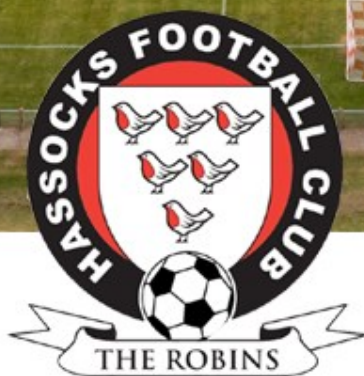

Welcome to the Beacon



Good morning and welcome to the Beacon for much-anticipated Boxing Day football as we host near-neighbours Steyning

Today represents our first Boxing Day home game since 2018 and our first holiday fixture against the Barrowmen.

We hope that their players, management, committee and supporters enjoy their stay with us today and we look forward to heading over to the Birchwood Ground on Easter Monday - especially for the famous Steyning Town meat raffle.

A combination of wet weather and freezing temperatures means that we have endured a bit of a barren spell with no football being played since our Sussex Senior Cup exit at the hands of Eastbourne Town on Tuesday 6th December.

Those who decided that the Beacon was the place to be that evening rather than watching Portugal dismantle Switzerland in the second round of the World Cup saw Town score the only goal early in their best spell of the game.

Although we created a lot of chances over the course of the 90 minutes - including hitting the bar three times - we could find no way through.

That there was a feeling of disappointment to have departed the competition in such a manner is a

sign of the progress being made so far in Westy's first campaign at the helm.

Games with Town have always been filled with dread for the Hassocks faithful about what the scoreline may be; it was only three seasons ago that they won 7-0 here at the Beacon.

Now though we are outplaying teams that good and coming off the pitch frustrated to have lost. It is quite the change and points to a very exciting 2023 lying ahead.

We kick off the new year away at Roffey on Monday 2nd January. It is an 11pm start for our first visit to Bartholomew Way for a senior competitive fixture.

Visiting a new ground is always exciting, although it would have been nice to face the Boars in warmer seasons to take advantage of their beer garden area at the Theatre of Trees.

Our next home game follows on Saturday 7th January against AFC Uckfield Town before two rearranged matches for your diaries.

We travel to Eastbourne Town on Saturday 14th January. It will be the third attempt to get that one played after the November fixture was

moved due to Town's continuing involvement in the FA Vase, followed by the game last Saturday falling to a frozen pitch.

Peacehaven & Telscombe then visit the Beacon three days later on Tuesday 17th January, kicking off at 7:45pm.

At the time of writing, we are still awaiting confirmation of our Under 23s and Under 18s games through January.

You can find where and when the Ladies will be in action in today's programme. They will be looking to continue their 100 percent start to the campaign.

Finally, we are delighted to have Hassocks woolly hats for sale for anyone wanting to treat themselves, their friends or their family to a late Christmas present.

Today's Boxing Day clash is between two sides who have enjoyed a remarkably similar upturn in fortunes following a managerial change in the summer

Where Hassocks finished 16th last season, handed the managerial reins to James Westlake and are now challenging for a top six spot, Steyning had to find a replacement for long-standing boss Gerry Murphy.

Murphy had done an outstanding job at the Birchwood Ground, leading the Barrowmen back to the top division of the Southern Combination League for the first time in nearly 30 years and then keeping them there.

His decision to retire from management in the summer saw Steyning turn to Montpellier Villa manager Kevin Green, a shrewd move which so far has the Barrowmen scaling heights not really seen since they were one of the most dominant clubs in Sussex non-league football during the 1980s.

Steyning arrive here this morning sitting fourth in the Premier Division having won 11, drawn three and lost six of their 20 matches so far.

That record leaves them six points and three places higher than us in the standings, although we do

have two games in hand.

Even more concerning to Hassocks than Steyning's lofty position will be their recent form.

Their past two matches saw them win 4-1 away at Newhaven a week after beating long-term leaders Broadbridge Heath by the same scoreline at the Birchwood Ground.

As those two results suggest, goals have been in plentiful supply. Steyning have scored 44 times, the third highest total in the division after Newhaven and current table toppers Crawley Down Gatwick.

Although we have not scored in our past two outings, our own goals record is not too patchy with 38 netted in 18 matches.

That augurs well for plenty of entertainment between two sides who, although not local rivals in a geographical sense, have plenty of shared history in terms of players and managers - and who have delivered a fair few fiery affairs in the past.

