Unfortunately, we were recently informed that Fish has passed away. Fish was one of the players who originally followed Dave John to Hassocks 33 years ago and went onto make in excess of 100 appearances, playing for nearly every side at the club.

He was a tricky winger who contributed plenty of goals and assists. Fish was also a friendly person, and had taken in a number of Hassocks games as a spectator in the last couple of years.

Everyone at the Beacon would like to pass on our condolences to his family at this difficult time. RIP, Fish.

As for today, Eastbourne Town are the visitors and we extend a warm welcome to their players, management, committee and supporters.

Both sides still have to much play for this afternoon. Three points for ourselves will guarantee a first top 10 finish since the 2013-14 campaign.

A draw will also be enough should Little Common not win by four clear goals at home to AFC Uckfield Town. If Common draw or lose to the Oakmen, 10th place is ours regardless.

Town meanwhile are fighting a three-way battle for seventh with Bexhill United and Peacehaven & Telscombe.

Our visitors are on 66 points and with a superior goal difference to Bexhill also on 66 with Peacehaven one back on 65.

It is fair to assume there will be plenty of twists and turns this afternoon.

From our point of view, no matter what happens today and whether we end up 10th or 11th, this has been a hugely successful season.

James Westlake has worked tirelessly behind the scenes in enticing quality faces new and old to the Beacon and that has been reflected in some brilliant results and fantastic football.

There is a real spirit amongst the group and excitement about what the foundations that have been put in place this year can lead to going forward.

Today may represent our final Premier Division game of the season, but there is still plenty more football to be played.

Our Under 23s face Broabridge Heath away on Thursday night then on Friday night, the Under 18s are at home to Shoreham in a 7:30pm kick off.

The Ladies have the opportunity to join the Under 23s in winning a league title and they play every weekend through May.

Their fixtures can be found in today's programme, entry to home games is free and any support will be gratefully received.

We also believe the Sussex FA are due to make an announcement early next week with regards to the RUR Cup, so please keep your eyes and ears peeled for any announcement—more of that elsewhere in today's programme.

The 2022-23 was one of change at Eastbourne Town. With that in mind, this afternoon's visitors can be relatively pleased with a guaranteed top nine finish

It maintains their proud record of always placing in the top half of the Southern Combination Premier Division since relegation from the Isthmian League in 2014 and gives Jude MacDonald a good base to build on moving into his second season in charge.

Former Whitehawk boss MacDonald replaced John Lambert at that impressive sequence. the helm last summer. Lambert's were big boots to full, having been in prior to that 1-0 Valentine's Day win, the dugout at the Saffrons for many successful years.

Under him, Town lifted the Sussex RUR Charity Cup in 2015, finished Premier Division runners up a year earlier and come mighty close to promotion on three occasions.

It has been a case of evolution rather than revolution under MacDonald, although one aspect that second time this season following remained from the Lambert Era was Town being notoriously slow starters to the season before finding rhythm from autumn onwards.

When we were due to visit the

Saffrons for our first league meeting in November, Town were 14th in the table.

By the time the game did eventually take place in February, they had risen to fifth following a run of just three defeats in 23 matches.

Remarkably, we were the side who inflicted loss number four of

We say remarkable, because no Hassocks side had won at the Saffrons for 17 years.

In truth, our record here at the Beacon against Town is not much better. 2017 was the last time Town left Mid Sussex defeated, which should be enough to make them favourites to head back to the Sunshine Coast with victory for the their Sussex Senior Cup win in December.

Hassocks though have made a habit of upsetting the apple cart this season. Time for one more shock?

Prior to this season, links between ourselves and Eastbourne Town have previously been few and far between.

We now though have two former Town players within our ranks. The first is **Sam Smith**, who began his senior career at the Saffrons after moving across Eastbourne from the Under 19s setup at National League South side Borough.

Smith played Isthmian League football whilst with Town, making his debut in the 2013-14 season and going onto play four times.

His best run of games for Town came when they returned to the Southern Combination League, going

onto play a further 24 times across the backline before moving to Loxwood.

The other is **JJ Minty**, dualsigned by James Westlake in November from Burgess Hll Town.

Miny began the current campaign with Eastbourne Town on a similar arrangement from the More Than Tyres Stadium

He played 10 times for Town, scoring twice including on his debut in a 3-0 win away at Roffey on the opening day of the season.

