The Under 23s had been due to play Broadbridge Heath on Thursday night but that game was lost to a waterlogged pitch at the Countryside Stadium.

Action involving the Ladies and Veterans has been non existent because of the weather, but the Under 18s have managed to play twice in the past fortnight.

A 4-0 win against Lancing on the 3G at Culver Road was followed by a 2-2 draw against AFC Varndeanians on Sunday in a fixture switched to the artificial surface at the University of Brighton.

A side managed by Brad Sweetman defying pre-season expectations after being many peoples' idea of relegation favourites? We have seen this before...

For that was us last season. The Robins were written off for the crime to start again from scratch, of having a young head coach and an even younger group of players.

A slow start to the campaign followed but a couple of shrewd additions who added experience to the prodigious talent at the Beacon led to much-improved form from autumn onwards.

We ended the season nine points clear of the bottom two and in a first Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup semi final for 10 years, representing a solid season which has provided the foundations for James Westlake to build on.

Sweetman's task after taking over at Hill Park in the summer looked even tougher than the job he faced with the Robins.

The resignation of Bryan O'Toole sparked the mass exodus of the Tigers squad who had finished runners up to Littlehampton Town in both the Premier Division and RUR Cup.

Saltdean have subsequently had Sweetman again relying on a mix of good young players and some older heads with the remit of staying out of the relegation battle.

So far, so good. The Tigers are 17th, 15 points clear of Roffey and nine ahead of Alfold at the bottom of the table.

We know for two reasons that Saltdean are not a club to be underestimated.

The first is because they almost eliminated us from the Sussex Senior Cup in October.

The second is that a number of ex-Robins followed Sweetman to the Tigers.

That will add an air of familiarity to this afternoon's proceedings as we welcome back the likes of Jack Gardner, Alfie Edmeads, Louis Thwaites, Lucas Tyrrell, Jayden Dunkley, Jacob Campbell and the Tigers' eight-goal top scorer Lewis Beebee.

The number of links between the Player of the Season awards. clubs have obviously jumped significantly this summer, but even before Brad Sweetman and his ex-Robins made Hill Park their new home there were plenty of players to have turned out for both through the years.

James Broadbent was number one goalkeeper for Saltdean last season as the Tigers finished runners up in both the Southern Combination League and RUR Charity Cup.

Broadbent spent 2016-17 as a Robin, playing a huge role in helping us avoid relegation on his way to winning all of Players' Player, Managers' Player and Supporters'

Another goalkeeper to have turned out for both clubs is Nathan Stroomberg, who played 21 times for Hassocks in the 2017-18 season.

Stroomberg spent the following season with Saltdean before establishing himself as number one at Lewes. He is now a Peacehaven & Telscombe player.

Striker Ben Bacon has enjoyed two spells with Hassocks and one with the Tigers, coming back to haunt of the Saltdean management team. us by scoring all four goals as Saltdean won 4-1 on their August Bank Holiday Monday visit to the Beacon in 2018.

Another striker Dan Smith

played for the Tigers in amongst his three spells with Hassocks between 2010 and 2013. His overall record for the Robins stood at 27 goals in 63 games with an even more impressive strike rate at Hill Park when Saltdean were a Division Two outfit.

Stuart Brown moved to Hill Park for first team football from the Beacon midway through the 2014-15 season, when our former reserve team boss Scott Osborne was part

Also with the Tigers at that time was Jamie Buckett whilst former Hassocks Under 18s captain Terry Gacias had a brief spell with Saltdean in the early 2010s.

Penalty drama sees Hassocks scrape into next round of Senior Cup

By the skin of their teeth, Hassocks moved into the second round of the Sussex Senior Cup for the first time since 2019 after eliminating Saltdean United on penalties.

As late as the 81st minute, it looked like ex-Robins head coach Brad Sweetman was going to mark his return to the Beacon by eliminating his former club from the competition.

The Tigers deservedly led 2-1 with Hassocks having delivered a really poor performance by the recent high standards which have seen them move to within five points of top spot in the Premier Division.

Then the Robins found a fortunate equaliser to force a shoot out. Substitute Phil Johnson hit an effort which took such a heavy deflection off a Saltdean player that it could feasibly have gone down as an own goal.

Lady luck continued to shine on the Robins into the lottery of penalties. A roller coaster shoot out saw 16 spot kicks taken, Hassocks missing two and Saltdean three to give the hosts a 6-5 victory.

Just like in the Peter Bentley League Cup last month, James Westlake used the break from league action as a chance to ring changes.

