It has been a busy period since we last played at the Beacon, with plenty of football for all four teams and moves in the transfer market.

Our most recent home fixture at the end of August resulted in a 3-1 win over Shoreham, including two wonder goals from distance.

Alex Fair and Kyle Woolven were the scorers of those, either side of Liam Benson continuing his red hot streak.

11 days off followed owing to Steyning Town remaining in the FA Cup before we lost our proud unbeaten league record at Eastbourne United last Saturday.

Any fears that defeat would spark a losing run were dispelled on Tuesday night via an excellent Sussex Senior Cup victory at AFC Uckfield Town. Alex Bygraves and Alfie Loversidge getting the goals at the Oaks.

The Under 23s suffered their first North Division defeat in over a year away at Broadbridge Heath. That was followed by another reversal a week later against Lingfield before Thursday night brought a 3-0 success over Roffey.

The Under 18s have two wins from two having beaten Shoreham and then Haywards Heath Town to top the early Central Division table, whilst the Ladies started their campaign with a 4-1 loss against Welling United on Sunday.

There are reports from all those games contained within today's programme, as well as fixtures as far as we know them through to the middle of October.

It will be another 17 days until we play here at the Beacon when Horsham YMCA visit on Tuesday 3rd October. You can of course keep upto-date with everything going on in the intervening period through our website and social media channels.

Last but by no means least, Westy has been working hard to further bolster the squad on the transfer front and we welcome Sean Stephenson to the Beacon from Newhaven.

Like London buses, Hassocks have waited over 100 years for a competitive game against the AFC Varndeanians, then loads come along at once. This afternoon is Vs second visit to the Beacon of the current campaign and it is only mid-September

Last month saw the clubs face off in the first round of the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup, where we progressed on penalties after 90 goalless minutes.

Last season, we were also drawn together in the Peter Bentley League Cup. That evening did not go quite so well, Varndeanians running out deserved 2-0 winners under the Beacon floodlights.

Those additional games in knockout competitions mean that we have gone from never facing Vs in a competitive match until 2021 to eight meetings in the space of three seasons.

That has created a degree of familiarity between the sides, something further boosted by the

number of players who have moved between the clubs in recent times.

Matt Gunn and Kyle Woolven swapped Withdean Stadium in the summer for the Beacon, whilst two of the stars of our title winning Under 23s went other way with Sam Rogers and Jude Wallis joining Vs.

They are not the only Hassocks connections at Varndeanians. Jamie Hillwood is also signed on although is yet to play a game. Vs also have ex-Robins defender Charlie Tuck on their books.

It has so far taken a young squad some time to gel. Varndeanians arrive here sitting 19th in the table with one win, one draw and seven defeats to their name.

That sole victory, however, is an

impressive one. They saw off Bexhill United 2-1 at Withdean with both goals coming from the former Hassocks contingent.

Wallis opened the scoring, followed by Tuck hitting an 89th minute winner for his first goal in Varndeanians colours.

Vs of course have history for slow starts. In their first Premier Division season for 60 years in 2021-22, they did not win any of their opening 25 games in all competitions.

Despite that leaving them rock bottom at Christmas, a remarkable run of form in the second half of the campaign saw them overhaul East Preston and Loxwood to avoid relegation.

Two Trigwell penalty saves take **Hassocks through in RUR Cup**

It was a case of job done for **Hassocks in their Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup** clash against AFC Varndeanians.

The Robins managed to successfully rotate their squad and secure safe passage to the second round of the competition, where they will travel to either Roffey or Montpelier Villa.

Fraser Trigwell ended up being the Hassocks hero. He made a couple of important interventions to keep Varndeanians at bay during 90 goalless minutes, followed by saving two penalties in the subsequent shootout as the Robins triumphed 5-4 from 12 yards.

Trigwell, Matt Gunn, Joe Bull, Josh Mundy and Liam Benson were the only survivors from Tuesday night's midweek win at Pagham.

James Westlake took the opportunity to rest Harvey Blake, Alex Bygraves, Tom Frankland, Jamie Wilkes, Pat Harding and Kyle Woolven.

