It is an intriguing game too, pitting ourselves for the first time against our former head coach Brad Sweetman and a large number of ex-Robins who followed Brad to Hill Park in the summer.

Brad did a fine job at the Premier Division survival and taking us to our first Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup semi final in a decade.

He will always be warmly received here for those efforts, as well as the time and work he put into managing the Under 18s through one of their most successful periods ever between 2017 and 2021.

As well as welcoming Brad, his players, the fans and officials of Saltdean, we would also like to congratulate our visitors on the fantastic news that their redevelopment of Hill Park has been granted planning permission.

A new clubhouse, stand and artificial pitch are set to go in, providing a platform for both Saltdean's men's and women's sections to progress up the pyramid. What an exciting time to be a Tiger.

It is also a pretty exciting time to be a Robin too. This weekend saw three victories out of three, including the first team moving to within five points of top spot in the Premier Division.

Saturday's 2-0 win over AFC Vardndeanians was the result of a professional performance, avenging our Peter Bentley League Cup exit against the same opponents at the start of September.

On Sunday morning, the Under 18s ran out 7-0 winners at Mile Oak. The Ladies followed that up by booking a League Cup quarter final spot with a 9-1 victory at AFC Uckfield Town.

Combined with a 6-2 win at Horsham YMCA on Thursday night for the Under 23s, you had a perfect run of results for all our sides.

There are numerous opportunities to see if that form can continue this week here at the Beacon. Thursday night sees the Under 23s host Lingfield in a 7:45pm kick off.

That is followed by a double header on Sunday, the Under 18s welcoming AFC Varndeanians at 11am followed by the Ladies playing Saltdean United. Admission to both games is free.

# There will be familiar faces at the Beacon this evening in the colours of Saltdean with ex-Robins head coach Brad Sweetman charged with rebuilding the Tigers

Sweetman was appointed in the summer following the resignation of Bryan O'Toole, whose departure sparked the mass exodus of the squad who had finished runners up to Littlehampton Town in both the Southern Combination League and the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

As the result of such upheaval, Saltdean were widely tipped for relegation this season - just like how Sweetman and his young Hassocks side were written off in 2021-22.

And just as happened at the Beacon, Sweetman and co are defying the predictions.

They sit six points clear of the Premier Division's bottom two with an eye catching win over Eastbourne Town their most impressive result so far.

Amongst the former Hassocks players who we could face today are Jack Gardner, Alfie Edmeads, Louis Thwaites, Lucas Tyrrell, Jayden Dunkley, Jacob Campbell and the Tigers' seven-goal top scorer Lewis Beebee.

The majority of those youngsters were not born on the one and only occasion that we have faced Saltdean before in the Sussex Senior Cup.

That came in the 2001-02 season, when the Robins won an eight-goal thriller 5-3 at Hill Park in the first round of the competition.

Dave John's side went onto beat the Tigers' local rivals Peacehaven & Telscombe, landing the plum tie of Brighton & Hove Albion Reserves in round three.

A huge crowd attended and they were treated to something of an exhibition from the Albion's professionals, who ran out 8-1 winners.

Having exited the Peter Bentley Cup and the FA Vase at the earliest possible opportunity this season, the Robins will be hoping that the Senior Cup in 2022-23 can provide similar memories to 21 years ago.

#### **Played for Both**

The number of links between the clubs have obviously jumped significantly this summer, but even before Brad Sweetman and his ex-Robins made Hill Park their new home there were plenty of players to have turned out for both through the years.

James Broadbent was number one goalkeeper for Saltdean last season as the Tigers finished runners up in both the Southern Combination League and RUR Charity Cup.

Broadbent spent the 2016-17 campaign as a Robin, playing a huge role in helping us avoid relegation on his way to winning a clean sweep of Players' Player, Managers' Player and Supporters' Player of the Season awards.

Another goalkeeper to have turned out for both clubs is Nathan **Stroomberg**, who played 21 times for Hassocks in the 2017-18 season.

Stroomberg spent the following season with Saltdean before establishing himself at number one at for first team football from the Lewes.