Danny Reid and Sam Rogers were both rewarded for some excellent Under 23s performances with their first senior starts for Hassocks.

Pat Harding got a first 90 minutes under his belt since breaking three ribs in pre-season. Sam Cash made his first start since August following injury and Alex Bygraves returned after missing the weekend win over AFC Varndeanians.

Dropping to the bench were Johnson, Harvey Blake, Bradley Tighe, Jamie Wilkes and Leon Turner. half and Saltdean took the lead

Hassocks might point to the unfamiliarity in their starting XI as a reason for their below par showing, although there was no indication of

what was to coming during an opening 15 minutes in which the Robins started well.

Alex Harris had to be alert inside of 60 seconds to make a smart save but after that, it was all Hassocks.

Rogers and Mike Williamson combined to release Reid who fired an effort straight down the throat of Saltdean goalkeeper Josh James.

The opening goal arrived with 12 minutes played. Raging Joe Bull delivered a corner to the front post where Jack Troak timed his run perfectly to arrive and volley home.

Hassocks continued to press. A searching ball out of defence from Sam Smith released Liam Benson down the flank. His cross was met by a Harding effort just over the bar.

Troak should have doubled the advantage when another good right wing delivery from Bull looked destined to find him at the far post. Instead, the ball sailed straight past Troak and out of play.

It was a goal out of nothing which hauled Saltdean level on 24 minutes. There did not seem much on when former Hassocks wide man Lucas Tyrrell had possession 30 yards away from goal and out towards

Tyrrell though spotted Harris off his line and hit a clean strike which flew over the head of the goalkeeper and into the back of the net.

Conceding seemed to rock Hassocks. Their dominance dried up and the remaining 65 minutes became a game of few chances at either end.

The Tigers came closest to moving into the lead before the break, drawing an important stop out of Harris from a free header at the far post.

Seven minutes into the second through Jesse Burbidge.

Westlake responded by making a double change on the hour mark, Wilkes and Turner replacing Rogers

and Reid.

A rare moment of quality from the Robins arrived two minutes later as they put the ball in the back of the net via a sweeping move, only for it to be disallowed in peculiar circumstances.

The assistant referee spotted an offside nobody else had, one it seemed that referee Owen Lawrence was willing to overrule as he allowed play to continue for an eternity after the flag was initially raised.

It was only once Hassocks finished the play by scoring that Mr Lawrence blew for offside, having not seen his assistant's flag in the air.

Johnson replaced Benson on 71 minutes, not long after Benson had fired high from the edge of the box.

Nine minutes after his introduction and Johnson was booked. 60 seconds later and he produced the equaliser with the help of that wicked deflection.

That shook the Robins back to life and they finished the game strongly. Turner's run caused a scramble in the box which nobody in red could convert.

Bull hit a free kick high, wide and not particularly handsome. A second yellow card for Ross Smith left Saltdean to negotiate the final three minutes with only 10 men and then tall striker Wilkes missed from a couple of yards when it looked easier to score right at the death.

Hassocks missed their first penalty which looked ominous. The Robins though held their nerve, recovered and will now be hoping for a money-spinning draw with one of the big boys of Sussex football in the next round.

Christmas miracle as Hassocks take point from leaders Saltdean

Ever the optimists, one Hassocks going on this occasion. 15 minutes fan turned to another in the Clubhouse before kick off as the **Robins hosted Southern Combination League Premier** Division leaders and said: "This could be worse than the cricket."

Christmas though is the season for miracles. England desperately need one in Australia.

Hassocks got one in Mid Sussex, drawing 1-1 with an outstanding Tigers side who had walloped them 6 -0 earlier in the campaign.

You could understand the pessimism amongst the home support. Saltdean arrived having put nine unanswered goals past East Preston seven days earlier.

They then went and eliminated Conference South side Eastbourne Borough from the Sussex Senior Cup in midweek.

Tigers manager Bryan O'Toole has built a squad that reads like a who's who of recent Southern Combination title winners and right now, they are playing at the peak of their powers as those previous two results evidence.

Hassocks meanwhile are ravaged by injury and illness to key players. Josh Short and Dan Turner were the latest notable omissions, joining longterm absentees like Andy Whittingham, Bradley Bant, Lucas Tyrrell, Jack Gardner and Spencer Slaughter on the missing list.

Brad Sweetman opted to replace Turner and Short with experience, turning to Jordan Badger and Jack Troak.

Both have endured stop-start campaigns and were making only their fifth and third starts of the season respectively.

