Good afternoon and welcome to the Beacon for our third consecutive Premier Division top five clash in a row

The postponement of last week's trip to Midhurst & Easebourne means we will have now faced Crowborough Athletic, Steyning Town and today's visitors Eastbourne United in successive weeks - a real test of our playoff credentials.

Those previous two matches with the Crows and the Barrowmen ended in defeat, so fingers crossed we can get back to winning ways this afternoon.

That will not be easy of course against a United side who have lost only three times so far this season and who are one place and seven points behind us but with two games in hand. That tells you everything about what an important game this is.

We will not dwell on that last match against Steyning too much, other than to say it was a mixture of a disappointing Hassocks display and the Barrowmen being an excellent outfit that resulted in a 4-0 loss. Another big crowd were packed into the Beacon which leads us to a plea going forward for more matchday volunteers.

We are currently stretched to the limit in terms of people helping with the car parking, on the gate and doing other jobs around the ground before kick off to help home games run smoothly.

If you could please spare 30 minutes or an hour of your time in exchange for some serious benefits, please speak to Owen behind the bar or Jason at the turnstiles to find our more.

This season's success on the pitch is being matched with the growing interest in the club from the village and beyond - and if we want to push for the next level, more help is please needed.

Despite the wet weather in the week leading up to the Steyning game, the first team fixture not only went ahead but the Under 18s played twice in a little over 48 hours on the Beacon pitch.

Sunday morning saw a 5-0 victory over Montpelier Villa with goals from Josh Nandhra, Oliver Goswamy, Freddie Searle and two for Cavan Chedzey. Tuesday night was less successful as a feisty League Cup third round clash with Worthing United went 2-0 by way of the visitors.

The Veterans were also in action on Sunday 25th February, going down 3-2 at Broadbridge Heath. Player-manager Steve Spies scored both the goals... at the right end, for the avoidance of any doubt.

At the same time, the Ladies were beaten 5-1 by Montpelier Villa at Culver Road. Katherine Chappell with the consolation.

There is no first team game next Saturday. Our next action comes on Tuesday 19th March with the rearranged trip to Midhurst, followed by the visit of Crawley Down Gatwick to the Beacon on Saturday 23rd.

Plenty of football does take place here in the intervening two weeks. The Under 18s take on Haywards Heath Town on Sunday 17th, the Veterans host Roffey Hills Farm on Monday 18th and the Under 23s are in League Cup action against Horley Town on Thursday 21st.

#### With only three Southern Combination Premier Division defeats to their name so far this season, Eastbourne United have proven tough to beat. It is a trait which will serve them well if they make it into the promotion playoffs.

Seeing Eastbourne United flying so high in the standings does not really come as a surprise.

Ever since former AFC Uckfield Town boss Anthony Storey arrived at the Oval early in the 2021-22 season, United have been one of the best sides in the division and one of the hardest to take three points from.

Having been on the fringes of the relegation battle when Storey was appointed, seven months later they had risen to a final finishing position of fifth.

That form continued into 2022-23. United ended the campaign in fourth spot, their highest placing since winning the Southern Combination title in 2009.

They lost just six matches - and

had they been able to turn some of their 12 draws into victories, would have been a lot closer to champions Broadbridge Heath, who they trailed by 15 points.

It has been a similar story in 2023 -24. They are 12 points off current leaders Steyning Town but with three games in hand.

Had United won just a couple of their 10 drawn matches, they would be right in the thick of the title race.

Being difficult to beat though could yet serve them well should they finish in the top five and secure a playoff place. No side will want to be paired with United, knowing they rarely lose.

They rarely concede, either. Only be in store for an ent Crowborough Athletic and Eastbourne afternoon of football.

Town have shipped less goals than the 29 which have passed former Hassocks number one James Broadbent so far this season.

United's mean defence was on show at the Oval when we visited the Sunshine Coast back in September, along with a clinical display of finishing which led the hosts to a 3-0 victory.

It was our first league defeat of the season, after which a lot of people predicted the Hassocks bubble had burst and we would fall back into mid table after our surprisingly good start to the campaign.