Previous players to have turned out for both clubs include **Scott Kirkwood,** who enjoyed a very brief spell at the Beacon in the 2018-19 season as he looked to get minutes

under his belts ahead of returning from injury for Horsham. Kirkwood had previously played for Town.

Former Town goalkeeper **James Broadbent** picked up a clean sweep of Players' Player, Managers' Player and Supporters' Player of the Season during his one year with us, playing a huge role in keeping the club in the Premier Division in Great Escape of 2016-17.

Striker **Dan Smith** played for Town in their Isthmian days having rattled through three separate spells with us.

Smith ended up making 63 appearances and scoring 26 goals in his Robins career.





Tuesday 14/02/23. The Saffrons

First win at Eastbourne Town for 17 years is perfect Valentine's gift

Forget overpriced cards and flowers that die within a couple of days. Hassocks gave speed. Neither side proved their fans a proper Valentine's present by winning away at **Eastbourne Town for the first** time since the 2005-06 season.

Phil Johnson struck early in the second half to decide the game 1-0 in favour of the visitors, 17 years and six days on from the Robins' last success at the Saffrons.

Stuart Faith scored on that occasion as Hassocks won by the same scoreline whilst Pat Harding remarkably was in the starting XI for both victories despite the passage of approaching two decades.

What made this result even more impressive than the scarcity of Hassocks victories in this part of the world was that Town came into the game as one of the most in-form teams in the county.

The Robins had been originally due to visit the Saffrons in the middle of November when Town sat 14th in the Premier Division.

Three postponements caused by the FA Vase, freezing temperatures and a waterlogged pitch meant that by the time the sides did finally meet on the most romantic day of the year, Jude MacDonald's side had climbed to fifth place.

A run of only three defeats from Town's past 23 matches against Southern Combination opponents included a 1-0 Sussex Senior Cup victory at the Beacon in December.

Having hit the woodwork three times, Hassocks felt hard done by that evening. There was no repeat this time around.

Johnson clinically despatched one of the three opportunities the Robins fashioned.

At the other end, Hassocks were well organised and resolute in restricting Town to even fewer chances to make it three clean sheets from five matches since the turn of

the year.

The game went off at breakneck particularly adept at keeping the ball in the opening 15 minutes, meaning things ebbed and flowed readily from end-to-end.

Jack Troak flashed an early cross into the box which just eluded Johnson at the back post with only three minutes played.

Eight minutes later and James Westlake turned over possession and fed Johnson, who managed to find the room to get a shot off despite being a tight spot.

Home goalkeeper Chris Winterton proved equal to it, making a fine stop low down to his left.

James Shaw made a similarly impressive stop diving the opposite way with 17 minutes on the clock from the lively Aaron Capon.

Town's number nine had looked to be their main threat in the early exchanges.

He was soon though marked out of the game by Sam Smith, promoted into the Hassocks starting XI against his former club at centre back alongside Alex Bygraves.

Capon managed to escape the attentions of Smith only once more, meeting a probing left wing cross from Ollie Davies with a header on the half hour mark which luckily for the Robins was not converted.

That proved to be it in terms of opportunities for Town. Hassocks ended the first half stronger. A typically mazy run forward at pace from Leon Turner earned a corner which came to nothing.

Westlake then squandered a glorious chance to give his side the lead seconds before the interval.

The Hassocks head coach found himself in a fantastic position with only Winterton to beat but he placed his shot too close to the Town goalkeeper, who made a fine save.

The second half was just two minutes old when Hassocks found what proved to be the only goal of the game.

A Town attack broke down and once the Robins managed to release their two young and speedy wingers Turner and Alfie Loversidge on the counter, the hosts looked in trouble.

Turner and Loversidge combined beautifully to slice through the home defence, presenting Johnson with a chance which he finished with aplomb to give Winterton no chance.

The Robins top scorer moved onto 17 for the season and 93 career goals for Hassocks in the process. The race to reach 100 before the end of the campaign is very much on.

MacDonald responded to seeing Town fall behind by making three substitutions in the space of four minutes and the following 20 minutes or so became almost as frantic as the start of the game.

No matter what Town tried however, they could find no way through a Hassocks side now set up with two deep lying banks of four and looking to again utilise Turner and Loversidge on the break.

