Good evening and welcome to the Beacon for our rearranged Premier Division match against Crowborough Athletic

The business end of the season is now very much upon us and Saturday against Newhaven saw one of the best afternoons we have had here at the Beacon in guite some time.

A crowd of over 300 came out in support of Non-League Day, where we offered reduced admission prices to anyone who brought along a donation for the Hassocks Community Food Bank.

We collected nearly 300 items which are to be passed onto the Food Bank (contrary to the tweet which went out on Saturday afternoon picturing the donations and saying it was Johnsy's lunch) to help those struggling in the village.

On behalf of the Food Bank, we cannot thank you enough for your generosity.

The importance of such an

impressive result cannot be overstated. Points from Newhaven have traditionally been hard to come by, so to secure one at a time when the Dockers are chasing the title was fantastic.

Crowborough will provide a similarly stern test this evening. Like ourselves, the Crows are in the hunt for a top six finish.

Victory for the visitors will push them into fourth spot. If we were to win, then we would leapfrog Crowborough and move up to sixth. It is still all to play for in a very congested middle of the table.

Aside from first team matters and Sunday proved to be a washout for the Under 18s and Ladies, who both saw their scheduled matches away at Saltdean United and Bognor Regis Town respectively postponed.

That leaves us with a very busy few weeks coming up. The Under 23s go to Oakwood tomorrow night, kicking off at 7:45pm.

The first team then make the long trip to Bexhill United on Saturday. Sunday will see the Under 18s at Seaford Town, the Veterans at Montpelier Villa and the Ladies home against Saltdean United.

Kick off in that one is at 2pm and

admission is free. Any support you can give the Ladies as they chase the Sussex County Women's League title will be very much appreciated.

Next week is slightly less busy. There is no Under 23s match and on Saturday the first team are back here for a 3pm kick off against another of the title challengers, Crawley Down Gatwick.

Finally, we have some news on this year's End of Season Awards. They will take place at the Beacon on Saturday 7th May and all fans are invited to attend as we celebrate what is shaping up to be our best campaign in nearly a decade.

Crowborough Athletic returned to the Southern Combination League in the summer after an eight year stay in the Southern Counties East Premier Division

With the Kent-based league generally considered to be a better standard than our own, it seemed likely that the Crows were going to be pushing for a top six finish.

And those predictions have proven true. Crowborough arrive here today enjoying an excellent campaign, sitting seventh in the table with 18 wins, six draws and eight defeats from their 31 matches so far.

The Crows are also into the final of the Peter Bentley League Cup after eliminating Peacehaven & Telscombe a week ago in the semis.

There they will face Newhaven, A top six finish and some silverware for however, as like virtually every side the Crowborough Community Stadium trophy cabinet would represent a superb return to the Southern Combination.

Crowborough's absence over the past eight years has denied us what has always been an entertaining fixture whenever Robins meet Crows.

It did not take long for normal

service to be resumed when we travelled to the Crowborough Community Stadium for our first league meeting since 2014 back in October.

Five goals arrived in the first half, three for us and two for the hosts. Given Crowborough's lofty place in the table and their pretty formidable record at home, that has to rank as one of the most impressive results of our season so far.

A repeat this evening would obviously be nice and continue our flying form of losing just twice since the turn of the year.

That is easier said than done, in the top half of the table, the Crows have been in good form since the turn of the year.

They have won 12 times from 16 outings, including hugely impressive victories over Peacehaven, Steyning Town, Eastbourne Town, Bexhill United and long term Premier Division leaders Crawley Down Gatwick.

Hassocks down Crows to win four in a row and move into the top six

Crowborough Athletic had only lost two Southern Combination League games all season before Hassocks made their first visit to the Crowborough Community Stadium since 2014.

Inflicting defeat number three on their hosts was arguably the best result of the Robins' season so far, a 3-2 win being their third in a row and pushing them into the top six of the Premier Division.

All five goals came in a tone for which was set when Jack Troak opened the scoring with seven minutes on the clock.

A loose Crowborough pass from out on the right drifted aimlessly into the middle of the pitch, which Troak came inside from his left flank to collect.

With space opening up in front of him, Troak hit one from 35 yards out. It did not look like it would cause Crows goalkeeper Cameron Hall much strife until Harrison Mayhew extended a long leg and deflected the shot into the opposite corner to which it had originally been travelling.

Crowborough mustered two half chances in response. Alex Harris held a snapshot low down to his left from Mayhew following a corner and it needed a lunging block from Mike Williamson to force the ball wide of the post when Harry Forster glided into the box.

