### Welcome to the Beacon



Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon THE ROBINS as we kick off a hectic run of February fixtures starting today against Alfold

### We would like to welcome the players management, committee and fans of Alfold and hope they enjoy their stay with us in Mid Sussex.

Today represents our first home game in over a month thanks to the freezing weather of January with matches against Peacehaven & Telscombe and Horsham YMCA both postponed.

Those two fixtures have been rearranged for Tuesday 21st and Tuesday 28th February respectively; but don't worry if you are struggling to keep up with where and when we are in action this month as a full list is provided in this afternoon's programme.

Plenty had happened since our last home game here against AFC Uckfield Town on Saturday 7th January, which ended up being an excellent start to 2023.

Goals from JJ Minty, Liam Benson and Joe Bull secured a 3-0 victory in a much improved performance from the Boxing Day meeting with Steyning Town.

We then had an enforced break of three weeks off before last Saturday's 2-1 defeat away at Broadbridge Heath.

Both sides looked a little rusty at the Countryside Stadium. We still managed to give a good account of ourselves however with positives to take in worrying opponents who are sure to be right in the title mix at the end of the season.

There has been a lot of football played by our other teams this past month, which is remarkable really given how other matches had been lost to the weather.

24 hours after the men had beaten Uckfield and the ladies picked up a 3-2 home win over Bognor Regis Town.

Katherine Chappell continued her astonishing form with a 22nd goal of the season from seven appearances. She was joined on the scoresheet by Kirsten Mair and Mia Pordage.

A week later and they went to Saltdean United. Missing four regulars and with a bare 11, they could be very pleased to come away with a 1-1 draw. Jo Brown scored the only goal of the game, her first for the club.

On the same day that the ladies saw off Bognor, the Veterans were 5-2 winners over Jarvis Brook. Five different players were on target; Paul Armstrong, Dave Juniper, Jonathan Bundy, Craig Beckwith and Adam

Waller to secure a first win of the season.

The Under 18s kicked off their 2023 against St Francis Rangers in the Dennis Probee Sussex Under 18 Cup on Sunday 15th January in a game switched from Colwell Road to the Beacon. It finished 2-2 after extra time with Sean Fernley's young Robins progressing 4-3 on penalties.

2-2 was also the score last Sunday in the League Cup down at Selsey, followed by more penalty drama as we eliminated the Blues 4-2 on spot kicks.

The Under 23s have only played once since the turn of the year, when goals from Phil Gault and Sam Geard saw off Chessington & Hook United 2-0 at the Beacon last Thursday night.

Our next first time game here is in two weeks time against Little Common, kicking off at 2pm.

Before then, the Under 18s host Worthing United tomorrow at 11am, the Under 23s are at East Preston on Thursday and next Sunday sees the Under 18s host Saltdean United and the Ladies in local derby action against Burgess Hill Town.

### Alfold and Roffey have been the Premier Division's bottom two for almost the entire season - but new managers have given both hope of escaping the mire

Alfold took the shrewd decision to appoint Dorking Wanderers director of football Jordan Clark in November. been collected since Clark's arrival, including wins over Saltdean United, AFC Uckfield Town and a 7-3 victory

Clark has been instrumental in the remarkable rise of Wanderers into the National League, working full time at Meadowbank with a range of responsibilities including overseeing their academy and managing the B Team in Division One of the Southern Combination League.

He wasted no time in making his mark at Fold, bringing in several new faces to mix with the impressive young players already at the Elliott Scott Group Stadium in the Under 18s and Under 23s.

Hassocks are only too aware of the talent Alfold possess; our Under 23s have swapped leadership of the North Division frequently with Fold throughout the season so far whilst last year, they eliminated us from the League Cup at the semi final stage on their way to winning the competition.

10 of Alfold's 14 points have

been collected since Clark's arrival, including wins over Saltdean United, AFC Uckfield Town and a 7-3 victory over Roffey last weekend, who themselves have been improving massively since just before Christmas.

Hammering the Boars in such spectacular style means Alfold will arrive here today full of confidence, whilst also having shown the rest of the Premier Division that they have goals in them.

The victory took them to within three points of Saltdean in a relegation battle which is now shaping up to be almost as tight as the title race at the top of the table.