Striker Ben Bacon has enjoyed two spells with Hassocks and one with the Tigers, coming back to haunt of the Saltdean management team. us by scoring all four goals as Saltdean won 4-1 on their August Bank Holiday Monday visit to the Beacon in 2018.

Striker **Dan Smith** played for the

Tigers in amongst his three spells with Hassocks between 2010 and 2013. His overall record for the Robins stood at 27 goals in 63 games with an even more impressive strike rate at Hill Park when Saltdean were a Division Two outfit.

Stuart Brown moved to Hill Park Beacon midway through the 2014-15 season, when our former reserve team boss **Scott Osborne** was part

# **Christmas miracle as Hassocks take** point from leaders Saltdean

**Ever the optimists, one Hassocks** going on this occasion. 15 minutes fan turned to another in the Clubhouse before kick off as the **Robins hosted Southern Combination League Premier** Division leaders and said: "This could be worse than the cricket."

Christmas though is the season for miracles. England desperately need one in Australia.

Hassocks got one in Mid Sussex, drawing 1-1 with an outstanding Tigers side who had walloped them 6 -0 earlier in the campaign.

You could understand the pessimism amongst the home support. Saltdean arrived having put nine unanswered goals past East Preston seven days earlier.

They then went and eliminated Conference South side Eastbourne Borough from the Sussex Senior Cup in midweek.

Tigers manager Bryan O'Toole has built a squad that reads like a who's who of recent Southern Combination title winners and right now, they are playing at the peak of their powers as those previous two results evidence.

Hassocks meanwhile are ravaged by injury and illness to key players. Josh Short and Dan Turner were the latest notable omissions, joining longterm absentees like Andy Whittingham, Bradley Bant, Lucas Tyrrell, Jack Gardner and Spencer Slaughter on the missing list.

Brad Sweetman opted to replace Turner and Short with experience, turning to Jordan Badger and Jack Troak.

Both have endured stop-start campaigns and were making only their fifth and third starts of the season respectively.

Saltdean had flown out of the traps on their way to scoring six goals last time these sides met, opening the scoring inside of 120 seconds on that balmy August evening at Hill Park.

It took them a little longer to get

had elapsed when Trevor McCreadie - so often a thorn in Hassocks' side during his Haywards Heath Town days – latched onto a ball over the top.

Alex Harris was quick off his line and did well to shut the danger down, resulting in McCreadie lifting his effort over the bar.

Hassocks registered their first chance shortly after. Sam Smith was making his home debut and he had a good sight 25 yards out but his effort lacked the required power to trouble former Hassocks favourite James Broadbent in the Tigers goal.

Saltdean took the lead on 20 minutes via an elegant strike from Tom Caplin.

Hassocks were unable to clear their lines and Caplin needed no second invitation when the ball fell to him 22 yards out, driving a clinical effort into the bottom corner.

The Robins were dealt a blow seven minutes later when Smith limped out of the action, adding to the their injury woes.

Joe Bull seemed the obvious replacement but Sweetman instead opted to bring Josh Hawkes on up front.

Hawkes has been in good scoring form recently for the Under 23s, but he cannot have been asked to lead the line many times in his senior career – as the look on his face of a man whose Christmases had all come at once eluded to.

It turned out to be an inspired decision and on the stroke of half time, Hawkes was denied what appeared a stonewall penalty.

Arthur Rawlingson went charging forward from right back to deliver the perfect cross which Hawkes looked set to get his chin on until he was clumsily tripped by a Saltdean defender. Remarkably, referee Ian Moore waved play on.

Undeterred, Hassocks continued to take the game to their visitors at the start of the second half. A quick counter inside the opening five minutes ended with Troak whistling a half volley over.

The Robins got the goal they deserved a few minutes later. Troak had a shot blocked but the ball fell kindly to Alfie Loversidge who slammed home from eight yards out for his eighth goal of the season.

Jack Baden was the next Hassocks player to depart injured, Charlie Tuck coming on at left back in a straight swap. It did not take Tuck long to make an impression.

A Badger slip let in McCreadie and the Robins looked bang in trouble until Tuck appeared from nowhere, producing one of the best tackles that the Beacon has seen in many years to snuff out the danger.

