Erith Town are a club on the up. Big crowds, three consecutive top 10 finishes in the Southern Counties East Premier Division and memorable runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase last season mark the Dockers out as dangerous opponents this afternoon

Like ourselves, Erith enjoyed their best campaign since 2013-14 last time out.

A fourth placed finish in the Southern Counties East League Premier Division was their second highest ever placing after the third place achieved nine years previously.

It also maintained their fine record of finishing in the top six in each of the last three completed campaigns.

Even more impressive than the Dockers' league form were there performances in the national knockout competitions - an ominous sign for this afternoon, perhaps.

In the FA Cup, Erith went all the way to the first qualifying round, where they were eliminated by Three Bridges.

Bridges famously went onto draw Hereford United at home later in the competition, putting up a brave fight before elimination in front of a huge crowd at Jubilee Field.

Included amongst their victims in that FA Cup run were Pagham, whom the Dockers hammered 4-0 at Nyetimber Lane.

Five victories in the FA Vase took the Dockers to the fourth round and a draw at the Erith Sports Stadium shootout defeat to Bridgwater United.

Two of those wins came against Southern Combination League clubs, Erith winning 6-0 over Loxwood in the first qualifying round before knocking out Premier Division runners up Crawley Down Gatwick in round

Today represents the fifth clash between Robins and Dockers, the previous four all having also come in the FA Cup.

We have two wins to our name, a 3-1 preliminary qualifying round replay victory at the Beacon in August 2000 and a 3-0 extra preliminary in 2005 with a certain Pat Harding scoring twice.

One game has ended level, a 2-2 leading to that Beacon replay in 2000.

The Dockers meanwhile won on their previous visit to Mid Sussex five years ago, running out 3-1 victors. From a Hassocks point of view, hopefully there will not be a repeat today...

Still no love for the FA Cup as barren run goes on for Robins

It may be the world's most romantic cup competition, but Erith has given the Dockers a real Hassocks are still not feeling the love for the FA Cup after their winless run in the competition was stretched to five years.

You have to go back to 2013 to find the last time Hassocks won an FA Cup game.

That was in the Preliminary Round stage when the Robins eliminated Dorking Wanderers in a

They went onto give Isthmian League side Chipstead a real fright in the next round before succumbing to an unfortunate 2-1 defeat. Since then, the cupboard has been bare.

True, Hassocks didn't enter for two seasons in 2015-16 and 2016-17, but their three other adventures have all ended in the Extra Preliminary Round stage, the latest of which was against Southern Counties East Premier division outfit Erith Town at the Beacon.

Both sides came into the game with identical league records of one point from two games.

Erith opened their campaign with a 4-2 defeat to K Sports, who Hassocks will host in the FA Vase in three weeks time.

They followed that up with a 1-1 draw against Glebe at the Erith Sports Stadium in their first game at their traditional home ground for five years. Since 2013, they've ground shared firstly with Cray Valley PM and then VCD Athletic.

Understandably, the return to boost this season and as a result they arrived at the Beacon in buoyant mood to take on a Hassocks side fresh from a 6-0 hammering at the hands of Chichester City in midweek.

You would have thought that the momentum would be with the visitors then but it took just seven minutes for Hassocks to upset the apple cart, Spencer Slaughter opening the scoring with his first goal of the season.

Slaughter was one of three changes made by Robins boss Mark Dalgleish.

The other saw Will Broomfield come in for his first start of the season at the expense of Dan Webster whilst Harvey Blake was handed a full debut in place of Harry Mills after two promising cameos from the bench since his summer move from Mid Sussex League side Sporting Lindfield.

The lead was short lived as within three minutes, Erith were level through Alex Nelson.

They went into half time 2-1 ahead, Luis Valencia adding the visitors second on 24 minutes.

Whatever Dalgleish said to his side at half time had the desired effect as Hassocks were much the better side at the start of the second half.

The Robins were knocking on the door without ever quite managing to force it open until they were awarded a penalty in the 65th minute.

That proved to be the turning point in the game and not in the way that Hassocks would've hoped as the otherwise outstanding Slaughter saw his spot kick kept out by the visiting goalkeeper.

It knocked the wind from the Robins sails somewhat and thev never really recovered despite throwing on the lively Joe Bull for his debut from the substitutes bench, the former Whitehawk youngster becoming the 299th player to represent Hassocks in the Beacon era in the process.

Still, Hassocks harboured hopes of earning a trip to South East London for a Monday night replay right up until the 89th minute when Valencia finally put the Robins out of their misery with his second and Erith's third of the afternoon.