In came Bradley Tighe, Sam Smith, Alfie Loversidge, Mike Williamson, Sam Geard and Alex Fair.

Hassocks knew from experience that making such wholesale changes is not without risk.

Westlake rested some big names in the Peter Bentley League Cup last season when Varndeanians provided the opposition at the Beacon.

On that occasion, the Robins were defeated 2-0. A year on and this Hassocks squad runs deeper. Westlake can make six changes and Hassocks can still get a result, although the head coach did admit afterwards that his side were nowhere near their best.

That made for a pretty turgid affair in which good chances were few and far between.

The first opportunity of the game summed up what was to come. Tighe was wearing the captain's armband with Bygraves watching from the

bench and seemed in particularly determined mood to score as skipper. leg to send the Robins wide man to

His charge forward from right back was picked out by Smith hitting a 70 yard pass up the pitch. The Varndeanians left back got stuck under the ball, leaving Tighe facing down goalkeeper Jordan Hawkins.

Tighe opted try and lob the bouncing ball first time over the head of Hawkins. This seemed bold and so it proved, the effort getting stuck in a tree behind the goal.

Two good chances came the way of Varndeanians in what proved to be effort and Wilkes blasted a shot from an action packed lead up to half

Mundy surrendered possession to Max Vardy, whose shot Smith managed to get just enough of a head on to deflect over the bar.

No Hassocks player then picked up the run into the box of Oscar Pinnock. Luckily for the Robins, Pinnock headed wastefully over from a Lawrence Edwards cross.

Trigwell went long from the subsequent goal kick. Benson flicked on down the left and Fair crossed deep to the far post.

The ball did not fall kindly to Loversidge but once he had it under control, the young winger drew a good reaction save from Hawkins.

Varndeanians were not convincing in dealing with the resulting corner, failing to take two opportunities to clear.

That gave Fair the chance to work miss was the rangy Wilkes. some space via a series of his trademark Cruyff Turns, leading Trammell Mthuzni on a merry dance before curling a shot easily held by Hawkins.

Hassocks had strong penalty appeals turned down in the final play prior to the break. Loversidge produced a delightful piece of skill to collect a long pass from Raging Bull, lobbing it over the head of a Varndeanians defender.

When said defender tried to recover the situation, he clumsily caught the back of Loversidge's right the ground. Referee Ellis South waved play on.

Hopes that the entertainment value of those final 10 minutes of the first half would extend into the second were dashed pretty early on as the game struggled to reignite.

Bull took a corner short to Mundy whose whipped cross ended up being more of a shot, clipping the crossbar and bouncing behind.

Hawkins gathered a deflected a promising position into orbit shortly after his introduction.

The tall striker was one of four replacements introduced by Westlake in an attempt to find a goal.

Harding, Frankland and Woolven also entered the fray. A foul on the latter as he attempted to run through after collecting a Wilkes pass resulted in Pinnock picking up his second vellow of the afternoon, leaving Varndeanians to finish with 10 men.

Just before that incident and Trigwell kept his side in it, saving brilliantly at the feet of Varndeanians substitute Marley Bigg.

Trigwell was equally impressive in the shootout, keeping out the second and sixth Varndeanians penalties with saves low down to his left.

Harding, Woolven, Bull, Frankland and Benson all converted for Hassocks. The only Robins player to

Robins sign former Tractor Boys youngster Stephenson

Hassocks have completed the signing of former Ipswich Town Under 18s player Sean Stephenson from fellow Southern Combination Premier Division club Newhaven.

Stephenson spent three years with the Tractor Boys, signing schoolboy forms in 2019 following a successful trial.

He then penned a two year academy contract in the summer of 2020, becoming part of Ipswich's Under 18s squad.

In October 2021, Stephenson was given his first taste of senior football with a loan spell at Eastern Counties League Premier Division side Brantham Athletic.

He played five times for the Blue Imps before injury brought his spell at Brantham Leisure Centre to an early end.

After leaving Ipswich, Stephenson

signed for Isthmian League South East outfit Lancing for the 2022-23 campaign.

Stephenson made 12 league appearances for the Lancers as well as a number of outings in cup competitions during his time at Culver Road.

