This is the 24th season in which we have entered the world's greatest cup competition Those involved in the Premier League and media pundits might tell you it has lost its excitement, but that is not the case whenever extra preliminary qualifying rolls around and non-league clubs like ourselves and Lingfield dream of how far we might advance.

It would take an absolute miracle for a Southern Combination League club to go all the way to the first round proper and a meeting with someone in the Football League.

Miracles do happen though. Chichester City were reigning Southern Combination champions when they went as far as the second round and an away day at Tranmere Rovers a few seasons ago.

And who would have predicted this time last year that Sussex would have its first representatives in the FA Vase Final at Wembley? Littlehampton Town proved that once you start building momentum, anything can happen.

Derby County at the Beacon on November 5th? Maybe not. But a nice little cup run would be nice and bank some very welcome prize money for

the club.

Lingfield will provide tough opposition having made an unbeaten start to the new season, compared to our two defeats from two matches.

There were plenty of reasons for encouragement during Tuesday night's 4-3 loss to Midhurst. Notching three times and going close to adding more on a number of occasions shows that we have goals in us this year.

If the performance today continues from the final hour against the Stags, there are reasons to be confident that we can give Lingfield a run for their money.

The prize awaiting the winners is a home time with Isthmian League side Uxbridge on Saturday 20th August. If we are to win today, then that will be our next first team game at the Beacon, so be sure to put it in the diary.

Should today end level, then there will be a replay on Tuesday night. This will also be held at the Beacon as Lingfield's Godstone Road home is not yet ready to host football with the cricket season still ongoing. Kick off would be at 7:45pm.

Today marks the start of a busy weekend at the club. Tomorrow we

host Lewes Women against West Ham United in a pre-season friendly. The surge in interest in women's football caused by Euro 2022 means that we are expecting a big crowd of Rooks fans, West Ham fans and football supporters from across Mid Sussex.

To ensure that the afternoon runs as smoothly as possible, we are still looking for some volunteers. If you are planning on attending the game and can offer your services to help, please speak to Owen behind the bar today who will be happy to advise.

If we lose today, then the next first team fixture here is due to be on August Bank Holiday Monday at 11am against Roffey.

Before that, the Under 23s get their campaign underway under new manager Neil Parker. They travel to Roffey on Thursday 18th August with a 7:30pm kick off.

That is followed a week later by their first home game when St Francis Rangers visit. It would be fantastic to see you supporting them in what is sure to be an entertaining derby.

This afternoon represents a little bit of history. Despite being regular foes over the past 40 seasons, Hassocks and Lingfield have never met in the FA Cup. Until now.

The Lingers are one of the few opponents who we have faced in the runners up Saltdean United at the Premier Division, Division One and Division Two of the Southern Combination League.

Throw in RUR Cup, Peter Bentley League Cup, Supplementary Shield and Division One Cup clashes and you have seven different competitions in which we have clashed in the past.

After today, all that remains is the FA Vase. What odds would you get on us being paired together in the competition later this season?

That would be a tough game for the Robins. Lingfield have undergone an overhaul during the summer and whereas results have been slow to come for us following our own rebuild, they have made a flying start to the season under joint managers Sam Morgan and Daniel Burnett.

An opening day draw at Alfold was a decent result. They then followed that up with a midweek win over last season's Premier Division Shooting Field, where Lingfield are to play two of their three opening home games.

Godstone Road was unavailable during the opening months of last season and then when the wet weather arrived, Lingfield continued to move fixtures away from to other

A lot of clubs might have been badly impacted by losing home advantage. It says a lot about the Lingers that they still managed to finish in a highly respectable 12th spot despite the upheaval.

Their aim for this season will be to combine that steely resolve with a little more quality. Morgan and Burnett will be hoping their new additions bring that.

We meanwhile can at least take comfort from earning four points against the Lingers in 2021-22. Who knows which way this afternoon will go? That is the Magic of the FA Cup!

Short and Troak secure first win on the road to get 2022 off to perfect start

Whyteleafe was not where Hassocks had been expecting to kick off 2022 but the long drive inside the M25 proved worth it in the end as they picked up a first away win of the season.

