Lingfield have spent the past few seasons living a nomadic existence at times due to issues with their Godstone Road home. And yet despite having to frequently surrender home advantage, they remain a stable part of the Premier Division

A case in point comes from our past three Southern Combination League matches due to be played away against the Lingers.

In the 2019-20 season, we were beaten by Lingfield at Steyning Town's Shooting Field after the game was switched to a 3G pitch to get it played.

2021-22 saw us head inside the M25 to Church Road, Whyteleafe. Goals from Jack Troak and Josh Short secured a 2-1 success.

Then in April, Lingfield asked to use the Beacon for our most recent meeting due to be played at their home. A 3-1 Hassocks victory was the entertaining one for the neutrals. result.

It says much about the quality and determination the Lingers have that they managed to finish in 14th position in the 2022-23 Premier Division table despite all the upheaval, winning 10, drawing four and losing 24 of their matches.

Throughout the first half of the campaign, they earned a reputation as one of the most entertaining sides to watch with a goals for record which put them in the top five for the division and a goals against record which was amongst the five worst.

That manifested itself in a highly entertaining 2-2 draw here in November. More of the same today will make this afternoon an

So, what of the current campaign so far? Two Premier Division games in and Lingfield have two 2-2 draws

to their name, suggesting they will again provide plenty of fun at both ends.

They opened with a point at Midhurst & Easebourne and followed that up with another score draw against AFC Varndeanians in a home game held at The New Defence, home of Horley Town.

Lingfield have since taken the decision to groundshare with Horley for the year whilst Godstone Road undergoes improvements.

Manager Dan Burnett hopes the stability of knowing where all 19 home games will be played can push his side into the playoffs come the end of the campaign.

Played for the Robins and Lingfield

Connections between Hassocks and Lingfield are few and far between with only a handful of players having represented both clubs.

Only one has moved directly from Godstone Road to the Beacon. Striker Daley Clark who joined us from Lingfield for the start of the 2009-10 season, going onto spend just over a year as a Robin.

The former Burgess Hill Town Under 18s forward was bought in by Dave John to form a new look strike partnership with Neil Kane, who made the move from Shoreham during the 2008-09 campaign.

It was hoped that Clark would

address the problem of scoring goals that had haunted us as we only just survived relegation at the end of that season.

The return of Phil Gault from St Francis Rangers early in the 2009-10 meant Clark was instead shifted into a new midfoeld role by John.

This move suited Clark and he played 34 times in his debut campaign, scoring once.

With Mickey Jewell taking the reigns for 2010-11 and an influx of new faces, Clark found his first team opportunities limited and he joined St Francis a month into the new season.

Current Hassocks striker **Ben Bacon** has played for both clubs with

this being his third spell at the Beacon after moving from Horsham YMCA in the summer.

He previously played for the Robins in 2016-17 and 2019-20. He had a brief period with Lingfield in 2018-19 between spells with Saltdean United and Steyning Town.

Finally, our current assistant manager **Tom Hughes** turned out for Lingfield as player after moving to Sussex from London.

He had previously played for Sutton United whilst living in the capital, although he never likes to mention it.

Behind the Stats

Lingfield are one of the few Southern Combination League clubs who Hassocks have played in all three divisions, part of eight different competitions the clubs have faced off in.

Those early meetings in Division One and Two between the sides in the late 1980s and early 1990s proved particularly fruitful, including an 11-0 win away from home which remains our biggest ever Southern Combination victory on the road.

Other large margin wins from around that era include two 6-0 and one 8-0 success for Hassocks.

Those high scoring clashes explain why we have plundered 84 goals from just 35 games against Linafield.

Things became much more competitive once the Lingers were promoted into the Premier Division in 2008, since when we have become regular opponents.

Lingfield enjoyed their best run of

form when going six matches unbeaten between 2018 and 2022.

They were the only opponent Hassocks did not beat in the 2021 Supplementary Shield competition, introduced at the end of the 2020-21 campaign following the lifting of lockdown restrictions.

We finished second in our group behind the Lingers, who went onto be eliminated in the semi finals.





