You wait 60 years to play AFC Varndeanians in senior football, and then four matches take place in the space of one year....

It is a little over four weeks since we last welcomed Varndeanians to the Beacon.

They will have fonder memories of that evening than we do as it secured their spot in the third round of the Peter Bentley League Cup to face Loxwood in a tie which took place on Monday night.

Varndeanians were well beaten, going down 4-1 at home to the Magpies.

Knockout competitions were never likely to be high on the priorities list at Withdean Stadium this season however as the club seek to continue to establish themselves in the Southern Combination League Premier Division.

2021-22 had been their first season at this level of football since 1962, explaining why there had never been a previous meeting between Robins and Vs.

Initially, Varndeanians found the step-up a struggle. They failed to win any of their opening 25 matches in any competitions, finding themselves in a hopeless position at the foot of the table in mid-December.

Then Ryan Gayler returned for a second spell as manager. He instigated an almighty turnaround with Varndeanians becoming one of the form sides in the second half of the campaign.

Vs eventually finished outside of the bottom two having overhauled relegated East Preston and Loxwood, completing an impressive great escape from the drop.

The aim in 2022-23 for Gayler and his players will be to avoid any dramas at the bottom and move into mid table.

So far, so good. Varndeanians have three wins from nine games, including an impressive success over last season's fourth Bexhill United.

And after what happened on their last visit here, they will be confident of securing victory number four this afternoon.

Robins do everything but score in more Peter Bentley Cup misery

The United Kingdom has rattled through seven Prime Ministers since Hassocks last progressed beyond the quarter finals of the Peter Bentley League Cup.

John Major. Tony Blair. Gordon Brown. David Cameron. Theresa May, Boris Johnson, And now Liz Truss have all occupied Number 10 since the 1996-97 season and the Robins' one and only foray to the final four.

Hassocks will be waiting at least a year into Ms Truss' time in office to improve their awful record in the competition after they were eliminated at the second round stage by AFC Varndeanians at the Beacon.

It finished 2-0 to the visitors in a match which was almost a carbon copy of the Robins' Friday night defeat at Little Common - same scoreline, same head scratching from Hassocks players, management and fans as to how they had not won.

The hosts were the better side, creating numerous opportunities over the 90 minutes. For the second game running, they could not make one stick on the scoreboard.

Varndeanians in contrast took advantage of a gift early in the second half to score with their first meaningful shot on target.

They doubled the advantage with their second shot on target 10 minutes later - and that proved enough to secure a home tie with Loxwood in round three.

James Westlake shuffled his pack, giving starts to Will Broomfield, Joe Bull, Tom Frankland, Liam Benson and Jamie Wilkes.

Jack Troak, Phil Johnson, Bradley Tighe, Sam Cash and Lewis Westlake were all rested. In Westlake's absence, Alex Bygraves captained Hassocks for the first time.

Nobody was really talking about the wholesale changes before the game. Instead, the focus was on the surprise presence of Pat Harding in a matchday squad for the first time

since re-joining the Robins from Burgess Hill Town in the summer.

Harding has recovered more quickly than expected from the broken ribs he sustained in a preseason friendly against Whitehawk.

He came off the bench for the final 30 minutes to guite the reception from the Beacon faithful. Harding's return is timely given the struggles Hassocks have experienced putting the ball in the back of the net during their two recent goalless outinas.

The Robins looked particularly dangerous against Varndeanians in wide positions during a first half in which Alex Harris was a spectator.

Harvey Blake and Frankland dovetailed well down the right. Leon Turner has been a lively presence on that flank so far this season but he showed he can be just as threatening the edge of the area, beat one man on the left, where he was switched in the absence of Troak.

The first clear cut chance of the game fell to head coach Westlake on 10 minutes. He defied his diminutive frame to meet a whipped Frankland cross with a header just wide.

12 minutes later and Blake and Frankland exchanged a series of passes. That created the space Frankland needed to deliver a low cross towards the front post.

Benson timed his run to perfection to get across Ollie Stevenson, only to place his sweeping finish into the side netting.