First half goals from Josh Short and Jack Troak secured a 2-1 win over Lingfield, who had taken the decision 48 hours earlier to switch the game from their waterlogged Godstone Road home to the 3G surface of Church Road.

And although Lingfield have hosted matches here in the past, it was Hassocks who made themselves at home by taking a 2-0 lead inside of half an hour.

The confidence Brad Sweetman's young side have taken from holding Premier Division leaders Saltdean United in their last game a little over two weeks ago was there for all to see right from the first whistle.

Hassocks set out to play with a high tempo and disrupt Lingfield. This approach bore fruit for the Robins' opening goal which arrived with nine minutes played.

James and Lewis Westlake harried in midfield to win possession from Braiden Hall. Senior Westlake brother James slipped in Short who produced a clinical finish with the inside of his foot that gave Lingfield goalkeeper Johnny Thurbin no chance.

The hosts were struggling to contain the energy of industrious James and he soon fashioned another decent opening for Hassocks just past the quarter of an hour mark.

Troak was the recipient this time, scampering away down the flank. Frustratingly, his cross was wasteful as it sailed straight into the arms of Thurbin as Short and Alfie Loversidge looked to arrive in the area.

Jack Baden has been a revelation at left back during the Robins' recent

good run of form and he was enjoying a lot of joy overlapping down the flank. He was next to be released, this time by Lewis Westlake but the resulting cross from Baden flew out of play.

By this point, it was fairly obvious that if Hassocks could get their final ball right then they would stand a very good chance of extending their lead.

That duly happened on 27 minutes. James Westlake again fed a pass into a wide area for Short, who led three Lingfield defenders on a merry dance.

When Short had finally finished toying with the opposition, he played a low cross perfectly placed to Loversidge who was scythed down just as he was about to pull the trigger.

A penalty was the only outcome and Troak despatched the spot kick with aplomb for his first goal of the season. You could see how much it meant to the popular forward to be starting the new year back on the scoresheet following a 2021 that was badly disrupted by injury.

The second half was never likely to be as comfortable for Hassocks as the first, although they could have made it three straight from kick off.

A long kick out of defence was flicked on by Troak to send Short away. He cut inside and forced a fine save on the stretch from Thurbin.

Lingfield began to exert ever increasing amounts of pressure on the Robins goal after that without ever really testing Harvey Parker, Hassocks' Under 23s number one who was standing in for the absent Alex Harris.

That was until a clumsy challenge from Bradley Tighe gifted Lingfield a penalty with 58 minutes played. Aaron Jenkins was the home player clattered and he duly punished Hassocks by beating Parker clinically from the spot.

Lingfield should have been level

almost immediately as in the 120 seconds following Jenkins' penalty, they passed up two gilt edged opportunities to equalise.

Haydn Dickinson somehow volleyed over from six yards out with the goal at his mercy. The same player then produced an ever so slightly more acceptable miss when clearing the cross bar from 20 yards with only Parker standing in his way.

Sweetman attempted to break Lingfield's second half dominance with a change on 75 minutes. Bradley Bant had been tireless in midfield on his return from injury and he made way for forward Joe Bull in amongst some positional adjustments.

The changes had the desired impact as Lingfield became less of a threat – so much so that Hassocks almost added a third to kill the game off as it entered the final 10 minutes. Short was outstanding once again in creating an opportunity, teeing up Troak at the far post who could only drag wide.

Not that the miss mattered as Hassocks held on to get 2022 off to the perfect start and end a 14 month wait for a Premier Division victory on the road.

With 10 of the Robins' 15 remaining league matches to be played away from the Beacon, it was a particularly timely moment to banish their travelling blues.

the moment. The Robins secured a seventh win in a row in all competitions in the hostile environment of highflying Lingfield, where they passed the physical test provided by their hosts with ease to run out 4-1 victors.

The only negative was a red card for Anthony Hibbert early in the second half. There was a certain amount of irony that Hibbert was the only player on the pitch to head for an early bath when Lingfield spent the entirety of a feisty and often ugly encounter swearing, bickering and moaning at each other and the

Colourful Lingers boss Dixie Dean also saw red on the stroke of half time. Dean launched what can only be described as a full on verbal assault at referee Barrie Cox which went on for a good two minutes.

