It is fair to say that Hassocks did not enjoy their clashes with Midhurst & Easebourne last season. A seven-goal thriller at the Beacon edged 4-3 by the Stags was at least entertaining for the neutral. The return at the Rotherfield on the other hand...

Hassocks suffered their heaviest defeat of the campaign on an afternoon in which nothing went right.

The game was up before half time with Midhurst 3-0 ahead. To make matters worse, Robins goalkeeper the board Alex Harris limped off with an injury and we had to play out the entire second half with defender Will the seasor post-Christ

In fairness to Broomfield, there was little he could do about the final two goals for the hosts.

One of those days which we could only file under "forget about and move on." Something we did by enjoying a superb second half of the campaign which resulted in a top 10 finish.

Midhurst in contrast went the other way. They failed to win any of their 19 games which followed that hammering, ending the campaign in 13th spot.

The nine wins the Stags put on the board from their opening 19 matches meant they were safe from the drop before the halfway point of the season and that disappointing run post-Christmas did not do any serious damage.

That meant it was a case of job done. Survival had been the aim of the game for Midhurst in what was their first season in the Premier Division for 30 years and they ended up some 13 points clear of Alfold in the final relegation spot.

As for the current campaign,

Midhurst have made a promising start. Draws with Lingfield and Newhaven combined with a good win at Division One champions Shoreham leave them with five points on the board from a possible 12.

The Stags' cup form has been impressive too. They eliminated Southern Counties East Premier Division outfit Holmesdale away from home in the FA Cup and saw off Loxwood in the RUR Cup in midweek.

There is just one blot on their copybook - an 8-0 defeat to Haywards Heath Town on their previous visit to Mid Sussex 11 days ago.

Is there something about clubs from these parts and Midhurst which leads to high scoring encounters?

Behind the Stats

Meetings between ourselves and Midhurst have been few and far between with more cup matches played between the two than league fixtures.

The clubs first faced off in the 1986-87 campaign when paired together in the Sussex Senior Cup.

The Stags were in the top flight of Hassocks wins, 6-0 here at the the Southern Combination League at the time and proved too good, running out 3-0 winners at the

Rotherfield.

By the time we met again seven years later, the Robins were on their rise to the top division whilst Midhurst that competition, Hassocks edging were at the start of the decline which would eventually see them fall into the West Sussex League.

That was reflected in two big Beacon and 6-1 at the Rotherfield.

Until this afternoon, it is the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup which has provided the greatest number of fixtures.

Three times the clubs have met in the head-to-head by two victories to one.

Overall, both sides have five wins apiece. Three of Midhurst's victories have come in the past three fixtures, in which time they have plundered 12 goals.

Misery at Midhurst where Hassocks hammered in heavy defeat

One week after scoring five times past helpless Saltdean United in the space of 24 first half minutes, Hassocks found themselves on the other end of a hammering at the hands of Midhurst & Easebourne.

Everything that could go wrong went wrong for the Robins on their long trip west for a first league game at the Rotherfield in nearly 30 years.

They were three down at half time, lost goalkeeper Alex Harris to a toe injury just before the interval and shipped twice more after the break with defender Will Broomfield between the posts to sink to a 5-0 defeat.

This was not the start to a pivotal looking December that James Westlake would have been hoping for.

League matches with Midhurst, Peacehaven & Telscombe, Eastbourne Town and Steyning Town mean Hassocks face four opponents all vying for a top six spot along with themselves.

The Robins will also take on the yellow half of Eastbourne in the second round of the Sussex Senior Cup at the Beacon.

With the winners facing a home tie against Bexhill United in round three, Hassocks have a winnable route to the quarter finals – a stage they have only ever reached twice before and which offers the prospect of a meeting with one of the biggest clubs in the county.

It goes without saying that if Hassocks are to progress in the Senior Cup and maintain their challenge for a first top six finish in nearly a decade, then they will have to do much better than they managed against Midhurst.

Westlake made two changes from the side who had been so impressive against Satldean seven days earlier.