Benson and Harding get Robins back to winning ways in bonus Beacon game

With Godstone Road unable to host Lingfield against Hassocks, the Beacon found itself with a bonus fixture on the penultimate weekend of the Southern Combination League season.

The Robins put this unexpected home advantage to good use, running out 3-1 winners to snap their seven game winless streak and boost their chances of a first top half Premier Division finish since 2014.

Victory kept Hassocks 10th in the standings, moving them three points and four goals ahead of Little Common, who have a game in hand.

That takes place against local rivals Bexhill United on Tuesday night.

Regardless of what happens there, the Robins know a win over Eastbourne Town in their final game of the campaign will secure their top 10 placing, an excellent achievement in James Westlake's first year in charge.

This clash with Lingfield was the third time the sides have met this season.

A Conor Wilford own goal which went viral with over 750,000 views on Twitter handed Hassocks a 1-0 FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round win back in August whilst the previous league clash ended in a thrilling 2-2 draw.

Neither game had been particularly feisty, so it was something of a surprise to see questionable challenges flying in from both teams in a heated 90 minutes.

Such was the tension that even Mike Williamson found himself in the middle of it. The normally placid and well-mannered midfielder was the victim of a terrible Haydn Dickinson tackle five minutes before half time worthy of a red card.

Dickinson followed up with a headbutt in the ruckus which followed, something referee Daniel Cooper must have missed. Nothing else could explain why it went unpunished with only Sam Smith ending up in the book.

Williamson then found himself serving a 10 minute spell in the sin bin early in the second half after Wilford converted a penalty which brought the scores to 2-1.

Not that playing shorthanded bothered Hassocks, their third goal of the afternoon arriving via Liam Benson whilst Williamson watched on from the bench.

Benson had opened the scoring for the Robins with 14 minutes on the clock via a poacher's finish.

Hassocks had a penalty claim so strong that the 21 other players on the pitch all stopped, waiting for Mr Cooper to point to the spot.

Benson though was not taking any chances and his decision to play to the whistle paid off when he smashed a right footed strike into the bottom corner after Mr Cooper remarkably said no penalty.

The Robins doubled the advantage on 37 minutes with a superb passing move which swept from one end to the other.

It began with James Shaw taking a short goal kick and ended with Super Pat Harding firing a clinical low drive beyond Lingers goalkeeper Tommy Sceal.

Falling two behind clearly did not sit well with Lingfield as the incident involving Dickinson came next, leaving the Robins incensed.

Hassocks channelled this anger in the right way, fashioning two more opportunities in the little time remaining before the break.

Jack Troak came on a charge forward from left back, only to hit a volley over the goal, the fence behind the goal and the trees on its way to the railway track.

It was the second Troak shot of the afternoon to pose a danger to passing trains following an almost identical effort resulting in a lost ball in the seventh minute. Benson then had the ball in the back of the net on the stroke of half time, only for the goal to be correctly chalked off by the assistant referee for offside.

Lingfield enjoyed their best period immediately after the restart. Shaw was forced into a flying save on the stretch from Richard Wetton before Hassocks conceded that penalty on 56 minutes.

It was confidently despatched by Wilford, going someway towards banishing the memory of his fantastic own goal from eight months ago.

Having just scored and with Hassocks down to 10 for a period, the momentum should have been with Lingfield.

The Robins therefore deserve a huge amount of credit for the way they not only nullified their opponents, but went onto kill the game off with the final goal of the afternoon.

Troak was the creator, delivering a beautiful ball from the left which Benson headed home from five yards for his 18th goal of the campaign.

Lingfield were left deflated and the game petered out from there with only one further opportunity coming for either side.

It fell to Harvey Blake, who ran the length of the pitch to beat three men and smash an effort last seen flying towards Hurstpierpoint for a third lost ball, much to the chagrin of Dave John.

Hassocks leave it late to see off Lingers and move out of bottom three

An action packed final 30 minutes saw Hassocks and Lingfield net five times between them with the Robins doing just about enough to run out 3-2 winners for their first league victory in over two months.