Admittedly, Mr Cox did look out of his depth. Dean's outburst though will no doubt have consequences for him, especially as he refused to leave the dugout at first.

Lingfield were 3-0 down by that point, not helping Dean's mood. This was the sort of febrile fixture that Hassocks would have wilted in even last season.

18 months into Mickey Jewell's reign and he is instilled a team spirit and mental toughness in his squad that made them stronger than Lingfield and ensured the game was over before even half time.

It took just three minutes for the Robins to take the lead on their way to a seventh victory of the campaign on the road.

Nathan Miles centred and James Westlake crept in unnoticed from his right flank to sweep home.

The next five minutes saw Mr Cox give a series of free kicks against Hassocks for innocuous challenges. These though were quickly forgotten

Nothing can stop Hassocks at when Miles doubled the lead on eight them. minutes with a superb goal.

Miles outstripped Chris Head easily before taking on an early shot, curling the ball around giant 6'10 goalkeeper Tom O'Hara via the inside of the post.

A bizarre incident involving Jack Simpson nearly led to Lingfield pulling one back. The Hassocks goalkeeper was adjudged to have handled outside his area when not releasing a drop kick quick enough.

Daryl Coleman struck a superb free kick which needed an even better save at full stretch from Simpson to keep it out.

Coleman then shot weakly at Simpson and fired over from two opportunities he was well placed to do better with.

Those misses were punished when Hassocks added a third on the half hour. Chris Maynard hit a diagonal ball which Tom Hughes headed back towards O'Hara.

Hughes though had not spotted Gault lurking behind and the Robins talisman collected the ball, coolly rounded O'Hara and tucked home.

The moment which so incensed Dean arrived in the 45th minute. Hibbert and former Crawley Town man Gareth Graham tangled in midfield.

Hibbert was booked for the initial tackle, Graham swung a handbag around for some afters to earn himself a booking and that led to Dean's meltdown and sending to the stands.

Lingfield started the second half with renewed vigour and Hassocks had to weather a bit of a storm. Kieran O'Callaghan taking over from the injured Stuart Faith and Ashley Marsh at the heart of the Robins defence were excellent in repelling everything the hosts could throw at

Marsh was the victim of a terrible stray elbow to the head which should have seen Danny Oakins shown a straight red. Somehow, Mr Cox let it

Hibbert was not so lucky when he was given a second yellow for a tackle on Graham shortly after. In the context of the game, it was a soft card to say the least.

Hassocks responded to being reduced to 10 by scoring their fourth on 58 minutes. O'Callaghan hit a long ball over the top of the Lingfield defence which Miles raced onto to beat O'Hara one-on-one.

Lingfield for their part kept trying to find a way through in between bouts of berating each other.

They eventually got a consolation deep into injury time when Graham lashed home a cross from Josh Coulson.

Even after this there was still time for a further incident. Hughes and Hassocks sub Andy Whittingham were lucky not to be sent off as they indulged in a spot of wrestling.

Mr Cox settled on flashing yellows to both, probably not to inflame an already disappointed Lingfield contingent with the game in the 97th minute.

Nothing though could dampen the spirits of the Hassocks players and supporters on another fine away day, even if the main talking point on the way home once again seemed to focus on the referee.

The Beacon to host Lewes Women v West Ham United

Two of the biggest clubs in English women's football will take to the Beacon tomorrow as Championship side Lewes host WSL outfit West Ham United in a pre-season friendly.

The Rooks have moved the game to Hassocks with the Dripping Pan unavailable. Kick off is at 2pm and admission is £7 adults, £5 concessions with Under 16s going free.

West Ham finished the 2021-22 WSL campaign in sixth spot and reached the semi finals of the FA Cup. In October, they pulled off one of the biggest shocks of the season when securing a famous 2-0 win against a Manchester City side containing Lionesses Jill Scott, Alex Greenwood, Keira Walsh, Ellen White and Lauren Hemp.

Lewes meanwhile play in the second tier of women's football. They are the only club in the world who pay their men and women an equal wage, earning them the moniker of Equality FC. The Rooks finished eight last season.