Yet here we are, in March, still up there. Whatever happens, we should be in store for an entertaining afternoon of football.

## **Robins find United too hot to handle on** scorching hot September day

In their toughest test of the season so far, Hassocks surrendered both their unbeaten Premier Division record and top spot following a 3-0 defeat at Eastbourne United.

Not many people would have expected the Robins to come into their seventh game of the campaign leading the way having amassed 16 points from a possible 18.

United in contrast are heavily fancied to be involved in the promotion race having finished fourth last season.

They conceded only 32 goals, the ioint-fewest in the division alongside runners up Crawley Down Gatwick.

Their six defeats meanwhile was a total bettered only by champions Broadbridge Heath on five.

Had United managed to turn some of their 12 draws into victories - both games with Hassocks ended level – then they would have been very much in the championship picture.

That gives Anthony Storey's side a obvious area for improvement. And based on what happened against Hassocks at the Oval, United look well capable of picking up the additional points needed to push even higher up the table.

They withstood plenty of pressure from the Robins at one end and proved clinical at the other.

The hosts needed just two minutes to take the lead. Hayden Beaconsfield swung over a corner which stuck Callum Barlow seemingly more by luck than design to defy Fraser Trigwell.

It was such an early opener that some of the Robins substitutes had the perfect view, watching it from behind the goal as they made their way from the changing rooms around to the dugouts on the opposite side of the pitch.

Hassocks strung their first passing move together five minutes later.

This eventually released Joe Bull down the left to flash a dangerous ball across the six yard box.

At least three red shirts were queuing up to convert and vet none where able to do so.

A simple touch would have at least forced ex-Hassocks goalkeeper James Broadbent into action.

Alex Fair dragged one wide on 13 minutes before Broadbent found himself stretching to keep out a Raging Bull free kick.

United winger Tigana Quebe went for a spectacular bicycle kick which is best described as good idea, bad execution with the effort heading a long way away from the goal.

Both sets of players had cause to thank Quebe though for his boldness as it led to referee Daniel Cooper offering a water break whilst the ball was retrieved.

With the mercury touching 30 degrees and many of the 200 plus crowd wondering if they had made the right decision in choosing the Oval over the nearby beach, the pause in play was very welcome.

Hassocks enjoyed a good spell after the refreshment stop. Bailo Camara and George Olulode were both booked in the space of two minutes and another Bull delivery was crying out to be turned in.

Broadbent saved bravely at the feet of Liam Benson. When Fair then rattled the post three minutes before half time, United were visibly holding out for the interval and the chance to regroup.

momentum checked by half time. The first 15 minutes of the second half were a non event, leading James Westlake to make a treble change on the hour mark in an attempt to shake his team back to life.

Off went Alfie Loversidge, Jamie Wilkes and Alex Fair. On came Kyle Woolven, Josh Mundy and Sean Stephenson.

For former Ipswich Town youth

team player Stephenson, it was a Hassocks debut following his signing earlier in the week from Newhaven.

The changes almost paid dividends with Hassocks coming close to an equaliser just three minutes later through Benson.

United survived though and as the half wore on, the Robins had to become ever more attacking in their quest for an equaliser.

The hosts remained solid despite the best efforts of Hassocks to find a way through.

United man-of-the-match Alfie Headland stood out in particular at centre back.

Hassocks were pretty sturdy themselves, Matt Gunn proving the equal of Headland by taking the Robins' Starman award.

This was certainly not an afternoon on which Gunn or indeed Hassocks deserved to concede three.

They did so after being caught out by two sucker punches in the final eight minutes.

Substitute Ed Ratcliffe hit a crisp strike from distance to double United's lead on 82.

The three points were then made safe as the game was about to tick into injury time with Ratcliffe again heavily involved.

He earned a corner with a shot from a Callum Barlow pass deflected behind.

Beaconsfield played the set piece short to Ratcliffe, who embarked on a great solo run ended with a clinical finish from a tight angle to complete The Robins in contrast found their an impressive cameo from the bench.