Saltdean had flown out of the traps on their way to scoring six goals last time these sides met, opening the scoring inside of 120 seconds on that balmy August evening at Hill Park.

It took them a little longer to get

had elapsed when Trevor McCreadie - so often a thorn in Hassocks' side during his Haywards Heath Town days - latched onto a ball over the top.

Alex Harris was quick off his line and did well to shut the danger down, resulting in McCreadie lifting his effort over the bar.

Hassocks registered their first chance shortly after. Sam Smith was making his home debut and he had a good sight 25 yards out but his effort lacked the required power to trouble former Hassocks favourite James Broadbent in the Tigers goal.

Saltdean took the lead on 20 minutes via an elegant strike from Tom Caplin.

Hassocks were unable to clear their lines and Caplin needed no second invitation when the ball fell to him 22 yards out, driving a clinical effort into the bottom corner.

The Robins were dealt a blow seven minutes later when Smith limped out of the action, adding to the their injury woes.

Joe Bull seemed the obvious replacement but Sweetman instead opted to bring Josh Hawkes on up front.

Hawkes has been in good scoring form recently for the Under 23s, but he cannot have been asked to lead the line many times in his senior career - as the look on his face of a man whose Christmases had all come at once eluded to.

It turned out to be an inspired decision and on the stroke of half time, Hawkes was denied what appeared a stonewall penalty.

Arthur Rawlingson went charging forward from right back to deliver the perfect cross which Hawkes looked set to get his chin on until he was clumsily tripped by a Saltdean defender. Remarkably, referee Ian Moore waved play on.

Undeterred, Hassocks continued to take the game to their visitors at the start of the second half. A quick counter inside the opening five minutes ended with Troak whistling a half volley over.

The Robins got the goal they deserved a few minutes later. Troak had a shot blocked but the ball fell kindly to Alfie Loversidge who slammed home from eight vards out for his eighth goal of the season.

Jack Baden was the next Hassocks player to depart injured, Charlie Tuck coming on at left back in a straight swap. It did not take Tuck long to make an impression.

A Badger slip let in McCreadie and the Robins looked bang in trouble until Tuck appeared from nowhere, producing one of the best tackles that the Beacon has seen in many years to snuff out the danger.

Saltdean continued to pour forward in the final 15 minutes and it was all hands on deck for Hassocks.

The Tigers had the ball in the net with five of normal time left to play but a tight offside call correctly went the Robins' way.

Harris repelled a Saltdean header with a fine save before Hassocks made their final change, the tireless Lewis Westlake making way for Luke Marshall as another defender was chucked on to try and help preserve the point.

Hassocks got there after what must have felt like an endless amount of time added on.

The reaction of the players at the end told its own story about what a big result this was. Move over Jesus, Mary, Joseph and the wee donkey there is a new Christmas miracle in town.

Festive feast of football for the Robins through December - and there might even by cake

A festive feast of football lies in store for Hassocks through December, including the Beacon hosting a Boxing Day fixture for the first time since 2018.

Steyning Town will provide the opposition on December 26th in an 11am kick off and although not a local derby by geography, it is a fixture which has had some spice in the past due to players and managers swapping the Birchwood Ground for the Beacon and vice versa.

So, what better way to blow off the Christmas Day cobwebs then with a morning watching the Robins before heading home for the second round of turkey?

Before Boxing Day arrives, Hassocks have three other scheduled matches. A first trip to the Rotherfield for a league game since the 1993-94 season is on the cards for Saturday 3rd December as we travel to Midhurst & Easebourne.

Peacehaven & Telscombe provide the opposition at the Beacon a week later in a 3pm kick off. Please keep an eye on the Hassocks website and social media channels to see if Dave John can be convinced to run the Robins' famous half price entry to anybody wearing a Christmas jumper offer again this year.

That clash with the Tye is followed a week later with Hassocks travelling to Eastbourne Town. If the Robins were to win, it would be their first victory at the Saffrons since 2006 to spark Christmas miracle headlines in the Mid Sussex Times.

The Under 23s will play only twice in December. Horsham YMCA visit the Beacon on Thursday 10th followed by a trip to Lingfield on Thursday 17th. Both games kick off at 7:45pm.

It is set to be a busy month for the Under 18s, who have three games crammed in. They host Mile Oak in the Central Division on Sunday 4th, St Francis Rangers are the visitors in the Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup second round on Sunday 11th and the League Cup takes the Robins all the way to Selsey on Sunday 18th.

The Ladies have a local derby away against Burgess Hill Town on Sunday 4th followed by their final game of 2022 on Sunday 11th at home to Saltdean United.