Having been playing park football in West Sussex Division Two North as recently as 2013, Alfold were never going to give up their Premier Division status earned by climbing five divisions in six years.

They will provide dangerous opponents this afternoon for the Robins to start a busy February against.

## Three nil win gives Robins three points and three wins in a row

The long Tuesday night trip to deepest, darkest Surrey proved worth it for Hassocks as they came away from Alfold with all three points via a superb 3-0 win to make it three victories in a row

There were three different scorers and had Leon Turner opened his Hassocks account 120 seconds earlier, we would also be talking about a goal after three minutes. Three was the magic number.

Fast starts have become the Robins' calling card this week. They were 2-0 ahead inside of 12 minutes in their 2-1 win at AFC Uckfield Town on Saturday and found themselves with the same advantage after 15 minutes on a beautiful evening at the Elliot Scott Group Stadium.

The heavy rain of earlier in the day put some much needed zip onto the playing surface.

It did not take the Robins long to take the lead via a really well worked passing move. Lewis Westlake released Turner down the right. His low pass into the box was laid off to James Westlake by Liam Benson.

Turner had continued his run inside, head coach Westlake threaded the ball through a gap back to his winger who bent an effort in from a tight angle for his first Robins goal.

Alfold appealed for an offside but it was not remotely close. The hosts did benefit from several friendly flags from the assistant referee as the first half wore on however, with both Mark Zydonik and Benson seeing very tight calls go against them.

It was the in-form Benson who doubled the advantage with a quarter of an hour played.

Joel Mann and Damien Fortune in the Alfold back line were having one of those evenings where everything that could go wrong, did go wrong.

The worst piece of misfortune was suffered by Fortune after he stumbled in possession when last man.

Benson ruthlessly took advantage, running clear with the ball and clinically beating Sebastian Jacovides in the Alfold goal.

Mann was next to suffer a mishap, missing his header from a long Alex Bygraves pass forward.

Benson again found himself clear but this time Fortune produced a magnificent saving block after covering a lot of ground.

Alfold came into the game more as an attacking force in the final 15 minutes of the first half.

Bygraves to work the space for a sight of goal. Alex Harris did well to get down to his right quickly and hold Martin's shot.

Kelvin Lucas then sped past Sam Cash and delivered a low cross into the Hassocks box. From six yards out, Martin fired over the goal, the fence and the trees in what was a major let off for the Robins.

Half time gave Hassocks the chance they needed to regroup, once they recovered from locking themselves out of their changing room.

The crowd making their way to the Clubhouse seemed to enjoy Robins assistant manager Tom Hughes appearing from the player's tunnel and shouting at the Hassocks substitutes warming up on the pitch "Who's got the key?!"

Benson had two good chances in the space of as many minutes early in the second half to score what would have been a killer third.

A strong save from Jacovides repelled a one-on-one from a difficult angle after Jack Troak had slipped Benson in.

Karim Elmellas became the latest Alfold player to produce a heavy touch under pressure from Benson.

That enabled Benson to again race towards Jacovides but this time the Hassocks forward cleared the bar with his shot.

Rampaging Joe Bull was replaced by tall striker Jamie Wilkes on 63 as Hassocks sought to test the hosts with a different threat.

It did not take the rangy Wilkes long to get involved. He had strong penalty claims controversially dismissed by referee Ian Homewood after a clumsy Mann challenge in the area.

A series of decisions from Mr Homewood followed that frustrated Hassocks, culminating in Zydonik entering the sin bin.

The Hassocks defender was Charlie Martin managed to escape caught in the face by the flailing arm of Louie Rand. When Zydonik expressed his disappointment at there being no punishment for Rand, Mr Homewood sent him to the sidelines for 10 minutes.

Hassocks had to weather a bit of a storm playing a man short. Not long into the sin bin and Westlake sacrificed Turner for Bradley Tighe to bolster the back line.

Zydonik could not have asked for a better first touch following his return to action as it was he who headed home the Robins' third.

Lewis Westlake delivered a corner which Zydonik rose highest to meet, powering home from inside the six vard box.

Alfold knew the game was up and Hassocks might have even added two more in the final five minutes.

A Phil Johnson cross was inches away from the gangling leg of Wilkes and Harvey Blake then hit a volley into orbit in a piece of play he later claimed was a deliberate bit of time wasting.

