Welcome to the Beacon



Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon for this Southern Combination Premier Division game against Lingfield

We would like to welcome the players, management, committee and of course the supporters of Lingfield and hope they enjoy their time in Mid Sussex.

This will be the Lingers' second visit to the Beacon of the season already. The first came back in August when we progressed in the FA Cup via a 1-0 win thanks to a quite spectacular own goal which sent visiting defender Conor Wilford viral.

Conor was at least able to see the funny side and we have very much enjoyed his posts on Twitter regarding the incident, including earlier this week when he posted: "Oh no not this ****ing ground again."

Moments like that are what non league football is all about. Hopefully, we can showcase some more today in the first round of Southern Combination League matches to be held whilst the Premier League and Championship are on pause for their winter World Cup break.

This will be our first action in two weeks thanks to a combination of unrelenting rain and last Saturday's scheduled trip to Eastbourne Town being postponed due to our hosts' continued involvement in the FA Vase.

The last time we kicked a ball in anger was the 2-0 win over Bexhill United, one of our most impressive results of the season.

We had some key players missing including three of the regular back four and the Pirates starting XI contains one of the most dangerous front pairings in the Southern Combination League in Jack Shonk and Evan Archibald.

Victory and a clean sheet to boot was no mean feat. It lifted us into sixth spot in the table with back-to-back home matches now giving us the opportunity to consolidate such a lofty position.

Next Saturday we are again here at the Beacon, facing Saltdean United, our former head coach Brad Sweetman and a glut of ex-Robins. Kick off reverts to 3pm for that one.

Away from first team matters, the Sunday following the Bexhill victory was unsurprisingly a washout for the Under 18s and Veterans.

The Ladies benefited from Pagham switching their game to a 3G pitch, running out 7-1 winners away from home to maintain their 100 percent start to the campaign.

Sean Perkins' side are proving very entertaining to watch, so we can

highly recommend catching them next time they are at the Beacon.

Full fixtures are included in today's programme with their next match taking place tomorrow away at Seaford Town.

The Under 18s are also on the road tomorrow, travelling to Withdean Stadium to face AFC Varndeanians in an 11am kick off.

The Under 23s were eliminated from the County Cup on Thursday night, going down 2-0 against Arundel.

Their midweek game against Chessington & Hook United was postponed, meaning their next fixture is this Thursday night away at reigning North Division champions Broadbridge Heath.

Finally, we will be opening the Clubhouse for England's World Cup group game against the USA on Friday night.

The bar will be open from 6.15pm ahead of the 7pm kick off. Please do try and come to support the club, enjoy some bargain craft beers and hopefully cheer the Three Lions onto victory..

Lingfield have played more Premier Division games than anyone else. And in those 18 matches, they have proven themselves the entertainers of the division

The Lingers have plundered 33 goals to date - two more than we have managed - which makes them the fourth-highest scorers in the Premier.

But despite all those goals flying in at one end, Lingfield sit 15th in the table with 17 points to their name from five wins, two draws and 11 defeats.

This position is largely on account of the fact that they have conceded 43 at the other end, which happens to be the fourth-worst total in the division.

Such an impressive scoring record combined with a questionable number conceded marks Lingfield out as being worth watching for the entertainment factor alone.

Not many of those in attendance when we hosted Lingfield in the FA Cup back in August would have picked the Lingers and ourselves to be two of the most entertaining sides in the division three months later.

A dour game went our way via a

spectacular own goal, providing one of the only bright spots both for those at the Beacon and the watching worldwide audience revelling in the highlights provided by *Your Instant Replay*.

Lingfield's scoring record deserves further credit as it has been achieved despite the Lingers losing key players such as Sam Lemon and Sam Clements over the past year.

Lemon and Clements were regular scorers past the Robins, helping Lingfield to enjoy recent dominance in this fixture up until last season.

We earned four points from the Lingers in 2021-22, ending a barren run of just one win in the preceding seven matches since Lingfield return to the Southern Combination after a brief one-season stay in the Southern Counties East.

Who knows what this afternoon will hold? Probably a 0-0, now we have talked up the entertainment factor.

