These are exciting times for everyone involved with Saltdean United. Work is expected to get underway soon on the installation of a 3G pitch at Hill Park, as well as the building of a new Clubhouse and stands

The work will turn Hill Park into one of the finest grounds in the Southern Combination League, allowing Saltdean to progress both up the men's and women's pyramids with their female section already one of the best in Sussex.

On the pitch, 2023-24 was always going to be something of a transitional season for the Tigers.

In late March, they replaced our former head coach Brad Sweetman with interim manager Joe Mctiffen to try and guarantee Premier Division survival.

This ultimately was a success, Saltdean ending the campaign someway clear of Alfold and Roffey in the bottom two.

The summer then saw the Tigers

appoint Newhaven Under 21s boss Kieran Ridley as their manager.

Ridley brought several of his talented Dockers squad with him to Hill Park.

But as is often the case with young players stepping up to senior level, the Tigers have struggled for consistency.

They arrive here this afternoon sitting 19th in the table, four points ahead of bottom side Shoreham.

Looking upwards, it is pretty congested with all of Saltdean, AFC Uckfield Town, AFC Varndeanians and Bexhill United separated by just two points.

The Tigers' two league wins so far have been impressive, showing what they can do on their day.

A 1-0 win over 2022-23 runners up Crawley Down Gatwick was one of the surprise results of the opening month of the campaign.

They then hammered AFC Uckfield 4-1 at Hill Park via a late rally having trailed 10 until the 72nd minute.

More recent points have been claimed from draws at Bexhill United and Shoreham, whilst the Tigers eliminated our Sussex RUR Charity Cup vanquishers Roffey from the Sussex Senior Cup.

The weather has frustrated Saltdean over the last six weeks. They have played just once since the middle of October, a close-fought 3-2 loss to in-form Loxwood a fortnight ago.

Those who followed Sweetman to Hill Park included Arthur Rawlingson, Jack Gardner, Lewis Beebee, Alfie Edmeads, Louis Thwaites, Lucas Tyrrell, Jayden

But even before the summer of 2021, there were plenty of others to have played for Hassocks and Saltdean.

Dunkley and **Jacob Campbell**.

James Broadbent was number one goalkeeper for Saltdean in 2021-22 as the Tigers runners up in both the Southern Combination League and RUR Charity Cup.

Broadbent spent 2016-17 as a

Robin, playing a huge role in helping us avoid relegation on his way to winning all of Players' Player, Managers' Player and Supporters' Player of the Season awards.

Another goalkeeper to have turned out for both clubs is Nathan **Stroomberg**, who played 21 times for Hassocks in the 2017-18 season.

Stroomberg spent the following season with Saltdean before establishing himself as number one at Lewes. He is now a Peacehaven & Telscombe player.

Striker **Ben Bacon** has enjoyed three spells with Hassocks and one with the Tigers, coming back to haunt was **Jamie Buckett**, whilst former us by scoring all four goals as Saltdean won 4-1 on their August Bank Holiday Monday visit to the Beacon in 2018.

Another striker Dan Smith played for the Tigers in amongst his three spells with Hassocks between 2010 and 2013.

His overall record for the Robins stood at 27 goals in 63 games with an even more impressive strike rate at Hill Park when Saltdean were a Division Two outfit.

Stuart Brown moved to Hill Park for first team football from the Beacon midway through the 2014-15 season, when our former reserve team boss **Scott Osborne** was part of the Saltdean management team.

Also with the Tigers at that time Hassocks Under 18s captain **Terry** Gacias had a brief spell with Saltdean in the early 2010s.

Behind the Stats

Saltdean are one of the few sides than three a game. we have faced in all three divisions of the Southern **Combination League having first** met in Division Two back in the 1987-88 season.

We never managed a victory at that level against the Tigers, which is in stark contrast to what happened when both clubs found themselves in Division One in the mid-90s.

Six games, six Robins victories with 19 goals at an average of more

Into the Premier Division and even when Saltdean were reaching Sussex Senior Cup finals and challenging Burgess Hill Town for honours, we were still able to pick up some decent results against them between 1996 and 2001.

The Tigers endured something of a rollercoaster after that, dropping back into Division Two before climbing again all the way into the Premier Division.