Up the other end and Alex Bygraves headed just over from a dangerous Bradley Tighe free kick delivered from deep.

Leon Turner then skipped past three Crowborough players down the right, cutting back to Troak who skied his shot.

Hassocks doubled their lead on 18 minutes from the spot. Raging Joe Bull initiated a great switch from left back to Turner out on the right flank.

Turner's clever flick released Harvey Blake on the overlap and when Blake was hacked down as he galloped into the area by Harry London, a penalty was the only

Taking duty fell to Phil Johnson and the Robins' top scorer made no mistake, sending Hall the wrong way.

Hassocks remained 2-0 ahead up until the 27th minute. By the 35th minute, Crowborough were level as the Robins defence fell alarmingly asleep.

The Crows pulled one back when ridiculously entertaining first half, the a throw found the unmarked London. He dinked a ball over the top of the static Robins back four, who had failed to notice John Sinclair ghosting in around the back.

> Sinclair was left with the simple task of collecting London's pass and beating Harris from a matter of yards whilst Hassocks appealed hopefully for an offside.

Crowborough had their tails up now and the next eight minutes was all theirs. London tested Harris' handling from distance before going down in the box under a hand in the back from Bull.

Referee Martyn Milligan ruled the contact minimal and Hassocks escaped. There was another let off when Lucas Murrain showed good strength to work an opening for Harvey Killick who shot into the side netting.

With the Robins goal leading a charmed life, it came as little surprise when the equaliser did arrive. Leo Vowles played a low ball into a dangerous area from right back, Forster rode a couple of half-hearted challenges before slipping a sideways pass to Murrain to apply the finish.

Hassocks deserve a lot of credit for what happened next. Not only did they manage to halt the Crows' momentum, but they retook the lead at a crucial time two minutes before the break.

Turner and Blake linked up down the right again with the latter making the by-line and pulling back for Liam

Benson to convert on the stretch from close range.

The Robins were only too aware of the threat Crowborough posed after the hosts' earlier rally and so the second half became all about game management.

Hassocks absorbed pressure and were sensible running the clock down in what was a really dever 45 minutes of football.

Crowborough's best chances of claiming a point came towards the end. Forster volleyed wide from a Murrain flick and Harry Brown had a stooping effort brilliantly headed away by Blake.

That was the last of the on-pitch action much attention was paid to. A medical emergency in the 87th minute involving a Crows supporter who had collapsed saw a call over the tannoy for anyone with first aid training to help.

Tighe was one of the first on the scene, running the length of the pitch to assist and arranging for an ambulance to be sent to the Community Stadium far more quickly than the original waiting time of two

The game was restarted when the spectator regained consciousness and the final 10 minutes played in front of a subdued, almost silent crowd. The full time whistle was greeted with little celebration.

Tighe returned to further support the fan after the game, who was released from hospital the following day. Three points for Hassocks, but a reminder there are more important things in life than football.

Subs inspire out-of-sorts Robins to sixth win in a row

Twice in less than three weeks now Hassocks have not played particularly well against Crowborough Athletic and yet they have six points in the bank from the Crows.

It finished 2-1 at the Community Stadium, just as it had at the Beacon 17 days earlier as the Robins extended their winning streak to six in all competitions.

Mickey Jewell had described that previous success against Crowborough as being "not very pretty."

There was at least a little more entertainment this time around, although much of it was provided by a young Crows side who could consider themselves unlucky to come off at full time with nothing to show for their efforts.

What did for the hosts was youthful naivety. Their game management in the second 45 minutes was not the best after taking the lead on the stroke of half time.

And whilst Hassocks may have been strangely out of sorts, Jewell being able to call upon a substitute bench of Dan Smith, Spencer Slaughter and Nathan Miles was telling.

Miles being named amongst the substitutes was one of two changes from the starting XI who had won a pulsating Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup third round tie 2-0 against East Grinstead Town on Friday night.

Phil Johnson took over from Miles in attack. Rob South was working away with Ben Palmer coming in at right back.

The first half was fairly even. Crowborough had the better chances and probably just about deserved the lead given to them by Tom Saunders with 44 minutes on the clock.

Anthony Hibbert is not exactly known for his aerial prowess although there was little he could do when a long ball out of defence from

the Crows skimmed off his head.

Saunders took ruthless advantage, hitting a crisp finish from the angle which gave Jack Simpson no chance. Saunders had also scored for Crowborough at the Beacon.

Four minutes after the break and Phil Gault might have been better advised squaring to the unmarked Johnson instead of screwing a shot wide.