In January, he moved to Southern Combination table toppers
Broadbridge Heath but with the Bears on their way to the Premier Division title, was unable to force his way into a winning team.

Stephenson turned out four times for Heath from the bench. He also played four times for the Bears' Under 23s, scoring three goals in a more advanced role than the centre back position he filled with Ipswich.

Next came a move to Loxwood for the final few weeks of the 2022-23 campaign, where Stephenson grabbed two goals from his five matches playing as a forward.

The first of those ended up winning the Magpies Goal of the Season award, a superb volley assisted by former Robin Jake Lindsey in a 3-1 win over Saltdean United.

Stephenson's second goal endeared him greatly to the Plaistow Road faithful as it came against local rivals Alfold, securing a 2-2 Easter Monday draw at the Elliott Scott Group Stadium.

Impressed by his form with Loxwood, Newhaven took Stephenson to the Trafalgar Ground in the summer to boost their attack.

He has started once for the Dockers and come off the bench three times, registering one assist when unselfishly playing in Alfie Rogers with a cheeky backheel for the final Newhaven goal in a 7-1 FA Cup Preliminary Qualifying Round win over Spelthorne Sports.

Benson bags six in eight and August Player of the Month

Not only did six Liam Benson goals in eight games help fire Hassocks to the top of the **Southern Combination Premier Division in August,** but they also saw the striker named a very worthy winner of the Robins Player of the Month award.

Benson enjoyed the most prolific season of his career in 2022-23, scoring 19 times and that form has carried over into the new campaign.

His first goal of 2023-24 came away against Loxwood, lashing home a Jack Troak corner on the volley at the second attempt as Hassocks ran out 3-0 winners at the Nest.

Benson provided the third goal in the 4-1 home rout of Lingfield 11 days later.

The score was 2-1 at the time and come from pinpoint set piece the Lingers were on getting on top when Benson latched onto a Joe Bull through ball and applied the finish for an important intervention which turned the tide back in favour of the

Robins.

The visit of Midhurst & Easebourne to the Beacon saw Benson write what is suspected to be a Hassocks record for the fastest ever hat-trick in the club's history.

He needed just eight minutes to hit a treble with all the goals coming before a quarter of an hour had been played in what turned out to be a 3-1 win for the Robins.

Benson rounded off August with a crashing header from another Bull assist when Hassocks saw off Shoreham 3-1 in their final game of the month.

Other individuals aside from Benson had profited from Raging Bull in August and Bull subsequently takes second place in Player of the Month for providing a glut of assists.

Whilst the majority of those have deliveries, Bull has also provded a set of swashbuckling attacking performances from left back.

And he might well have already won the Hassocks Goal of the Season

award for his incredible 35 yard strike into the top corner during the 1-1 FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round draw with Erith Town at the Beacon.

Bull was named Robins Starman in that game against the Dockers and also took the accolade when Hassocks won at Loxwood.

Third place in August Player of the Month went to one of the Robins' summer recruits.

Defender Matt Gunn has made quite the impression in his first month in a Hassocks shirt since making the move from AFC Varndeanians.

He has established himself alongside Alex Bygraves at the heart of the James Westlake's defence, impressing with some important interventions in a Robins back line that have looked very solid throughout August.

Gunn has also caught the eye with his penchant for playing raking passes out of defence, one of which saw him assist Benson as part of that rapid hat-trick against the Stags.

Six undefeated as rampant Robins prove too strong for Musselmen

Southern Combination League Premier Division Tuesday 29th August 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 3-1 Shoreham

Six league games undefeated and three points clear at the top of the Southern Combination Premier Division. To say the first month of the 2023-24 season has gone well for Hassocks would be a slight understatement.

Shoreham became the latest victims of a Robins side whose position at the head of the standings is as deserved as it is unexpected.

Spectacular strikes from Alex Fair and Kyle Woolven sandwiched a sixth of the campaign from in-form Liam Benson as Hassocks eased their way to a 3-1 win.

It took Fair just seven minutes to open the scoring, his first goal for the Robins coming against the club he helped win the Division One title last season under the management of ex-Hassocks striker Michael Death.

