It has been something of a different story since 2010, however, with Wick spending just two of the past 14 seasons in the Premier Division.

They last played at step five in 2017 with their seven-year exodus ended by winning promotion through the Division One playoffs back in May.

The Dragons finished the regular season in fourth spot before overcoming Worthing United in the semi finals and defeating Seaford Town at the Crouch in the playoff final, having finished six points behind opening two matches. Seaford in the standings.



Saturday 17th December 2016 - Hassocks 0-1 Wick

If anybody was in any doubt that Hassocks are in a battle for Premier Division survival, then this 1-0 defeat against Wick at the Beacon hammered the point home.

Wick arrived at in Mid Sussex without a win in five games, sitting second bottom in the table

Their win saw their move to within just three points of the Robins in the ridiculously congested lower half in which only five points now separate 13th and 19th.

Things don't get any easier for Hassocks either. Their next four league games are against three of the top four in the division. Come mid January, they could be in real trouble.

Joe Grommett got the only goal of the game on the hour mark, finishing off a counter attacking move as Hassocks again conceded a goal from a passage of play that started out as their own attack.

That seems to have become nearly as much of a recurring theme this season as the Robins' inability to defend set pieces.

Those two areas are obvious starting points for Mark Dalgleish and Phil Wickwar to look at as a base for dragging Hassocks out of the

It was the talented Danny Simmonds who led Wick's lighting quick turnover from defending to scoring.

He had only been on the pitch for a matter of minutes when finding Rob Hutchings, whose cross was turned in by Grommett.

Goalmouth action was sparse in the first half, which was just as well given the heavy fog that encompassed the ground.

Although never serious enough to threaten the game, it did make spectating difficult, particularly when the action was taking place at the far end.

Wick goalkeeper Lewis Broughton made an excellent stop from a Phil Gault free kick while Grommett had a good chance on the stroke of half time but James Broadbent spread himself to save bravely at the striker's feet.

Once Wick took the lead Hassocks seemed to lose their heads and all the good work they had done in possession in the first half went out of the window.

The advantage could have been doubled on a couple of occasions. There was a block on the

line from Jordan Badger which looked suspiciously like a handball.

It was the sort of decision that nine times out of 10 gets given but Hassocks somehow got away with it.

They were then indebted to Broadbent for keeping them in the tie with 10 minutes remaining.

The Robins number one pulled off what was quite simply an extraordinary safe from point blank range from an Ash Harper header.

Hassocks did manage to carve out a couple more opportunities but they are really missing a cutting edge in front of goal currently.

Their blank here made it a third game in a row without scoring. The returns of Nathan Miles and Michael Death really cannot come soon enough.

Wickwar admitted afterwards to being severely concerned about his sides current run of form.

The Robins have won just three league of their past 17 games dating back to the heady days of August when they had begun the campaign in flying fashion.

"We mustn't panic but the players need to realise we are deep in it now. We've got to pull our fingers out, get some more points on the board and try and get away from the drop zone as it looks like any two of six or seven teams could go down."

One thing that will help is the return of Spencer Slaughter. The popular midfielder was there to watch having recently returned from 10 months of travelling and he has put pen to paper.

Having been out of the game for so long, it will no doubt take Slaughter some time to get up to speed.

But he possesses the sort of battling qualities that are desperately needed if Hassocks are to get themselves out of their current predicament.

Wick 1-2 Hassocks - Saturday 30th September 2006

Matt Amos has been threatening a first senior goal for several weeks now. It finally arrived and at the perfect time for Hassocks, a crisp 89th minute volley securing a 2-1 Sussex RUR Charity Cup win at Wick.

The Robins' reward is a winnable third round home tie with Division Two opponents Seaford Town. Might this be the season Hassocks finally end their long wait for a trophy?

Extra time was looming large with the scores locked at 1-1 when Amos struck. Mickey Turner put in a superb delivery from the right which Amos met first time with his left foot from eight yards out.