Blake was the next to cross on the half hour mark, hanging up a ball to the back post. Benson produced a startling leap and a brilliant header which required an even better save from Keen Ancell tipping over.

Ancell next kept out a Wilkes volley at full stretch. The tall striker had set himself up with lovely close control on the edge of the box after a Turner run and cross.

All of the Robins' good first half work was undone within 60 seconds of the restart. Mike Williamson

slipped when attempting to pass back to Harris, Ali Rainford gleefully accepted possession and slotted

It was a poor goal to concede. In contrast, not much could be done about Fin Bigg's strike to make it 2-0 on 56 minutes. The Varndeanians winger cut in from the left and bent a spectacular effort into the far corner.

Between the two goals, Blake hit a drive into the side netting and Wilkes had an effort blocked by imperious Vs captain Omar Bukleb.

Hassocks responded to falling two behind by rattling the woodwork twice in three minutes. Benson chested down to Turner who hit a fierce volley from 12 yards. Ancell somehow got a touch on the shot to divert it onto the crossbar.

Blake then picked up the ball on and cracked a low effort which clipped the outside of the post. Even with 25 minutes still to go at that point, you knew it was going to be one of those nights.

Hassocks used all five of their permitted subs in an attempt to find a way through. Harding looked lively, although it was Sam Smith and Tighe of the replacements who came closest to scoring late on.

Bygraves' downward header from a corner landed at the feet of Smith on the goal line but the ball got caught, allowing Ancell to grab it.

Tighe then hit an outrageous outside of the boot piledriver from 25 yards which was flicked over the bar by a Varndeanians head with the final touch of the game.

Loversidge leads Hassocks to victory against Vs with first senior hat-trick

Has a star been born at the **Beacon? Alfie Loversidge** became the first Hassocks teenager to score a senior hat -trick for 15 years as the **Robins hammered AFC** Varndeanians 4-1 in the first league meeting between the clubs.

Mid-October and the season 12 games old may be too early to describe a fixture as a six pointer.

This had the feeling though of a match Hassocks could not afford to lose against one of only four teams below them in the table.

Varndeanians arrived rock bottom with one draw and 10 defeats from 11 games, but they had shown signs of improvement in recent weeks.

Still, they had no answer to a Hassocks side giving their best performance of the season in front of a Beacon crowd of 210.

Loversidge deservedly took the headlines. This though was a real team effort and equally impressive was his strike partner Joe Bull, who set the Robins on their way to victory when opening the scoring inside of 10 minutes.

It was a goal of individual brilliance, Bull making something out of nothing. He has a natural tendency to drift into the channels and on this occasion, that saw him picking up the ball out on the right.

There did not seem much on as he cut inside the Varndeanians left back. What followed was a shot unleashed from 25 yards that caught everyone by surprise to nestle in the far corner of the Varndeanians goal.

The visitors nearly had an instant response. Hassocks were unable to clear their lines, a scuffed clearance fell to a Varndeanians player and Charlie Pugh was forced into a smart

Andy Whittingham flicked on a Pugh goal kick and when a visiting defender dallied on the ball, the rampaging Bull was able to pick his pocket.

Bull now had a clear run at goal down the left and he selflessly pulled a low cross back to Loversidge who finished with aplomb.

Six minutes later and Hassocks should have had a third. Bull was again at the heart of it, another powerful charge at the Varndeanians defence ending with a shot that was repelled.

He perhaps should have squared to Bradley Bant who was in a far better position to net against the club comeback, rattling the post with a he began the season with, but nobody could blame Bull for going it alone given the confident mood he was in.

So confident in fact that he was willing to try and audacious bicycle kick a couple of minutes into the second half.

Varndeanians did not need to worry, the effort ending up in the children's park at the west end of the ground rather than the visitors' net.

Following that, the remaining 40 or so minutes became the Loversidge smart save. show. He scored his second of the afternoon and Hassocks' third shortly after that Bull overhead.

A flying block of a Josh Short effort fell kindly to Loversidge, who showed a remarkably cool head to round the goalkeeper and finish from a very tight angle.