That set the Dockers up for a meeting with Hassocks' fellow Southern Combination League Premier division side Loxwood in the next round.

For the Robins, it is back to the drawing board as they will have to wait at least another year to try and end their FA Cup hoodoo.

HASSOCKS IN THE FA CUP

The 2022-23 season represents Hassocks' 25th crack at the FA Cup with the Robins furthest run so far seeing them get to within two games of the first round proper. We look back at our previous efforts in the world's greatest cup competition

Rattling the Rooks

Hassocks' best run in the FA Cup came in the 2001-02 season when Dave John's side made it to within two games of the first round proper.

Lewes were the team who ended that most unlikely of dreams, triumphing 3-0 in the third qualifying round.

Ashford Town were seen off 3-2 in the Preliminary Qualifying Round to set up a date with Ash United in the First Qualifying Round.

Nothing could separate the sides in the first game at the Beacon and so it was off to the Shawfield Stadium for a Tuesday night replay.

Three goals in six second half minutes were enough to win the tie for Hassocks and end Ash's unbeaten start to the season as well.

Marc Rendall notched the first in the 70th minute, bringing a Mickey Turner cross under control and slamming the ball into the bottom corner.

Home defender Stuart Woodhouse put through his own net with a volley from a quickly-taken Luke Flomo free kick five minutes later.

And the blitz was completed when Flomo teed up James Laing who beat two defenders to fire home.

The result and performance earned Hassocks the applause of the Ash support and handed the Robins a home tie against Bromley from two divisions higher up the pyramid.

Not many people gave Hassocks a hope going into that one, but the Robins pulled off one of the shocks of the round by comfortably winning 2-0 at the Beacon.

That set up a mouth watering all-Sussex tie at the Dripping Pan, where

Jimmy Quinn's Rooks proved to be too good for Hassocks.

Lewes would go onto make it all the way into the main draw, facing Stoke City at the Britannia Stadium in the first round.

The Robins meanwhile were able to build the Maurice Boxall Stand with the money generated from their cup run, which still stands on the south side of the Beacon today.

Nothing dull about Dulwich

Fast forward four seasons to the 2005-06 campaign and Hassocks nearly equalled that famous run, going out at the second qualifying round stage against Isthmian Premier side Dulwich Hamlet.

Being the only Southern Combination League side left in the competition by that point, there was a bumper crowd at the Beacon of over 300 who witnessed Hamlet squeak through by the tightest of 1-0 margins.

It took four games to get that far in the competition, victories over this afternoon's opponents Erith Town and Chessington & Hook sandwiching two meetings with Hillingdon Borough, the Robins knocking Hillingdon out in a replay.

Pat Harding had a particularly good time of it that season, scoring four times in the cup run.

Super Pat is one of only two players who have left Hassocks and gone onto feature in the first round proper of the competition.

That was when he was a regular at Eastbourne Borough; the other player being Eddie French, who was part of Horsham's famous run that included taking Swansea City to a replay in the mid 2000's.

Facing the big guns

The biggest side the Robins have faced in the FA Cup was Havant & Waterlooville in the First Qualifying Round in the 1998-99 season.

That game saw a highly creditable 1-0 defeat away at Westleigh Park, one of six exits at that stage of the competition for Hassocks.

The Robins have faced Bromley - who can currently be found in the Conference National – on two other occasions aside from that 2001-02 run.

Both of those came in the 1999-00 season, when the Ravens required a replay to knock the Robins out, eventually winning 2-1 at Hayes Road after a 1-1 draw at the Beacon.

That tie was set up by one of our most notable scalps in the competition, a 1-0 win away at Horsham.

French scored the only goal of the game at Queens Road against the side he would go onto join not long after, heading home a Dickie Fernley corner in the 29th minute.

The Hornets were unable to find a way past the inspired Paul John in the Hassocks goal after that and their heads dropped as a result for the final 20 minutes in which Hassocks could have made the game safe.

Laing was denied twice by Horsham' debutant goalkeeper Phil Lewis and Lewis also saved well from a powerful Adam Waller drive.

The shock result saw Hornets boss Russell Mason quit as manager in the immediate aftermath.

Although not a particularly notable scalp at the time, current Conference National side Dorking Wanderers found themselves eliminated by the Robins in a preliminary qualifying round replay in the 2013-14 campaign.

Wanderers were a fellow Southern Combination League Premier Division side at the time, in the midst of their remarkable climb from parks football to one step below the professional ranks.

Phil Gault got the only goal at the Beacon

three days after the sides had drawn 0-0 at Westhumble Playing Field.