Played for Both

There has been a constant flow of players between Hassocks and Steyning Town over the past decade or so, which always tends to add a certain spice to the fixture.

It began when former Barrowmen manager **Mark Dalglish** left the Birchwood Ground to become Mickey Jewell's Hassocks assistant in the summer of 2010.

Goalkeeper **Mike Abbott**, defenders **Andy Whittingham** and **Sam Goodridge** and midfielder **Lee Waterhouse** were amongst those to follow Dalglish to the Beacon.

The 2013-14 campaign saw striker **Craig Knowles** switch Steyning for Hassocks.

In that same season, Jewell signed **Alex Gathern** from Burgess Hill Town.

Gathern went onto play 21 times for the Robins before joining Horsham YMCA and Shoreham.

He then signed for Steyning and helped his hometown club to promotion to the Premier Division in 2019 and the Division One Cup.

Gathern eventually became captain of the Barrowmen and is now the Under 23s manager after having to retire through injury last season.

Two current Hassocks players have previously had brief spells with Steyning.

Liam Benson spent a month at the Birchwood Ground at the start of

the 2019-20 campaign and **Lewis Westlake** was with the Barrowmen after leaving Loxwood last season.

Other notable names to play for both include The Wizard **Jamie Weston**, who played over 100 times for Hassocks between 2010 and 2013 and spent the second half of the 2019-20 season at the Shooting Field.

Ben Bacon has turned out for both sides in a couple of spells as part of his quest to play for every single club in Sussex.

Last but by no means least, **John Suter** joins Dalglish in having managed the two clubs, taking charge at Steyning in the 2013-14 campaign five years after his ill-fated spell here at the Beacon.



Awesome Akras denies Hassocks three points in sunny Steyning

With both Steyning Town and Hassocks safe from relegation, there was little to play for when the sides who sit 16th and 17th in the Southern Combination League Premier Division met at the Shooting Field.

It was to both teams credit then that they still put on a decent show, especially in the first half when most of the chances arrived and both goals were scored in a 1-1 draw.

The spoils being shared was probably the right result, even though home goalkeeper Stefanos Akras was the best player on the pitch.

He denied the Robins from adding to Jack Troak's early opener with three saves of the highest class and was also involved in the game's major talking point midway through the first half.

That saw Lewis Westlake clip a long ball forward for Josh Short to chase. Akras came haring from his goal and as Short beat him to the ball and rounded him, the two collided. Short now had an open net to fire into and so Akras cleverly grabbed his head.

The general consensus from those who had the best view of the incident watching from the stand was that Akras had been caught on the shoulder, but from the position that referee Nick Blogg was in, it must have appeared a head injury.

Mr Blogg subsequently stopped the game, denying Short the most routine of goals.

Hassocks were incensed and even though Mr Blogg was right to halt proceedings for a potential head injury you could understand why the visitors were irked; they almost certainly would have gone onto win had they gone 2-0 ahead.

It was a lead they deserved too after dominating the opening 25 minutes.

To make matters worse, the decision seemed to take the wind out of the Robins' sails and Steyning equalised shortly afterwards with their first shot on target.

Hassocks had gone ahead with only seven minutes on the clock. Dan Turner charged over to the touchline to use one of his famous long throws, launching the ball 50 yards down the pitch deep into Steyning territory.

The Barrowmen worked the ball back to a surprised Akras, who dallied in possession for a second too long. Troak closed him down, won the ball and then rolled into an empty goal to make it 1-0.

Akras atoned for his part in the opener with his first outrageous stop of the afternoon five minutes later.

Lewis Westlake played a long ball over the top to set Short away and his powerful drive looked destined for the bottom corner until Akram somehow repelled it with a strong arm.

The Steyning goalkeeper made an even more impressive save just before the phantom head injury incident. Lewis Westlake swung over a corner which young Luke Marshall met with a towering header.

Akras though threw himself into the air and got the most important of touches on the ball, pushing it onto the crossbar as Steyning again survived.

The Barrowmen's quest to find a way back into the game appeared to get a little harder when Bobby Bennett limped out of proceedings with around 30 minutes played.

Steyning though made light work of losing their leading striker. They finished the first half the stronger side and scored with their first real effort at Alex Harris five minutes before the interval.