The treble was completed with 13 minutes remaining. Loversidge converted a penalty after being chopped down in the box, becoming the first 18-year-old to nab a Hassocks hat-trick since Matt Amos in 2006. Not bad company to be in.

The similarities do not end there. Hassocks doubled their advantage Like Amos, Loversidge started out as a midfielder. Brad Sweetman's decision to push him further forward in the wake of George Mitchell-Phillips' departure to Saltdean United is looking inspired and Loversidge now sits on seven goals from 15 matches. He is guite the talent.

There was plenty of action to note in-between Loversidge's second and third goals, too. Following the return of Spencer Slaughter to the Beacon from Loxwood, Hassocks have also raided Plaistow Road to bring James Westlake and Josh Hawkes back to the club.

Both were introduced as second half substitutes, the recipients of excellent receptions from the Hassocks faithful telling you just how well their captures have gone down.

Westlake nearly made the perfect volley five minutes after his introduction.

The rebound was bundled home, only to be correctly ruled out for a foul on the goalkeeper by referee Thomas Price.

There were other chances for Hassocks to go beyond the four goals they managed. Westlake tried a bicycle kick of his own from a long throw which was much closer than Bull's earlier effort, forcing the Varndeanians goalkeeper into a

Westlake then should have done better when off target from another enterprising cross from Bull and Loversidge was inches wide with a snapshot.

The only downer came when Varndeanians denied Pugh and his defence a clean sheet, substitute Constantin Cornel Ducia powering home a free header with seven minutes remaining.

Robins face Tigers and Frow in County Cups

The draws for the two Sussex County FA run competitions have been made, handing Hassocks intriguing fixtures against opponents very familiar and completely new.

In the Sussex Senior Cup, the Robins will welcome Saltdean United to the Beacon in the first round of the competition this Tuesday night with a 7:45pm kick off.

With former Hassocks head coach Brad Sweetman now in charge of the Tigers and a number of players having followed him to Hill Park in the summer, there is sure to be added intrigue.

Jack Gardner, Lewis Beebee, Alfie Edmeads, Louis Thwaites, Lucas Tyrrell, Jayden Dunkley and Jacob Campbell are just some of former Robins who could line up for Saltdean when they visit Mid Sussex for the tie.

Hassocks and Saltdean have met once before in the Senior Cup, back in the 2001-02 campaign.

The Robins won an eight-goal thriller 5-3 at Hill Park, starting a memorable run to the third round of

the competition.

Dave John's side went onto beat Saltdean's local rivals Peacehaven & Telscombe 1-0 next, earning the plum third round draw of Brighton & Hove Albion Reserves at the Beacon.

A huge crowd attended and they were treated to something of an exhibition from the Albion, who ran out 8-1 winners.

In total, Hassocks have faced Saltdean on 31 occasions in all competitions, winning 12 times. There have been four draws and 15 victories for the Tigers.

The draw for the second round of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup meanwhile has given the Robins a trip to Southern Combination League Division One side Forest Row.

Hassocks very much enjoyed themselves in the competition last year, advancing all the way to the semi final where treble-winning Littlehampton Town proved to be too good for Sweetman's side.

The RUR Cup clash will be the first ever meeting between the clubs at senior level, although the old Hassocks IIIs have experience of

facing Frow from their days in the Mid Sussex League.

The most recent clash came in the 2010-11 season when Steve Spies' Robins won 4-1 at the Beacon.

Two goals apiece from Stuart Dallaway and Greg Hearn secured victory against a Forest Row side who ended that campaign relegated.

Frow joined the Southern Combination for the start of the 2021 -22 season, being bumped up two divisions from the Mid Sussex Premier into Division One.

They finished 11th in their first year but are finding the current campaign a little harder going, sitting 17th with just one league win from nine outings.

Forest Row play their home games at Tinsley Lane, Oakwood - a venue Hassocks have not visited for a competitive game since the 2008-09 campaign and a 1-0 Premier Division defeat to an Oak side relegated shortly after.

The tie will take place on Wednesday 26th October with a 7:45pm kick off.

