A managerial change in November has given Loxwood fresh impetus as they look to avoid a bottom two finish for the second successive season

The Magpies appointed a very familiar name on the Southern Combination League circuit to the hotseat with Dave Altendorff taking charge at the Nest.

During his playing career, Altendorff represented some of the biggest clubs in the county before moving into coaching at Lancing where he helped the Lancers to top the Premier Division table before the season was stopped due to Covid-19.

11 of the 21 points Loxwood have collected this season have come since Altendorff arrived at Loxwood and the Magpies have also advanced to the semi finals of the Peter Bentley League Cup via victories over AFC Varndeanians and Dorking Wanderers B.

Had we not lost to Varndeanians in round two of the competition back in September, then that would have been our potential route towards the final, entailing a first ever cup meeting with Loxwood.

Whilst we have only crossed

swords at first team level in Premier Division matches since the Magpies joined the top division in 2014, there is no shortage of familiarity between the two clubs.

James Westlake had a previous spell as assistant manager at the Nest working alongside former Hassocks favourite Spencer Slaughter, with the duo leading Loxwood to the final of the Supplementary Shield in 2021.

Westlake has recruited heavily from the Magpies since taking over the reigns at the Beacon, whilst Loxwood themselves are not averse to having a former Robin or two at their club.

That should add a bit of extra spice to an afternoon where we will be looking to secure just our second ever win over Loxwood at the Beacon.

They have tended to enjoy their trips to Mid Sussex over the past decade, something the glut of ex-Magpies now in Robins red will be hoping to put right today.

Deep breath and off we go in an attempt to rattle through as many of the players to have turned out for Hassocks and Loxwood as possible.

Let us start with the current Robins squad, where **James Westlake, Lewis Westlake, Sam Smith, Leon Turner** and **Tom Frankland** are amongst the names to have represented both clubs.

Loxwood have a former Robins of their own in **Jake Lindsey**, who burst onto the scene at the Beacon as part of the treble winning 2017-18 youth team.

Lindsey has wound up at the Nest via Horsham YMCA, Crawley Down Gatwick, Hashtag United and Haywards Heath Town.

Spencer Slaughter and Josh Hawkes returned to Hassocks from Loxwood, playing small but important roles in keeping us in the Premier Division before retiring in the summer.

Charlie Pitcher, Harvey
Enticknap and Dave Carruthers all
broke into the first team at Loxwood
as teenagers before moving to the
Beacon at various stages.

Enitcknap and Carruthers are now at Crawley Down Gatwick with Pitcher having recently moved from Burgess Hill Town to Littlehampton Town.

Then we come to the three former Hassocks Under 18s captains who have joined the Magpies at various stages over the past decade.

Eddie French led Dave John's successful youth side in the late 1990s as well as captaining the Sussex, something that no other youth player from the Robins has ever achieved.

French became a regular in the

first team at the Beacon at a young age and racked up 99 appearances, scoring 10 goals.

It was not long before bigger sides came calling and French moved to Isthmian League side Horsham, where he was part of the Hornets side who faced Swansea City in the FA Cup first round.

Adam Williams captained the young Robins to their League Cup title success in 2009 and played 24 times for the first team before moving to Haywards Heath Town and later Loxwood.

Dan Stokes captained the Robins' Under 18s of 2013-14 to the Central Division title, progressing to make 172 appearances for the first team before he became one of the first signings Slaughter made when appointed Magpies manager in the summer of 2020.

Johnson and Harding help Robins swoop to rare win at the Nest

Following Hassocks on the road is rather fun at the moment. The Robins won for the fourth time on their travels from seven **Southern Combination Premier** Division away games with an excellent 2-0 win at Loxwood.

To put that into perspective, Hassocks tasted victory in five away games out of 19 last season.

In 2020-21, they managed only two before lockdown curtailed the Premier Division at the turn of the vear.

2019-20 was even more barren, a single success prior to the campaign being ended in March by the first wave of Covid outbreak.

More impressive than the improved away form are the places Hassocks are winning at.

Horsham YMCA had been a graveyard for the Robins prior to their 4-2 success there 11 days earlier, with just three league victories at the Herbert Direct Stadium since the turn of the century.

Loxwood has never been the happiest of hunting grounds either. Hassocks had won only once at the Nest before this latest success, in which precious little happened in the first 15 minutes.

As good as it got was Jack Troak launching a medium-length throw which found its way to Mike Williamson.

The midfielder unleashed an effort from distance which hit an unsuspecting Loxwood player on its way out for a corner. Said corner came to nothing.

Openings belatedly began to arrive around the midway point of the half, once Hassocks were able to get their wide players into the game.