A left wing cross from Max Howell was met by a flicked header from the in-form Josh Bradley, scoring for the fifth time in Steyning's past five

matches.

Chances were at a premium after the break. Hassocks struggled to make much headway whilst Steyning could find no way past Turner, who was a one-man blocking and heading machine.

The only thing Turner did not win on the day was the post-game meat raffle drawn in the Clubhouse afterwards.

One of the prizes did at least go to someone with Hassocks connections, the dad of suspended defender Bradley Tighe and substitute Wes picking up a nice prize to take home.

In football terms, Hassocks had the only chances of note in a second half which drifted somewhat compared to the entertainment of the first.

Another Lewis Westlake corner caused problems for the home side on 58 minutes. This time, Short met it with a header as good as Marshall's in the first half.

Unfortunately for Hassocks, Akras pulled off an equally impressive save to keep it out.

Then on 81, it took a combination of Akras and defender Joe Fitzpatrick to ensure the Robins were not victorious.

Short led the Steyning defence on a merry dance, skipping past three defenders before firing a shot towards the bottom corner that Akras kept out.

The loose ball fell to James Westlake, who looked certain to score. That was until Fitzpatrick appeared from nowhere to make a superb sliding block which sent the ball behind for a corner.

O'Callaghan rescues a replay and Robins from Senior Cup upset

Kieran O'Callaghan spared the blushes of Hassocks with a 112th minute equaliser which prevented their elimination from the Sussex Senior Cup at the hands of lowly Division Two outfit Steyning Town.

It finished a 1-1 draw at the Shooting Field, the Robins' third result in a row by that scoreline and remarkably their eighth of the season from 20 matches.

Mickey Jewell was far from impressed but his side did at least earn a second crack at beating the Barrowmen and earning a plum home tie against Ryman League Whitehawk in round two.

Steyning belied their position of second bottom in the division below Hassocks with a gutsy display on an awful surface made worse by heavy overnight rain which continued into the morning.

Town adapted better to the conditions whilst the Robins tried to play their usual passing game.

That was never likely to work on a lumpy, bumpy pitch. Hassocks though were so sloppy in possession and so quick to give the ball away that they would have struggled even playing on a Wembley-esque surface.

The game kicked off at 2pm, an hour early than originally advertised due to problems with the Shooting Field's floodlights.

Some Hassocks fans did not get the memo and arrived at the interval, not that they missed much as there was hardly any action of note in a dire first half.

It took until the 33rd minute for the first shot on target from either side to arrive.

Stuart Brown cut inside from the right and put an effort straight at Darren Ford.

Ryan De Freitas fired over for Town shortly afterwards. Right on the stroke of half time, the

industrious Jamie Hillwood had a shot blocked at the far post on his first start since the 2008-09 season. And that was about as good as it got.

Hassocks upped their game in the second half but several promising moves lacked the final ball and broke down on the edge of or around the box.

Brown departed with an injury six minutes after the break, Jewell taking the opportunity to introduce Spencer Slaughter who had begun the game on the bench after being rested.

Slaughter brought increased energy and was soon into the

action, releasing Phil Gault down a channel.

Gault's layback found Anthony Hibbert but he could only shoot wide before making way for Lee Waterhouse shortly afterwards, coming on against his former club.

The angle proved too tight as Slaughter chipped wide and Hassocks had strong penalty appeals waved away when Ryan Pratt appeared to handle a Elliott Butler free kick.

On 66 minutes the deadlock should have been broken by the Robins.

A long kick from Jack Simpson found Hillwood on the left. He whipped in a pinpoint cross to the far post but the usually clinical Gault somehow headed across goal and wide from barely two yards out.

Hassocks had a huge let off themselves as the game entered the final 10 minutes when Steyning

fashioned what was the best opportunity of the 90.

Simpson had been a virtual spectator all afternoon when he suddenly found himself confronted by the lively Sean Pickup running clear.

Pickup beat Simpson but not the bar, the ball blasting against the woodwork and away to safety as the game meandered into extra time.

The additional period was three minutes old when Steyning took the lead, a deserved reward for frustrating the Robins and making an even game of it up to that point.

Substitute Lewis Levoi was the scorer, netting with a brilliant volley that left Simpson with no hope of keeping it out.