Phil Johnson scored twice for Hassocks with substitute Jake Lindsey the other man on target with what proved to be the winner in the 90th minute.

That put the Robins 3-1 ahead, but there was still time for Jake Horn to pull one back with virtually the last kick of the game, leaving a nervy final few seconds which Hassocks managed to see out.

It was breathless, tense, exciting and ultimately a massive three points for the Robins against a side they lost 3-0 to just a month ago in the Peter Bentley League Cup. The result lifted Hassocks above Arundel and out of the relegation zone.

Having not won in the league since bottom club Eastbourne United visited the Beacon on September 22nd, Mark Dalgleish looked to shake things up and he was aided in that by the return of two favourites.

Bradley Tighe has rejoined the Robins from Lancing having left the Beacon for Ringmer originally in the summer of 2017.

The inclusion of the former youth team product allowed Harvey Blake to move forward from right back to a more advanced wide role.

The link up between the two down the flank pointed to a potentially promising partnership going forward.

James Westlake was also back in the side for his first competitive action since December.

Westlake has spent the past 11 months concentrating on his running commitments, in which time he was the seventh British finisher in the London Marathon, set a new course

record for the Worthing 10k winning in 00:30:31, won the Brighton 10 mile and finished 20th in the Toronto Marathon on his debut for England athletics with a PB of 2:23:05.

Not that you could tell that Westlake has not kicked a ball for nearly a year.

Alongside Spencer Slaughter and the outstanding Harvey Enticknap, the Robins midfield three gave a hard working and organised showing which provided the platform for victory.

Johnson was keen to praise the impact of Tighe and Westlake afterwards, saying: "The new boys that played were really good and made a real difference for us."

"We showed great character throughout the game, especially to recover from the first equaliser and then go and win the game."

"It is an important win to get under our belts as we've been on a bad run recently."

There was little of note to report in the opening exchanges, other than Hassocks getting themselves into a bit of a pickle when attempting to play out of defence.

Spencer Slaughter's back pass to Josh Green was returned by the Hassocks goalkeeper into a gap between Jordan Badger and Dan Jacques.

Not only did that nearly prove costly in terms of gifting Lingfield a goal, but Slaughter and Harry Mills found themselves in trouble with the referee after sharing more than a few stern words before Badger separated them.

Slaughter put that down to the their passion for the club when asked about the incident afterwards.

Hassocks certainly channeled any frustrations they had positively in the second half as they sought about ending their two month wait for a Premier Division victory.

Johnson continued his remarkable record of missing with his head when

nodding a corner wide after being left free in the box.

The Robins top scorer made up for that miss by earning and then converting a penalty for the opener on the hour mark.

Tighe hit a brilliant long ball over the top and Johnson's pace took him steaming past Jamie Bakhit, whose only answer was to haul the Hassocks striker down.

Bakhit received a yellow for his troubles and Johnson made no mistake from the spot, sending goalkeeper Oliver Moore the wrong way to give Hassocks the lead.

17 minutes elapsed before Lingfield equalised on 77, sparking the mad finale in which four of the goals arrived.

The visitors were level for all of five minutes before an error from Moore gifted Johnson his second, the Lingers number one spilling a shot straight to Lindsey who sensibly squared to Johnson for a tap in.

Johnson's pace again caused devastation in the visitors back line with a couple of minutes remaining.

He ran through before whipping the ball in for Lindsey to tap home at the back post for 3-1.

The game was still not done yet, Jake Horn scoring the Lingers second with seconds remaining.

Having not won for so long, the Hassocks faithful could have been forgiven for feeling anxious in what little time was left.

But when the final whistle blew almost as soon as the game had restarted, the relief around the Beacon was obvious as the Robins moved out of the bottom three.

RIP Dave Knight

Everybody at the Beacon was saddened to hear of the death of Hassocks Football Club stalwart Dave Knight.

Dave was involved with the Robins for many years both on and off the pitch, including as an instrumental figure in helping the club move from Adastra Park to the Beacon.