Hassocks' heaviest FA Cup defeat came in the First Qualifying Round in 2010-11, a 5-0 away defeat at an impressive Sholing side.

It was a game overshadowed by Chris Maynard suffering a terrible double leg break that would rule him out for the best part of a year.

That season was also responsible for the Robins' biggest ever FA Cup win when Eastbourne United were hammered 7-1 at the Beacon in the Extra Preliminary Round of the competition.

Maynard scored twice along with a Neil Kane brace and further goals from Anthony Hibbert, Daley Clark and Dan Smith.

Aside from the big loss at Sholing, there have been a couple of other heavy defeats in the First Qualifying Round, with Tonbridge Angels and Sittingbourne both beating the Robins 3-0.

The most recent time Hassocks made it as far as the First Qualifying Round was in the 2013-14 season under the management of Mickey Jewell.

That run included a rare victory at Gorings Mead against fellow Southern Combination League side Horsham YMCA followed by the aforementioned elimination of Dorking.

Isthmian South side Chipstead provided the opponents in the first qualifying round, winning 2-1 at the Beacon.

The Robins were good value for the draw that today however and would have had a replay three days later were it not for a last minute penalty miss from the normally reliable Gault.

Lord Gault did suitably punish himself afterwards, spending the evening drowning his sorrows in notorious Burgess Hill nightspot Jacobs Post.

Learning the ropes

It took Hassocks a few seasons to learn the ropes of national cup competitions - that shock win at Horsham in 1999-00 was our first in the competition at the fourth time of entering

Hassocks' first ever FA Cup game came in the Preliminary Round in the 1996-97 season, a 3-1 home defeat against Egham Town.

The following season saw a 2-1 defeat against Barton Rovers while there have been seven other exits at the second stage; to Molesey 3-0, Merstham 3-1, Walton & Hersham 3-0 and most disappointingly, a heavy 4-0 loss at Mill Road against fellow Southern Combination League club Arundel in 2003-04.

2019-20 saw a replay exit against Chipstead after Langney Wanderers had been beaten 2-0 at the Beacon in the previous round.

The Hassocks squad infamously celebrated their draw away at Isthmian League opponents by visiting a pub deep in Crystal Palace territory with tracksuits emblazed with WeAreBrighton.com on the back which, needless to say, did not go down well with the locals.

2020-21 saw a dramatic 5-3 penalty shoot out win over Balham followed by elimination at the hands

of Bedfont Sports.

Uxbridge then accounted for Hassocks in the Preliminary Round last season after a spectacular Conor Wilford own goal from 30 yards which racked up nearly a million views on Twitter had sent the Robins through against Lingfield

Over and out as early as possible

The Extra Preliminary Round was added to the competition for 2005-06 and Hassocks have exited at that earliest point of the competition in seven of the last 10 seasons that we have entered the competition.

The first of those came in 2008-09, a disappointing 1-0 defeat to Shoreham played at Culver Road due to the summer pitch works at the Beacon not being completed in time to host the tie.

Kane was still a Shoreham player at that point and he got the only goal of the game for the Mussells.

By the time Hassocks were knocked out of the following seasons competition Kane was in a Hassocks shirt, part of Dave John's side which crashed out 4-1 against Ash United.

Back-to-back Extra Preliminary Round exits came in 2011-12 away at Raynes Park Vale and a shock reversal at home to Sidley United in 2012-13.

Hassocks' 2014-15, 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2021-22 voyages all came to an end at the Extra Preliminary Round when they were well beaten 3-1 by Epsom and Ewell, 3-2 by Hollands and Blair, 3-1 by Erith Town and 2-1 by Spelthorne Sports respectively.

Meet our new Robins

It has been a refreshingly quiet summer compared to normal standards at the Beacon. Five new faces have come into the first team squad with four players departing for pastures new. Here is the rundown of the Robins' transfer business

First through the door came dangerous winger **Kyle Woolven** from AFC Varndeanians.

Woolven will be a familiar name to Robins fans having done his fair share of tormenting of Hassocks over the past seven or so years since coming through the ranks at Newhaven.

A member of the Dockers' incredibly successful Under 18s side in 2014-15, Woolven scored six goals

and assisted 17 as Newhaven went the season unbeaten to win the Southern Combination League Under 18 East Division title by 12 points from AFC Uckfield Town.

Once established in the senior setup at the Trafalgar Ground, Woolven's form earned him a move to Isthmian League side East Grinstead Town at the start of the 2019-20 campaign.

Woolven made 13 appearances

for the Wasps before joining Lancing in November 2019, where he was a teammate of current Hassocks favourite Alex Bygraves.

