Our friends from Crawley Down Gatwick are the visitors and we hope their players, management, committee and supporters enjoy their stay with us this afternoon.

The Anvils arrive here in the thick of the promotion chase and will therefore provide another tough examination of where we stand at the Beacon resulted in a closeend of an encouraging first season under the management of Westy.

But before we talk about first team matters, there are two massive midweek fixtures to bring to your attention and for which your support would be hugely appreciated.

On Wednesday evening, the Under 23s host Loxwood here at the Beacon in a 7:45pm kick off, when three points will secure our first ever league title at Under 23 level.

Admission prices are £3 for adults, £1 for concessions and free for under 16s for the chance to potentially see a little bit of club history made.

Then on Thursday night, the Under 18s travel to Newhaven in the semi finals of the League Cup.

The young Robins advanced all the way to the final four of the Sussex Dennis Probee Youth Cup, being the last Southern Combination side remaining in the competition.

They will be hoping to go one better in their other knockout competition and reach the final for the first time since 2018.

Kick off at the Trafalgar Ground is at 8pm and as far as we are aware, admission is free.

Our most recent first team match fought 2-1 defeat at the hands of Crowborough Athletic and it was the same result a week ago at Bexhill United.

Whilst our form since the turn of the year has been excellent, we are now seeing that there is a gap in quality between the top half of the league and the bottom.

With seven of our final eight games coming against those above us in the standing, that has meant a challenging final month as we battle for a first top 10 finish since 2013-14.

The games do not get any easier either. On Monday morning, we travel to the Birchwood Ground to take on Steyning Town.

It will be the third meeting of the campaign between ourselves and the Barrowmen.

The previous two have been packed with incident; we squandered a 2-0 lead on Boxing Day to lost 3-2

in the final minute before eliminating Steyning from the quarter finals of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup last month on penalties.

Kick off is at 11am and despite the early start, both sides are sure to be riled up with the fixture having developed a little bit of needle in recent years.

We then travel to Lingfield next Saturday before our final game of the campaign on Saturday 22nd April at home to Eastbourne Town.

Following that, our End of Season presentation afternoon takes place on Sunday 7th May here at the Beacon.

All supporters are invited to attend as we toast and celebrate what could yet end up being a very memorable campaign with several chances to add silverware to the Beacon trophy cabinet.

Future fixtures are all listed in today's programme and we hope to see you supporting as many of the teams as possible over the coming weeks.

Down on the other hand could name up to four former Robins in their squad for this afternoon.

Goalkeeper Dave Carruthers

spent the 2020-21 season with us after joining from Loxwood, playing seven times in the Covid-19 hit campaign.

In defence, right back **Louis Pittock** made nine appearances over the same period. Pittock signed from Newhaven and went onto play for Shoreham before ending up with Down in the current season.

Centre back **Mark Zydonik** signed for Hassocks in the summer and played six times at the start of the campaign, scoring once before returning to Broadbridge Heath.

His second spell with the Bears was short lived and now he finds himself an Anvil.

Midfielder **Harvey Enticknap** made 73 appearance for Hassocks after joining in 2018, registering four goals. He signed for Down in 2021.

Other players to have represented both clubs in recent times include **Charlie Pitcher,** who was our top scorer in 2020-21 and followed that up by winning the Anvils' golden boot last time out. He is now at Littlehampton Town via Burgess Hill.

Hassocks youth team product Jake Lindsey had a brief spell at Down last season whilst going back more than a decade, progressive winger Lee Waterhouse was a popular figure for Anvils and Robins.

Robins left raging after refereeing decision extends goal drought

After the feast comes the famine. Since scoring seven unanswered goals past Roffey on August Bank Holiday Monday, Hassocks have now failed to find the back of the net in 270 minutes of football.

Their third successive blank was drawn in an unusually low-quality game away at Crawley Down Gatwick, settled in the final 10 minutes in favour of the Anvils when substitute Oli Leslie scrambled home the only goal.

Games between Down and the Robins are normally high-scoring, enthralling affairs.