If anything, it was the Robins who looked more likely to add a second when counter attacking than Town did trying to force an equaliser.

There were though no further goals and Hassocks left with a famous 1-0 win. Not a bad way to spend a Valentine's Day.

Determined Robins frustrate Town to earn excellent Saffrons point

The wait for a first away win of the season goes on for Hassocks but Dave John cut a much happier figure than on recent travels as his side claimed an excellent point from Eastbourne Town.

Adam Davidson struck early to give the hosts the lead with the Robins battling back to earn a 1-1 draw and what was only their third point on the road thanks to a second half Pat Harding penalty.

Town combine a potent mix of footballing ability and physicality. Whilst Hassocks struggled to match their hosts technically at times, they took the fight to Town and refused to give an inch in a resilient defensive display.

On a good playing surface at the Saffrons, Town knocked the ball around with ease in the first half to leave Hassocks struggling to hang onto their coattails.

Davidson opened the scoring with just 12 minutes on the clock, although how much he knew about the goal is up for debate.

A cross came into the near post where Davidson was stationed, the ball hitting him by chance more than design and diverting past the surprised and flat footed Joel Harding.

Richard Thompson volleyed over a first Hassocks chance on 18 minutes, after which the remainder of the half became a war of attrition in midfield.

Importantly for the Robins, their three of Ian Dawson, Graham Beveridge and Matt Robbins proved equal to Town's central players and that ensured Hassocks were firmly in the game come half time.

They were, however, dealt a blow two minutes before the break when talented young centre half Ashley Marsh limped off injured.

Marsh was the victim of a dreadful tackle from Luke Denton, which if referee Mr Smith had seen clearly merited a red card rather than saw a header of his own given the the yellow which was brandished.

John reported afterwards that Marsh had somehow escaped with only a very badly bruised ankle. It could and looked to have been a lot worse.

Hassocks played out the short time remaining of the first half with only 10 men before changing things up during the interval.

Tom Stripp came on at left wing back with Thompson reverting to an unfamiliar role as part of the three man defence alongside Chris Hewitt and Nick Newman.

Having angered the Robins with his response to the Marsh incident, Mr Smith was in Town's bad books within two minutes of the restart.

Beveridge fell over in the box in a fashion which was almost comedic in nature and much to the despair of Town, the official awarded what can only described as a very dubious

The protests against the decision went on some time. Despite the circus, Harding remained calm and sent Russell Tanner the wrong way from the spot to restore parity.

Hassocks came into the game more following Harding's equaliser and that upped the entertainment as chances came at both ends.

Gary Brockwell headed a good opportunity over and the same player shot wide when well placed.

Thompson then headed a Steve King effort off the line and Harding

same treatment by Carl Harris.

With the game entering the final 20 minutes, Town were becoming visibly and audibly frustrated at their failure to find a way through.

They thought they had on 72 when Lee Walsh hit a powerful shot which appeared destined for the bottom corner.

Harding though proved equal to it, going full stretch down to his left to produce a wonderful diving save.

Tanner had an opportunity to show off his goalkeeping skills next when faced with a trademark 25 yard piledriver from Hewitt.

Initially it looked as though the swerve and dip on the shot was going to do for Tanner, who seemed to be going the wrong way until adjusting at the last possible moment to tip the ball to safety.

Hassocks reverted to manning the trenches again in the final 10 minutes, happy to walk away with a point rather than go for all three and risk leaving with none.

Town threw everything they had at the Robins during that spell but captain Hewitt was having his best game of the season and with Newman and Thompson also excelling, Hassocks held firm.

Under 23s win North Division title for first time in Hassocks history

Hassocks Under 23s have been crowned Southern Combination League Under 23 North Division champions with two games to spare of an historic 2022-23 season.

It is the first time the Robins have lifted a league title at Under 23 level, since it was brought in at the start of the 2015-16 campaign to replace reserve team football.

Hassocks had needed three points from their three remaining fixtures against Loxwood, Oakwood and Broadbridge Heath to secure the title.

That was until Loxwood informed the league they would not be completing their remaining matches.

Hassocks were awarded the three points and with that, the Robins were champions.

It is richly deserved with Hassocks having dominated the North Division all season.