The calvary began arriving from the 53rd minute onwards. First Jewell introduced Smith for Jamie Weston and went three up front.

Then the industrious Slaughter replaced Hibbert in the middle of the park.

It did not take long for Slaughter to make his mark, playing a great diagonal ball to send Kieran O'Callaghan through one-on-one.

The finish though was a poor one which Crowborough goalkeeper Ben Head had little trouble in keeping out.

Palmer headed just over from a Chris Maynard followed by surprise all round when Ashley Marsh escaped punishment for bringing down Saunders just outside the box. play well. And right stop winning.

A yellow at the least seemed obvious - and would have been a very apt way for Marsh to mark his 300th appearance for the Robins - but referee Barrie Cox decreed the free kick enough. It was a let off.

The third and final Hassocks substitution was more forced than by design when skipper Stuart Faith went off injured just past the hour mark.

Jewell put Miles on into the front three, dropped Gault into midfield and O'Callaghan joined Marsh in the centre of defence.

Hassocks now had all four of their strikers on the pitch in Johnson, Smith, Miles and Gault.

Yet despite all that firepower, the equaliser came via a set piece. Crowborough were unable to deal with the aerial threat posed by O'Callaghan and he rose highest to head home a James Westlake corner.

Credit to Crowborough, who were not content to settle for a draw. It was however there overexuberance which played a part in Hassocks finding their winner with eight minutes remaining.

The Crows overcommitted from a corner and when Marsh played a clever clearance towards Johnson, there was a mad rush of navy blue shirts attempting to chase back.

Hassocks did not give them a sniff of rescuing the situation.

Johnson linked up with Smith in a lightning quick break that worked the ball to Miles.


The finish was exquisite, Miles scoring with the most delicate of chips dinked over the home goalkeeper from 12 yards out.

A fortunate victory for Hassocks, who would rightly respond by pointing to the old adage of the best sides winning even when they do not play well.

And right now, the Robins cannot stop winning.

Robins fighting for silverware at business end of the season

April is upon us and there remain several chances of silverware ending up in the Beacon trophy cabinet, including both the Under 23s and Ladies winning league titles.

The first team too remain in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup, although no date has as yet been set for the quarter final trip to one of Lancing or Peacehaven & Telscombe.

James Westlake's side will for now be focussing solely on the battle for a top six finish, with five matches to play.

Four of those are against clubs currently above the Robins in the table, so there is plenty of scope for movement up the standings.

April begins with a trip to Bexhill United on Saturday 1st. Hassocks picked up a memorable point at the Polegrove last season in horrific conditions when Alfie Loversidge scored in a 1-1 draw.

The previous meeting in the current campaign saw the Robins triumph 2-0, again in terrible wind and rain. Liam Benson got both the goals. Fingers crossed for some sunshine on the south coast on this occasion.

Easter weekend kicks off with the visit of title chasing Crawley Down Gatwick to the Beacon on Saturday 9th April.

The Anvils ran out 1-0 winners when the sides met at the Haven in September through an Ollie Leslie goal with seven minutes remaining.

Less than 48 hours later and Hassocks make the short trip to Steyning Town for an 11am kick off on Easter Monday.

It will be the third meeting of the campaign between the teams. The Barrowmen hit a 94th minute winner to come from 2-0 down and win 3-2 at the Beacon on Boxing Day.

Hassocks then gained a measure of revenge, eliminating Steyning from the RUR Cup via nine perfect penalties in a shootout win following a 0-0 draw over 90 minutes.

Last season's visit to the

Birchwood Ground ended in a 1-1 draw on a scorching hot afternoon. Jack Troak scored for Hassocks but the real winner on the day was Bradley Tighe's father, who walked away with the main prize from the famous Barrowmen meat raffle.

The penultimate game of the campaign takes Hassocks over the Surrey border to face Lingfield at Godstone Road.

A quite incredible own goal from 25 yards scored by Lingers defender Conor Wilford went viral when the sides met at the Beacon in the FA Cup in August.

Wilford's unfortunate moment proved to be the difference between the sides as the Robins progressed 1-0.

Three months later and Lingfield returned to Mid Sussex, drawing 2-2 in the league. Benson and Troak got the Hassocks goals.

The final weekend of the Premier Division season then brings fourth placed Eastbourne Town to the Beacon.

Phil Johnson gave the Robins their first win at the Saffrons in 17 years when Hassocks visited the Sunshine Coast on Valentine's Day.

Town had earlier eliminated Hassocks from the Sussex Senior Cup, Frankie Chappell's 13th minute strike deciding the second round tie on a freezing night in favour of the visitors.