The two clubs have swapped players frequently over the past few seasons and that has added to the intrigue.

Rather than footballing entertainment taking centre stage, the main talking point on this occasion focussed on a controversial piece of officiating early in the second half which left Hassocks incensed.

Leon Turner slipped in Pat Harding for a one-on-one with home goalkeeper Alex Bellingham, who produced a superb save low down to his right.

Ex-Anvil Phil Johnson latched onto the loose ball, only to be brought down by Bellingham.

No matter thought Hassocks when Jack Troak picked up the pieces, firing into the bottom corner of the empty net.

Then the assistant referee's flag went up for an offside against Troak. The Robins subsequently expected referee Ian Lane to point to the spot for the foul on Johnson, which had occurred prior to the offside.

Incredibly, Mr Lane concluded Bellingham had done nothing illegal when hauling to ground his former teammate and Troak's goal was chalked off. Nothing worth mentioning occurred prior to that incident. The opening 45 minutes was a scrappy affair with neither side managing to string more than a couple of passes together.

Neither Alex Harris - making his 100th appearance for Hassocks - nor Bellingham had a save of any note to make.

The Robins got on top after the break via their wingers. Turner down the right was the best Hassocks player on the park with another positive performance of the sort that has made him a firm fan favourite already following his summer move from Croydon.

Troak was his usual busy self on the opposite flank. If anyone was going to break Hassocks' scoring drought, then it looked likely to be either he or Johnson.

Shortly after the penalty offside incident and Johnson linked up beautifully with Lewis Westlake on the edge of the Down box.

The duo managed to work some space for Westlake to reach the byline and his return pass found Johnson in a really good position. Unfortunately, Johnson's effort could not trouble Belllingham.

Down began to get a foothold in the game following that spell of Hassocks domination.

Home man-of-the-match Michael Belli hit the bar with an outrageous strike from distance.

A couple of crosses then flashed

across Harris' goal with Hassocks lucky that no red shirt was on hand to convert.

It began to feel as the second half wore on that the tie would either finish 0-0 or be decided by a scrambled goal from a set piece.

And so it proved. Hassocks ended up being their own worst enemy when conceding an unnecessary free kick in a wide area with seven minutes remaining.

The ball was delivered to the back post, from where it was nodded back across goal.

Having failed to win the first header, the Robins also passed up the opportunity to clear at the second, third and fourth attempt.

Eventually, Leslie made them pay when smashing home at the back post, just eight minutes after he had replaced Sam Clements.

Hassocks rang the changes after that to try and elicit a response but Down saw out the short time left pretty comfortably, leaving the Robins to reflect on a missed opportunity to claim at least a point.

They could have done it with it ahead of their next two Premier Division fixtures, tough matches against early league leaders Broadbridge Heath and current third place side Horsham YMCA.

Robins overcome injuries with Johnson and Czech downing Down

The Sussex County League Division One season may only be nine games old, but already this meeting between Hassocks and Crawley Down Gatwick had a must-win feel about it.

Hassocks came into the game with just one win to their name, leaving them fourth bottom at the start of play.

Down have endured an even more miserable start. Relegation from the Isthmian League at the end of last season meant a total rebuild of the playing staff over the summer.

Their new-look young squad has taken time to gel and they arrived at the Beacon as one of the three teams below Hassocks in the standings.

And that is where they remain for now. First half goals from Aaron Czech and Phil Johnson helped the Robins to a 2-1 success, giving Dave John hope that his charges have turned a corner.

It has been a case of one step forward, two steps back so far. The ship appeared to be steadying last weekend, when Hassocks eliminated Broadbridge Heath from the FA Vase for their first victory since several key players departed in late August and through September.

The Robins though followed that up with a disappointing Sussex Senior Cup exit at Division Two Bexhill United in midweek.

Hassocks will have happily traded a place in the second round of a competition they are never going to win for three precious league points, however.

The challenge now is to kick on and start climbing the table to ensure that the Robins stay clear of the relegation battle.

If that is to happen, John will know that his charges need to play better than they did here with this being more of a battling point than one earned by quality.

