Newhaven were one game away from promotion last season. They look well placed to go one better as the current campaign prepares to enter its final month

The Dockers finished third in 2021-22 but with Saltdean United not partaking in the promotion/ relegation playoff against Lancing, it gave Newhaven a shot at taking the Lancers' spot in the Isthmian League.

It finished Lancing 2-1 Newhaven at Culver Road. The Dockers were subsequently a little slow to get going in 2022-23 - and nobody could blame them from suffering a hangover after missing out on promotion in such cruel fashion - but changes direction. they have been relentlessly pursing top spot since the start of October.

The result is an enthralling threeway battle for the Southern Combination League title between Crawley Down Gatwick, Broadbridge Heath and Newhaven.

Where the Dockers have the edge is experience. To see Down and Heath in the championship picture is something of a surprise; Newhaven in contrast have been regularly challenging for both league and cup honours since their

promotion into the Premier Division in 2013 after an absence of more than 20 years.

In the past eight seasons, Newhaven have won the Peter Bentley League Cup and two Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cups.

With managers Andy Cook and Sean Breach having been in charge for more than 400 games now, the Dockers are a beacon of stability in a league where managers and players often move on whenever the wind

Newhaven have the personnel to win the title and their facilities including the newly installed 3G pitch - are ready-made for the Isthmian League.

The only question is can they get over the line this time? If they can, then it could yet become the most memorable campaign in Dockers history.

On Tuesday, they advanced to the Peter Bentley League Cup final, meaning a double is very much on the cards.

Two former Hassocks Under 18s products were in the Newhaven side who won promotion to the **Southern Combination League** Premier Division in 2013.

Midfielder **Terry Gacias** racked up 35 appearances for us across two spells at the Beacon in the 2000s.

The majority of those games came during the 2009-10 season after Dave John brought Gacias back to Hassocks from Mid Sussex rivals St Francis Rangers.

Gacias had previously captained both the Under 18s and the Reserves and proved a popular player with the Robins faithful in the time he spent with the club.

Naim Rouane failed to make a first team appearance for us, featuring for the Reserves and IIIs after progressing from the Under 18s.

He went onto have much greater success after leaving the Beacon, most notably with Lancing and Haywards Heath whom he captained to the Southern Combination League and Peter Bentley League Cup double us from the Dockers in the summer in 2017-18.

Rouane was appointed as Lancing manager in the summer of 2019, leading the Lancers to top spot in the Premier Division before the 2019-20 season was curtailed.

Several other players have represented both clubs through the

Rob Boddy played eight times for the Robins at the back end of the 2011-12 season after joining from Shoreham and he went onto play for Newhaven a few seasons later via a spell at East Preston...

Jake Forward meanwhile had a

brief five game spell with us at the start of the 2012-13 campaign, scoring once before moving onto St Francis Rangers and then Newhaven.

Right back **Louis Pittock** joined of 2020.

He played eight times in a campaign disrupted by injury and then the second Covid-19 lockdown which halted all football between January and April. Pittock can now be found at Shoreham.

Finally, Newhaven may call upon a former Robin this afternoon. Forward **Charlie Bennett** played twice for us in the 2017-18 season after signing on dual registration from Burgess Hill Town.

Hassocks unable to sink 10-man **Dockers at Trafalgar Ground**

Three months into the 2022-23 Southern Combination **League Premier Division** season and Hassocks can be pretty pleased with their efforts, sitting sixth in the table with 23 points in the

The trip to the Trafalgar Ground to take on one of the promotion favourites Newhaven however has to go down as a missed opportunity to make a real statement of intent.

A straight red card after 24 minutes for Bailie Rogers gave Hassocks more than an hour of playing shorthanded against the Dockers.

The score was locked at 0-0 at the time of Rogers' dismissal. By full time, goals from Alfie Rogers and Lee Robinson had fired Newhaven to a 2-0 success and up to second behind leaders Broadbridge Heath.

Clearly, there is something about games between Robins and Dockers at Fort Road which seem to benefit the side who has a man sent off.

Hassocks have only ever won once in a competitive game away at Newhaven.

That came in February 2019 despite a red card for George Brown, Spencer Slaughter notching the only goal in a memorable 1-0 victory for Mark Dalgleish's side.