## Super sub Sheriff strikes late to deliver

## an early Christmas present

**Forget the Grinch Who Stole** Christmas - it was Hassocks doing the robbery as they snatched a 3-2 injury time win against Eastbourne United Association at the Beacon.

United were clearly the better side in the second half and looked the more likely winners after skipper Sheldon Snashall put them level at 2-2 seven minutes after the break.

But the Robins' most experienced striker Mark Sheriff came off the bench late to deliver an early present for home fans, scoring with what was probably only his second touch as the clock ticked onto 92.

Sheriff had originally said he was unavailable to face United. When that changed, he was happy to be on the bench after Dave John explained he had already told new signing Phil Gault he would be pitched straight into the starting XI.

John has been tracking Gault for some time - the striker played in a pre-season friendly for Hassocks away at Horley Town before opting to recommit to St Francis Rangers and his transfer came through just in time.

That meant his brace for Rangers on Saturday in their 4-2 defeat at Midhurst & Easebourne were his parting gift to them.

Gault did enough in this match to suggest John is right to be delighted with the signing, which gives him another option up front where hitherto they have been limited.

Summer capture Sheriff and the emergence of 17-year-old Matt Amos from the youth team have done a wonderful job filling the void left by Pat Harding's move to Eastbourne Borough, but strength in depth is always the secret of a successful squad.

A thick fog rolled in off the Downs before kick off and although it made the first half a nightmare for spectators, those on the pitch felt it

was just about playable.

Referee David Spain should therefore be commended for listening to the improved visibility of the to both teams and John, who advised the official that any mist over the Beacon usually clears in time for the second half.

In the circumstances, other referees may have been tempted to postpone.

Mr Spain though decided to go ahead, meaning another fixture rearranged for later in the campaign to go with all the games lost through the wet weather of November and December has been avoided.

John's prediction of better vision once the opening 45 minutes were out of the way proved correct - and it was United who emerged the better outfit after the fog lifted.

Confusion reigned through the first half as to how Hassocks had scored their goals and who were the players on target.

Both were eventually credited to Amos, although somewhat controversially by all accounts.

The opener came on 27 minutes when Pete Lear headed a corner towards goal and Amos applied the final touch on the goal line.

Hassocks led for all of nine minutes before Mark Warren nodded United back on level terms.

Amos then claimed his and the Robins' second goal five minutes before half time.

A free kick from Anthony Hibbert was headed back across goal by Lear. Spencer Slaughter latched onto the loose ball, firing off a shot which was about to give him his second senior goal.

Amos though had other ideas. Handily placed once again a couple of yards out, the teenager provided a final touch helping the ball in for his second so-called stolen goal in the space of 13 minutes.

Already, the teenager is showing the sort of ruthless streak and selfish dedication to scoring all the best

strikers have.

The first act seen clearly thanks second half was Snashall's equaliser on 52 minutes, coming when a left wing corner fell to him in the six yard box.

Clearcut chances were at a premium after that, with the ones that did arrive mainly being for United.

Nathan Crabb prodded inches wide when the Robins were undone through the middle.

Sam Crabb blazed over when Hassocks failed to deal effectively with a Snashall cross and Ben Billings was closed with an enterprising effort from distance.

The closest Hassocks came to retaking the lead was when Gault had a header cleared off the line after a bizarre of head tennis broke out in the box.

Sheriff replaced Lear on 85 and the Robins were rewarded for the gamble of throwing on a striker for a centre back seven minutes later.

Hibbert did well to heed Sheriff's call for a through ball and the diminutive striker dispatched in clinical style to secure an underserved three points.

John has been in football long enough to know such results are swings and roundabouts.

So, whilst he accepted it was a fortunate win, he also pointed to the Robins' scarcely deserved 5-1 defeat at Redhill on their previous league match and the 2-2 draw with United at the Oval in the game before that for the other side of the coin.

## Turner returns to take February Player of the Month

Dan Turner marked his first month back as a Hassocks regular since April 2022 in style, being named the Robins February Player of the Month.