Jewell immediately brought on Nathan Miles in place of the hardworking Dan Smith and moved Gault further forward to try and find an equaliser.

For all their plugging away, it didn't look like Hassocks would find a way through and Steyning were just eight minutes from bringing the reigning County League champions to the Shooting Field when O'Callaghan levelled.

Waterhouse played a corner short to Butler whose out-swinging cross was eventually poked past Ford by O'Callaghan.

At that point, both sides seemed content with their lot. A draw was ultimately the correct result with the right to face Hawks now to be decided in a replay at the Beacon next month.

Troak takes himself into the Hassocks One Hundred Club

Jack Troak has become a Hassocks Centurion, making his 100th appearance for the Robins in their Sussex Senior Cup second round clash with Eastbourne Town at the Beacon.

Troak has reached the milestone in three-and-a-half seasons, during which he has been an automatic choice in the side when fit for four different Hassocks managers.

The hugely popular winger was signed by Mark Dalglish in the summer of 2019 having previously played for Eastbourne United, Lewes and Ringmer.

In his first season at the Beacon, Troak scored five times from 32 appearances primarily at left back.

That made him one of the few bright spots in a season curtailed by lockdown when Hassocks were deep in relegation trouble.

Dave John deployed Troak further forward when taking over the reins for the 2020-21 season to good

effect.

Troak plundered eight goals in 21 matches to finish another campaign shortened by Covid-19 as the Robins' second highest scorer behind Charlie Pitcher.

One of the first things Brad Sweetman did as Hassocks head coach was appoint Troak club captain ahead of the 2021-22 season.

Troak had to wait several months to wear the armband as a hernia problem kept him on the sidelines for most of the opening four months.

Prior to his return in mid-November, Hassocks had spent the entire campaign in the bottom three.

But with Troak back in the team, relegation fears were soon banished. The Robins ended up nine points clear of the bottom two, at the same time of embarking on a memorable run to the semi finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

Even though Hassocks were beaten by treble winners

Littlehampton Town, Troak wrote himself a small piece of Robins history by being only the fifth player to captain the club in a senior semi final.

To cap a memorable 2021-22, Troak finished second in the vote for Supporters' Player of the Season to Dan Turner.

That reflects the esteem in which Troak is held by Hassocks fans for his ability, his work rate and his infectious attitude.

Current head coach James Westlake clearly values those attributes too.

Troak has made 24 appearances for Hassocks in the 2022-23 season so far, more than any other player. He has scored seven times.

That gives Troak an overall Robins record of 100 games and 30 goals, leaving him 22nd on the all-time top scorers list.

Congratulations on your century, Jack - and here is to the next 100.

Four goals fire Benson to November Player of the Month

Liam Benson scored four goals in three games to help Hassocks navigate November unbeaten and earn the striker his second Robins Player of the Month award of the season.

Benson also took the crown back in September and has now scored 11 times in 23 appearances, leaving him just two short of his most prolific campaign in a Hassocks shirt with the season only at its halfway point.

November got off to an excellent start for Benson when he bagged a brace in a 2-0 win over Bexhill United at the Beacon.

He opened the scoring with 62 minutes played, expertly finishing a one-on-one after being sent clear of a Pirates defence who were left all at sea by a JJ Minty through ball.

Benson's second of the afternoon came via a poacher's finish in the final minute of normal time, enabling the Robins to leapfrog Bexhill and climb to sixth in the Premier Division standings.

With Phil Johnson and Pat Harding absent for Hassocks' next fixture a

fortnight later at home to Lingfield, Benson shouldered the responsibility of leading the line alongside Under 23s top scorer Danny Reid.

The Lingers had taken an early lead when Benson struck his third goal of November, firing a rebound home clinically after an Alex Bygraves header from a Joe Bull corner had somehow been blocked on the line.

Benson rounded off his excellent November by scoring the third Hassocks goal in the 5-1 demolition of Saltdean United, volleying home after a clever short corner routine involving Bull and Harding.

He also put enough pressure on Josh James to force the Tigers goalkeeper into punching into his own net for the Robins' fourth as Hassocks went about scoring five times in the space of 24 first half minutes.

Harvey Blake was another player who enjoyed himself against Saltdean with the strength of his showing pushing him into second in November Player of the Month.