Saltdean continued to pour forward in the final 15 minutes and it was all hands on deck for Hassocks.

The Tigers had the ball in the net with five of normal time left to play but a tight offside call correctly went the Robins' way.

Harris repelled a Saltdean header with a fine save before Hassocks made their final change, the tireless Lewis Westlake making way for Luke Marshall as another defender was chucked on to try and help preserve the point.

Hassocks got there after what must have felt like an endless amount of time added on.

The reaction of the players at the end told its own story about what a big result this was. Move over Jesus, Mary, Joseph and the wee donkey there is a new Christmas miracle in town.

## Spinks strike earns point but it could have been more for Robins

On a big night in the Southern **Combination League Premier** Division relegation battle, nothing could separate Saltdean **United and Hassocks as they** played out a 1-1 draw at a freezing Hill Park.

This was a game that neither side could afford to lose. Both sides got their wish in that regard, but by full time they could also both have laid justifiable claims to being worthy of three points.

The hosts had more of the ball but were only able to force Charlie Pugh into one meaningful save.

Hassocks by contrast had to defend for their lives at times and yet managed to miss three glorious chances to add to Alex Spinks' first half volley. It was a strange evening.

An important one, too. Saltdean and Hassocks weren't the only sides in the bottom six meeting as some 27 miles to west, 16th placed East Preston were hosting 18th placed Pagham at the Lashmar.

That went the way of the visitors as Pagham made it three wins in a row to climb out of the relegation zone for the first time this season.

The Lions are now four points clear of Hassocks having played a game more.

The gap between the Robins and EP is down to five with Hassocks having three games in hand.

Saltdean stay eight ahead having played twice more whilst Lingfield's 3 -0 defeat at Lancing dropped them to 18th, two points better off than the Robins.

There will no doubt be plenty more twists and turns to come in what is shaping up to be an intriguing fight to avoid the drop into Division One.

Should Hassocks be successful in doing so, then they will look back on this as a valuable point.

Little of note happened in the opening 15 minutes, save for the crowd admiring Hassocks' cheery surprise return of James Westlake to first team duty.

Westlake has spent the past couple of months combining appearances for the Under 23s with his running commitments and this was his first game of senior football since December 2018.

It took just 26 minutes for Westlake to make his mark as he played a part in the Hassocks goal.

Some neat play down the right between Westlake, Dan Stokes and Liam Benson earned a throw which Dan Turner came forward to launch into the box.

Turner's trebuchet caused chaos and with Saltdean unable to effectively clear their lines, Spinks was on hand to crash a crisp volley past home goalkeeper Billy Collings.

A timely moment for the Hassocks captain to score his first for the club. Saltdean had gone ahead eight minutes earlier through Dan Perry, scoring his 27th of the season after taking advantage of some slack marking to glance home a Jack Walters cross.

22 of Perry's total were scored for Eastbourne Town earlier in the

Convincing one of the Premier Division's leading strikers to swap a title chase at the Saffrons for a relegation battle at Hill Park was an extraordinary piece of transfer business from the Saltdean hierarchy and one which could go a long way towards ensuring their survival.

Hassocks know only too well what a difference a talismanic marksman can make, given that they've had to do without the services of Phil Johnson for most of this season thanks to a succession of injuries.

You would certainly have backed the Robins to get all three points had Johnson been playing here with the opportunities that they created.

Three of those chances should have led to goals. There were two

new yellow away kit and taking in the minutes of the first half remaining when Benson sprung the offside trap with a perfectly timed run to latch onto Jack Troak's through ball, but his effort was too close to Collings.

> Midway through the second half and Westlake drew an excellent stop from Collings.

The loose ball fell to Benson who looked certain to roll into an empty net, only for some desperate defending from the hosts to scramble it behind for a corner.

Then in the 89th minute, Westlake had a near-identical one-on -one to Benson's first half effort kept out by Collings after the Saltdean defence misjudged Jack Troak's ball over the top.

At the other end, Pugh's only real save came on 70 minutes when Perry brilliantly played in home captain Harry Shooman but his effort from six yards out, front and centre was somehow repelled by Hassocks' voung number one.