The Robins have dropped just four points, winning 14, drawing one and losing one of their 16 games to date.

That sole reversal came at the end of September, when Horley Town ran out 3-0 victors at the Beacon.

The Clarets are one of five teams who could finish as runners up to Hassocks, with just three points separating Horley, Roffey, Broadbridge Heath, Lingfield and Horsham YMCA.

The Robins have filled that second position three times in the previous three completed seasons.

It is now no longer a case of always the bridesmaid, never the bride.

Hassocks faced a difficult opening month to the campaign. Victory at Roffey was followed by a convincing 6-0 Mid Sussex derby win over St Francis Rangers.

The Robins then lost 2-1 to Alfold, a result expunged from the records after Fold withdrew from the league

in March.

Hassocks bounced back in impressive style by defeating reigning champions Broadbridge Heath 2-0.

A long trip to inside the M25 was made worthwhile with another three points from a roller coaster 4-1 win over league newcomers Chessington & Hook United.

Next came that defeat against Horley, since when Hassocks have not lost a North Division game.

Amongst the more impressive results from October onwards were a 4-1 home win over Roffey and a 3-1 victory at Horley.

The Robins went into half time trailing 1-0 at the New Defence. They showed their champions pedigree in the second 45 minutes with goals from Tom Frankland, Jude Wallis and Wes Tighe completing a magnificent turnaround.

As well as playing some wonderful football, Hassocks have displayed plenty of fight and character on their way to the title.

At Godstone Road last month, they found themselves trailing Lingfield 3-1 as the game ticked into the 90th minute.

Two injury time goals salvaged a point and maintained that proud six month long unbeaten record.

The season has not been without challenges. The Robins have had to overcome several key players moving on for first team football elsewhere in the Southern Combination League.

It has also been difficult at times to build momentum thanks to the weather.

Rain wiped out most of November's fixtures and December was a complete whiteout thanks to the freezing temperatures.

Things improved at the end of January but only slightly. For Hassocks to keep coming back from long periods of inactivity and winning matches makes the way they have run away with the title even more impressive.

Head coach Neil Parker has relied on a mix of youth and experience in his first season at the helm, making particularly clever use of the rules permitting overage players.

Hassocks record goal scorer Phil Gault has turned out regularly since Christmas, netting five goals in five games.

He tops the scoring charts alongside Charlie Broad and Sam Geard.

At the other end of the age scale to Gault, Parker has given opportunities to 11 players from the Robins' Under 18s squad.

Goalkeeper Jack Thomas has played six times whilst midfielder Sam Fernley contributed three goals from seven matches.

Sam Rogers leads the way in terms of appearances with 16 starts. Jack Thomas has started 12 times and come off the bench a further four with Tighe starting 11 along with five outings as a substitute.

For Rogers, it is the second season in a row he has won the North Division championship.

The midfielder captained Broadbridge Heath to the title in 2021 -22.

There are a couple of opportunities to watch the U23s this season, as we travel to Broadbridge Heath on Thursday 27th April in a 7:45pm kick off. They complete their season with a trip to Oakwod on Wednesday the 3rd of May.

Beacon to host Peter Bentley Cup final

Hassocks have been chosen to 1 draw in 90 minutes. hold this season's Peter **Bentley League Cup final** between Newhaven and Crowborough Athletic.

The game will take place on Monday 1st May 2023, kicking off at 1pm.

It marks the fifth time in the past six completed seasons that the Beacon has hosted the final of the Southern Combination League's showpiece flagship knockout competition.

Crowborough booked their place with a 2-0 semi final win over Peacehaven & Telscombe at the Trafalgar Ground.

The Crows are yet to concede a goal in the Peter Bentley Cup this season, having eliminated Lingfield 4-0 and Forest Row 5-0 in the two previous rounds.

Newhaven meanwhile had a tough rough to the final. A 5-1 win at Little Common in round two was routine enough, but next they needed penalties to overcome Bexhill United at the Trafalgar Ground following a 1-

The guarter finals saw the Dockers eliminate Broadbridge Heath, in the process denying the Bears the double if they go onto claim the Premier Division title this weekend as expected.

In their semi, Newhaven overcame Loxwood 2-0 at the Birchwood Ground.

The Dockers are no strangers to Peter Bentley Cup finals. They went down to treble winning Littlehampton Town last season and were beaten 2-1 by Lancing in 2016.