A Harvey Blake charge from right back saw him clip a diagonal to Phil Johnson.

Johnson produced an unbelievable first touch, taking out both Loxwood centre backs only for his thumping volley to fly just wide.

Next it was the turn of a player home supporters at the Nest are familiar with the fleeting footwork of. Leon Turner spent a large portion of last season with Loxwood.

He worked wonders against his old club, beating two players down the right and cutting back to Jamie Wilkes. The tall striker was unfortunate to see his thunderbolt from 24 yards crash into the post and away to safety.

Hassocks chances kept coming. A Joe Bull corner was met by an Alex Bygraves volley blocked on the line.

Alex Harris picked out Troak on the left, Turner collected the dangerous cross in but could only fire over from close range after nifty footwork to create some space.

The Robins had strong penalty appeals waved away when Johnson was brought down by Loxwood goalkeeper Fraser Trigwell, followed shortly by the Magpies rattling the bar with a great free kick from 30 vards.

Despite the blistering end to the half, it looked like the sides would head in goalless. That was until more good distribution from Harris was flicked on by Liam Benson, sending Troak clear.

Troak gathered and composed himself, cutting the ball to Johnson who converted with the half time whistle coming seconds after the restart. It was the perfect time for Hassocks to score and the least they deserved.

Loxwood to their credit did used falling behind so late as motivation and they began the second half in strong fashion.

The Magpies should have equalised when a nice cross from out on the right found the head of the unmarked Devon Fender. He somehow headed wide.

Harris achieved the frankly ridiculously feat of entering the book for kicking the ball away when

Hassocks won a free kick.

He was joined in the yellow card club minutes later by Loxwood captain Adrian Todd.

Hassocks were handed a glorious chance to double their lead on 63 minutes. A quickly taken free kick from the rangy Wilkes put Blake in on goal, who was subsequently wiped out by Trigwell.

Troak stepped up for the resulting penalty but missed a second successive spot kick having seen his effort from 12 yards saved against Broadbridge Heath on Tuesday night.

The Robins tried to set about ensuring that miss did not prove costly.

Pat Harding entered the fray in place of Johnson and Turner danced around a series of white shirts before being denied as he was about to pull the trigger by a brilliant last ditch tackle from Igor Sokirke.

Loxwood began to enjoy their best spell after that. Harris made a strong save when a left sided corner caused issues.

Williamson then had to make a clever modern-day foul and accept the booking that came with it to break up a dangerous looking

Having weathered the storm, Hassocks wrapped up the points in the final minute. Harding raced onto a bouncing ball, opened up his body and then bent a stunning effort into the top corner for his 138th Robins goal – and first since returning from Burgess Hill Town.

There was still time for one more incident, Todd picking up a second yellow for scything down Williamson as home frustrations boiled over.

Hassocks lose out in eight goal thriller stretching winless run to 10

It is now 10 games without a victory for Hassocks as a 5-3 defeat away at high flying Loxwood condemned the Robins to their worst winless run in over a decade.

This defeat at Plaistow Road was an all too familiar story. Hassocks were going well and deservedly led 2 -1 as the clock ticked into the 40th minute. But by the time the teams were trudging off at the break, Loxwood had scored twice to flip the game on its head.

Of the 38 goals Hassocks have conceded in the league this season, 12 have come in the last five minutes of either half.

It is this alarming ability of capitulating after 40 minutes work that is really harming their cause in a season that is again beginning to look like a desperate struggle against the drop into Division One.

Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar have been busy on the transfer front in the last week in an attempt to shake their side out of this slump.

Midfielder James Westlake and goalkeeper Alex Harris have both returned to the club from Haywards Heath Town and Metropolitan Police respectively and they both started here.

The Robins could have been forgiven for looking rusty given that this was their first full game in 17 days.

Their weekend encounter with

Worthing United was abandoned at half time after an electrical problem in the village knocked out the Beacon's power supply and with it, the floodlights.

Yet any concerns about a lack of match practice were dismissed as they went ahead with just three minutes played, Bradley Bant's corner sailing straight in despite the call of "safe" from Loxwood goalkeeper Sam Smith.

The lead lasted just nine minutes, Michael Death being desperately unlucky to deflect a Josh Courtney cross past the returning Harris for an unfortunate own goal.

Smith was obviously not content with simply playing his part in giving Hassocks their opener as he did his level best to hand Spencer Slaughter a golden opportunity to make it 2-1.

The Loxwood number one came charging out of goal when it appeared fairly obvious he was not going to make it to the ball before Slaughter. Luckily for Smith, Slaughter's effort rolled just wide of the empty net.

Smith was again involved when Hassocks did retake the lead on 35 minutes.

