Although the tie has been hastily arranged at the behest of the Sussex County FA, starting this early in the season should at least help us avoid the palaver of last year when the competition nearly had to be cancelled.

Whilst the second round was played in October, the third round was not organised until the end of March.

That left a mad rush to completion. Several clubs withdrew as their stay with us this afternoon, we the quarters, semis and final were all crammed into a couple of weeks in May after the Southern Combination League campaign had finished.

The result kept us second in the table - yes, second in the table - and maintained stretched our unbeaten league start to four matches.

Following all the dramas of their first Southern Combination League Premier Division campaign for over 60 years in 2021-22, AFC Varndeanians were no doubt relieved to eniov a much normal time of it in a season of consolidation last time out

Go back to December 2021 and Varndeanians had failed to win any of escapes from relegation the Southern their opening 25 games in all competitions.

That left them someway adrift at the bottom of the Premier Division table, staring an immediate return to Division One in the face.

After such a long wait to return to the top flight, it looked like their adventure was over before it had ever really begun.

What followed in the second half of the campaign then was remarkable. The return of Ryan Gayler sparked a huge improvement. Before the season was out, Varndeanians had overhauled both East Preston and Loxwood to clamber out of the bottom two.

It was one of the greatest Combination has seen.

Gayler stood down last October. His replacement Justin Jones continued the good work, consolidating Vs place in the Premier Division.

Varndeanians spent most of 2022-23 tucked safely into mid table. By the start of March, they had nothing to play for; miles clear of relegation but also with too many points to make up to challenge for a top 10 finish.

The lack of peril in either direction understandably had a knock on effect when it came to form and a bad run to end the campaign saw Vs drop to a final finishing position of 17th.

They arrive at the Beacon this afternoon with one win, one draw and three defeats from five matches so far. That sole victory came last Saturday at home to Bexhill United.

Both the goals came from former Hassocks players, Jude Wallis opening the scoring with 16 minutes played and Charlie Tuck providing the winner with on 89.

Sam Rogers also made the move from the Beacon to Withdean Stadium in the summer, whilst we signed Kyle Woolven and Matt Gunn from Vs.

The links between the clubs should provide some added motivation this afternoon beyond the chance to progress to the second round of the RUR Cup.

Hassocks victorious at Varndeanians for

four wins and five clean sheets in a row

There is no stopping Phil Johnson at the moment. Two goals at Withdean Stadium made it 10 from his past 10 appearances, 23 for the season and 99 in a Hassocks shirt as the Robins ran out 3-0 winners over AFC Varndeanians.

At the other end, James Westlake's side recorded a fifth clean sheet in a row.

James Shaw and his defence have condemned the keeper of the statistics to an evening pouring through the annals to see if that is a club record; the likely answer being yes.

Shaw remained relatively untroubled against a Varndeanians side with not an awful lot to play for over the remaining eight games of the season.

The Vs are already destined to finish in lower mid table, currently 16 points clear of the two relegation spots and the same number behind Little Common in 11th.

Nobody connected with Varndeanians will mind that, especially after the dramas of last season when they failed to win any of their opening 25 matches and yet managed to avoid the drop following a stunning turnaround post-Christmas.

Hassocks were one of the sides who fell victims to the Vs during that greatest of great escapes, losing 1-0 at Withdean in February.

The Robins showed very early on there was going to be no repeat this time around, taking the lead with the first attack of the game on two minutes.

Josh Bradley took a snapshot which home goalkeeper Jordan Hawkins could only parry.

The ball fell kindly to Leon Turner to strike home at the start of a manof-the-match performance down the left. Bradley on the other flank meanwhile was making first start since completing a four-match ban.

He replaced Alfie Loversidge in the only change Westlake made from last week's 2-0 win over Loxwood.

The former Steyning Town man certainly made the most of the opportunity, being at the heart of a lot of the good stuff Hassocks did to threaten a Varndeanians defence including ex-Robins favourite Luke Akehurst.

Hassocks almost added a second before the clock had even reached five minutes.

Liam Benson flashed a ball across goal which defender Sam Smith could not quite get on the end of.