Blake assisted the opener on six minutes with a beautiful floated cross

met by a Harding diving header, setting the tone for an afternoon in which he caused no end of problems for the Tigers defence charging forward from right back.

A performance worthy of the Bedlam Brewery Starman award against Lingfield was Blake's first outing of November having missed the Bexhill win at a wedding.

Sam Rogers makes his first appearance in a Player of the Month top three having taken the opportunity to establish himself in the midfield engine room during November.

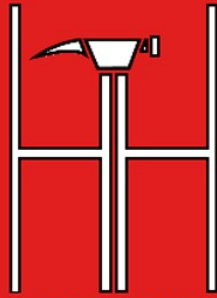

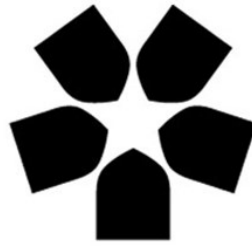

Hassocks left to wonder what might have been following Senior Cup exit to Town

Sussex Senior Cup Second Round

Tuesday 6th December 2022, The Beacon

Hassocks 0-1 Eastbourne Town

As the final game to be played in the second round of the Sussex Senior Cup, Hassocks and Eastbourne Town knew that a home tie with Bexhill United awaited the winners of their clash at the Beacon.

Both had beaten the Pirates in the past month - Hassocks in the league, Town in the FA Vase - and would therefore have viewed a meeting with Bexhill as a winnable tie to book quarter final place.

Hassocks have only ever gone that far in the competition three times in their history.

Chances such as this to advance to the last eight have been few and far between since the Robins first entered the Senior Cup in 1982.

For that reason - as well as missing out on a potentially lucrative tie with one of the big clubs of Sussex football at the quarter final stage - their exit via a 1-0 defeat has to go down as a missed opportunity.

Hassocks sit above both Bexhill and Town in the current Southern Combination League standings, although not by much in the case of their Senior Cup vanquishers.

Town are four points and four places below Hassocks with a game in hand. That closeness in the table was reflected in a tight game, one which the Robins lost as much as the visitors won.

The only goal arrived on 13 minutes and was a poor one for Hassocks to concede. A corner was flicked on far too easily by one free man at the front post towards the back post, where Town captain Frankie Chappell had also been left completely free to head home.

Chappell's goal came against the run of play. The Robins had started strongly and could have gone ahead twice in the opening five minutes.

Harvey Greig attempted to clear a Jack Troak cross, only to slice the ball up into the air and against his own crossbar.

Troak then delivered a whipped ball to Liam Benson who outjumped Chappell but put a powerful header just a little too high.

Town enjoyed their best spell after taking the lead. They encamped in the Hassocks half with lots of possession without ever really threatening to double their advantage.

The closest the visitors came was on 35 minutes. Anesu Sisimayi got away down the right and his low pull back found James Waters well placed front and centre of the goal around 15 yards out.

Luckily for the Robins, Waters lent back as he struck and the ball was last seen flying through the cold night sky towards Hurstpierpoint.

Hassocks raised their game back to the levels they had shown at the start after that let off.

Troak came close to marking his 100th appearance in a Robins shirt with something special, cracking a strike from a full 30 yards which cannoned off the bar with Chris Winterton beaten.

Hassocks hit the woodwork for a third time 10 minutes after the restart, this time through Phil Johnson.

Tom Frankland and Harvey Blake linked up nicely down the right. The latter fed a pass to Johnson who stepped inside his man and smashed one from outside the area. It clipped the bar and went out for a goal kick.

The Robins' next chance also came to Johnson. Troak delivered a cross after scampering down the left but Johnson did not get the connection he was looking for and his headed effort dribbled meekly wide of the post.

Most of the Beacon thought Town had a second on 70 minutes when a Blake clearance unfortunately hit Bradley Tighe, falling kindly to Leon Greig.

Greig hit a powerful volley that seemed destined for the bottom



corner until Joe Southam somehow turned the ball around the post at full stretch.

It was an extraordinary save from the teenager, who impressed again deputising for Alex Harris.

And it really should have provided a platform for Hassocks to go on and find an equaliser as they created a series of decent opportunities in the last 20 minutes.

Pat Harding had not long been introduced as the Robins went three up front when he found himself in a foot race to a ball over the top with Winterton. The Town goalkeeper just got there first to snatch the ball ahead of the stretching Harding.