That game was also held at the Beacon with the Lancers' team that day including former Hassocks goalkeeper Josh Green and defender Josh Green.

Two of the Robins' current squad were also involved, Mike Williamson and Alex Bygraves. Williamson was named man of the match whilst Green saved a pivotal penalty in the 51st minute.

Newhaven have better memories of the 2015 final, when they saw off Arundel 3-1 at Gorings Mead to lift

the trophy for the first and only time.

Crowborough meanwhile are also one-time winners of the Peter Bentley Cup. They defeated Sidley 2-1 at the Caburn in 2007.

The Crows most recent final experience came in 2013, when they were beaten by double winners Peacehaven at Culver Road.

Crowborough were moved by the FA into the Southern Counties East League in 2014, where they remained until the start of the current campaign.

To mark their first season back in the Southern Combination with silverware would be an impressive achievement from the Crows.

As is always the case when the Beacon is chosen to host such prestigious matches, the day can only run smoothly with the help of volunteers.

Leslie lifts Down into the promotion picture with Hassocks ruing missed chances

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 8th April 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 0-1 Crawley Down Gatwick

There was a distinct end of season feeling around the Hassocks camp as the penultimate home game of the campaign ended in a 1-0 defeat against Crawley Down Gatwick.

The Robins were without a glut of regulars and have little to play for now with a highest finish since 2013-14 already assured but the top six almost out of reach.

With the likes of Phil Johnson, Jamie Wilkes, Bradley Tighe, Leon Turner, Alfie Loversidge and Josh Bradley all unavailable, James Westlake took the opportunity to reward a number of players who have excelled for the Under 23s and Under 18s this season with a place in the first team squad.

On the bench were youth teamers Sam Fernley, Oliver Parker-Williams and Ed Tobias. Fernley came on for his second senior appearance having made his bow in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup at Forest Row in October whilst Parker-Williams made his debut late on, replacing Joe Bull.

Sam Geard meanwhile was handed his first start of the season having been one of the stars of the Under 23s.

Neil Parker's side were confirmed as North Division champions on Saturday evening when awarded three points after Loxwood informed the league they would not be fulfilling their remaining fixtures.

In contrast to Hassocks' season petering out, Crawley Down remain in the thick of the promotion race. Oli Leslie scoring the only goal of the game on the half hour mark at the Beacon moved the Anvils just a point behind second place Newhaven with a game in hand.

Hassocks had been much the better side before that and could have been two or three goals to the good having created a number of promising chances during the opening 30 minutes.

Geard teed up the first

opportunity, beautifully bringing down a lofted pass from Westlake in the box and laying back to Pat Harding.

Harding's effort lacked the power to overly trouble Down's former Hassocks goalkeeper Dave Carruthers.

Harvey Blake volleyed just wide from outside the area when a Westlake cross was only half cleared before another ex-Robin in Harvey Enticknap somehow managed to deflect a Alex Bygraves shot over the bar from five yards in a scramble from a free kick.

Liam Benson could not quite stretch to meet a Bull cross. It was a similar story from a series of Jack Troak corners which just required a Hassocks touch as they flashed across the face of goal.

Whereas the Robins were unable to make the most of Troak's deliveries, Down scored with their first shot on target from their first corner.

The towering figure of Guy Harding won a header at the back post and Leslie beat James Shaw and Troak to the dropping ball, steering it into the back of the net.

Hassocks lost their momentum after falling behind and it was Down who finished the first half the stronger.

The Anvils' best opportunity to double the lead before the break came when Leslie missed a header from a Ben Connolly cross.

Hassocks used half time to regroup and they began the second 45 minutes in the same sort of positive fashion as they had the first.

Blake went scampering forward to put in a low and hard delivery almost turned in for an own goal by Harding.

Troak sent in the resulting corner which Carruthers showed bravery and a safe pair of hands to gather just ahead of Benson.

Blake then went down in the box claiming a push in the back from





Enticknap. On another day a penalty might have been given, but referee Dominic Barrow had consistently allowed the game to flow through some hard tackles from both sides.

Mr Barrow's approach of using the whistle sparingly certainly helped the entertainment in what was an excellent officiating performance.