The Robins were wasting no time in laying bare their attacking intent. Not content with creating chances for Hassocks, Bradley momentarily decided he wanted to help out Varndeanians too on 21 minutes.

An attempted back pass to Shaw was way too short, forcing the Hassocks number one into his only meaningful save of the afternoon to deny Mark Goldson.

Five minutes later and Hassocks doubled their advantage. Turner slid in Johnson and with the red-hot form the Robins' leading scorer is in, there was only going to be one outcome as he went one-on-one with Hawkins.

Johnson rifled home with aplomb and you sensed Hassocks were already on easy street with half hour yet to be completed.

The Robins performance subsequently became professional more than spectacular.

Nobody could blame Hassocks for easing up and saving themselves for the challenges ahead.

Their next six Premier Division matches are against teams above them in the table and they have a Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup third round tie with fifth placed Steyning Town slotted in for Tuesday 21st March.

With a potentially season-defining next few weeks to come, it is little wonder than Westlake is keeping his cards close to his chest about where he and his players are aiming to finish the campaign.

Just before half time and Bradley came close to scoring one of the goals of the season, hitting a strike on the volley without breaking stride which flew just wide.

The second half was all Hassocks in terms of possession although chances from open play were few and far between. So much so that the Robins third and Johnson's second came from a 69th minute penalty.

Job done for Hassocks, who know sterner tests lie ahead. But when Johnson cannot stop scoring and with a defence which has now not been breached for more than 450 minutes, no other team in the league will fancy playing Hassocks either.

Robins in the RUR

Hassocks first entered the Sussex RUR Charity Cup in 1981. We take a look back at the Robins' attempts over the past 38 years to make it the first ever piece of senior silverware to enter the Beacon's trophy

Everybody knows the fact -Hassocks have never reached a senior cup final, let alone lifted a trophy in their 114 year history.

The Sussex RUR Charity Cup is the one that has provided the Robins with the best opportunity to do so not that that is saying much, admittedly - as we have reached the semi-finals of the competition on four occasions.

The most recent came in 2022,

when we were beaten 2-0 by a Littlehampton Town side who were on their way to a treble of Southern Combination League title, Peter Bentley League Cup and RUR Cup.

To reach the final four, we had beaten Montpelier Villa 5-0 in our first exit came a decade earlier in the ever meeting in senior football.

An impressive 2-1 extra time win over Crawley Down Gatwick followed thanks to two goals from Jack Troak before we beat Seaford Town at the

Crouch in the guarter finals -Troak scoring both again as he became the star of the Robins' memorable run which caught the imagination of the entire village.

Our most disappointing semi final 2011-12 campaign, a 3-1 defeat against lowly Selsey at Culver Road.

A 5-2 victory in the league at the High Street Ground had been recorded a month previously and the Robins went into the tie the favourites despite being without the services of the talismanic Phil Gault.

But there could be little complaint about the score on the day as Mickey Jewell's side simply didn't turn up and the chance of a first ever cup final went begging.

It had been a straight forward cup run up until that point with victories against Mile Oak, East Grinstead Town and Southwick paving the way to heartache in the last four.

If that illustrated just what a favourable draw can do for a cup run, then Hassocks' semi-final defeat in the 1999-00 season was an indication of how it can work the other way, when we met all-conquering Burgess Hill Town in the final four.

Mile Oak, Arundel and Lancing had all been vanguished on route to the meeting with the Robins' arch rivals of the time and although formbooks and class can go out the window when it comes to a local derby, Hassocks proved to be no match for the Hillians who ran out 4-1 winners.

That was not an easy run to reach the last four either with

victories over Wick, Southwick, Lancing and Whitehawk all being gained along the way.

In the mid 00's, Hassocks were remarkably consistent in bowing out of the competition at the quarter final responsible for our exit in the last stage with four last eight exits in a row – 2005-06 to Shoreham, 2006-07 to Whitehawk, 2007-08 to Rye United and 2008-09 to Three Bridges.