You could see how much it meant to the 17 -year-old with the way he celebrated. His teammates too were clearly delighted for him.

The excitement was even greater amongst the travelling contingent. Or to be more precise, Amos' father, who almost ended up tumbling over the perimeter fence and onto the pitch.

Mr Amos will probably need to get used to the feeling that comes with seeing his son score.

Dave John said earlier in the season that he believed once Amos got his account up and running, the goals would start flowing regularly. That theory will now be tested.

Amos' goal capped a very exciting tie which ebbed and flowed. Both sides could justifiably claim they deserved to win as chances were frequently exchanged in an end-to-end encounter.

John and Wick manager Carl Stabler have been locking horns for years. They know each other well and have reputations for believing in youth; something that was evident from their respective starting XIs.

Wick were lively up front through Phil Turner and Jason Power. They also had a couple of tricky midfielders in Tom Manton and Matt Axell, who the Robins midfield trio of Matt Robbins, Anthony Hibbert and Stuart Faith did well to counter.

Joel Harding was first called into action on 12 minutes to deny Turner with his legs. Harding's opposite number Simon Davey then saved from Hibbert.

Amos was next to test Davey with a fine turn and shot which the Wick goalkeeper

tipped over at full stretch.

Grant Vanson shot low but Harding was equal to it before Hassocks took the lead on the 30 minute mark.

Hibbert delivered a corner headed in by Mark Sheriff, much to the obvious surprise of his teammates and indeed the diminutive striker himself.

Sheriff missed a good chance to double the lead just before the interval. Another Hassocks teenager in Sam Fisk exchanged passes with Robbins to tee up Sheriff, who shot wastefully off target.

Early in the second half and a lovely clip up the line from Ashley Marsh sent Amos scampering away down the left. He cut inside but again Davey proved equal to it with a fine save

Hassocks now seemed to be taking control. Amos drew an almost identical tip over from Davey as in the first half.

Davey then messed up clearing a back pass, gifting the ball straight to Sheriff. The goal was gaping but the angle too difficult, leaving Sheriff unable to guide the ball into the empty net

Almost immediately, the Robins were made to regret not getting a two-goal cushion as Wick equalised.

A long ball from midfield caught out the Hassocks defence to find Manton. He beat Harding with a clinical finish from inside the box.

Neither side seemingly wanted an additional 30 minutes as both went for the win in the final half hour.

Sheriff had a shot cleared off the line, Ben Torode fired wide and Power extended Harding with a distance drive.

No player on the pitch had worked harder than Amos though and his tireless shift was rewarded with that winning goal right at the death.

Bygraves bows out in style against Saltdean

Alex Bygraves bowed out from the Hassocks Hotel Beacon Ground in style. His final appearance in a Robins shirt saw him named Starman, helping Hassocks to a clean sheet and a 1-0 win over Saltdean United.

Bygraves and his young family are moving imminently to Dubai. As a result, he had not been due to play this season.

But with the Robins' two new centre back signings in Liam Hendy and Will Berry both unavailable and Dan Turner suspended for the campaign opener, Bygraves answered James Westlake's call to help out.

What made the popular defender's performance even more impressive was that it came having barely kicked a ball for six months.

Bygraves had little involvement in pre-season training, believing his Hassocks career over.

He last turned out for the Robins back in February away against former

club Peacehaven & Telscombe, where a knee injury brought his 2023-24 campaign to an early end.

It was the fourth serious injury of his career. Bygraves had already shown remarkable resolve to come back from a fractured foot, an MCL and a horror leg break during his time at Lancing.

To return once again and only for a one-off appearance to help out Hassocks speaks volumes about Bygraves.

The defender was one of Westlake's chief transfer targets when he took over as Robins head coach in the summer of 2022.

Hassocks fought off a host of other clubs for Bygraves' signature, convincing him to make the move from Peacehaven.