The game comes one week after England were crowned Euro 2022 champions. Goals from Ella Toone and Chloe Smith - both of whom played and scored against Lewes in 2018 for Manchester United and Everton respectively - gave the Lionesses their first major trophy in front of a sell-out crowd at Wembley.

A peak TV audience of more than 17 million tuned in to watch, making it the most-watched women's football game in UK television history and the most-watched TV event of the year.

Women's football has never been more popular, making everyone at the Beacon particularly proud that Lewes have chosen to play at Hassocks.

The T Bar will be open selling hot food and drink. The Robins Bar has a range of craft beers from local breweries including Bedlam, Silver Rocket and Silly Moo Cider. Other alcohol is also available.

Ample parking will be provided with the south field behind the Maurice Boxall Stand to be opened for cars to use.

Hassocks run their own Ladies side, playing in the Sussex County Women's & Girls Premier Division. The Robins are one of the longest-running sides in Sussex, having been playing in their current guise since 1999.

Successes of the past 23 years including lifting the South East Counties' Premier Division title, the League Cup on two occasions and being crowed county champions when winning the Sussex Women's Challenge Trophy in 2019.

Players departing for clubs up the pyramid and retirements have seen the Robins drop a few levels since those heady days.

The club is now looking to rebuild ahead of an influx of young players set to come through the thriving Juniors Section in the coming years.

Bedlam Brewery to sponsor Hassocks Man-of-the-Match

There will be an added incentive for Hassocks players to win the Man-of-the-Match this season thanks to new sponsors Bedlam Brewery.

The winner of the Bedlam Brewery Starman award from each game in 2022-23 will receive a three pack of selected Bedlam Beer for their efforts.

Alex Bygraves and Harvey Blake have claimed the first two awards for their performances against Peacehaven & Telscombe and Midhurst & Easebourne respectively.

Bedlam has been served at the Beacon since the start of the 2020-21 season, when the Robins took the decision to start stocking local craft beers to support brewers from Mid Sussex as the first Covid-19 lockdown came to an end.

Their selection has proven hugely popular with Hassocks fans, visiting supporters and groundhoppers and helped the Robins Bar take record levels of income last season.

Now, Hassocks players can benefit from the partnership between

the club and brewery.

Based in Plumpton Green, the idea for Bedlam Brewery was born in 2011 by a group of friends whilst enjoying Bedfest in the picturesque Albourne Estate Winery in Sussex.

Over a few beers, they discussed their frustrations at not being able to find local beers that not only tasted great, but were also better for the environment too.

Their passion was ignited and they built a small brewery on Bedlam Street with a mission to brew better beer for a better planet and our local community.

By 2015 Bedlam Beers had gained such a strong local following that they were encouraged to start brewing commercially.

This meant they had outgrown their brewhouse, so a new ecobrewery - which coincidentally is also on the original Bedlam Street - was built in the shadow of the picturesque South Downs National Park.

From their new base, Bedlam have produced a number of award-winning beers. Bedlam Pilsner won

double gold at the European Beer Challenge 2021 and Wilde East Coast Pale Ale was also a gold winner.


Wilde was brewed in celebration of Oscar Wilde, the colourful writer and poet who loved Sussex and is a celebrated icon in the LGBTQ community.

Bedlam Phoenix Extra American Pale Ale meanwhile picked up national keg winner gold at the SIBA Independent Beer Awards 2022.

As well as the Robins, Bedlam support numerous other community clubs, projects and initiatives. They work with charities including City Angels, Hospices of Hope, the MS Centre and Only a Pavement Away and launched Bedlam Kelp to raise awareness and money for the Sussex Kelp Restoration Project, donating 5 percent of all sales.

Their beers can be found at some of the biggest venues and events in Sussex (as well as the Beacon). Everyone at Hassocks is delighted to have further extended the club's relationship with them and we thank them for their support of the Robins.







HASSOCKS IN THE FA CUP

The 2021-22 season represents Hassocks' 24th crack at the FA Cup with the Robins furthest run so far seeing them get to within two games of the first round proper. Here's a look back at our previous efforts in the world's greatest cup competition...

Rattling the Rooks

Hassocks' best run in the FA Cup came in the 2001-02 season when Dave John's side made it to within two games of the first round proper.