There have been six other guarter final exits - to Burgess Hill the year before that semi heartache at the hands of the Hillians, Selsey in 1994-95, Pagham in 1992-93 and Southwick in 1981-82 – the first

season we entered the competition.

Crawley Down Gatwick knocked us out in the last eight in 2016-17 on their way to defeat in the final against Newhaven.

Haywards Heath Town were responsible for our 2018-19 quarter final elimination when they won 3-0 at the Beacon.

The Bluebells went onto win the competition, defeating Peacehaven & Telscombe in the final.

Peacehaven themselves were eight last season and they ended up lifting the trophy too by beating Southern Combination League champions Broadbridge in the final back in May.

Round three has been dropped this season in favour of the competition running through first round, second round and quarter final.

It came into existence for the 2000-01 competition when the preliminary round was removed, and has been the Robins' exiting point on three occasions, most recently in 2013-14 via a 3-2 defeat away at Horsham YMCA.

Hassocks crashed out at the stage in back-to-back campaigns in 2000-01 and 2001-02 to Selsey and Southwick respectively.

And as for the aforementioned preliminary round? Hassocks only ever had one dalliance with it.

That came in the 1993-94 season, a 3-2 win over Wick.

As for the second round, that was the stage we exited in 2019-20, losing 3-0 at home to Pagham before the competition took a two-season break due to Covid.

In 2017-18, we somehow blew a 2-0 lead with 15 minutes remaining

Another final shot goes



to lose 4-2 in extra time away at AFC 1982-83. Uckfield Town.

Hassocks were also eliminated from the competition at that stage in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons via heavy home defeats, 5-1 against Eastbourne Town and 5-0 against Littlehampton Town.

Given the Robins well documented ability to make hard work and more often than not lose to teams from a lower division, Hassocks have been knocked out of the RUR Cup a surprisingly low number of times by sides from lower down the pyramid.

The most recent of those did come in the second round, a penalty shootout defeat to Division One outfit Little Common in 2012-13 after an astonishing 5-5 draw.

Round two also accounted for exits in 2010-11 to Sidley United and 2009-10 when Dave John's side were eliminated by Selsey.

Selsey again eliminated the Robins at that stage in 2004-05, which followed second round defeats to Pagham the previous year and Burgess Hill before that.

Other exits came against Shoreham in 1997-98, Midhurst & Easebourne in 1995-96 which represented another rare shock, Sidley in 1986-87 and Whitehawk in

Before the changes to the format for the current campaign, the majority of clubs received byes through round one and straight into round two.

Subsequently, Hassocks did not play a game in the first round for 17 years between defeating Mile Oak in the 1999-00 season and beating Worthing United 6-3 in 2016-17.

That win over the Mavericks seven years ago was our most recent appearance at this stage before this afternoon.

The Robins have only bowed out of the competition three times at the first round stage - to Langney Sports in 1996-97, Ringmer in 1984-85 and Peacehaven & Telscombe in 1983-84.

That exit to the Tye remains one of only two games in the competition that Hassocks have been involved in that required a replay, a 1-1 draw at Adastra Park being followed by a 1-0 defeat away from home.

The other came two seasons previously when another 1-1 draw at Adastra necessitated a second game, this time Hassocks triumphing 5-3 in a thriller away at Hastings Town.

Six games have gone to extra time and Hassocks have won four of them, the only blemishes being that 1994 semi-final defeat to Pagham

and the exit four seasons ago against AFC Uckfield Town.

The extra time wins have seen the Robins defeat Ringmer 4-3 in 1982-83, Worthing United 4-2 in 1995-96 Ringmer again in 2005-06 2-1 and Crawley Down last season.

Aside from the Little Common penalty defeat, Hassocks have only had two other shootouts in the competition.

2007-08 saw Arundel beaten 4-1 from 12 yards after a 2-2 draw in normal time.

Penalties were also required back in March when we knocked Steyning Town out in the third round.

A 0-0 draw was followed by 17 perfect penalties apiece until the Barrowman's Charlie Robinson was denied by James Shaw to give Hassocks a 9-8 victory. Shaw had earlier converted our fifth spot kick, although the highlight of the shootout was undoubtedly a Panenka from Super Pat Harding.

