### Last season saw Bexhill United in the Southern **Combination League Premier Division for the first time** in 30 years. It was a campaign to remember...

The Pirates had last played top flight stride in recent weeks. After losing football in the 1990-91 campaign, since when they have merged, bounced between Division One and Division Two and picked up their fair share of silverware in the lower levels.

Nobody was quite sure what to expect from Bexhill in the Premier Division, however.

The answer was going the entire season unbeaten at the Polegrove and securing a fourth place finish, proving just how strong Division One had been over the past few years fellow promoted club Littlehampton Town won the treble and reached the FA Vase final.

2022-23 season looked likely to be avoiding second season syndrome. Could they be such an effective outfit - especially at home - now that they were not so much of an unknown quality?

The Pirates started the season slowly but have begun to find their

two of their opening four league fixtures, Bexhill have now won 10 of their past 14 games in all competitions.

Of the matches they have not been successful in, one was against current table toppers Broadbridge Heath.

Another saw them draw with much-fancied Newhaven in the Peter Bentley League Cup before elimination on penalties.

Firing much of Bexhill's success is striker Jack Shonk, who sits on 10 goals in competitions at the time of writing.

Alongside the evergreen Evan Bexhill's biggest challenge for the Archibald, the Pirates possess two strikers who are proven scorers at this level. As we are finding out this season with Phil Johnson, Liam Benson and Pat Harding back at the Beacon, that can take you far.

> How far when it comes to Bexhill? In a wide-open season, that is anyone's quess.

### Wind and injuries combine to leave **luckless Robins pillaged by Pirates**

Sometimes when your luck is out, it is really out. Both conditions and injuries went against Hassocks on an afternoon when they needed everything to go their way to stand a chance against an impressive Bexhill United outfit eyeing a late charge into the **Southern Combination title** picture.

First, there was the wind. A ghastly gale was blowing towards the sting out of the game, slowing things Railway End of the Beacon at 2.55pm, resulting in Hassocks turning around to defend it in the first half when Jack Troak won the toss.

The Robins did the hard work, going into the interval only 1-0 behind. By the time the second half kicked off however, the wind had dropped markedly. Any advantage Hassocks had hoped to have with it behind them was gone.

Even more problematic were the injuries that the Robins picked up. Troak went at half time. The outstanding Dan Turner was then carried off after suffering excruciating shooting pains up his leg early in the second half with the score locked at 1-1 with Hassocks on top.

Fast forward 20 minutes and Bexhill had a 4-1 lead which they held until the end.

To complete a miserable day for the Robins, AFC Varndeanians won their second match of the season by beating Horsham YMCA 3-0. That cut the gap between Hassocks and the bottom two to seven points.

It took just 12 minutes for Bexhill to take the lead. Alex Harris made a decent stop from a 25 yard effort from Jack Shonk but when Hassocks could not clear their lines against the wind, the ball fell to Shonk again.

He made no mistake second time around, bending an exquisite effort into the far corner.

Evan Archibald should have doubled the advantage four minutes later when a Bexhill free kick from

just inside the Hassocks half was blown all the way to the penalty spot. alongside Tighe in the middle. Luckily for the hosts, Archibald put a header straight into the arms of Harris.

"We know about the wind, deal with it," shouted Robins head coach Brad Sweetman. His side duly listened, Bradley Tighe and Turner dropping off five yards and becoming more dominant in the air as a result.

Harris too attempted to take the down to the point where referee Mark Gidman gave the Hassocks goalkeeper a talking to.

Never before can Mr Gidman have finished. pulled up a player for time wasting after 18 minutes with their side 1-0 behind.

Hassocks grew into the game as the first half progressed. James Westlake had a deflected shot held by Pirates goalkeeper Dan Rose and an enterprising Troak run earned a free kick on the by-line from which Lewis Westlake's delivery caused problems before Rose gathered.

Harris made a big save on the 30 minute mark when the wind caused more issues.

Charlie Tuck misjudged the flight of the ball, an outrageous piece of skill from Ollie Hull further bamboozled the young Hassocks full back but Harris got a strong arm down guickly to block the Bexhill winger's driven effort.

Both Troak and the wind left proceedings at the interval. Hassocks made light of losing their captain initially at least as within 60 seconds of the restart, they equalised.

There was an instant impact for Troak's replacement Charlie Broad, the striker holding the ball up well before laying off to James Westlake.