## Late drama at the Beacon as Gault wins it from the spot

### Where do you even begin with what happened between Hassocks and Alfold at the Beacon?

Two red cards for the visitors, Hassocks losing three players to injury and then a penalty in the final seconds from Phil Gault saved, retaken and scored at the second attempt ended up earning the Robins a much-needed 2-1 victory on a day of ridiculous drama.

The first of those injuries arrived before the game had even kicked off, Hassocks losing top scorer Alfie Loversidge in the warm up.

His place was taken by youth team winger Louis Thwaites, thrust in domination, during which the visitors for a full debut.

Surprisingly, Hassocks were not at all impacted by the disruption as they flew out of the traps, taking the lead with only two minutes on the clock.

For the second game running following the 5-0 midweek win over Montpelier Villa, Lewis Westlake scored a superb effort from distance after pressing a roll out from Alfold goalkeeper Andrew Osei and chipping in from 24 yards.

Unfortunately for Westlake, that was the end of his afternoon as he left proceedings minutes later as the Robins' second injury.

Lucas Tyrrell then joined him after a nasty collision with Osei. Both players were entitled to go for the ball, it was just unfortunate that Tyrrell came off worse and had to be helped from the field.

Jordan Badger and Josh Hawkes are both feeling their way back to match fitness, so they probably could have done without playing for well over an hour once Westlake and Tyrrell departed.

Hassocks did well to cope with the chaos in their ranks and although they struggled to create too many first half opportunities, they crucially kept Alfold at bay for the most part.

On the one occasion where the

visitors had a sight of goal, Alex Harris pulled off one of the best saves the Beacon has seen for a very lona time.

It looked to all the world like Sam Lemon was going to score from point blank range but somehow, Harris managed to stick out a strong hand and turn the effort over the bar.

The second half took a while to heat up, sparking into life when Alfold equalised with 63 minutes on the clock. It was an excellent goal from Lemon, cutting inside from the left channel and bending a sweet effort into the top corner.

That led to a brief period of Alfold looked the most likely winners.

Hassocks were again indebted to Harris when he pushed another effort from close range over the bar, this time from Kelvin Lucas.

Harris' heroics suddenly seemed to inspire the Robins and they ended the game back on top, led by the driving runs of Jack Troak who had taken over from the hard working Thwaites.

Osei was called into action when he managed to get his leg onto Josh Short's effort from six yards out, just doing enough to see the ball trickle wide of the post after good link up between Gault and James Westlake.

Alfold were reduced to 10 men when Mitch Clark made a lazy trip on Short in the middle of the park to pick up a second booking.

Dan Turner then met a beautiful free kick delivered into the box from out wide with a towering header which beat Osei.

Not one Alfold player appealed for liking. offside as Turner had come from at least 10 yards on.

The linesman though concluded that somebody in red had strayed and so the goal was controversially chalked off.

The game was by now entering its final five minutes and it looked like (used), Loversidge, Parker (unused). Hassocks' chance of winning it had

aone.

Alfold were content to sit back and take a point, as you might expect given their numerical disadvantage and that they are in the midst of a poor run of form.

Short though had other ideas and in the fourth minute of time added on, he embarked on a mesmerising run, jinking past three players and into the penalty area.

Osei came charging off his line and unlike that first half challenge on Tyrrell, got his timing all wrong as he completely missed the ball and wiped Short out.

A penalty was the only outcome but Osei redeemed himself with a superb full length save to his left to push Gault's spot kick onto the post.

The linesman who had spotted that offside which nobody else witnessed minutes earlier this time saw that Osei had left his line to make the stop and so Gault was given a second bite of the cherry.

A deathly hush descended from everyone except Osei, who did his best to put Gault off.

The veteran was not going to make the same mistake twice however and he scored with the last kick of the game to give Hassocks back-to-back wins for the first time under Brad Sweetman.

Whilst the Robins players celebrated with their young supporters behind the goal, Osei managed to talk himself into a red card for dissent after the full time whistle for continuing his protest against the retake far too vehemently for referee Joshua Langley-Fineing's

## Benson adds December Player of the Month to his growing collection

### It is turning into quite the 2022-23 season for Liam Benson, who picked up his third Hassocks Player of the Month award of the campaign in December.