Two goals in 16 appearances followed for a Lancers side who topped the Southern Combination Premier Division table and looked destined for promotion before Covid-19 led the season to be declared null and void in March.

The summer of 2020 saw

Woolven join another Isthmian League outfit in Three Bridges.

He then returned to Newhaven midway through the 2020-21 campaign, playing 16 times and scoring twice for the Dockers before another lockdown.

Woolven remained with Newhaven for the start of the 2021-22 season, playing 16 times before switching to AFC Varndeanians.

From the moment he arrived at Withdean Stadium, he was one of the first names on the team sheet when available.

22 appearances in the second half of 2021-22 yielded six goals. Woolven then played 32 times for Varndeanians in the previous campaign, contributing two goals and four assists.

The Robins second summer signing was a familiar rather than new face signing for Hassocks for a third time.

Ben Bacon made 47 appearances for the Robins and scored 17 goals across his two previous spells with the club, the first of which began in the 2016-17 season.

Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar brought the striker in from Haywards Heath Town, where he found first team opportunities limited despite averaging over a goal a game for the Bluebells reserves side.

Bacon scored nine times from 24 matches in his first campaign with the Robins, the highlight being a hat-trick

in a 5-0 win away at Worthing United in October 2016 which helped end a club record run of seven consecutive defeats.

He left for Steyning Town in the summer of 2017 before moving onto Saltdean United for the 2018-19

Whilst with Saltdean, he scored all appearances for YM last season, four goals in his first game as an opponent of Hassocks to give the Tigers a 4-1 August Bank Holiday victory at the Beacon.

Bacon also turned out in the 2018 -19 season for Lingfield and Steyning again, with whom he won the Southern Combination League Division One Cup and promotion to the Premier Division.

One month into the 2019-20 campaign and Mark Dalgleish resigned Bacon for Hassocks.

He scored in the first appearance of his second spell, rescuing a 2-2 draw at Horsham YMCA with an equaliser from the bench. That was one of eight goals Bacon notched from 22 appearances.

Despite the fact Bacon left for Three Bridges a couple of months before the 2020 lockdown arrived, his total was still enough to see him finish joint top scorer alongside James Littlejohn.

Bacon was prolific when he made the step up the Isthmian League with Bridges, scoring five times in his first 10 appearances.

His overall record over three

seasons at Jubilee Field read nine goals in 39 appearances.

Having dual-registered with Horsham YMCA during his time with Bridges, Bacon made the move permanent for the 2022-23 campaign.

He scored three times in 14 including against Hassocks once again when the Robins won 4-2 at the Herbert Direct Stadium in September.

Given his penchant for scoring past the Robins, Bacon swapping YM for Hassocks does at least guarantee that will not be happening again.

It was another player from AFC Varndeanians who was third through the door with centre back Matt **Gunn** following Woolven in swapping Withdean for the Beacon.

Gunn first came to prominence at Newhaven - again alongside Woolven - playing for the Dockers across the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.

Woolven and Gunn helped Newhaven finish ninth and fourth in the Premier Division standings over those two campaigns.

Gunn moved to Saltdean United for the start of the 2019-20 season, playing 13 times for the Tigers.

He had a brief three game spell in Division One with Seaford Town before joining Peacehaven & Telscombe.

Gunn only managed one senior



appearance and one Under 23s outing for the Tye before the campaign was declared null and void.

He played 14 times for Peacehaven in 2020-21 and made 13 appearances, scoring once in 2021-22 before moving to Varndeanians midway through the campaign.

Over his 18 months at Withdean, Gunn was a model of consistency in the Vs back line.

He played 11 times in his first half -season, following that up with 26 outings in 2022-23.

After helping Hassocks to a 5-1 pre-season friendly win at Billingshurst, Gunn committed himself to the Robins for the season.

Head coach Westlake subsequently told the Mid Sussex Times he was very pleased to have secured the signature of such a proven defender at Premier Division level.

The eve of the season saw Hassocks complete loan deals for young Three Bridges duo **Josh Mundy** and **Elliott Hanslow**.

Both were part of the Bridges Under 18s side who went all the way to the first round proper of the FA Youth Cup last season, where they were eliminated by Portsmouth at Fratton Park.

Bridges saw off Steyning Town, East Preston, Dorking Wanderers and Tring Athletic through the qualifying rounds with Hanslow scoring twice

along the way.

In the Isthmian Under 18 South Division, Bridges finished as runners up just one point behind champions Worthing.

Midfielder Mundy played 19 times in all competitions across the campaign and winger Hanslow made 23 appearances in which he contributed five goals.