When the club hit a cashflow crisis many years ago, both he and Dave John loaned the club money without which it may not have survived.

It is no exaggeration to say that without Dave, there may not be a Hassocks Football Club today.

Dave was never afraid to speak his mind and that made him a fascinating character for post-game analysis.

It also manifested itself in his long

-running *Through the Smoke Haze* column in the matchday programme, featuring brilliant and often hilarious views on the Sussex non-league circuit and the wider football world.

Through the Smoke Haze was a continuation of Dave's work as programme editor through the late 1980s before settling into the role he was probably best known for as the club's long-serving secretary.

In this role, Dave famously found himself being called as a witness at a disciplinary hearing after Brian Husbands decided to appeal a red card.

Ever honest, Dave told the appeal panel that Brian had done exactly what he was accused of and so the ban remain in place. A story which has entered Hassocks folklore.

Even after Dave stood down as secretary after many years, he

remained a regular at the Beacon when his health allowed it.

When Dave could not attend matches, he would request an indepth report on what had happened from those who had the following day whilst enjoying a couple of Sunday lunchtime pints at Keymer & Hassocks Sports & Social Club, where he was also a member.

The Knight family have invited anybody who would like celebrate Dave's life to attend a service at the Clayton Wood Natural Burial Ground on Tuesday 15th August at 11am.

There will then be food and drink served at Keymer & Hassocks Sports & Social Club immediately afterwards.

Our thoughts are with Phillip, Richard, Alexandra and the rest of the Knight family. RIP Dave.









Forward Fair flies in to become latest Robin

Hassocks have boosted their attacking options with the signing of former Shoreham and Lancing forward Alex Fair.

A regular goal-getter wherever he has been thanks to his clinical finishing ability, Fair scored 12 times in 29 appearances last season to help Shoreham to the Southern Combination League Division One title.

Former Hassocks striker Michael Death had taken Fair to Middle Road ahead of the start of the 2021-22 campaign.

He plundered eight goals that season as the Musselmen narrowly missed out on promotion when defeated by Midhurst & Easebourne in the playoffs.

Fair spent 2020-21 with Mile Oak but is probably best known for his time at Lancing spread over two spells, where he played alongside a number of current Robins including Alex Bygraves and Kyle Woolven.

In the 2019-20 season when Lancing topped the Premier Division at the time Covid-19 led the

campaign to be declared null and void, Fair had contributed 16 goals in 26 appearances.

Included in that haul were two from the Lancers' August Bank Holiday Monday visit to the Beacon. Fair was introduced early in the second half with Lancing trailing 1-0 to a James Littlejohn effort and in danger of suffering a first league defeat of the season.

That was until Fair's brace bagged in the space of 180 seconds turned the game on its head. The first was a stunning 73 minute header with power and direction from a corner out on the left.

The second arrived on 76 and was an equally impressive finish, a cool curling effort from the edge of the box which gave Robins goalkeeper Josh Green no chance.

Fair would go onto inflict further damage on Hassocks two months later.

He turned out for Lancing Under 23s when the Robins went to Culver Road in Southern Combination Under 23 West Division action, scoring a hat -trick.

The Lancers ran out 4-2 winners

that night with their other goal coming from future Hassocks forward George Mitchell-Phillips. Louis Pople and Tom Jupp replied for the Robins.

During his first spell at Culver Road, Fair was part of the Lancing squad who ended a 23 year wait for senior silverware when winning the Peter Bentley League Cup at the Beacon in 2016 via a 2-1 victory over Newhaven.

There were plenty of other Hassocks connections involved with the Lancers at that time.

Former Robins defender Jake Mills was on the receiving end of a foul which saw the Dockers' Joe Dryer dismissed after only 24 minutes.

Green was Lancing goalkeeper between his two spells with Hassocks, saving Lee Robinson's penalty six minutes into the second half. Mike Williamson was named man-of-thematch and Bygraves was also a Lancer.


Fair has also represented Littlehampton Town, for whom he scored six times in 11 appearances during the 2018-19 Southern Combination Division One season.