The striker was also victorious in September and November. No player has ever been named Player of the Month four times in a single campaign before, giving Benson a little bit of history to aim at between now and April.

Results wise, it was something of a disappointing month for Hassocks. Two games lost to the freezing weather meant the Robins only completed three matches, all of which ended in defeat.

Having drawn blanks in a 5-0 hammering away at Midhurst & Easebourne and when exiting the Sussex Senior Cup by losing 1-0 at home to Eastbourne Town, the two goals Hassocks scored in December both came on Boxing Day against Steyning Town.

Benson was named Bedlam Brewery Starman in that game with the Barrowmen where he gave the Robins a first minute lead. Steyning defender Charlie Robinson was caught trying to play out from the back by Benson, who latched onto a loose pass and made no mistake with a low left footed effort to notch against one of his former clubs.

Benson was then heavily involved in the second Hassocks goal. He drew a good save from Barrowmen goalkeeper Lucas Szendela-Goetzke after being played in one-on-one by Harvey Blake.

The loose ball from Szendela-Gotezke's interception fell to Blake continuing his run into the box to smash home and double the advantage.

Unfortunately, Hassocks surrendered their two goal lead in the second half as Steyning battled back to win 3-2 via a 94th minute Jack Barnes goal after Robins goalkeeper Joe Southam was taken off injured.

Second place in December Player of the Month goes to Pat Harding, whose burgeoning partnership with Benson meant that Hassocks top scorer Phil Johnson started every league game on the bench in December.

The veteran proved an ideal foil

for Benson with clever approach play and lots of willing running.

It was the introduction of Super Pat in the Eastbourne Town match which led the Robins to enjoy their best spell, dominating a final 20 minutes in which they did everything but put the ball in the back of the net.

Harding's place in the top three is the first time he has been involved in a Hassocks Player of the Month award since his summer return to the Robins from Burgess Hill Town.

He missed the opening month of the campaign after breaking three ribs in pre-season but is now firmly up-to-speed and showing his quality not that the Beacon faithful need much reminding of what Super Pat brings to the table.

For the second month running, young Sam Rogers took third place. After beginning the season in the Under 23s, the midfielder had established himself in the first team squad over the past few months.

His best performance came against Eastbourne Town, where he ran the midfield against quality opponents with a showing which belied his years.

## **Hassocks face eight games** through a frantic February

Strap yourselves in for a busy February. Having played only eight games since the start of November due to the weather playing havoc with the Southern **Combination League, Hassocks** will now face eight matches crammed into the space of four weeks.

The Robins' first two fixtures come against the Premier Division's bottom two clubs, although both have and the Tye away from home in the shown signs of improvement in recent months since pre-Christmas manager changes.

Alfold are the visitors to the Beacon this afternoon followed by Hassocks making the trip to Roffey on Tuesday night for a 7:30pm kick off.

It will be the Robins' first ever visit to Bartholomew Way for a competitive fixture.

Hassocks won the earlier meeting at the Beacon 7-0 on Bank Holiday Monday with the Boars being muchchanged since that day following the appointment of new boss Jack Munday.

The Robins will then visit the Sunshine Coast twice in the space of 72 hours. Eastbourne United away lies in wait on Saturday 11th with

Valentine's Day spent at Eastbourne Town on Tuesday 14th.

Kick off is at 7:30pm for those Hassocks fans planning to treat their lucky partners to a night at the Saffrons.

Back-to-back home games follow against Little Common on Saturday 18th starting at 2pm and Peacehaven & Telscombe on Tuesday 21st.

Hassocks lost to both Common opening two months of the campaign.

Saturday 25th will see the Robins reunited with former head coach Brad United at home tomorrow in the Sweetman and a whole host of explayers who have followed him to Saltdean United over the past six months.

That one gets underway at 3pm at Hill Park and will be the third meeting of the campaign between the off February for the Ladies tomorrow clubs.

The Robins triumphed 5-1 in November's league game with the Sussex Senior Cup clash between the sides a month earlier ending in a 2-2 draw after 90 minutes. Hassocks went onto progress to round two on penalties.

February is rounded off with game eight, the rearranged fixture with

Horsham YMCA on Tuesday 28th at 7:45pm.