Hanslow found himself breaking into the first team squad at Jubilee Field by the end of the season.

His senior debut came from the bench as a 60th minute substitute in a 2-1 home defeat to Beckenham Town in March and he was an unused substitute on several other occasions.

Mundy and Hanslow made a good impression on their first outings at the Beacon, combining for the Robins' second goal in their 5-0 preseason victory over Oakwood.

After picking up possession in midfield, Mundy hit a delightful switch left to find Jack Troak scampering forward.

Troak flashed a ball across the face of the Oaks goal which made it all the way to the back post where Hanslow arrived to clinically fire past the visiting goalkeeper.

In terms of outgoings, two members of last season's first team squad have left the Beacon for Isthmian League football.

Goalkeeper **James Shaw** made an instant impression after joining the Robins in February from Tooting & Mitcham, soon helping set a club record of five consecutive clean sheets.

That form was enough to convince new Hillians manager Dean Cox to take Shaw back to the More Than Tyres Stadium for a second spell with the club.

Leon Turner had plenty of admirers last season thanks to his dazzling displays out wide for the Robins.

It therefore did not come as much of a surprise that a club higher up the pyramid were willing to give him an opportunity.

Turner's destination is Littlehampton Town, who have a good success rate when it comes to introducing Hassocks players to step four following Josh Short's impressive debut campaign at the Flora Sportsfield in 2022-23.

The churn of players between Varndeanians and the Robins has seen **Sam Rogers** head to Withdean for greater first team opportunities.

Josh Bradley meanwhile committed to sign for Hassocks, only to have a change of heart and head to Peacehaven & Telscombe.

He spent almost as much time suspended following his February move to the Beacon from Steyning Town as he did on the pitch during a brief stay with the Robins.









Hassocks earn deserved point to kick off the new campaign

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 29th July 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 1-1 Eastbourne Town

The opening game of the 2023-24 Southern Combination League season took some time to get going, but once it did a big crowd at the Beacon were treated to some high-quality entertainment by Hassocks and Eastbourne Town.

It finished 1-1, a result which Robins head coach James Westlake said he felt fair afterwards. Most of those watching agreed with that assessment.

Both sides though could feasibly have walked away with all three points; Hassocks had they been a little more clinical and Town were it not for an extraordinary save from Fraser Trigwell right at the death.

Evan Archibald thought he had won it with his traditional goal against Hassocks, only for Trigwell to somehow keep out the forward's header one-handed at full stretch.

The Robins had created the better second half opportunities before that, including when hitting a post as they mounted wave upon wave of attacks towards the west end of the ground.

In contrast, the first half was pretty turgid. It felt at times more like a pre-season friendly rather than the start of the competitive action.

There were appeals from the Town bench for a third minute penalty when George Cook went to ground under a Joe Bull challenge.

Cook's lack of protest was evidence that referee Perry Hart had made the correct call in awarding a corner rather than a spot kick.

Mr Hart had a fine game overall. The only major decision he got wrong was to award Hassocks a free kick on the edge of the box following a well-timed Delwin Duah sliding tackle, from which Jack Troak drove a powerful effort through the wall which repelled by a strong Taylor Seymour wrist.

Seymour was in the midst of a busy weekend having been man-of-

the-match for Burgess Hill in their 1-0 friendly win at Whitehawk the previous evening.

Further chances before the break were limited. Town left winger Max Hollobone blasted into the children's playground from a good position 18 yards out and Troak flashed a ball across the face of goal which neither Westlake nor Tom Frankland could quite latch onto.

Hassocks debutant centre back Matt Gunn made a good block on the stroke of half time after a lovely 40 yard switch from Hollobone created a shooting opportunity for Ollie Davies cutting in from the right.

The Robins hitting the upright gave an early indication that the second 45 was going to be far more watchable than the first.

Jamie Wilkes crossed, Benson's glancing header came back off the post and Troak could not quite sort his body out in time as the rebound hit him from point blank range and diverted wide.

A few minutes later and Town took the lead. An attempted back pass to Trigwell from 30 yards away ended going out for a corner nowhere near the goalkeeper.

Laughter at that comedic moment soon turned to despair. Hollobone Town retain whipped in a dangerous delivery turned in by the stretching Nathan Hover at the back post. Charlie Gibson. Town retain Trigwell's intervent working the ball towns from

Town left back Harry Simmons almost diverted a Bull cross beyond Seymour, the relief on Simmons' face being palpable when the ball flew inches wide.

That relief would prove to be short lived, however, as Simmons would go onto provide Hassocks with their equaliser on 67 minutes.