For large parts of the second half

in particular, the Hassocks defence had to soak up a remarkable amount of pressure.

The Robins rode their luck at times, although they were not helped by a succession of injuries which left them with little choice but to play on the counter.

Mercurial midfielder Mark Price lasted only 20 minutes of his first league start of the campaign.

Youth team defender Bradley Tighe came on for his debut with Alex Gathern reverting to centre back and Nick Pitcher pushing forward.

More problems were to follow when Nathan Miles limped off just before half time.

With the reserves in Sussex Intermediate Cup action at Peche Hill Select, Hassocks were only able to name three subs - Tighe, Ellis Common and Phil Wickwar as backup goalkeeper. That meant right back Common taking over from Miles up front.

Common is one of the fastest players at Hassocks. Pairing him with the equally speedy Johnson is what led to the Robins sitting increasingly deep and trying to utilise the pace of their makeshift front two on the break.

Both Price and Miles were still on the pitch when Czech opened the scoring with 10 minutes on the clock.

A really nice passing move swept the ball from front to back and out towards Johnson drifting wide.

He fed Miles to switch left to Czech, cutting inside and letting loose a superb effort that left Down goalkeeper Seb Boss clutching at thin air as it flew into the top corner.

Tighe underlined why he is so highly thought of by setting up the second Hassocks goal for Johnson just 10 minutes after coming on.

The teenager grabbed the ball and launched a quickly taken long throw over the top of a Down defence caught napping.

Johnson accelerated clear and finished past Boss at his near post to double the advantage.

Understandably, there was a fair amount of injury time to be played at the end of the first half and it was in the second additional minute when Down pulled one back.

Hassocks conceded a cheap penalty and although Sam Brock kept out the initial spot kick, Sam Cane was not to be denied and reacted quickest to fire home the rebound.

Scoring so close to the interval gave Down a very obvious boost in the second half.

The Robins meanwhile knew they could afford no further injuries and so their gameplan became all about defending the lead whilst trying to nick a third.

Johnson and Common did not see much of the ball as it became pretty much one-way traffic but for all their possession, Down were unable to find a way past a resilient Hassocks defence consisting of Tighe, Gathern, George Brown and Ashley Marsh.

Take away the elder statesman Marsh and the average age of the backline which finished the game was just 20. A good three points, all things considered.

Century scoring Johnson wins March Player of the Month

That Man Phil Johnson enjoyed himself in March. Four goals in five appearances took him onto 100 in Hassocks colours and earned him a second Player of the Month award in succession.

Johnson won the accolade in February for his free scoring form and it showed no sign of abating in the penultimate month of the campaign before an untimely injury struck.

He notched the important second goal in March's opening fixture, a 2-0 win over struggling Loxwood when converting a Harvey Blake cross helped on by Alfie Loversidge and James Westlake.

A week later and Johnson claimed a brace in a convincing 3-0 win at AFC Varndeanians, moving onto 99 goals in the process.

The first was a clinical one-on-one rifled into the top corner after being played through by Leon Turner. The second was a penalty earned by the impressive Turner which Johnson duly converted with aplomb.

Johnson did not have to wait long to hit his century. Three days later and Hassocks went to Eastbourne United, where he struck after just 11

Playing with the wind in their

favour, the Robins hit a long ball over United plundered their late equaliser the top which caught out the home defence.

Johnson showed great pace and tenacity to power his way through United centre backs Sam Cole and George Olulode before firing low and hard past former Hassocks goalkeeper James Broadbent.

The goal was wildly celebrated and made Johnson just the sixth man to score 100 for the Robins in senior football after Phil Gault, James Laing, Pat Harding, Anthony Hibbert and Robbie Kitchen.

Johnson was not the only player making history for Hassocks in March. Second place in Player of the Month went to goalkeeper James Shaw, who set a club record by keeping five consecutive clean sheets.

The run started against Peacehaven & Telscombe in February with further shutouts following last month against Saltdean United and Horsham YMCA.

In March, Shaw extended the mean streak to more than 270 minutes against Loxwood and then Horsham YMCA.