Between 2017 and 2022, we failed to win any of our eight clashes with Saltdean before completing a league double last season.

That made the Premier Division head-to-head a little more respectable, giving us six wins compared to the Tigers' 12.

We still have a lot of catching up to do in the scoring stakes though, Saltdean having nearly double the number of goals we have managed in those 21 games so far.





Troak helps Robins find two goals in final 15 minutes to tame the Tigers

For 75 minutes at Hill Park, it looked like Hassocks were going to suffer from that dreaded word frustration against Saltdean United.

The score was locked at 0-0 despite the Robins being the dominant side, particularly in the second half following the introduction of livewire substitute Jack Troak.

Countless opportunities had gone begging and the travelling support were beginning to wonder if this was to be another of those days - and there have been quite a few this season – where Hassocks were going to rue their wastefulness.

But then the Robins found two goals in the final quarter of an hour, both of which were the result of brilliant link up play down the left flank from Leon Turner and Troak to secure a first league double over Saltdean since the 1994-95 season.

The first arrived on 76 minutes, just as the Tigers and former Hassocks head coach Brad Sweetman must have thought their luck was in and they were going to claim a big point in their battle against relegation.

Turner fed the overlapping Troak to pull a pass back to Phil Johnson who fired past Josh James to finally open the scoring.

Six minutes later and the Robins made the game safe. Again Turner released Troak to set up a second which appeared to have been turned in by a Saltdean defender.

The dubious goals panel will have to rule whether it goes down as an own goal or to Troak.

James Westlake's team selection laid bare his intention to attack opponents who his side had stuck five goals past in 24 first half minutes at the Beacon in November.

Johnson, Liam Benson and Pat Harding all started together for just the second time this season.

Westlake also introduced tall striker Jamie Wilkes into midfield. Bradley Tighe was unavailable as he and his partner had welcomed a baby girl into the world earlier in the mornina.

Sam Smith took Tighe's place alongside Alex Bygraves at centre back.

Saltdean meanwhile could count upon six ex-Robins in their line up with Sweetman having recruited heavily from Hassocks following his summer switch to Hill Park.

Arthur Rawlingson and Danny Reid have recently moved from the Beacon to Saltdean and they joined fellow former Hassocks players Alfie Edmeads, Josh Tuck, Lewis Beebee and Connor Ghosh in the Tigers XI.

The Robins nearly made the perfect start when Joe Bull sported James off his line and went for goal from 35 yards inside of 60 seconds. well.

Other than that, the opening exchanges were quite placid. It needed a Johnson half chance created by Harvey Blake down the right to spark things into life on 28 minutes, followed by Johnson heading a brilliant Westlake delivery over the bar from six yards.

The 35th minute saw Harding slide in Johnson to fire over. Turner then did everything right by beating two Saltdean defenders with his potent combination of pace and skill, only to drag his shot wide.

Given how Hassocks had finished the first half, Saltdean were relieved when the break arrived to bring them some respite.

Any hopes that the 15 minute interval would derail the Robins' momentum were quickly dashed as Hassocks were instantly on the front foot as soon as the action resumed.

Three minutes after the restart and Johnson headed a pinpoint Blake cross straight at James.

Saltdean were put even more under the cosh when the Robins replaced Bull with Troak on 54

minutes to overload the left side with attacking threat.

Just past the hour mark and Smith had a header cleared off the line, sparking pandemonium in the Saltdean box.

No Hassocks player was able to capitalise and put the ball into the

Another big chance came the way of Johnson's head from a Westlake free kick.

Two minutes later and a headed opportunity went to someone other than Johnson.

The outcome however was the same, this time Harding nodding straight at the thankful James.

Hassocks finally opened the scoring six minutes after that missed Harding chance.

The relief in the away camp was James though recovered the situation obvious and even though you sensed one goal would be enough, the second was very welcome.

> Scoring twice in guick succession seemed to push the Robins on to find more in the final 10.

A cleverly worked free kick put Westlake in one-on-one. For once, poor finishing was not to blame as James made an outstanding save to deny the Hassocks head coach.

Saltdean mustered their best chance of the game with two minutes remaining.

It fell to Edmeads, denied a goal against his old club by James Shaw making a fine stop in what was the Hassocks goalkeepers only real action of the afternoon.