Harris hits hundred Hassocks appearances

Alex Harris has become the latest inductee to the Hassocks Centurions club, joining a select list of goalkeepers to have made 100 appearances for the club in senior football.

Just three other number ones have a century of games at this level of football for Hassocks to their name - Joel Harding, Paul John and Jack Simpson. Not bad company to be in.

Harris has reached the landmark over nine years and five different spells with the Robins, the first of which began in the 2013-14 season when he was just 16-years-old.

Mickey Jewell brought Harris to the Beacon on dual-signed terms from Woking, where he was Under 18s goalkeeper.

The Cardinals wanted Harris to gain experience of senior football and Jewell needed somebody to deputise for Simpson, who was off backpacking three months into the campaign.

Harris initially sat on the bench as jersey before again departing. number two to Simpson before getting his opportunity in November. He made a total of 16 appearances for the Robins.

His second spell at the Beacon came midway through the 2015-16 campaign. Hassocks were embroiled in a relegation battle when Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar signed Harris from Metropolitan Police.

It proved to be an inspired piece of transfer business. Harris played a major role in helping the Robins climb away from the danger zone, including keeping four clean sheets in a clubrecord run of eight consecutive wins.

Harris lost his place to James Broadbent at the start of the 2016-17 season, subsequently moving to Burgess Hill Town.

His third spell at Hassocks came at the start of the 2017-18 season after Broadbent moved onto Ryman League Shoreham.

Harris vied with Nathan Stroomberg for the number one Dalgleish then re-signed Harris for a fourth spell at the start of 2018-19 but again, it was short-lived.

His current spell has been by far his most successful as a Hassocks player. Harris has firmly established himself as number one over the past year, making 44 appearances since Brad Sweetman brought him back to solve the selection inconsistency which blighted the Robins' goalkeeping department.

Hassocks defensive record from November onwards with Harris playing regularly was much improved, including keeping six clean sheets from the final 13 games of the season.

This tightening up at the back provided the bedrock for the Robins to finish nine points clear of relegation and make the semi finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity

Congratulations to Alex for reaching the milestone.

The Robins should have been out of sight by that point. Just like in recent defeats to Little Common, AFC Varndeanians and Crawley Down Gatwick, Hassocks missed a succession of gilt-edged opportunities.

Credit though to a very youthful United side. Their equalising goal came on 66 minutes from a player even younger than Ellis, 16-year-old Ellis Dunn having cancelled out Liam Benson's opener.

Chessington spent much of the 90 having to weather a sea-storm, picking their moment to strike like a vampire late on to spark scenes of jubilation amongst the Chalky Lane faithful at knocking out opponents from one division higher.

The opening 15 minutes was oneway traffic, other than a Chessington corner nearly creeping directly in when Alex Harris appeared to be impeded.

Leon Turner drew a good stop from Andrew Osei inside of 180 seconds before firing the follow up over the bar.

That was the start of a busy afternoon for Osei. His next intervention was to make a strong save low down to his right from Jack Troak collecting Pat Harding's flick on of a Harris goal kick.

Chessington could have been reduced in number as early as the 13th minute. Turner capitalised on a loose pass and was haring in on goal when Aaron Cole-Bolt brought him down just outside the box.

Hassocks wanted a red as they The referee did not agree and Cole-Bolt was relieved to get away with a booking, leaving him to walk a disciplinary tightrope.

The Robins made a circus of the free kick but were given a second bite of the cherry when Chessington committed another foul when attempting to clear. Troak stepped up this time, his low effort comfortably held by Osei.

Turner was causing real problems with just his decision making letting him down on occasions. In one instance, he picked the pocket of the Chessington right back and should have squared to Benson who was aueuina in the middle.

Instead, Turner went for goal himself with a weak left footed shot easy to repel for Osei.

Troak learned from Turner's mistake when released by Harris, cutting the ball back to Benson. The striker did well to shift around Cole-Bolt, only to fire into orbit.

Two more chances came from Troak before the break. A free kick was straight at Osei and then Benson turned provider, crossing to Troak who headed straight down the throat of the United number one.

The second half began exactly where the first had left off. Blake delivered a free kick into the box which Troak volleyed over when he should have at least hit the target.