Former Loxwood midfielder Tom Tennant came in for his full debut in place of Sam Rogers, who dropped to the bench.

Tom Frankland made his first start since September following injury.

Frankland replaced the absent JJ Minty out on the right and his showing was one of the few bright spots from a Hassocks point of view.

Any away supporters arriving late would have missed the Robins' best moment of the match.

Three minutes had elapsed when a lovely passing move from right to left presented a shooting opportunity for Joe Bull charging forward from left back.

Bull though failed to trouble Midhurst goalkeeper Josh Bird with his effort flying wide of the upright.

"Hassocks were three down at half time, lost goalkeeper Alex Harris to a toe injury just before the interval and shipped twice more after the break with defender Will Broomfield between the posts to sink to a 5-0 defeat.

That represented a good start for Hassocks; but sadly, it was as good as it got.

Midhurst took the lead with 13 minutes played thanks to some poor defending from Hassocks.

Two home players were allowed free headers in the area, the second of which was put past Harris by the Stags' top scorer Harry Tremlett.

Hassocks had déjà vu 120 seconds later. A free kick was delivered into the box and again the Robins' marking was non-existent, leaving Dan Wood free to head home.

Midhurst scored their third five minutes before the break and it was another gift.

Harris passed the ball straight to

Tremlett, who subsequently hit a lob over the head of the stranded Hassocks number one to make it 3-0.

That was Harris' last contribution before hobbling off. With no substitute goalkeeper on the bench, it fell to Broomfield to don the gloves in the second half.

During the interval, the more optimistic of the Hassocks faithful recalled the August meeting of these two sides at the Beacon.

Midhurst had sauntered into an easy 3-0 lead, only for the Robins to come battling back.

Hassocks were within a Phil Johnson effort which rattled the woodwork of claiming a famous point from a 4-4 draw that night.

Striking early in the second half might have given the Robins a chance of worrying Midhurst.

Instead, it was the Stags who added their fourth just two minutes after the restart as the poor defending which had blighted Hassocks in the opening 45 showed no signs of abating.

Tremlett was again the scorer, completing his hat-trick. The Robins did at least show a little fight after that, managing to get through half an hour without conceding.

No prizes for guessing who added the fifth for Midhurst to complete the scoring with 13 minutes remaining. Tremlett had enjoyed a very fruitful afternoon and he left Broomfield with no chance to round off a four-goal haul.

New faces fire Hassocks past Midhurst and into round two of Senior Cup

For the second weekend in a row, Hassocks defeated **Division One opponents with** uncharacteristic ease as they progressed to the second round of the Sussex Senior Cup with a 3-1 success at Midhurst & Easebourne.

Although not as convincing as the previous Saturday's 5-1 victory over Lingfield in the Peter Bentley Cup, this represented another good days work for the Robins.

Midhurst might occupy a lowly place near the bottom of the Southern Combination League's second tier, but they were a well organised outfit who looked capable of causing the Robins a degree of problems.

Hassocks joint manager Phil Wickwar said afterwards this was exactly the sort of game Hassocks would have lost a year ago.

That is probably as good an indication as any as to how far this young squad have come since successfully battling their way out of relegation trouble last season.

The experience the side gained during that campaign as well as several shrewd additions means that the Robins now have enough strength in depth to talk about squad rotation and resting players.

That newfound quality was in evidence here - firstly by the fact that Ashley Marsh, Dan Jacques, Dan Stokes, Bradley Bant and Nick Pitcher were all missing and yet the Robins coped easily.

Secondly, a quick glance at the score sheet shows the names of three new arrivals in Josh Hawkes, Spencer Slaughter and Jonno Melia. Hassocks' work on the transfer front is clearly paying off.

Those goals – as well as Midhurst's consolation – all came in a frantic 25 minute period in the second half.

That was one of two ridiculous bursts in which all the action seemed to occur, the other coming in the opening 25 minutes of the first half.

Nathan Miles had two excellent chances to give Hassocks the lead inside the first quarter of an hour.