With the clocks having gone defeat of forward, all Saturday first team competition games at the Beacon will now kick off at 3pm. Two w

The Under 23s have three huge matches to play in April as they chase a first ever Southern Combination League Under 23 North Division title.

Hassocks currently sit 11 points clear at the top having played one game more than nearest rivals Roffey and Horley Town and two more than Broadbridge Heath.

Loxwood will visit the Beacon on Thursday 13th April in a 7:45pm kick off. Goals from Sam Rogers and Will Broomfield secured a tight 2-1 win at the Nest in October.

Thursday 20th April brings bottom

of the table Oakwood to the Beacon in what will be the final home game of the campaign for Neil Parker and his players.

Should the championship race go down to the final day, then a potentially pivotal evening lies in store on Thursday 27th when Hassocks travel to the Countryside Stadium to take on Heath. All those matches are due to kick off at 7:45pm.

The Under 18s could yet win a trophy of their own if they can progress past Seaford Town in the quarter finals of the League Cup this Sunday. Kick off is 11am at the Crouch.

They then have five Central Division matches crammed into April including two rare midweek outings.

Saltdean United are the visitors on Thursday 6th April at 7:45pm. The Robins then go to Hill Park on Tuesday 18th at 7:30pm.

Sunday matches take place at Steyning Town on the 9th and home to St Francis Rangers and Shoreham on the 16th and 23rd respectively.

The Ladies are level on points at the top of the Sussex Women's Premier League but with two games in hand on Shoreham.

Their April gets underway at home to Saltdean United on Sunday, kicking off at 2pm. The Tigers eliminated the Robins from the League Cup when inflicting a first defeat of the season in any competition on Sean Perkins' side in February.

Two weeks later on Sunday 16th and six points will be up for grab in a double header at local rivals Burgess Hill Town.

The Ladies season will then continue into May with Pagham at home on Wednesday 5th, Burgess Hill at the Beacon on Sunday 14th and a double header to complete the campaign away against Bognor Regis Town on Sunday 28th.

The veterans are scheduled to play twice, travelling to Montpelier Villa this Sunday before making the trip to Lewes on Sunday 16th. Both games are 4pm kick offs.



Benson strikes late to help Hassocks claim point from title chasing Newhaven

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 25th March 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 2-2 Newhaven

Non-League Day 2023 will be fondly remembered by Hassocks. A biggest league crowd at the Beacon in more than 20 years, an excellent point from a 2-2 draw with title chasing **Newhaven and over 300 items** collected for the Hassocks Community Food Bank.

Those donations came in response to the Robins offering cheaper admission to anyone who brought along a tin to help those who really need it during these difficult times.

Both Hassocks and Newhaven fans more than delivered in that regard before the players put on an enthralling 90 minutes of football.

This was ultimately a more useful point for the Robins than it was their visitors. Whilst Hassocks strengthened their hopes of a top six finish, the gap between the Dockers and leaders Broadbridge Heath was extended to four points.

It is not the first time Newhaven have seen their title hopes dealt a blow against Hassocks on Non-League Day. Last season, the Robins picked up a shock 1-1 draw at the Trafalgar Ground which all-but ended Newhaven's hopes of overhauling Littlehampton Town and Saltdean United.

With five games still to play, this vear's stalemate is nowhere near as terminal. But Liam Benson's equaliser with eight minutes remaining may yet hard past Buss. prove a crucial moment in deciding who of Heath, Newhaven or even Crawley Down Gatwick are crowned champions in four weeks time.

There was drama before the game had even kicked off when one of the assistant referees injured himself during the warm up.

Hassocks vice chairman Owen John was thrust into linesman duties with Jason Tighe taking over behind the bar, much to Dave John's delight.

The first half was fast and frantic. Hassocks opted to play with the

strong wind behind their backs. helping them create a couple of good opportunities.

An early chance came when Benson latched onto a long ball over the top of the right hand channel. Benson drilled a shot low and hard across the goal which just eluded Phil Johnson lurking at the back post.

Hassocks had strong penalty appeals turned down on 20 minutes when another long pass was chased into the box by Johnson.

Newhaven goalkeeper Jake Buss misjudged the bounce as he advanced, completely missed the ball and wiped out Johnson.

Incredibly, referee Mark Spence saw nothing wrong with it. Had the incident taken place anywhere else on the pitch, it surely would have been a foul.

Buss had been clumsy rather than malicious but that could not be said for some of the other heavy challenges put in by both sides.

The game was very stop-start as a result with a constant flow of free kicks disrupting proceedings and leading to nearly 10 minutes of stoppage time at the end of the first half alone.