Brown's crime that day was a spectacular example of kicking the ball away to waste time when already on a vellow card.

Once Hassocks headed back to Mid Sussex with all three points, it was something that you could look back on and laugh at.

Not so much Rogers' red. A quickly taken Jack Troak free kick looked to send Jamie Wilkes galloping into space down the left flank, only for Rogers to come sliding in once the ball had been played past him and wipe out the tall Hassocks striker.

Referee John Pike was not

impressed with the lateness of it and so out came the red.

It was a decision that split the crowd and those on the pitch and not brother's dismissal, picking the ball in the way you would expect; some Newhaven fans felt Mr Pike was right to send Rogers off whilst a couple of Hassocks players were surprised the punishment was so harsh.

note in a game which struggled to entertain.

That was not what a large crowd would have been expecting, seeing as Newhaven are the Premier Division's top scorers whilst Hassocks started the day with the third highest goals total.

The Robins hopes of adding to the 29 they have plundered so far took a blow in the fourth minute when Leon Turner had to be withdrawn.

Not many full backs have been able to handle the lively right winger

On a pitch as big and flat as the new 3G surface at the Trafalgar Ground, Turner had the potential to cause plenty of problems for the Dockers.

His place was taken by Danny Reid, fresh from scoring his first senior goal in the 5-0 Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup hammering of Forest Row on Wednesday night.

One half-chance per side was mustered before the red card. Alex Harris had to show exemplary handling when dealing with a Newhaven free kick into the box on eight minutes.

On 16, raging Joe Bull sent in a good delivery which Liam Benson headed wide when he really should have worked Jake Buss in the home goal.

Three minutes after Rogers headed for his early bath and a Troak lob beat Buss but not Jack Meeres, who cleared off the line.

That clearance looked even more important when Newhaven took the

lead on 33.

Alfie Rogers was seemingly determined to make up for his up in midfield and driving past three Hassocks challenges before beating Harris with a ferocious effort from outside the box.

The Robins failed to muster much It was one of the only incidents of of a response in what remained of the first half.

> Newhaven enjoyed playing the ball around at the back between Buss, Meeres and their other central defender Henry Watson, easily navigating their way to the break with the lead intact.

Hassocks failed to fire after the interval too. Robinson almost made it 2-0 within five minutes of the restart, beating Harris to a through ball.

The angle proved too tight and the home striker's effort rolled along the line and out for a throw.

Robinson though is usually good for a goal against the Robins. He duly doubled the advantage midway through the second half, controlling a long ball forward on his chest and lobbing the ball over Harris.

Reid was unfortunate to be sacrificed a few minutes later, the substitute being substituted as Hassocks introduced Pat Harding and went three up front.

The Robins did at least look a little more positive, forcing two chances in the final 10 once another attack-minded player in JJ Minty had also entered proceedings.

Benson fired over from close range and Johnson was denied by Buss making his first save of the afternoon in injury time.

Simpson on song but it's not enough for Robins in narrow Newhaven loss

Jack Simpson was the best player on the pitch at wet and windy Fort Road but despite the best efforts of the Hassocks goalkeeper, the Robins were still unable to get their first ever win at Newhaven.

An enthralling August Bank Holiday Monday clash finished 3-2 to the Dockers, who on this early season evidence could have enough firepower to make an impression on the Sussex County League title race.

Against a lesser keeper than Simpson, Newhaven could have racked up eight or nine.

Hassocks though were kept in the game by the efforts of their number one, even though they arrived on the banks of the River Ouse with a significant absentee list.

Admittedly, it was not quite as long as the nine first choice players the Robins had to do without when losing 3-0 at Newhaven back in April.

But one could not help but wonder how different the outcome might have been had Hassocks been able to call upon Phil Gault, Nathan Cooper, Kieran O'Callaghan and the suspended Ashley Marsh.

Dave John handed rare opportunities to Luke Pawson at left back and the mercurial Stuart Brown on the left of midfield whilst last season's top scorer for the title winning Under 18s Jake Booth came in for his second senior start.

Booth partnered Phil Johnson in attack with John so short of midfield options as to deploy Nathan Miles in a deeper role alongside Anthony Hibbert.