Westlake swept a pass out to the left flank, Short ghosted past Connor Robertson and bent an unstoppable effort into the bottom corner.

Turner then departed, Arthur Rawlingson coming on at right back with Tuck taking Turner's place

The Robins were incensed a couple of minutes later when Short again got the better of Robertson.

The Bexhill man appeared to catch Short in the face with an arm and although Hassocks got the free kick, there was no card forthcoming.

Their mood darkened when Bexhill retook the lead on the hour. A Joe Summerbell through ball did not look particularly dangerous, yet it found a way to send Shonk in one-on -one. Hassocks appealed for an offside that never was as Shonk

Two minutes and it was deja vu. Summerbell again released Shonk and despite the commotion of Hassocks this time screaming for both an offside and a handball from Summerbell in the build up, Shonk was calmness personified to clinically complete his hat-trick.

The Robins were utterly at sea now. Bexhill added their fourth when Hassocks failed to deal with a delivery into the box, leaving Max Walsh free to fire into the corner.

Hassocks did at least rally after that to finish the stronger. Tighe went close with a header from a Lewis Westlake free kick, Broad had an effort blocked and Jack Baden was denied a first senior goal by a fine tip over at full stretch from Rose after a mazy run and cross from Short.

The final chance went to Bexhill, Shonk hitting a swerving, dipping effort from 30 yards against the bar. Four was harsh on Hassocks; five would have been cruel.

### **Robins come from two down to sink Pirates in Peter Bentley Cup**

#### At half time of Hassocks' Peter **Bentley League Cup Second tie** against Bexhill United, an all too familiar story was unfolding at the Beacon.

The Robins had been largely dominant in the first 45 minutes yet found themselves going into the break trailing 2-0 thanks to a combination of failing to take their chances and some suspect defending.

Normally, that is how things finish and everyone is left to wonder what might have been had Hassocks taken those opportunities or defended slightly better.

But not on this occasion. On this occasion, three goals in 20 second half minutes turned the game on its head as Hassocks came roaring back to win 3-2 and book a spot in the third round of the competition for the when Giles received the ball way out first time in three seasons.

The Robins began the tie brightly with Matt Berridge hitting a shot straight at Pirates goalkeeper Dan Rose, Phil Johnson seeing an effort blocked and Liam Benson curling just wide of the post after being teed up by James Littlejohn, all inside of the first 10 minutes.

It was from Bexhill's first raid into the Hassocks half that they took the lead. Josh Green was making his first appearance in four seasons for the first team in place of the suspended Alex Harris and he had done well to keep out Wayne Giles' effort but nobody in red could react quick enough to prevent Jamie Bunn from pillaging the rebound.

Undeterred, Hassocks went back on the attack with Johnson's pace in particular leaving United all at sea. The Robins striker was forging a particularly useful alliance with Harvey Blake who was cannon balling forward from right back at every opportunity.

Twice that duo linked up, the first one back. time Blake slipping in Johnson who saw his effort brilliantly blocked by a

last ditch sliding tackle from Chris Rea and then another forward pass from Blake released Johnson who showed auick feet to aet to the byline but there was nobody there to turn his cross home.

Berridge and Littlejohn then danced the hempen to set up Ryan Collins. The midfielder was a nautical mile from goal but still released a crashing effort that flew just over Rose's crossbar.

At the other end, Nathan Lopez delivered an excellent cross straight onto the head of Giles but he put his free header wastefully over the bar.

That was a warning shot across the bow for Hassocks which they did not heed and five minutes before half time they found themselves 2-0 down.

There seemed to be nothing on on the left, from where he sent a cross-cum-shot which dropped over the head of Green and into the back of the net.

Only Giles will know if it was intentional but whatever the striker meant, his side were now in a commanding position going into the break and it could have been even better but for Dan Jacques deflecting a Lopez effort wide and Green making a big, bold claim after Giles attempted an outrageous overhead kick from the resulting corner.

Hassocks supporters could've been forgiven for fearing the worst at that point, especially as United have become something of a bogey side to the Robins in recent seasons having knocked them out at the same stage of the same competition last year and the first round of the Sussex Senior Cup two seasons before that.

Whatever Mark Dalgleish said to his players at the break though had the desired effect and within 10 minutes of the restart they pulled

The Bexhill dugout were incensed when Rea was booked for a

rapscallion tackle on Collins and they were still holding parley towards referee Alex Howard when Spencer Slaughter sent the resulting free kick into the box with the ball eventually falling to Littlejohn who smashed under the body of Rose for his first senior goal.