Seeing his side fall behind so early was not the first return to the Beacon as a manager Death would have wanted.

He did though have praise for his former side and the job being done in the dugout by old teammate James Westlake.

"Hassocks are flying at the moment and Westy and his team are doing brilliantly. Well done to them, they could really be in the mix this season," said Death afterwards.

There was also a face familiar to the Robins faithful leading the line for Shoreham, Death having convinced Nathan Miles to end a five-year exile from senior football.

The seventh-highest scorer in Hassocks history was afforded a warm reception on his first ever appearance against the Robins.

Or rather, a warm reception from the crowd. Bradley Tighe was not quite so generous, fouling his former colleague with less than 120 seconds on the clock.

Tighe redeemed himself by clearing away the resulting free kick,

crossed into the box by the Musselmen from a dangerous position.

Next came Fair's goal, a brilliant chest and dipping volley from the edge of the area after collecting a Tom Frankland throw.

The marking from Shoreham was non-existent, but nobody could argue with the quality of the finish which left another ex-Robin in young goalkeeper Joe Southam grasping at thin air.

Seven minutes later and Tighe came closer than ever to ending his 179 game wait for a senior goal, putting a header against the bar from a Joe Bull corner.

Shoreham fashioned their first chance on 17 minutes. Neil Munday flashed a shot across goal which Fraser Trigwell did well to divert with his legs.

A well worked short corner routine from Hassocks saw Benson lay back to take Frankland, whose curling effort from 18 yards needed a hand from Southam to turn it behind.

Frankland delivered that next corner directly into the box. Gunn nodded onto the chest of Fair but his subsequent volley from much closer range on this occasion ended up on the railway tracks rather than the back of the net.

Shoreham left back Tom Bond almost doubled the advantage for Hassocks on the stroke of half time.

Benson helped on a Super Pat Harding cross and under no pressure, Bond inexplicably headed the ball against his own crossbar.

From there, it bounced down and back towards Benson. Seemingly flummoxed by Bond's decision making, Benson could not quite react quickest enough to force the loose ball home. Levi Martin was able to nip in and clear.

Heavy rain arrived during the interval and continued into the second half, making the surface slick





and the ball greasy.

Tighe embarked on an early charge forward from right back, hitting a fizzing pass into Fair. Some trademark quick footwork from Fair created the space for a shot on the turn which whistled just past the post.

Frankland was equally nifty when lifting the ball over the head of Ross Myers in midfield, carrying into 40 yards of open space and slipping in Benson. It needed a firm block from Bond to turn the ball behind.

Benson would not be denied for long. Raging Bull delivered the resulting corner into a dangerous area where Benson headed home just before Southam could gather.

Woolven added the third with seven minutes remaining. Picking up possession some 30 yards out from goal, the substitute advanced a couple of steps before picking out the top right hand corner.

That a player as good as Woolven started the night on the bench is indicative of the squad depth Hassocks currently enjoy.

Keeping everyone happy will be no easy task for Westlake, but it is undoubtedly a nice problem to have.

The Robins were 60 seconds away from a clean sheet when George Hollah struck the consolation for Shoreham, bending a superb left footed free kick over the wall and into the opposite corner.

Hassocks find United too hot to handle on scorching September day

Southern Combination League Premier Division Saturday 9th September 2023, The Oval **Eastbourne United 3-0 Hassocks**

In their toughest test of the season so far, Hassocks surrendered both their unbeaten Premier Division record and top spot following a 3-0 defeat at Eastbourne United.

Not many people would have expected the Robins to come into their seventh game of the campaign leading the way having amassed 16 points from a possible 18.

United in contrast are heavily fancied to be involved in the promotion race having finished fourth last season.

They conceded only 32 goals, the joint-fewest in the division alongside runners up Crawley Down Gatwick.

Their six defeats meanwhile was a total bettered only by champions Broadbridge Heath on five.

Had United managed to turn some of their 12 draws into victories - both games with Hassocks ended level - then they would have been very much in the championship picture.

That gives Anthony Storey's side a obvious area for improvement. And based on what happened against Hassocks at the Oval, United look well capable of picking up the additional points needed to push even higher up the table.