Miles just failed to connect to a cross after Jamie Hillwood got away down the left. He then turned and spun beautifully 10 yards out only to blaze over.

George Willett produced an excellent save to ensure the hosts did negotiated and that is what it is all not punish the Robins for those misses.

A lull in proceedings following in the middle third of the game before things sparked into life as Hassocks took control without ever really hitting top gear.

Hawkes opened the scoring on the hour mark when he fired home with aplomb after a free kick was headed down.

Five minutes later and Slaughter embarked on a strong marauding run which was topped off by a neat

That should have been that but Midhurst were gifted a potential way back into the tie on 75, a long hoof

from George Morris leading to Willett and a home striker getting in a right tangle.

The ball eventually ended up in the back of the net with the Hassocks goalkeeper clearly impeded.

Quite why the goal was allowed to stand was unfathomable, not just to the Hassocks bench but also the home dugout who burst into laughter at the decision.

That generous award spurred the hosts into thinking that a comeback was on, but those hopes were extinguished with five minutes left to

Substitute Melia raced clear and showed great composure to round the goalkeeper and finish.

A home game was what Wickwar fancied for his charges as a reward for this solid result.

"This afternoon was a tricky tie about in the Senior Cup," Wickwar said afterwards.

'We are building a reasonable squad now and it is important to use everyone. There is still room for improvement from us yet."

Hassocks hit the road in three cup competitions

The Robins face away matches in the Sussex Transport Senior Cup, the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup and the Peter Bentley League Cup

There will be plenty of midweek cup action to come in September with Hassocks discovering their opponents in three knockout competitions.

The draw for the first round of the Sussex Transport Senior Cup took place on Saturday evening, giving the Robins a trip to AFC Uckfield Town.

Hassocks and the Oakmen have met once previously in the competition.

It came in the third round in the 2005-06 season, when AFC Uckfield were known as Wealden and playing in Division One of the Southern Combination League.

It ended up being a straightforward victory for the Robins. Two goals from Pat Harding, one from Graham Beveridge and an own goal secured a 4-1.

Hassocks would end up being eliminated from the competition at the quarter final stage after a brave performance at home to Horsham in which their Ryman League opponents needed extra time to progress to the semis.

The Robins will make the journey to the Oaks on Tuesday 12th September, kick off at 7:30pm.

A week later and Hassocks are on the road to Division One outfit Roffev in the second round of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup, again kicking off at 7:30pm.

The Boars set up the tie by eliminating Montpelier Villa on Tuesday night. Hassocks meanwhile progressed when seeing off AFC Varndeanians on penalties at the weekend.

It will be the first time the Robins have faced Roffey in the RUR Cup. The three previous meetings at senior the High Street Ground in November level between the clubs have come in the Premier Division and Peter Bentley League Cup.

Hassocks did a league double last season, winning 7-0 at the Beacon on August Bank Holiday Monday and 2-1 at Bartholomew Way in February.

The second of those Robins victories was harsh on Roffey, who had been much the better side as they eyed up their first win of the campaign.

They led 1-0 until the final six

minutes, after which Phil Johnson spared Hassocks blushes with two late goals.

Roffey had won that first Peter Bentley Cup clash 5-1 at the Beacon in September 2021.

Tuesday 26th September will see Hassocks enter the Peter Bentley Cup when they face Selsey for the first time since the 2014-15 campaign.

Despite the two clubs having both been in the Southern Combination League for over 40 years, they have only been paired together once before in the competition.

The Robins ran out 2-0 winners at 2007 thanks to a Mark Sheriff brace.

The game has entered into Hassocks folklore for being the day when Dave John answered a phone call before the players set off to say Spencer Slaughter could not make it as he had been arrested the night

James Westlake will be hoping he is not the recipient of similar news when the Robins return to the wonderfully named Seal Bay Stadium in a 7:45pm kick off.