Down went on the attack next, Josh Brown crossing deep to the far post where Ben Chowney arrived from right back to volley into the side netting.

Leslie then went to ground under a push from Bygraves after collecting a long ball from Enticknap. It was almost a carbon copy of the Blake penalty shout earlier and again Mr Barrow waved played on.

Hassocks broke straight up the other end, Troak found Westlake to lay off for Benson who bent an effort just over the bar from a good position.

At that point, you sensed it was going to be one of those days where the Robins were destined not to score no matter how much they knocked on the door.

Bull sent Troak clear and he beat Carruthers to the ball, only for Marc Pelling to come sliding across and clear before Benson could convert.

Westlake headed a Blake cross over, another Blake cross bounced to Carruthers just ahead of Harding and Parker-Williams did really well to roll Pelling and looked to have beaten Carruthers, only for a sliding block from substitute Michael Spence to deny the teenager a debut goal.

Low quality goal decides low quality Easter Monday affair at Steyning

Easter Monday entertainment was in short supply at the Birchwood Ground where Steyning Town ran out 1-0 winners over Hassocks.

The match statistics showed just two shots on target all morning and even that would be generous seeing as the only goal from Dom Johnson-Fisher on 77 minutes was more of a hopeful cross than anything else.

Fortunately for the Barrowmen, the ball bounced right in front of James Shaw as he attempted to gather, skidded off the wet 3G surface and evaded the Hassocks goalkeeper on its way into the back of the net.

Such a low quality goal deciding the game was rather apt. Steyning also mustered the only other shot which arrived in injury time, substitute Joe Radley-Martin drawing a sprawling save from Shaw at the end of a counter attack.

Home goalkeeper Lucas Szendela-Goetzke did not have a single save to make. This was just as well from a Steyning point of view as Szendela-Goetzke was playing with an ankle injury which meant he was unable to kick.

The Robins only discovered this well past the hour mark when a rare foray forward resulted left back Rob Clark taking the Barrowmen's first goal kick of the day.

But even then, they were unable to test the true extent of the issue. Szendela-Goetzke will not keep an easier clean sheet in his life.

Hassocks were short on numbers again, as they had been when going down 1-0 at home to Crawley Down Gatwick 48 hours earlier.

James Westlake gave full debuts to youth team duo Sam Fernley and Alex Brewer down the flanks whilst Bradley Tighe answered a late call to play despite being on paternity leave.

In a sign of how thread threadbare the Robins squad is at the moment, Tighe was deployed as a

central midfielder rather than the defensive berth he has permanently filled in his 170 game Hassocks career.

Tighe had the best chance either side mustered through the first half, escaping his marker to meet a Jack Troak corner with a header placed just wide of the post on 21 minutes.

Half chances came to Steyning after, Sam Smith blocking from Max Howell after a rare instance of more than three passes being put together and Westlake throwing himself at a Jack Langford shot.

Conditions certainly were not helping with driving rain and a swirling wind. So dark were the clouds that Steyning had their floodlights on, something no club should be forced to do on an April morning, let alone in a cost of living crisis.

Referee Tazlim Ali did his best to increase the entertainment level in the final five minutes of the first half.

Mr Ali first gave Robins physio Phil Wickwar a long talking too. Little did the official realise it was actually assistant head coach Tom Hughes who had berated him for missing a push on Liam Benson, much to the amusement of the Hassocks bench given there are few similarities between Hughes and Wickwar.

Then on the stroke of half time, Mr Ali awarded Steyning an indirect free kick in the Hassocks box after ruling Shaw had handled a pass back.

What actually happened is Troak had inadvertently put a long ball over the top past his advancing goalkeeper, forcing Shaw to run back towards his line and grab the ball before Langford could fire into the empty net.

Even the Steyning contingent were baffled at how it could be construed a deliberate pass back.

Shaw decreed "I've never seen anything like it on my life" after being booked for booting the ball 70 yards down the pitch in frustration,





sparking something of a melee.

When order was eventually restored, Pat Harding was the man in the Hassocks wall to block the set piece laid off by Jack Barnes to Langford.

The second half was equally slow to get going. Misha Djemaili hit one from distance which did not look far away from the sidelines but had Shaw very nonplussed.

Shaw then came racing from his like to win a header outside the box before chasing the loose ball down the pitch, ending up around 35 yards from his line and leathering a volley into a neighbouring garden. This delighted the crowd.