They withstood plenty of pressure from the Robins at one end and proved clinical at the other.

The hosts needed just two minutes to take the lead. Hayden Beaconsfield swung over a corner which stuck Callum Barlow seemingly more by luck than design to defy Fraser Trigwell.

It was such an early opener that some of the Robins substitutes had the perfect view, watching it from behind the goal as they made their way from the changing rooms around to the dugouts on the opposite side of the pitch.

Hassocks strung their first passing move together five minutes later.

This eventually released Joe Bull down the left to flash a dangerous ball across the six yard box.

At least three red shirts were queuing up to convert and yet none where able to do so. A simple touch would have at least forced ex-Hassocks goalkeeper James Broadbent into action.

Alex Fair dragged one wide on 13 minutes before Broadbent found himself stretching to keep out a Raging Bull free kick.

United winger Tigana Quebe went for a spectacular bicycle kick which is best described as good idea, bad execution with the effort heading a long way away from the goal.

Both sets of players had cause to thank Quebe though for his boldness as it led to referee Daniel Cooper offering a water break whilst the ball was retrieved.

With the mercury touching 30 degrees and many of the 200 plus crowd wondering if they had made the right decision in choosing the Oval over the nearby beach, the pause in play was very welcome.

Hassocks enjoyed a good spell after the refreshment stop. Bailo Camara and George Olulode were both booked in the space of two minutes and another Bull delivery was crying out to be turned in.

Broadbent saved bravely at the feet of Liam Benson. When Fair then rattled the post three minutes before half time, United were visibly holding out for the interval and the chance to regroup.

The Robins in contrast found their momentum checked by half time. The first 15 minutes of the second half were a non event, leading James Westlake to make a treble change on the hour mark in an attempt to shake his team back to life.

Off went Alfie Loversidge, Jamie Wilkes and Alex Fair. One came Kyle Woolven, Josh Mundy and Sean Stephenson.





For former Ipswich Town youth team player Stephenson, it was a Hassocks debut following his signing earlier in the week from Newhaven.

The changes almost paid dividends with Hassocks coming close to an equaliser just three minutes later through Benson.

United survived though and as the half wore on, the Robins had to become ever more attacking in their quest for an equaliser.

The hosts remained solid despite the best efforts of Hassocks to find a way through. United man-of-thematch Alfie Headland stood out in particular at centre back.

Hassocks were pretty sturdy themselves, Matt Gunn proving the equal of Headland by taking the Robins' Starman award.

This was certainly not a day on which Hassocks deserved to concede three. They did so after being caught out by two sucker punches in the final eight minutes.

Substitute Ed Ratcliffe hit a crisp strike from distance to double United's lead on 82. The three points were then made safe as the game was about to tick into injury time with Ratcliffe again heavily involved.

He earned a corner with a shot from a Callum Barlow pass deflected behind. Beaconsfield played the set piece short to Ratcliffe, who embarked on a great solo run ended with a clinical finish from a tight angle to complete an impressive cameo from the bench.

Late Loversidge winner sends Robins through in Senior Cup

Sussex Transport Senior Cup First Round Tuesday 12th September 2023, The Oaks AFC Uckfield Town 1-2 Hassocks

Alfie Loversidge picked the perfect moment to score his first goal in nearly 18 months, securing safe passage for Hassocks into round two of the Sussex Transport Senior Cup.

Loversidge burst onto the scene in the 2021-22 campaign, scoring nine times in 43 appearances to help keep the Robins in the Southern Combination League Premier Division.

But his progress was unfortunately stalled last season through injury. The young forward was ruled out for five months between August and January and then had his minutes carefully managed as Hassocks eased him back into senior football.

That meant Loversidge had not found the back of the net since the Robins defeated East Preston 5-2 at the Beacon in March 2022, a hugely important win in the ultimately successful battle for survival.

Fast forward to the Oaks on Tuesday night and penalties were looming in this Senior Cup first round tie against AFC Uckfield Town, the score locked at 1-1 with just 90 seconds of normal time remaining.