Perry himself put a free header over shortly afterwards when the Saltdean right back hung a cross up to the back post, but other than that Pugh had a largely quiet evening save for expertly gathering a couple of set piece deliveries.

His unemployment was largely down to the efforts of his defenders. For all Saltdean's possession, they struggled to find a way past Hassocks' two best players on the night - Turner who headed everything and Will Broomfield who turned into a one-man blocking machine.

# Hassocks in the Senior Cup

Hassocks first entered the Sussex Senior Cup in the 1981/82 season. Since then, it's a been a competition that has delivered some big wins, some great memories and plenty of "what might have been" moments...

The furthest that the Robins have gone in the competition is the quarter finals, a stage we reached in three seasons out of four in the middle of the 00's.

Two of those adventures were ended by clubs from higher divisions in memorable encounters at the Beacon; the other was arguably a great opportunity missed, although nobody felt like that at the time.

Our first appearance in the last eight came in the 2005-06 season against a Horsham side who were enjoying a golden period of their own.

Horsham had pretty much the same squad that would go onto reach the second round of the FA Cup two years later where they

would take League One side Swansea everybody wants from the City to a replay.

On this occasion though it was them who were nearly victims of a giant killing as despite the two divisions difference between Robins and Hornets, the visitors required extra time to see off plucky Hassocks.

Mickey Turner and Richard Thomas scored for us but Horsham had just about enough quality to win 3-2 in extra time.

The Hornets would go onto make the final that year, going down 3-1 to Lewes at Priory Lane five months later.

The following season and we again made the quarter finals, this time receiving the plum draw that

competition - Brighton and Hove Albion at home.

The Seagulls bought an experienced line up to a Beacon that was packed out by over 300 intrigued spectators and none of them could deny that the men in red were harshly done by in going down 2-0.

The most controversial moment came in the first half when Brighton captain Richard Carpenter slapped Mark Sherriff in the face right in front of the referee.

Incredibly, the official described it as "a friendly slap" and therefore deemed it worthy of only a yellow card, infuriating home connections.

Hassocks might have fancied their chances against 10 men but with 11,

the Albion's professionals had the fitness edge and that was enough to see them squeak through thanks to goals from Nathan Elder and Doug Loft.

Our most recent run to the quarter finals came two seasons after that clash with the Albion with Shoreham the visitors to the Beacon in the 2008-09 campaign.

The Robins were in the midst of a desperate battle against relegation at the time. Dave John wasn't backwards in coming forwards by saying that the only reason he was glad to be in the last eight was because it was another fixture which meant Jack Simpson and Spencer Slaughter could get one-match bans out the way without impacting on his side's survival bid!

Looking back though, this was a real opportunity to reach the final four against a fellow Southern Combination League side which Hassocks were unable to take, going down 1-0 at the Beacon.

That bought to an end one of the more interesting runs in the competition for the club.

It should have finished against Conference South outfit Bognor Regis Town in the second round stage, but the Rocks played an ineligible player in their 5-2 extra time win and so we were put through.

Chichester City came to the Beacon in round three and a goalkeeping crisis meant that Chi's 58 -year-old manager Adie Girdler had to play himself in goal.

Girdler was only beaten by an original tie had ended a shooting Field - and aw progressed 1-0 to set up their quarter final tie with the Musselmen. original tie had ended a Shooting Field - and aw Storrington in 2012-13. Our ridiculous 6-4 vi

The third round has been the exit point of the competition for us on seven occasions and always to clubs from outside of the Southern Combination League.

It was at that stage where we suffered our heaviest Senior Cup defeat, being beaten 8-1 by Brighton in the 2001-02 season when then-Albion boss Peter Taylor decided to send a near-full strength side to the Beacon.

In the 1996-97 campaign we went out to St Leonards Stamco with a 4-1 home defeat, Bognor Regis were 4-2 winners in Mid Sussex in 2000-01 and Pat Harding returned to the Beacon in 2007-08 with Eastbourne Borough,

scoring past brother Joel in a comfortable 5-0 win for a side who would go onto win promotion to the Conference Premier at the end of that season.