Frankland nearly levelled before Simmons' own goal arrived. Gunn picked out Troak, who produced an outrageous piece of skill to lift the ball over the head of Leon Greig and escape down the left flank.





From there, Troak hung up a cross to the back post. Frankland saw his initial header blocked by Simmons and then put the rebound into the side netting from a tight angle.

The lively Frankland made way after that for new loan signing from Three Bridges, Elliott Hanslow.

It did not take long for Hanslow to make an impression, his pressure on Simmons leading the Town defender to turn a Bull cross into the back of his own net.

The final 20 minutes brought a flurry of action at both ends. For Hassocks, Westlake saw an effort saved by Seymour and then fired high, wide and handsome from a Pat Harding layoff.

Harding himself saw a snap volley on the turn blocked. Harding's fellow substitute Ben Bacon crossed for Hanslow to head too high and Bacon then sent an effort into neighbouring Hurstpierpoint when he had more time to advance than he realised.

For Town, Archibald saw a goal correctly ruled out for offside and Trigwell saved bravely at the feet of Charlie Gibson.

Town retained possession from Trigwell's intervention, patiently working the ball back towards Greig.

It was from here that Greig picked out the run of Archibald with a 50 yard aerial ball into the box, resulting in that brilliant save from Trigwell plunging to his left to preserve a point for the Robins.

Robins fly away from Magpies' Nest with convincing victory

Three goals scored, none conceded and a thoroughly professional performance away at Loxwood secured Hassocks their first victory of the season in front of an increasingly infuriated Nest of Magpies.

The Robins drew some of that ire from the home support whose verbal barbs appeared to be part of an early warm up for the eagerly anticipated Loxwood Joust festival this weekend, but most of it was reserved for referee Pablo Aguilar.

Mr Aguilar booked four Magpies players before sin binning Loxwood captain Alfie Jones for protesting too vehemently over the award of an 83rd minute penalty to Hassocks converted by Pat Harding.

It was admittedly a soft foul on substitute Ben Bacon which led to the spot kick which gave the Robins their third and final goal.

Loxwood though had been extremely fortunate not to concede a 21st minute penalty when Jamie Wilkes glided past three players and into the box, where he had his legs swiped away for arguably the most blatant foul of the evening.

At least that is how it looked from the sidelines. In fairness to Mr Aguilar, his view was impeded by a number of bodies between himself and the rangy Wilkes.

That did not stop Hassocks being incensed, however. So much so that the incident was still playing on visiting minds going into half time.

Robins assistant coach Tom Hughes spoke to Mr Aguilar as the sides headed towards the changing rooms at the interval, sparking a pantomime exchange of words with an unimpressed Loxwood management team.

The Magpies are being filmed this season by the Bunch of Amateurs non-league football documentary team and their cameras were in close pursuit.

One can only hope they were not expecting to film something akin to Pep Guardiola All or Nothing on Amazon as this was more Pat and Peggy EastEnders in the Queen Vic.

As for the flurry of yellow cards flashed Loxwood's way, two appeared harsh but the other two were deserved.

And it was certainly not Mr Aguilar's fault Loxwood failed to once test their former number one Fraser Trigwell in the Hassocks goal all evening.

Trigwell was one of four ex-Magpies in the Robins starting XI alongside player head coach James Westlake, Sam Smith and Tom Frankland.

The last of those opened the scoring on 19 minutes for his first goal in Hassocks colours.

Jack Troak was poleaxed by Tyler Dhanipersad 25 yards out, picking up the first justified Loxwood booking of the evening for his troubles.

Frankland fired the subsequent free kick superbly around the wall to beat the despairing dive of Magpies number one Conor Manderson.

Two minutes later came the controversial decision not to award Wilkes a penalty, the first of several occasions in which the tall striker was brought to ground following direct gazelle-like runs.

Loxwood saw more of the ball after that before Hassocks reasserted control, fashioning three good chances to extend the lead before half time.

A delightful Westlake through ball slipped in Troak who could only shoot over.

Harding flashed a powerful left footed volley just wide and then Benson showed real tenacity to outpace Ben Hack and go one-on-one with Manderson.

Despite being a thoroughly polite and likeable young man, Troak somehow became public enemy number one amongst the Loxwood fans gathered behind the goal over the next 20 minutes.

Predictably, this culminated in Troak setting up the second Hassocks goal. A flat corner from his wand of a left foot was knocked down at the back post by Alex Bygraves.

Benson showed his poacher's instincts, lashing home a volley at the second attempt from close range.