Hassocks finally broke the deadlock with a well-worked goal on



50 minutes. Turner robbed Cole-Bolt, James Westlake worked the ball to Harding who delivered a perfect low cross to leave Benson with a tap in from on the goal line.

"Surprised we didn't find a way to miss that," quipped one relieved travelling fan. The joke wore thin quite quickly when Benson scuffed wide twice in quick succession from Troak crosses, followed by Chessington punishing all those previous Hassocks misses by finding an equaliser out of nothing.

Dunn took a corner which Blake on the front post and Harris got in a right mess from. The ball somehow sailed between the pair and into the back of the net.

Another driving run from Turner saw him beat three men before firing over when again there were better options for the pass.

Then came the red card. George Fry let the referee know in no uncertain terms that he felt he had been fouled in the middle of the park.

Those protests saw Fry talk himself into a sin bin, then upgraded to a dismissal following a quite spectacular piece of continued ranting and raving.

Unfortunately, Hassocks seemed to find it harder playing against 10. They created only one chance of note in the final 20 minutes when substitute Phil Johnson glanced a header wide from a free kick.

That left the spectre of spot kicks looming large until Ellis struck on 89 minutes, Hassocks seeing their FA Vase adventure ended by Chessington at the earliest hurdle.

Tuesday night games against early Southern Combination League Premier Division pacesetters seem to be to the liking of Hassocks right now.

One week on from their 4-2 win at third-place Horsham YMCA, the Robins claimed a point from a sixgoal thriller against a Broadbridge Heath side who arrived at the Beacon sitting second in the table.

Hassocks trailed, led, trailed again and then levelled to make it 3-3 with seven minutes remaining through the in-form Liam Benson.

They played some scintillating stuff at times before relying on grit and determination to take the draw which they deserved.

It was wildly entertaining and a sign of what this Robins side can be capable of when they take their goal scoring chances - something which they have not done enough of in recent weeks when falling to Little Common, Crawley Down Gatwick, AFC Varndeanians and Chessington & Hook United.

Heath made a fast start, showing the Hassocks faithful why they are some peoples' idea of dark horses for the title in a wide-open campaign with no obvious candidates.

Lewis Croal opened the scoring with 10 minutes played. A slide-rule pass was slipped between Joe Bull and Bradley Tighe with Croal winning the race and firing right footed past Alex Harris.

The Bears were ahead for only seven minutes. Bull delivered an outswinger corner which found its way to Jack Troak on the edge of the box.

Troak unleashed a fierce strike. When it proved too hot for Heath goalkeeper Liam Matthews to handle, Benson was on hand to gobble up the rebound for 1-1.

Heath responded by trying to get back on the front foot. That suited Hassocks, who were happy to sit, pinch possession and then use the pace and directness of Troak, Leon Turner and Phil Johnson on the break.

Several half chances came and went for both sides before a Troak rocket put Hassocks into the lead on 33 minutes.

There did not seem much on when Troak picked the ball up 30 yards from goal, only for him to unleash a low effort which left Matthews helpless as it clipped the far post on its way in.

James Westlake fed Johnson who bent just over on the stroke of half time after another dangerous counter.

But if Heath were expecting Hassocks to continue sitting in at the start of the second 45, they were in for a surprise.

Within the opening five minutes Matthews had to be alert to hold a Troak effort and Turner and Harvey Blake linked up well down the right, the latter crossing to Benson who could not quite get a shot away.

A flurry of cards followed as the game became rather heated. Tall striker Jamie Wilkes entered the book, although nobody was entirely sure what for.

That miss only galvanised Hassocks. Johnson stole the ball from Mark Zydonik, the defender who played eight times for the Robins at the start of the campaign before returning to Heath. Matthews comfortably saved the subsequent weak effort from Johnson.





Zydonik was lucky to stay on the pitch a couple of minutes later when he produced a shocking tackle on Turner.

Remarkably, Mr Wells did not even deem it worthy of a yellow. Zydonik's crime spree would continue with another nasty foul on Benson in injury time.