This time, he tried to claim a Dan Jacques cross but failed to get anywhere near it after a strong challenge from Phil Gault with the ball dropping in at the far post.

Then came those two quick fire goals from the hosts. The impressive

Ollie Gill was the architect of both, firstly slipping in Jon Nurse after a rapid counter attack from a Hassocks corner and then teeing up Michael Wood to give Loxwood the lead.

Gill himself made it 4-2 five minutes after the restart with a low drive from distance.

The game was up on the hour mark when Nurse added his second of the evening and Loxwood's fifth, rounding off another counter attack despite everybody in the ground expecting the goal to be ruled out for what was a blatant offside.

Hassocks added a late third when substitute Josh Hawkes ended a goal mouth scramble from a free kick by firing home with the last kick of the game.

That was of course nothing more than another consolation, but to score three times against a side who came into the game with the joint third best defensive record in the division will at least give the Robins some hope.

They need it going into a massive six pointer on Saturday away at the side immediately above them in the table, Wick & Barnham United.

Young Robins host Hawks in County Cup big semi final

Hassocks Under 18s will host one of the strongest sides in the county in the semi finals of the Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup at the Beacon tomorrow.

The Young Robins welcome Whitehawk, who sit third in the Isthmian Youth League South Division.

Hassocks are the only remaining Southern Combination League side in the competition.

Just once before have the Robins reached the last four of the County Cup.

That came 21 years ago when a team containing the likes of Pat Harding, Joel Harding, Anthony Hibbert and Stuart Faith went onto win the trophy as part of a treble along with the North Division title and the overall crown of Sussex County Youth League Champions.

The current crop of Under 18s are in their first season together and consist of players aged between 15 and 17 from Hassocks, Hurstpierpoint and Burgess Hill.

To make the semi finals of the

County Cup from an initial pool of over 60 teams with such a young squad still learning about youth football is a fantastic achievement.

Hassocks have claimed some impressive scalps along the way. They eliminated local rivals St Francis Rangers on penalties following a 2-2 draw at the Beacon in round two in which Oliver Goswamy and Alex Wintle got the goals.

Rangers have spent the entire Central Division campaign so far above the Robins in the table and are the only challengers to runaway leaders Burgess Hill Town.

Round three saw Hassocks ease through 4-0 against Worthing United. Goswamy again netted along with George Gladding, Ed Tobias and Oliver Parker-Williams.

The quarter finals brought Newhaven to Mid Sussex, one of the better sides in the East Division.

The Robins though showed once more how much they love playing as underdogs by beating the Dockers 3-2.

Gladding notched one and Goswamy another two – remarkably all four of his goals this season have come in the competition – to set up a date with Whitehawk.

Hassocks warmed up for the semi final with a thrilling league game away at Burgess Hill on Sunday. The table topping hosts are comprised of talented players from the Russell Martin Academy.

The Robins though gave an excellent account of themselves before succumbing to a 4-3 defeat.

It was the first time Hassocks had lost in any competition since Sunday 2nd October.

Whitehawk will provide an even sterner test. The magic of the cup at any level of football however is about giant killings; Hassocks will be hoping to extend an already memorable County Cup run one game further and into the final at Culver Road.

Please do come along and support the Young Robins in their attempts to make a bit of history. Kick off is at 11am and admission is free.

Four goal win over YMCA gives Hassocks five wins from fantastic February

Southern Combination League Premier Division Tuesday 28th February 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 4-0 Horsham YMCA

With eight games crammed into four weeks, February had taken on the look of a pivotal month as Hassocks attempt to secure a top Benson, whose excellent flicked 10 Premier Division finish.

The Robins end it with five wins. one draw and one defeat. The trip to Eastbourne United was abandoned following a double leg break to opposition striker Tony Halsey and will now be replayed in March.

Hassocks saved the best of their victories for last, completing a first league double since the 2003-04 season over Horsham YMCA via a 4-0 win at the Beacon.

There was little indication of the comfortable scoreline which was to come during a first half which was pretty turgid for the most part.

Neither side kept the ball particularly well, the whistle seemed to blow for some sort of infringement every couple of minutes and good opportunities were at a premium throughout the opening 40 minutes.

Harvey Blake had a drive deflected behind for a corner early on and YM's leading marksman Tom Tolfrey dragged wide when James Shaw might have expected to be tested.

Mike Williamson and Leon Turner then linked up well down the left with the latter going for goal from a tight angle when perhaps he should have looked to lay back across.

The half hour mark brought two moments which very much summed up the lack of quality.

First, Tolfrey would have had a clear run at goal had he not elected to use his hand to knock the ball beyond Sam Smith in what resembled a basketball double dribble. Tolfrey was booked for his troubles.