Troak's next set piece was less successful, a 30 yard piledriver free kick which flew through the forest surrounding the Nest.

"That was closer to the goal at Alfold than ours," quipped one Magpies supporter. Given that Dunsfold Road is only two miles due north, they did have a point.

The second Hassocks goal had created a sense that the game was done but that did not prevent the Robins ruthlessly going after a third.

Harding duly provided it, sending Manderson the wrong way from the spot to move within two goals of overhauling James Laing and climbing into second spot in the Hassocks all-time scorers list.

Short-lived return to FA Cup as Robins beaten by Blair

August 5th 2017: Hassocks returned to the FA Cup after a two year absence, on the wrong end of a five-goal thriller against Southern Counties East side Hollands & Blair

It was a short-lived return to the FA Cup for Hassocks as their first foray into the world's most famous cup competition since 2014 came to an end after 90 extra preliminary qualifying round minutes against Hollands & Blair.

This was a game that could have gone either way; the Southern Counties East League visitors racing into a 2-0 lead inside of 20 minutes only for Hassocks to pull a quick fire double of their own before we had reached half time.

Both teams had chances to win it in the second 45 with Blair eventually taking one of those through their prolific forward Jamie McDonald with six minutes remaining.

That was too late for the Robins to launch another comeback. There were though plenty of supporters in attendance left wondering if things might have worked out different had Hassocks not been afflicted by the selection issues they seem to have in the opening few weeks of every season.

What also did not help their cause was that terrible start to proceedings, kicking off with going 1-0 down inside of a minute.

Most of the spectators had not left the sanctuary of the clubhouse by as Blair scored a scrappy goal that suggested it could be a long afternoon for Hassocks, Sam Adgie heading home a Brad Webb corner.

The impression that the Robins were in for a heavy defeat was reinforced over the following 20 minutes when it was a genuine miracle that Blair did not put the game to bed.

Dan Stokes and Tom Barnes both had to head off the line while Alex Harris suffered a moment of madness first half display with a couple of fine in the Hassocks goal when he tried to stops.

dribble around an attacker.

Harris found himself in a right state, surrendering possession and somehow not being punished.

The large away contingent who had made the journey from Kent and were gathered on the bank behind Harris' goal enjoyed that.

Their happiness increased when Harris was nutmegged from a matter of yards after a cheeky flick from Ben Brown to double the lead.

That finally shook Hassocks into life and within five minutes they pulled one back.

Michael Death reacted with a crisp volleyed finish after Tom Benham had flapped at a cross from the latest member of last season's Under 18s to be handed a first team debut, Matt Berridge.

Ashley Marsh made an excellent last ditch tackle and Harris pulled off a flying stop before Benson levelled things up just before the interval.

The Hassocks wing backs of Stokes and Berridge were discovering that Blair's back line were not the quickest as they began to experience a lot of joy getting in behind.

Benson too began playing more on the shoulder of the last man, looking to accelerate clear.

It was from such an instance that the equaliser arrived, Benson latching onto a long ball over the top to streak away and lob over Benham with aplomb.

At half time a deluge of rain was deposited over the ground but the Beacon does not have a reputation as one of the best pitches in the county for no reason and it was more than able to cope.

If anything, it aided the game as the slick surface now sped things up and both teams went hammer and tongs at each other.

Harris atoned for his interesting

Stokes shot wide and the move of the match went through Berridge, Death and Stokes but again Stokes was off target.

Based on the intensity being shown by the hosts in the quest for a winner, Hassocks were clearly keen to avoid a trek to Gillingham on Tuesday night for a potential replay.

But it was that attacking intent which eventually proved costly, Blair hitting the Robins on the counter with a sweeping move finished clinically one-on-one by McDonald.

Hassocks summoned the not-yetfully-fit Nathan Miles from the subs bench for what proved to be a dramatic final six minutes.

Benson fired over when he was played in, Harris made another good stop with his body and then Jordan Badger went on one of his trademark rampaging runs forward from centre back to crash an effort inches away.

The drama did not end with the final whistle, either. Eastbourne United occupy second spot behind Crowborough having picked up four points from a possible six.

They held one of the promotion

Our third home fixture in the opening three weeks of the season brings Lingfield to the Beacon, opponents who continue to thrive in the Premier Division despite often living a somewhat nomadic existence

Lingfield last season

Problems with their Godstone Road home throughout the campaign meant Lingfield switching venues frequently; either moving games to 3G pitches or asking the visiting side to host instead. It says much about the quality they have that the Lingers still managed to finish in 14th position in the Premier Division table. They won 10, drew four and lost 24 of their matches. Throughout the first half of the campaign, they earned a reputation as one of the most entertaining sides to watch with a goals for record which put them in the top five for the division and a goals against record which was amongst the five worst.