Lewes were the team who ended that most unlikely of dreams, triumphing 3-0 in the third qualifying round.

Ashford Town were seen off 3-2 a tie against Bro in the Preliminary Qualifying Round to set up a date with Ash United in the First Qualifying Round.

Nothing could separate the sides in the first game at the Beacon and so it was off to the Shawfield Stadium for a Tuesday night replay.

Three goals in six second half minutes were enough to win the tie for Hassocks and end Ash's unbeaten start to the season as well.

Marc Rendall notched the first in the 70th minute, bringing a Mickey Turner cross under control and slamming the ball into the bottom corner.

Home defender Stuart Woodhouse put through his own net with a volley from a quickly-taken Luke Flomo free kick five minutes later.

And the blitz was completed when Flomo teed up James Laing who beat two defenders to fire home.

The result and performance earned Hassocks the applause of the Ash support and set the Robins up for a tie against Bromley from two divisions higher.

That set up a mouth watering all-Sussex tie at the Dripping Pan, where Jimmy Quinn's Rooks proved to be too good for Hassocks.

Lewes would go onto make it all the way into the main draw, facing Stoke City at the Britannia Stadium in the first round.

The Robins meanwhile were able to build the Maurice Boxall Stand with the money generated from their cup run, which still stands on the south side of the Beacon today.

Nothing dull about Dulwich

Fast forward four seasons to the 2005-06 campaign and Hassocks nearly equalled that famous run, going out at the second qualifying round stage against Isthmian Premier side Dulwich Hamlet.

Being the only Southern Combination League side left in the competition by that point, there was a bumper crowd at the Beacon of over 300 who witnessed Hamlet squeak through by the tightest of 1-0 margins.

It took four games to get that far in the competition, victories over Erith Town and Chessington & Hook sandwiching two meetings with Hillingdon Borough following a draw at Hillingdon.

Pat Harding had a particularly good time of it, scoring four times in the cup run and he is one of only two former Robins to appear in the competition proper.

That was when he was a regular at Eastbourne Borough; the other player being Eddie French, who was part of Horsham's famous run that included taking Swansea City to a replay in the mid 2000's.

Facing the big guns

The biggest side the Robins have faced in the FA Cup was Havant & Waterlooville in the First Qualifying Round in the 1998-99 season.

That game saw a highly creditable 1-0 defeat away at Westleigh Park, one of six exits at that particular stage of the competition for Hassocks.

We've faced Bromley - who can currently be found in the Conference National – on two other occasions aside from that 2001-02 run.

Both of those came in the 1999-00 season, when the Ravens required a replay to knock the Robins out, eventually winning 2-1 at Hayes Road after a 1-1 draw at the Beacon.

That tie was set up by one of our most notable scalps in the competition, a 1-0 win away at Horsham,

French scored the only goal of the game at Queens Road, heading home a Dickie Fernley corner in the 29th minute.

The Hornets were unable to find a way past the inspired Paul John in the Hassocks goal after that and their heads dropped as a result for the final 20 minutes in which Hassocks could've made the game safe.

Laing was denied twice by Horsham' debutant goalkeeper Phil Lewis and Lewis also saved well from a powerful Adam Waller drive.

The shock result saw Hornets boss Russell Mason quit as manager in the immediate aftermath.

Hassocks' heaviest FA Cup defeat came in the First Qualifying Round in 2010-11, a 5-0 away defeat at an impressive Sholing side, a game that was overshadowed by Chris Maynard suffering a terrible double leg break that would rule him out for the best part of a year.

That season was also responsible for the Robins' biggest ever FA Cup win when

Eastbourne United were hammered 7 -1 at the Beacon in the Extra Preliminary Round of the competition.

Maynard scored twice that day along with a Neil Kane brace and further goals from Anthony Hibbert, Daley Clark and Dan Smith.

Aside from the big loss at Sholing, there have been a couple of other heavy defeats in the First Qualifying Round, with Tonbridge Angels and Sittingbourne both winning 3-0.

The most recent time Hassocks made it as far as the First Qualifying Round was in the 2013-14 season under the management of Mickey Jewell.