He soon became Robins club captain and one of the first names on the team sheet, making 76 appearances and scoring seven goals.

Bygraves initially came to

prominence with Haywards Heath Town, captaining the Bluebells to promotion from Division Three, the Division Three Cup and the Sussex Intermediate Cup in the 2012-13 campaign.

Seven years at Lancing where he won a Peter Bentley League Cup were then followed by one-season with Peacehaven before joining Hassocks.

Westlake paid tribute to Bygraves following the victory against Satldean, saying: "Massive thank you to Alex for the last two seasons. A proper defender, such a competitor and incredibly loyal. We have been fortunate to have him."

"It says so much that he threw himself into a competitive game after being out injured for the last ix months."

"We also have to thank his family, wife Natalie and their two little champs for all their support. We wish them all the best in their new venture, They are Robins for life."

Bromage the hero as Heath edge out Hassocks in dramatic FA Cup derby

Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Qualifying Round Saturday 3rd August, Hassocks Hotel Beacon Ground Hassocks 2-3 Haywards Heath Town

Having been drawn together in the FA Cup for the first time, Hassocks and Haywards Heath Town did not disappoint in putting on a dramatic Mid Sussex Derby in the extra preliminary qualifying round.

At 99 minutes, a Tuesday replay at the Home Smart Energy Stadium looked like it could be on the cards.

Yellow-clad Heath led 3-2 but had just given the Robins a lifeline back into the tie when a Tom Frankland shot was blocked by the arm of Byron Napper for a last-gasp penalty.

With silence descending around the Hassocks Hotel Beacon Ground, Frankland himself took the kick.

As Frankland struck, Bluebells goalkeeper Mitch Bromage went the right way and showed superb reactions to stick a hand down low and propel the ball around the post.

Robins hearts were broken. Heath pocketed a useful £1125 in prize money and will now host Deal Town in the next round.

Doubtful it will prove much consolation, but Hassocks could at least take away the fact they had pushed the Southern Combination title favourites to the brink.

Some supporters were yet to leave the newly-named Dave John Lounge when the Robins took the lead with only three minutes on the clock.

Hassocks played out from the back through Fraser Trigwell and Liam Hendy clipped a ball over the top.

Excellent has been Jack Troak's middle name so far this season. He raced onto the pass and delivered a looping cross towards the back post.

Arriving there was Big Alex Fair. It seemed to take an age for the ball to fall from the sky but Fair watched it

all the way and when it did, he crashed a first-time volley across Bromage and into the opposite corner of the Heath goal.

That fast start was followed by a lull in proceedings until the Bluebells equalised via their first effort on goal with 23 minutes played.

Heath centre back Josh Spinks embarked on a run forward, finding himself in a crossing position on the right wing.

Alex Plummer was the recipient. His shot looked to be heading straight at Trigwell, only for it to deflect off the head of Bradley Tighe and into the far corner.

Robins captain Harvey Blake set up Morgan Vale for an effort requiring a sprawling save from Bromage as Hassocks initially responded well to conceding.

Entering the final 10 minutes of the half, however, and the Robins were their own worst enemy as they began gifting away possession.

An attempted pass from Blake to Tighe turned into a through ball for Darius Goldsmith. Trigwell stood up to save the one-on-one, followed by Plummer blazing the rebound into the playpark behind the goal.

But the let off did not last long. One minute later and Noah Hoffmann and Fair got their wires crossed, gifting the ball to Heath.

Uncharacteristically, Jack Meeres failed to find a yellow shirt with his subsequent pass forward. Tighe instead intercepted but was then dispossessed himself by Lewis Finney.

Now faced with Finney, Trigwell raced from his line and brought down the Bluebells forward for a clearcut penalty. Finney did the rest from 12





yards, giving Heath the lead nine minutes before the break.

Onto the second half, which was something of a slow burner. Neither side mustered an opportunity until Hendy equalised on the hour.