There was another meeting with Horsham in 2010-11 with the Hornets winning 4-2, Eastbourne Borough again accounted for us two year's later by winning 2-0 at Priory Lane and our most recent adventure to the third round stage came in the 2016-17 season when Southern Counties East League outfit Crowborough Athletic won 1-0 at the Beacon.

Given our long-established reputation as a side who frequently fall to opponents from lower divisions in cup games, the Robins have a surprisingly good record when it comes to avoiding upsets in the Senior Cup.

Just twice in 34 years in the competition have we fallen to a side below us in the footballing pyramid.

The first of those was a 3-2 home defeat to Seaford Town at the second round stage in the 2004-05 campaign and the most recent, a 3-0 defeat at Midhurst & Easebourne in the 2020-21 season when Johnsy paid the price for naming a second-string side at the Rotherfield.

Our biggest Sussex Senior Cup win came in the 2002-03 season when Shinewater Association were hammered 6-1 in the first round stage, while there has been a 5-0 victory over Newhaven in 1982-83 and 5-1 wins over Steyning Town in a 2010-11 first round replay - the original tie had ended a 1-1 at the Shooting Field - and away at Storrington in 2012-13.

Our ridiculous 6-4 victory over Arundel in 2019 set a record for the Robins' highest scoring game in the competition and nobody who was at Mill Road that night is ever likely to forget that extraordinary evening.

Hassocks were eliminated by Lancing in round two that season, the Lancers very much enjoying themselves whenever they are paired with us.

In the 2011-12 season, they inflicted a 6-1 defeat on Mickey Jewell's Robins, which remains our heaviest defeat in the competition to a Southern Combination League Club.

# "5-1, even Marshy scored"

Hassocks' 5-1 win at Storrington in November 2012 was memorable not just for the ease with which Mickey Jewell's team swatted aside the Swans, but also for the identity of one of the scorers.

Whilst James Westlake, Anthony Hibbert and Dan Smith were all regulars when it came to finding the back of the net, the name of Ashley Marsh wasn't exactly one that you associated with goal-scoring feats.

In fact, since his debut eight years and over 300 games previously, Marsh had only managed to find the back of the net on one other occasion and that had come in his debut season in 2004.



The Hassocks captain owed his first goal for nearly a decade to a friendly linesman who ruled that the ball had crossed the line despite the best efforts of a Swans' defender to hack it clear.

That sparked wild scenes of jubilation mixed with disbelief with half an hour played at Storrington Rec.

Marsh's goal was the second of the evening and proved to be pivotal, coming as it did at the end of a period of Storrington pressure and providing a platform for Hassocks to go onto win the game from.

There was not quite such a long wait for his next strike as Marsh goals proved to be like London Buses— you wait eight years for one to come along, and then two do at once.

Fast forward three months and he was at it again, scoring against Chichester in a 3-2 league victory.

Still, they proved to be very much collector's items - by the time Marsh retired four years later, he had managed just one more goal to take his career tally to four in 525 games for the club.

# Robins at the races to vanquish cup conquerors Varndeanians

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 8th October 2022, The Beacon Hassocks 2-0 AFC Varndeanians

There is a real feelgood factor around Hassocks at the moment both on and off the pitch. On Saturday evening, the Beacon hosted its first race night since Covid-19.

A few hours earlier and the Robins had galloped to within five points of top spot in the Southern Combination League Premier Division thanks to a 2-0 win over AFC Varndeanians.

Goals in either half from Jamie Wilkes and Phil Johnson avenged elimination by the same scoreline against the same opponents from the Peter Bentley League Cup a little over four weeks ago.

Defeat in that previous meeting with Varndeanians only told half the story, however. Head coach James Westlake used the break from league action to rest players and despite the changes, Hassocks still should have won.

The Robins were in the midst of a period where they dominated games, fashioned countless opportunities but could not put the ball in the back of the net for love nor money. Varndeanians in contrast netted with their two shots on target.

Hassocks have since found their scoring boots. The most pleasing thing being that goals are now starting to come from multiple sources across the front line.