Penalty drama sees Hassocks scrape into second round of Senior Cup

By the skin of their teeth, Hassocks moved into the second round of the Sussex Senior Cup for the first time since 2019 after eliminating Saltdean United on penalties.

As late as the 81st minute, it looked like ex-Robins head coach Brad Sweetman was going to mark his return to the Beacon by eliminating his former club from the competition.

The Tigers deservedly led 2-1 with Hassocks having delivered a really poor performance by the recent high standards which have seen them move to within five points of top spot in the Premier Division.

Then the Robins found a fortunate equaliser to force a shoot out. Substitute Phil Johnson hit an effort which took such a heavy deflection off a Saltdean player that it could feasibly have gone down as an own goal.

Lady luck continued to shine on the Robins into the lottery of penalties. A roller coaster shoot out saw 16 spot kicks taken, Hassocks missing two and Saltdean three to give the hosts a 6-5 victory.

Just like in the Peter Bentley League Cup last month, James Westlake used the break from league action as a chance to ring changes.

Danny Reid and Sam Rogers were both rewarded for some excellent Under 23s performances with their first senior starts for Hassocks.

Pat Harding got a first 90 minutes under his belt since breaking three ribs in pre-season. Sam Cash made his first start since August following injury and Alex Bygraves returned after missing the weekend win over AFC Varndeanians.

Dropping to the bench were Johnson, Harvey Blake, Bradley Tighe, Jamie Wilkes and Leon Turner.

Hassocks might point to the unfamiliarity in their starting XI as a reason for their below par showing, although there was no indication of what was to coming during an opening 15 minutes in which the Robins started well.

Alex Harris had to be alert inside of 60 seconds to make a smart save but after that, it was all Hassocks.

Rogers and Mike Williamson combined to release Reid who fired an effort straight down the throat of Saltdean goalkeeper Josh James.

The opening goal arrived with 12 minutes played. Raging Joe Bull delivered a corner to the front post where Jack Troak timed his run perfectly to arrive and volley home.

Hassocks continued to press. A searching ball out of defence from Sam Smith released Liam Benson down the flank. His cross was met by a Harding effort just over the bar.

Troak should have doubled the advantage when another good right wing delivery from Bull looked destined to find him at the far post. Instead, the ball sailed straight past Troak and out of play.

It was a goal out of nothing which hauled Saltdean level on 24 minutes. There did not seem much on when former Hassocks wide man Lucas Tyrrell had possession 30 yards away from goal and out towards wing.

Tyrrell though spotted Harris off his line and hit a clean strike which flew over the head of the goalkeeper and into the back of the net.

Conceding seemed to rock Hassocks. Their dominance dried up and the remaining 65 minutes became a game of few chances at either end.

The Tigers came closest to moving into the lead before the break, drawing an important stop out of Harris from a free header at the far post.

Seven minutes into the second half and Saltdean took the lead through Jesse Burbidge. Westlake responded by making a double change on the hour mark, Wilkes and Turner replacing Rogers and Reid.

A rare moment of quality from the Robins arrived two minutes later as they put the ball in the back of the net via a sweeping move, only for it to be disallowed in peculiar circumstances.

The assistant referee spotted an offside nobody else had, one it seemed that referee Owen Lawrence was willing to overrule as he allowed play to continue for an eternity after the flag was initially raised.

It was only once Hassocks finished the play by scoring that Mr Lawrence blew for offside, having not seen his assistant's flag in the air.

Johnson replaced Benson on 71 minutes, not long after Benson had fired high from the edge of the box.

Nine minutes after his introduction and Johnson was booked. 60 seconds later and he produced the equaliser with the help of that wicked deflection.

That shook the Robins back to life and they finished the game strongly. Turner's run caused a scramble in the box which nobody in red could convert.

Bull hit a free kick high, wide and not particularly handsome. A second yellow card for Ross Smith left Saltdean to negotiate the final three minutes with only 10 men and then tall striker Wilkes missed from a couple of yards when it looked easier to score right at the death.

Hassocks missed their first penalty which looked ominous. The Robins though held their nerve, recovered and will now be hoping for a money-spinning draw with one of the big boys of Sussex football in the next round.