Blake flashed in a low cross which just evaded the onrushing Benson and Johnson and Benson was then too honest for his own good when he stayed on his feet and got a shot away after United captain Lewis McGuigan attempted to haul him down. Had Benson hit the deck, he would almost certainly have been awarded a penalty.

There were 20 minutes left when the equaliser did eventually arrive and it came from an unlikely source. Nobody could quite work out what Jacques was doing as the furthest man forward but the Robins were thanking the stars that he was as he was there to barrel home Johnson's cross at the far post.

Bexhill seemed to loose their heads at that but worse was to come for the visitors three minutes later.

A long ball over the top left Johnson in a foot race with McGuigan and the Hassocks striker was never going to lose that one, accelerating onto the ball at a rate of knots despite the flailing arms of the United captain doing everything possible to try and stop him.

Needless to say there was no stopping Johnson and he went through to slot the ball past Rose and ensure Hassocks sail into the next round.

### **2pm kick offs at the Beacon** through British Winter Time

Games across the Southern Combination League are set to start earlier with rising energy prices biting non league football clubs across the country

#### Several of Hassocks' Saturday home games from the start of November to the end of March will kick off at 2pm in an attempt to ease the significant financial burden placed on the club by rising energy bills.

Earlier starts through the winter months will remove the need to turn the floodlights on during the second half of matches which kick off at 3pm, when there are reduced lighting conditions.

Since the alarming increase in the price of electricity, it has become increasingly expensive to use the floodlights.

Admission prices were increased marginally in the summer but that does not even scratch the surface of the bills we are set face over the winter months.

Reducing floodlight use as much as possible will help save money at a time of real uncertainty, without the need to pass on costs to supporters by a further increase on the gate.

It has been agreed between Hassocks, the opposition and the Southern Combination League to move five games so far.

More may follow, whilst the Robins are also expecting fixtures away from home to kick off at 2pm at December, Horsham YMCA on the request of their hosts.

Today's visit of Bexhill United to the Beacon is the first 2pm kick off. It will be followed by the Robins' home match with Lingfield on Saturday 19th Hassocks website and social media November.

Hassocks' first Beacon fixture of

2023 against AFC Uckfield Town on Saturday 7th January will be a 2pm kick off, as will Loxwood at home on Saturday 4th March and Newhaven at home on Saturday 25th March.

Home fixture definitely remaining as 3pm kick offs are Saltdean United on Saturday 26th November and Crowborough Athletic on Saturday 18th March.

A decision is still be taken on the games against Peacehaven & Telscombe on Saturday 10th Saturday 21st January, Alfold on Saturday 4th February and Little Common on Saturday 18th February.

Please keep an eye on the channels for updated kick off times as and when games are confirmed.

### **Minty joins from Burgess Hill** to give Hassocks a fresh face

#### Hassocks have completed the signing of JJ Minty, who joins the Town the lead away at Crawley Down **Robins on dual-registration from Isthmian League South East side Burgess Hill Town.**

The forward is highly thought of at the More Than Tyres Stadium. His move to the Beacon is aimed at providing senior experience as he attempts to break into Hill's first team sauad.

He has already enjoyed one such loan spell this season, turning out 10 times for the Robins' fellow Southern **Combination League Premier Division** outfit Eastbourne Town.

Minty made seven starts and three substitute appearances at the Saffrons, netting twice.

His first goal in Town colours came on his debut when Jude MacDonald's side were 3-0 winners away at Roffey on the opening day of the campaign.

He followed that up by giving Gatwick a little over two weeks later. The visitors went onto win 2-0 at the Haven.

Minty joined Burgess Hill in March from Eastbourne Borough, where he had played Under 18s football. His Hill debut came soon after his arrival at Leylands Park.

It did not take Minty long to make an impression with the Hillians. His long Rory Delap-esque throw helped Jay Lovett's side to a 1-0 win over Cray Valley Paper Mills on Easter Saturday, causing chaos in the home box and leading big defender Nathaniel Blanks to head past his own and two more in the current goalkeeper.

Minty has made two appearances for Hill so far this season, coming off the bench in the Isuzu FA Trophy away at Felixstowe & Walton United and the Velocity Cup first round

against Chichester City.