1958... the Lingers move to their current home at Godstone Road
1978... lift the Surrey League and Intermediate Cup double, repeating the trick the following season

1982... floodlights are installed at Godstone Road and the club enter the FA Vase for the first time
1983... they finally join the Southern Combination, lasting six seasons before relegation to the Mid Sussex League

2008... promoted to the Premier Division for the first time in the clubs history

Striker Daley Clark joined us from Lingfield for the start of the 2009-10 season, going onto spend just over a year at the Beacon.

The former Burgess Hill Town Under 18s forward was bought in by Dave John to form a new look strike partnership with Neil Kane, who made the move from Shoreham during the 2008-09 campaign.

It was hoped that Clark would address the problem of scoring goals that had haunted us as we only just

survived relegation at the end of that season.

Clark did not prove to be the answer as the return of Phil Gault from St Francis Rangers saw Clark shifted back into a midfield role.

The move suited Clark and he played 34 times in his debut campaign, scoring once.

With Mickey Jewell taking the reigns for 2010-11 and an influx of new faces, Clark found his first team opportunities limited and he joined St Francis a month into the new season.

Ben Bacon has played for both clubs as part of his attempts to tick off every team in Sussex. His brief spell at Lingfield came in-between spells with Saltdean United and Steyning Town in 2018-19.

Bacon has been a Hassocks player twice, playing for us at the start of the 2016-17 and 2019-20 seasons.

Finally, our current assistant manager **Tom Hughes** turned out for Lingfield as player after moving to Sussex from London.



Magical own goal makes the Beacon centre of FA Cup attention

The Emirates FA Cup is a competition synonymous with magic and memorable moments. Hassocks needed one such intervention to secure safe passage as an incredible Lingfield own goal settled this extra preliminary round tie at the Beacon.

A quarter of an hour into the first half and Lingfield number one Harvey Mills stroked a goal kick out to Conor Wilford in the left back position looking to advance up the line.

Wilford was under no pressure when he cut back and aimed to return the ball to Mills.

Unfortunately, the Lingfield defender got it totally wrong and ended up leathering a lofted pass nowhere near the advancing Mills.

Instead, it flew into the back of the unguarded Lingers net from a good 25 yards out.

As far as own goals go, you will be hard pressed to see a better one. Within 24 hours of the full time whistle, the video had reached over a quarter of a million views on Twitter.

And if it is any consolation to Wilford, he did provide one of the only moments of entertainment in what was otherwise a scrappy, ugly affair far removed from the Robins' seven goal midweek thriller against Midhurst & Easebourne.

Not that Hassocks will care. Other than the £1125 banked in prize money, the most pleasing aspect for the Robins would have been keeping a clean sheet.

A turgid 1-0 to get the season up and running and give James Westlake his first win as head coach was just what the doctor ordered after shipping seven goals in the opening two games.

Westlake made two changes from the 4-3 Tuesday night defeat against the Stags. He started himself in midfield, pushing Leon Turner further forward alongside Phil Johnson in

place of Liam Benson.

Sam Cash meanwhile made his first full appearance since re-joining Hassocks from AFC Uckfield Town as Charlie Tuck dropped out.

It was a good afternoon for Cash, who was a worthy winner of the Robins' starman award for his part in a much tightened defensive showing.

Hassocks had the first opening, carved out via the positivity of Turner. The former Croydon man picked up possession deep inside his own half and outpaced and tricked his way past three Lingfield defenders on a run covering 60 yards of the pitch.

The finish could not match the approach sadly, Turner firing a weak effort straight into the arms of Mills.

Still, the home crowd roared their approval. Roars were replaced by laughter when Wilford had his head-in-hands moment.

Whilst the crowd chuckled, Hassocks players congratulated Phil Johnson, as if his half-hearted press that left him 20 yards from Wilford had caused the hapless defender to score an own goal they will be talking about for years to come.

Johnson played more of a role in setting up the opportunity that gave Hassocks their best shot at extending the lead. He put in a superb sliding challenge on Lingfield skipper David Heaton to win back possession.

The loose ball fell to Lewis Westlake. The Hassocks captain showed great awareness to realise Mills was off his line and even better technique to strike a first time effort from a good 40 yards.