A chaotic final 20 minutes was kicked off when substitute Tyler Symonds equalised for Heath.

It was a poor goal to concede from a Hassocks viewpoint, Blake seeming to miss his clearance to allow Symonds to run through and beat Harris.

10 minutes later and Heath moved 3-2 ahead when Croal scored his second of the evening.

The reaction of some of the Bears substitutes seemed to suggest they thought that had won them the three points - a very bold position to take given the manner in which the game had ebbed and flowed up until that point.

And so it proved when Benson made it 3-3 less than 60 seconds later.

Turner won possession and produced the perfect cross met with a powerful header from Benson which gave Matthews no chance.

Two more chances were packed into the remaining eight minutes, one per team.

A Harvey Blake charge from right back saw him clip a diagonal to Phil Johnson. Johnson produced an unbelievable first touch, taking out both Loxwood centre backs only for his thumping volley to fly just wide. Leon Turner spent a large portion of last season with Loxwood and he worked wonders against his old club, beating two players down the right and cutting back to Jamie Wilkes.

The tall striker was unfortunate to see his thunderbolt from 24 yards crash into the post and away to safety.

Hassocks chances kept coming. A Joe Bull corner was met by an Alex Bygraves volley blocked on the line.

The Robins had strong penalty appeals waved away when Johnson was brought down by Loxwood goalkeeper Fraser Trigwell, followed shortly after by the Magpies rattling the bar with a great free kick from 30 yards.

Despite the blistering end to the half, it looked like the sides would head in goalless. That was until more good distribution from Harris was flicked on by Liam Benson, sending Troak clear.

Troak gathered and composed himself, cutting the ball to Johnson who converted with the half time whistle coming seconds after the restart.

It was the perfect time for Hassocks to score and the least they deserved. Loxwood to their credit did used falling behind so late as motivation and they began the second half in strong fashion.

The Magpies should have equalised when a nice cross from out on the right found the head of the unmarked Devon Fender. He somehow headed wide.

Harris achieved the frankly ridiculously feat of entering the book for kicking the ball away when Hassocks won a free kick.





He was joined in the yellow card club minutes later by Loxwood captain Adrian Todd.

Hassocks were handed a glorious chance to double their lead on 63 minutes. A quickly taken free kick from the rangy Wilkes put Blake in on goal, who was subsequently wiped out by Trigwell.

Troak stepped up for the resulting penalty but missed a second successive spot kick having seen his effort from 12 yards saved against Broadbridge Heath on Tuesday night.

The Robins tried to set about ensuring that miss did not prove costly. Pat Harding entered the fray in place of Johnson and Turner danced around a series of white shirts before being denied as he was about to pull the trigger by a brilliant last ditch tackle from Igor Sokirke.

Loxwood began to enjoy their best spell after that. Harris made a strong save when a left sided corner caused issues.

Williamson then had to make a clever modern-day foul and accept the booking that came with it to break up a dangerous looking counter.

Having weathered the storm, Hassocks wrapped up the points in the final minute. Harding raced onto a bouncing ball, opened up his body and then bent a stunning effort into the top corner for his 138th Robins goal - and first since returning from Burgess Hill Town.

There was still time for one more incident, Todd picking up a second yellow for scything down Williamson as home frustrations boiled over.



Tuck provided further vindication for him being fast-tracked back into the starting XI by joining Mercer on the scoresheet with Sam Geard the other Robin who notched.


Alex Adejokun denied Callum Thompson a fourth clean sheet of the campaign as Chessington became only the second opponents to find a way past the Robins defence.

Mavericks prove too sharp for Hassocks in first defeat of the season

Southern Combination League Under 18 Central Division Sunday 18th September 2022, The Beacon Hassocks U18s 1-2 Worthing United U18s

Following a week off out of respect for the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Hassocks Under 18s returned to action with a tough game at home to Worthing United.

The Mavericks finished third in the Southern Combination League Under 18 Central Division last season and had started their campaign with a 5-3 win over Shoreham.

United had also played twice in the FA Youth Cup, beating Newhaven on penalties before bowing out against Bexhill United.