Blockbuster Bull strike gives Hassocks another shot at Erith

Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round Saturday 5th August 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 1-1 Erith Town

We might only be three games into the 2023-24 football campaign, but Hassocks can probably give out their Goal of the Season award right now.

The Robins' Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying tie against Erith Town was 17 minutes old when Joe Bull picked up possession 38 yards out.

Nobody expected Bull to shoot, save for one lonely voice in the Maurice Boxall Stand which said "Shoot" too quietly to be convincing.

Bull's first touch was perfect, setting himself inside and into space to unleash a frankly unbelievable strike into the very top corner.

The noise which greeted the goal said it all. There were no cheers of celebration reserved for Hassocks connections; instead the entire ground, home and away support, let out a combined "OOOOH."

It was a strike good enough to win any game of football.
Unfortunately for the Robins, it merely counted as an equaliser after Henry Arnold had opened the scoring seven minutes earlier.

No further goals meant it finished 1-1. The sides will now meet again on Tuesday night at Stanmore Stadium to decide who progresses to face either Burgess Hill Town or Sutton Common Rovers on August 19th in preliminary qualifying.

In terms of both weather and quality, this was very much a game of two halves. A richly entertaining first 45 minutes were played out under dark clouds and near-biblical rainfall.

The sun made an appearance after the break but the quality of football dropped off, so much so that a young supporter riding a unicycle around the perimeter path provided much of the interest. Non-league football at its finest.

Plenty of action was packed into the opening exchanges, mainly involving Liam Benson.

The Hassocks striker had a shot blocked within 120 seconds of kick off before twice escaping the attentions of the Erith back line to latch onto through balls. Benson was off target with one and earned a corner with the other.

It was somewhat against the run of play when the Dockers took the lead with 10 minutes on the clock.

Matt Gunn put in a heavy challenge on Ollie Milton, causing everyone in close attention to stop awaiting the award of a free kick.

Everyone except Arnold, that is. The Dockers forward chased down the loose ball which had spun into the Robins box, beat Fraser Trigwell to it and rounded the Hassocks goalkeeper before firing home.

James Dyer almost doubled the lead for Erith a few minutes later, skipping past two challenges before blasting narrowly over.

Next came Bull's spectacular leveller. James Westlake collected a Bradley Tighe throw on the right and between the player head coach, Pat Harding and Jack Troak, possession was worked across the pitch to Bull at left back. You already know about the rest.

A little of the shine was taken off the equaliser four minutes later when Troak landed awkwardly after challenging for a header.

Following lengthy treatment from Hassocks physio Jay Patel, Troak walked from he field and was whisked off to hospital.

X-rays there revealed a fractured collarbone. Little wonder Troak kicked the downward guttering of the Clubhouse out of frustration as he swapped an afternoon at the Beacon for a visit to the Princess Royal.

Kyle Woolven took over from Troak and was almost involved in setting up a goal with his first touch, splitting the Erith defence with a pass into the path of the advancing Tighe





on the right. Tighe flashed a low ball across the box which nobody in red could quite convert.

A bizarre incident saw Milton booked for hugging Trigwell after the Hassocks goalkeeper won a footrace to a through ball.

The same pair then faced off again. Not only did Trigwell do really well to claw away from the feet of the Erith striker, but he also managed to get up, chase down and leather the loose ball out for a throw as it escaped his box.

Neither Trigwell nor opposite number Mackenzie Foley were particularly worked after the interval with it taking 24 minutes for the first chance of the second half to arrive.

Dyer showed further nifty footwork to glide past two challenges, only to fire wide.

Hassocks introduced new signing Alex Fair from the bench along with Alex Brewer, ending the game with four strikers on the pitch.

No headway could be made in an attempt to avoid a midweek trip to Thameside however, and it was the Dockers who finished stronger.

Substitute Alfie Eldridge should have done better when dragging wide from six yards before Bull capped a starman performance with a brilliantly timed last ditch sliding tackle to nick the ball off Arnold just as he was about to pull the trigger.