Agonisingly, he was just four minutes away from a sixth clean sheet in a row when Eastbourne as the Robins had to settle for a point from a 1-1 draw at the Oval.

Shaw added another shutout to his collection a week later in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup third round against Steyning Town, which finished 0-0 after 90 minutes.

That was his hardest earned since joining Hassocks from Tooting & Mitcham in February, requiring a string of important stops to take the game to penalties.

In the resulting shootout, Shaw scored the Robins' fifth penalty and then saved Steyning's ninth from Charlie Robinson to send Hassocks into the quarter finals of the competition.

Third place for March Player of the Month was Turner, looking very much over the long-term injury which kept him out through most of the autumn.

He picked up two Bedlam Brewery Starman awards for his performances in the win at Varndeanians and the useful 2-2 draw against title chasing Newhaven on Non-League Day 2023.

Turner scored in both those matches, as well as claiming two assists for Johnson's brace in the Varndeanians victory.

Under 18s in a second big semi of the season

For the second time this season, Hassocks Under 18s have a big semi final to look forward to after advancing to the last four of the Southern Combination League Under 18 Cup.

The Robins will travel to Newhaven on Thursday night to take on a Dockers side they have struck up quite the rivalry with following an enthralling clash in the Sussex Bluefin Dennis Probee Youth Cup earlier in the season.

Hassocks hosted Newhaven in the quarter finals of that competition, eventually coming out on top in a ding-dong 3-2 victory through goals from George Gladding and an Oliver Goswamy brace.

That left the Robins as the last Southern Combination League side standing in the County Cup, where they bowed out to eventual winners Whitehawk 3-0.

The Dockers will therefore be out for revenge and that should make for quite the 90 minutes at the Trafalgar Ground and a stern test for a very young Hassocks side.

They are all local boys from Hassocks, Hurstpierpoint and Burgess Hill with several only 15-years-old.

Undoubtedly, the Robins have saved their best performances for knockout competitions, doing the club and themselves proud in their first season together as team.

Hassocks' run to the semi finals of the League Cup has not been easy. In the quarters, they had to withstand a lot of pressure away at Seaford Town, defending valiantly and picking their moments to play brilliantly on the counter attack in the second half.

A Will Varley header from a Oliver Parker-Williams cross gave the Robins a 1-0 lead going into half time.

Seaford threw everything they had at Hassocks after the break, the Badgers dominating possession and creating a number of good chances.

The Robins though weathered the storm, followed by Sam Fernley teeing up Varley for a magnificent volley to double the lead on 65 minutes. Varley then repaid the favour, sending Fernley clear to finish a one-on-one with aplomb for a 3-0 victory.

Hassocks had arguably faced tougher opposition in the round of 16 away to Eastbourne United, who had only lost one league game all season and were vying for top spot in the East Division.

It was yet another tight affair and with the game 0-0 at half time, it could have gone either way.

But with United having a defender sent off just before the break for a second bookable offence, Hassocks dominated the second half and thoroughly deserved their 3 -0 victory.

Parker-Williams produced two clinical finishes and a superb Ewan Edwards header from a sumptuous Jack Duckett free kick secured the win. The whole team were excellent, but in particular 15-year-olds Ben Foster and Toby Munt. Unfortunately, Munt is currently ruled out for four weeks with an ankle injury.

In the second round, Hassocks overcame Selsey away from home via a 4-2 penalty shootout success.

Feisty affair goes way of Crows as battle for the top six takes another turn

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 28th March 2023, The Beacon **Hassocks 1-2 Crowborough Athletic**

At the end of a feisty, full blooded 90 minutes of football it was visitors Crowborough Athletic who walked away from Hassocks with three precious points in the fight for a Southern **Combination League top six** finish.

The Crows ran out 2-1 winners to move up to fourth in the Premier Division whilst Hassocks dropped to ninth as the season prepares to enter its final month.

And it looks as though the Robins will have to navigate their last five league matches and the remainder of their Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup campaign without the services of that, including an early booking for top scorer Phil Johnson.