The popular centre back was one of the star performers in the 2021-22 campaign, helping Hassocks avoid relegation whilst taking home a double of Players' Player and Supporters' Player of the Season awards.

He spent most of 2022-23 playing cricket the other side of the world, before returning to the Beacon for the current campaign.

The form of Alex Bygraves, Matt Gunn and Bradley Tighe meant Turner had to patiently wait for an opportunity with most of his football up to now played for the Under 21s.

That changed in February. Turner came off the bench in the Robins' second game of the month, scoring an 86th minute winner in the 2-1 win over Little Common with a finish featuring nifty footwork any forward would be proud of. Turner subsequently made his first league start of the campaign as Hassocks won 2-1 at Peacehaven & Telscombe.

He has looked undroppable since then, including when being chosen as Robins Starman for the 2-1 defeat at home to table topping Crowborough Athletic.

With Bygraves unfortunately ruled out for the rest of the campaign, Turner will have a big part to play as Hassocks aim to keep up their unlikely challenge for a playoff spot.

Second place in February 2024 Player of the Month went to Joe Bull, who continues to impress at left back.

Raging Bull has been a virtual ever present for the Robins this season, defending solidly at one end and posing a real threat going forward at the other.

Set pieces have proven a particularly fruitful route to assists for Bull.

It was his corner which led to Hassocks opening the scoring in their 3-1 win over Pagham, Jack Troak somehow getting credited with a header despite it quite clearly being an own goal from Lions number one Connor Kelly.

Another Bull corner three days later also created the goalmouth scramble in which Julian Durand pounced to give Hassocks the lead against Little Common.

Behind Turner and Bull in third was Jamie Wilkes, meaning the tall striker has finished in the top three in five out of seven Player of the Month awards so far this season.

The rangy Wilkes helped set up the Robins' second against Pagham, popping up on the left wing to release goal scorer Leon Turner.

Wilkes was rested for the win over Little Common but returned to play a huge part as Hassocks made the journey back from Peacehaven & Telscombe with three league points for only the second time this century.

He then went onto be one of the few bright spots in the disappointing 4-0 defeat to title chasing Steyning Town which rounded off the month.

## Title chasing Barrowmen wheel to Beacon victory inside of 45 minutes

#### Did the Beacon play host to the 2023-24 season Southern Combination Premier Division champions on Saturday?

Based on the way Steyning Town dismantled Hassocks 4-0 in a manner no other side has managed so far this campaign, the Barrowmen will take some stopping in their quest for a first league title since 1986.

True, the Robins were nowhere near their best. But even had they matched the high level Hassocks fans have been treated to in what has been an exceptional season so far, they still would have struggled against their South Downs neighbours.

You only have to look at some of Steyning's cup results to see the challenge the Robins were facing.

In the FA Cup, Steyning went all the way to the second qualifying round and a home game with Maidstone United - the same Maidstone United taking on Coventry City in the fifth round on Monday night.

The Barrowmen have eliminated both Brighton Under 21s and Burgess Hill Town from the Sussex Transport Senior Cup on a run which has taken them to the semi finals.

Victory over Horsham at Culver Road on Tuesday night will see them become the first Southern Combination side to reach the showpiece final of Sussex non-league football in over 30 years.

With one eye firmly on midweek, Steyning boss Kevin Green would no doubt have been delighted that his side had three points from their trip to Hassocks in the bag before half time.

The Barrowmen led 3-0 going into the interval through goals from Tom Chalaye, Nathan Cooper and Jack Barnes.

Steyning understandably grasped the opportunity to ease up and take

their foot off the pedal after the break.

It subsequently looked like the second half was going to finish goalless until Chalaye notched again in the eighth minute of injury time to add one final lick of gloss to the scoreline.

Chalaye's first of the afternoon arrived at the opposite end timewise, coming with only four minutes on the clock.

A cross from Charlie Meehan on the right was drilled low and hard across the edge of the box to Chalaye.

The Barrowmen's leading scorer curled a first-time finish into the bottom corner.