He made his Hassocks debut as a second half substitute in the 5-0 Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup second round win at Forest Row.

Whilst Minty comes in through the door, Hassocks recently said goodbye to Charlie Tuck who has signed for Horsham YMCA.

Tuck joined the Robins from Shoreham before the Supplementary Shield competition which rounded off the Covid-19 interrupted 2020-21 season.

The defender went onto play six times at the end of that campaign. He made 15 appearances last season campaign before his transfer to the Herbert Direct Stadium, leaving with a total of 23 Hassocks appearances to his name.



# Home is where the heart is for Hassocks in November

#### Home will be where the heart is for Hassocks in November with all four of their fixtures to be played at the Beacon.

Three Premier Division matches were already pencilled in. They are now joined by a home tie in the Sussex Senior Cup.

Today's visit of Bexhill United kicks things off. Our scheduled trip to Eastbourne Town on Saturday 12th November has been postponed due to our hosts' continued involved in the FA Vase, where they will ironically meet this afternoon's opponents the Pirates at the Polegrove.

Not that the Robins have to wait long to face Town. Jude Macdonald brings his side to the Beacon on Tuesday 15th November in the second round of the Sussex Senior Cup.

Kick off is at 7:45pm in what will be the first ever meeting between the sides in the competition. The league trip to the Saffrons meanwhile has been rescheduled for Saturday 17th December.

Saturday 19th November sees Lingfield come to Mid Sussex in another 2pm kick off to avoid floodlight use. It will be the Lingers' second visit of the season to the Beacon. The first came back in August, when a quite incredible own goal which chalked up over half a million views on Twitter from visiting defender Conor Wilford gave Hassocks a 1-0 win the extra preliminary round of the FA Cup.

Former Robins head coach Brad Sweetman and a number of ex-Hassocks players return with Saltdean United on Saturday 26th in a 3pm kick off, rounding off November's first team fixtures.

Just as with Lingfield, it will be the second meeting of the campaign between the sides.

Last month saw a 2-2 draw in the Senior Cup with the Robins eventually triumphing 6-5 on penalties.

The Under 23s began their November against Oakwood 48 hours ago. If you wish to know the score in that one, please speak to Owen behind the bar.

#### Phil Johnson enjoyed a first half feast against Forest Row, where his four goals paved the way for Hassocks to progress to round three of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

Johnson struck twice from open play and twice from the penalty spot to have the Robins home and dry inside of 45 minutes at Tinsley Lane.

A first senior goal from Danny Reid with eight minutes remaining completed a 5-0 success; the sort of straightforward result that many would have expected between a Hassocks side sitting sixth in the Southern Combination League Premier and Frow who currently prop up Division One.

The Robins though have a long and not-so-proud tradition of slipping on such banana skins.

Professionally putting away lower division opponents - especially when Hassocks gave several fringe players opportunities - feels like another important milestone in the James Westlake era.

It took Hassocks just seven minutes to open the scoring - and the Robins arguably should have been 2-0 up already.

Johnson headed over from a right wing Reid cross with two minutes played, followed by Benson repeating the trick when Jack Troak delivered from the opposite flank.

No matter. A quickly taken throw from Reid found Benson on the right, who managed to keep possession although fouled by the only Forest Row defender alert to the danger

With the assistant referee waving his flag for the free kick, man in the middle Konrad Kaminski played a good advantage which allowed Benson to cross.

Johnson collected the ball into the box and took a touch into space, from where he clinically found the bottom corner with a neat left footed finish.

Reid drew a good stop from the

Forest Row goalkeeper, followed by a clever free kick routine between Troak and Benson presenting Johnson with a one-on-one.

His first effort was saved, sparking a bit of a scramble involving Sam Rogers and Will Broomfield before the ball again fell to Johnson who dragged wide.

Forest Row were struggling to cope with some of Hassocks' passing football by this point. The hosts didn't fare better when the Robins went more direct, resulting in the second goal on 16 minutes.

Alex Harris picked out the run of Troak down the left with a great 70 yard kick from his hands down the pitch.

Troak pulled a pass back to Johnson who bent low and hard into the far corner despite the best efforts of two Frow players to block.

A rare foray forward from Forest Row saw Ollie Monnery trick and tease Harvey Blake, finding enough space to get a shot away which Broomfield had to divert behind for a corner.

Monnery then led Blake on a merry dance, only to lift his effort too high over Harris' crossbar.