The tackle which forced Johnson off at half time against Newhaven on Saturday was bad enough to necessitate a trip to A&E.

X-rays did not detect any serious damage, even though Johnson described the pain he is still in to the same leg he fractured in 2019 as being worse than when that break occurred.

Rest is for the time being the only remedy, leaving a frustrated Johnson to spectate from the sidelines whilst marooned on 199 career games for Hassocks. He deserves better.

Not that Johnson's teammates missed him too much in the opening five minutes. That was how long it took Hassocks to take the lead via a well worked goal from Josh Bradley.

A ball dropped invitingly for Mike Williamson 30 yards out. The temptation must have been there to have a crack on the volley, yet Williamson resisted it and instead played a perfect first-time pass right to Bradlev.

There suddenly appeared a gap between Jack Mayhew and visiting captain Tom Boddy which Bradley was able to expertly drill a shot through from the edge of the box, picking out the bottom corner.

Two more good opportunities

came the Robins' way in the next five minutes, both again involving Bradley.

Pat Harding did really well to turn on a sixpence and cross from the byline. Bradley collected on his chest and managed to get around Will Puffette. Crows goalkeeper Martin Grant was off his line guick enough to force Bradley into lifting his effort just a little too high over the bar.

Bradley then found Liam Benson, whose mazy run took him around four Crowborough defenders before a superb last ditch tackle from Puffette prevented a shot on goal.

Challenges began flying in after Bradley who slid away the legs of Rory Salter after an offside flag had halted a Crows attack.

It was from a marvellous 50-50 win by tall striker Jamie Wilkes that the next chance arrived for Hassocks on the 27 minute mark.

The rangy Wilkes and Ollie Hyland were both fully committed to reaching a loose ball. Wilkes came out on top but his intervention would not guite fall right for Harding, giving Puffette the chance to make another vital block.

Crowborough levelled the game six minutes later. Harvey Blake attempted to cut out a cross-field Crows pass by getting it under control, only to have possession pinched from him by Jacob Lambert who advanced to fire low and hard past James Shaw.

The visitors had barely threatened up until that point but the goal gave them renewed confidence and they ended the first half the better team.

An early offside flag left the Crowborough supporters gathered in the Maurice Boxall Stand incensed when Harry Forster went through and beat Shaw on the stroke of half time.

Having done his best to let the game flow despite its physicality in the opening 45 minutes, Mr Head reverted to a completely opposite





approach after the break with fouls and free kicks galore awarded.

In a way, this suited Hassocks as Jack Troak was having one of those days where every delivery he produced was dangerous.

The Robins though were unable to take advantage. The tone for that was set nine minutes after the restart, when three red shirts somehow contrived to defy all the known laws of geometry by diverting a Troak corner miles wide despite being stood a yard from goal.

Next, a Troak free kick was met with a good Alex Bygraves header striking the post. Benson could not quite force the rebound in from a tight angle.

Ironically, it was with a set piece of their own that Crowborough scored what proved to be the winner with 17 minutes left to play.


Lambert sent a straight free kick into the box from 35 yards out and the head of Harvey Killick beat the attempted punch of the advancing Shaw to head home.

There were plenty of set piece based opportunities for Hassocks to equalise after that. Benson headed a Troak free kick against the bar followed by a Troak corner leading to an almighty scramble in which Blake and Bygraves had efforts blocked.

With the final free kick of the game, Troak went for goal himself. Just for a second, it looked like Grant might be caught out but the Crows goalkeeper did well to adjust his position and palm away from under the bar.

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 1st April 2023, The Beacon Bexhill United 2-1 Hassocks

Facing seven of the Southern Combination League Premier Division's top 10 in their final eight games of the season was always likely to make the run-in difficult for Hassocks.

Quite how difficult was laid bare as the Robins went down 2-1 in the last minute at Bexhill United, suffering back-to-back defeats for the first time since December.

The Polegrove is never an easy place to go. The Pirates sailed through the previous campaign unbeaten at home and although they have lost five times this season on their own turf, all those defeats have been against sides above them in the table.