Hassocks won a six-goal thriller 4-2 at the Herbert Direct Stadium in September, only their fourth league win at Gorings Mead this century.

There are currently two Under 23s games scheduled for February. Roffey were due to visit the Beacon on Thursday night with a trip to East Preston in the League Cup on Thursday 9th. Kick off is 7:30pm at the Lashmar for that one.

The Under 18s host Worthing second round of the Dennis Probee Youth Cup followed by a home Central Division fixture against Saltdean on Sunday 19th. Both start at 11am.

A League Cup quarter final kicks away at Saltdean.

The Robins then have three consecutive home games, hosting Burgess Hill Town on Sunday 12th, Shoreham on Sunday 19th and Pagham on Sunday 26th all at 2pm.

And last but by no means least, the Veterans travel to Rotherfield tomorrow for their one February fixture.









## **Thompson signs scholarship** with Point University Skyhawks

### **Hassocks Under 23s** goalkeeper Callum Thompson is headed to the United States after signing a scholarship with Point University.

The teenager will move to West Point, Georgia in 2023 and combine studying with playing for the Skyhawks soccer programme.

Thompson joined the Robins in the summer having spent last season playing for a combination of Sutton Common Rovers, Redhill and Loxwood.

Thompson had caught the eye of Hassocks head coach James Westlake when Westlake was assistant to Spencer Slaughter at Loxwood.

Westlake subsequently brought Thompson to the Beacon after a brief dalliance with AFC Varndeanians.

He was immediately installed as number one by Neil Parker in the Under 23s whilst also providing competition for Alex Harris in the first team.

Thompson started the opening seven games of the Under 23s season times ahead. Looking forward to before suffering a nasty shoulder dislocation and fracture in the final three minutes of a 6-2 win at Horsham YMCA in early October.

Before injury struck and caused an enforced break in his season, Thompson had impressed with his shot stopping ability and speed and agility between the posts.

He kept three clean sheets against Roffey, St Francis Rangers and reigning Southern Combination League Under 23 North Division champions Broadbridge Heath.

Five of the seven games Thompson played in were won as the Robins made a strong start a campaign in which they have not dropped out of the top three so far.


All three shutouts recorded by Thompson came in Hassocks victories whilst he also tasted success away at Chessington & Hook United and in the YM game where he was injured.

> Having come forward to join the attack, Broomfield was faster than a whippet to latch onto the loose ball ahead of Manderson, sweeping a low cross back to the waiting Minty who fired into the empty net from a matter of yards.

Hassocks should have doubled the lead on 37 minutes. Harvey Blake embarked on a dancing run down the right followed by a pinpoint cross which Benson headed wide.

Uckfield had done little to trouble the home defence and you sensed that a second goal for the Robins would kill the tie.

After plenty of huffing and puffing at the start of the second half, it eventually arrived with 66 minutes played.

Mike Williamson sent a free kick into the box. Broomfield had been left totally unmarked but contrived to completely miss the ball at an admittedly awkward height between head and knee.

Not that it mattered. Sam Rogers had made a darting run to the far post and he was able to hook across the goal line for Benson to bundle home.

That moved Benson onto 13 for the season, pulling him level with Johnson at the top of the scoring charts.

There was no opportunity for Johnson to add to his own total as he made way for Phil Gault three minutes later, part of a double change which also saw Westlake introduce himself into midfield in place of Rogers.

A runout of over 20 minutes was



the most game time assistant head coach Gault has enjoyed for over a year and he put it to good use by creating the Robins' third and final goal in injury time.

Gault collected possession from a short throw routine near the Uckfield by-line, turned his man and delivered the perfect cross hung up towards the back post.

A darting run from Joe Bull saw him escape the attentions of Alfie Dennis to power home a header from eight vards.

It was Bull's first goal of the season and came just 10 minutes after he had come off the bench to take over from Minty.

Uckfield defender George Cook saw red with seconds remaining to complete a busy day for referee Brendan Jones, who booked seven Hassocks players.

Johnson, Bygraves, Troak, Westlake, Rogers, Williamson and Broomfield were the guilty parties, leaving the Robins likely to find themselves in hot water with the Sussex County FA - the only negative on an otherwise super start to the new year.