It was then that Loversidge struck, giving Hassocks a 2-1 victory, a place in round two of the competition and the prospect of a plum tie with one of the big clubs of Sussex football when the draw is be made live on BBC Radio Sussex on Saturday evening.

James Westlake has made a habit of rotating his squad for cup matches, including last month when the Robins progressed beyond AFC Varndeanians in the Sussex Principal RUR Charity Cup.

He did so again here. And it is a sign of how much strength in depth the Robins currently possess that they have now seen off two fellow Southern Combination Premier Division outfits even when resting

key individuals.

Five of the XI from the weekend defeat at Eastbourne United were given a night off from starting duties against Uckfield - Tom Frankland, Matt Gunn, Jamie Wilkes, Alex Fair and leading scorer Liam Benson.

Josh Mundy, Kyle Woolven, Sam Smith, Bradley Tighe and Sean Stephenson came in, the latter making his first start in Hassocks colours since joining from Newhaven.

With three of the Robins' next four fixtures also coming in cup competitions, there are sure to be plenty of other opportunities for rotation as Hassocks navigate a busy schedule which has them playing two games a week through until the middle of October.

Having conceded after only two minutes against United at the weekend, the Robins would have been hoping to keep things tight early on.

Naturally, this led to them falling behind with only five minutes played. This young Uckfield side tried to keep the ball on the deck throughout, which is always easier said than done on the infamous surface of the Oaks.

Some neat passing out of a tight spot at right back worked the ball into the middle of the park.

Mundy thought he had successfully intercepted, only to fall over a divot. Uckfield made the most of the reprieve, switching to break down the opposite left flank where Ali Rainford crossed and Morgan Vale fired clinically beyond Fraser Trigwell.

The lead lasted for 14 minutes before Hassocks captain Alex Bygraves hauled his side level with his first goal of the season, coming after a typically threatening Joe Bull corner caused chaos in the Oakmen box.

Westlake's rotation policy means that Raging Bull is now the only outfield player to have started all 11 matches this season for Hassocks.





Pat Harding is the only other man to be involved in every game, despite being far and away the oldest member of the squad.

Harding had scored two of the goals on the only previous occasion Hassocks and the Oakmen had met in the Senior Cup back in December 2005, so just the 18-odd years ago.

Uckfield were known as Wealden back then and playing in Division One. They were easily swatted aside 4-1 by a Robins side who went as far as the quarter finals of the competition.

Harding would undoubtedly have been in the first five penalty takers had spot kicks been required to see off Uckfield in 2023.

Loversidge ensured that was not the case, capping off a man-of-thematch performance with that late goal greeted by wild celebrations from the travelling players and support.

Uckfield meanwhile could take heart from their performance and will hope to use it as a platform to push up the Premier Division table having won only two of eight games so far since Steve Ives' summer return as manager.

Other than the result, the only disappointment for them on the evening was Ellis Wright being sent off for two bookable offences.

First defeat in 11 months for 10 man Hassocks against buoyant Bears

Charlie Fogden missed out altogether whilst Sam Fernley and Noah McHale dropped down to the bench.

Two first team players came into the side. Kyle Woolven has found starting opportunities limited thanks to the form which has led Hassocks to top spot in the Premier Division.

With no first team game at the weekend owing to Steyning Town still being in the FA Cup, Woolven given the opportunity to get minutes under

his belt 48 hours after coming off the bench to score a stunning 30 yard effort against Shoreham on Tuesday night.

The Robins were also boosted by the return of club captain Lewis Westlake, playing his first competitive action for over eight months following an injury-hit previous campaign.

Under 23s regular Jack Smith made his first start of the season, as did George Gladding from the Under 18s squad.

anything down the left flank was latched onto by Lemon, who did brilliantly to hit a sweet first time cross into the box.

It found its way to Wiktor Maznica, who took a touch before striking beyond Jack Thomas to double the Bears advantage.

Heath ended the game as a contest three minutes into the second half thanks to a fine individual goal from defender James Archard.

After advancing down the right flank and cutting inside, Archard exchanged a one-two with Kowalczyk on the edge of the box.

Having received possession back, Archard proceeded to go around two more Hassocks defenders before beating Thomas at the near post.