Festive fixtures as Robins aim to keep flying through December

Hassocks will be looking to keep their top six challenge going through December, when they will play five Southern Combination League Premier Division matches.

The month gets underway with a trip to Bexhill United on Saturday 2nd, kick off at 3pm.

Having finished in the top seven in their two Premier Division seasons so far, the Pirates are undergoing something of a transitional campaign under new management.

Long-standing boss Ryan Light stood down at the end of 2022-23 with his place taken by Under 21s manager John Wright.

Having made a slow start, Bexhill are showing signs of improvement and with the Polegrove always a tough place to go, the Robins will need to be at their best to make the long journey home with something to show for their efforts.

Saturday 9th sees Loxwood visit the Beacon in a 2pm kick off. Hassocks beat the Magpies 3-0 at the Nest earlier in the season, with games between the two clubs always having a little extra edge thanks to the number of players who have switched between the two in the past three seasons.

Hassocks travel to the New Defence, home of Horley Town to take on Lingfield in their final fixture before Christmas.

That one is a 3pm kick off, where the Robins will be hoping to repeat their 4-1 win from August.

Then comes one of the highlights of the season when Haywards Heath Town visit the Beacon on Boxing Day for an eagerly anticipated Mid Sussex Derby.

Kick off is at 11am and if the entertainment factor is anything like when the sides drew 2-2 in the Peter Bentley League Cup back in October, it will be a morning of football not to be missed.

Robins saunter to success in front of **shocked Saffrons**

You wait 17 years for Hassocks to win at the Saffrons, and then two victories come along in the space of nine months.

Having triumphed 1-0 at Eastbourne Town on Valentine's Day, the Robins were even more impressive on the slightly-less romantic date of November 18th in running out 3-0 winners.

Two of the goals admittedly arrived in second half injury time, adding a fair amount of gloss to the scoreline.

But even so, this was the perfect way for Hassocks to bounce back from suffering only their second league defeat of the campaign last time out at Premier Division leaders Crowborough Athletic.

Good chances arrived for both the Robins and Town inside the opening 10 minutes.

Alfie Loversidge did brilliantly to bamboozle Harvey Greig and get a cross into the box headed over from close range by Liam Benson.

60 seconds later and James Stone put an even more glorious opportunity with the head straight at Fraser Trigwell.

It was a busy start to proceedings for Stone, who achieved the impressive feat of getting booked within three minutes of kick off.

Stone and James Hull were not far away with distance drives, followed by Mike Williamson crossing for Sean Stephenson to head off target after drifting in from his left flank.

That Stephenson chance began a spell of dominance for the Robins. Home captain Frankie Chappell almost kneed a left footed cross from Harvey Blake beyond his own stranded goalkeeper Josh Barnett. Luckily for the Town, the ball brushed the outside of the post.

The half hour mark saw Barnett called into action twice in quick

succession.

He comfortably saved a Stephenson effort from 25 yards and a header from Jamie Wilkes after the tall striker got free to meet another fine Loversidge delivery.

Evan Archibald has scored his fair share of goals against Hassocks in the past and the veteran forward had two good chances in the space of five by Trigwell spreading himself minutes prior to the break.

There was not quite enough contact on a glancing far post header back of the net with two minutes of followed by a curling effort which had Trigwell looking worried, only for the wind to carry it a little too high over the bar.

The second half proved a much cagier affair compared to the way the first had ebbed and flowed until Benson broke the deadlock on 63 minutes.

Some industrious play by the rangy Wilkes won possession for Hassocks on the edge of the Town box. The loose ball fell to Benson with his back to goal.

From there, the Robins top scorer produced a textbook Cruvff turn to escape Jack Murphy. Now facing the right way, Benson took another touch before drilling left footed into the bottom corner with aplomb.

Town almost responded immediately, Ollie Davies hitting a cross-shot from the right flank which almost dipped beyond Trigwell and in at the back post. Hassocks were relieved to see it drop behind for a goal kick.

Suddenly, the game became as end-to-end and entertaining as the first half had been.

Alex Bygraves headed a pinpoint Josh Mundy free kick off target after escaping his marker and Wilkes put a shot wide.

That Wilkes chance came from a typically probing run from Leon Turner, introduced as a substitute on the hour mark for his first



appearance since rejoining the Robins from Littlehampton Town.