Newhaven made a fast start and took the lead inside of 10 minutes. A clever stepover from James Rhodes flummoxed both Ian Simpson and Nick Pitcher, allowing Scott Marshall to convert a low cross.

A minute later and Lee Robinson hit the side netting from a tight

angle. Simpson then denied Ebou Jallow twice in guick succession. The first save from a one-on-one was impressive enough; the second beggared belief.

With Simpson at his near post, Robinson drilled a hard cross to the back post where Jallow was waiting to apply the finish for what looked a certain second for Newhaven.

Simpson though plunged low to his left, diving the width of his goal and somehow keeping Jallow's effort out. It was an astonishing piece of goalkeeping.

Spurred on by that moment, Hassocks soon had an equaliser. The Robins were utilising Johnson's pace on the break to good effect with Newhaven resorting to ever cruder means to halt the speedster.

One such instance saw Hassocks awarded a free kick 25 yards out in prime Anthony Hibbert territory.

Hibbert made no mistake with the opportunity, bending a lovely free kick around the wall and into the top corner beyond the outstretched hand of Jake Buss.

A frantic finish to the first half followed. Simpson denied Robinson in a one-on-one situation from a lighting guick Dockers counter after the Robins made a mess of a throw in a promising position deep in opposition territory.

There were around five minutes until the break when Hassocks took the lead. Newhaven failed to clear a corner and Booth was on hand to produce a crisp volley from six yards out to get his first team account up and running.

Jallow hit the post from a wellworked short corner routine in the final play of the half and you could tell as the teams made their way off for the interval that the Dockers wee not expecting to be behind.

As a result, they came flying out of the traps at the start of the second **Subs:** Rudwick (Brown 55), John half.

Simpson was called into action

within four minutes of the restart, pushing a Robinson snapshot from the edge of the box over the bar.

The equaliser arrived just after that and there was nothing Simpson could do, Craig Bunch getting in behind and finishing clinically from close range.

John replaced Brown with debutant George Rudwick, a summer signing who helped South Coast City to win the Brighton League Division One title last season.

Rudwick displayed some nice touches as Hassocks managed to relief some of the pressure they were under, although they still needed a combination of luck and Simpson to keep them in it.

A dangerous Dockers free kick flashed across goal with no home player able to apply the vital touch.

Simpson then spectacularly flew through the air at full stretch to finger tip a Conor Sidwell piledriver from 20 yards around the post.

Newhaven found what proved to be the winner with 15 minutes left, Sidwell converting a scrappy goal from a corner.

Pawson was injured during the build up and John took the opportunity to replace his left back with a striker, throwing on his nephew Ryan John.

One of Hassocks' two chances to grab a point in the final 10 fell to young John, whose effort needed a smart save from Buss to keep it out.

That came just three minutes after Buss had turned a Dan Jacques header from a Hibbert free kick onto the bar in a save equal in brilliance to Simpson's interventions.

Jonno joins exclusive club of Hassocks century scorers

With his first half strike away at Eastbourne United, Phil Johnson joined a very exclusive club of players to score 100 goals in senior football for Hassocks.

Phil Gault, James Laing, Pat Harding, Anthony Hibbert and Robbie Kitchen are the five others to have hit a century, with Johnson becoming the first man to achieve the feat since Gault over a decade ago.

Johnson has reached the landmark in 197 matches since making his debut in the 2007-08 season after bursting onto the scene with a sensational hat-trick as the Under 18s won the Southern Combination League Youth Cup in a 3 -2 win over Arundel.

University commitments meant Johnson did not become a first team regular at the Beacon until the 2011-12 season under Mickey Jewell.

He scored his first senior goal at Worthing United in a 2-1 defeat in August 2011 and went onto finish the season with nine in 39 appearances.

Four more goals from nine games followed in 2012-13 and seven in 20 through 2013-14 as further studies restricted his involvement.

The 2014-15 campaign saw Johnson establish himself as the Robins' talisman following the departure of Gault and Nathan Miles' unfortunate injury problems.

Despite being regularly seen in popular Burgess Hill nightspots such as The Railway and Jacobs Post, Johnson plundered 26 goals from 39 appearances.