Robins elimination at Erith means no Mid Sussex Derby in FA Cup

Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round Replay Tuesday 8th August 2023, Stanmore Stadium **Erith Town 4-0 Hassocks**

There will be no Mid Sussex **Derby between Hassocks and Burgess Hill Town in the Emirates FA Cup after the Robins** were well beaten 4-0 in their **Extra Preliminary Qualifying** Round replay against Erith Town.

Having drawn 1-1 at the Beacon on Saturday, the Dockers showed why they finished fourth in the stronger Southern Counties East Premier last season with a domineering result.

It earns Erith a trip to the More Than Tyres Stadium on Saturday 19th August after Dean Cox's Hillians needed a replay of their own to overcome Sutton Common Rovers.

The Robins made two changes from the weekend for their trip to the Stanmore Stadium in Thamesmead. Harvey Blake came in on the right wing for his first start of the season in place of Tom Frankland.

Former Shoreham and Lancing forward Alex Fair was handed his full debut in place of Jack Troak, who faces a spell on the sidelines after breaking his collarbone midway through the first half of Saturday's clash.

Troak's nasty injury came shortly after Joe Bull had scored an absolute rocket from 38 yards to level the tie for Hassocks.

You could sense the concern amongst the Erith players when Bull lined up a similar effort after only six minutes here, but this time around the end result was nowhere neat as magical.

Dockers forward Ollie Milton had been off target with a long ranger of his own with two minutes played of what was a pretty even opening half hour.

There was certainly nothing to suggest during that period the margin of victory Erith were going to rack up via a blistering spell of three goals in 17 minutes before half time.

The ninth minute saw James

Trueman and Henry Arnold link up down the left to sweep a low cross pulled back to the edge of the Hassocks box.

Arriving midfielder James Miles should have at least tested Fraser Trigwell, only to blast wastefully over the bar.

A towering Alex Bygraves header from a James Westlake free kick on the right forced Mackenzie Foley into a sprawling save.

Not only did the Erth number one do well to react, but he managed to hold the ball too which was vital with Liam Benson lurking.

Blake was not far away with a left footed effort after cutting in from the right flank on 24 minutes as Hassocks Trigwell somehow kept out from enjoyed a decent spell.

That was brought to a shuddering end when Erith took the lead after the Robins were poor in defending a long throw into the box.

Somehow, the ball was allowed to make its way to the back post where Miles was on hand to apply a close range finish.

Falling behind noticeably took the wind from Hassocks' sails. They needed Trigwell to scramble away a deflected Joe Chalker effort which looked initially like it was going to deceive the Robins goalkeeper and end up in the back of the net.

Wirth Erith on top, the Robins badly needed half time for the opportunity to regroup.

Had Hassocks made it to the break without conceding again, then they might have found a way back into the tie in the second half.

Instead, Erith added goals in the 38th and 45th minutes to effectively end the game as a contest.

Home captain Jack Holland doubled the advantage with a fine effort, striding forward from right back and convincingly lashing past Trigwell from distance to send the home support into raptures.

There was further joy on the





stroke of half time. A game of pinball broke out in the Hassocks box eventually ended by a Robins defender scrambling away at the expense of a corner.

Over came the resulting delivery for Tom Ash to power a header beyond Trigwell which sent Erith into the interval three goals to the good.

Trigwell was forced into another important intervention within a few minutes of the restart.

The excellent Arnold collected a pass on the penalty spot, turned on a sixpence and hit a snapshot which close range.

Hassocks threw on Under 23s midfielder Sam Geard for a rare first team opportunity whilst there was also a debut from the bench for Three Bridges loanee Josh Mundy.

Between those two substitutions came Erith's fourth. Milton slalomed his way through the Robins defence like a Winter Olympics skier before slotting beyond Trigwell and into the bottom corner for the best goal of the evening.

Robins on song in rare Mill Road mauling

August 12th 2017: The Robins opened their 2017-18 Southern Combination League campaign with a rare win at Arundel, running out 3-0 victors over the Mullets

Arundel away may not be seen as the toughest of fixtures in the Southern Combination League Premier Division but there have been plenty of hair raising experiences for Hassocks at the home of the Mullets down the years.