Beacon attendances rose by 26 percent in 2022-23

Hassocks home crowds hit highest average on record in the 2022-23 season with two league matches pulling in over 300 for the first time in over 20 years

Hassocks enjoyed a 26 percent rise in attendances at the Beacon during the 2022-23, resulting in the Robins posting their highest average crowd since complete records began in the 2004-05 season.

The increase is based on the 2021 -22 campaign when Hassocks averaged 130.

That in itself was a 17 percent rise on 2018-19 when the Southern Combination League Premier Division had last been played to a finish before two Covid-19 interrupted campaigns.

Hassocks played plenty of entertaining, free flowing football through the season just finished with James Westlake leading to the Robins to their first top 10 finish in nine years.

Two games attracted crowds in excess of 300, the first time such a number had been reached for a league game since Burgess Hill Town were in the Southern Combination League and the Mid Sussex Derby was one of the must-see matches in

Sussex non league football.

The visit of Steyning Town on Boxing Day pulled in 305. That high was then topped by the 310 who attended the Robins game against Newhaven.

A collection held that afternoon for the Hassocks Community Food Bank resulted in more than 300 donations in response to the Robins offering half-price entry to anyone who came armed with a tin.

Three further matches exceeded the 200 mark and all resulted in big wins with Hassocks beating Roffey 7-0, Saltdean United 5-1 and Eastbourne Town 4-1.

There were no attendances below three figures, again for the first time since records began.

The Robins' 26 percent rise was the third biggest in the Premier Division after Newhaven and Lingfield.

The Dockers saw their crowds jump by a staggering 98 percent as they topped the average attendance table.

Hassocks found themselves sixth. Also ahead of the Robins were

Peacehaven & Telscombe, Crowborough Athletic, Eastbourne Town and Bexhill United.

Attendances on the whole were up across the entire Premier Division. 13 of the 20 clubs reported a rise, including Lingfield whose 36 percent eclipsed Hassocks and saw them climb away from the bottom position they occupied in 2021-22.

With two well-supported clubs in Haywards Heath Town and Shoreham coming into the Premier Division for this season after relegation from the Isthmian League and promotion from Division One respectively, crowds should increase again across the league.

Hassocks will hope to play a part by continuing to grow their fanbase, attract even more people to the Beacon and post further recordbreaking figures in 2023-24.

Thank you to everyone who attended a game at the Beacon last season for your fantastic support and your continued backing in the new campaign.

Two penalty saves from Trigwell takes Hassocks through in RUR Cup

Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup First Round Saturday 19th August 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 0-0 AFC Varndeanians

It was a case of job done for **Hassocks in their Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup clash** against AFC Varndeanians.

The Robins managed to successfully rotate their squad and secure safe passage to the second round of the competition, where they will travel to either Roffev or Montpelier Villa.

Fraser Trigwell ended up being the Hassocks hero. He made a couple of important interventions to keep Varndeanians at bay during 90 goalless minutes, followed by saving two penalties in the subsequent shootout as the Robins triumphed 5-4 from 12 yards.

Trigwell, Matt Gunn, Joe Bull, Josh Mundy and Liam Benson were the only survivors from Tuesday night's midweek win at Pagham.

James Westlake took the opportunity to rest Harvey Blake, Alex Bygraves, Tom Frankland, Jamie Wilkes, Pat Harding and Kyle Woolven.

In came Bradley Tighe, Sam Smith, Alfie Loversidge, Mike Williamson, Sam Geard and Alex Fair.

Hassocks knew from experience that making such wholesale changes is not without risk.

Westlake rested some big names in the Peter Bentley League Cup last season when Varndeanians provided the opposition at the Beacon.

Trigwell went long from the subsequent goal kick. Benson flicked on down the left and Fair crossed deep to the far post.

The ball did not fall kindly to Loversidge but once he had it under control, the young winger drew a good reaction save from Hawkins.

Varndeanians were not convincing in dealing with the resulting corner, failing to take two opportunities to clear.

That gave Fair the chance to work saves low down to his left. some space via a series of his trademark Cruyff Turns, leading Trammell Mthuzni on a merry dance before curling a shot easily held by

Bull took a corner short to Mundy whose whipped cross ended up being and bouncing behind.