That run included a rare victory at Gorings Mead against fellow Southern Combination League side Horsham YMCA – one of only four Hassocks' wins there since the turn of the century - and a 1-0 replay victory over Dorking Wanderers after a 0-0 draw at Westhumble Playing Fields.

Isthmian South side Chipstead provided the opponents in the fourth game in the competition, winning 2-1 at the Beacon.

The Robins were good value for the draw that today however and would have had a replay three days later were it not for a last minute penalty miss from the normally reliable Phil Gault.

Gault did suitably punish himself afterwards, spending the evening drowning his sorrows in notorious Burgess Hill nightspot Jacobs Post.

Learning the ropes

It took Hassocks a few seasons to learn the ropes of national cup competitions - that aforementioned Horsham win was our first in the

competition, coming at the fourth season of asking.

Hassocks' first ever FA Cup game came in the Preliminary Round in the 1996-97 season, a 3-1 home defeat against Egham Town.

The following season saw a 2-1 defeat against Barton Rovers while there have been six other exits at the second stage; to Molesey 3-0, Merstham 3-1, Walton & Hersham 3-0 and most disappointingly, a heavy 4-0 loss at Mill Road against fellow Southern Combination League club Arundel in 2003-04.

2019-20 saw a replay exit against Chipstead after Langney Wanderers had been beaten 2-0 at the Beacon in the previous round.

The Hassocks squad infamously celebrated their draw away at Isthmian League opponents by visiting a pub deep in Crystal Palace territory with tracksuits emblazed with WeAreBrighton.com on the back which, needless to say, did not go down well with the locals.

2020-21 saw a dramatic 5-3 penalty shoot out win over Balham followed by elimination at the hands of Bedfont Sports.

Over and out as early as possible The Extra Preliminary Round was added to the competition in the 2005-06 season and Hassocks have exited at that earliest point of the competition in seven of the last nine seasons that we have entered the competition.

The first of those came in 2008/09, a disappointing 1-0 defeat to Shoreham played at Culver Road due to the summer pitch works at the Beacon not being completed in time to host the tie.

Kane was still a Shoreham player at that point and he got the only goal of the game for the Mussells.

By the time Hassocks were knocked out of the following seasons competition Kane was in a Hassocks shirt, part of Dave John's side which crashed out 4-1 at home to Ash United.

Back-to-back Extra Preliminary Round exits came in 2011-12 away at Raynes Park Vale and a shock reversal at home to Sidley United in 2012-13.

Hassocks' 2014-15, 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2021-22 voyages into the FA Cup also came to an end at the Extra Preliminary Round when they were well beaten 3-1 by Epsom and Ewell, 3-2 by Hollands and Blair, 3-1 by Erith Town and 2-1 by Spelthorne Sports respectively.

Last season's Spelthorne was particularly disappointing. An early Alfie Loversidge goals meant we led for 84 minutes in total before conceding twice in time added on as the Spelly progressed.

Robins their own worst enemy in crazy seven goal thriller edged by Stags

Seven goals in 45 minutes made for a breathless first half between Hassocks and Premier **Division newcomers Midhurst &** Easebourne.

Unfortunately for the Robins, the result did not go their way as they slipped to a 4-3 defeat in James Westlake's first home game in charge.

It was crazy and chaotic. The neutrals in a healthy crowd loved it and will no doubt return if this is the sort of entertainment served up at the Beacon this season.

Westlake would have it enjoyed it less, especially his side's defending. All four Midhurst goals were preventable. The Stags could scarcely believe their luck as they were aided into a 3-0 lead inside of 30 minutes.

Hassocks could at least take the positive that they were excellent in the final hour. They scored three well -worked goals and maybe should have added more

The woodwork, a clearance off the line and an outstanding save from Josh Bird flying to his right all combined to deny the Robins a famous comeback.

It seems obvious to state that Hassocks cannot keep gifting away goals and expect to win matches, no matter how good they look going forward.

Just eight minutes had elapsed when Midhurst took the lead. Harry Tremlett hit a big switch, finding an alarming amount of space down the right side of the Hassocks defence for Billy Connor to exploit.

Connor crossed low and hard to Rob Tambling, who had all the time in the world to pick his spot and beat Alex Harris.