Wilkes is one such example. He had to wait patiently for an opportunity following his summer move back to the Beacon from AFC Uckfield Town.

He was afforded his first start in that Peter Bentley Cup game against Varndeanians. A good showing opened the door and he is now becoming highly influential in the starting XI.

Wilkes was heavily involved in the first real opportunity mustered by either side, which arrived on the 20 minute mark.

The tall striker used his rangy

frame to embark on a driving gallop through the Varndeanians defence before slipping a pass to Johnson who blazed over.

Prior to that, Hassocks had two half-chances. Varndeanians goalkeeper Jordan Hawkins dallied in possession a second too long but Liam Benson was unable to get a convincing shot away after stealing the ball.

A Harvey Blake cross then found Johnson for a wayward header at the far post.

It was with 30 minutes played that Wilkes opened the scoring. Brad Tighe delivered a free kick into the box from just inside the Varndeanians half.

A blue-shirted defender produced a rather impressive improvised back heel volley clearance. From it, the ball dropped invitingly to Wilkes rushing into the area.

He slammed first-time without breaking stride through a crowd of players and past unsighted Varndeanians goalkeeper Jordan Hawkins.

Aside from Wilkes, Hassocks were also getting a lot of joy out of Jack Troak down the left, wearing the captain's armband in the absence of Lewis Westlake and Alex Bygraves.

Before the goal, Troak flashed a dangerous ball across goal which a Hassocks player really should have been on the end of for the simplest of tap-ins.

Immediately after the Robins take the lead and Troak rode a couple of tackles and cut inside, only for his effort to drift agonisingly wide of the post.

Hassocks came out for the second half clearly determined to make a fast start. The outstanding Mike Williamson broke through midfield within two minutes of the restart, squaring to Benson who was just unable to provide the finishing touch.

Three minutes later and the Robins doubled their advantage.



Hassocks will be hard-pushed to score a goal involving better interplay in the build up this season.

Leon Turner and Benson combined to carve apart the Varndeanians defence, leaving Turner to square and Johnson to convert from five yards.

The hour mark nearly brought a third for Hassocks. Another driving run from Williamson released Benson.

His cut back found Turner, whose shot was deflected behind for a corner. The set piece came to nothing.

A better free kick delivery from Joe Bull caused Varndeanians problems as the game entered the final 10 minutes.

Sam Smith - who enjoyed an excellent first start since August in place of Bygraves at centre back - headed back across goal to Johnson.

Somehow, Johnson missed from all of three yards before his blushes were spared by the offside flag going up.

Troak forced Hawkins into a good save low down to his right from a direct free kick in the final minute, after which Alex Harris was called into action for the only time of note all afternoon.

Hassocks were unable to effectively clear their lines, leading to Mark Goldson getting a shot away.

Although straight at Harris, the Robins goalkeeper still had to show some smart handling to hold the effort.





Moquet's long kicks can be a real asset when she plays in goal. She put one to good use, sending Mair clear to narrowly miss the target.

The hosts briefly threated again but some expert covering from Flin averted the danger.





Hassocks pushed Holly Webb further forward to try and help regain control.

She soon linked up with Sarah Chappell, who forced another corner which Stevens headed just over the bar.

Katherine Chappell had been a little quiet in the second half, much to the relief of the hosts.

That was until the final 15 minutes when she had one of those golden spells in which she is unstoppable for opponents.

A twisting run and defence splitting pass from Chappell set up Mair to score the Robins' seventh.

Chappell then rounded off the scoring in the 89th minute with her fourth and Hassocks' eighth. It came from another mazy run followed by a cool finish.

Having produced such a dominant performance, every Hassocks player should be pleased with their efforts.

Webb and Moquet - before her spell in goal - both performed well in midfield, supporting both the defence and attack.

The debutants all contributed, the forwards looked dangerous every time they attacked and the defence - despite the game being fairly one sided - looked assured and in control throughout.



# Keehan hat-trick and mean Vs defence send Hassocks to opening game defeat

The Robins are next scheduled to be in action against Sidley United on Sunday 6th November at the Beacon.


Sidley will be out for revenge having been eliminated by Hassocks in the quarter finals of last season's Fred Pretty Plate, so that is a game not to be missed.