Raging Bull started a particularly dramatic final five minutes with a quickly taken free kick which released Blake into acres of space down the right.

Blake opted for a high and hard cross from a decent angle which nobody was able to connect with. A low ball drilled in with the potential to hit any of the plethora of Hassocks and Town legs in the box appeared the better option.

Johnson then saw a goalbound effort blocked by some heroic, desperate defending from Jack Murphy, who got a little carried away by hacking down Blake seconds later.

Bull sent in a dangerous delivery from the set piece which represented the last kick of the game.

Not for the first time, no Hassocks play could get a touch to turn it towards goal and so the Robins' Senior Cup adventure was at an end. Who knows what might have been?

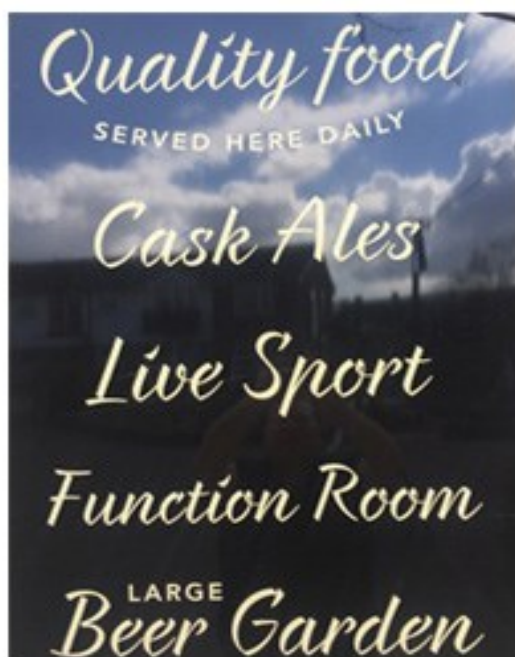

Faith and Gault decide turgid Mid Sussex Derby in favour of Hassocks

December 26th 2007: After weeks of build up, the first ever competitive Mid Sussex Derby between Hassocks and St Francis Rangers took place at the Beacon

The eagerly-anticipated first ever Mid Sussex derby between Hassocks and St Francis Rangers failed to live up to expectations with the Robins doing just about enough to come out on top, winning 2-0 at the Beacon.

Seasoned derby watchers amongst a bumper crowd of 280 would not have been surprised. Games like these often struggle to match the hype because of the closeness and familiarity of the players involved.

That certainly seemed to be the case here with both sides seemingly more scared of losing than they were intent on winning.

Hopefully, derby day two or three times down the line will serve up a better treat more comparable to the clashes of a decade ago between Hassocks and Burgess Hill Town which have since taken on almost mythical status.

Home boss Dave John felt his side just shaded it through their experience and being physically stronger, particularly at the back.

Opposite number Danny Bryan agreed, but with the caveat that his side are learning every week in their first ever County League Division One campaign and that they were their own worst enemies in conceding two soft goals.

Still, Rangers sit one point short of Bryan's Christmas target of 30, set at the start of campaign. He will now want to push on and reach the magic 40 mark as soon as possible.

That survival total is always John's first priority, even though he is now comfortable enough to rate the Robins as top six material.

Hassocks had a gameplan to stifle Rangers playmaker Geoff Pitcher and cut off service to leading scorer Sam Jeremiah. They were effective at that but the rest of their performance was below par compared to normal

standards.

Winning when not playing particularly well is said to be the sign of a good team however, and that is what the Robins did on a Boxing Day morning with weather more akin to mid-Spring.

John felt Hassocks should have had a penalty as early as the first minute when Laurence Robinson was clipped when goal side.

In fairness to referee James Slaney, he was miles away from the incident as it came about via a huge punt out of defence from Ashley Marsh.

John also said Mr Slaney failed to let the game flow. That was true in the first half - and he would not be the first referee to let common sense go out the window when being assessed - but you could see after the break he was trying to allow play to continue as much as possible.

The problem being players from both sides were in determined mood to pick up a late Christmas card, reflected in five bookings. Rangers defenders Ben Palmer and Dan O'Farrell could have no complaints in particular.

Other than Robinson's penalty shout, Rangers enjoyed the better of the opening exchanges until a goal out of the blue for Hassocks with 18 minutes played.