Town came on strong in the final 10 with Stone inches too high from 12 yards on the angle and Archibald seeing a close-range volley kept out superbly.

Archibald did have the ball in the the 90 remaining, only for it to be ruled out for... well, nobody seemed to know.

Not that Hassocks were complaining as they took ruthless advantage of the decision by killing the game off pretty much as late in the day as possible.

The 93rd minute saw Turner lead a counter, switching to fellow sub Pat Harding.

When Super Pat's shot was parried by Barnett, Mundy was in the right place at the right time to claim his first senior goal.

Wilkes then added the third in the 95th. Julian Durand had been on the pitch less than 60 seconds when he intercepted an attempted pass from Barnett to Harry Simmons, made ground towards goal before laying the ball into the middle.

A couple of Town defenders were on the scene but they could not stop Wilkes acting like the absolute fox in the box he is, firing low and hard beyond Barnett to complete a stunning victory.

2-0 even Bradley scored... Tighe and Tall Striker help Hassocks tame Tye

Southern Combination League Premier Division Tuesday 21st November 2023, The Beacon Hassocks 2-0 Peacehaven & Telscombe

Anyone who still thinks Hassocks sitting third in the Southern Combination League Premier Division is some sort of fluke will surely have had to reassess that view in light of the last 72 hours.

On Saturday, the Robins picked up only their second victory at the Saffrons in 17 years when beating sixth placed Eastbourne Town 3-0.

Tuesday night then brought a 2-0 win against Peacehaven & Telscombe, opponents whom Hassocks had defeated just four times in 21 league matches this century.

Two goals in the space of five minutes just past the hour mark saw off the Tye to leave Hassocks in the thick of the playoff race as the campaign hurtles towards its halfway point.

Much of the talk before kick off in the Beacon Clubhouse centred on 17 goal top scorer Liam Benson being absent from the starting XI having accepted an offer to join Haywards Heath Town.

Whilst the Robins stick to their long-held ethos of not paying players, they will always be susceptible to losing important individuals like Benson to rival clubs.

But the more results like this Hassocks pull off and the longer they remain in the promotion picture, the stronger the case James Westlake builds for a change in approach and a budget to keep the Robins competitive at the top end of the table.

Under 23s forward Julian Durand led the line in place of Benson and was soon into the action, single-handedly creating the first opportunity of the game with two minutes on the clock.

Drew Matthews underestimated the sheer speed of Durand, who put on the afterburners to latch onto an under hit pass back. Although Durand managed to round Nathan Stroomberg-Clarke, the former Hassocks goalkeeper did just enough to force Durand wide so that the angle was a little too tight and the ball fired into the side netting.

Durand had another chance on 21 minutes when Sean Stephenson cut in from the right and hit a peach of a pass through the middle.

Having shown quick feet which would not look out of place in the Blackpool Ballroom, Durand escaped Harry Pollard and let fly a clean strike which whistled just over the bar.

Bar a Guy Bolton effort which Fraser Trigwell kept out at his near post on the quarter hour mark, Peacehaven had not really threatened until sparking into life in the final five minutes of the first half.

Henry Blackmore put a free far post header straight at Trigwell from a Harry Docherty cross.

It was then Docherty's turn to be wasteful with his head, nodding a dangerous George Cook corner over from inside the six yard box.


With the Tye finishing strong, Hassocks were grateful for the interval to ease the pressure.

The start of the second half saw Bradley Tighe replace Harvey Blake. At this point, nobody could have predicted the surreal scenes of celebration Tighe would cause around 15 minutes later.

Before that, Stephenson hit a rasping half volley without breaking stride just wide of the post.

Tighe then produced a lovely impression of Michael Jordan in his Chicago Bulls heyday to get a ball under control with his hand on halfway.

Peacehaven were not impressed and their mood nearly darkened when the Robins swept forward and only a fine block from Matthews prevented a Stephenson shot causing Stroomberg-Clarke problems.





Bygraves made an equally impressive intervention with an outstanding lunge on Billy Oliver at the other end before Hassocks took the lead from the most unlikely of sources - yes, that man Tighe.

Nine years and 192 matches after his Robins debut, the popular stalwart finally opened his account to a mixture of shock and awe.