Hawkins gathered a deflected effort and Wilkes blasted a shot from a promising position into orbit shortly after his introduction.

The tall striker was one of four replacements introduced by Westlake in an attempt to find a goal.

Harding, Frankland and Woolven also entered the fray. A foul on the latter as he attempted to run through after collecting a Wilkes pass resulted in Pinnock picking up his second yellow of the afternoon, leaving Varndeanians to finish with 10 men.

Just before that incident and Trigwell kept his side in it, saving brilliantly at the feet of Varndeanians substitute Marley Bigg.

Lobsters firepower proves too hot for Hassocks

August 26th 2008: Hassocks gave a good account of themselves against a quality Redhill outfit whose firepower power ultimately proved too much for John Suter's Robins

Four minutes were all that stood between Hassocks and what would have been a hugely impressive point against a slick and powerful Redhill unit.

Twice the hosts had led at Kiln Brown and twice the Robins had pegged them back thanks to Matt Amos' first goals of the season.

That looked like it would be enough to secure to a share of the spoils until Andrew Dalhouse fired home from 25 yards right at the death to give the Lobsters what was undoubtedly a deserved three points.

Hassocks won't come up against many sides as good as this. If Redhill can keep this squad together, they'll surely be in the shake up come the end of the season.

The Robins meanwhile remain a work in progress under John Suter and with so many new players settling in, nobody really knows what to expect from them.

They certainly couldn't have any complaints about this result. Redhill missed a penalty and hit the woodwork on two occasions in the space of five crazy minutes that opened the second half, a sign that they should have won the game more comfortably than they did.

Hassocks though deserve credit for their staying power as despite being outplayed, they were never truly out of the game.

Redhill's lively front pairing of Dalhouse and Tony Reid were a constant threat all evening and that made for a baptism of fire for 18year-old centre back Nick Pitcher, a member of last season's Youth League Cup winning squad who was handed his debut by Suter in the absence of Matt Percival.

Paul Williams in the Hassocks goal denied Reid twice in the first half, once low down to his right and then by superbly tipping away a free kick

to his left.

hit the side netting after bulldozing his way past Pitcher and Ashlev Marsh and Aaron Murphy shot straight at Williams after a jinking

Hassocks were pretty much a non -entity in terms of an attacking force in the first half but all that changed as the second half began in an absolute frenzy.

Redhill took the lead within 60 seconds of the restart, Reid slamming home from close range after Williams had parried a Murphy cross.

Michael Bates was the architect, marking his first appearance under Suter with a pinpoint cross onto the head of his fellow teenager Amos who headed home.

Hassocks rode their luck after that Peter Barkley fired over, Dalhouse five minutes of madness and it came as little surprise when Redhill retook the lead in the 69th minute, Teddy Ansell bundling the ball in after Dalhouse had headed a Murphy centre back across the box.

This time, it was substitute Laurence Robinson's 79th minute cross which evaded Spencer Slaughter, Ali Russell and two home defenders but not Amos who slotted past Shannon Ruth to restore parity.

Our first home midweek game under the lights so far this season sees former Hassocks striker Michael Death bring his reigning Division One champions Shoreham to the Beacon

Shoreham last season

Shoreham ended a four season absence from the Premier Division by winning promotion as Division One champions last time out under the management of former Hassocks striker Michael Death. In the process, the Musselmen went over a calendar year unbeaten in the league from January 2022 to January 2023, providing the foundations to lift the title by six points from Dorking Wanderers B with a record of 21 wins, eight draws and just three defeats from 32 matches. Shoreham are yet to win from any of their seven games so far this season with a league record reading three defeats and a draw against Eastbourne United from four outings.

Head-to-head

Despite the fact we have not played each other for four seasons, there have been 51 meetings between the clubs. We have won 22, Shoreham 18 Familiar faces with 11 draws; such an even record showing there is rarely anything between the clubs. The only competition in senior football we are yet to play each other in is the FA Vase.