Phil Johnson was then fouled in a good position some 25 yards out. Johnson took the resulting free kick himself with the ball last seen flying over some houses in neighbouring Hurstpierpoint.

With five minutes remaining until

the half, some football finally broke out.

Alfie Loversidge crossed to Liam header was met by an equally impressive tip over the bar at full stretch from Aaron Jeal.

The first meaningful effort of the match was followed 60 seconds later and this time, it resulted in Hassocks taking the lead.

Smith hit a long ball out of defence which Benson chased. With Jeal advancing to try and cut out the danger, Benson lobbed the ball over the YM goalkeeper and in at the opposite post for a superb finish.

The Robins just about deserved to go into the interval in the lead. They set about extending it with real vigour after the break, winning a flurry of corners.

James Westlake delivered from the left and it needed an outstanding piece of defending from Sam Henderson to prevent a tap in at the back post.

Jack Troak then swung one over from the right which neither Alex Bygraves nor Smith could turn past a mass of white shirts grouped together on the line.

Both the Hassocks and YM bench were increasingly amused by Troak appearing to be making a noise like an aeroplane as he ran up and down the left flank early in the second half.

YM's mood soon darkened however when the Robins doubled their advantage in controversial circumstances on 56 minutes.

Loversidge harried Hayden Neathey, eventually forcing the YM defender to ground and coming away with the ball.

The visitors wanted a foul and it was a bit of a surprise when one was not forthcoming.

Loversidge took full advantage of referee Ian Lane finding in his favour by getting into the YM box and squaring for Johnson to sweep home his traditional goal against his former





club.

YM had to get on the front foot in the final half hour if they wanted to salvage anything from the game and that suited Hassocks, who were now content to play on the counter.

Shaw made a big save when turning over a Josh Neathey effort but he was otherwise protected well by Blake, Bygraves, Smith and Troak.
















Hassocks have to battle to see off plucky Pagham in nine goal thriller

Blood, sweat and possibly tears... but no result for Robins

March 4th 2006: A big and physical Shoreham side visited the Beacon on an afternoon when Pat Harding ended up bleeding for the Hassocks cause but to no avail

There was plenty of blood, a lot of sweat and Hassocks fans could have been forgiven for shedding a few tears following a hugely disappointing 1-0 defeat at home to Shoreham.

The blood came courtesy of Pat Harding, who had to leave the field just before the break after suffering a badly cut head.

Hassocks patched up their 36goal leading scorer and Harding bravely continued, even as he had to leave the field on two further occasions to staunch the flow of blood.

By full time, Harding had his head encased in layers of bandage so thick that it looked from a distance like he was wearing a crash helmet.

It was all in vain, however. Whilst nobody could fault the work rate of the Robins - the sweat - they just never got going against opponents below them in the table. Hence the disappointment.

Hassocks struggled to do anything really in an attacking sense during the first half.

The closest the Robins came to testing former Burgess Hill Town goalkeeper Ronan Callaghan were with a couple of long distance efforts from Anthony Hibbert.

Shoreham could have taken the lead with seven on the clock. Chris Hibberd delivered a free kick towards Justin Simmons but he mishit a great chance wide.

The Musselmen were one of the biggest sides seen at the Beacon so far this season and Hassocks never really got to grips with the height or physicality of their visitors.

Nothing summed that up better than the only goal of the game which arrived just before the quarter of an hour mark.

The Robins were badly caught out

when Ben Boiling crossed into the box and Tom Levitt had been left totally free to produce a looping header which gave Joel Harding no chance.

Callaghan was for some reason stranded on the edge of the box, leaving an empty net for Thomas to aim at.

The young striker's effort was on target but lacked the required pace, enabling Danny Gainsford to race back and hook off the line.

Referee David Spain showed the game's sole booking with five minutes remaining to Stuart Faith.

It was a decision which infuriated Hassocks boss Dave John, who felt Mr Spain had let a number of far worse offences than Faith's relatively minor foul go without punishment.

John did have a point, especially when it came to a deliberate handball from a guilty Shoreham party engineered for no other reason than to try and cheat a way to a goal.

The injustice dished out to Faith lit a late fire under the Robins and they were able to create one more good opportunity with time running out.

Harding linked up well with Turner but the latter's effort drifted well wide.

An afternoon to forget in the end for the Robins, whose hectic schedule through February looks like it is catching up with them.

Eastbourne United this season

Anthony Storey was appointed as United boss following a slow start to the 2021-22 season and there has been no looking back from there really. United climbed from the fringes of the relegation battle to a final finishing position of fifth, their highest since being crowned champions in 2008-09. They have continued in that vein this season, sitting sevent in the table with 15 wins, seven draws and just five defeats from 23 games.