Mills was left scrambling back as the ball sailed over his head once again. The difference this time was it went inches over the bar and was hit by a Hassocks player rather than Mills' own defender.

Troublingly for Hassocks, Johnson departed after that with Benson taking over.

Hassocks are already without the

services of Pat Harding through three broken ribs, so to lose Johnson for a period of time would be a blow with such a busy fixture list throughout August and September.

Benson was soon into the action, laying up an Alex Bygraves flick from a Harvey Blake long throw for Jack Troak to volley towards goal.

It needed a flying block from Luke New to keep it out at the expense of a corner. Lewis Westlake then curled a free kick into the side netting in the last action of the half.

Chances were at even less of a premium in the second 45. Cash collected a Troak throw, weaved his way past New and Richard Wetton into the box and delivered a low cross just turned behind by Rhyen Ramsey.

Had the clearance been two inches for the right, the Beacon would have had its second own goal of the game.

Cash then proved his worth defensively, making two blocks in a melee from a corner as Lingfield began to pour forward in search of an equaliser.

That left space for Hassocks to exploit. Benson looked to be in on two occasions racing behind, only for Mike Adepouju to intercept.

Substitute Jamie Wilkes, a tall striker signed from AFC Uckfield, then led a late counter attack by feeding Benson down the right.

Benson crossed for Troak, who could have laid off to the rangy Wilkes but opted to go for goal himself via an acrobatic volley on the turn which dropped just wide.

O'Callaghan and Wallis come together to help earn Robins a point

Things looked a little ominous for Hassocks before kick off away at Lingfield. The Robins were forced into fielding a makeshift centre back pairing against opponents containing a striker with 139 professional goals to his name.

Having never played together before, Kieran O'Callaghan and Rowan Wallis were thrown together and asked to deal with the considerable threat posed by Nicky Forster.

The former Brighton, Brentford, Reading, Birmingham City, Ipswich and Hull City forward has plundered seven goals in 10 games since his return to Godstone Road in early March.

Forster though could get no change out of O'Callaghan and Wallis, who were magnificent in helping a Robins side missing several key players to a highly impressive 1-1 draw.

Mickey Jewell was without either Ashley Marsh or Stuart Faith, necessitating O'Callaghan being redeployed from midfield and Wallis receiving the call up from the reserves.

With Elliott Butler only deemed fit enough to sit on the bench as an unused substitute, there was also a rare start for Stuart Brown on the right with James Westlake shifted into the middle of the park.

The patched up look of this Hassocks side combined with having to defend the slope in the first half meant the Robins were under a lot of early pressure.

Simon Lehkyj was never really troubled however, thanks largely to Messrs Wallis and O'Callaghan with able support from Rob South at right back and Lee Bryant at left back.

The Robins gradually came into the game as it ticked towards the break, even managing to fashion the

first clearcut opportunity of the match on 38 minutes.

Westlake got the ball rolling with a quickly taken free kick to catch the hosts out.

Some nice midfield interplay followed, ended with Weston cutting in from the left to shoot narrowly wide.

Lingfield reacted to that warning by taking the lead in the final seconds of the half.

Play was switched from right to left, followed by the ball being crossed into the feet of Danny Oatkins from the by-line.

Oatkins did not have much room to work with, but he showed impressive feet to lay back out of the tight space to Gareth Graham on the edge of the box.

Graham hit a first time effort which nestled in the far corner via a deflection which took it just beyond the despairing dive of Lehkyj.

It was harsh on Hassocks for them to go into the break trailing. They did not waste any time feeling sorry for themselves, flying out the traps at the start of the second half.

Lingfield were caught by surprise and the Robins nearly had an equaliser within three minutes of the restart.

Nathan Cooper spread play out to Brown on the right. Brown's clever first time volleyed cross was met by the head of Nathan Miles, forcing giant Lingfield goalkeeper Rob O'Hara to tip over the bar.

The Hassocks equaliser arrived on 79 minutes with the best move of the match.

South hit a diagonal pass to Miles, who produced an outrageous flick around the corner which enabled Phil Gault to spring the Lingers offside trap.

It initially looked as though the ball was going to head out of play but Gault did superbly to keep it in.

Gault then spotted the run of Westlake into the box and picked him

out with the perfect cross volleyed home neatly via a sidefoot from eight yards.