Hassocks enjoyed a good spell of possession in the middle of the park after falling behind but were never able to turn it into anything troubling Lucas Szendela-Goetzke in the Steyning goal.

In amongst expertly soaking up the pressure, the Barrowmen also looked dangerous on the counter.

One lightning quick break resulted in Matt Gunn making a superb clearance off the line when a Billy Fuller cross was headed towards goal by Meehan.

The Robins created a couple of half chances for Leon Turner, Jack Troak and Big Alex Fair but nothing substantial enough to either worry or exert Szendela-Goetzke.

Proceedings seemed to be meandering to a 3-0 Barrowmen win when Chalaye suddenly popped up with that late fourth goal for the visitors.

Lloyd Francis and substitute Jared Rance combined to release Chalaye down the left flank, from where he headed towards goal and rounded Trigwell before rolling into the nowempty net.

## **Miles to the four in Robins crushing of Crows**

**March 9th 2013:** Nathan Miles had an enjoyable afternoon as his four goals helped Hassocks to a convincing 6-1 win over Crowborough Athletic at the Beacon

#### The Robins ran riot against Crowborough Athletic at the Beacon and at the heart of it was the four-midable Nathan Miles.

Miles provided four of the goals in a 6-1 win for Hassocks. The game was done and dusted as early as the 24th minute, by which point the Robins led 3-0.

Hassocks showed no signs of letting up against a Crows defence whose nervousness increased each time they conceded, going into half time 5-0 to the good.

The talk around the Clubhouse at half time was of record wins and how many goals the Robins could rack up in the remaining 45 minutes of football.

Full credit to this young Crowborough side then, who came out after the break surprisingly rejuvenated and able to make much more of a game of it.

Two things made the final score particularly impressive from a Hassocks point of view.

The first was that the Robins had not won for five matches coming into the game, going back to another 6-1 win at the Beacon four weeks ago against AFC Uckfield. Talk about an emphatic way to break a barren run.

And the second was that Hassocks did it missing stalwarts like Anthony Hibbert and Ashley Marsh going to show what a Jekyl and Hyde outfit they have been in recent weeks.

Mickey Jewell overcame the absentees by engaging in a shuffling of positions.

Lee Bryant shifted to centre half to partner Stuart Faith, Elliott Butler dropped in at left back and James Westlake was given a central midfield role instead his usual wide berth.

That opened up an opportunity for Stuart Brown to make another

start on the right wing, having impressed for Roy Staughton's allconquering reserve side this season.

Miles set the tone for what was to come when opening the scoring with just four minutes played.

Visiting player-manager Dave Adams attempted a clearing header, only to succeed in glancing the ball straight into the path of Miles.

No second invitation was needed, Miles hitting a sweet first-time half volley with confidence which caught Crowborough goalkeeper Ben Head by surprise.

A much simpler finish provided

Miles with his hat-trick goal 10 minutes later, tapping inside the far post from close range following a Weston cross.

Crowborough only seriously threatened Simon Lehkyj once in the first half.

The Robins goalkeeper had to show good alertness to make a smart save denying Tom Saunders from a matter of yards.

Not wanting to hand the spotlight completely over to his strike partner Miles, Division One's leading scorer Phil Gault struck his 30th of the season just before half time.

There was a certain amount of cheek mixed with a little bit of intelligence as Gault struck a free kick which took another cruel deflection before flying into the top corner.

The Crows were rewarded for their obvious improvement after the break by pulling one back on the hour mark.

Lehkyj denied Alex Rich but in doing so, only succeeded in pushing the ball to Harry Thompson who tucked away from a tight angle.

Given the outcome was already beyond doubt and Hassocks had not scored for over 30 minutes, it was somewhat bizarre that Crowborough lost their heads entering the final 15.

There were three unsavoury bookings in quick succession for Crows players, all for dissent towards the referee.