Those goals fired Hassocks to a great escape from relegation and saw Johnson win a clean sweep of Players' Player, Managers' Player and Supporters' Player of the Season awards.

His form attracted the attention of Burgess Hill Town and Johnson moved to Leylands Park that summer.

A brief spell at Haywards Heath Town was followed by a goal-laden two-and-a-half years at Horsham YMCA, where Johnson scored 53 times in 102 appearances.

Mark Dalgleish managed to tempt Johnson is within sight of Premier Johnson back to the Beacon in 2018. He brought up his Hassocks half century with the fourth goal of his second spell, the 50 coming from 114 matches - meaning Johnson has increased his run rate through the second half of his century.

The 2018-19 season ended up being his most prolific campaign so far for the Robins, ending it with 27 in 40 matches as Hassocks secured their highest league finish in five years.

Johnson broke his leg against East Preston in the second game of the 2019-20 season, although he did not realise it at the time and tried to play

That was the start of an injury hit campaign in which he played only 13 times. With Johnson able to contribute just three goals because of occasions, Roffey twice this season his lengthy absence, Hassocks were deep in relegation trouble when Covid -19 brought the campaign to a premature closure.

Johnson moved to Crawley Down Gatwick in the summer of 2020, playing 47 matches over two seasons at the Haven and scoring 30 times.

23 of those goals came in the 2021-22 season, despite Johnson spending virtually the entire second half of the campaign out injured.

Johnson returned to Hassocks for a third spell last summer, becoming James Westlake's sixth signing as Robins head coach.

It took until the sixth game of the season for Johnson to get up and running, giving Hassocks a shock lead against Isthmian League South Central side Uxbridge in the FA Cup.

Since then however, there has been no looking back. Johnson currently has 24 goals from 34 matches and has been particularly prolific since the turn of the year, notching 10 in 13.

With at least eight more games to play, there is a strong possibility that Johnson will surpass his previous best season's tally of 27.

Gault was the last player to break the 30 mark in 2013-14 whilst

Division leading scorer Alfie Rogers, who has 27 for Newhaven.

If Johnson were to win the Premier Division golden boot, he would become only the third Hassocks player ever to achieve the feat after Gault and Harding.

Johnson's century includes two four-goal hauls. The first came in a 5-2 win at Crawley Down in March 2019; the most recent in October, when he had the Robins' Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup tie at Forest Row done and dusted before half time.

He has two Hassocks hat-tricks both coming against Selsey in the 2014-15 campaign - and 17 braces against 13 different sides.

Arundel have been victims of a Johnson double on three separate and Horsham YMCA twice.

AFC Varndeanians, Corinthian, East Grinstead Town, Hailsham Town, Lingfield, Loxwood, Pagham, Ringmer, Rye United and Shoreham are the other opponents Johnson has two goals in a game against.

Three of those braces have proven particularly dramatic, thanks to Johnson's penchant for scoring doubles late in the day.

At Arundel in April 2013, he struck in the 88th and 89th minutes to turn a 2-1 deficit into a rare three points from Mill Road.

Four months later and a Johnson double salvo in the final 10 earned Hassocks a point from a 2-2 home draw with East Grinstead.

And at Roffey last month, he prevented the Robins from becoming the first side to lose a league game against the Boars this season by scoring in the 88th and 94th minutes as Hassocks came from behind to win

Five clean sheets in a row sets new Hassocks record

Hassocks have set a new club record for consecutive clean sheets in senior football after keeping five shutouts in a row.

The previous best was four, set in the 1996-97 season and then equalled in the 1998-99 campaign.

Paul John was between the sticks on both occasions with the first run coming as the Robins made a flying start to the season.

Hassocks were 2-0 winners at home to Peacehaven & Telscombe on the opening day of the campaign. They followed that up by beating Eastbourne Town by the same scoreline with a third successive 2-0 win coming at Southwick.

The Robins then won 1-0 at Oakwood before exiting the FA Cup at the hands of Egham Town, conceding 3-1 times as the run came to an end.

A little over two years later and John and his defence repeated the trick, recording four clean sheets from four matches in four different competitions.