Hassocks were unable to trouble that statistics, making the trip to the east of the county two points and one place worse off in the standings.

With that gap extended to five points and Bexhill now up to seventh, the Robins' hopes of a top six finish are starting to diminish.

Still, to even be in with a shot of such a lofty position represents an excellent first season at the helm for James Westlake.

Taking points from Hassocks is now seen as a big thing. This was evidenced by the scenes of celebration amongst the players and fans of the Pirates come full time, and by the way in which Bexhill manager Ryan Light spoke about the Robins afterwards.

"It wasn't pretty, we knew it would be a scrap and we knew would have to play the long game as teams like Hassocks are not ones you can put to bed lightly," said Light.

The Robins were without injured top scorer Phil Johnson and winger Josh Bradley, two of their leading attacking lights since the turn of the year.

Johnson had missed the 2-1 midweek defeat at home to Crowborough Athletic in which Bradley had scored.

Alfie Loversidge taking over on the right flank from Bradley was the only change Westlake opted to make from the Crows game.

Hassocks were to be dealt a further blow to their forward repertoire when Leon Turner limped off injured eight minutes before half time.

His place was taken by Joe Bull, who struck the opening goal early in the second half with a quality effort from distance.

Oliver Hull was not convincing with his attempted clearing header from a Jack Troak delivery and that gave Alex Bygraves the opportunity to nod back to the edge of the area, where Raging Bull was lurking.

The ball set up for him to drive a crisp left footed volley back through the crowded box and beyond unsighted Bexhill goalkeeper Alex Zamani.

It was a difficult finish, as evidenced by the fact Bull hit the deck as it whistled home having stretched to connect. He celebrated whilst lying on his back, like an upside down tortoise.

That was the first moment of class following an opening 45 minutes lacking in much to write home about.

Neither James Shaw nor Zamani were particularly worked with Hassocks looking most dangerous down the right flank.

Loversidge embarked on a couple





of probing runs and he was ably supported on the overlap by Harvey Blake, the Robins' best player on the day.

As well as complimenting Hassocks, Light praised his own side's patience. "At 1-0 down, I was so impressed with our strength of character to not panic and stick to the game plan, and we got the rewards for that."

Yet for all the Pirates' patience, the two goals which turned the game around came via some poor defending from Hassocks, as was the case with both Crowborough goals four days earlier.

The equaliser arrived on 63 minutes. Zamani hit a long free kick 70 yards down the pitch to the edge of the Robins box.

All of Bradley Tighe, Jamie Wilkes and Mike Williamson converged to try and deal with it, resulting in the latter producing an unfortunate flicked header back towards his own goal.

That put Evan Archibald in and the veteran striker gleefully accepted the opportunity, coolly lobbing the ball as it bounced over the advancing Shaw.

In keeping with much of the preceding 90 minutes, the winning Bexhill goal in injury time was low on quality.

A scuffed corner barely had the required power to make it to the six yard box. Archibald reacted before anyone in red, darting to the neat post and scooping the ball over his own shoulder and into the box where Joe Summerbell darted in to head home from four yards.

Robins closing in on North Division title after easily cutting down Oakmen

JJ Minty was absent and Marshall Smith dropped to the bench. Coming in were George Mercer, Jude Wallis





and Luke Marshall, making just his second start of the campaign back from university for the Easter break.

Marshall certainly made the most of opportunity, getting on the scoresheet with a typically towering header from a set piece opportunity.

He was joined by another promising youngster in Phil Gault, who scored his fifth of the season from only five appearances to move level with Sam Geard and Charlie Broad in the race for the Robins golden boot.

Tom Frankland and substitute Jay Hudson completed the rout, with Hassocks even having the kind manners to provide Oakwood with their consolation via a Jack Thomas own goal.



Easter Monday sees us making the short trip to Birchwood Ground to take on Steyning Town and you know what that means - yes, another important game against a top six rival but also the chance to win their famous meat raffle!