### Defeat at high-flying Bears in first game for three weeks harsh on spirited Hassocks

Having gone three weeks without a competitive game, Hassocks could not have faced a much tougher return to Southern Combination League action than a trip to high-flying Broadbridge Heath.

And the Bears showed why they have lost only three times and not dropped out of the Premier Division's top four all season, resisting a spirited second half Hassocks performance to secure a 2-1 victory at the Countryside Stadium.

Speaking afterwards, James Westlake felt his side worthy of a draw.

To help his squad through the busy period, Westlake is hoping to add two new faces by the time Alfold arrive at the Beacon next Saturday.

Hassocks have also been boosted by the return of Alfie Loversidge after long-term injury which, to throw in a favourite football cliché, will be akin to a new signing.

Loversidge's introduction from the bench at half time was his first action bar two runouts for the Under 23s since the 3-0 defeat away at Peacehaven & Telscombe on the opening day of the campaign.

He wasted little time in reminding everyone of the talents that made him one of the stars of last season, being central to most of the good stuff Hassocks did as they attempted to overturn the two goal lead Heath had taken just before half time.

The Bears' first came on 36 minutes when Ryan Brackpool met a pinpoint corner with a bullet near post header giving Joe Southam no chance of keeping it out.

Young Southam then fumbled a shot from the edge of the box which allowed the onrushing Charlie Parmiter to put the loose ball into the empty net three minutes before the break.

Those goals came something out of the blue. The opening half hour had very much looked like a game between two sides who had not played a massive amount of football since the turn of the year with no chances worthy of note being created.

The second half though was a different story. Hassocks were clearly fired up by whatever Westlake had said at the interval and with Loversidge on the pitch, they looked more much progressive in attacking areas.

Loversidge's first involvement came within 30 seconds of the restart.

Raging Joe Bull went on a charge down the left ended with a cross into the box which found Loversidge in acres of space.

The chance though had come too quickly off the bench for the young midfielder, whose rustiness was evidenced when he put his shot straight at Heath goalkeeper Alfie Hadfield.

Creating their first good opportunity of the match seemed to give Hassocks confidence and helped set the tone for the remainder of a half in which the Robins pushed and pushed.

Two more changes helped to intensify the momentum Hassocks were building, Westlake introducing himself into the action along with assistant head coach Phil Gault.

Hassocks got the goal they deserved on 79 minutes. Loversidge embarked on a really good run into the box, where despite being clattered by a number of Heath defenders he managed to remain



upright.

That was until Hadfield came rushing from his line with enough contact finally being made on Loversidge to convince referee Oliver Westgate to point to the spot.

Despite a delay in the taking of the penalty, Phil Johnson kept a cool head and slotted the ball under the body of Hadfield for his 14th goal of the season.

Sensing an equaliser within their grasp and wanting the game to restart as soon as possible, several Hassocks players went to retrieve the ball which Hadfield had grabbed and was now refusing to let go off.

This resulted in handbags at dawn and a melee in the goal during which Hadfield pushed Westlake into the side netting, receiving a red card from Mr Westgate for his troubles.

Hassocks now had 10 minutes of plus stoppage time in which to find a leveller against a Heath outfit down to 10 men and with an outfield player having taken over between the sticks.

It very much looked like game on. Heath though to their credit used the red card in the right way, refocussing and battening down the hatches.

The Robins did plenty of huffing and puffing but could find no way through in the time remaining, leaving them to return home empty handed.

Hassocks though held firm even with a bare 11 and indeed nearly found a winner themselves when a typically mazy run from Jess Craig was halted by some top defender.


Skipper Stevens was alert twice in the final minutes, firstly conceding a corner and then blocking an effort on goal to ensure it finished 1-1.

### Spinks strike earns point but it could have been more

**February 4th 2020:** Hassocks and Saltdean United met on a freezing cold Tuesday evening at Hill Park for a fixture that looked pivotal in the battle to avoid relegation into Division One

### On a big night in the Southern Combination League Premier Division relegation battle, nothing could separate Saltdean United and Hassocks as they played out a 1-1 draw at a freezing Hill Park.

This was a game that neither side could afford to lose. Both got their wish in that regard, but by full time they could also both have laid justifiable claims to being worthy of three points.

The hosts had more of the ball but were only able to force Charlie Pugh into one meaningful save.