Hassocks bounced back from that minor lull with Reid teeing up Johnson for a hat-trick chance well blocked on 35 minutes.

Johnson did not have long to wait to bag his treble. Sam Cash was sent flying as the resulting corner came into the box and then Benson hit the ground at the back post as he attempted to convert.

Two potential fouls in the space of three seconds saw Mr Kaminski point to the spot. Johnson calmly placed the ball into the back of the net.

Incredibly, Frow conceded another penalty from a corner in the second minute of first half stoppage time.

Johnson made a run from deep between two home defenders, one of



whom won the ball whilst the other appeared to catch Johnson in the head, causing him to go to ground.

No player in red appealed. There was total surprise amongst the Hassocks ranks and understandable fury from Forest Row when Mr Kaminski pointed to the spot. Johnson converted again for his and the Robins' fourth of the evening.

With Johnson replaced at the break by debutant JJ Minty dualsigned from Burgess Hill Town, Reid became an increasingly influential figure in the second half after being moved into a more central position.

## Hassocks unable to sink 10 man Dockers in battle at the Trafalgar Ground

Three months into the 2022-23 Southern Combination League Premier Division season and Hassocks can be pretty pleased with their efforts, sitting sixth in the table with 23 points in the bag.

The trip to the Trafalgar Ground to take on one of the promotion favourites Newhaven however has to go down as a missed opportunity to make a real statement of intent.

A straight red card after 24 minutes for Bailie Rogers gave Hassocks more than an hour of playing shorthanded against the Dockers.

The score was locked at 0-0 at the time of Rogers' dismissal. By full time, goals from Alfie Rogers and Lee Robinson had fired Newhaven to a 2-0 success and up to second behind leaders Broadbridge Heath.

Clearly, there is something about games between Robins and Dockers at Fort Road which seem to benefit the side who has a man sent off.

Hassocks have only ever won once in a competitive game away at Newhaven. That came in February 2019 despite a red card for George Brown, Spencer Slaughter notching the only goal in a memorable 1-0 victory for Mark Dalgleish's side.

Brown's crime that day was a spectacular example of kicking the ball away to waste time when already on a yellow card.

Once Hassocks headed back to Mid Sussex with all three points, it was something that you could look back on and laugh at.

Not so much Rogers' red. A quickly taken Jack Troak free kick looked to send Jamie Wilkes galloping into space down the left flank, only for Rogers to come sliding in once the ball had been played past him and wipe out the tall Hassocks striker.

Referee John Pike was not impressed with the lateness of it and so out came the red. It was a decision that split the crowd and those on the pitch and not in the way you would expect; some Newhaven fans felt Mr Pike was right to send Rogers off whilst a couple of Hassocks players were surprised the punishment was so harsh.

It was one of the only incidents of note in a game which struggled to entertain.

That was not what a large crowd would have been expecting, seeing as Newhaven are the Premier Division's top scorers whilst Hassocks started the day with the third highest goals total.

The Robins hopes of adding to the 29 they have plundered so far took a blow in the fourth minute when Leon Turner had to be withdrawn.

Not many full backs have been able to handle the lively right winger this season.

On a pitch as big and flat as the new 3G surface at the Trafalgar Ground, Turner had the potential to cause plenty of problems for the Dockers.

His place was taken by Danny Reid, fresh from scoring his first senior goal in the 5-0 Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup hammering of Forest Row on Wednesday night.

One half-chance per side was mustered before the red card. Alex Harris had to show exemplary handling when dealing with a Newhaven free kick into the box on eight minutes.

On 16, raging Joe Bull sent in a good delivery which Liam Benson headed wide when he really should have worked Jake Buss in the home goal.

Three minutes after Rogers headed for his early bath and a Troak lob beat Buss but not Jack Meeres, who cleared off the line.

That clearance looked even more important when Newhaven took the lead on 33. Alfie Rogers was seemingly determined to make up for



his brother's dismissal, picking the ball up in midfield and driving past three Hassocks challenges before beating Harris with a ferocious effort from outside the box.

The Robins failed to muster much of a response in what remained of the first half.

Newhaven enjoyed playing the ball around at the back between Buss, Meeres and their other central defender Henry Watson, easily navigating their way to the break with the lead intact.

Hassocks failed to fire after the interval too. Robinson almost made it 2-0 within five minutes of the restart, beating Harris to a through ball. The angle proved too tight and the Newhaven striker's effort rolled along the goal line and out for a throw.