These are the top flight's two longest serving clubs. And despite having faced each other in every season since before the turn of the Millennium, Hassocks have only returned from Mill Road with three points on a handful of occasions over the last two decades; trips west were good for admiring this most picturesque of grounds in the shadow of Arundel Castle but not much else.

Being handed Arundel away first league game looked a daunting test then based on historical evidence.

As it was, it was one that the Robins passed with flying colours despite a fresh raft of unavailable players.

A lack of consistency in selection has hindered Hassocks for a good four seasons now. It is especially acute at the start of the season with holidays and cricketing commitments.

From last week's squad who played in the FA Cup defeat to Hollands and Blair, Jordan Badger, Ashley Marsh, Matt Berridge and Nathan Miles joined Josh Hawkes and Phil Gault on the absentees list.

Despite the missing, the Robins dominated the game from start to finish to run out comfortable 3-0 winners in an encounter in which Alex Harris was hardly troubled in keeping an all too rare clean sheet.

Harris had looked shaky in the first half of the opening game of his fourth spell at the Beacon a week previously but that was a distant memory as he gobbled up balls into the box with all the ease of a pig

snorting up a truffle.

The goalkeeper has particularly big gloves to fill in replacing James Broadbent.

Broadbent was outstanding in 2016-17, winning Players', Managers' and Supporters' Player of the Season Awards and earning a deserved step up to the Bostik League with Shoreham.

Clean sheets and performances like this from Harris will make that sizeable transfer blow seem less so.

Hassocks took the lead on the 25 minute mark through the in-form Liam Benson.

Benson enjoyed a fine second half to last season after being promoted from the Robins' Under 21 squad and he's got two in two now in this campaign.

There were admittedly question marks about the goalkeeping of Stuart McDonald, who could only parry a rasping effort from Lewis Westlake.

That gave Benson the chance to show off his predatory instincts which he duly did by smashing home the loose ball.

The lead was doubled on the stroke of half time by Spencer Slaughter, scoring his first goal since December 2015 on his first start since January 2016.

Since then, Slaughter has been backpacking around the world before returning for a couple of brief substitute cameos last season.

A proper pre-season has given him some form and fitness under his belt and he said before the game he fancied himself to score as a result.

The opportunity to do so came courtesy of Dan Stokes, who crossed from the right to Slaughter at the far post with the finish being a tight one on the angle.

Stokes had endured a frustrating game up until that point, his passing at times being so off that he gave up trying to link up with Michael Death.

In one wonderful moment, Stokes told Death after another five yard pass went astray "I'm not passing to you anymore as it obviously just isn't working," much to mercurial striker's annoyance.

Death had no such problems with his forward partner Benson, however, and that combination gave Hassocks their third with five minutes remaining.

Benson unselfishly rolled across to Death who finished into an open goal from eight yards to wrap up the Robins biggest opening day of the league season victory since a 5-0 win over Littlehampton Town in 1996.

Arundel had briefly threatened slightly before that when Hassocks made all manner of weird and wonderful decisions to go for goal and shoot from stupid positions rather than keep possession and run the clock down.

Doing so also would have helped the Robins conserve energy ahead of what will no doubt be a much sterner test against early league leaders Newhaven on Tuesday night.

A lack of options on the bench did not help either when it came to resting players.

Jack Wilkins was the only substitute summoned, which was perhaps just as well as joint boss Mark Dalgleish had to name himself amongst the replacements.

Hassocks v Pagham

The fixture Gods have decreed that one of our longest away trips of the season takes place on a Tuesday night, to Pagham who return to the Southern Combination after a season spent in the Wessex League

Pagham last season

It was a difficult 2022-23 season for Pagham following the FA's decision to **Head-to-head** move them sideways from the Southern Combination into the Wessex League. They lost some important players who wished to remain playing against Sussex-based opponents rather than travelling west as far as Bournemouth which, combined with the Wessex League being of a higher standard, meant a campaign of struggle. The Lions finished 19th of 20 teams which could have seen them relegated into Wessex One. Instead, the FA have moved them back into the Southern Combination. They kicked off the current campaign with a 1-0 defeat at home against Crawley Down Gatwick

Games with Pagham are not clashes that we have tended to enjoy through the years. This is slightly problematic as there have 57 of them, making the Lions one of our most frequently played opponents. Pagham lead the head-to-head having won 28 to our 20 with nine draws. Hassocks' league form against Pagham in recent years is particularly dire. Since 2014, we have picked up a grand total of 13 points from a possible 42.