Midhurst added their second on the quarter of an hour mark. For the second game running, the Robins were caught and punished trying to play out from the back.

A combination of Harris selling Charlie Tuck short and a poor piece of control from the young defender gifted possession to Kieran Carter. He played a clever pass into Tambling, who beat the out-of-position Harris.

At this point, you felt like Midhurst were going to score every time they came forward. Their third arrived on 31 via a pleasing passing move finished off by Connor.

That at least sparked Hassocks into life. Within a couple of minutes, a Lewis Westlake corner was headed home at the back post by the stooping Alex Bygraves.

Westlake soon delivered another corner which Midhurst struggled to deal with. In the ensuing melee, Liam up again, this time Johnson rattling Benson connected with a rasping volley kept out by an outstanding block from Stags captain Alex Giles.

Unfortunately, Hassocks were still not quite done being their own worst enemy at the other end as they conceded what proved to be the decisive fourth with 37 on the clock.

A slice of luck from a rebound put Connor in on goal, causing more panic in the Hassocks ranks. Connor was subsequently scythed down by a rash challenge in the box, leaving Carter to convert the resulting spot kick.

In the remaining seven minutes of the half, the Robins managed to score twice to turn a comfortable 4-1 Midhurst lead into a slim Stags advantage going into the second 45.

Hassocks man-of-the-match Harvey Blake charged down the right, skipping past three men with some nifty footwork and drilling a low ball into the area.

Phil Johnson produced a clever dummy, allowing the ball to run to Jack Troak on the left. Troak stepped inside to overtake Stags midfielder Lewis Hamilton and bent an unstoppable shot into the corner.

Benson then got his account up and running for the season, striking a near-identical volley to his effort 10 minutes early. This time there was no Giles on hand to get in the way.





The momentum had totally switched and that continued into the second half. Benson sped away from Hamilton and his cross was just missed by Johnson with 53 on the clock.

Next came that superb save from Bird, getting enough to tip a bending Mike Williamson effort around the post. Johnson had a header scrambled off the line by Dan Wood and Blake's follow up was blocked behind for a corner.

Blake and Johnson soon teamed the upright from 12 yards. Midhurst were hanging on but a crucial moment was about to go their way when Leon Turner was brought down on the edge of the area.

Hassocks wanted a foul but nothing was forthcoming from referee Owen Lawrence. When Mr Lawrence immediately awarded a soft free kick on the touchline, frustrations boiled over and there were handbags at dawn.

Turner was sent for 10 minutes in the sin bin for continuing to protest vehemently about the initial tackle. Midhurst used the respite of playing against 10 men to regroup, taking the sting out of the game.

The final 15 minutes yielded only one further chance and that went the way of the Stags. Tambling should have completed his hat-trick at the back post but his effort was weak, allowing Mark Zydonik to make the

Troak and Johnson get Hassocks up and running

August 6th 2019: Hassocks hosted East Preston in their first home game of the season, securing a 2-1 win thanks to goals from Jack Troak and Phil Johnson

The record books will show that Hassocks' first win of the 2019-20 campaign was delivered by a slender one-goal margin, but their performance at the Beacon deserved more.

A much-changed East Preston side were the visitors to Mid Sussex and even those with the most white-and-black tinted spectacles would be hard pressed to disagree that on another day, Hassocks could have run up a cricket score.

2-1 was how it ended, the Robins coming from behind to win thanks a goal on his home debut from young Jack Troak and a winner 15 minutes from time from Phil Johnson. But in reality, it could and should have been much more.

Hassocks hit the bar three times; they missed three further chances with the goal gaping; had two shots blocked on the line and Stuart MacDonald in the EP goal clawed two more out at full stretch.

It was an entertaining 90 minutes that ebbed and flowed, a far cry from the Robins' turgid season opener when they failed to muster a shot of any description in a 2-0 defeat at Horley Town.

Mark Dalgleish made two changes from that weekend trip to the New Defence as Lewis Westlake replaced Alex Spinks and James Littlejohn came in for Dan Stokes.

Littlejohn in particular was a lively presence throughout and he set the tone for his enterprising evening by having the first opportunity with just five minutes played.

Westlake released Jack Rowe-Hurst down the right and his low cutback found Troak in the box.