It was a finish good enough almost to be worth waiting the best part of a decade for, a crisp volley at the far post which gave Stroomberg-Clarke no chance.

The home faithful were still trying to recover from the surprise of seeing Tighe score when tall striker Jamie Wilkes doubled the advantage four minutes later.

When Peacehaven failed to deal with a long ball over the top, the rangy Wilkes nipped in like the absolute fox in the box he is.

Wilkes rounded Stroomberg-Clarke and rolled into the now empty net for his third goal in as many appearances.

The Tye lost their heads a little after that and Trigwell was pretty much untroubled, save for keeping out a decent Blackmore effort.

Stroomberg-Clarke also found himself called into late action after Raging Joe Bull and Pat Harding linked up down the left, resulting in a Super Pat shot from distance which almost caught the Peacehaven number one out at his near post.




















Missed chances cost Hassocks in score draw at Montpelier Villa

For Villa, Theo Messent-Lilly, George Hendriks and Ellis Gosling provided the goals.


Hassocks will be hoping to return to winning weeks next week when they face St Francis Rangers in a Mid Sussex Derby at Colwell Road.

Entertaing score draw between third and fourth

November 25th 2011: There was Friday night action under the lights at Culver Road as high flyers Lancing and Hassocks played out an entertaining 2-2 draw

Third place Lancing hosted fourth place Hassocks under the Friday night lights at **Culver Road in a game which** had it all.

A red card, a penalty and four goals after which nothing could separate the sides in an enthralling 2-2 draw.

The hosts were probably a shade happier come the full time whistle, given they had to play the whole second half with only 10 men after Dan Turner elbowed James Westlake in first half stoppage time.

Steyning Town v Hassocks

Having been due to take place on the first weekend of September, our trip to Steyning Town finally gets played a week today. The big question with it being a Tuesday night match... will the Barrowmen be holding a meat raffle?

Stevning Town this season

Steyning have been absolutely flying so far, making it all the way into November unbeaten in the Premier Division to mark themselves out as one of the favourites in the title race. Their league record so far reads played 13, won nine, drawn three and lost only once - that defeat coming at current leaders Crowborough. They also claimed the scalp of Brighton Under 21s in the Sussex Senior Cup and advanced to the second qualifying round of the FA Cup, when over 1,100 people packed the Birchwood Ground to see the Barrowmen take on Maidstone United. Assignments do not come much tougher than a trip to Steyning at the moment.

Head-to-head

There have only been 16 meetings between the sides, thanks largely to Steyning much of the 1990s in the Wessex League. Six of those matches have taken place in the Premier Division, four in Division One, four in the Sussex Senior Cup and two in the RUR Cup. The head-to-head reads seven Hassocks wins, four Steyning victories and five draws.

Last time we met

It was a grim Easter Monday at the Birchwood Ground with weather more akin the to the depths of winter than an April morning. The action on the pitch matched as there was scant entertainment on offer. Dom Johnson -Fisher grabbed the only goal of the

game on 77 minutes with a shot from distance which skidded off the wet 3G pitch to defy James Shaw and end up in the back of the net.

How to get to the Birchwood Ground

Make your way to the A283 Steyning bypass and continue on it once you reach the roundabout with Bramber Castle. Take the second left off the bypass onto Canons Way followed by an immediate right onto Henderson Walk. Following this road around to the right, turn right onto S Ash then left onto Farnefold Road. Follow this onto Middle Mead, turn left at the end onto the Shooting Field and you will find the ground a little way up on the right. Easy, right?

Some impressive recent results include defeating Pagham and going down to close defeats against high-flying Peacehaven and Haywards Heath Town.

Head-to-head

This will be the 14th meeting between ourselves and Bexhill. The first four came in Division One when Bexhill were known as Bexhill Town. We then met in four cup matches before the Pirates won promotion to the Premier Division with four more meetings following. The Pirates lead the head-to-head with six wins to Hassocks' four, leaving three draws.

Last time we met

A disappointing April Fool's Day down at the Polegrove as some poor marking from a set piece gave Bexhill a 90th minute winner as they ran out 2-0 victors. Evan Archibald had put the Pirates 1-0 ahead but they led for

Pass over the railway line, then take another right onto Cooden Drive and the third right after that will take you onto Brockley Road where you will find the ground.