That gave them three competitive games under their belts whereas Hassocks only had one, their opening day 3-1 comeback win over Steyning Town at the Beacon.

Steyning themselves were runners up in 2021-22, so the Robins still felt confident of their chances having already picked up an impressive victory over the Barrowmen.

You can sometimes read too much into how a team did the previous year in Under 18s football where there is so much change from season-to-season.

Where United undoubtedly had the advantage was in match sharpness thanks to their additional two games. That showed as they ran out 2-1 winners.

Hassocks made two changes from their side who had beaten the Barrowmen a week earlier.

Last season's top scorer Oliver Parker-Williams was available for his first start of the campaign, replacing Cam Mitchell who dropped to the bench as he continued to recover from his exploits at the Reading Festival.

The other change saw George Gladding make his debut for the Robins in place of the absent Will Varley.

Two more players made their Hassocks debuts from the bench. Will Matthews and Eden Thompson were both introduced as substitutes as the Robins sought to take something from the tie.

When Hassocks last met United back in January, it had resulted in one of the craziest Under 18s games for many years. An 11-goal thriller was edged 6-5 by the Mavericks.

There was not quite as much entertainment on this occasion, but it was still 90 minutes of high quality football from two sides who wanted to play the game the right way.

Goals from Liam Appleton and Callum Noyce secured the three points for United, moving them

October 8th 2011: 10 goals were scored in an entertaining 90 minutes at Kiln Brown but unfortunately for Hassocks, Redhill notched seven of them on their way to a 7-3 victory

It is now 13 goals conceded in two games spaced just four days apart as Hassocks found themselves hammered 7-3 away at Redhill.

10 goals made for plenty of entertainment for the home fans and neutrals at Kiln Brow.

Not for Mickey Jewell and the Robins though, even if most in attendance agreed that the scoreline was a little harsh.

Tuesday night had seen Hassocks go from leading Lancing 1-0 after 30 minutes in the Sussex Senior Cup to coming off an hour later eliminated from the competition via a 6-1 defeat.

The Robins looked shell shocked by full time at Culver Road, a state that extended to the opening 45 minutes here when Redhill scored five unanswered goals.

That left Hassocks dead and buried before the half time tea was being served.

They did at least recover with a much-improved performance after the break, winning the second half 3-2.

How much of that was down to Redhill taking their foot of the pedal with the game already won is up for debate.

Jewell and the Robins though will take any positive they can get at the minute.

Giving a strong Lobsters outfit something to think about is a straw worth clutching.

Redhill have a talented squad and a manager in ex-Crowborough Athletic boss Simon Colbran who knows what it takes to win a County League title.

The Lobsters had been tipped in some quarters to make an impression on the championship race, although three consecutive losses had raised question marks.

Hassocks were unfortunate to catch Redhill in the midst of such a barren run.

They were clearly fired up to put things right and Colbran was a vocal presence on the touchline, urging his side forward at every opportunity.

Great work from the impressive Wayne Clark set up Billy Medlock for the Redhill opener on 12 minutes.

To make the non-penalty award even more disappointing, Redhill made the most of the reprieve by going straight up the other end and scoring their sixth.

It was a quite brilliant individual solo goal from Clark, who deserved his brace for a performance in which he teased and tormented Hassocks all afternoon.

A first trip to Crowborough since Crowborough returned to the Southern Combination League from the Southern Counties East in the summer beckons to face opponents making a mark on their return to Sussex football

Crowborough Athletic this season

After eight seasons spent away from the Southern Combination, Crowborough were moved back by the FA to where they have spent most of their existence. The South East Counties is considered a stronger league than our own, so the theory went that the Crows would make quite the impression on their return. They are handily sat in 10th position at the time of writing with four wins, four draws and two defeats. The Crows' most impressive result of the campaign so far being a 1-0 win over Eastbourne United at the Crowborough Community Stadium back in August, followed closely by holding leaders Newhaven.

Head-to-head

We were regular opponents before the Crows found themselves moved into the Kent-based league. 25 well beate previous matches have resulted in 13 Hassocks wins, nine Crowborough victories and three draws. Our good record was helped by an unbeaten six game spell including five successive wins between 2010 and 2014.