Hassocks' biggest victory in the competition also represents one of their biggest ever victories in senior football, a 9-0 hammering dished out to the now defunct Shinewater Association in 2000-01.

The Robins heaviest RUR defeat is that 5-0 loss to Littlehampton Town from 2014.

Robins ready for London & South East challenge

Hassocks Ladies kick off their 2023-24 campaign tomorrow in a new division having sauntered to the Sussex County League title last season

Having been crowned Sussex County Women's League Premier Division champions last season, Hassocks Ladies find themselves taking on the London & South East Regional League Division One for 2023-24.

The Robins promotion moves them up to the sixth tier in the English women's pyramid. More travelling, tougher opponents but a welcome challenge having won the title by six clear points from runners up Bognor Regis Town.

Hassocks picked up 11 victories, two draws and just a solitary defeat from their 14 matches in 2022-23. That record suggests they had it easy; but this was a far from straightforward campaign.

The weather wiped out large chunks of the season, leaving Hassocks going up to six weeks without playing.

Rain and freezing temperatures were not the only problems. Two teams dropped out with records expunged or points awarded and other games were declared null and void.

Despite the somewhat haphazard nature of the fixture list and never quite knowing what would happen next, the Robins kept putting win after win on their board.

They confirmed their place as the best side in the Sussex League by beating nearest rivals Bognor 5-2 to secure the championship in the penultimate game of the campaign.

Hassocks had to show fight and determination to recover from 2-1 down. Emily Spooner hit a hat-trick along with goals from Mia Pordage and Jemma Lindfield.

Spooner proved quite the signing after joining from Burgess Hill Town in February, scoring four times in three appearances, contributing two assists and being Player of the Match in the win over Bognor.

Goals were in plentiful supply. Katherine Chappell finished as the league's top scorer with 22 from just 11 matches.

Jess Craig was runner up in the golden boot stakes with 12 and Kirstin Mair contributed a highly important seven.

Hassocks are expecting a much more organised campaign this time around in their new league.

They will face 11 opponents, six of whom are from Sussex: Bexhill United, Bognor Regis, Eastbourne United, Hastings United, Montpelier Villa, Newhaven and Steyning Town. Steyning will provide the shortest journey of the season.

The five other clubs are Bromley, Dartford Reserves, Herne Bay and Welling United.

Fixtures through to the end of October have been published. The Robins will kick off their season away at Bromley tomorrow in a 3pm kick off on the 3G pitch at Hayes Lane used by the Ravens' men in the National League.

Hassocks host their first game at the Beacon on Sunday 10th September against Welling, kick off at 2pm.

All home matches take place at 2pm on Sunday afternoons and admission is free, so please do come along and support the Robins if you can this season.

his run and fired home on the volley.

Lingfield enjoyed their best spell immediately after as they set about cutting the deficit.

Matt Gunn had to block a Carl Brown volley behind and then the same Lingfield player hit an effort which dipped just over the bar.

The Lingers almost scrambled home a corner before Hassocks added the killer third with 15 minutes left to play.

Bull picked up possession just inside the Lingfield half, embarked on a mazy run forward and slipped in Benson to apply the finish.

Conor Wilford pulled one back for the visitors from the penalty spot following a Harvey Blake handball with five minutes remaining.

Hassocks though ensured they won by three when Under 23s midfielder Sam Geard grabbed his first senior goal for the Robins in stoppage time.

Alex Bygraves nodded a corner back across goal towards Geard who picked his spot with a precision header placed between Glassborow and New guarding the post.

Three points from Pagham pays perfect tribute to Dave

At Clayton Wood Burial Ground a stone's throw from the Beacon on Tuesday morning, a service was held for Hassocks Football Club stalwart Dave Knight who passed away recently.

Come the evening and the Robins delivered a fitting tribute to a man associated for more than 40 years with the club by winning 2-1 away at Pagham.

Dave fulfilled many roles for Hassocks, although he was best known for his lengthy spells as secretary and programme editor.