Hassocks won 1-0 away at Whitehawk in the league, 3-0 at Ware in the FA Vase, 5-0 at home against Haywards Heath Town in the old Floodlit Cup and 2-0 at Selsey in the Sussex RUR Charity Cup.

The sequence was broken with a 2-0 defeat in yet another competition, the Robins exiting the John O'Hara League Cup in a 2-0 away defeat to Sidlesham.

There have been plenty of occasions when Hassocks have managed three clean sheets in a row but never five.

James Shaw and his defence are now the proud owners of the record. They kicked off their run with a 0-0 draw at home against FA Vase quarter finalists Peacehaven & Telscombe.

The Robins then went and won 2-0 away at Saltdean United, inflicting defeat on former Hassocks head coach Brad Sweetman.

Horsham YMCA came to the Beacon with one of the Premier Division's leading scorers in their ranks in Tom Tolfrey, but they could find no way through either.

A 2-0 win at Loxwood followed by a 3-0 win against AFC Varndeanians completed the fantastic five.

Since Shaw arrived from Tooting & Mitcham United, he has conceded just three times in nine matches before Tuesday night's trip to Eastbourne United.

Bottom of the table Roffey breached the Hassocks defence in what was a disappointing performance from the Robins.

They were bailed out that night by Phil Johnson scoring 88th and 94th minute goals.

Johnson's scoring form has been comparable to the Hassocks defence in keeping goals out, the Robins top scorer having notched 10 in his 10 appearances.

Little Common were responsible or the other two goals, scoring twice at the Beacon on their way to a 2-1 win - one of only two matches Hassocks have lost since the turn of the year.

Trigwell lured from Loxwood to bolster goalkeeping options

It has been all change in the goalkeeping department at the Beacon with one in and two out ahead of the business end of the Southern Combination League season.

Hassocks have pulled off quite the coup in signing experienced Loxwood number one Fraser Trigwell for their Under 23s title charge.

Trigwell has been first choice at Plaistow Road since arriving from Steyning Town in the summer of 2020 after former Robins favourite Spencer Slaughter was appointed manager.

He played 24 times in his first campaign with Loxwood, enjoying a starring role as the Magpies reached the final of the 2021 Supplementary Shield competition.

Trigwell saved three Newhaven penalties in the semi final shootout after the sides had drawn 2-2 in 90 minutes at Woodside Road.

The final against Lancing finished level and even though Trigwell kept out another penalty, it was the

Isthmian League-bound Lancers who lifted the trophy after winning 5-4 from 12 yards.

Trigwell was a virtual ever-present for Loxwood last season, playing 39 times in all competitions. He made 23 appearances for the Magpies in the current campaign before being lured to the Beacon.

Hassocks head coach James Westlake served as assistant to Slaughter at Plaistow Road and was able to put his contacts to good use to strengthen the Robins' goalkeeper options.

That became necessary in the wake of both Joe Southam and Callum Thompson leaving the Beacon.

Teenager Southam has returned to parent club Burgess Hill Town. He played five times for the Robins, helping to fill the void left when Alex Harris was ruled out through injury in November and December.

Thompson meanwhile was offered the opportunity to play first team football at Roffey following his return from a nasty shoulder dislocation and

fracture playing for the Under 23s against Horsham YMCA in early October.

Before the injury, Thompson had kept three clean sheets as Neil Parker's side won five of their opening seven games of the campaign. He signed a scholarship with Point University in January.

There has been one other piece of outgoing business away from the goalkeepers with Danny Reid moving to Saltdean United.

Like Thompson's departure to Roffey, the Tigers are able to offer Reid greater first team opportunities.

Reid made three starts and seven substitute appearances, scoring once in the 5-0 Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup win away at Forest Row.

He had topped the Under 23s goal charts earlier in the season with four from six matches.

Between those two chances, Liam Benson slipped a pass across to Leon Turner charging in from the left.

Under pressure from Charlie Meehan doing really well to track back, Turner fired just wide.

Shaw next had to adjust in midair to claw away a vicious Meehan free kick on the 20 minute mark through from 25 yards out.

Good hold up play from Benson saw the powerful striker lay off to Jack Troak, charging forward from left back like Galopin Des Champs coming over the last to win the Cheltenham Gold Cup.