#### Death double defeats Billingshurst in action-packed RUR tie

**October 11th 2016:** A first ever meeting in senior football between Hassocks and Billingshurst had it all - goals, cards and missed penalties as the Robins ran out 3-0 winners

The third round of the Sussex RUR Charity Cup beckons for Hassocks after they dispatched Division One outfit Billingshurst in a ridiculously entertaining encounter at the Beacon.

This was the first ever senior meeting between the two sides, and it had everything. Three goals all scored by Hassocks, one apiece disallowed for either side, three red cards, seven further booking and two missed penalties.

Michael Death in particular had an interesting evening. He scored twice and missed both of those spot kicks to be denied a first hat-trick for the Robins.

Josh Hawkes meanwhile was the home player to see red alongside dismissals for Ryan Carse and Jake Chadwick of Billingshurst.

An action packed opening half hour saw plenty of chances for Hassocks.

Death, Hawkes, Bradley Bant and Ben Bacon all went close before Hassocks did put the ball in the back of the net only to see it chalked off for a foul on Tom Betts in the Hurst goal.

In between the plethora of chances, Ashley Marsh picked up a quite surreal booking for dissent from referee Tobias Pinesmith when he appeared to actually be berating his own team mates in typical Marsh style rather than the match officials.

Death's opener arrived with 29 minutes played and Billingshurst could feel hard done by.

Nobody in the ground seemed to be able to give a satisfactory answer as to why Hassocks had been awarded a free kick in a dangerous position, but Death didn't care for the woes of the visitors, driving the set piece into the bottom right hand corner.

Next it was Billingshurst's turn to see a goal ruled out and this was frankly a terrible decision.

Jordan Badger was the hapless Hassocks defender who scored past his own goalkeeper James Broadbent, only for Mr Pinesmith to pull things back and award a free kick to Hurst on the edge of the box just as the ball crossed the goal line.

That free kick was duly chipped harmlessly into the arms of Broadbent while Mr Pinesmith's unwarranted desire to halt play every five minutes meant a ridiculous amount of added on time at the end of the first half.

Into the second half and there were more cards being flashed than the Royal Mail processes at Christmas before the first two reds arrived just after the hour mark.

Hawkes and Chadwick were the

players to go, being sent for an early bath after a coming together that appeared more like a dance from Strictly Come Dancing than anything approaching violent conduct.

The Robins dealt with going down to 10 far better than their visitors and were awarded their first penalty of the game when debutant from the bench Elliot Dollner went down in the box, only for Betts to save Death's spot kick.

Carse then saw red for a heavy foul on James Westlake, leaving the game to be Hassocks' to kill off. They duly did that when substitute Luke Akehurst rolled in Miles who dropped a shoulder, left his marker for dead and finished with great aplomb.

Westlake was then fouled in the box with Death again stepping up. He picked the same side with the same result as Betts again saved, much to the joy of the visitors bench.

Death did have a last laugh of sorts however, adding his second and the Robins third with five minutes left to set up a tie away at Midhurst & Easebourne in round three.

After eight seasons spent away from the Southern Combination, Crowborough were moved back by the FA to where they have spent most of their existence. The South East Counties is considered a stronger league than our own, so the theory went that the Crows would make quite the impression on their return. They are handily sat in 10th position at the time of writing with four wins, four draws and two defeats. The Crows' most impressive result of the campaign so far being a 1-0 win over Eastbourne United at the Crowborough Community Stadium back in August, followed closely by holding leaders Newhaven.

#### **Head-to-head**

We were regular opponents before the Crows found themselves moved into the Kent-based league. 25 previous matches have resulted in 13 Hassocks wins, nine Crowborough victories and three draws. Our good record was helped by an unbeaten six game spell including five successive wins between 2010 and 2014.

#### Last time we met

Crowborough visited the Beacon in the third round of the 2016-17 Sussex Senior Cup. Victory would have equalled our best ever run in the competition by securing a quarter final berth. It was the visitors though who picked up a 1-0 win through a Ross Treleaven goal with five minutes

remaining. The most recent league meeting came in April 2014, when Mickey Jewell's injury-hit squad were well beaten 4-0 at the Community Stadium.