He was a huge figure in the move from Adastra Park to the Beacon. At one point, he lent the club money to get through a cashflow crisis without which it may not have survived.

Dave was never afraid to speak his mind and that made him a fascinating character for post-game analysis; the more action packed a game, the more incidents to pick through, the better.

He would have enjoyed this trip to Nyetimber Lane. Pagham spent most of the second half playing numerically disadvantaged, firstly through a number of sin bins and then by two late red cards which saw them finish with only nine men on the pitch.

Hassocks kept their cool by-andlarge, the end result being three points which leaves them sitting a single goal off the top of the Premier Division.

Both Crowborough Athletic and the Robins have 10 points at the head of the table. The Crows lead the way on account of their +8 goal difference compared to the +7 of Hassocks.

Too early to be paying any serious attentions to the standings? Almost certainly. But it is rare to see the Robins flying in such a lofty position and so hard not to marvel at the novelty of it all.

Hassocks made a good start,

knocking the ball around well across their backline and in midfield.

Inroads further forward were more difficult to come by until Pagham were dealt a blow with 10 minutes played when centre back Daryl Wollers took a nasty blow to the face.

Wollers required lengthy treatment on the side of the pitch, missing a good five minutes of the action as a result.

Midfielder John Phillips dropped in to cover from Wollers. Little did Pagham know that this would not be the last time they would find themselves a man down.

Having done the hard work by navigating that spell playing shorthanded without conceding, the Lions fell behind within a few minutes of Wollers returning to the fray.

Raging Joe Bull delivered a corner and Super Pat Harding was left free to head home unchallenged.

As a Hassocks stalwart himself who came through the youth setup at the Beacon 20 years ago when Mr Knight was secretary, Harding was a most apt opening scorer.

Hassocks moved 2-0 ahead just past the half hour mark. A long ball over the top sent Liam Benson racing clear one-on-one with Connor Kelly.

The Pagham goalkeeper made an outstanding save, only for the ball to divert towards the onrushing Kyle Woolven.

There was to be no mistake from Woolven, who clinically despatched the rebound for his second goal in as many matches.

Having already booked two Pagham players by this point, referee Tazlim Ali was about to become even more busy.

Dan Simmonds became the first Lion to be sin binned for ranting at Mr Ali after being penalised for a tug of a shirt on the stroke of half time.

Pagham were dealt a further blow when Wollers succumbed to his



earlier injury and was withdrawn at the break.

Hassocks did their best to take advantage of both the disruption in the Pagham defence and Simmonds sitting out 10 minutes, almost adding a third through Benson.

Simmonds' return to the action gave the Lions 11 men once again but this was very short lived as within a couple of minutes, Lucas Micevisius was sent to the sin bin.

The Robins fashioned several half chances during this latest period of 11 versus 10, though none were serious enough to worry Kelly.

It was totally against the run of play when Pagham pulled one back on 67 minutes.

Alex Bygraves and Matt Gunn collided when attempting to clear, leaving Simmonds to go through and beat Fraser Trigwell one-on-one.

Cutting the deficit perked the Lions up. They enjoyed a lot more possession and it needed Bygraves and Gunn to atone for their earlier moment by making some vital interventions to prevent Trigwell being called into serious action.

Home hopes of an equaliser were all-but extinguished when Jamie Ford picked up harsh second yellow card for an innocent foul on 84 minutes.

In contrast, there could be no defending substitute Ronald Kardos two minutes later when he was shown a deserved straight red for a horror challenge as the Lions well and truly lost their heads.





Hassocks throw it away to crash out of RUR Cup

August 19th 2017: Leading 2-0 at AFC Uckfield Town with only 15 minutes remaining, Hassocks contrived to find a way to exit the RUR Cup by losing 4-2 at the Oaks

For the second successive season, Hassocks were eliminated at the earliest possible stage of a knockout competition by AFC Uckfield Town.

Last year, the Oakmen were 2-1 winners in the second round of the Peter Bentley League Cup in extra time.

This time it was the Sussex RUR Charity Cup and again it required a full 120 minutes for the hosts to advance to the round three with a 4-2 victory.