Heath added their fourth on 65 as Maznica completed his brace. Some quick feet on the edge of the box opened up enough space for Maznica to rifle home.

The floodgates could easily have opened further at that point. One positive for Hassocks is that they did not. Another positive was a debut goal for substitute Cavan Chedzey.

And some goal it was too. The former Hurstpierpoint player was 40 yards from goal and positioned on out on the touchline when he hit a right footed effort which flew over the head of helpless Heath goalkeeper Montgomery Watson-Price before dropping into the far corner.

That helps give the Robins greater strength depth, so much so that Hassocks can still score five

times in a game even without the services of leading scorer Alex Brewer.

The striker plundered four of the Robins goals in the 6-1 win over Shoreham a week earlier but was unavailable for the short trip to Haywards Heath.

His place was taken by Josh Nandhra, who seamlessly slotted in by scoring a hat-trick.

There were two other changes for Hassocks. George Gladding missed out and Will Hatley dropped down to the bench.

Joining Nandhra in coming into the side were his brother Kian and Ed Tobias.

Kian Nandhra has already made his senior debut for the Robins, coming off the bench in the 4-1 win over Lingfield last month.

Tobias meanwhile won Players' Player of the Season last year having been an ever-present and breaking into the Under 23s.

Not wanting to be completely outshone by his brother, Kian Nandhra joined Josh on the scoresheet.

The other Robins goal came from Charlie Fogden, grabbing his first in Hassocks colours.

All four Heath goals came after







Robins beaten in season opener but scoreline does not tell whole story

In a hard fought match which was closer than the final score of 4-1 suggests, Hassocks Ladies lost their opening game in the London and South East Regional Women's League Division One against Welling United.

The match started fairly evenly with both sides threatening at a sunny Beacon.

Firstly, Hassocks captain Claire Stevens had to head clear two early crosses in quick succession.

Hassocks fashioned a half chance in response. Kirsten Mair hit a superb through ball which Welling goalkeeper Tania Morton had to come rushing from her box to clear.

Unfortunately, Hassocks found themselves a goal down shortly after that chance when Gracie Speak produced a clinical shot from distance which found the corner of the net.

New Robins manager Alison Page responded by making a substitution, introducing debutant Lola Moon in place of Mair. The change had an immediate impact as Hassocks equalised almost straight away.

Emma Flin hit a cross field pass to Johanson, who played the ball back inside for Katherine Chappell. Having scored 30 times in only 13 games last season, Chappell continued where she left off by making no mistake with a shot drilled across Morton and into the bottom corner.

The visitors had seemingly not expected a Robins equaliser and they subsequently raised their game.

A dangerous Welling break ended with a shot just wide before Hassocks survived another chaotic scramble to again hack away.

The Robins lost Johanson to a head injury in the final 10 minutes of the half with Mair returning in her place. There was still time after that for Welling to threaten twice more.

A corner was headed wastefully wide, followed by Stevens taking a break from heading everything clear to expertly shepherd a forward into a position where the angle was too wide to finish.

Despite the very obvious improvement in the visitors' performance after Hassocks had levelled, 1-1 was ultimately a fair reflection going into the break.

Just like the first half, the second half began fairly evenly. A great run from Pordage won Hassocks a corner which came to nothing. Welling almost made more of corner of their own, only for Sarah Chappell to make a great claim under pressure.

The 57th minute saw Tallie Bright release Spooner into a dangerous position where she was halted by a foul. From the resulting free kick, Morton was required to make another good stop at the expense of another corner.

Welling then enjoyed a breakaway with Chappell producing a brilliant save. The Hassocks number one followed up with another important stop from a Welling forward racing through on goal.

There was nothing Chappell could do when substitute Carly Gray produced a crisp finish to give





Welling a 2-1 lead just past the hour mark.

Page again turned to her bench in response, bringing on Jess Gray. Hassocks forced a goalmouth scramble of their own but nobody in read was able to provide a finish.

A remarkable piece of skill from Gray then saw her turn and power a shot which beat Morton all ends up, only to crash against the angle of post and bar.