Troak crossed and Benson was on the end of it with a difficult diving header he did well to trouble Barrowmen goalkeeper Lucas Szendela-Goetzke with.

Hassocks had the first opportunity of the second half. Harvey Blake hit a free kick from just inside his own half long into the Steyning box.

It was a similar story minutes later at the other end, where Steyning substitutes Joe Radley-Martin and Misha Djemaili combined with Jack Langford to create a shooting chance for Radley-Martin placed over the bar.

Radley-Martin was proving a lively presence and he next forced Shaw into a sprawling save in his top lefthand corner with a shot from outside the box after Hassocks were caught out by a mishit corner.

That proved to be the final meaningful chance of the match and so it was to penalties, taken at the west end of the Beacon.

Johnson, Josh Bradley, Harding, Troak and Shaw were the first five to convert for Hassocks.



Hawks prove too strong as memorable Robins cup run comes to an end

Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup Semi Final Sunday 5th March 2023, The Beacon Hassocks U18s 1-3 Whitehawk U18s

The giant killers of Hassocks Under 18s fell just short in their quest to pull off one more upset which would have taken them into their first Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup final for 21 years.

In front of a good crowd at the Beacon, Isthmian League side Whitehawk proved too strong on their way to a 3-1 victory.

The Hawks will face either Hastings United or Worthing at Culver Road next month to decide who is crowned County Champions.

To reach this stage of the competition, Hassocks had already delivered three shock results which left them as the only Southern Combination League side left flying the flag in the final four.

Local rivals St Francis Rangers may sit above the Robins in the Central Division and be the only side laying down a title challenge to long-term leaders Burgess Hill Town, but they were eliminated on penalties in round two.

Worthing United had underlined their quality by inflicting upon Hill their only defeat of the season in any competition in the second round, setting up a trip to the Beacon in the process. The Robins made one change from the team who had come close to taking a point from Burgess Hill a week earlier before being edged out 4-3 in a seven goal thriller.

Oliver Parker-Williams dropped down to the bench having made a lively debut as a substitute for the Under 23s on Thursday night in their 3-1 win over Horsham YMCA.

His place was taken by Oliver Goswamy, arguably the star of the Robins' County Cup run.

Goswamy has four goals for the season and all have come in the three games Hassocks had played to reach this stage of the competition, including a brace in the win over Newhaven.

Unfortunately, Goswamy was unable to add to his impressive record against Whitehawk.

It fell to leading scorer Alex Brewer to provide the Robins consolation, his 17th of the season from 15 appearances.

All three of the visitors goals were scored by Toby Reeder, a forward good enough to have played eight





times for Whitehawk's first team already having made his debut at 16 away at Sevenoaks Town last season.

Reeder's treble came via a perfect hat-trick. A right footed effort from 12 yards in the first half was followed by a towering header from a cross and a low left foot strike from outside the box in the second.

Hawks had other chances over the 90 minutes with Jack Thomas in the Hassocks goal having to make some important saves, including one at full stretch from a free kick which seemed certain to bend into far corner.

The Robins did cause Whitehawk their fair share of problems at the other end but ultimately, Hawks proved too good - no disgrace in that and this young Hassocks side can be very proud of their efforts in an historic and memorable cup run.

There was no hangover from last week's Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup semi final defeat to Whitehawk for Hassocks Under 18s as the Robins were instantly back in winning ways.

And this first victory in three keeps alive hopes of ending the season with some sort of silverware as Eastbourne United were easily seen off 3-0 at the Oval in the third round of the Southern Combination League Under 18 Cup.
















McFadden and Chappell complete comeback win in top of table clash

Hassocks saw out the game from there to pick up their sixth win in seven league games this season.



Mills strikes at Mill Road to earn 10-man Robins point from Mullets

March 25th 2017: Harry Mills was on target as Hassocks secured a decent point away at Arundel after Tom Barnes had picked up two impressive yellow cards in the space of five minutes

On the face of it, a 1-1 draw at third from bottom Arundel looks like a poor result for a Hassocks side that have been in good form of late.

But they may look back on this as a big point gained in their quest to secure a 24th consecutive season of Premier Division football come the end of the campaign.