Robinson though is usually good for a goal against the Robins. He duly doubled the advantage midway through the second half, controlling a long ball forward on his chest and lobbing the ball over Harris.

Reid was unfortunate to be sacrificed a few minutes later, the substitute being substituted as Hassocks introduced Pat Harding and went three up front.

The Robins did at least look a little more positive, forcing two chances in the final 10 once another attack-minded player in JJ Minty had also entered proceedings.

Benson fired over from close range and Johnson was denied by Buss making his first save of the afternoon in injury time.

### Hassocks unable to extinguish on-fire Pagham

**November 5th 2016:** The only fireworks at the Beacon came from Pagham, who extended their unbeaten record in the league to three months with an easy 3-0 win against the Robins

#### Pagham have not lost in the league since the opening day of the season and there was little chance of that record ending as they sauntered to a 3-0 victory over Hassocks at the Beacon.

The Robins have now faced all of the realistic title contenders bar Mid Sussex rivals Haywards Heath Town.

Pagham have easily been the best of the lot, a view shared by Hassocks boss Phil Wickwar.

"We stuck at it but no complaints - we were second best today. There is no shame in that against a team that good, the best we've faced this season."

Ever the optimist though, Wickwar added, "We could've done better with the soft second goal and for their third, we didn't think it was a foul and then the free kick took a deflection."

The fact that Hassocks goalkeeper James Broadbent was voted as the supporter's man of the match tells it's own story.

Broadbent made three outstanding saves in particular which helped keep the scoreline somewhat respectable.

Joe Shelley has lifted the Southern Combination League title in each of the past three seasons - with Horsham, Littlehampton Town and East Preston - and the talented journeyman midfielder opened the scoring with 12 minutes on the clock.

Hassocks' trials and tribulations in dealing with set pieces have been well documented but for once there was little blame that could be attached, Shelley rising to produce an absolute bullet header from a superb corner delivery.

With the Lions having conceded only nine goals in 13 league games coming into the tie, Hassocks faced an uphill struggle to get back into the Ashley Marsh rampaging forward game from that point, especially given that they were missing two of their in-form forwards in Nathan Miles and Ben Bacon.

And that struggle became an all but impossible task on 26 minutes when Kieron Pamment doubled Pagham's lead.

Bonfire Night is traditionally a time to give to charities and the Hassocks defence got in the spirit of generosity, deciding that rather than clear their lines they would give Pagham a couple of opportunities to get crosses in which they then would not effectively clear, eventually giving Pamment the chance to net.

Things looked to be getting even worse when Mark Price's body gave up on him on the half hour mark but the subsequent personnel and tactical reshuffle that followed belatedly got Hassocks going with James Westlake having a decent chance from which he could not find a finish.

Hassocks huffed and puffed at the start of the second half before the game was finally killed off.

A quick break saw a Pagham forward appear to trip over the ball rather than being fouled but a free kick was awarded which Scott Murfin fired home via a deflection from the wall for 3-0.

The Robins kept going despite what was clearly an insurmountable task and had a couple of opportunities to pull a goal back, from left back to produce an exquisite cross which Liam Benson should have finished and Jamie Hillwood blazing high, wide and handsome when well placed.

Whilst the result leaves Pagham as a clutch of teams challenging leaders Shoreham with seven points between the top four, it is even tighter at the bottom.

Hassocks are one of eight clubs separated by just three points from the relegation zone.

With a run of games against teams around them coming up, the Robins face a season defining period before Christmas in which they know they must escape the clutches of the bottom three.

#### Hassocks v Eastbourne Town

You have to go back to 2016 to find the last time Hassocks advanced to the third round of the Sussex Senior Cup. Looking to stop the Robins taking another step towards the Amex Stadium are Eastbourne Town

#### **Eastbourne Town this season**

Town bid farewell to one of the longest serving managers in the Premier Division when John Lambert stood down in the summer. He has been replaced by former Whitehawk boss Jude Macdonald. Under Lambert, Town had always been notoriously slow starters to the season before finding rhythm from autumn onwards and making a late charge into the title picture. That has not happened so far, although that will hardly come as a surprise following a summer of change at the Saffrons. Town sit 13th with five wins, four draws and five defeats to their name. Their best results have come in cup competitions, including reaching the first qualifying round of

the FA Cup, eliminating Newhaven from the RUR Cup and remaining in the FA Vase.