#### How to get to the Community Stadium

Head east on the A272, taking a right at the roundabout when you reach the A22. At the next roundabout with the McDonalds go left and follow the A26 towards Crowborough. Just before entering the town, take a right onto Sheep Plain, following the road until you reach Aldervale Cottages on your right. The ground is then on the right nearly immediately after you turn onto the road.

Eastbourne United had been due to visit the Beacon on Saturday 10th September, a game postponed out of respect following the passing of Queen Elizabeth II. Instead, they now come to Mid Sussex in two weeks time

#### **Eastbourne United this season**

United endured a slow start to 2021-22 until the appointment of former AFC Uckfield Town boss Anthony Storey in October. An influx of former Oakmen players followed, helping lift United from the fringes of the relegation battle to a final finishing position of fifth, their highest since being crowned champions in 2008-09. They have continued in that vein so far in the current campaign and were the early league leaders at one point. At the time of writing, United sit fifth with six wins and one draw from 10 games so far. The good news for us is that two of their three Premier Division defeats have come in their past four matches.

#### Head-to-head

The Robins dominate the head-to-head with 18 wins to United's 14 and 12 draws in our 44 meetings. That record is helped hugely by the fact that we used to love visiting the Oval for reasons that nobody could ever really understand. We won six times in a row there between 2010 and 2019 despite only finishing above United twice in that period, although that run has been dampened somewhat by defeats on our last three visits to the Sunshine Coast.

#### Last time we met

A January trip to the Oval resulted in 90 minutes of turgid football lacking in any real quality. One of the only moments worth writing about

provided the game's single goal, scored by United captain Charlie Ball. Conjuring something out of nothing, Ball hit an unstoppable effort from 25 yards which Alex Harris could only watch rocket into the top corner.

#### Links between the clubs?

Jack Troak played for United earlier in his career as a young player at Lewes after the Rooks decided they wanted the lively left winger to experience of senior football. Goalkeeper James Broadbent won a clean sweep of Players' Player, Supporters' Player and Managers' Player of the Season at the Beacon after signing from United for 2016-17 and current Eastbourne Town women's manager Zak Dove turned out for both clubs.

Our Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup campaign gets underway in the second round stage with a trip to Tinsley Lane to face Forest Row, for what will be our first ever meeting in senior football against Frow

#### Forest Row this season

This is Forest Row's second season in the Southern Combination League following their promotion up two levels from the Mid Sussex Premier in the summer of 2021. Their first campaign in Division One went well, culminating in an 11th placed finish. Frow have suffered from second season syndrome of sorts so far and currently sit 17th with only Montpelier Villa below them. Defying their lowly position is the fact their sole league win was a stunning 4-1 success over promotion hopefuls Seaford Town. They also have a Peter Bentley League Cup victory against landlords Oakwood under their belts before a 5 -0 elimination at the hands of Lingfield in the second round.

#### **Head-to-head**

As mentioned, this will be our first ever meeting at senior level with Frow. The old Hassocks IIIs faced Forest Row in the Mid Sussex League between 2006 and 2011. Their head-to-head reads eight matches, three wins, two draws, three defeats, 16 scored and 13 conceded. Remarkably, Phil Wickwar is responsible for two of those goals. Such an impressive record might give Westy something to ponder ahead of the trip to Tinsley Lane...

### Last time we played at Tinsley Lane

Frow might be new opponents but Tinsley Lane is not a new ground. We used to play there on a frequent

basis against Oakwood, although our last visit was as long ago as April 2009. It was not a good one either; a 1-0 defeat against hosts who would be relegated a fee weeks later.

#### **How to get to Tinslev Lane**

Take the A23/M23, come off at Junction 10 and head towards Crawley on the A2011. At the first roundabout, go all the way around to the fourth exit for Gatwick Road and Manor Royal. Take the second exit at the next roundabout, continuing on Gatwick Road. Tinsley Lane will be on your right, between the Kia showroom and the next roundabout. Take the first left onto Kenmara Court and the ground is at the end of the road.
