their leading striker. They finished the first half the stronger side and scored with their first real effort at Alex Harris five minutes before the interval.

the break. Hassocks struggled to make much headway whilst Steyning could find no way past Turner, who was a one-man blocking and heading machine.

The only thing Turner did not win on the day was the post-game meat raffle drawn in the Clubhouse afterwards. One of the prizes did at least go to someone with Hassocks connections, the dad of suspended defender Bradley Tighe and substitute Wes picking up a nice prize to take home.

In football terms, Hassocks had the only chances of note in a second half which drifted somewhat compared to the entertainment of the first.

Another Lewis Westlake corner caused problems for the home side on 58 minutes. This time, Short met it with a header as good as Marshall's in the first half. Unfortunately for Hassocks, Akras pulled off an equally impressive save to keep it out.

Then on 81, it took a combination of Akras and defender Joe Fitzpatrick to ensure the Robins were not victorious.

Short led the Steyning defence on a merry dance, skipping past three defenders before firing a shot towards the bottom corner that Akras kept out.

The loose ball fell to James Westlake, who looked certain to score. That was until Fitzpatrick appeared from nowhere to make a superb sliding block which sent the ball behind for a corner.

Ragged Robins beaten as Oakwood boost survival hopes

Hassocks secured their Division One status a few weeks ago and at Tinsley Lane, they did their best to boost the slim survival hopes of hosts Oakwood with a lacklustre display that had a distinct end of season feel about it.

The Robins had plenty of chances but they took none of them on their way to a 1-0 defeat. It was all rather half-hearted from the visitors, who could at least point to a batch of absentees as a reason for their display.

Stuart Faith and the Simpson brothers all had cricketing commitments. Arni Kublickas missed out with a leg injury and Laurence Robinson was only well enough to sit on the benching having been struck down with tonsilitis, meaning Dave John had to shuffle his pack.

Dan Jacques was moved from his normal right wing back berth to play as one of three central defenders. Young Luke Akehurst took over on the right whilst Jack Simpson's absence meant another starting opportunity in goal for Jason Gander.

An overhead kick as early as the 14th minute from Chris Williams settled the issue in Oakwood's favour.

Hassocks though could and should have scored at least once. The normally reliable James Laing in particular rued a couple of missed opportunities which on another day he scores easily and the Robins take at least a share of the spoils. Had Laing's one-on-one effort after just eight minutes not been tipped around the post by Oakwood goalkeeper Anthony DiBernardo, then perhaps the game would have taken a different shape.

The hosts grew in confidence thanks to that save and Williams' acrobatic effort six minutes later gave them a further lift.

After that, they were the sharper and hungrier team for most of the match, knowing that anything other than three points would see their relegation out of the top flight mathematically confirmed.

There was a frenetic start to proceedings. Nathan Pullen missed the first chance of the game when volleying wide from a good position after just three minutes.

Laing's pivotal miss occurred five minutes later, followed swiftly by another chance for Pullen. This time, he was denied by a strong Sol Bowra block.

The goal arrived from a long Russ Wells throw, carried into the box by a strong wind. Hassocks allowed the ball to bounce a couple of times and Williams took full advantage, leaving Gander with no chance.

Oakwood fashioned some more good chances before the interval with the gale in their favour. Gander foiled Pullen, Williams missed a one-on-one after a mistake by Ashley Marsh let the Oakwood scorer in and Pullen should have done better when firing straight at Gander.

At the other end, Laing headed

over following an enterprising run and cross down the left from Richard Thompson. Neil Kane then saw an effort blocked by some desperate Oakwood defending.

Hassocks found it much harder playing with the wind in the second half than Oakwood had in the first. That meant chances were at a premium in what was a pretty dour 45 minutes of football.

A rare moment of action came on the hour when the Robins thought they had equalised. DiBernardo came a long way in an attempt to claim Anthony Hibbert's diagonal free kick, only to completely miss the ball.

That left Laing with a free header which he put towards goal. Somehow though, Wells hooked away from right under the cross bar to preserve Oakwood's lead.

Kane shot at DiBernardo with a chance from the resulting corner and the home goalkeeper then made a scrambling save when Adam Williams tried his luck from distance.

Bowra cleared a Gerald Manville header off the line and Hibbert forced a fine diving stop from DiBernardo with a free kick after Kane was brought down on the edge of the area.

John threw on Robinson for the final 20 minutes in an attempt to find a way through but just like his teammates, the striker failed to make too much of an impact as Oakwood held on to secure three vital points.