#### **Head-to-head**

It is a fixture which Eastbourne Town tend to enjoy. Of the 38 previous matches, Town have won 23 with just nine Hassocks wins and six draws along the way. Of those nine fixtures we have won, just one has come in the past 14 years. Phil Gault scored twice and James Broadbent saved a penalty in a shock 2-1 win at the Beacon towards the end of the 2016-17 season. Remarkably, this will be the first ever meeting in the Sussex Senior Cup between the clubs in the 40 years in which we have been entering the competition.

#### Last time we met

You have to go back to 2006 to find the last time we won at the Saffrons. There was little prospect of breaking that duck on our most recent visit in December, although the 5-2 scoreline was a little harsh. It was 2-1 going into half time, a Lewis Westlake cutting the deficit after Kevin Farragher and Arron Hopkinson had the hosts 2-0 ahead after 21 minutes. The Robins lost concentration in an eight minute spell just past the hour mark, allowing Town to score three more times through Kian Moynes, Louis Veneti and Hopkinson again to put the game beyond us. Sam Smith added a second consolation on his Hassocks debut against the club where he started his career.

#### Lingfield make their second visit to the Beacon of the campaign - and if it is anything like the Emirates FA Cup meeting between the sides in August, then fans of high-quality own goals will not want to miss it.

#### Lingfield this season

Lingfield have lost key players such as Sam Lemon and Sam Clements over the past year and yet they have still plundered their fair share of goals, racking up 29 - the same as us and the joint-fifth highest total in the Premier Division. Despite their scoring record, the Lingers it 15th in the table, largely on account of the 37 they have conceded on their way to recording five wins, two draws and nine defeats so far. With Lingfield's liking for goal involvements at both ends of the pitch, there could be plenty of entertainment in store.

#### **Head-to-head**

There have been 31 meetings between ourselves and Lingfield in

the past with the Robins leading the head-to-head with 14 wins to the Lingers' 10, leaving seven draws. Lingfield have been the dominant side in recent years. We have won just three of the past nine meetings a 3-2 Peter Bentley League Cup win at the Beacon in the 2018-19 season, January's away games and August's FA Cup clash. Perhaps a sign that the tide is turning back in our favour?

#### Last time we met

Ah yes, let's talk about that own goal then. 15 minutes had been played when Conor Wilford under no pressure hit a 25 yard aerial back pass from out on the right straight over his goalkeeper's head and into the back of the net. The magical moment was captured on video by Your Instant Replay and racked up over half a million views on Twitter. It also proved to be the only goal of the game, sending Hassocks through to a preliminary round tie with Uxbridge.

#### **Played for both**

Not many individuals have turned out for both ourselves and the Lingers. Ben Bacon's quest to play for every team in the Southern Combination League has seen him have two spells at the Beacon and one with Lingfield. The only other representative of both clubs is Daley Clark. The striker moved to the Robins from Godstone Road in the summer of 2009. He would go onto play 40 times for us.

#### Saltdean United this season

The Tigers saw manager Bryan O'Toole and virtually his entire first team squad depart in the summer after finishing runners up to Littlehampton Town in both the Premier Division title race and the RUR Cup. Our former head coach Brad Sweetman was tasked with rebuilding Saltdean, a task which looked so tough that many had the Tigers down as relegation favourites. Sweetman and a number of ex-Robins who followed him to Hill Park have defied those expectations so far, sitting 10 points clear of the bottom two with five wins from 15 matches, including impressive successes over Eastbourne Town and Lingfield.

#### **Head-to-head**

We have faced Saltdean on 32 Saltde occasions in the past, winning 12. The Tigers have 15 victories to their name, leaving just five draws. Three of those stalemates have come in the past four meetings, suggesting that this might be one to put on your pools' coupon. This was a fixture we used to dominate during the early 90s, winning six times in Division One and scoring 19 goals along the way. Not so much anymore; we are yet to beat the Tigers in any competition since their return to the top flight in 2017. #### Last time we met?

There was plenty of drama in the Sussex Senior Cup last month. Jack

Troak put us 1-0 ahead, only for Saltdean to come fighting back through Lucas Tyrrell and Jesse Burbidge. It looked like the Tigers were going to progress until Phil Johnson struck an 81st minute equaliser, sending the game to penalties. Seven spot kicks out of 18 were missed but we eventually progressed, winning 6-5 from 12 yards.