Remarkably, that will be just their third game of the season at the Beacon.

Sean Perkins' side have been scoring goals for fun so far in both league and cup and are well worth a watch. Kick off against the Tigers will be at 2pm and admission is free.

Lastly, the Veterans face Seaford Town away in the Sussex Veterans Challenge Cup on Sunday 4th December. Kick off is 2pm at the Crouch.









Robins make double swoop for Southam and Tennant

Hassocks have bolstered their squad with two new additions arriving at the Beacon in goalkeeper Joe Southam and midfielder Tom Tennant.

19-year-old Southam has been dual-signed from Burgess Hill Town after Robins number one Alex Harris was struck down with illness in the week leading up to the visit of Lingfield to Mid Sussex.

When Harris failed to recover, Southam was handed his senior debut.

It was his first competitive 90 minutes in six months but he showed no sign of rustiness, impressing in helping Hassocks to a 2-2 draw.

Lingfield came flying out of the traps and took the lead inside of three minutes with a clinical goal scored on the counter.

Southam then had to make two impressive saves in quick succession, without which the Robins could easily have been three goals behind and

with the game potentially over before the 10 minute mark.

The teenager is highly thought of at the More Than Tyres Stadium, where he was named Players' Player of the Season for Hill's Under 18s in 2021-22.

That form was rewarded with Jay Lovett including Southam in several Isthmian League squads towards the end of the campaign.

Southam is the second young player to move to the Beacon from Hill in the past month.

Winger JJ Minty made the switch at the end of October, also dualsigned having started the campaign with a similar agreement to gain experience of senior football at Eastbourne Town.

Minty has looked lively in his four Hassocks appearances to date with more to come.

Tennant meanwhile arrives from the Robins' Southern Combination League Premier Division rivals Loxwood. He has played eight times this season for the Magpies having switched to the Nest from Copthorne after four appearances in the current campaign for the Division Two outfit.

Tennant was a regular for Copthorne last season, playing 25 games and scoring three goals.

In the 2020-21 campaign, he represented another Division Two side in Charlwood.

Tennant's arrival increases the ex-Loxwood contingent at the Beacon, although he was not a Magpies player when any of Lewis Westlake, Sam Smith, Leon Turner, Charlie Broad, Tom Frankland or head coach James Westlake were at the Nest.

There has been one recent departure from the Beacon, Sam Geard having joined Montpelier Villa in search of first team football.

Geard came through the Under 18s and played five times for the Under 23s this season, scoring once. He made three senior appearances in 2021-22.

Slow start and free kick magic at the finish deny Robins three points from Lingers

The neutrals who chose the Beacon as the place to get a **football fix with the top divisions** on the ball, enjoying their first real now on their World Cup winter break were entertained and visitors Lingfield were clearly happy at heading back to Surrey with a point.

For Hassocks though, this 2-2 draw against opponents sitting 15th in the table was a frustrating afternoon bookended by a sloppy start and the shock of seeing a magic 78th minute free kick undo all their hard work having recovered from going behind very early.

That there were four goals was no real surprise. The Lingers arrived in Mid Sussex having scored the fourth-highest total in the Premier Division this season, whilst at the same time conceding the fourthmost.

It did not take Lingfield long to show why they have found the net with such frequency.

Just three minutes had elapsed when they opened the scoring with a blistering goal on the counter attack.

A Hassocks free kick went awry, the Lingers galloped straight up the other end and Dennis Asante applied the finish past Joe Southam in the Robins goal.

Being left so ruthlessly exposed was hardly the start to his Hassocks debut Southam would have been hoping for.

The 19-year-old was signed on dual-registration from Burgess Hill Town to deputise for the ill Alex Harris.

Southam won Players' Player of the Year for the Hillians' Under 18s last season and he showed why in the immediate aftermath of Hassocks going behind.

Excellent saves in the sixth and 10th minutes from Lingfield top scorer Cameron Dobell and Deji Adeosun prevented the visitors moving 3-0 ahead and potentially killing the game before it had even

Hassocks eventually got their foot spell of possession just before the 20 minute mark.

That led up nicely to an equaliser which arrived on 22. With Phil Johnson and Pat Harding both absent, Hassocks were shouldering Liam Benson with the responsibility for goals as he led the line alongside Under 23s top scorer Danny Reid making his first league start.

Benson produced a classic poacher's finish for his 10th of the campaign, reacting quickest to smash home a rebound after an Alex Bygraves header from a raging Joe Bull delivery was somehow blocked on the line.