Last time we met

Three of those points did, however, come the last time we met and went a long way to helping the Robins

before beating AFC Varndeanians 2-0. avoid relegation from the Premier Division. Josh Short scored the only goal of the game with 32 minutes played at Nyetimber Lane in a 1-0 victory in March 2022, arguably the most impressive win of Brad Sweetman's time in charge.

How to get to Nyetimber Lane

Journey west on the A27 to Chichester. Once on the bypass, take the second exit at the second roundabout onto Vinnetrow Road. At the next roundabout it's a left onto the B2166 Lagness Road which eventually turns into Pagham Road. After passing on a Tesco on your left, Nyetimber Lane is the next round on the left with the ground pretty much immediately on the right.

Midhurst last season

Midhurst won the Division One playoffs at the end of the 2021-22 with 2022-23 being their first season in the Premier Division for 30 years. Survival was the aim of the game and a strong start to life at step five put them in an excellent position to achieve that. Their campaign teetered off a little after Christmas but nine wins, eight draws and 21 defeats was enough for a 13th place finish some 13 points above Alfold in the final relegation spot. Like ourselves, Midhurst have taken four points out of a possible six to start the new campaign. They drew 2-2 with Lingfield on the opening day which was followed up by a 2-0 win over Shoreham in midweek.

Shoreham provided the second opponents in our August Bank Holiday double header, coming to the Beacon for an 11am kick off on the Monday.

Head-to-head

Meetings have been few and far between. There have been 10 previous games, five of which we have won and five of which Midhurst have been triumphant in. Goals tend to be guaranteed; we have a 6-0 win at the Beacon and a 6-1 win at the Rotherfield to our name. The game last August at the Beacon was a crazy seven-goal thriller in which all the scoring took place in the first half. Midhurst won that one 4-3 and followed up with a 5-0 win at the

Rotherfield in December, inflicting on the Robins a heaviest defeat of the campaign.

Last time we met

A terrible afternoon on which everything that could go wrong, did go wrong. What made the result even more bizarre is that just one week earlier, we had put five goals past Saltdean United in 30 minutes at the Beacon. Midhurst were 3-0 ahead going into half time through two Harry Tremlett goals and one from Dan Wood. Alex Harris went off with a toe injury at the interval, leaving defender Will Broomfield to play in goal during a second half in which Tremlett added two more to finish his day with four of Midhurst's five goals.

Shoreham last season

Shoreham ended a four season absence from the Premier Division by winning promotion as Division One champions last time out under the management of former Hassocks striker Michael Death. In the process, the Musselmen went over a calendar year unbeaten in the league from January 2022 to January 2023, providing the foundations to lift the title by six points from Dorking Wanderers B with a record of 21 wins, eight draws and just three defeats from 32 matches. Shoreham are yet to win from any of their three games so far this season, losing to Midhurst & Easebourne and Little Common in the league and Crowborough Athletic in the FA Cup.

Head-to-head

Despite the fact we have not played each other for four seasons, there have been 51 meetings between the clubs. We have won 22, Shoreham 18 Familiar faces with 11 draws; such an even record showing there is rarely anything between the clubs. The only competition in senior football we are yet to play each other in is the FA Vase.

Last time we met

Shoreham were all-but relegated when they visited Hassocks for the final game played at the Beacon of the 2018-19 season whilst we were safely positioned in mid table. Not that any of that mattered as the Musselmen stormed to a 5-0 victory. Mohammed Diallo scored four of the goals with the other coming from Martin Mutungi.