Not a bad way for Westlake to mark his 100th appearance in a Hassocks shirt.

Nobody could have blamed the Robins for settling for a point after levelling the tie.

Jewell though was bold, throwing on two attack minded youth team players in winger Aaron Czech and striker Ryan John.

There were a couple of half chances for either side in the final 10 minutes, whilst stoppage time offered a stage for the otherwise surprisingly subdued Dixie Dean to entertain with a trademark appeal when he felt his Lingfield side should have been awarded a penalty.

Overall, a share of the spoils was probably a fair result - with the biggest cheer of the afternoon reserved for referee Theo Parfitt after he took a Cooper clearance in the unmentionables on the hour mark.

Raging Bull charges to Hassocks October Player of the Month Award

Joe Bull is enjoying quite the 2022-23 season following his reinvention as a left back with the latest accolade being named Hassocks Player of the Month for October.

Bull finished second in the September award, as well as passing a century of appearances for the Robins at the end of August.

The majority of those had come as a forward. When AFC Vardeanians visited the Beacon in the Peter Bentley League Cup at the start of September, Bull took over from the injured Sam Cash at left back.

Since then, there has been no looking back. Bull has made himself an undroppable part of a back four which kept three Southern Combination League Premier Division clean sheets in five matches through October.

Such a mean defence helped the Robins climb to the dizzy heights of

sixth in the table. Bull has also contributed going forward, Hassocks deploying two attack-minded full backs with Harvey Blake on the opposite side.

Raging Bull has made the most of the freedom to charge forward, sending in the sort of deliveries which the Robins' current first choice strike force of Phil Johnson and Liam Benson thrive upon.

Speaking of Johnson, it was Hassocks' top scorer who finished second to Bull in the October Player of the Month award.

Johnson was in irresistible form, scoring eight goals from seven matches, including a first half haul of four in the Robins' 5-0 Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup win at Forest Row.

It was Johnson's timely late equaliser against Saltdean United in the Sussex Senior Cup which sent the tie to penalties, with Hassocks eventually winning a topsy turvy shootout 6-5.

Johnson also scored in wins away at Loxwood and Crowborough Athletic and when AFC Vardeanians were beaten 2-0 at the Beacon.

Third place in October Player of the Month went to goalkeeper Alex Harris, who remains the only player to have started every game in league and cup so far this season.

Harris took the Bedlam Brewery Starman accolade against Saltdean, playing a huge part in helping Hassocks into the second round of the competition.

The Tigers, Crowborough and Newhaven were the only opponents to find a way past Harris as he recorded shutouts facing Loxwood, Vardeanians, Eastbourne United and Forest Row.

The Forest Row fixture also gave Harris the opportunity to show off his distribution, a pinpoint kick 70 yards down the pitch to Jack Troak enabling Captain Jack to tee up Johnson for the Robins' second goal of the evening.

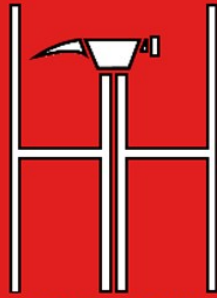

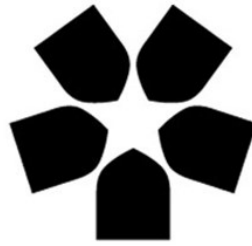

Benson bags Bonfire Night brace to beat Bexhill at the Beacon

After seeing their seven game unbeaten run ended at Newhaven last weekend, the Bonfire Night visit of sixth placed Bexhill United to the Beacon provided a good test for Hassocks in terms of responding to disappointment.

It was one they passed with flying colours, even if fireworks were in short supply.

A second half brace from Liam Benson secured a 2-0 win and in the process enabled the Robins to leapfrog their visitors in the Premier Division standings.

What made this three points most impressive was the players Hassocks had to contend without.

Harvey Blake and Alex Bygraves were suspended and Bradley Tighe at a wedding, denying James Westlake three of his back four.

Leon Turner was ruled out by injury having come off injured four minutes into the Newhaven defeat and Westlake then lost Phil Johnson to illness.

It is testament to the depth of the squad Westlake has built that that none of those five absentees were keenly felt.