Head-to-head

There have been 33 meetings with the Robins leading the head-to-head with 15 wins to the Lingers' 10, leaving eight draws. Lingfield had been the dominant side in recent years but since January 2022 we have gone unbeaten in four matches, winning three and drawing one.

Last time we met

Lingfield surrendered home advantage, requesting that the Beacon host our clash on the penultimate weekend of last season rather than Godstone Road. A somewhat ill-tempered affair went the way of "the visitors" as two goals from Liam Benson and one from Pat Harding secured a 3-1 win. Conor

Wilford scored the consolation for Lingfield whilst a very bemused Mike Williamson found himself going for a 10 minute spell in the sin bin despite being one of the most polite and friendly gentlemen on the Southern Combination League circuit.

Played for both

Not many individuals have turned out for both ourselves and the Lingers. Ben Bacon is one and he has a formidable record scoring against his former club, so fingers crossed that rears its head again. The other is Daley Clark, who moved to the Robins from Godstone Road in the summer of 2009. He went onto play 40 times in Hassocks colours.

The fixture Gods have decreed that one of our longest away trips of the season takes place on a Tuesday night, to Pagham who return to the Southern Combination after a season spent in the Wessex League

Pagham last season

It was a difficult 2022-23 season for Pagham following the FA's decision to **Head-to-head** move them sideways from the Southern Combination into the Wessex League. They lost some important players who wished to remain playing against Sussex-based opponents rather than travelling west as far as Bournemouth which, combined with the Wessex League being of a higher standard, meant a campaign of struggle. The Lions finished 19th of 20 teams which could have seen them relegated into Wessex One. Instead, the FA have moved them back into the Southern Combination. They kicked off the current campaign with a 1-0 defeat at home against last season's runners

up, Crawley Down Gatwick.

Games with Pagham are not clashes that we have tended to enjoy through the years. This is slightly problematic as there have 57 of them, making the Lions one of our most frequently played opponents. Pagham lead the head-to-head having won 28 to our 20 with nine draws. Hassocks' league form against Pagham in recent years is particularly dire. Since 2014, we have picked up a grand total of 13 points from a possible 42.

Last time we met

Three of those points did, however, come the last time we met and went a long way to helping the Robins

avoid relegation from the Premier Division. Josh Short scored the only goal of the game with 32 minutes played at Nyetimber Lane in a 1-0 victory in March 2022, arguably the most impressive win of Brad Sweetman's time in charge.

How to get to Nyetimber Lane

Journey west on the A27 to Chichester. Once on the bypass, take the second exit at the second roundabout onto Vinnetrow Road. At the next roundabout it's a left onto the B2166 Lagness Road which eventually turns into Pagham Road. After passing on a Tesco on your left, Nyetimber Lane is the next round on the left with the ground pretty much immediately on the right.

Midhurst last season

Midhurst won the Division One playoffs at the end of the 2021-22 with 2022-23 being their first season in the Premier Division for 30 years. Survival was the aim of the game and a strong start to life at step five put them in an excellent position to achieve that. Their campaign teetered off a little after Christmas but nine wins, eight draws and 21 defeats was enough for a 13th place finish some 13 points above Alfold in the final relegation spot. They drew 2-2 with Lingfield on the opening day which was followed up by a 2-0 win over Shoreham in midweek.

Shoreham provided the second opponents in our August Bank Holiday double header, coming to the Beacon for an 11am kick off on the Monday.

Head-to-head

Meetings have been few and far between. There have been 10 previous games, five of which we have won and five of which Midhurst have been triumphant in. Goals tend to be guaranteed; we have a 6-0 win at the Beacon and a 6-1 win at the Rotherfield to our name. The game last August at the Beacon was a crazy seven-goal thriller in which all the scoring took place in the first half. Midhurst won that one 4-3 and followed up with a 5-0 win at the

Rotherfield in December, inflicting on the Robins a heaviest defeat of the campaign.

Last time we met

A terrible afternoon on which everything that could go wrong, did go wrong. What made the result even more bizarre is that just one week earlier, we had put five goals past Saltdean United in 30 minutes at the Beacon, Midhurst were 3-0 ahead going into half time through two Harry Tremlett goals and one from Dan Wood. Alex Harris went off with a toe injury at the interval, leaving defender Will Broomfield to play in goal during a second half in which Tremlett added two more to finish his day with four of Midhurst's five goals.