Steyning Town this season

Steyning have enjoyed a remarkably similar season to ourselves so far with a new manager overhauling a squad to turn the Barrowmen into surprise challenges for the top six. Kevin Green made the move to the Birchwood Ground from Montpelier Villa and currently has Steyning flying high in fifth position. They have won 19, drawn six and lost nine of their 34 matches so far. That leaves the Barrowmen chasing their highest league finish since they were the dominant side of Sussex football in the 1980s - a seriously impressive achievement for Green in his first season at the helm.

Head-to-head

Meetings between ourselves and Steyning have been few and far between because of Town's spell in the Wessex League 1990s. 15 times the sides have faced off; five in the Premier Division, four in Division One, four in the Sussex Senior Cup and twice in the RUR Cup. We have won seven, drawn five and lost three, so there is never much in it.

Last time we met

Less than a month has passed since we clashed at the Beacon in the third round of the RUR Cup. Nothing could separate the sides after 90 minutes in a surprisingly entertaining 0-0 draw, followed by the first 17 penalties of the subsequent shootout all being

scored before we eventually triumphed 9-8 from the spot.

How to get to the Birchwood Ground

Make your way to the A283 Steyning bypass and continue on it once you reach the roundabout with Bramber Castle. Take the second left off the bypass onto Canons Way followed by an immediate right onto Henderson Walk. Following this road around to the right, turn right onto S Ash then left onto Farnefold Road. Follow this onto Middle Mead, turn left at the end onto the Shooting Field and you will find the ground a little way up on the right.

Lingfield this season

Lingfield have seen some big hitting players leave over the past year or so, such as Sam Lemon and Sam Clements. Some might have expected them to struggle with those losses, but they have enjoyed a solid enough campaign spent almost entirely in mid table. This is made more impressive when you consider they have had to surrender home advantage on several occasions due to problems with the Godstone Road pitch requiring fixtures to be reversed to get them played. The Lingers are currently 13th in the standings.

Head-to-head

There have been 32 meetings

between ourselves and Lingfield in the past with the Robins leading the head-to-head with 14 wins to the Lingers' 10, leaving eight draws. Lingfield have been the dominant side in recent years. We have won just three of the past nine meetings - a 3-2 Peter Bentley League Cup win at the Beacon in the 2018-19 season, last January's away game and the FA Cup extra preliminary round clash at the Beacon in August.

Last time we met

A four goal thriller at the Beacon back in November with the spoils shared. Dennis Asante put the Lingers 1-0 ahead with just three minutes played before Liam Benson and Jack Troak

gave us a 2-1 advantage going into half time. The visitors equaliser came with 12 minutes remaining from Gus Ward.

How to get to the Sports Pavilion

Our 2021-22 away game at Lingfield was played at Church Road, Whyteleafe, 2020-21 lost to Covid-19 and 2019-20 switched to Steyning. To get to Godstone Road, head to Ardingly and join the B2028 through Turners Hill and Crawley Down. Cross the Dukes Head roundabout and continue following the road until you get into Lingfield. At the T Junction with Plaistow Street take a left onto the B2029 and the Sports Pavillion is on your right a little up the road.

This time around it has taken until the winter for Town to start their normal climb up the standings but it has now started in earnest. their name. A good first year at the helm for MacDonald.

Head-to-head

It is a fixture which Eastbourne Town tend to enjoy. Of the 40 previous matches, Town have won 24 with just 10 Hassocks wins and six draws along the way. Of those 10 fixtures we have won, just two have come in the past 16 years. Phil Gault scored twice in a shock 2-1 win at the Beacon towards the end of the 2016-17 season followed by our Valentine's Day trip to the Saffrons...

Last time we met

Phil Johnson scored the only goal of seasor the game on a memorable evening as Town.

we returned from Eastbourne Town with three points for the first time since 2006. Johnson struck early in the second half following beautiful link up play between wide men Alfie Loversidge and Leon Turner. The Robins defence then held firm in the face of a lot of pressure for a deserved and rare victory at the Saffrons.

Played for both

We currently have two former Town players in our squad. Sam Smith began his senior career at the Saffrons a decade ago whilst JJ Minty turned out for Town earlier in the season dual signed from Burgess Hill Town.