Johnson was replaced in the XI by the outstanding Pat Harding, the perfect foil for Benson whose double made light of the Robins being without their 13 goal leading scorer.

Burgess Hill Town youngster JJ Minty came in for Turner on the right, giving a lively display including an assist his full debut for the Robins.

It was the much-changed defence who deserved the most credit, however.

Sam Cash, Will Broomfield and Sam Smith have all been forced to wait patiently for starting opportunities over the past two months because of the fine form of Blake, Bygraves, Tighe and Joe Bull.

Westlake now faces quite the selection dilemma having seen his new-look back line shutout Jack

Shonk and Evan Archibald, one of the most lethal strike partnerships in the Southern Combination League. A nice dilemma to have, mind.

Despite the constant rain of the 48 hours leading up to kick off, the Beacon pitch was in excellent condition.

It was only in the final five minutes that the surface became noticeably wet, meaning that those fans who braved the biblical weather were treated to a surface conducive to playing entertaining football on.

Bexhill started the stronger, an early chance inside of three minutes falling to Shonk. Luckily for Hassocks, he could only blaze over from five yards out.

On five minutes, the Pirates rattled the bar with an effort which cannoned downwards, requiring an important reflex intervention from Alex Harris to prevent the ball crossing the line.

Having weathered that early storm, the Robins grew into the game from quarter hour mark onwards.

Harding took an effort on early with his left foot from distance which crept just wide of the post as Hassocks had their first sight of goal with 17 on the clock.

The Robins played some nice stuff over the next half an hour without ever troubling Gregor Shaw in the Bexhill goal.

That was until the final five minutes of the half, which brought two big chances for Hassocks in the same passage of play.

A loose ball fell to Harding whose strike was well repelled by Shaw. The rebound set up nicely for Jamie Wilkes, only for the tall striker to fire wastefully over the bar.

Archibald had his first opportunity on the hour mark. It needed a stunning block from Smith to prevent the evergreen forward giving Bexhill the lead.

Hassocks went up the other end



from there, earning a free kick in a central position some 25 yards out.

Captain Jack Troak bent an effort expertly around the wall, only to see Shaw fly across his goal to push the ball around the post at full stretch.

The second half was warming up nicely now and two minutes later, Hassocks took the lead.

Harding and Minty linked up with the latter playing a defence splitting pass to send Benson scampering clear. The finish was expertly produced.

Minty was by now becoming increasingly influential. Another clever pass created a chance for the rangy Wilkes, fired just wide.

Hassocks had their upright to thank for preventing Bexhill equalising on 70 minutes when a great distance effort from Aaron Cook cannoned off the post with Harris beaten.

That was the beginning of a tense final 20. Cash, Broomfield, Smith and Bull with Harris behind stuck manfully to their task of securing a clean sheet, whilst Minty and Harding both made way after running themselves into the ground for Danny Reid and Phil Gault respectively.

Assistant manager Gault coming off the bench for his first appearance of the season certainly raised the spirits of the home crowd.

And their happy afternoon was rounded off when Benson secured all three points with a scrappy effort in the final minute of regulation time.

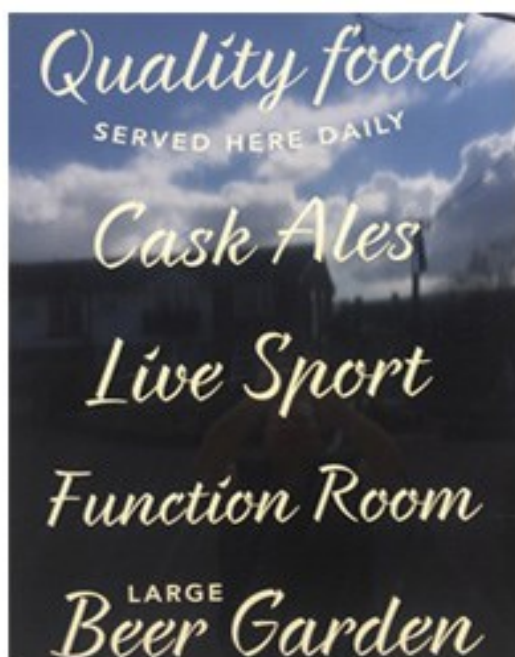

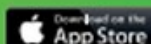

Robins improve but its not enough to book RUR quarter spot

November 19th 2013: Three days after being hammered 5-0 on the league at Horsham YMCA, Hassocks were back at Gorings Mead for an RUR Charity Cup third round tie

After suffering a 5-0 County League Division One defeat at Horsham YMCA on Saturday, Hassocks returned to Gorings Mead for midweek Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup action.