It was in the third of those minutes that the Robins opened the scoring. Benson and tall striker Jamie Wilkes linked up well to release Leon Turner, who slalomed his way around three rough tackles and fired low and

Johnson was kicked to the ground for the third time seconds before the break in a challenge which meant he was unable to continue in the second half. Head coach James Westlake let Mr Spence know he was unimpressed and received a booking at the interval as a result.

Pat Harding came on and proved to be an excellent outlet with Hassocks now playing into the wind, holding the ball up and bringing others into play as the hosts began to Loversidge, Bull, J Westlake, exhibit some lovely passing football in Broomfield (unused).





the final 20 minutes.

Before that point however, the Robins fell 2-1 behind. On the hour mark, Lukas Franzen-Jones floated in a free kick from the right headed past Hassocks debutant goalkeeper Fraser Trigwell by Henry Watson.

Newhaven moved into a 2-1 lead 10 minutes later when Franzen-Jones hit a long free kick which an unexpected gust of wind suddenly caught and carried over the head of Trigwell.

The Hassocks response to going behind was excellent as they dominated the game and patiently waited for their chance to equalise.

It duly came when Josh Bradley received a throw and looped the ball over the head of Jack Meers. Benson was onto it in a flash, outpacing and outpowering Meers before clipping the ball over Buss from what seemed an impossibly tight angle.

The quality of the finish was spectacular and no less than Benson deserved having shown plenty of hard work and endeavour.

Hassocks might have even won the game moments later. Harvey Blake and Bradley linked up down the right with a cross finding its way to the unmarked Turner at the back post. Turner seemed certain to score, only for Buss to appear from nowhere and pull off a quite unbelievable save.

That proved to be the final opportunity. Hassocks were pleased with their point but had the game gone on a little longer, they felt they could have gone onto take all three.

Two injury time goals rescue a precious point for Hassocks

With the 90 minutes up at Godstone Road, Hassocks Under 23s looked like they were about to lose for the first time in nine Southern Combination League Under 23 North Division matches.

The Robins trailed Lingfield 3-1 with the trip just over the Sussex border into Surrey proving to be as hard as head coach Neil Parker had predicted beforehand, despite the Lingers place in mid table.

What followed was pure drama as two stoppage time goals from Hassocks salvaged the most unlikely of points from a 3-3 draw.

Since the Robins last played a fortnight ago, there has been a big change in the North Division with Alfold withdrawing and having their record expunged.

Hassocks had played Fold only once so far and that game ended in defeat, so there points haul was unaffected by the withdrawal.

This was not the case for some of the sides vying to knock the Robins off top spot, who had won or drawn against Alfold and have now seen those points removed.

Broadbridge Heath had been Hassocks' closest pursuers but they dropped to fourth as a result of the adjustments.

Horley Town moved into second, which meant the Robins' lead was extended to 14 points without needing to kick a ball.

The Clarets have since been overtaken by Roffey, who cut the gap to 11 in the process by beating Heath 3-2 at the Countryside Stadium whilst Hassocks were drawing at Lingfield.

Heath still have two games in hand on Hassocks but are now 15 points behind; the Robins trip there next month now looks pivotal.

So many twists and turns serve as a reminder of what a useful point this was for Hassocks, especially when they looked dead and buried so late in the game.

To come from behind at such a tough place - Lingfield are unbeaten at home in the league this season - will do wonders for confidence and belief going into the run in.

There were two chances from the Robins side who had beaten Horsham YMCA 3-1 last time out.

Marshall Smith was promoted into the starting XI to replace Josh Bradley, now back in the first team after completing a four-game ban.

Jude Wallis was unavailable and his place was taken by Ed Tobias, rewarded for his excellent season in the Under 18s with a first start for





the Under 23s.

This proved to be a shrewd decision as Tobias marked his full debut with a goal.

Frankland pushed his claims for a first team recall by scoring his second from four Under 23s appearances so far this season.

The other Hassocks goal getter was Sam Geard, who has been in a rich vein of form since returning to the Beacon following a brief spell at Montpelier Villa.

Geard now has four in his past seven outings and five for the season in total, moving him level with top scorer Charlie Broad.

For Lingfield, Jimmy Williams, Tyler Dhanipersad and Paris Jackson got the goals that looked for the most part like they were going to deliver three points for the hosts.

Beveridge gives Robins revenge against disgruntled Hawks

March 28th 2005: Hassocks completed an excellent Easter weekend by winning 1-0 at home against title chasing Whitehawk in front of a bumper crowd at the Beacon