Steyning began to force the issue a little more in the final 15 minutes. Johnson-Fisher got away from Harvey Blake and crossed for Djemaili. Troak produced an excellent block of the initial effort, followed by Alex Bygraves deflecting the rebound drilled by Barnes behind for a corner.

It was three minutes later that the Barrowmen took the lead, leaving Hassocks with a little less than a quarter hour to try and find an equaliser.

The only time they threatened was when a long Shaw kick was flicked on by Harding. Clark and Dayvarn Downer collided as both attempted to clear and with Szendela -Goetzke unable to advance quick enough to come and gather die to his ankle, the Robins had a half chance.

Nobody though had gambled on Harding winning the header or the Steyning defence getting in a mess and so the opportunity passed.

Benson and Harding get Hassocks back to winning ways in bonus Beacon game

With Godstone Road unable to host Lingfield against Hassocks. the Beacon found itself with a **bonus fixture on the penultimate** serving a 10 minute spell in the sin weekend of the Southern Combination League season.

The Robins put this unexpected home advantage to good use, running out 3-1 winners to snap their seven game winless streak and boost their chances of a first top half Premier Division finish since 2014.

Victory kept Hassocks 10th in the standings, moving them three points and four goals ahead of Little Common, who have a game in hand.

That takes place against local rivals Bexhill United on Tuesday night.

Regardless of what happens there, the Robins know a win over Eastbourne Town in their final game of the campaign will secure their top 10 placing, an excellent achievement in James Westlake's first year in charge.

This clash with Lingfield was the third time the sides have met this season.

A Conor Wilford own goal which went viral with over 750,000 views on Twitter handed Hassocks a 1-0 FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round win back in August whilst the previous league clash ended in a thrilling 2-2 draw.

Neither game had been particularly feisty, so it was something of a surprise to see questionable challenges flying in from the right way, fashioning two more both teams in a heated 90 minutes.

Such was the tension that even Mike Williamson found himself in the middle of it. The normally placid and well-mannered midfielder was the victim of a terrible Havdn Dickinson tackle five minutes before half time worthy of a red card.

Dickinson followed up with a headbutt in the ruckus which followed, something referee Daniel Cooper must have missed. Nothing else could explain why it went

unpunished with only Sam Smith ending up in the book.

Williamson then found himself bin early in the second half after Wilford converted a penalty which brought the scores to 2-1.

Not that playing shorthanded bothered Hassocks, their third goal of the afternoon arriving via Liam Benson whilst Williamson watched on from the bench.

Benson had opened the scoring for the Robins with 14 minutes on the clock via a poacher's finish.

Hassocks had a penalty claim so strong that the 21 other players on the pitch all stopped, waiting for Mr Cooper to point to the spot.

Benson though was not taking any chances and his decision to play to the whistle paid off when he smashed a right footed strike into the bottom corner after Mr Cooper remarkably said no penalty.

The Robins doubled the advantage on 37 minutes with a superb passing move which swept from one end to the other.

It began with James Shaw taking a short goal kick and ended with Super Pat Harding firing a clinical low drive beyond Lingers goalkeeper Tommy Sceal.

Falling two behind clearly did not sit well with Lingfield as the incident involving Dickinson came next, leaving the Robins incensed.

Hassocks channelled this anger in opportunities in the little time remaining before the break.

Jack Troak came on a charge forward from left back, only to hit a volley over the goal, the fence behind the goal and the trees on its way to the railway track.

It was the second Troak shot of the afternoon to pose a danger to passing trains following an almost identical effort resulting in a lost ball in the seventh minute.

Benson then had the ball in the





back of the net on the stroke of half time, only for the goal to be correctly chalked off by the assistant referee for offside.

Lingfield enjoyed their best period immediately after the restart. Shaw was forced into a flying save on the stretch from Richard Wetton before Hassocks conceded that penalty on 56 minutes.

It was confidently despatched by Wilford, going someway towards banishing the memory of his fantastic own goal from eight months ago.

Having just scored and with Hassocks down to 10 for a period, the momentum should have been with Lingfield.

The Robins therefore deserve a huge amount of credit for the way they not only nullified their opponents, but went onto kill the game off with the final goal of the afternoon.