Hassocks by contrast had to defend for their lives at times and yet managed to miss three glorious chances to add to Alex Spinks' first half volley. It was a strange evening.

An important one, too. Saltdean and Hassocks weren't the only sides in the bottom six meeting as some 27 miles to west, 16th placed East Preston were hosting 18th placed Pagham at the Lashmar.

That went the way of the visitors as Pagham made it three wins in a row to climb out of the relegation zone for the first time this season.

The Lions are now four points clear of Hassocks having played a game more. The gap between the Robins and EP is down to five with Hassocks having three game in hand.

Saltdean stay eight ahead having played twice more while Lingfield's 3-0 defeat at Lancing dropped them to 18th, two points better off than the Robins.

There will no doubt be plenty more twists and turns to come in what is shaping up to be an intriguing fight to avoid the drop into Division One.

Should Hassocks be successful in doing so, then they will look back on this as a valuable point.

Little of note happened in the opening 15 minutes, save for the

crowd admiring Hassocks' cheery new yellow away kit and taking in the surprise return of James Westlake to first team duty.

Westlake has spent the past couple of months combining appearances for the Under 23s with his running commitments and this was his first game of senior football since December 2018.

It took just 26 minutes for Westlake to make his mark as he played a part in the Hassocks goal.

Some neat play down the right between Westlake, Dan Stokes and Liam Benson earned a throw which Dan Turner came forward to launch into the box.

Turner's trebuchet caused chaos and with Saltdean unable to effectively clear their lines, Spinks was on hand to crash a crisp volley past home goalkeeper Billy Collings. A timely moment for the Hassocks captain to score his first for the club.

Saltdean had gone ahead eight minutes earlier through Dan Perry, scoring his 27th of the season after taking advantage of some slack marking to glance home a Jack Walters cross.

22 of Perry's total were scored for Eastbourne Town earlier in the season.

Convincing one of the Premier Division's leading strikers to swap a title chase at the Saffrons for a relegation battle at Hill Park was an extraordinary piece of transfer business from the Saltdean hierarchy and one which could go a long way towards ensuring their survival.

Hassocks know only too well what a difference a talismanic marksman can make, given that they've had to do without the services of Phil Johnson for most of this season thanks to a succession of injuries.

You would certainly have backed the Robins to get all three points had Johnson been playing here with the opportunities that they created.

Three of those chances should have led to goals. There were two minutes of the first half remaining when Benson sprung the offside trap with a perfectly timed run to latch onto Jack Troak's through ball, but his effort was too close to Collings.

Midway through the second half and Westlake drew an excellent stop from Collings.

The loose ball fell to Benson who looked certain to roll into an empty net, only for some desperate defending from the hosts to scramble it behind for a corner.

Then in the 89th minute, Westlake had a near-identical one-on -one to Benson's first half effort kept out by Collings after the Saltdean defence misjudged Jack Troak's ball over the top.

At the other end, Pugh's only real save came on 70 minutes when Perry brilliantly played in home captain Harry Shooman but his effort from six yards out, front and centre was somehow repelled by Hassocks' young number one.

Perry himself put a free header over shortly afterwards when the Saltdean right back hung a cross up to the back post, but other than that Pugh had a largely quiet evening save for expertly gathering a couple of set piece deliveries.

His unemployment was largely down to the efforts of his defenders. For all Saltdean's possession, they struggled to find a way past Hassocks' two best players on the night – Turner who headed everything and Will Broomfield who turned into a one-man blocking machine.

### **Roffey v Hassocks**

Our first trip to Bartholomew Way for a competitive game comes with Roffey occupying the bottom spot they have spent all season in - but a managerial change and some improved performances have given hope of a great escape

### **Roffey this season**

Last season's Division One title winning manager Andy Lampard taking a break from football followed by Roffey's attempts to replace him attracted a lot of unwanted publicity and struggle on the pitch at the start of the season. Jack Munday is the latest man in the hotseat having been appointed last month and he has managed to coax back some of Lampard's squad, which may yet give them a shot at escaping the bottom two. They are still yet to win a league game, but draws with Loxwood, Eastbourne United, Horsham YMCA and AFC Varndeanians offer encouragement.