Much of the ground were expecting the former Lewes winger to shoot but instead he produced a clever layoff to Littlejohn who curled just wide.

Eight minutes later and Littlejohn

was free at the back post but a brilliant last gasp block from EP left back Jack Bingham deflected his shot over the bar.

Bingham repeated his heroics from the resulting corner, hacking clear from on the line after Johnson had diverted Westlake's delivery.

EP mustered their first shot on target with a quarter of an hour played, Howard Neighbour's deflected shot requiring a brilliant reaction save by Josh Green to his left at the expense of the corner.

From the resulting delivery, Hassocks failed to clear their lines which left Dave Crouch with the simple task of firing home from a matter of inches.

The bar intervened on EP's behalf for the first time with 20 minutes played when Johnson rattled it from Littlejohn's pullback.

On the half hour mark, those roles were reversed and it was Johnson who was crossing for Littlejohn who couldn't quite connect with the low ball in. Littlejohn then looped a header from a Troak cross onto the roof of the net.

Troak, playing with his socks rolled down his legs like a modernday Steve Claridge, was making quite the impression on his Beacon bow and it was he who levelled things up two minutes before the break.

Westlake whipped over a corner from the left, the bearded face of Will Broomfield was involved in there somewhere with the ball eventually falling to Troak who bundled home.

Littlejohn was back in the thick of the action at the start of second half, drawing a good save from MacDonald with Matt Berridge following suit.

EP had two forays forward after that, Crouch firing over from the edge of the box and Green again getting down well to divert Josh Irish's effort around the post.

Westlake's free kick from a full 35

yards was next to hit the bar as the ball bounced and evaded everyone before cannoning against the woodwork.

The bar was still rattling two minutes later when Harvey Blake came rampaging forward from right back two minutes later, sidestepped past two EP defenders and then smashed his shot against it with MacDonald nothing more than a startled onlooker.

At that point, the home faithful could have been forgiven for thinking it was going to be one of those nights until Johnson struck.

The goal owed much to Troak who breezed past Harry Williams and laid a clever ball back into the path of Johnson. The Hassocks captain still had plenty to do but do it he did, two touches working some room from where he was able to beat MacDonald with aplomb.

Johnson was on the end of some rough treatment after that and eventually hobbled off for Harry Mills with two minutes remaining, after which EP nearly snatched a point.

Green got in a bit of a mess from a back pass, stumbling over the ball which looked like it had presented Chris Darwin with an open goal only for Mills to react quickest to hack the danger into the garden centre.

There was one final chance for the visitors, a controversial free kick decision in the final seconds going their way after Shaun Brazil had appeared to kick Green as he lay prone on the ground but Neighbour's effort was more danger to passing trains than the Hassocks goal.

One of the shortest away trips of the season takes place in a week as we hop along the A272 to face new-look AFC Uckfield Town in a fixture which normally guarantees goals and entertainment

AFC Uckfield last season

The Oakmen were the Premier Division draw specialists last season. 15 of their 38 matches ended level, more than any other club. The challenge for new boss Jonny Elwood is to turn some of those stalemates into victories this season to push Uckfield back up the table. Elwood succeeds Steve Ives and although in his first senior managerial role, comes with a wealth of experience having held various positions at the likes of Tonbridge Angels, Crowborough Athletic and Whitehawk. A busy summer on the transfer front has seen him overhaul his squad with a mixture of young players and experience, making it difficult to know what to expect.

Head-to-head

We have met AFC Uckfield on 19 previous occasions. The head-to-head is locked at nine wins apiece with only one draw between the sides. That was a 2-2 thriller at the Beacon a year ago. It might not be a game to put on your coupon, but it is one which normally delivers goals. 74 having been plundered at an average of over three per game.

Last time we met

A rare occasion when entertainment was in short supply at the Oaks back in early February. The pitch had more bobbles than the surface of the moon, which made playing on the ground difficult. A strong wind made taking an aerial route equally

challenging. It was one of those afternoons decided by who adapted to conditions better. Thankfully, it was us - Charlie Broad scored the only goal, his looping header from a long Dan Turner throw securing three important points.

How to get to the Oaks