Last time we met

Crowborough visited the Beacon in the third round of the 2016-17 Sussex Senior Cup. Victory would have equalled our best ever run in the competition by securing a quarter final berth. It was the visitors though who picked up a 1-0 win through a Ross Treleaven goal with five minutes

remaining. The most recent league meeting came in April 2014, when Mickey Jewell's injury-hit squad were well beaten 4-0 at the Community Stadium.

How to get to the Community Stadium

Head east on the A272, taking a right at the roundabout when you reach the A22. At the next roundabout with the McDonalds go left and follow the A26 towards Crowborough. Just before entering the town, take a right onto Sheep Plain, following the road until you reach Aldervale Cottages on your right. The ground is then on the right nearly immediately after you turn onto the road.

Eastbourne United this season

United endured a slow start to 2021-22 until the appointment of former AFC Uckfield Town boss Anthony Storey in October. An influx of former Oakmen players followed, helping lift United from the fringes of the relegation battle to a final finishing position of fifth, their highest since being crowned champions in 2008-09. They have continued in that vein so far in the current campaign and were the early league leaders at one point. At the time of writing, United sit fifth with six wins and one draw from 10 games so far. The good news for us is that two of their three Premier Division defeats have come in their past four matches.

Head-to-head

The Robins dominate the head-to-head with 18 wins to United's 14 and 12 draws in our 44 meetings. That record is helped hugely by the fact that we used to love visiting the Oval for reasons that nobody could ever really understand. We won six times in a row there between 2010 and 2019 despite only finishing above United twice in that period, although that run has been dampened somewhat by defeats on our last three visits to the Sunshine Coast.

Last time we met

A January trip to the Oval resulted in 90 minutes of turgid football lacking in any real quality. One of the only moments worth writing about

provided the game's single goal, scored by United captain Charlie Ball. Conjuring something out of nothing, Ball hit an unstoppable effort from 25 yards which Alex Harris could only watch rocket into the top corner.

Links between the clubs?

Jack Troak played for United earlier in his career as a young player at Lewes after the Rooks decided they wanted the lively left winger to experience of senior football. Goalkeeper James Broadbent won a clean sweep of Players' Player, Supporters' Player and Managers' Player of the Season at the Beacon after signing from United for 2016-17 and current Eastbourne Town women's manager Zak Dove turned out for both clubs.

Forest Row this season

This is Forest Row's second season in the Southern Combination League following their promotion up two levels from the Mid Sussex Premier in the summer of 2021. Their first campaign in Division One went well, culminating in an 11th placed finish. Frow have suffered from second season syndrome of sorts so far and currently sit 17th with only Montpelier Villa below them. Defying their lowly position is the fact their sole league win was a stunning 4-1 success over promotion hopefuls Seaford Town. They also have a Peter Bentley League Cup victory against landlords Oakwood under their belts before a 5 -0 elimination at the hands of Lingfield in the second round.

Head-to-head

As mentioned, this will be our first ever meeting at senior level with Frow. The old Hassocks IIIs faced Forest Row in the Mid Sussex League between 2006 and 2011. Their head-to-head reads eight matches, three wins, two draws, three defeats, 16 scored and 13 conceded. Remarkably, Phil Wickwar is responsible for two of those goals. Such an impressive record might give Westy something to ponder ahead of the trip to Tinsley Lane...

Last time we played at Tinsley Lane

Frow might be new opponents but Tinsley Lane is not a new ground. We used to play there on a frequent

basis against Oakwood, although our last visit was as long ago as April 2009. It was not a good one either; a 1-0 defeat against hosts who would be relegated a fee weeks later.

How to get to Tinsley Lane

Take the A23/M23, come off at Junction 10 and head towards Crawley on the A2011. At the first roundabout, go all the way around to the fourth exit for Gatwick Road and Manor Royal. Take the second exit at the next roundabout, continuing on Gatwick Road. Tinsley Lane will be on your right, between the Kia showroom and the next roundabout. Take the first left onto Kenmara Court and the ground is at the end of the road.