### Head-to-head

There have been just two previous games between ourselves and Roffey. The Boars won 5-1 here in the Peter Bentley League Cup in September 2021, a result that did not come as a great surprise even though Roffey were a division below us at the time. Our Bank Holiday August meeting was a much pleasanter experience ending in a 7-0 victory.

#### Last time we met

It was 4-0 before half time in that clash at the Beacon five months ago. A Phil Johnson double, an own goal and an early Jack Troak effort had us in total command. We took our foot off the gas in the second half but still managed to add another three in the final 10 minutes through Alex Bygraves, Sam Smith and tall striker Jamie Wilkes.

#### How to get to Bartholomew Way

It is quite a straightforward journey to the Theatre of Trees; take the A23 to the Pease Pottage turnoff and then follow the A264 towards Horsham. At the fourth roundabout for Rusper, take the first exit on Rusper Road for Roffey. Turn left at the next roundabout onto Lemmington Way and another left when you reach the end of the road to join Bartholomew Way. The ground is at the end of the road, where you can enjoy a drink on their infamous wooden patio.

We hope you like trips to Eastbourne! We visit the Sunshine Coast twice in the space of 72 hours, the first game coming against Eastbourne United at the Oval - a venue we used to like visiting but not so much in recent times

#### Eastbourne United this season

Anthony Storey was appointed as United boss following a slow start to the 2021-22 season and there has been no looking back from there really. United climbed from the fringes of the relegation battle to a final finishing position of fifth, their highest since being crowned champions in 2008-09. They have continued in that vein this season, sitting fifth in the table with 13 wins, five draws and five defeats from 23 games. A title charge is probably off the cards with Crawley Down 13 points ahead but they will fancy their chances of bettering last year's finish.

The Robins just about lead the head-

leaving 13 draws from the 45 meetings between the clubs. Our record is helped hugely by the fact that we seemed to love visiting the Oval in the 2010s, winning on all six visits we made even though we only finished above United in the Premier Division standings once in that time. Such happy times away against United are fast fading to memory with our last three trips ending in defeat.

#### Last time we met

It was one of the more entertaining 0 -0 draws you will see as both sides racked up and missed a glut of opportunities to come away with three points. The Robins felt they should have been awarded a sixth minute penalty when Leon Turner was scythed down which could have led to a very different afternoon but ultimately the spoils being shared was the right result.

#### How to get to The Oval

Take the A27 to Eastbourne, joining the A22 when you reach the Sunshine Coast. Follow that until you reach the second roundabout, turning left onto Lottbridge Drove. Turn right onto the A259 when you hit the roundabout by Homebase, then turn right into Channel View Road with The Oval a little further down on the right.

Nothing quite says Happy Valentine's Day like a Tuesday night in Eastbourne, does it? The Robins will spend the most romantic day of the year at the Saffrons in what will be the fourth attempt to get this game played

#### **Eastbourne Town this season**

Town bid farewell to one of the longest serving managers in the Premier when John Lambert stood down in the summer, replaced by former Whitehawk boss Jude Macdonald, Under Lambert, Town had always been notoriously slow starters to the season before finding rhythm from autumn onwards. This time around it has taken until the winter for Town to start their normal climb up the standings but it has now started in earnest. Having been as low as 14th when we were originally meant to go to the Saffrons in the middle of November, Town are now to seventh with 11 wins, six draws and six defeats to their name.

#### Head-to-head

It is a fixture which Eastbourne Town tend to enjoy. Of the 39 previous matches, Town have won 24 with just nine Hassocks wins and six draws along the way. Of those nine fixtures we have won, just one has come in the past 14 years. Phil Gault scored twice in a shock 2-1 win at the Beacon towards the end of the 2016-17 season.

#### Last time we met

Town visited the Beacon in the Sussex Senior Cup at the start of December. Frankie Chappell scored the only goal of the game with 13 minutes played to send MacDonald's side through to the third round.

#### How to get to the Saffrons

The normal route to Eastbourne via the A27 and the A2770, following the road towards Eastbourne town centre. Turn right into The Goffs just before reaching the main station followed by an immediate left into Southfields Road. That is followed by another right into Dittons Road with the Saffrons on the left at the end of the road.

#### **Played for both**

We have two former Town players in our ranks who could face their former club. Sam Smith started his career at the Saffrons and JJ Minty had a brief spell with Town at the start of the current campaign.