Page made several more changes in an attempt to find an equaliser. Pordage thought she had provided one, only for Morton to again thwart the Robins.

With the game entering injury time, Hassocks threw everything they had at Welling. That left spaces at the other end for the visitors to exploit on the counter, which they did ruthlessly as Gray scored a quickfire double to complete her hattrick and end the Robins' hopes of a comeback.

Although Welling deserved their victory, the final scoreline was harsh and Hassocks could easily have taken a point from the match.

It is clear the London & Regional League is a big step up in quality from the Sussex League which Hassocks won last season, but the Robins will take heart from their efforts.

Full backs Katie Read and Webb can dealt well with two very skilful and fast forwards. The Hassocks midfielders were always involved and had their share of possession and new players Moon and Gray look to be good additions to the squad.

Tame exit leaves Hassocks wondering what might have been

September 16th 2006: Hassocks exited the FA Cup at the first qualifying round away at Ryman League Sittingbourne in a game Dave John felt his side could have won on another day

It was a case of wondering what might have been for Hassocks as they exited the FA Cup in the first qualifying round away at Ryman League Sittingbourne.

Dave John had no complaints about the 3-0 scoreline, the hosts being worthy winners on the balance of play.

What the Robins boss did regret was that his side did not do themselves justice.

On another day, John felt it was a tie Hassocks could have won with the XI they had out - and even more so if he had a full squad to choose him.

The absence of the holidaying Matt Robbins was clearly a factor and Hassocks were also without Mark Sheriff, at a wedding having scored a hat-trick for the reserves in their 6-1 win over Worthing United on Friday night.

Chris Brown thankfully passed a late fitness test and was able to start, although he went off just before the hour mark.

The Robins then lost both Stuart Faith and skipper Chris Hewitt to injuries.

Three enforced substitutions in the space of 18 minutes did little to help their cause.

No doubt Hassocks showed the Brickies too much respect in the opening half hour.

That enabled the hosts to make all the running before being awarded a 14th minute penalty when one of many awkward bounces off a hard, bumpy pitch led to Hewitt handballing.

Andy Doerr made no mistake from the spot. And that is how the tie continued until the final 15 minutes of the first half, when the Robins at last showed a little more confidence.

They needed to be shocked into life by a close shave, however. An early Sittingbourne injury had seen

substitute Joe Dowley come on and his first time cross caught the Hassocks defence napping. Luckily for the visitors, Doerr headed wide.

It was young Matt Amos who began to offer Hassocks hope. The 17-year-old engineered a shooting chance well thwarted by Brickies goalkeeper Steve Williams.

The angle was then against Amos following an error by Paul Ainsworth. A better opportunity fashioned by good link up play between Amos and strike partner Richard Thomas was fired wide by Anthony Hibbert.

Suddenly, the game had become an end-to-end contest. Hewitt found himself in the right place at the right time when getting hit by a Mitchell Sherwood volley which appeared goal bound.

Another great early cross from Dowley next left the Hassocks defence for dead, only for Clint Goodling to somehow fire over from six yards with the goal gaping.

The Robins had the final chance of the half and it was a glorious one too.

Amos chipped a perfect ball over the top for Hibbert to chase onto. The connection from Hibbert was perfect but the volley flew inches over.

Had that gone in, the game may well have turned out very different. John said it was particularly disappointing as Hibbert had been working on that kind of finish in training and hitting the target regularly.

Not long into the second half and Amos went close with an acrobatic overhead kick which drew gasps from around Woodstock Park.

Joel Harding was forced into a good stop from Tristan Wells and Sam Fisk pulled a save from Williams after charging into the Sittingbourne area from left wing back.

Brown's 57th minute withdrawal

saw Fisk pushed into midfield and Ian Dawson take over on the left.

The positional roulette seemed to throw Hassocks however, and two goals in little more than a minute ended the game as a contest.

Both came from defensive errors. First, a long cross on 62 went over the head of last defender Ashley Marsh.

Part-namesake Kieran Marsh took his chance expertly from what had appeared a most unpromising angle.

Roffey this season

Roffey are back in Division One after their debut Premier Division campaign last time out did not go according to plan.