The Robins gave a much improved account of themselves second time around, although it still was not enough as YM progressed a quarter final tie against Rye United with a 3-2 victory despite playing for 50 minutes with 10 men.

Half time was five minutes away and the score locked at 1-1 when Tom Cannon received a straight red card from referee Ian Moore.

Cannon had decided to welcome Ashley Marsh back into the Hassocks line up with a high tackle that was dangerous, reckless and quite unnecessary.

They often say that playing against 10 is harder than 11 and the Robins certainly found that to be the case, unable to press home their numerical advantage.

That leaves Mickey Jewell and his players with just the league and the Sussex Senior Cup now to concentrate on.

Given the threadbare look of Jewell's squad at the minute, Hassocks were happy to have Marsh available after suspension and long time absentee Kieran O'Callaghan back in the fold.

Jewell also gave an opportunity to Stuart Brown out on the right, the winger having scored four goals in his past two appearances for the reserves.

Hassocks looked determined to make up for their poor show at the weekend, starting the game with plenty of determination and a high work rate which caught YM by surprise.

That led to the Robins opening the scoring with 14 minutes played.

Young Alex Harris in goal sent a long kick forward expertly flicked on by Phil Gault.

The ball fell into the path of Craig Knowles, who took an unexpected early shot from 35 yards which flew past surprised home goalkeeper Sam Smith.

Knowles had an excellent game playing on the shoulder of the YM defence, frequently using his pace to break through whilst always aware enough never to stray offside.

One such instance of clever play from Knowles almost led to Hassocks doubling their lead.

His escape down the right led to a cross only half cleared by YM to Brown who shot narrowly wide from a good position 10 yards out.

The Robins were made to rue that miss on 33 when YM equalised. Some neat play eventually left Ashley Dugdale with enough space on the edge of the box to place an effort into the far corner which left Harris with no chance.

No YM players had any complaints when Cannon was given his marching orders, almost as if they knew that they would end up streaking 3-1 ahead within 10 minutes of the second half.

Hassocks failed to clear their lines, giving Dave Brown a sight of goal.

Brown scuffed his effort and Harris looked to have it covered, only for the ball to find its way in.

Five minutes later and Hassocks were done on the counter, Dan Sullivan finishing neatly.

Visiting fans could have been forgiven for fearing that a similar collapse and scoreline to Saturday was about to unfold.

Hassocks though showed the sort of resolve missing a little over 72 hours earlier by quickly working their way back into tie.

Anthony Hibbert pulled one back

on the hour mark after a lovely move carved through YM.

Knowles was again at the heart of it. He beat the offside trap to slip in Brown, whose low pull back was cleverly dummied by Gault leaving Hibbert to finish.

Jewell switched things up after that, introducing Jamie Ingham for Brown on the right and bringing on youth teamer George Brown for a senior debut in place of Dan Jacques.

17-year-old Brown has a wicked left foot and it was from one of his corners swung in with pace and accuracy that Hassocks had their best chance to equalise.

O'Callaghan met the delivery with a looping header which came back off the crossbar.

Knowles broke through once more after being released by Gault but Smith made a good save low down to his left as the game entered its final 10 minutes.

That was the cue to throw O'Callaghan up front and start launching the ball forward with Knowles running off in a desperate search for an equaliser. YM though held on.

If it feels like only yesterday that we last played Saltdean United, that is because it was... kind of. The Tigers make their second visit to to the Beacon in the space of five weeks, this time in Premier Division action

Saltdean United this season

The Tigers saw manager Bryan O'Toole and virtually his entire first team squad depart in the summer after finishing runners up to Littlehampton Town in both the Premier Division title race and the RUR Cup. He kept net for us in the 2017-18 season after switching to the Beacon from Lewes.