Elliott Butler failed to clear effectively from a Robins short corner routine, allowing Stuart Faith to come racing into the box and get the all-important touch to beat Simon Lehkyj via a slight deflection.

A strong Sam Fisk run ended with a shot that did not unduly test Lehkyj on 27 minutes. Soon after and Chris Maynard enjoyed a purple patch at the other end.

In the space of four minutes, he set up the lively Luke Leppard for one of Rangers' only clear cut chances, crossed for Jeremiah to head over on

the stretch and then hit the bar with a superb direct free kick.

A dubious free kick on the other side of the pitch followed which Pitcher tested Joel Harding from. Phil Gault then hit left the Rangers woodwork rattling after his half volley cross on the turn bent onto the bar.

Hassocks were improved after the break and began to show a little more going forward. Robinson and Gault both missed chances before the two were involved in the best untaken opportunity of the game.

Gault crossed brilliantly from the right and Robinson only needed to make contact in the centre of the goal. Unfortunately for Robinson, he completely missed the ball.

Rangers enjoyed a bright spell after the let off with Harding needing to show smart reactions to thwart Jeremiah after a neat turn.

For the second time in the game, Rangers managed to concede when on top as the Robins took advantage of some poor defending to kill the game off.

A gaping hole appeared in the visiting back line and that left Lehkyj badly exposed as he came out to challenge Robinson.

The Rangers goalkeeper looked the favourite to get there first and so he would have been disappointed to lose out to Robinson.

Credit though to the tall Hassocks striker for keeping a cool head and finding Gault who finished for a goal against his former club.

There was no way back for Rangers in the 17 minutes remaining, even as former Robins youth team captain Terry Gacias was introduced in a late attempt to fashion something.

The closest Gacias came against his old teammates was a well struck shot Harding did well to hold even if it were directly above the Hassocks goalkeeper's head.

Roffey this season

Last season's Division One title winning manager Andy Lampard taking a break from football followed by Roffey's attempts to replace him attracted a lot of unwanted publicity and struggle on the pitch at the start of the season. Jack Munday is the latest man in the hotseat having been appointed last month and he has managed to coax back some of Lampard's squad, which may yet give them a shot at escaping the bottom two. They are still yet to win a league game, but draws with Loxwood and Eastbourne United offer encouragement.

Head-to-head

There have been just two previous

games between ourselves and Roffey. The Boars won 5-1 here in the Peter Bentley League Cup in September 2021, a result that did not come as a great surprise even though Roffey were a division below us at the time. Our Bank Holiday August meeting was a much pleasanter experience ending in a 7-0 victory.

Last time we met

It was 4-0 before half time in that clash at the Beacon four months ago. A Phil Johnson double, an own goal and an early Jack Troak effort had us in total command. We took out foot off the gas in the second half but still managed to add another three in the final 10 minutes through Alex Bygraves, Sam Smith and tall striker

Jamie Wilkes.

How to get to Bartholomew Way

The Theatre of Trees could well rival the Beacon as one of the most picturesque grounds in the Southern Combination League. It is quite a straightforward journey; take the A23 to the Pease Pottage turnoff and then follow the A264 towards Horsham. At the fourth roundabout for Ruser, take the first exit on Ruser Road for Roffey. Turn left at the next roundabout onto Lemmington Way and another left when you reach the end of the road to join Bartholomew Way. The ground is at the end of the road, where you can enjoy a drink on their wooden patio... although maybe not alcoholic with the game kicking off at 11am.

AFC Uckfield Town this season

The Oakmen were one of the many Southern Combination league sides to instigate a managerial change in the summer, bringing in Jonny Elwood to replace Steve Ives. Having previously coached at Whitehawk, Tonbridge Angels and Crowborough Athletic, Elwood arrived with a wealth of contacts which he put to good use in building a young but talented squad. As is often the case at this level when using younger players, results have been inconsistent and Uckfield sit 15th in the table. They have games in hand on every side around them however and will be eyeing a push towards the top 10 in the second half of the campaign.

Head-to-head

We have met AFC Uckfield on 20 previous occasions. The head-to-head reads 10 Hassocks wins, nine for Uckfield and only one draw. That was a 2-2 thriller at the Beacon last season in which Jordan Badger bagged a late equaliser on his first appearance for over two years. It might not be a game to put on your coupon, but it is one which normally delivers goals. 78 having been plundered at an average of nearly four per game.