Fair headed down a cross for Jamie Wilkes. The tall striker saw his shot well saved from point blank range by Bromage.

Charging onto the scene though was Hendy, who smashed home the rebound for his first Hassocks goal.

Unsurprisingly, Hendy enjoyed that one having swapped Haywards for Hassocks in the summer.

Nearly 10 minutes were lost when Spinks required treatment from Robins physio Ash Cooper, meaning that although Heath grabbed their third with 89 on the clock there was still plenty of time remaining.

The towering head of Meeres beat Trigwell, Wilkes and Tighe to a corner for what proved to be the winner.

Sympathy abounded for Frankland 10 minutes later, although he is not the first Robin to miss a last minute FA Cup penalty - the same fate befell the great Phil Gault 10 years ago against Chipstead, after which Gault famously punished himself by spending Saturday evening in notorious Burgess Hill nightspot Jacobs Post.



The opening day of the County League season saw Hassocks come from behind via a superb second half showing to score a 2-1 victory over Littlehampton Town.

Anthony Hibbert got both the Robins goals to see off visitors who many consider to be dark horses for the title.

Littlehampton won Division Two at a cantor last season but it was their cup form which really caught the eye.

The Marigolds eliminated no less than eight higher division clubs from knockout competitions.

Hassocks were included in that number, losing at the Sportsfield in the quarter finals of the John O'Hara League Cup back in February.

There was clearly something about Mid Sussex's senior outfits that Littlehampton liked as they also recorded shock wins against Burgess Hill Town and St Francis Rangers.

Missing the holidaying Phil Gault, Mickey Jewell opted to play a 4-5-1 formation with Nathan Miles ploughing a lonely furrow up front.

Miles' hard work was solely responsible for the few half chances Hassocks created in an opening 45 minutes otherwise dominated by the Marigolds.

Littlehampton had enough possession and first half chances to put the game beyond doubt.

It was only a combination of disciplined defending and wasteful finishing which meant the Robins went into break just one behind rather than two or three.

The Marigolds had already created a couple of good opportunities before taking the lead on 18 minutes.

Hassocks were unconvincing in attempting to clear their lines, only succeeding in getting the ball out to Scott Packer on the left touchline.

Packer's cross back into the box dropped over the head of Jack Simpson and into the back of the net with a little assistance from the wind.

Simpson is back at the Beacon after finishing last season at Worthing, although his return will last only until November when he heads off travelling.

Midway through the second half and Johnson burst into the Littlehampton box, where he was tripped by a visiting defender.

Referee Michael Ryan had no option other than to point to the spot. Hibbert did the rest by finishing with aplomb from 12 yards.

That was on 65 minutes. Just five later and Hibbert struck again to complete the turnaround.

Laurence Robinson has forced his way back into first team contention after impressing in pre-season having enjoyed a goal-laden campaign for the treble winning Reserves last time out.

Robinson cut in from the left on a run halted illegally 25 yards out. Hibbert did the rest, completely bamboozling the Marigolds goalkeeper with a brilliant direct free kick.

Hassocks almost had a third another five minutes later when Miles found himself running clear on the counter, only to be denied by a fine last ditch tackle.

Littlehampton poured forward in the final 15 but could find no way through as the Robins held on, much to the delight of a bumper Beacon crowd of 150.

Included in that number were players from the club's Juniors section, who received a coaching session on the pitch before the game and acted as mascots as part of the celebrations for Sir Bobby Robson National Football Day.

Crawley Down Gatwick last season

It was something of a hangover season for the Anvils last time out and nobody could blame them for that. Not only did they come within three points of beating Broadbridge Heath to the Southern Combination League title in 2022 -23, but they then suffered the disappointment of playoff defeat against Sutton Common Rovers which denied them promotion to the Isthmian League. Down were slow to start 2023 -24 as they recovered from the double blow but enjoyed an excellent second half of the season to secure a ninth place finish. Head-to-head