Last time we met

Shoreham were all-but relegated when they visited Hassocks for the final game played at the Beacon of the 2018-19 season whilst we were safely positioned in mid table. Not that any of that mattered as the Musselmen stormed to a 5-0 victory. Mohammed Diallo scored four of the goals with the other coming from Martin Mutungi.

The game will represent Death's first return to the Beacon as a manager. He played 112 games between 2015 and 2018 for the Robins, scoring 38 goals to sit 17th on the all time scorer's list in senior football. Our recent signing of Alex Fair will give the winger an early opportunity to take on the side he helped to win Division One last season, whilst young goalkeeper Joe Southam has signed for Shoreham this season having spent part of last season dualsigned with us from Burgess Hill Town.

Eastbourne United last season

Eastbourne United enjoyed their best season since their 2008-09 Southern Combination League title win, finishing in fourth spot last time out. They conceded only 32 goals, the joint-fewest in the division alongside runners up Crawley Down Gatwick. Their six defeats meanwhile was a total bettered only by champions Broadbridge Heath on five. Had United managed to turn some of their 12 draws into victories, then they would have been very much in the championship picture. That provides an obvious area for Anthony Storey to improve upon this time around in his third campaign since taking over at the Oval.

Head-to-head

The Robins just about lead the head-to-head with 18 wins to United's 14, leaving 14 draws from the 46 meetings between the clubs. Our record is helped hugely by the fact that we seemed to love visiting the Oval in the 2010s, winning on all six visits we made even though we only finished above United in the Premier Division standings once in that time. Such happy times away at United are fast fading to memory with our last four trips ending in three defeats and a draw.

Last time we met

Phil Johnson scored his 100th goal for right into Channel View Road with the Robins in our March visit to the Oval but it was not quite enough for right.

victory. Johnson struck with 11 minutes played and we led right up until four minutes before time when Gary Ingram equalised. Not only did that deny us three points, but it also ended a club-record run of five consecutive clean sheets recorded by James Shaw and his defence.

How to get to The Oval

Take the A27 to Eastbourne, joining the A22 when you reach the Sunshine Coast. Follow that until you reach the second roundabout, turning left onto Lottbridge Drove. Turn right onto the A259 when you hit the roundabout by Homebase, then turn right into Channel View Road with The Oval a little further down on the right.

AFC Uckfield Town last season

It was a season of transition for the Oaks as new manager Jonny Elwood brought in a number of young players with a determination to play good football. As is usually the case with vouthful teams, results were somewhat inconsistent and that resulted in a 16th place finish. Despite the lowly position, Uckfield had no concerns over relegation and finished 11 points clear of the bottom two. The summer has though brought a change in boss with the man Elwood replaced, Steve Ives, returning to the Oaks for a third spell. Ives has led Uckfield to three wins from seven in all competitions in the current campaign. They have defeated AFC Varndeanians and

Horsham YMCA in the league and eliminated Saltdean United from the Peter Bentley League Cup.

Head-to-head

We have met AFC Uckfield on 21 previous occasions. Last season's double moved us ahead in the head-to-head with 11 wins compared to the Oaks' nine, leaving only one draw between the sides. That was a 2-2 thriller at the Beacon in August 2021. It might not be a game to put on your coupon, but it is one which normally delivers goals. 80 having been plundered at an average of nearly four per game.

Last time we met

It was a routine Robins win in the

face game of 2023 at the Beacon back in January. Goals from Liam Benson, JJ Minty and Joe Bull secured a 3-0 victory, just reward for James Westlake naming all three of his senior strikers - Benson, Johnson and Pat Harding - in the same starting XI for the first time.

How to get to the Oaks

Take the A272 followed by the A26 towards Uckfield before joining the B2102 into the town itself. Turn right at the t-junction, past the railway station and follow the road down the high street. When the fork is reached, take the left hand option down Eastbourne Road with the ground being on the left by the Rajditt Restaurant.