The point maintains a seven point gap to the Mullets who continue to occupy the final relegation spot whilst Worthing United were the only side in the bottom eight to win.

Throw in the fact the Robins had to play out the final third of the game with 10 men after Tom Barnes received two cautions in the space of five minutes for the second time this season and it was not hard to see why Phil Wickwar was articulating the positives afterwards.

"It was a good result in the end given we had to be disciplined and tactically astute once we went down to 10."

"We defended excellently from that point on, James Broadbent didn't have a save to make and we could've won the game with the chances we created."

Most of those chances were either fashioned by or fell to Charlie Pitcher. Pitcher arrived last week from Loxwood and scored twice in his first game in Hassocks colours, the Under 21s 6-1 win over Eastbourne United Association on Thursday night.

Wickwar and Mark Dalgliesh did not hesitate to throw him in for his first team debut just 48 hours later.

It was a lively performance from the striker who has been a regular scorer at this level for four seasons now, which makes it easy to forget he is still only 19 years old.

Pitcher put Hassocks on the front foot early on in a first half in which they were largely dominant.

He shot wide when well placed

and was then denied by Arundel goalkeeper James Fernandes when a square pass to Phil Gault would've left the Robins talismanic forward with an open goal.

Bradley Tighe was having a whale of a time marauding forward from right back, his best delivery of the day coming when Pitcher sent him away and Gault was a hair's breadth from connecting with the cross.

Gault then played a delightful through ball which looked destined to send James Westlake in one-on-one until Pitcher misread the situation and intercepted it himself.

Jordan Badger was causing all manner of issues from set pieces, clipping the post with a thumping volley.

It was from a Badger flick on from a James Westlake corner that Hassocks went ahead, Harry Mills lashing home the loose ball from eight vards out.

The lead lasted all of five minutes. Arundel had been on a few raids into Hassocks territory but Broadbent had been largely comfortable until an excellent Asa Nicholson delivery fell to Harry Russell who smashed home with aplomb.

The second half was just 10 minutes old when Barnes received his marching orders.

The first yellow seemed harsh, a tackle that nine times out of 10

wouldn't warrant a card.

But there could be little complaint about the second as the Robins centre back cynically checked Russell in a decision that, given he had been booked less than five minutes beforehand, seemed a very bizarre one to make.

Hassocks changed things up immediately, Mills dropping into the centre of defence with Gault moving back into midfield and Liam Benson replacing Jack Rowe-Hurst as the visitors took the brave decision to leave two up top.

That bold approach paid off as the Robins pinned Arundel back into their half for large periods of the remaining half an hour.

As a result, the Mullets were forced into playing a more direct game in an attempt to break out and take advantage of the wind.

Hassocks had a couple of chances to win the game late on, James Westlake being denied brilliantly by the feet of Fernandes and Pitcher firing high, wide and handsome when well placed.

Pitcher was replaced by Michael Death for the final 15 minutes and the experienced striker used his body well to hold up the ball.

Crowborough Athletic make their first trip to the Beacon since the 2016-17 season on Tuesday night, renewing a fixture that used to throw up some fantastic battles during their previous spell in the Southern Combination

Crowborough Athletic this season

After eight seasons spent in the South East Counties League, Crowborough were moved back to the Southern Combination by the FA in the summer. With the South East Counties considered a stronger league than our own, the theory went that the Crows could make guite the impression on their return. They took a little while to warm to the task but since Christmas have been one of the Last time we met Premier Division's form teams, moving to within two points of Steyning Town in fifth with a game in hand. A top six finish seems there for the taking, making their visit to the Beacon a very difficult game for us.

Head-to-head

We were regular opponents before the Crows found themselves moved into the Kent-based league, 26 previous matches have resulted in 14 Hassocks wins, nine Crowborough victories and three draws. Our good record was helped by an unbeaten six game spell including five successive wins between 2010 and 2014 under the management of Mickey Jewell.

We came away with three points from the Crowborough Community Stadium after triumphing in a 3-2 thriller back in October, Jack Troak and Phil Johnson had the Robins 2-0 ahead inside of 20 minutes, only for John Sinclair and Lucas Murrain to

Death went onto score 38 goals in 112 appearances for the Robins and can now be found managing Division One leaders Shoreham.