As late in the day as 15 minutes remaining, you would have got long odds on there being extra time - let alone Uckfield progressing to the last 16.

Hassocks led 2-0 and were looking relatively comfortable. Safe passage for the Robins seemed assured.

Uckfield were not exactly in great form or spirits coming into the game. They had lost three out of four so far this season and conceded eight times along the way.

But Hassocks did their best to boost morale around the Oaks by producing a quite remarkable collapse, conceding in the 76th, 88th, 108th and 118th minutes.

The continued defensive issues and the manner in which the Robins conspired to throw this game away has got to be a major cause for concern for Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar.

Hassocks though tend to focus on the positives. Strike duo Liam Benson and Michael Death provided most of those.

Both were on target to take their tallies to three apiece for the campaign.

Their goals are at least making light of the loss of four key attacking players.

Charlie Pitcher and Jamie Hillwood both moved to Haywards Heath Town in the summer, Jack Rowe-Hurst has signed for Ringmer and Phil Gault continues to be unavailable.

Benson had begun on the bench but an early injury to Nathan Miles saw him introduced with the game barely 15 minutes old.

It did not take him long to make an impact, heading home midway through the half.

Seven minutes later and Death doubled the advantage. Again it came from a header, Harry Mills drifting out wide on the right and delivering an excellent cross which Death expertly diverted into the back of the net.

We still though need to talk about what is going on at the other end. Dalgleish and Wickwar sought to tighten up their alarmingly leaky defence by switching from a back three to a back four.

Club captain Ashley Marsh was recalled and they also gave a debut to young goalkeeper Nathan Stroomberg, dual-signed in midweek from Lewes.

Stroomberg is highly thought of at the Dripping Pan. Lewes are therefore keen for him to experience as much senior football as possible and he spent part of last season at Worthing United.

He took over from Alex Harris, who has endured a testing start to his third spell as a Hassocks player.

Despite all those changes, as soon as Shaun Loft pulled one back for Uckfield it was a familiar story.

A wave of panic contagiously spread like wildfire through the Hassocks ranks as they collectively fell apart.

So far this season, once one goal has flown in the Robins look ridiculously vulnerable to conceding more and that reached a nadir on this occasion.

There was a feeling that had Hassocks been able to call upon the experience and leadership of the likes of injured duo James Westlake and Spencer Slaughter - as well as Gault and Josh Hawkes - then perhaps they might have possessed the nous to close the game out.

They could not call upon it though and did not see the game out. Richie Welch ensured the extra 30 minutes were necessary with an equaliser two minutes from the end of normal time.

Bailo Camara added the third shortly after the sides had turned around in extra time. Uckfield's safe progression was secured by Dean Stewart-Hunter with 10 minutes of the additional.


It was a frustrating afternoon for Hassocks with plenty of their ire being directed at referee Ciaran Kane.



Shoreham last season

Shoreham ended a four season absence from the Premier Division by winning promotion as Division One champions last time out under the management of former Hassocks striker Michael Death. In the process, the Musselmen went over a calendar year unbeaten in the league from January 2022 to January 2023, providing the foundations to lift the title by six points from Dorking Wanderers B with a record of 21 wins, eight draws and just three defeats from 32 matches. Shoreham are yet to win from any of their three games so far this season, losing to Midhurst & Easebourne and Little Common in the league and Crowborough Athletic in the FA Cup.

Head-to-head

Despite the fact we have not played each other for four seasons, there have been 51 meetings between the clubs. We have won 22, Shoreham 18 Familiar faces with 11 draws; such an even record showing there is rarely anything between the clubs. The only competition in senior football we are yet to play each other in is the FA Vase.

Last time we met

Shoreham were all-but relegated when they visited Hassocks for the final game played at the Beacon of the 2018-19 season whilst we were safely positioned in mid table. Not that any of that mattered as the Musselmen stormed to a 5-0 victory.

Mohammed Diallo scored four of the goals with the other coming from Martin Mutungi.

The game will represent Death's first return to the Beacon as a manager. 