The Robins dominated the remaining 23 minutes of the first half. Reid began to grow in confidence, letting one fly from distance on the half hour mark which had Lingers goalkeeper Jimmy Penfold a little worried even if it were off target.

Lingfield dug in and defended manfully and it looked like they might make it to the break on level terms until five minutes before the interval.

The goal which gave Hassocks the lead was beautifully crafted between the Robins' two wingers.

JJ Minty and Jack Troak combined to create a shooting opportunity for Troak.

The first Troak effort was cleared off the line but he had continued his run and made no mistake with the second bite of the cherry, burying a left footed drive low and hard into the bottom corner.

Hassocks came flying out of the stalls at the start of the second half, forging two good chances within 180 seconds of the restart.

Harvey Blake and Minty linked up well down the right to earn a corner. Bull sent over another dangerous delivery which Troak volleyed wide.

The Robins quickly worked another corner. This time, Bull found





Minty whose header was inches the wrong side of the post.

It was not just Bull and Hassocks who were threatening from set pieces, however.

A teasing free kick from Gus Ward required Bradley Tighe to make an outstanding block to prevent Lingfield pulling level on 52 minutes, the fastpaced start to the second half showing no signs of slowing.

Hassocks should have forced an opportunity to add a third on 72 minutes.

Troak did everything right in tearing down the left and past three Lingfield players as quick as lightning, only to be let down by his final ball which ended up on the railway track behind the east goal with a plethora of red shirts arriving in the area.

That was punished when Lingfield levelled via a moment of magic with 12 minutes remaining.

Ward had fired a warning shot earlier over what he could do with set pieces.

When Hassocks conceded a free kick in a good position, Ward took full advantage by producing a stunning effort which left Southam no chance of keeping it out.

The best the Robins could muster in response was an injury time effort from Troak deflected over the bar by Jake Riddington. In the end, a draw was a fair result.

County Cup curse continues as Robins again eliminated at earliest opportunity

Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup Second Round Thursday 10th November 2022, The Beacon Hassocks U23s 0-2 Arundel U23s

Playing in the Sussex Under 23 Challenge Cup has rarely been an enjoyable experience for Hassocks and their poor recorded continued with second round elimination at the hands of Arundel.

The competition was first introduced for the 2017-18 season, since when the Robins have won only four times in it and advanced beyond the stage they entered on three occasions.

As Southern Combination League North Division leaders going into the tie - Alfold took over at the top thanks to a 4-1 win at the same time as Hassocks were losing to Arundel - the Robins might have fancied a decent crack at the competition this time. Especially as the draw appeared kind, on paper at least. The Mullets sit 10th of 12 teams in the West Division, winning three of their six matches.

Fernley had scored twice in the Robins last outing, a 5-1 win in the League Cup at Chessington & Hook United in which Neil Parker included seven Under 18s players in his squad.

There was a much more experienced look to the side who took on Arundel with five changes to the starting XI from victory at Chalky Lane.

Will Broomfield and Arthur Rawlingson returned to the back line. Sam Rogers was introduced in midfield having missed the Chessington game through first team involvement against both Forest Row and Newhaven.

JJ Minty came in for his first Under 23s appearances as Hassocks try to get him up to match fitness following his dual-signing from Burgess Hill Town, whilst Will Varley from the Under 18s came in for a full debut.

Dropping out were Varley's fellow youth team players Fernley, George Gladding, Archie Hill and Alex Wintle,



along with Under 23s regular Ben Hicks. Both Hicks and Wintle were introduced from the bench, but nothing Hassocks did could help them find a way past the mean Mullets defence.

Charlie Broad also came on having plundered three goals in his past three appearances, with Tom Frankland making his Under 23s bow from the bench having not featured for the first team for the past six weeks.

Arundel scored their goals in a 16 minute spell either side of half time. Kieron Howard put the visitors ahead three minutes before the break, followed by James Ayling adding the second just before the hour mark.

The Mullets will now face either Crowborough Athletic or Broadbridge Heath in the third round. For Hassocks, it is back to the bread and butter of league football next week at home to Chessington & Hook United.

Three goals from the bench help Hassocks to hammer Lancing

Same opponents, same scoreline. For the second game running, Hassocks Under 18s faced Lancing and for their second game running it ended in a healthy 4-0 victory for the Robins.

Crazy 10 goal thriller marks Marsh's 500th Hassocks game

November 26th 2016: Ashley Marsh made his 500th Hassocks appearance on an unforgettable afternoon at Crawley Down Gatwick where the Robins won a crazy game 6-4


Last time we met