Last time we met

The first Premier Division win of the James Westlake era arrived at the Oaks back in August. We came flying

out of the traps to be 2-0 ahead inside of 12 minutes through Mark Zydonik and Liam Benson. James Pass pulled one back midway through the first half but that was the end of the scoring - hardly a surprise with both teams tiring on an afternoon when the mercury hit 35 degrees.

Played for both

We have two former Oakmen in our squad who could face off with the club they played for last season. The rangy Jamie Wilkes has made himself a firm fan favourite as a hardworking tall striker whilst Sam Cash has not put a foot wrong when called upon, although his campaign has been disrupted by injury.

Eastbourne Town this season

Town bid farewell to one of the longest serving managers in the Premier when John Lambert stood down in the summer. He has been replaced by former Whitehawk boss Jude Macdonald. Under Lambert, Town had always been notoriously slow starters to the season before finding rhythm from autumn onwards. That has not happened so far, although that will hardly come as a surprise following a summer of change at the Saffrons. Town sit 11th with seven wins, five draws and five defeats to their name.

Head-to-head

It is a fixture which Eastbourne Town

tend to enjoy. Of the 39 previous matches, Town have won 24 with just nine Hassocks wins and six draws along the way. Of those nine fixtures we have won, just one has come in the past 14 years. Phil Gault scored twice and James Broadbent saved a penalty in a shock 2-1 win at the Beacon towards the end of the 2016-17 season.

Last time we met

It was 20 days ago that Town visited the Beacon in the Sussex Senior Cup. Frankie Chappell scored the only goal of the game with 13 minutes played to send MacDonald's side through to a third round meeting against Bexhill United.

How to get to the Saffrons

The normal route to Eastbourne via the A27 and the A2770, following the road towards Eastbourne town centre. Turn right into The Goffs just before reaching the main station followed by an immediate left into Southfields Road. That is followed by another right into Dittons Road with the Saffrons on the left at the end of the road.

Played for both

We have two former Town players in our ranks who could face their former club. Sam Smith started his career at the Saffrons and JJ Minty had a brief spell with Town at the start of the current campaign.

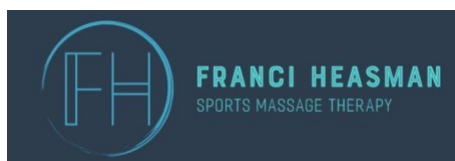

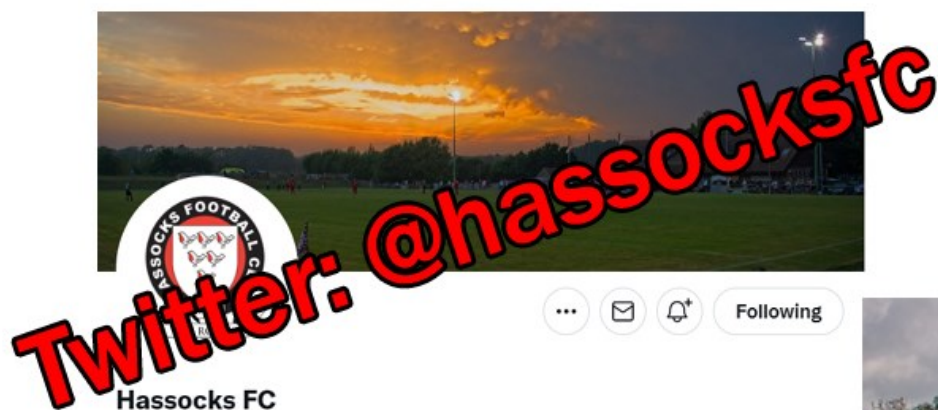

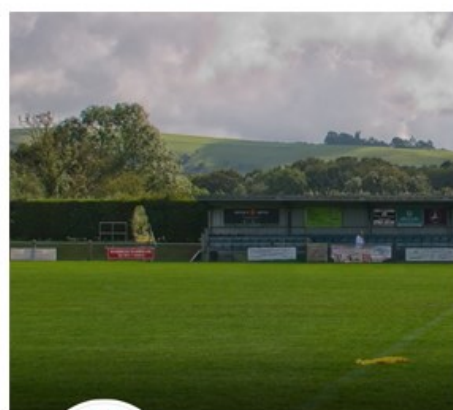