Troak was the creator, delivering a beautiful ball from the left which Benson headed home from five yards for his 18th goal of the campaign.

Lingfield were left deflated and the game petered out from there with only one further opportunity coming for either side.

It fell to Harvey Blake, who ran the length of the pitch to beat three men and smash an effort last seen flying towards Hurstpierpoint for a third lost ball, much to the chagrin of Dave John.

Duckett hits hat-trick for Hassocks in perfect warm up for their big semi

A hectic final fortnight of the campaign for Hassocks Under 18s began in perfect style with an Easter Sunday win away at Steyning Town.

Will Varley joined Duckett on the scoresheet with his 13th of the season, moving to within five of Brewer in their personal battle for the Robins golden boot.

Whilst attention has understandably focussed on Thursday night's big semi at the Trafalgar Ground, Hassocks could still yet finish third in the Central Division standings.

Hassocks pegged back twice in end of season stalemate

April 22nd 2008: Neither Hassocks nor Ringmer had much to play for at the end of the 2007-08 season but that did not stop them putting on an entertaining 2-2 draw at the Beacon

Anyone used to watching games towards the back end of the season could hardly have been disappointed with what Hassocks and Ringmer served up when drawing 2-2 at the Beacon.

It was far from a classic in terms of the football played but under the circumstances was watchable enough.

It is only a pity that is very obvious full-blown love affair with the beautiful game clearly lacks measure on occasions.

Johnson entered into an unsavoury slanging match with a Hassocks support before eventually being hauled back to the away dugout by Ringmer substitute Aaron MacMillian.

Johnson's assistant Paul Thomsett was equally vocal and they gave the officials a testing time all evening.

It was a fiery game for teenager Sol Bowra to make his senior debut for Hassocks in a makeshift back line.

Veteran sweeper and former club captain Chris Hewitt answered Dave John's call to fill in along with another youngster in Ian Simpson.

John seems to be able to pluck

centre backs from anywhere and in Bowra and Simpson, the Robins have unearthed two more this season who should have long careers ahead of them at this level if they want it.

John's replacement in the hotseat for next season Mickey Jewell certainly knows enough about them and the likes of Michael Bates and Laurence Robinson with the first team currently leaning so heavily on players from Jewell's reserve squad.

Hassocks took the lead on seven minutes via a somewhat soft penalty. The assistant referee spotted a Ringmer defender deliberately handballing which even the most ardent Robins fan would have trouble agreeing with.

Not that Spencer Slaughter minded. He put his previous penalty miss behind him by comfortably beating Ringmer goalkeeper Jack Stern from the penalty spot.

Unfortunately for the hosts, the lead only lasted another seven minutes.

A neat Joe Dryer cross from out on the left was put away in excellent goal poaching fashion by Marc Whiteman.

The Ringmer forward was made quite a name for himself this season and it would be a surprise to see him move up to Ryman level for next season.

A minute later and Slaughter nearly caught Stern by surprise with a low first time strike from distance.

It took a wicked bounce off the hard Beacon surface which required the young Ringmer goalkeeper to adjust his dive and turn away.

Stern then did well to put off Richard Thomas when the Hassocks striker opted to chest the ball down when clean through on goal following a splendid defence splitting pass by Richard Thompson.

Letting the ball drop and going for goal first time would have been the

better option for Thomas.

Still, Thomas showed better judgement when putting Hassocks back into the lead on 29 minutes and leaving egg on the face of Stern.

Good work from Robinson resulted in the ball breaking to Thomas 25 yards out. This time he did strike it first time, catching the Ringmer number one in a questionable position.

Stern was left back pedalling to try and retrieve the situation, only succeeding in palming the ball above his own head from where it looped up and dropped into the unguarded goal.

The Robins were only ahead for four minutes second time around. No prizes for guessing who got the Ringmer goal, Whiteman again showing his predatory instincts with a finish on the turn in a very crowded Hassocks box.

Both teams had chances after the break. The Robins looked most dangerous from set piece with Simpson going close to a first senior goal via a couple of towering headers on the end of Slaughter deliveries.

Ringmer's best opportunity fell to Whiteman, denied a hat-trick by a fine save from the feet of Joel Harding.

In the end, a draw was the right result and leaves John with just two more matches in charge before his summer retirement.