#### Midhurst & Easebourne v Hassocks

#### We are back out on the road next Tuesday with one of the longest away trips of the season to Midhurst & Easebourne, where the heaviest defeat of the James Westlake Era was inflicted upon the Robins last season

#### Midhurst & Easebourne this season

2022-23 was Midhurst's first Premier Division campaign for 30 years and it proved to be very much a season of two. They were victorious in nine of their opening 17 matches before failing to win another league game from the start of December onwards. Despite their form diving off a cliff, the Stags had enough points in the bag to finish 13th. Greater consistency over an entire campaign was the aim for 2023-24 and Midhurst have delivered, sitting ninth at the time of writing.

#### Head-to-head

Meetings have been few and far between. There have been 11

won and five of which Midhurst have been triumphant in. Goals tend to be guaranteed; we have a 6-0 win at the Matt Rowland provided the Stags Beacon and a 6-1 win at the Rotherfield to our name. Last season meanwhile saw a crazy seven-goal thriller at the Beacon in which all the goals came in the first half won 4-3 by the Stags. That was followed by a 5-0 defeat away from home in the December return match. Fingers crossed for much, much better on this occasion.

#### Last time we met

We did at least gain some sort of revenge for the hammering taken at the Rotherfield last time the sides met back in August. Liam Benson hit

#### Head-to-head

It has been something of a hangover season for the Anvils and nobody can blame them for that. Not only did they come within three points of beating Broadbridge Heath to the Southern Combination League title last April, but they then suffered the disappointment of playoff defeat against Sutton Common Rovers which from 28 meetings, although things denied them promotion to the Isthmian League. Down were slow to start the current campaign as they recovered from the double blow but have moved themselves into contention for a top 10 spot as the season heads towards its finale. It would be no surprise to see them back amongst the promotion

Hassocks v Crawley Down used to be one of the highest-scoring games on the Southern Combination League circuit, regularly throwing up ridiculous scorelines such as 5-3 and 6-4 wins for the Robins. #### Last time we met

"It wasn't a game for the neutral, put it that way," was the assessment of James Westlake afterwards. And he was right. Raging Joe Bull struck the

only goal of the game on 23 minutes having only landed back at Gatwick the morning of the game from watching Brighton away against Marseille in the Europa League.

#### Familiar faces

Plenty of players have swapped the Haven for the Beacon and vice versa in recent seasons and that always adds a little extra spice to games between the clubs. For Hassocks, Harvey Blake is an ex-Anvil. Down meanwhile can call upon Harvey Enticknap, Dave Carruthers and Louis Pittock.

March comes to an end with a trip to Horsham YMCA. The Herbert Direct Stadium used to be a graveyard for Hassocks, but not so much anymore with two wins in our past three visits. No better time to make that three from four...

#### Horsham YMCA this season

On the pitch, this has been a solid if unspectacular season for Horsham YMCA. For the second campaign running, they sit in mid table having neither troubled the upper reaches nor been in any sort of relegation battle. Seven wins, eight draws and 13 defeats leaves them 14th in the standing. Off the pitch, YM have been given permission to install a 3G pitch at Gorings Mead - a transformative moment if the new facility brings similar success to that seen at Lancing, Steyning Town and Newhaven in recent years.

#### Head-to-head

YM have been one of our most frequently faced opponents since we joined the Southern Combination League. There have been 57 games between the sides. YM have won 27 with 18 Hassocks wins and 12 draws. YM's dominance of the fixture stems largely from their strong record at Gorings Mead in the fixture; we have won just three times in the league there since 2000. As already mentioned, two of those victories have come in the past three seasons.

#### Last time we met

The one and only 0-0 draw of the season so far involving the Robins. After scoring 15 times in five consecutive away games through September, we could find no way past a mean Horsham YMCA defence at the Beacon in a game in which

neither Fraser Trigwell nor his opposite number Aaron Jeal had a serious save to make.

#### How to get to the Herbert Direct Stadium

The around is situated on the outskirts of the town centre. Take the A272 to Cowfold before joining the A281 towards Horsham. Once in the town, Gorings Mead is located on the left before the railway bridge as directed by the "YMCA" sign. There is extremely limited parking at the ground and when that is full there is no parking in the street leading to the ground. Visitors are advised to park in one of the many car parks that are a five-minute walk away.


